IN TOWN

TONIGHT

BRISTOL ROVERS arrive at The County Ground on the back of four wins in their last five games. With plenty of links between the two sides, tonight's encounter will also see the Robins look to avenge a double defeat during the 2009/10 campaign.

THE Pirates made a nightmare start to the season, losing their opening two matches at Peterborough United and Oxford United - conceding nine goals and scoring only one in the process.

However a 2-1 win over local rivals Yeovil Town, and a credible 2-2 away draw against Exeter City soon followed, and instilled a renewed sense of confidence at The Memorial Stadium after what was a disastrous opening to the campaign.

A 4-0 roasting at home to Southampton completed an indifferent first month of

Season 2010/2011 for the Pirates, but the result also signalled the start of a run of six league games from which Rovers have taken 11 points and suffered just one defeat: a 1-0 reverse away to Tranmere Rovers.

Consecutive draws against Oldham Athletic (1-1) and Brentford (0-0) preceded consecutive wins over Dagenham & Redbridge (3-0) and Notts County (2-1) in September before the defeat at Prenton Park; a series of results which has seen the Rovers make a steady ascent of the sporadic League 1 table.

Perhaps the most

impressive result in their recent run came at The Galpharm Stadium last weekend, with a last minute winner from Will Hoskins winner claiming a 1-0 victory over promotion favourites Huddersfield Town, and Tuesday's 1-0 Johnstone's Paint Trophy triumph over Aldershot Town brings the Pirates into tonight's clash full of confidence.

Neither set of fans will need any reminding of the two clashes between the sides last season, with Rovers claiming 3-0 and 4-0 wins at The Memorial Stadium and The County Ground respectively.

BRISTOL ROVERS

made a number of astute additions to the ranks during the summer months with the likes of Wayne Brown, James

Tunicliffe and Will Hoskins all set to feature in tonight's derby encounter.



MIKE GREEN 13

The goalkeeper was one of five Filton College scholars awarded a professional contract in the summer of 2006. He was a regular member of the reserve team for three seasons and was on the bench for the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final at the Millennium Stadium and the play-off final at Wembley in 2006/07.



CARL REGAN 2

A right-back with pace and experience, with almost 200 league games to his name, Regan can play in either full-back position or as a central defender. He made his Rovers debut in the first game of the 2009/10 season, against Leyton Orient, after joining on a free transfer from MK Dons.



MIKKEL ANDERSEN 1

Goalkeeper Mikkel Andersen first joined Rovers on transfer deadline day, 1st September 2009. The highly rated Reading shot stopper eventually had his loan spell extended until the end of the season and made a total of 39 league appearances. A popular player with Rovers supporters, he picked up the Young Player of the Year Award.

It was hoped that he would return on loan at the start of the current season, but the uncertainty over his future meant that manager Paul Trollope searched elsewhere for a shot stopper and signed West Brom's Luke Daniels on a season-long loan. After Daniels returned to the Midlands, Andersen was allowed to return to Rovers – after signing a new deal with the Royals.



WAYNE BROWN 14

Brown signed a two-year contract with the club in the summer of 2010, although he first arrived at The Memorial Stadium in February on loan from Fulham, making his debut in the 5-0 defeat at Leyton Orient a day later. A very versatile player, he can play in all positions across midfield.



STUART CAMPBELL 7

A midfielder with plenty of experience, Campbell lists Leicester City, Birmingham City and Grimsby Town as his former clubs. After joining Rovers in June 2004 on a free transfer, he is now the club's longest serving player and has won 15 caps for Scotland at U21 level.



CHRIS LINES 4

Midfielder Lines trained with the first team squad for much of the 2004/05 season, even though he was a still a third year scholar at Filton College. After completing his studies he was awarded a pro contract in January 2006 and made his long awaited first team debut against Chester City later that month.



CHARLIE REECE 20

A central midfielder, Reece was originally with Aston Villa and on his release from Villa Park he joined Filton College. He then progressed to the Rovers reserve side before making his league debut for the club when going on as a second half substitute against Carlisle on 29th December 2007.


