BRADDERS THE BOSS

Good evening and welcome
to tonight's match against
Swindon Town.

I would like to thank the Chairman and the board for giving us this opportunity to take permanent charge here at Bournemouth, and we now look to take this club forward. This is an ambitious club and myself and Fletch are ambitious people. This is the right thing for me and it is the right thing for the club which is important. We have the players 100% behind us and they have shown that in the last three performances.

There is pressure on me, I know that, but this is the sort of pressure I want. It is a positive pressure and one that can drive us on to be successful. The same as when I was a player, there is always pressure to get results, and now as the manager, I have more of a responsibility to get the results and that is a responsibility that I understand and accept.

I'd like to welcome Danny Wilson and his Swindon team to Dean Court tonight. This will be a very tough game and we can have no complacency. As soon as you let that in to your game, you will get trampled on and you can't do that. We have prepared well for the game against a side with good players who are fighting to get back up the league. We have played them recently at the County Ground and it was always going to take something special like Jason Pearce's overhead kick to beat them.

It was a really hard game, and they will come here and try and get the win. We have self belief and confidence with the way we have been playing coming in to this game, and if we can apply ourselves like we have done in the last three games, then I see no reason why we can't get a result.

I was proud of the lads in the last game here against Brighton. They worked tirelessly and we got what we deserved. You get out of games what you put in to them, and that's why they got their rewards. We backed up that win with three points on Saturday at Plymouth. We did ride our luck at times and it was a difficult afternoon for us. The lads dealt with the threat they posed well and as I said to the players afterwards, sometimes you have to win games ugly and it's a sign of a good side when you can mix it up and win games like that. They had their chances, but when we had ours, we took them and we worked hard for the three points.

Since taking charge, we have had three very different games and I have been delighted with the players endeavour and work. I have said to the players that if they continue to apply themselves game in and game out in the same



manner, then we can be successful. It's very encouraging from my point of view to know that the lads can mix it and get results. It's not just about the lads on the field, but about the whole squad. Of course players are disappointed that they are not in the starting line up, and I would be concerned if they weren't disappointed, but what is massive for me is that everyone is urging everyone on and they all feel a big part of it and it is imperative that we keep that spirit and togetherness around the place. The team spirit here is second to none and I believe that has been borne from the adversity we have had here in the past. The majority of the lads were here when we nearly went out of the football league and we have come on so much since then. We now have a chance of achieving even more and that's everyone's goal here.

I'd like to thank you all for your support since we have taken charge. The way everyone has expressed their feelings towards myself and Fletch has been brilliant and it's a great help to have everyone on board.

It has been something special and I urge you to get right behind us again tonight. In our last game here, the atmosphere was just incredible and the players thrive on playing in matches when everyone is so behind them. At Plymouth, you travelled in good numbers and we were all grateful how you got behind the team, especially when they made it 1-1. It's at times like that when you really need everyone 100% behind you and it does make a big difference.

It's a local derby and there will be a good number from Swindon here tonight, so it should be a great atmosphere and a good game, and one we can hopefully come out of on top.

Enjoy the game tonight and see you on Saturday. ■

CAPTAIN'S TALK WITH JASON PEARCE

We go into tonight's game with things looking good. We are delighted that it has been confirmed that Lee and Fletch are in their roles permanently.

Everyone in the changing room has ultimate respect for them and they have come in and kept everything pretty much the same and we are continuing on the upward spiral. The three performances we have put in since they took over have been outstanding and we now must continue that.

On Saturday, we played against a very good Plymouth side with good players. They deserve credit for the way they played and I hope that as a club, they get out of the trouble they are in. When that happens, you have to come together as a team and we have shown what a good group of players we have got. Swindon will now have to do the same, hopefully not against us though! It will give someone else a chance to come in there and as we have seen, they are a good team, so I'm sure they can adapt and climb the table.

We just have to focus on ourselves. We know about Swindon and their dangers, but we are at home and we know that if we apply ourselves in the right way, we can beat anyone in this division and that is what we have to do.

