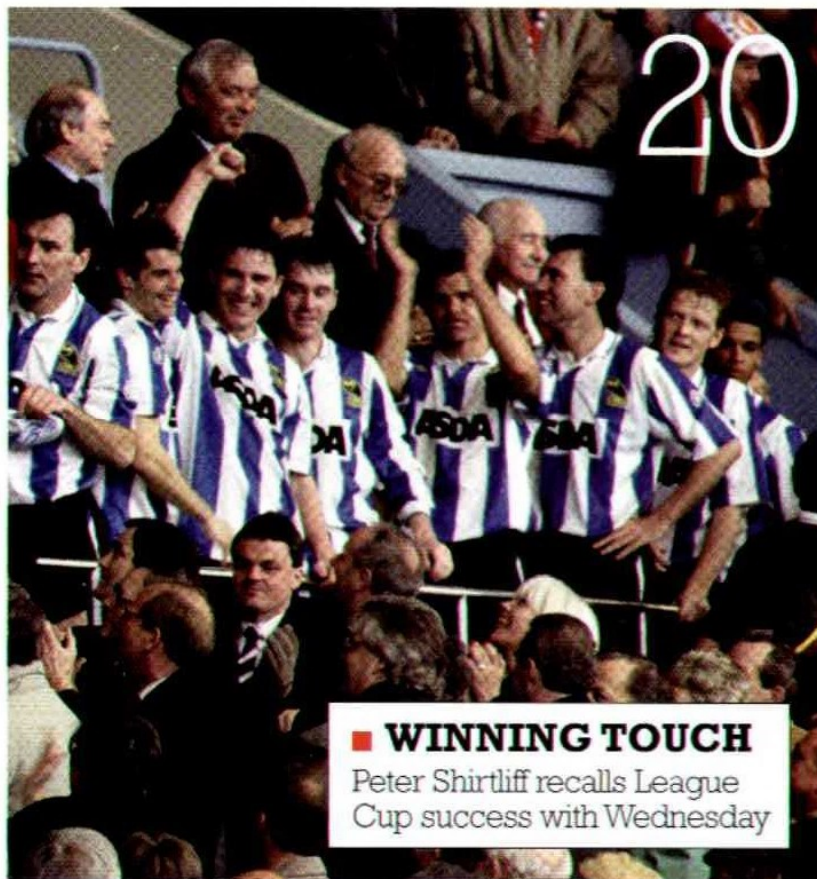

IN TOWN TONIGHT

LEYTON ORIENT boss Russell Slade has made no fewer than nine new signings over the close season, and supporters will be hoping the new-look squad can improve on last season's showing which saw the O's avoid relegation by a single point.

SLADE, who was appointed in April, performed admirably to keep the side up after a poor season in which some massively inconsistent runs of form left the O's struggling to stay above the bottom four.

However, a late surge in form saw them secure safety and allowed Slade to start planning for the coming season safe in the knowledge their League 1 status had been retained.

The manager set straight to work, bringing in a wealth of new talent to Brisbane Road, including Matthew Spring, Elliot Omozusi and former Town striker Alex Revell.

Revell will face Town for the second time and with a second different team since leaving the club last year, having lined up for Wycombe Wanderers against Danny Wilson's side in April of last year.

Many have tipped the O's for a more successful campaign this year, and supporters will be hoping Slade and his players can carry some of the momentum from last year's late flourish into the opening exchanges of this campaign.

Orient reached the second round of the Carling Cup last year, and were eliminated by Premiership

side Stoke City in an epic tie at Brisbane Road in August.

The clash finished 0-0 after 90 minutes, but a 35-yard pile-driver from Dave Kitson put paid to any Orient hopes in the 94th minute, and was a cruel blow to the hosts after a commendable performance.

In the two clashes between the sides last season, Town triumphed 3-1 at The County Ground in December courtesy of a brace from Charlie Austin and one from Billy Paynter, while a 0-0 stalemate greeted the fans at Brisbane Road in March, on a hazardedly rain-affected surface.

