



Matches against Swindon are always tight affairs but we have been playing really well lately despite the last two defeats and I am really confident that back here at home we can give a really good showing.


Hopefully we will have most of our injured players back in contention which should help to strengthen the team.

OOD afternoon everyone and welcome to the players, officials and supporters of Swindon Town who have made the trip to Huish Park. I hope they enjoy their stay with us and have a safe journey home.

Although we've not gained a point from our last two matches at home to Sheffield Wednesday and away at Brighton, the performances were encouraging and probably merited more.

Against Wednesday we enjoyed the lion's share of possession and managed twice as many attempts on goal as our opponents but a moment of sheer brilliance from substitute Jermaine Johnson put the visitors in the driving seat and a late penalty from Tornmy Miller enabled the Owls to take the points back to Yorkshire.

At Brighton we were forced to withdraw Adam Virgo and Shaun MacDonald from the starting line up due to injury and illness and with Craig Alcock and Stefan Stam also unavailable we had to improvise with the team by playing Owain Tudur Jones in the centre of defence and giving Ed Upson his first league start in midfield.


We played extremely well for the first 40 minutes or so, making it difficult for the South coast side to play and passed the ball well ourselves.

Sadly a goal just before half time put the League leaders in front and a second strike early in the second period effectively ended our hopes of a good result.

preparation these last few weeks but the lads have been working very hard to try and improve our goals to chances ratio.



The midfielder, who had to step in at centre-back against Brighton, will remain at Huish Park until November 27.


YEOVIL Town's annual fireworks display is being held on Thursday, November 4 with the gates opening at 6.00pm for a 7.30pm start

SINCE JOINING YEOVIL TOWN FROM ARSENAL, YOUNGSTER LIKE AYLING HAS PROVEN TO BE A VERY VERSATILE PLAYER HAVING ALREADY PLAYED IN SEVERAL DIFFERENT POSITIONS FOR THE GLOVERS. CHRIS SPITTLES CAUGHT UP WITH THE MAN WHO IS HAPPY PROVING HIMSELF IN WHATEVER POSITION THE MANAGER CHOOSES TO PLAY HIM

Ayling is emerging as the Glovers' 'Mr Versatile' this season - and admits it's a role he's happy to fulfil.

Signed from Arsenal as a central defender in the summer, the 19-yearold started the campaign in central midfield.

But he's also lined up in the middle of the back four, on the right of midfield and most recently at rightback in the absence of injured Town captain Craig Alcock.

"I think my versatility is a good thing at this stage of my career and I even played at right wing away at Notts County earlier in the season which was a bit different," said Ayling.

"I think being able to play in a number of positions makes me more of an asset for the gaffer to be able to call upon, especially as we've got a relatively small squad.

"But sooner or later I've got to look to hold down one spot in the team and get a long run in the side, hopefully for the rest of the season."

With Owain Tudur Jones, Shaun MacDonald, Gavin Williams and Jean-Paul Kalala all hoping to occupy the midfield spots, competition in that area of the team is fierce.

But while Ayling may be happy

playing at right-back at the moment, he still has eyes on a midfield berth.

The youngster said: "I've been playing full-back in recent games and that is something that I really don't mind doing.

"I've been filling in there while Craig Alcock is injured but when he's fit again I'd like to be challenging for a place in central midfield again.

"At the moment I think central midfield is my best position because I'm still young and learning the game and also need to develop physically.

"I think I need to get more experience before I play more games in central defence and midfield suits me at this stage of my career.

"I enjoy playing in there, my fitness levels are good so I can get around the pitch and I like a tackle so I think I fit in in midfield.

"I enjoy getting forward as well and I can do that when I play in midfield or when I'm at right-back. I wouldn't be able to do it if I was at centre-back."

Ayling made his Football League debut for Yeovil during a loan spell at Huish Park at the end of last season.

And having only experienced youth and reserve team football with Arsenal, he's been pleased to make the step up.

