32 teams from the North and the South take part in the first round of the regionalised competition, with Saints entering at this stage for the first time.

Last year's successful Trophy campaign began in the second round after the team had been given a bye to face Torquay United in round two.

Saints set a Football league Trophy record attendance when 9,319 supporters turned out for the club's first venture into the tournament, and after a nervy penalty shoot-out win over the Gulls, they never looked back.

Wins over Charlton, Norwich and MK Dons sealed a route to the Final, and we all know what happened there!

Should Southampton progress into the second

round again this year, they will be one of 16 teams battling it out for places in the Area Quarter Finals, before an Area semi-final and a two-legged Area Final determine who makes it to Wembley from the two regions.

The draw for the second round will take place on Saturday 4th September, with the matches then played in the week commencing 4th October.

If the scores are tied after 90 minutes this evening, there will be no extra-time and the match will go straight to a penalty shoot-out.

The Manager: **Danny Wilson**

Danny Wilson is hopeful about building on last season's successful campaign where the Robins reached the League One play-off final.

The Town boss lost the services of striker Billy Paynter and talismanic centre-half and captain, Gordon Greer in the summer, which has increased the expectation on young forward Charlie Austin to deliver again this year.

Wilson admits that after a terrific debut season in league football where Austin notched 20 goals, there will be added pressure on the 21 year-old striker.

"There's so much expectation on Charlie's shoulders and everyone expects him to score every week," the County Ground chief said.

"People forget his age, so we have to nurse him along at times.

"He's going to have a period where he doesn't score, and when that happens there are other parts of his game he has to

Charlie has already scored twice in the current campaign at the time of going to print, which has been helped by the experienced players Wilson has brought in to play alongside the former Poole Town striker.

Left-back Michael Rose and former Saints midfielder David Prutton are two of the signings that completed moves to the County Ground on the eve of the new season.

"Michael knows this league inside out and with David, he's played at big clubs and been very successful," Wilson explained.

"Michael is a tough old warrior, and David is a creative player who will get forward, he's got a terrific engine.

"David's also played at the highest level so we know that he can bring something to us."

Prutton was out of contract with Colchester at the end of June,

and his arrival has added some know-how into the Swindon midfield. He scored his first goal in Swindon's 1-1 draw with Brentford at the County Ground earlier this month.





Player Profiles:

David Lucas

32 year-old goalkeeper who began his career with Preston North End, spending 10 successful years with the Lancashire club. He also won International honours whilst at Deepdale; representing England at Under-21 level

After two loan spells with Sheffield Wednesday in 2003 he made the switch to Hillsborough a permanent one the following summer. It was to be a successful season with The Owls as he racked up 15 clean sheets in 41 appearances during the 2004/05 season.

The campaign ended with a 4-2 victory in the League One Play-Off Final against Hartlepool United - with McGovern on the scoresheet in front of almost 60,000 fans in Cardiff.

Lucas started the 2005/06 season as number one with newly-promoted Sheffield Wednesday before suffering injury. He made the switch to Yorkshire rivals Barnsley in January 2007.

A move to Leeds United followed, as he joined The Whites in September 2007. He enjoyed an extended run in the side during the first half of the 2008/09 season, which included a start against Swindon at The County

After his move to Wiltshire, Lucas started the 2009/10 season as Town's number one keeper and it proved to be a hugely successful first season at The County Ground for the shot stopper, as he made 43 appearances for Town, including a start at Wembley in the League One Play-Off Final against Millwall.

Phil Smith

Phil Smith joined Town in July 2006 from Crawley Town and made his first start for the club in the Carling Cup defeat by Brentford in August 2006.

A dependable customer, his heroics between the sticks for the '06-'07 didn't go unnoticed by the fans, who named him their Player of the Season in May 2007.

Smith had made over 50 appearances for The Robins before the start of the 2008/2009 season. He enjoyed regular spells in the side in September. November and December but after losing his place to Peter Brezovan in the New Year, returned to the starting

The 30-year-old endured a frustrating campaign in 2009/2010 in the face of David Lucas' imperious form but still made some telling contributions to the campaign, not least in the Play-Off Semi-Final second leg against Charlton Athletic at The Valley, in which he made a string of excellent saves and helped Town secure a place at Wembley.

Mark Scott

19-year old goalkeeper who is yet to make his first team debut for The Robins, but will look to take his chance during the current campaign.