JAMES TUNICLIFFE 6

The central defender joined in the summer of 2010, arriving on a season-long loan from League 1 rivals Brighton & Hove Albion. He graduated through the youth system at Stockport County and made his first team debut in a 2-0 defeat against Notts County in 2005 when only 16. He joined Albion in July 2009.


DANNY COLES 5

Equally adept in the backline or in midfield, Coles started out with Bristol City and went onto make 141 league starts before a £200,000 switch to Hull City in July 2005. After joining Rovers on loan in November 2007, he made the move a permanent one at the start of the following year.


BYRON ANTHONY 15

The defender came up through the ranks at Cardiff City and signed his first pro deal in July 2003 before being released at the end of the 2005/06 season. He spent pre season on trial with Rovers and was given a one-year contract just before the start of the 2005/06 campaign. He is now an established member of the squad.


DOMINIC BLIZZARD 16


The midfielder began his career with Watford although was released after making 22 appearances in a six-year spell with the Vicarage Road club. He spent loan spells at Stockport County and MK Dons during his time with the Hornets and signed for Rovers from Stockport in the summer of 2009 on a three-year deal.

INTERESTING FACT!

The Pirates is a name derived from Bristol's status as a seafaring city and its association with some notorious Pirates from a bygone age. The term Gasheads is a nickname coined by local rivals Bristol City and refers to the gasworks behind what used to be Rovers home ground, Eastville.


JO KUFFOUR 17

A livewire striker, Kuffour began his career with Arsenal and spent a loan spell at The County Ground during his days at Highbury. He arrived at The Memorial Stadium after stints with Torquay United, Brentford and AFC Bournemouth and has a one in four strike ratio with just over 270 league starts to his name.


JOHN AKINDE 9

Akinde arrived at The Memorial Stadium at the end of August, on loan from Bristol City until January 2011. The frontman joined the ranks at Ashton Gate from Ebbsfleet United in September 2008 although has just one start to his name in a City shirt so far. He is yet to open his Rovers account.



WILL HOSKINS 8

Former Watford striker Hoskins arrived at The Memorial Stadium in the summer of 2010, having signed a two-year contract.

Born in Nottingham, the 24-year old began his career with Rotherham United, for whom he scored 23 goals in 73 league appearances before a move to Watford in January 2007.

In fact the Hornets made a double swoop on Rotherham, signing Lee Williamson at the same time as Hoskins, paying a combined fee of £1.2million to the Millers for both players.

He has also had loan spells with Millwall and Nottingham Forest. The striker made his league debut for Rovers on the opening day of the current season and scored the winner in the recent 1-0 away triumph at Huddersfield Town.



FORMER Town midfielder Trollope arrives at The County Ground after a successful run of games against the Robins as Rovers boss. Will history repeat itself this evening?

AN accomplished central midfielder, Trollope enjoyed a long and successful career which began as a trainee with Swindon. Unable to make the breakthrough into the first team, a move to Torquay, in March 1992, kick started his professional career.

After more than 100 league appearances at Plainmoor, he moved to Derby County in December 1994. Whilst with the Rams, he made 65 first team appearances as well as spending time on

loan at Grimsby Town and Crystal Palace.

A move to Fulham came about in November 1997 and in over four years at Craven Cottage, he made 78 league appearances, 20 of which were in their Second Division Championship season of 1997/98 and 10 in 2000/01 when the London side clinched the First Division title.

After a brief spell with Coventry, towards the end of the 2001/02 season, he moved to Northampton

Town in July 2002 and was immediately appointed club captain.

After joining Rovers in the summer of 2004, he appeared in 30 league games during the 2004/05 campaign. Transfer listed by manager Ian Atkins in March 2005, he was appointed player/coach to assist the manager in August of that year.

Atkins was relieved of his duties in September and Trollope was appointed caretaker manager before

becoming first team coach in November 2005, when the club appointed Lennie Lawrence as Director of Football, assuming responsibility for team training, selection and tactics

In September 2009, Trollope was given a new 12-month rolling contract and the title of manager,

One To Watch

With seven Northern Ireland caps to his name, midfielder **JEFF HUGHES** has impressed during a two-season spell with Rovers to date.