I'd like to thank you all for your outstanding support at the last two games since I last wrote. It was such a great feeling to play at a packed Dean Court against Brighton and then last week, we had a thousand supporters right behind every one of us. I can only ask for everyone to keep coming in numbers and giving us such positive support because it helps us massively and will go a long way to us staying where we are in the league. ■

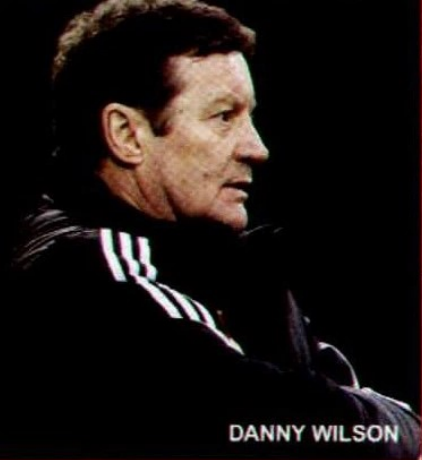

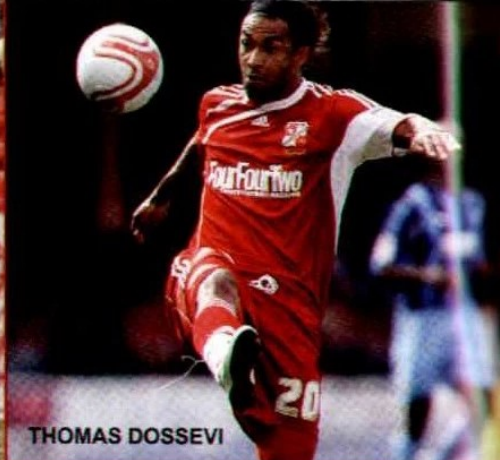

WELCOME TO SWINDON TOWN

It has been a difficult season for tonight's visitors Swindon Town, and they now have to cope with the loss of the prolific Charlie Austin, who has moved to join up with Eddie Howe at Burnley.

It's a far cry from last season when the Robins looked like they could go all the way to the Championship. After a thrilling semi final play-off win over Charlton, they narrowly missed out at Wembley against Millwall.

Manager Danny Wilson lost leading goalscorer Billy Paynter in the summer and then saw his side have a disappointing start to the season. Three draws and two defeats in the league saw the side second bottom of the table, but in that spell, they were buoyed by an excellent 3-0 win at Southampton in the JPT. On 11 September, they met the Saints again in the league and gained their first win with a 1-0 success and that was followed by a 2-1 win at Walsall and a 1-0 home win over high flying Huddersfield to mark their best spell of the season so far.

It was nearly four positive results in a row until a late Plymouth goal robbed them of a point at home in a 3-2 defeat. After a loss at Dagenham, progression was made in the JPT with a 2-0 win over Torquay before they recorded another league win, beating Bristol Rovers 2-1 at the County Ground. This was followed by a four match winless run, a run that was ended by a tremendous 4-0 FA Cup win at Plymouth. They then went out of the JPT on penalties at Brentford before beating Colchester 2-1 in the league.

A draw at Rochdale and defeat at Notts County was followed by an excellent 2-1 win over Sheffield Wednesday on 4th December, and that has proved to be the last home win. After being knocked out of the FA Cup by Crawley, they gained a point at home against Peterborough before the Cherries won 2-1 at the County Ground thanks to Jason Pearce's late winner.

The response to that set back was stunning as they travelled to Charlton two days later and thumped the Addicks 4-2, but that success has been followed by a frustrating time. A home defeat by Yeovil and away losses at Oldham and Bristol Rovers followed and then in the last seven days they have been held to goalless draws at home by Tranmere in Austin's last game before his move and on Saturday against Exeter.

Although it has been a frustrating time for the Wiltshire club, they showed on New Year's Day that they are a more than capable side. Wilson has taken positives from the last two performances and the two clean sheets show that they are a hard team to break down and they will travel south tonight determined to gain revenge for the match a month ago and go home with three points.

TEAM v EXETER CITY 29-1-11

PHIL SMITH

Keeper who after starting his career at Millwall, plied his trade in non-league for a number of years, playing for Folkestone, Dover, Margate and Crawley. After a successful trial at Swindon in 2006, Phil signed for the Robins and marked his first run in goal for the side with the PFA player of the month award. Last season saw him sign a new contract and in October last year, he got back in to the first team and has enjoyed a good run in the side.

SCOTT CUTHBERT

Defender who has represented Scotland at Under 19, Under 20, Under 21 and B level. Scott started his career at Celtic where he came through the ranks, and gained experience during loan spells at Livingston and St. Mirren. He joined Swindon in July 2009 and has been a regular in the side ever since. He scored three goals last season and opened his account this term in the defeat at MK Dons.