He said: "It's great at Yeovil. I'm really enjoying myself and playing first team football on a regular basis is great experience for me.

"Here at Yeovil we are playing for points and we are battling to move up the table. The games have a purpose.

COMPETITIVE

"At Arsenal when I played in games it was all about player development and there wasn't any pressure on us.

"But that has to change at some point in your career and I'm getting the competitive games now."

However, Ayling also admits that he's found his first full season in League 1 tough going.

After starting the season at the heart of Terry Skiverton's new-look Yeovil team, he was handed a rest by the manager after six games - which was a welcome relief.

Ayling said: "Before the start of the season I hadn't played in that many games in the league and suddenly I was playing every match which meant two tough games every week.

"I hadn't played that many competitive games in a row before and if I'm honest I was getting tired.

"The gaffer took me out of the side to get a rest and I think it did me a lot of good because I've come back quite sharp and feeling fresh.


"I thought that because I'm a young lad I would be able to come straight in and play every game straight off without a problem. But you can't do that. It's so tiring."

Ayling joined Arsenal when he was eight and had more than 10 years with the north London giants before leaving on a free transfer.

But he insists he feels privileged to have come through the ranks at one of the top clubs in Europe.

Ayling added: "It was great to grow up at Arsenal. All the training is football related and it's a great education in the game.

"I had some very good people to



learn from at Arsenal as well. Steve Bould was a brilliant defender for the club and he was my coach for two years.

"I improved so much under his tutelage. He's not just a good coach, he's a great person and he played more than 500 games for Arsenal so he knows what he's talking about, especially when it comes to defending.

"As a young centre half in the Arsenal youth team I couldn't really have had anyone better teaching me.

"I joined Arsenal when I was eight and that was when Tony Adams and the famous back four with Bould, Lee Dixon and Nigel Winterburn were still playing.

"Then after that Sol Campbell stood out for me, and in both of his spells



with the club as well.

"When he came back to Arsenal last year I got to know him really well. I trained with him and played in the reserves with him and he really impressed me.

"He was such a great pro and the way he got back fit after his spell at Notts County to get back in the Arsenal team and play at the top level was amazing to see.

SWITCHED

"He was a brilliant communicator on the pitch as well, talking all the time, and he taught me to always stay switched on when you're on the pitch.

"I picked up a lot of tips from Sol and also when I trained with the rest of the first team towards the end of my time with Arsenal.


"Now I need to put all that into practice with Yeovil because we're playing at a good level against decent pros."

And while Ayling currently regards himself as a central midfielder, he still hopes to follow in Campbell's footsteps later in his career - once he's bulked up.

"I hope I'll end up in central defence in the long-term, but I know that I need to get stronger," said the teenager. "I need to get to the gym and build up some muscle!

"I am working on it, trying my best. It is taking some time but I'm trying my best and I'm only 19 so I've got plenty of time."



JED An alternative take on football... PITMEN

S I've got a bit older, I've started to recount my younger days, sometimes through rose-tinted glasses.

One thing I can recall almost as if it was yesterday was starting out as a football journalist. My career had begun with a concentration on all things cricket, but then, in the early 1990s I was asked to report on a club called Swindon Town by the BBC.

Admittedly, the only thing I knew about the team before I began to cover them was that they had famously faced the wrath of the Football Association at the start of that decade.

They had been promoted to the top flight via the play-offs but, after a hearing regarding things far too complicated, the head honchos at the FA had donned some black hats and sentenced the bad boys to a double demotion, three years hard labour and being forced to listen to Country and Western music while having their feet tickled with a fluffy feather.

By the time I arrived at the County Ground for the first time, the club had put those dark days behind them and were looking to show the games' top brass that they could still be a force to be reckoned with.

On one of my first days at the Beeb, I was interviewing their new manager, Glenn 'Early Doors' Hoddle, before he started fiddling with crystals, taking the advice of a mad woman and reaping what he sewed.