THE midfielder began his career at Larne, Northern Ireland, and signed for Lincoln in the summer of 2005 before joining Crystal Palace in 2007. However when Peter Taylor, the manager who took him to Selhurst Park, was replaced by Neil Warnock, he went on loan to Peterborough United in November 2007 and made seven league appearances whilst at London Road.


He first joined Rovers, on

loan, in March 2008 but was injured in a reserve team match before he could make his first team debut although he returned to The Memorial Stadium to sign a three-year contract in the summer of 2008.

Last season he missed just two league games, scoring 13 goals in all competitions, and became the club's regular penalty taker. He scored both home and away in League 1 against Swindon last term.

This term Hughes has been a regular fixture in the Rovers midfield and he has helped his side make a solid start to the new campaign, with the Pirates having won four out of their last five games.

Hughes, who scored eight goals during his time with Lincoln City, hit a hat-trick in the League 1 clash at Dagenham & Redbridge back in August. Town fans will hope he fails to add to his tally by full-time tonight.

SIMON Ferry believes Tuesday's win over Torquay United in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy has given the club the boost it needs after last Saturday's disappointing defeat at Dagenham & Redbridge.

The midfielder, who went close to scoring on two occasions in mid-week said: "A win always lifts you.

"We know Saturday wasn't good enough, but we got a good result on Tuesday and hopefully we can kick on from that now.

"Torquay tried to play and passed it a lot more than Dagenham which suited us a lot more, and that confidence from Tuesday will help us against Bristol Rovers."

Ferry added that he and his teammates need to return to last season's form if they are to replicate the successes of last term.

"We need to start getting back to last season – grinding wins out like we did, rather than collapsing like we did at Dagenham," he admitted.

"Maybe we need to be a bit stronger, and I think we can definitely be that – starting against Bristol Rovers."

FORMER Town loanee Jo Kuffour who played 13 games for the Robins after joining on loan from Arsenal in August 2001, has hit two goals so far this term and believes his side have what it takes to continue their good league form which has seen Rovers win four out of their last five games.

"We know the game with Swindon will be a tough one,"

said the 28-year old. "The gaffer seems to have found a team and a shape that works and things are going well for us. We have a good team that is clicking into place but we don't want to get too carried away.

"I have a good record against Swindon generally, but that's in the past and we are going to have to work hard on Monday night."



David Prutton



DAVID Prutton is hoping to draw on his experiences of some of the biggest local derbies in the country this evening.

The 28-year-old, who returns from suspension, has taken part in both the Nottingham Forest vs. Derby County and Southampton vs. Portsmouth clashes during his career, and knows exactly what to expect from his first West Country derby tonight.

He said: "Southampton v Pompey was pretty nasty to be fair, and Forest v Derby was a bit of a tasty one too!

"I'm under no illusions about what these games mean to people, and how important they are in the local area.

"As footballers you move around to different places, but the passion from the fans always translates onto the pitch in derbies and really inspires your performance."


"The whole team is defending well and putting in a lot of running throughout games to ensure we defend together, from front to back. You have to be very fit to do that and every player is putting in the effort."

Knowledge of the laws of the game and very good man management skills.



Law 15

THE THROW-IN

At the moment of delivering the ball, the thrower:

- faces the field of play
- has part of each foot either on the touch line or on the ground outside the touch line
- holds the ball with both hands
- delivers the ball from behind and over his head
- delivers the ball from the point where it left the field of play

All opponents must stand no less than 2 m (2 yds) from the point at which the throw-in is taken.

The ball is in play when it enters the field of play.

After delivering the ball, the thrower must not touch the ball again until it has touched another player.

SEEING RED!

Bristol Rovers have had two players sent off so far this season. Danny Coles saw red four minutes from time in the 1-1 away draw at Oldham Athletic in early September whilst former Plymouth Argyle defender Gary Sawyer was dismissed during the recent home clash with Brentford. David Prutton leads the Town dismissal list after red cards against MK Dons in August and in the recent home League 1 clash with Plymouth Argyle.

Good evening and welcome back to The County Ground for this evening's local derby with **BRISTOL ROVERS**. We're coming off the back of a good win over Torquay on Tuesday, so hopefully that will serve us well tonight.