The stopper started his career with Saints as an eight-year old and spent six years with us before being

performances caught the eye of Aldershot Town FC.

After a year with The Shots, he made a move to Swindon in the summer of 2007. He established himself in the youth team during the 2007/08 season and also played in a number of reserve games.

2008/09 started well for Scott, who was included on the bench for the League One encounter with Leeds United in September 2008 after an injury to Peter Brezovan.

The 6'2 stopper spent a loan spell with Chippenham Town during the early stages of the 2009/10 campaign where he gained further experience at first team level.

Jakub Jefionkowski

Young Polish goalkeeper who joined Swindon last year to provide fierce

and youth graduate Mark Scott. He was unable to find a way into Swindon's first team throughout his debut season., He did however, act as cover on the substitute's bench for the league games against Colchester, Oldham, Norwich, Southend and Saints

Jesionkowski has represented his native Poland at youth international level playing for both the Under-19's and Under-21's while playing for former club Zag bie Lubin.

Scott Cuthbert

The 22-year old defender came up through the ranks at Celtic Park and captained the club's Under 19 and reserve teams

The defender joined St. Mirren on a season-long loan deal in 2008/2009 and made 28 league starts for the club before returning to Celtic.

Cuthbert also has experience of International football having captained the Scotland Under 19 side that reached the final of the UEFA Under 19 Championships in 2006.

He also represented the Scotland Under 20 team that played at the 2007 World Cup in Canada, and played for Scotland's 'B' side as recently as May 2009.

He went on to become one of the first names on Danny Wilson's team sheet throughout the season, forming an impressive central defensive partnership with former Town captain Gordon Greer

Michael Rose

Arrived at Town on a free transfer from Stockport County in June 2010.

Rose spent three months on loan at 2009/2010's League One Champions Norwich City and having made nearly 300 Football League appearances, brought valuable experience to Danny Wilson's defensive unit.

Rose started his career at Manchester United, before spending the next six years making over 40 appearances for Chester City, Hereford United and Yeovil Town respectively.

He then spent two short loan spells at Cheltenham Town and Scunthorpe United, before joining Stockport County in the summer of 2006, where he became a fans' favourite, making over 100 appearances at Edgeley Park.

The left-back featured twice against Town last season - during the 1-0 victory over Stockport County at Edgeley Park, and the 1-1 draw with Norwich City at The County Ground.

Jonathan Douglas

Club captain Jonathan Douglas signed for Town on a free transfer in July 2009 following his release from Leeds United

He made the switch to Elland Road in August 2005 and made 32 league starts during the season, before making the move permanent a year later, signing a three-year deal for an undisclosed fee at the beginning of the 2006/2007 season.

It was a successful spell in Yorkshire for the Irishman, as he made over 100 league appearances in Leeds colours before agreeing to the switch to The County Ground. Douglas also has International experience, having represented the Republic of Ireland at both Under 21 and senior level. He made his debut for the Republic of Ireland side when he came on as a substitute against Poland in 2004.

The 28-year-old was a near everpresent for Town in Season 2009/2010, making 45 appearances for the club during the campaign.

Paul Caddis

Paul Caddis signed alongside fellow Celtic youth team graduate Simon Ferry in August 2010 for a combined undisclosed fee.

The 22-year-old penned a three-year deal, and his capture concluded a lengthy pursuit from Danny Wilson.

Caddis can play in many different positions, but is predominantly a right-sided defender.

Along with fellow Robins Ferry and Scott Cuthbert, Caddis came through the ranks at Celtic and enjoyed much success at youth team level, before making 25 appearances for the Bhoys in 2009/2010, including starts in the Champions League.

Jon-Paul McGovern

Lively winger who joined the Robins three years ago to the day. McGovern can operate out wide or through the middle, and was brought to the club by former Saints boss Paul Sturrock.

McGovern began his career as a trainee at Celtic but was released by the Scottish giants after one season and subsequently signed for Livingston in July 2003 after a successful loan spell in England with Sheffield United.



A promising season for 'Livi' saw Sheffield Wednesday come in for the midfielder who joined Paul Sturrock's squad in time for the start of the 2004/2005 season.

He was an ever-present during the promotion winning campaign and scored the first goal at the Millennium Stadium to help secure promotion for a side that also included David Lucas.

Having been signed by Sturrock again at Town, McGovern made an immediate impression from the rightwing, before being moved into a more central role by Sturrock's replacement Maurice Malpas.