Two entertaining years later and Hoddle had guided his team to an extraordinary promotion to the Premier League coming with a brilliant 4-3 Play-off Final win over Leicester at Wembley.

Having given away a 3-0 lead in the blink of an eye (actually while I was in the toilet), Swindon won at the end thanks to a disputed penalty after

During their more troubled times they managed to get through eight managers in fewer than eight seasons. After the luckless Jimmy Quinn was given the boot at the turn of the century, Colin Todd, Andy King (twice), Roy Evans, Iffy Onuora, Dennis Wise, Paul Stur-Steve rock and Maurice Malpas all had a go but my White tavourite was head coach Razor Ruddock fell over who was supposed to play as well but as if hit couldn't do so until specially made by a powlarge shorts were made for him. erful and mysterious They like big names in aust of wind. I remember Swindon. heading for my car and seeing some irate

and seeing some irate Leicester supporters surrounding the Swindon coach with White doing diving impressions out of the skylight.

SUCCESS

It was priceless as was the scene in the town when we arrived back later that night. If ever you wanted to see what sporting success could do to a small provincial town then you should have been there on that long, long night, one which turned into an even longer morning.

Of course, Hoddle then left for Chelsea leaving his bezzie mate, John Gorman, in charge. In all the years of covering sport, I have rarely come across a man as nice as John although we had some major fallings out in what was a bit of a disastrous single season in the Premier League when they conceded an incredible 100 League goals.


The season had many downs but my favourite moment was in the now defunct Anglo Italian Cup when Swindon had been drawn away in Venice. At training one morning, their striker, Keith Scott, appeared to be struggling a bit. It turned out that he had left his contact lenses in England and now couldn't see the ball. But even better was travelling to the match from the hotel.

Naturally, the football ground in Venice is on a small island and as we got on a boat to get to the match, there appeared to be some concerned faces from the crew. We soon realised why.

We were fighting against the tide and as hard as the captain tried the further we drifted away from the ground, eventually arriving an hour late for the kick-off. Needless to say defeat followed.

John eventually blamed me personally for his sacking but he had the last laugh. Not only did he go off to England but he left me to deal with Steve McMahon, a man who was soon pinning me against a wall in a Finnish hotel, something which led to my own resignation.

I trust that things are much calmer these days in Wiltshire.





While Scottish pair McGovern and Caddis have also played centrally in recent weeks, both are happier out on the right.

Former Sheffield Wednesday man McGovern has played the majority of his career as a right-winger and was a key figure as Swindon reached the Play-offs last year, playing in every single league and cup game.

Caddis, a six-figure summer signing from Celtic, played 25 times for the Bhoys, including two Champions League appearances. He is a natural right-back, but has so far been deployed right across midfield by Wilson.

The man in possession of the right wing berth is Manchester City loanee Ball. The 20-year-old is actually a striker but his pace and athleticism have come in handy out wide and seen him bag two goals in ten games.

On the left, it should be a straight fight between Ritchie and ALAN O'BRIEN. Ritchie. 21. is on loan from Portsmouth, for whom he played five games at the start of the season. Quick and direct, he has started the

against Peterborough. O'Brien, meanwhile, joined from Hibernian last summer but has been hampered by a recurrent hamstring injury.

That just leaves **THOMAS DOS-SEVI**, a French-born Togolese who joined Swindon from Nantes in the summer.

It is the skilful 31-year-old's first season in English football but he has adapted well, making seven starts and scoring twice.

AS a midfielder with the likes of Chesterfield, Brighton, Luton and Sheff Wednesday, Wilson made more than 600 League appearances and notched over 100 goals.

That attacking intent is obvious in the way he sets up his teams, with emphasis placed on width and getting the ball quickly into the front men.

Having rescued the Robins from relegation after taking over on Boxing Day 2008, Wigan-born Wilson carried that momentum into the 2009-10 season and built an attacking, vibrant side that very nearly clinched promotion.