EVERY win is vital, but when you've come off the back of two defeats, as we had done on Tuesday, it makes a victory all the more crucial.


So it was a big relief we got the result in the game against Torquay, not least because it was a tricky tie in which we managed to score a couple of good goals and create a number of chances.

Prior to kick-off, the monthly Board meeting took place, followed by a County



A Low Carbon Game


TONIGHT is Town's first ever Low Carbon Football Game in a bid to raise awareness and provide education to the issue surrounding Climate Change.





AFTER moving from Fratton Park back in February, Ritchie was looking forward to simultaneously gaining match fitness and making a contribution to Town's promotion push.

However, in the face of fellow winger and Bolton Wanderers loanee Danny Ward's sensational form, Ritchie found both of these objectives difficult to achieve, and despite enjoying his time at SN1, the youngster admits it was a difficult period.

"Obviously when I was first here Wardy was absolutely flying," he said, "and with the team winning week in, week out there was nothing I could do really.

"It was frustrating of course which would be the same as anywhere when you're not playing, but I did enjoy my time here.

"All the players are top, top lads and it was good to get to know everyone, which makes it easier coming in for a second time as I'm doing now."

Ritchie's first spell at the club came to a bizarrely abrupt end, with Portsmouth recalling him while Town were en route to the north-east for the League 1 clash with Hartlepool United.

This resulted in the winger having to alight from the team coach in Yorkshire and board a train from Barnsley, in an effort to reach White Hart Lane in time for Pompey's Premiership clash with Tottenham Hotspur - for which he was an unused substitute.

"All the lads are top, top lads and it was good to get to know everyone, which makes it easier coming in for a second time."



"It was a little bit strange and I wasn't expecting it to finish like that, that's for sure!" he admits.

"I was a bit disappointed to go because the lads were doing so well, but that's the way things work out in football sometimes."

After his return to Fratton Park, Ritchie went on to feature in two top-flight clashes in a Pompey side already doomed to relegation, and despite his side's miserable campaign, the youngster is grateful for having gained what he believes is valuable experience.


"I went back to Portsmouth and got a few games under my belt there which I think has benefited me coming into this year," he said.

"They were tough circumstances to be playing under at Portsmouth what with everything that was going on.

"But as a player you've just got to put all that behind you and give 110% which is what I did.

"It gave me a taste of it (playing in the Premiership), and how hard you have to work to make it at that level. So it was good to get a sniff of it, and it's made me strive to want it even more."

And Ritchie admits to having watched his former Town teammates progress to Wembley while he plied his trade back in Hampshire.



He said: "When I looked back at Swindon last year I was really pleased to see them doing well because it's a good club with a great set of lads and managing staff.

"It's always good to see a club that you've been involved with succeed, and I was delighted for everyone here.

"But at the same time I was just concentrating on myself and making sure I was developing, which I'd like to think I've done, and I'm hoping to show that during this month."

The start of Season 2010/2011 saw Ritchie comfortably within the first team reckoning under new Pompey boss Steve Cotterill, but with his parent club having made a number of signings in recent weeks the youngster has fallen down the pecking order, and is looking forward to getting some much needed match minutes during his time at The County Ground.

"I got a few games there (at Portsmouth) towards the end of last season, and at the start of this season but that's stopped now because they've have signed some more players so my chance of game time has decreased quite a bit," he said.

"So myself and the manager at Portsmouth decided it was best for me to come back out on loan and get some games, which I'm looking forward to getting at Swindon now.

"I got a few games there towards the end of last season, and at the start of this season."

"It's good to be back here, and it's good to be playing football most importantly, because hopefully I will get the chances to play here that I wasn't getting at Portsmouth."

With both Premiership and Championship experience having been added to his CV since he was last at The County Ground, Ritchie is better placed than most to assess his temporary teammates' ability to make the step up, and he believes there is enough in the Town changing room to progress to the next level this year.

"League 1 and the Championship are both very good, and very tough leagues with some excellent players in there, so you've got to be on the ball all the time," he said.

"It (the Championship) is a little bit quicker, but to be honest I don't think there's that much of a difference between the two.

"This is why I've come back here because I feel I can still learn a lot from the players here.