After Malpas had been sacked midway through Season 2008/2009, McGovern struggled to hold down a place in the side under Danny Wilson, and looked set to leave the club.

However, a stunning goal in the 4-1 Carling Cup win at MK Dons helped him cement a place in the side, and he never looked back

The popular winger enjoyed his best season for the club in 2009/2010, playing 47 games and proving instrumental as Danny Wilson's side reached the League 1 Play-Off Final.

Simon Ferry

22 year-old Ferry made the permanent switch from Celtic this summer following a hugely successful loan season at SN1 in 2009/2010, making 42 starts and scoring twice in Town's play-off campaign.

Having joined Celtic at the age of 12, Ferry progressed through the ranks at Parkhead along with Caddis and Scott Cuthbert, enjoying much success.

However, he was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury. and 2009/2010 was his first full season of professional football, a season in which he was agonisingly close to SUCCESS

His signing brought to an end Town's summer-long pursuit of the diminutive Scot, who had made no secret of his desire to return to the club after his loan spell had ended in May.

Vincent Pericard

Former Saint who rejected the offer of a contract extension at Carlisle United. in favour of a move to The County Ground in the January transfer window earlier this year.

27-year old Pericard, who had scored four goals in 10 League One starts at Brunton Park prior to joining Town, agreed terms on a one-and-a-half year deal at SN1. He first came to England when he signed for Portsmouth on loan from Juventus in 2002 and became an instant hit at Fratton Park scoring nine goals in 18 starts for

He eventually signed a permanent deal in the summer of 2003 but injury problems hampered his progress. He then had loan spells with Sheffield United and Plymouth Argyle as he regained fitness.

Pericard joined Stoke City on a threevear deal in the summer of 2006 and became Tony Pulis' first signing at The Brittania Stadium. He scored on his home debut against Derby County and followed that up with the winner against Sunderland in October.

Following loan spells with Saints and Millwall in early 2009, he joined Greg

Abbott's Carlisle United on a shortterm contract in October 2009.

The big striker made his Swindon debut off the bench against Gillingham in a 3-1 win, and won a penalty during his 22 minute appearance.

However the remainder of the campaign proved frustrating for Pericard, as injury and lack of form saw him start just twice without breaking his duck, and he will be hoping to have a more productive season in 2010/2011.

David Prutton

Another former Saint who joined Swindon just this summer.

Prutton is a product of Nottingham Forest's youth system, and brings plenty of versatility and experience to Town's midfield.

He made over 155 senior team appearances with Nottingham Forest and also gained England Under- 21 international honours, making 25 appearances between 2001 and 2004.

He moved to Saints for a £2.5million transfer in 2003 before joining Leeds United as a free agent during 2007.

He made 41 appearances and scored four goals during his debut season with Leeds in 2007/08 and established himself as a crowd favourite.

The Hull-born middle-man was unable to hold down a regular place the following season.

The 2009/10 campaign began with regular appearances off the Leeds bench before a move to Colchester United on loan in January 2010.

He scored within two minutes of his U's debut with a goal in the 2-0 home win over MK Dons before signing a permanent deal until the end of the campaign in early February.

Now Prutton has linked up with former Leeds United teammates Jonathan Douglas and David Lucas upon moving to Wiltshire.

Michael Timlin

Former Town manager Maurice Malpas dipped into the transfer market with the addition of Michael Timlin from Fulham in May 2008.

He started his career at Craven Cottage as a left-winger but was converted to central midfield by then Academy Director, Steve Kean.

The switch paid remarkable dividends for Timlin as he made rapid progress through the Academy's ranks, and then on to the international stage with the Republic of Ireland.

Timlin initially arrived at The County

Ground on loan in November 2006 and went on to make 24 appearances as Town won promotion from League Two.

Timlin then made the permanent switch to Wiltshire in the summer of 2008

A regular in his first full season in a Town shirt, Timlin struggled to hold down a first team slot in 2009/2010 in the face of the excellent performances given by Jonathan Douglas and Simon Ferry.

Sean Morrison

Young defender Morrison was handed a call up to the first team and made appearances against Gillingham and Millwall at the end of Season 2007/2008.

The defender benefited greatly from the advice passed on from former Town defensive coach Ady Williams before his departure, and went on to make 18 first team starts under Maurice Malpas and Danny Wilson in 2008/2009.