Play-off defeat to Millwall scuppered what would have been the 50-year-old's third promotion, having led Hartlepool from League 2 in 2006-07 and, most famously, taken Barnsley into the top flight for the first time in their 110-year history.

Achieved back in 1997 as a rookie manager, that feat made Wilson's name and, while the Tykes' stay lasted just one year, he went on to manage Sheff Wednesday, Bristol City and MK Dons.



N the same week that Wayne Rooney's protracted contract negotiations were played out in front of the world's media, The Football League unveiled a memorial to the players and fans who fought side by side in The Footballers' Battalion during The Great War.

Football has a way of throwing up great contrasts and here was another. While one of the stars of the current game was being rewarded with a staggering £200,000 plus a week contract, the heroes of yesterday were being remembered for something far more important with a simple slab of marble and some eloquent words.

The facts are that from the 17th and 23rd Middlesex Footballers' Battalions more than 1,000 players and fans died while about 2,000 suffered injuries.

UNVEILED

Most of the injuries came in the battle of Delville Wood – or Devil's Wood as the troops re-named it - on the edge of the tiny village of Longueval in northern France, where the memorial was unveiled.

The Football League organised a party of dignitaries and players to attend the ceremony. They included Phil Stant who organised the memorial, Wycombe player Gareth Ainsworth, and Millwall chief executive Andy Ambler. All of them agreed with Football League chairman Greg Clarke who said that current players, and especially academy members, should pay a visit to the memorial to gain understanding.

As Clarke said: "The problem with football is it can be all-consuming but it's not all of life, I'd support bringing young footballers out here, to give them a sense of perspective to what true sacrifice is all about.

"Walking around those graves, seeing people aged 17, 18, 19, who ran into a wood with people running at them screaming, holding bayonets

at them, and shells raining down on their heads is truly humbling."

Wycombe winger Ainsworth added: "The First World War was a massive part of our history and it is so important that it is not forgotten.

"I would encourage all players, especially the younger ones to visit the memorial and learn about what players their age went through for us."

Abler said he will ensure that the Millwall academy make a visit to the memorial and would encourage all players, academies and fans do the same.

The role of the Footballers' Battalions has been praised in historical writings of the Great War. But following the outbreak of hostilities in August 1914 the footballers were heavily criticised by notable personalities of the day like WG Grace and Field Marshall Lord Roberts who labelled them as "shirkers" for continuing to play the game while the majority of other sports had stopped.

It was as a result of the criticism that in November 1914 Brentford MP William Joynson Hicks raised the Footballers' Battalion following a meeting in Fulham Town Hall.

At first 35 professional footballers signed up, but within a few months there were more than 300 from clubs including Millwall, Reading, Clapton (now Leyton) Orient and Brighton and Hove Albion.

By 1918 only 30 of them were still alive. Many of the stories are documented in the book 'When the Whistle Blows' by Andrew Riddoch and John Kemp, which charts the stories of the 17th and 23rd Middlesex Footballers Battalions.



THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE PAPER IS OUT EVERY SUNDAY. AVAILABLE FROM ALL GOOD NEWSAGENTS VERY footballer has someone in their background who took a chance on them, showed belief in them when maybe others didn't and who indisputably shaped the way their career, and indeed life, turned out afterwards.

For manager Terry Skiverton, that person was Colin Lippiatt; a man who had taken Woking to multiple FA Trophy triumphs and who arrived at Huish Park in November 1997. Our manager takes up the story of how he ended up in Somerset.

"I knew about Colin as he visited Chelsea regularly when I was there and I had come down to Huish Park in April 1998 with Welling, We'd gone on a great unbeaten run and amazingly finished tenth in the end, a

fantastic position for Welling.

"In that run, we came down to Yeovil and won 3-1.

"I thought my career was declining a little and started to question myself about what I wanted to do with my career. Then, in the summer of 1999, I think AI-James Hannigan left for Slough and Colin was looking for a replacement.