"We've got a great squad here with a lot of experience and youth in it which is exactly what you need, and I really think we can push on and make a real go at

promotion this season."

Despite having only been back in Wiltshire for a week, Ritchie is delighted to have settled comfortably back into life at SN1, and draws many parallels between this season and last within most aspects of the club.

"There's the same atmosphere around the club as last year, and there's still that good vibe around the place," he said.

"Obviously there've been a few changes in the squad, but it still feels a good place to be and hopefully that can continue.


"There are a lot of people who were here last year which has made it easier to settle back in, and there is some quite good banter in the changing room, which is always good for the team!"

And having impressed during his debut against Torquay United in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy second round on Tuesday, Ritchie is determined to replicate that showing at every opportunity during his second stay in Wiltshire.

"I think I did ok on Tuesday, and it was nice to get back into it," he said.

"I tired a bit in the second half and there wasn't much energy left in my legs to be honest! But I was still pretty pleased with it overall.

"Those minutes under my belt are all crucial though, and the more I play the fitter I'll get, so hopefully Tuesday's game will have stood me in good stead to put in some good performances for Swindon."

Where are they now?

PETER EASTOE

After a successful loan spell at The County Ground, Tamworth-born striker Eastoe joined Town for a club record fee of £88,000 in March 1974, and he left two years later having repaid every penny.

HAVING notched 51 goals in just 108 appearances for the Robins in the mid-'70s, Eastoe is a County Ground legend, and he recalls his time at Town with great delight, keen to express how much he owes the club that gave him a chance after he had failed to break into the first team at Wolverhampton Wanderers.

"They were great memories, and Swindon was a great club to be at – whenever I open the paper on a Sunday I always look for their result," he said.

"I think if I hadn't have moved to Swindon I probably wouldn't have been the same player for the rest of my career really."

Eastoe initially joined the club on loan, and despite scoring eight goals, could not prevent the club's relegation to the Third Division.

However, it is his 31 goals in Season 1974/1975 for which he will be most fondly remembered by Town fans, as he fired the club into fourth position – narrowly missing out on promotion.

"The first season was a bit difficult, but it always is because it takes a while to settle down into the area and the way the team play," he said.

"But then the second season was brilliant because I'd settled down and I scored 26 league goals, and five FA Cup goals. That season was the springboard to my career really.

"It was a shame we didn't get promotion, but there were a lot of good teams in that division that year, and a lot of players were

scoring goals.

"You never really got the 'breakaway' teams that you get now in those days, there were always five or six up there and unfortunately we couldn't get into the top three.

"But it was a great year and I did well in my third season at the club before moving on so I think I helped the club out and the club helped me out which was great."

The striker scored some stunning goals during his time at SN1, but he picks out the equaliser in the 1975 FA Cup fourth round tie with West Ham United at Upton Park as his most memorable.

"I remember I picked it up just outside the box and hit it low with my left foot into the corner," he said.

"I remember it more because it gave us a 1-1 draw and a replay against them, and as they were in the old First Division and we were in the Third Division it was a great result for us.

"And of course it helped swell the coffers as well which was very important in those days!

Eastoe is also full of praise for his teammates with whom he shared The County Ground pitch.

"There were a number of very good players in that team," he said.


"David Moss was always did well from the left, and Frank Burrows led the team with his experience well too.

"And John Trollope obviously is a

legend down at Swindon so it was great to play with him.

"I saw Mossy and a few of the other players at a reunion down at The County Ground a couple of years back, and it was great to see them."

The 53-year-old now works for the garden centre Solus in Halesowen, packing and delivering outdoor supplies in a job from which he derives much pleasure.

"You name anything to do with garden centres and we'll do it!" he said.

"It involves putting anything from compost bins to watering cans on pallets, wrapping them up and delivering them.

"It's not a bad job, and it keeps me working as well which is good though they're all younger lads so I'm the granddad of the group!"

"I used to be a van driver years ago but at the time I left that I think I'd had enough, and I'm happy doing this work now."


Despite his hero status at The County Ground and at Everton – for whom he scored 26 goals in 95 games – Eastoe is recognised as little more than a workmate nowadays, but, with a humility lacking from much of today's ego-ridden football industry, the former striker says he is far from concerned with his anonymity.