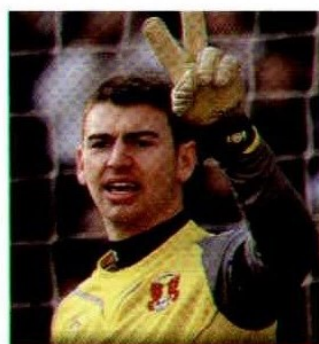

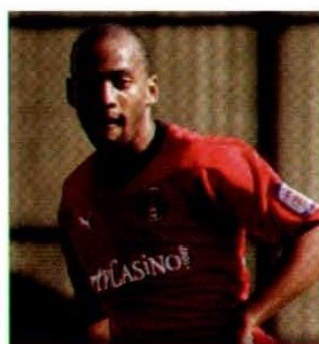


The **LEYTON ORIENT** squad contains a mix of seasoned Football League experience, foreign flair and youthful exuberance. Here are the men that matter for tonight's visitors.



JAMIE JONES 1

The 21-year-old stopper wasted little time in establishing himself as the club's number one after making the move from Everton in summer of 2008. He may have been a young and inexperienced stopper, but within six months of signing for the club he had dislodged Glenn Morris between the posts, and has not looked back since.



ELLIOT OMOZUSI 2

Attacking right back Omozusi could not have moved closer to home when he signed for the O's from Fulham in the summer of 2010. Hailing from Hackney, just a stone's throw from the club's Leyton base, Omozusi put pen-to-paper on a one-year contract at Brisbane Road, with the option for a further year dependent on appearances.



TERRELL FORBES 6

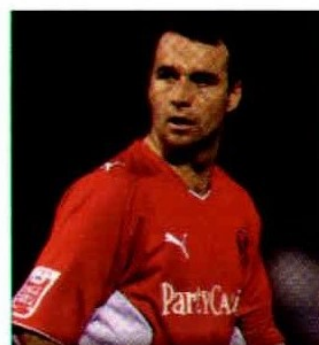
Forbes linked up with O's boss Russell Slade for a third time when he decided to leave Yeovil Town for East London in the summer of 2010. Forbes, a 29-year-old defender, previously played under the Brisbane Road chief at Grimsby Town and Yeovil, and he was delighted to move back home to London to sign for him again. He was at Yeovil for four years, playing 160 League games, and he was part of Slade's Glovers team that made the League 1 play-off final in the 2006/07 campaign.

Forbes began his career at the West Ham Academy, where he was an FA Youth Cup winner in 1999 alongside Michael Carrick and Joe Cole. He then had spells with QPR, Grimsby and Oldham.



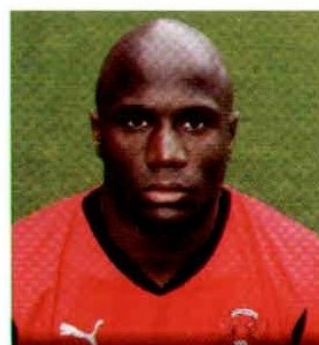
JIMMY SMITH 20

23-year-old former Chelsea midfielder Smith signed in 2009 when he opted to leave Stamford Bridge for Brisbane Road. He previously spent three months on loan in E10, helping Orient's 2008/09 survival bid. A versatile attacking midfielder player, Smith is capable of playing in a central position or on either flank.



SCOTT MCGLEISH 9

McGleish is on the hunt for his 200th career League goal after signing a new one-year deal in 2010. The 36-year-old striker is in his third Orient spell, having been on loan with Orient from Charlton in the 1994/95 season, then having played for the club for a year between 1996 and 1997, rejoining from Wycombe Wanderers in February 2009.



JONATHAN TEHOUE 18

The powerful Frenchman arrived at Brisbane Road in January 2010 following a successful trial period at the club. A strong striker with top flight experience in his native France, Belgium and Turkey, Tehoué came to E10 with an impressive pedigree and will be looking to make a name for himself in England.