"It was down to a straight choice between Jason Goodliffe and me; Jason was an established Non-League centre half but Colin decided to take a chance on me. He knew what a lot of other people didn't and he had the foresight to show it with me.

"I remember coming down, agreeing terms and being really impressed
with the place straight away, it was so
professional. As soon as I met Colin,
I wanted to sign for him just from the
way he spoke; he was so enthusiastic and knew all of the players I had
played with and against. As soon as
I signed, I knew it was the right decision to play for Colin."

The pair would not be together at Yeovil for long as the former Woking boss didn't want to go full time by giving up his sales manager's job and left the Glovers a month into the new season. The brief relationship didn't stop Yeovil's present manager from picking up a few ideas from his mentor, some of which will remain between the pair.

"I was impressed with the way he handled the press," admits Terry.

"He had a good way of dealing with players, he was methodical in his approach and it was good to watch him in action. One thing he did which I'd like to do too was to take chances with young players – he gave people like Dave Piper and Murray Fishlock the opportunity to play at a decent level as well.

"His knowledge of football outside of the league was unparalleled; he was one of the best managers around and it showed in the fact he was successful wherever he went."

The Town team at the time was a useful blend of youth and experience and Terry settled in well, admitting that the move shook him out of a

comfort zone.

"It was a great move for me. Sometimes you need that definitive change in your life – mine was getting away from London and coming down to Yeovil. The penny definitely dropped when Colin gave me the chance here."

Eleven years later, Terry is still here but now he inhabits the manager's office where

once Colin was based. One of Colin's last visits here was to manage a team in the testimonial for Terry in 2009, an afternoon that summed up Colin according to the boss.

"Everyone could see the sort of bloke he was when he was bouncing off Gary when they interviewed him on the mic. He had a certain way about him; he was very charismatic and quick-witted."

At 35, Terry is still a newbie in terms of management experience and style but his words of tribute to his mentor and first Glovers manager are as emotional as they are revealing.

"Yeovil to me is the best job in the world. I spoke to my wife and two little boys and told them that I wouldn't have been here doing this job, wouldn't have had all the success I've enjoyed down here if he hadn't brought me down here. My family, my life down here is down to Colin."

There was even silverware to polish as they lifted the Somerset Premier Cup and a prolific end to the season winning the last two games scoring ten goals.

Colin's first full season saw fifth place in the Conference along with a strong FA Trophy run to the fifth round and a fluke exit to Cardiff City in the FA Cup third round after a replay.

The likeable ex-Woking boss then had to decide to resign or go full-time with the Glovers and chose the former option after much deliberation.

Colin Lippiatt was one of those managers who made a difference. Everywhere he managed, he made a positive impact at that club and, with Geoff Chapple at Woking, formed the most successful managerial partnership in Non-League football history. His teams played with flair and invention and were a reflection of himself as he liked to play the game.

Charisma, friendliness and charm

aren't necessarily vital to succeed in football management but when you have it in bucket loads, it endears you to a supporter which is never a bad thing.

'Big Col' had all three qualities and many more besides, and this is why his passing has left the football world mourning his absence.

He will never be forgotten by fans of many clubs, not least of all Yeovil Town to whom he brought our present manager Terry Skiverton. RIP Colin Lippiatt 1942 – 2010.

canny habit of throwing up ironies and coincidences.

It was planned for today's subject Jimmy Giles to appear in this programme weeks ago yet he features today just two weeks after the death of the manager he took over from when he arrived at Huish, a certain Malcolm Allison.

He took over as Yeovil's player manager a few months before his 35th birthday, just like our own Terry Skiverton, with a reputation of being a strong centre half, just like Terry too.

Having played exactly 500 Football League games for Swindon (another coincidence bearing in mind today's opponents), Aldershot, Exeter and Charlton, he was experienced on the field but less so off it.

"I never imagined I'd get into management," confessed the likeable defender.