"None of the other lads I work with know I played football," he said.

"Well I'm pretty sure nobody knows unless they're keeping it from me! It's a nice feeling to be honest, and I'd like to keep it that way."




You started your career with Manchester United and are a self-confessed United fan, what are your memories of the Manchester derby?







Swindon Town made the journey to Essex last weekend with Northampton-based Swindon fan Derek Elston making the trip. Here is his away review..

Host Club Website: 4/10

Regular checks on the website revealed very little other than an advert to try to encourage supporters to purchase hospitality places for the game. There was not even a match preview added when I last looked on Friday evening. That said I always feel that club websites are generally aimed at that club's own supporters in the main.

Directions: 8/10

The travel to Dagenham was made by train & tube as the website confirmed that this was very easy as the ground is only a five-minute walk from Dagenham East tube station. Arrival at Dagenham East brought back memories of our last visit to Victoria Road almost 26 years previously in the FA Cup when we scraped a 0-0 draw on a miserable Monday night before being dumped out at home in the replay a week later by the then Non League club Dagenham FC.

Club Shop: 5/10

The club shop at Dagenham was very small and sparsely stocked although there was a good selection of enamel badges available, which is the kind of item that can entice visiting supporters to part with some hard earned cash. Perhaps they are still finding their feet having been in the Football League only a couple of years plus the support base

for the club, which is quite small would also be a factor.

Pitch: 6/10

The pitch was a vast improvement on that of our previous visit 26 years previous, although it did appear to cut up quite quickly, no doubt due to the last week of continuously inclement weather.

Food Kiosks: 6/10

There were two kiosks available at the away area. The first one that you saw was as you entered the ground and a queue quickly formed. This was quite small and not in the best of positions being just a couple of yards from the Gents toilet which left a lot to be desired. The main kiosk was under the stand, no such luxury in 1984, and much better.

Pies: 8/10

The range of food available at the kiosks was comprehensive and well priced. I can't admit to having tried the pies but you are usually pretty safe with the pies on offer. The burgers were very tasty.



Atmosphere: 7/10

The atmosphere in the ground was entirely down to the travelling hoards from Wiltshire. The Dagenham supporters were generally quiet most of the afternoon

and could hardly be heard at all in the away end, but then they only just managed to outnumber the Red Army in a crowd of 2,776. I must however give a special mention to Tony Roberts in the Dagenham goal. He had been slaughtered by Town fans throughout the second half but he took it on the chin and added to the fun with his antics. He was probably the most entertaining part of the afternoon.

Programme: 7/10

At the apparent regulation price of £3 the programme was well presented and provided a reasonable read on the journey home through misty eyes after the result. Or perhaps it was the walk back to Dagenham East in the rain!

Stadium: 3/10

It still retains much of its Non-League heritage and had as good an atmosphere as you could expect from such a small ground. The surrounding areas weren't up to much either.

Stewards: 6/10

Stewards seemed on the whole to be pretty amiable and Swindon fans were made welcome in the Dagenham supporters bar before the game for a small entrance charge of 50p where the ale was also reasonably priced.

Then...

WHEN the North Stand (now more commonly known as The Arkell's Stand) was first erected in 1971, the seats from the old stand were left in front of the new one – and the old roof removed. The removal of the old seats was completed in 1974.

At the end of the 1987/88 season, the club was served with a prohibition order and the ground declared unsuitable for public use until various improvements had been made. This included stairways from the front of the North Stand to ground level.

The opening home game of the 1988/89 season was delayed until Sunday 11 September. The stairways were removed in 1992, before 1,850 new seats were installed.



Now...

The improvements around The County Ground continued with a number of major changes to The Arkell's Stand in the summer of 2009 with work continuing in the summer of 2010.

In the summer months of 2009 the multi-coloured seats in the upper areas of The Arkell's Stand were replaced with red ones to standardise the stadium seating. Improvements were also made to external areas, with club branding also placed on West end of the stand.

In the summer of 2010 signage vomitary signage was put up at each of the exit points as well as an overhaul to each of the dugouts in front of the stand itself.