ANDREW FRAMPTON

Experienced defender who is currently on loan at Swindon, a move that has recently been extended to the end of the season. He started his career at Crystal Palace before signing for Brentford, where he spent five years and made over 150 appearances. Andrew signed for Millwall in 2007, but this season has spent time away from the Den. He joined Leyton Orient on loan in October and then signed for Swindon in December, making his debut in the 1-1 draw against Peterborough.

KEVIN AMANKWAH

28 year old defender, who has been a regular for the Robins since joining in June 2008. Kevin started his career at Bristol City working his way through the ranks to the first team and also having loan spells at Torquay, Cheltenham and Yeovil, eventually joining the Glovers permanently. He spent the 2005-06 season at Huish Park, and such was his form, Swansea paid big money for his services. He spent two years in South Wales before signing for Swindon.

ALAN SHEEHAN

24 year old left back who has played five times for the Republic of Ireland Under 21 side. Alan came through the ranks at Leicester and in 2008, signed for Leeds. He first joined Swindon in November 2009 on loan and then signed permanently in August 2010, scoring in his second game back in the 2-1 win at Walsall.

JONATHAN DOUGLAS

Midfielder who joined Swindon in 2009 after a successful three years at Leeds. He started his career at Blackburn Rovers, making 16 League appearances and enjoying loan spells at Chesterfield, Blackpool and Gillingham before having a lengthy loan spell at Leeds before making the

move permanent. In his career, Jonathan has made eight full international appearances for his native Republic of Ireland. He was named Player of the Year after his performances for the Robins last season.

JON-PAUL MCGOVERN

Experienced midfielder who started his career at Celtic and after a loan spell at Sheffield United in the 2002-03 season, signed for Livingston. He moved south of the border in 2004, signing for Sheffield Wednesday and in 2006, joined MK Dons. Jon-Paul signed for Swindon in August 2007 and has been the model of consistency. He has been finding the net regularly in recent times too, scoring in consecutive games against Sheffield Wednesday and Crawley, and netted the Swindon goal in the Robins last away game at Bristol Rovers.

MICHAEL TIMLIN

Former Fulham midfielder who had already had two loan spells at Swindon before signing permanently in July 2008. At the start of this season, he made two appearances for the Robins before going out on loan to Southend, making eight appearances and scoring in the Shrimpers 3-1 win at Hereford. He has been a regular in the Swindon side since returning and scored his first Town goal of the season in the 3-3 draw at Rochdale.

ALAN O'BRIEN

Dublin born winger who has made five full international appearances for the Republic of Ireland. The 25 year old started his career at Newcastle, going on to join Hibernian in 2007. He spent two years in Scotland before signing for Swindon in the summer of 2009.

MATT RITCHIE

Talented midfielder who whilst at Portsmouth, faced the Cherries for both Dagenham & Redbridge and Notts County during loan spells. Matt started the season in the Pompey first team, playing his final game in a 3-1 win over Bristol City before signing for Swindon on loan, making his debut in the JPT against Torquay. He scored his first goal for the club in a 5-4 defeat at Peterborough. Nearing the end of his loan spell, he scored the Robins equaliser with a fine strike against the Cherries on New Year's Day and then two days later was on target again in the side's impressive 4-2 win at Charlton. On 7 January he signed for the club permanently on a two and a half year deal.

THOMAS DOSSEVI

Highly rated French born striker, who has played for the Togo national side 27 times. He has enjoyed most of his career in France, playing for ASOA Valence, LB Chateauroux, Stade Reims, Valenciennes and FC Nantes before signing for the Robins in the summer after a successful trial. Thomas scored his first goal for the club in the 2-2 draw with Hartlepool.

ON THE BENCH

MARK SCOTT

Keeper who celebrated his 20th birthday two days after the sides met at the County Ground. He started his career at the Southampton Academy and after playing for Whitchurch, played for Aldershot where he was spotted by Swindon, signing for the Robins in 2007 and has since had experience on loan at Chippenham Town.

PAUL CADDIS

Right sided player who has captained the Scotland Under 21 side. Formerly with Celtic, Paul went through the youth system and went on to make 17 SPL appearances for the Scottish giants and also had a loan spell at Dundee United before heading south and signing for Swindon in August 2010. He made his Robins debut in the Carling Cup against Leyton Orient and has been a regular in the squad all season.