ADRIAN PATULEA 17

The Romanian striker put pen-to-paper on a two-year contract with the O's during the summer of 2009. The 25-year-old forward rejected the offer of new terms at former club Lincoln City in favour of a move to Orient and he scored with his first touch for his new club in a Carling Cup tie at Colchester United.


BEN CHORLEY 4

The Londoner capped a fine first season with the O's by picking up the club's Player of the Year award in May 2010. The dominant centre-back decided to make the move back to his home city when he turned down the offer of a new contract at his former club Tranmere Rovers to join Orient in 2009.


MIKE CESTOR 19

The French youngster came into the Leyton Orient youth-set up on non-contract terms early in the 2009/10 season, quickly establishing himself as a regular in the under-18s. Impressive in the youngsters' run to the FA Youth Cup fourth round, he signed his first professional contract in December 2009.


MATTHEW SPRING 16

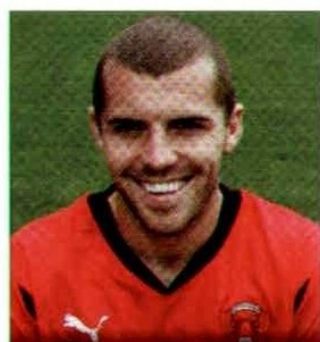
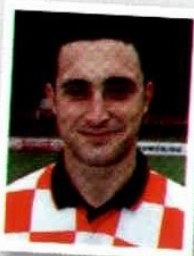
Former Luton Town playmaker Spring was yet another summer 2010 signing following his release by Charlton Athletic. Harlow-born Spring has played in the Championship for Luton Town, Leeds United, Watford and Charlton and is hoping to play a more central role in E10 following a barren 18 months at The Valley.


HARRY BEAUTYMAN 22

The East-Londoner made the step up from the youth team ranks in the summer of 2010, signing a six-month professional contract. An impressive performer in the youth and reserve sides over his two-year scholarship, the central midfielder was an unused substitute on a number of occasions for the first team last year.

INTERESTING FACT!

Town Fitness and Conditioning coach David Morrison came off the bench for Leyton Orient in the last League Cup tie between tonight's teams at The County Ground. Morrison replaced Wim Walschaerts on the hour with Orient going on to earn a 1-0 win in August 1999.


STEPHEN DAWSON 8

The Dublin-born midfielder was one of Russell Slade's nine permanent signings of the summer of 2010, rejecting the advances of several other clubs to join Orient from League 2 outfit Bury. He had just been voted into the PFA Team of the Season and will now be looking to replicate that form at the higher level.


MICHAEL LIDDLE 3

The left-back joined The O's from Sunderland at the end of last week and went straight into the side for Saturday's opener at Yeovil Town. Liddle spent time with Carlisle United on loan in 2008/09 where he made 22 league appearances. His one appearance for Sunderland came in last season's FA Cup tie against Barrow.


DEAN COX 7

Former Brighton wingman Cox was another of Orient's summer arrivals to have already played under manager Russell Slade elsewhere. 23-year-old Cox was at Brighton throughout Slade's eight-month reign as Albion boss and he put pen-to-paper on a two-year deal at Brisbane Road when agreeing to make the move to E10. Cox is a product of the Brighton youth system and played 179 games for the Sussex side prior to his release in the summer of 2010. He made his Seagulls debut in August 2005 and was a first team regular up until the arrival of Gus Poyet as manager midway through last season. He scored 22 goals from those 179 Brighton games, including three against the O's and will be looking to find his way under Slade again.



RUSSELL SLADE

The **ORIENT MANAGER** will be looking to avenge an opening day defeat with a Carling Cup victory this evening. Slade is in the early stages of his tenure at Brisbane Road and will take charge of his first cup tie as O's boss tonight.

RUSSELL SLADE was appointed as manager of the O's on April 5 2010, two days after previous boss Geraint Williams parted company with the club.

Slade had previously managed Scarborough, Grimsby Town, Yeovil Town and Brighton, and took Yeovil to the League One play-off final in 2007. He was named the division's manager of the year after leading The Glovers to the final, where they were beaten 2-0

by Blackpool.