Morrison began last season with great promise, lining up alongside Gordon Greer and scoring the winner in a 1-0 win over Saints at The County Ground. However, the form of Scott Cuthbert curtailed his first team opportunities, and despite a successful two-month loan spell at Southend United, he found his chances to make an impression limited.

He signed a one-year contract extension alongside fellow youth team graduate Callum Kennedy in January 2010.

Kevin Amankwaah

Kevin Amankwaah signed for Town on a two-year deal from Championship side Swansea City in the summer of 2008.

At 6'1 he added height to the backline and soon made the right-back slot his own after being reunited with his former boss at Bristol City, Danny Wilson in early 2009.

The defender was a near everpresent in the latter half of Season 2008/2009, and after Smith was released in the summer, he cemented his place as first choice right-back at the start of 2009/2010.

38 consecutive appearances then followed before a hamstring injury and the arrival of Liverpool loanee Stephen Darby kept Amankwaah out of the side until the Play-Off Final against Millwall.

David Ball

Young Manchester City forward David Ball signed a six-month loan deal at The County Ground in July 2010, just in time to travel with the squad for their pre-season tour of Austria.

20-year-old Ball has been on the books at Eastlands since a young age, and was named on the bench for the Manchester derby towards the back end of the 2009/2010 season.

But, with first team opportunities at a premium in the face of City's talented squad, Ball decided to make the move to The County Ground and to try and impress in Town's colours before his potential return to Lancashire in January.

Callum Kennedy

Former Reading youngster Callum Kennedy was first granted a taste of first team action by former Town boss Paul Sturrock

The youngster made a surprise start in the 4-1 win over Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in September 2007.

Kennedy was handed a chance to impress in pre-season with games against Cardiff City and Plymouth Argyle in 2008

Numerous substitute appearances then followed in 2008/2009, before he made his full debut against Carlisle United at the start of December 2008.

He was awarded a new one-year contract in the summer of 2009 and competed with Lecsinel Jean-Francois for the left-back slot before a pelvic injury sustained mid-way through the season kept him on the sidelines for the remainder of it.


Despite his lack of first team action in the face of injury and the form of loanee Alan Sheehan, Kennedy signed a new one-year deal in January 2010.

Alan O'Brien

The 25-year old Irish winger joined Town from Scottish Premier League side Hibernian and also has five caps for the Republic of Ireland to his name.

He joined Newcastle United from St Joseph's Boys club in Ireland and progressed through the youth ranks at St. James' Park.

He won the Under 17's title with the Magpies, defeating Manchester United



5-2 in the final over two legs. His impressive performances in the youth team were enough to secure a regular run in the Newcastle reserve team during the 2003/04 season, before a broken leg in July 2004 stalled his progress.

A determined attitude during his recovery saw O'Brien return to action the following season where he earned a place in the first team squad before being loaned out to Carlisle United in October 2005.

He scored within 10 minutes of his debut for The Cumbrians and featured in five games at Brunton Park.

O'Brien was handed his debut for Newcastle United in an FA Cup tie against Mansfield Town in January 2006. A full Premier League appearance soon followed, two weeks later when he played 90 minutes against West Ham United.

The winger then moved to Hibernian followed in the summer of 2007. His first season in a Town shirt was a frustrating one however, starting as he did just four games for Danny Wilson's side.

A recurrent hamstring problem put paid to any hopes of a prolonged run in the first team, but O'Brien believes he has got to the bottom of the issue, and will be determined to make an impact during the remainder of his time at The County Ground.

Lecsinel Jean-Francois

Lecsinel Jean-Francois is a 22-year old Haiti international who began his footballing career in France, playing

for the reserve teams of Paris Saint Germain and Sedan. He had a spell during 2006 on loan at SPL side Falkirk

After impressing in numerous reserve games for Town during before playing for Lique 2 club Guingamp, the 2008/2009 season. Jean-François signed a deal until the end of the season, and made his full debut off the bench in a League One clash at Millwall in January.

Further performances during the remainder of the campaign were enough to secure a new contract and he began the 2009/10 campaign at leftback. He made 28 starts for Town during the campaign, gaining cult hero status among some sections of The County Ground support.

Thomas Dossevi

Togolese striker Thomas Dossevi signed a one-year deal at The County Ground in this summer impressing during a trial.

The 31-year-old scored a brace in the pre-season friendly against Nottingham Forest, and was a Town player just three days later.