ADEN FLINT

21 year old defender who is a recent signing from non league Alfreton Town, where he had plied his trade since the summer of 2008 after signing from Pinxton. A highly rated player who attracted the attentions of a number of league clubs, Aden was on the bench for his new club for the first time on Saturday.

WILL EVANS

Centre half who hails from nearby Cricklade and was spotted as a youngster playing for Fairford Town and was signed as a youth player at the club. He progressed through the youth system and was a regular in the reserve side and gained his first professional contract in April 2010. Will made his debut in the impressive 3-0 win at Southampton in the JPT.

SIMON FERRY

Midfielder who arrived at Swindon on a permanent basis from Celtic in the summer along with Paul Caddis. Simon had previously spent all of last season on loan at the County Ground when he was a virtual ever present and appeared at Wembley in the Play-Off final.

DAVID PRUTTON

Experienced midfielder who played for the England Under 21 side on 25 occasions. David spent the early years of his career at Nottingham Forest, where he became a regular in the side before in 2003, signed for Southampton. He was a regular at St. Mary's for a number of years, and after a short spell on loan back at Forest, joined Leeds in 2007 where he made 72 League appearances in a three year spell. He joined Colchester exactly a year ago today and then in the summer, made the switch to Swindon.

BILLY BODIN

18 year old who is the son of former Swindon defender and current youth team coach Paul Bodin. Billy has won international caps for Wales at Under 17, Under 19 and under 21 level and made his Robins debut this season at Dagenham & Redbridge. ■

CHERRIES & ROBINS



TON UP TONIGHT

Tonight is the 100th Football League meeting between the Cherries and the Robins. Bournemouth are slightly ahead on wins, enjoying 38 successes to Swindon's 35, while 26 games have ended as a draw.

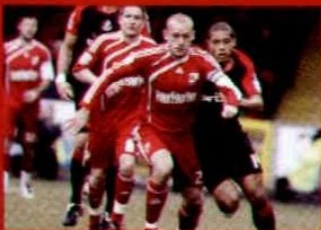
All but six league meetings between the sides have been in the third tier of English football, the other six games being played between 1987 and 1990 in Division Two.

It is well known that Swindon were our first ever opponents in the Football League, that game coming in Division Three (South) at the County Ground on 25 August 1923, with Swindon winning 3-1. The first ever Football League match to be played at Dean Court was also against Swindon, that game coming a week later and ending 0-0 in front of a 6,414 crowd, giving the Cherries their first ever point.

Our record league win came against Swindon in the memorable 1956-57 season. Early in that season, Swindon travelled to Dean Court and were thumped 7-0. On 8 December, the sides met in the FA Cup Second Round at the County Ground, with the Cherries winning 1-0 and eventually going on to reach the Sixth Round. Swindon did gain some revenge though with a 2-1 win in the League at the County Ground in the February.

Although we have beaten Swindon 7-0, they have scored more goals against us in one match! On 2 January 1926, Swindon beat the Cherries 8-2 at the County Ground. That wasn't the Robins record win as six years previously, they had beaten Luton 9-1. It was the record defeat for Bournemouth in the league though, a record that stood until 24 January 1970, when we lost 8-1 at Bradford City.

The Cherries last win at Swindon came just a month ago, thanks to Jason Pearce's spectacular late strike.



Our last win at Dean Court came on 17 September 2005 with a 2-1 win. Swindon last won at Dean Court on 7 April 1990 in the old Division Two, coming

away with a 2-1 win. Their last win at the County Ground came on 22 September 2007 with a 4-1 win.



JAMIE VINCENT

A player who served both Bournemouth and Swindon with distinction was Jamie Vincent, with the majority of his appearances in his career coming at the two clubs. He started his career at Crystal Palace and came to

Bournemouth on loan in 1994 as the Cherries were desperately trying to get to double figures points wise in what ended up being the 'Great Escape' season. The left back made his debut in a 2-0 home defeat by Oxford on 26 November 1994 and finally enjoyed the taste of a victory on 2 January as the side beat Swansea 3-2.