Slade, 49, arrived at Brisbane Road with Orient just one place above the League One drop zone after an alarming slump in form.

Ironically, he was pipped to promotion to League One by the O's during his time as Grimsby Town boss but it was matters at the other end of the table that were more pressing following his appointment at Orient.

Home victories over Norwich City, Stockport

County and Wycombe Wanderers ultimately proved enough to help keep Slade's new club in League 1, as they ended the season four places – and one point – above the drop zone.

Slade returned to former club Yeovil Town at the weekend and like Swindon, saw his side suffer a 2-1 defeat. Alex Revell was on the scoresheet for The O's and he will be looking to net again on familiar territory tonight.

One To Watch

Town fans will know all about **ALEX REVELL** after the striker spent a loan spell at The County Ground last term, scoring twice in the away win at Brentford in October.



REVELL was one of Russell Slade's 2010 summer signings, putting pen-to-paper on a two-year deal after turning down the chance to stay at previous club Wycombe Wanderers.

Cambridge born-Revell scored six goals in 11 starts for Wycombe during a loan spell at Adams Park at the end of last season, but could not save the Chairboys from relegation to League 2 and he chose to remain in the

higher division with Orient.

He began his career with his hometown club, but dropped into non-league with Braintree Town after being released by the U's in 2004. 35 goals for the Essex side later, he earned a move back into League football with Brighton & Hove Albion in the summer of 2006.

The goals continued to come for the 6'3" frontman at the Withdean Stadium, and Southend splashed out

£150,000 to take him to Roots Hall in January 2008. After breaking his leg against the O's in January 2009, he returned in pre-season, before joining the Robins for the first half of the last campaign.

The second part of the season saw Revell turn out for Wycombe, where he rediscovered his goalscoring touch and he opened his Orient account with a header at Yeovil Town on Saturday.

SCOTT CUTHBERT insists the Town squad are desperate to bounce back from their opening day defeat with Brighton & Hove Albion against Orient this evening.

He said: "It's massively important for us because we want to get through in the cup.

"It's important we show the fans we can get up towards the top of the league like we did last year.

"They were excited on Saturday and we've let them down but it's important not to get too disheartened.

"We were terrible in the first game last year, but we bounced back then and I'm more than confident we can do it again this year."

The defender added that he believes his new centre-back partnership with Leccsinel Jean-Francois can flourish after an encouraging display on Saturday.

He said: "Leccy had a good game on Saturday. Gordy had different qualities to him but I'm sure we can play together.

"It'll take few games to get the understanding, but we've got a settled back four already."

SUMMER signing Michael Rose was full of praise for The County Ground crowd after making his full debut for the club on Saturday.

The 28-year old, who played for Norwich City at Swindon during a 12-game loan spell last term, reflected on his first start for The Robins as well as looking ahead to the challenge of facing Leyton Orient in the Carling Cup first round.

"We had a lot of possession on Saturday and we should probably have finished a few of the chances we had, especially in the first half," he said, speaking to the matchday magazine after the game.

"It was great to get out there. The crowd kept going all the way through the game and I could hear them willing us on.

"For me personally it was disappointing to lose on my home debut for the club, but you have to move on and we will look for a positive performance against Orient.

"It's a bit of a break from the league and maybe we can get back on track with a cup win."

FORMER Town loanee Alex Revell made a goalscoring debut for Leyton Orient at the weekend but knows there is much more to come from his new club.

"We have high expectations this year and Saturday's game was below par," he told Orient Player after Saturday's encounter. "We didn't use the ball well and it was disappointing but we have

to kick on now.

"The pressure is off slightly as it's not a league game and we will come up against a passing side because Swindon like to get the ball down and play.

"The gaffer is very positive in everything he does and so are the lads here, so we will be doing all we can to get back on track and we will all be looking to do that on Tuesday night."

TOWN announced Danny Wilson as the new man in charge just hours before kick-off of the Boxing Day fixture at Brisbane Road. The players wasted little time in trying to impress, with Lee Peacock combining well with Blair Sturrock to fire home the opener inside sixty seconds. A Jack Smith penalty doubled the on the hour before Tamika Mkandawire netted a consolation eleven minutes from time.