Dossevi has represented Stade Reims, Valenciennes and Nantes during his time in French football, and having been released from the latter during the summer of 2010, he decided to try and make an impact in English football.

Having been born in France, the striker has 25 caps for his naturalised nation Togo, including an appearance in the 2006 World Cup.

Nathan Thompson

Having been part of a successful youth team set up in 2008-2009, Nathan Thompson signed a two-year professional contract in the summer of 2009.

The youngster appeared among the substitutes on a number of occasions in Season 2009/2010, but did not feature for the first team due to the impressive form of fellow right-backs Kevin Amankwaah and Stephen Darby.

Thompson's performances in the vouth team had brought interest from Premiership giants Arsenal and Chelsea, as he impressed alongside the likes of Sean Morrison, Kurt Hammonds and Mark Scott.

Billy Bodin

The son of Town legend and Under 18's manager Paul, Billy Bodin signed his first professional contract at The County Ground in 2010, alongside

fellow youth team graduate Will Evans.

Bodin has progressed through the ranks at the club, having played from Under 9 level upwards in red and white.

He was top scorer for both the Under 18 and reserve teams at The County Ground in Season 2009/2010, and was rewarded with a one-year deal by manager Danny Wilson.

The 18-year-old, who can play as both a left-winger and a striker, already has international honours to his name, having represented Wales at both Under 18 and Under-21 level.

Charlie Austin

21 year-old striker Charlie Austin joined the Robins from Poole Town for an undisclosed fee in October

He arrived at The County Ground with an impressive scoring record and hit 46 goals in 46 games for Poole in 2008/2009.

After scoring six goals in six reserve games. Austin was given his full debut from the bench against Norwich City at Carrow Road, and has not looked back since.

The former Reading trainee initially signed a deal until the end of the season, but after what was a hugely impressive start was offered a twoyear extension to his deal - which he duly signed.

His whole-hearted performances and formidable strike partnership with Billy Paynter meant that, by the end of Season 2009/2010, Austin had gone from an unknown amateur to a local hero after scoring 20 goals in 31 starts.

Will Evans

Centre-back Will Evans signed a one-year professional deal with Town in July 2010.

He did so alongside fellow youth team graduate Billy Bodin, with both players having been influential in the youth team's Championship winning 2009/2010 squad.

The 18-year-old, who hails from Cricklade, represented Fairford Town before being snapped up by Town and progressing through the Centre of Excellence at The County Ground.





Emergency Procedures

Important announcements will be notified to spectators by means of the public address system.

- The announcement will be preceded by a loud warning signal.
- Listen carefully to the announcement and be ready to respond in a calm and controlled manner.
- Stewards and/or police officers will assist by directing spectators to the nearest safe exit where necessary.
- Please remain calm and keep gangways and exits clear.

Standing in seated areas

The current legislation is very clear. Persistent standing in seated areas is in breach of the Ground Regulations which are required under the Safety Certificate that allows the Club to operate St. Mary's Stadium.

GROUND REGULATION 13 STATES:

Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.

Ground Regulations, including Regulation 13 are posted by each turnstile and ticket holders have made an undertaking to observe this and all other ground regulations when purchasing their tickets.

The reasons for the outlawing of standing in seated areas are clear:

- It is not safe and can lead to a "domino" effect as seat backs provide insufficient support to prevent fans toppling forward.
- It interferes with the enjoyment of other fans who may want to sit down during the game.

The Club recognises that supporters may stand at exciting times of the match but that at all other times, supporters should sit.

Supporter Behaviour

Some supporters attending away fixtures are giving Southampton Football Club a tarnished reputation. Please behave appropriately at all away matches or you may receive a ban from St. Mary's Stadium and from purchasing away tickets.

Remember, if you have purchased a ticket, you are responsible for the behaviour of the person using that ticket!

Please observe the Ground Regulations and comply with stewards' requests. We all have a duty to keep St. Mary's Stadium operating within the current legal requirements.

- The use of foul and abusive language (including racial abuse) is in breach of Ground Regulation 9 & 10.
- Smoking is not permitted in the stadium.
- Please leave the stadium and surrounding area quietly after the match.

We remind fans it is a criminal offence to throw any object towards the pitch, track or spectator areas. This could cause serious injury and could also lead to disciplinary action against the Club. We will not tolerate this sort of behaviour and will have no hesitation in banning any supporter found guilty of this.