"I'd assumed that I'd just slip back into the building trade full time once my career finished but David Hawker gave me a call when I was at Exeter and the rest is history."

Jimmy had just enjoyed a 15 year career at just four clubs but left the Grecians after a disagreement with City boss Brian Godfrey before their epic FA Cup tie with Newcastle in 1981.

The call from Yeovil's chairman came at just the right time and offered the 34-year-old his first chance in the gaffer's chair.

"I remember my first game well; it was a draw up at Gravesend & Northfleet. We were struggling in the league a little but we managed to stay up in the end despite the playing budget being cut quite heavily."

PREMATURE

The following season saw progress with the side ending up in 13th place, well above the drop zone, but no cup run. The final season of Jimmy's reign sadly ended in the sack after the inevitable drop in league position following heavy financial losses.

Following his premature departure from Huish, the Oxfordshire-born Giles returned to Devon and, as predicted, the building trade from where he had come.

Now, almost three decades on, he

works as a bricklayer's agent where he matches up qualified, skilled brickies with major house builders assuring a smooth working relationship.

He clocked up 40 years of marriage last May to the lovely Pat, a union which has produced children Scott and Nicola. Work doesn't take up all of his time, thankfully, and he still plays in a team on Astroturf regularly at the age of, whisper it quietly, 64.

"I have to take it easy right now as I'm waiting for an operation on my cartilage," he laughs. "It's also interrupting my regular golf routine as well," says the man who can play off nine when he visits his local Honiton course.

His times at both Yeovil and Exeter City will always be intertwined and he has visited Huish Park regularly this season where he bumped into a dear friend, journalist John Lukins, an ally from all those years ago. "It was nice to sit near John at the recent Yeovil v Exeter match. He is a great man."

Jim was up at the fixture as a summariser for BBC Radio Devon, a role he has filled for around five years now bringing his forthright and often light-hearted views to the Devon airwayes.

The welcome he still gets now at Yeovil is a warm one, particularly from the folk who can remember his two year spell as player manager.

"The people at Yeovil were fantastic. I always get welcomed back when I return nowadays and I like coming back as I love to see good football. I think Terry is doing a good job with what he's got to spend."







EOVIL Town are back in FA Cup action next Saturday, but a competition which used to be the highlight of the Glovers' season is now approached with apprehension.

Of course it's well-chronicled that the club made its name as cup giantkillers and still holds the record for the number of league scalps claimed by a Non-League team.

But since Yeovil were promoted to League 1 in 2005, they have become the prey for the underdogs.

Astonishingly, the Glovers have won just one match in the competition over the last five years, a replay victory over Macclesfield in the first round in November 2005.

That year they lost to Walsall in the second round, but that defeat is irrelevant when more recent losses are considered.

THRASHED

In a run of four successive defeats in the first round, Town have lost to Non-League opponents three times and also been thrashed 5-0 by Stockport County.


Rushden and Diamonds started the rot in 2006 when they beat the Glovers 3-1 at Nene Park.

Which means Yeovil manager Terry Skiverton is right to approach next Saturday's rematch with the Northamptonshire side with caution.

For some reason Town have been unable to rise to the occasion in the FA Cup over the last five years and, given the club's history, it's difficult to know why.

Oxford was tame in comparison, but still a blow to a club that needs funds from a cup run to compete with the bigger clubs in League 1.

It means that next week's tie against Yeovil's former Non-League rivals is hugely significant despite the obvious priority of maintaining the club's League 1 status this season.

Beating Rushden and then advancing beyond the second round opens up the possibility of a money-spinning tie against one of the country's biggest clubs in round three.

Anyone involved in Yeovil's game with Liverpool in 2004 knows just what a boost that could provide.

However, another first round defeat against Non-Leaguers next week will be a massive blow and could impact on the survival battle in League 1.

Once again, the FA Cup is set to play a huge part in the history of Yeovil Town.