A THIRD minute strike from Jason Demetriou proved to be the only goal of the game to deny relegation-threatened Town a share of the spoils. Town made a number of second half changes with J-P McGovern, Lloyd Macklin and Leccsinel Jean-Francois coming off the bench but Orient were able to sew up the points to aid their own League 1 safety.

GOALKEEPER Phil Smith cut a frustrated figure after Saturday's opening day defeat, but insists Town have to grasp the opportunity of cup progress this evening.

The stopper was handed a start following a thigh injury to last season's regular custodian David Lucas, but Smith was left disappointed after a double strike from former Scunthorpe middleman Matt Sparrow secured the points for the visitors.

"I don't think we played to our full potential for most of the game at the weekend," he said. "For the final third of the game we were well on top and could have taken a draw, but we were unlucky."

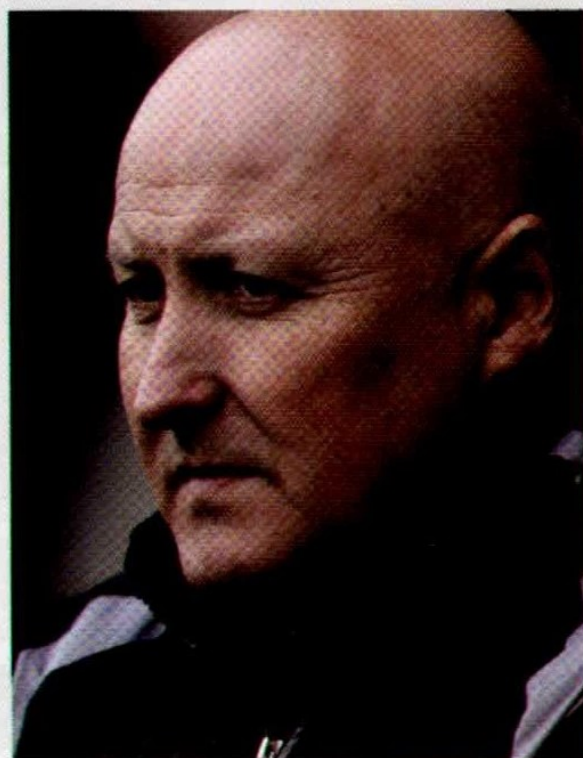

Slade, taking charge of Orient for the seventh time, offered his views on the opening day encounter ahead of tonight's cup-tie at The County Ground.

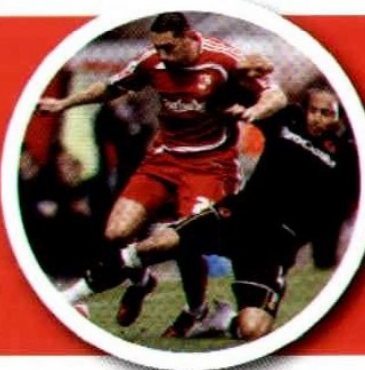

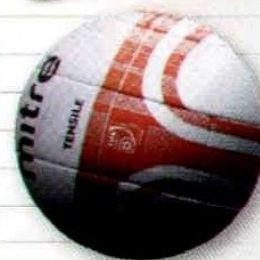

Law 2

REPLACEMENT OF A DEFECTIVE BALL

If the ball bursts or becomes defective during the course of a match:

- The match is stopped
- The match is restarted by dropping the replacement ball at the place where the original ball became defective, unless play was stopped inside the goal area, in which case the referee drops the replacement ball on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the original ball was located when play was stopped.

If the ball bursts or becomes defective whilst not in play at a kick-off, goal kick, corner kick, free kick, penalty kick or throw-in:

- The match is restarted accordingly

The ball may not be changed during the match without the authority of the referee.

In each matchday magazine this season, Town supporters will be able to get to know a little more about the match **OFFICIALS IN CHARGE** of Swindon's home games.

DANNY McDERMID

was promoted to the referees' list in 2006 after joining the National List of assistant referees in 2002.

His last game in charge of The Robins was at Plainmoor in November 2006 with Town running out 1-0 winners against Torquay United, with Christian Roberts netting a penalty to seal the three points.

Last season he officiated 32 Football League and cup games which saw 108 yellow cards issued and just four dismissals.

How did you get introduced to refereeing?

During my playing days I was injured and not quite fit enough to play. At this time I still went along to support my team when they often asked if I would run the line for them which I did and started to enjoy it. From there

a referee called Max Hanlon suggested that I should do the referee's course which I did and the bug was officially started.

What has been the highlight of your career so far?

The highlight of my career so far has been when I was selected to become a National List Referee and did my first Football League game at Peterborough United against Bristol Rovers.

What is the best game you have officiated and why?

This would have to be the Australia v Denmark international where I was the assistant referee.

What are your aims as a National List Referee?

For one day to be able to referee two Premier League Clubs either in league or cup competition.

What skills do you think you need to become a referee?

A thick skin to start with! You need to be able to manage difficult players or officials. In addition to that you have got to be fit and also be receptive to constructive criticism.

Who has been the biggest influence in your career and why?

Two people really. The

first is Peter Foakes - who was my coach and mentor during my days as a Level 2 referee. The second is Gary Willard who has been my coach and mentor during my time as a National List Referee. The reasons being that they have given me tremendous advice and helped me to develop into the referee I am today.

In your opinion who is/ was the best referee?

Howard Webb in my opinion has everything that a great referee needs in his locker. He has great man management skills not only on the field of play but also off it. It was good to see him receive his just rewards in being awarded the World Cup final appointment.

Hugh Dallas in my opinion was one of the best referee's of his time having watched him numerous times doing Celtic vs Rangers games. He only ever got it wrong when Celtic lost!

The first red card of the 2010/11 season was given to Millwall's Darren Carter. The on-loan midfielder, who joined from Championship rivals Preston North End in the summer, was shown a second yellow card just after the hour at Ashton Gate. Welcome to The County Ground for this evening's **CARLING CUP** first round tie against Leyton Orient. It goes without saying that we'll be looking to bounce back from Saturday's defeat with an improved performance and result tonight.

IT WAS a disappointing start to the season on Saturday, especially considering how much anticipation there had been surrounding the start of the year, and it was a shame that we didn't perform how we know we can.

Throughout last season we very rarely had to change our system to cope with the opposition – it was often the other way round – but on Saturday we had to change the way we set up on a few occasions because Brighton were causing us too many problems, and that illustrated to me that we played poorly.

As far as tonight is concerned, I'm sure Orient will provide as tough a test as Brighton did, and will be just as eager to progress in the competition as we are, and for exactly the same reasons.

They've made a number of signings over the summer, including Alex Revell who did a good job for us here last season, and they'll all be out to impress so we'll have to be on our game to get a result here tonight.

After tasting defeat on the opening day of the new season, **JONATHAN DOUGLAS** is determined to help his side get back on track with a win tonight.

What are your thoughts when you look back on Saturday's game?

It's still early days and whilst it wasn't good to lose the opening game of the season at home, there is plenty of time to turn things around.

We managed to get three points against them here in December and I think it was a tough 0-0 draw for the return game at their place. They added quite a few new players to their squad in the summer and I am sure they will be looking to make their mark by impressing here. If we can win the game then it will get Saturday's defeat to Brighton firmly out of our minds before we take on Hartlepool United on Saturday afternoon.

And someone you know well in the Orient squad is Alex Revell. What type of threat will he pose this evening?

Alex is a top man and did well for us when he was here last season. It was disappointing to see him leave when he did but he

is a player who can cause problems for opposition defences and we will have to keep a close eye on him. He did well during a loan spell at Wycombe at the end of last season and I saw he scored for Orient at the weekend against Yeovil. He gives everything as a player and it will be good to catch up with him.

How important could a cup run in this competition be this year?

The Carling Cup is a decent competition and we will be doing everything we can to win and secure a place in the next round, when the big boys come in. The lads know that a win against Orient could set up a tie against one of the top sides and after the experience of playing Wolves and Fulham last year in cup competitions, I am sure every effort will be given to win the game.

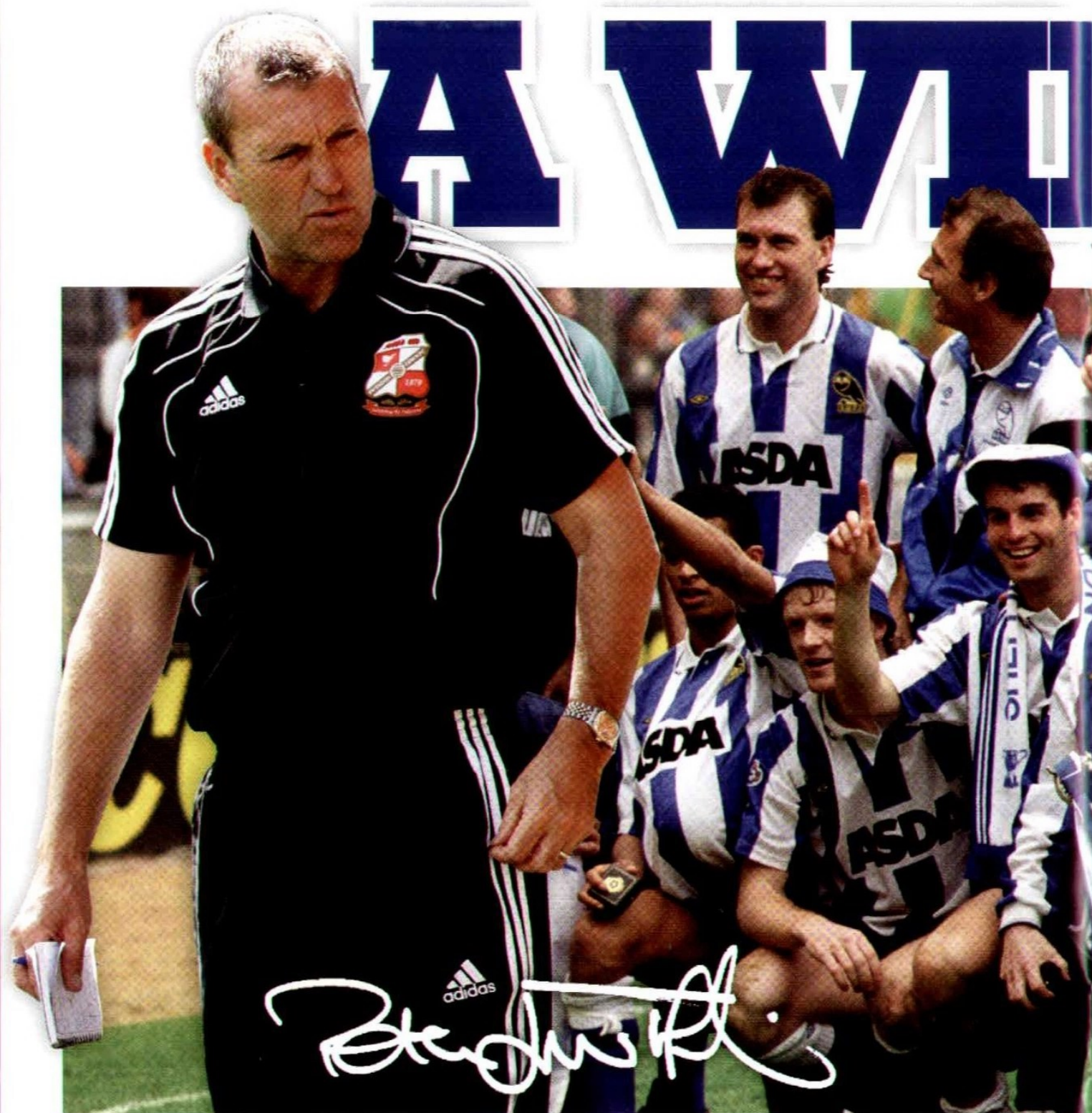

SHIRTLIFF arrived at Swindon in the summer of 2009 as assistant manager and the former defender has resumed his successful partnership with former Sheffield Wednesday teammate Danny Wilson. Shirliff made over 100 appearances for the Hillsborough club after joining from Charlton Athletic for £500,000 in 1989. Wilson too has a credible League Cup record as a player, defeating Arsenal 3-2 in the 1988 final before lifting the trophy again three years later after making the move to Hillsborough.

"I have some great memories of playing in League Cup games and remember quite a few occasions we got to the quarter and semi-finals during my time at Wednesday.

"The semi-final in 1991 was especially memorable because we beat Chelsea 5-1 over two games," Shirliff recounts.

"The team spirit at Wednesday in those days was fantastic. It was lovely to go into work every day, to train with the lads and compete in the games. The likes of 'Kinky' and Danny were very good lads and also strong characters in the dressing room. My time with Sheffield Wednesday was a very good period of my career."

It is clear that the League Cup as a competition is highly regarded by the Swindon management and Shirliff believes that a first round victory could provide the opportunity to line-up against higher division opposition once again.

"It would be nice to get through a few rounds because it is a great competition. It gets interesting the further you get and hopefully we can get through the Orient game.

"The draw of the Premier League clubs is a considerable one, but the Carling Cup is actually a competition that you can sneak quite a long way in with the luck of the draw. If you can get under the radar and put a few wins together against the so called 'lesser' sides then you could suddenly find yourself one game away from the quarter-final.

"I am a big supporter of the Carling Cup because the big clubs, when they are in Europe, don't tend to take it as seriously which gives other sides a great chance of making progress," said the 49-year old.

away from reaching round three last season with Gordon Greer's spot-kick striking the post to send Wolves through to a tie at Manchester United. Despite defeat, the memories of the midweek tie at Molineux are fresh for Shirliff, himself a former Black Country favourite.

"I remember it well. We went into the game after the defeat at Gillingham on the opening day and put in a good performance against Wolves. It was a bit disappointing to go out on penalties, but we gave a good account of ourselves."

And fresh off the back of the weekend's League 1 opener against Brighton & Hove Albion, the Robins now find themselves in action at The County Ground for the second time inside four days. Leyton Orient made a number of new additions during the summer months and after narrowly escaping the drop last term, the expectation levels have been raised in E10.

"It should be an interesting test for us. Russell (Slade) kept them up at the end

of last season when they were in danger of slipping down and I am sure they will be a bit more buoyant this season. Orient have made a number of signings in the summer and will be keen to come here and get a result.

"All clubs go into the new season with optimism but from our point of view we have to take all the positives we put together last season into the new campaign and look to do well again."

Shirliff worked with one of Orient's summer recruits at close quarters last term, with Alex Revell scoring twice in seven League 1 starts during a loan spell in Wiltshire last term.

"Alex did well for us because he trained well and he fitted in the dressing room. Some of his contributions were very good and he scored two excellent goals against Brentford

to get the win there.

"At the time we had a very successful partnership in Austin and Paynter which made it difficult to give Alex the game time that perhaps he would have liked."

Memories of cup final days at Wembley were evoked back in May as Shirliff was part of the Town management team for the League 1 play-off final.

"It was the first time I had been back since going there with Barnsley in 2000. That was for the play-off final against Ipswich Town which was actually the last competitive game at the old Wembley.

"We were on the wrong end of the scoreline in that game, so I have seen both sides of it having won and lost there with Sheffield Wednesday as well. It's a shame things didn't work out differently this year but that's gone and we move on into the new campaign. I am sure the players will benefit from the experience."

And with Town facing their second competitive fixture of the season this evening, Shirliff is hoping for a solid performance to put them in the hat for round 2 and another step towards a swift Wembley return.

"The Carling Cup is an important competition and we will be looking to win the game. The squad we have here now is strong and we will be putting a team in front of Orient that we think can win the game. We want to win the tie, end of story."