Before that game, he had been sent off at Bristol Rovers in harsh fashion, and when the suspension set in, he returned to Palace. In the early part of the 1996-97 season, he joined Bournemouth on a permanent basis, this time enduring another great escape, but this one involving the very future of the club. The 1997-98 season saw him a virtual ever present as the Cherries reached Wembley and as the side put in a promotion challenge in the 1998-99 season, he was simply terrific. The side won 1-0 at fellow promotion contenders Preston on 27 March 1999 and that was to prove his last game for the club as he made a big money move to Huddersfield, much to the shock of Cherries supporters. Many supporters put his departure down to the slump in form. Of the remaining nine games, only two were won as the side missed out on the play-offs on goal difference. Jamie's career then took him to Portsmouth, Derby, Millwall, Yeovil and then in 2006 to Swindon Town. It was at the Robins when he rediscovered that fine form that had made him so popular at Bournemouth. He made 84 League appearances for Swindon from 2006 to 2009 before spending a season at Walsall and is now at Aldershot.

TRULY MASSIVE GAMES!

We all take the play-offs for granted now, but it wasn't that long ago that they were introduced, and Swindon Town were the first club to benefit from them at this level as they gained promotion in the 1986-87 season along with AFC Bournemouth. The Robins had been promoted from Division Four the previous season and were tipped to be in mid table. Bournemouth meanwhile were one of the favourites for relegation! It didn't pan out that way as Bournemouth were challenging all season at the top, just like the Robins.

1987 started with a match between the clubs at Dean Court with 10,537 turning up on New Years Day. The Cherries were very much injury hit, but Carl Richards, who could barely walk, managed to summon up enough energy to score a late goal for the Cherries. Swindon thought they had equalised right on time, but it was disallowed and Mark Jones was sent off for his protests. The scorer of the 'goal' was none other than Jimmy Quinn, who would eventually play and later manage Bournemouth.

By the time the teams played at the County Ground, the Cherries had pulled away at the top with Swindon very much in the mix. 4,000 Cherries supporters made the trip to see a true top of the table tussle, with John Williams scoring a brilliant header to put Bournemouth in the lead. Swindon did equalise, but for the Cherries, it was a great point and by the end of the season, were crowned as champions.

For Swindon though, they had a trip to the unknown in the play-offs after finishing third and ten points behind Bournemouth. The format was different in the first season of the end of season play offs. Teams finishing third, fourth and fifth qualified and they were joined by the team who finished 20th in Division Two. Swindon met Wigan at Springfield Park in the first ever Division Three play-off game, winning 3-2. They drew 0-0 at the County Ground to go through to the final. The team who finished 20th in Division Two were Sunderland, and they faced Gillingham in the semi final. The Gills had finished 5th and beat Sunderland on away goals after the sides drew 6-6 on aggregate. The finals were played over two legs at the clubs own grounds. Both the sides won their home matches, the Gills by 1-0 and Swindon 2-1, but in the final, away goals didn't count double. The match was replayed at Selhurst Park

and watched by over 18,000, with Swindon winning 2-0 to take their place in Division Two as they enjoyed a consecutive promotion.



THE ONE THAT GOT AWAY

One of the best known 'one that got away' stories of recent times is the one about Charlie Austin! Charlie was born not too far from Swindon in

Hungerford, playing non league football in the area. When he moved with his family to Bournemouth, he signed for Poole Town and his goalscoring exploits with the Dolphins were the big news of the non-league scene in our area. At the start of last season, he linked up with the Cherries for training and also played in the pre-season match at Salisbury. He then made a reserve team outing against the same opposition at Dean Court on 25 August 2010, coming on to play for the second half. Lewis Smith scored a hat trick that day while Austin scored on 78 and 83 minutes in a 7-0 win.

Bournemouth were keen to sign both players, but the Football League embargo meant neither could sign and Smith went to Bishops Cleeve and Austin continued to bang the goals in for Poole Town. He scored 18 in their first 11 games of the season and it was Swindon who came in to sign him, with Bournemouth being unable to offer anything due to the transfer block. If there were any questions as to whether he could make the step up from Wessex League to League football, they were soon answered as Charlie had a wonderful first season for the Robins.

He quickly forced his way into the first team and alongside Billy Paynter, had a partnership that produced 50 goals as Swindon reached the play-off final at Wembley. Without Paynter, Charlie has shown what a great player he is by continuing to find the net this season and recently it was only Bournemouth who prevented him from finding the net in a six game period. His wonderful form meant that he was very much in demand, and Eddie Howe has now finally got his man, just a different club! ■

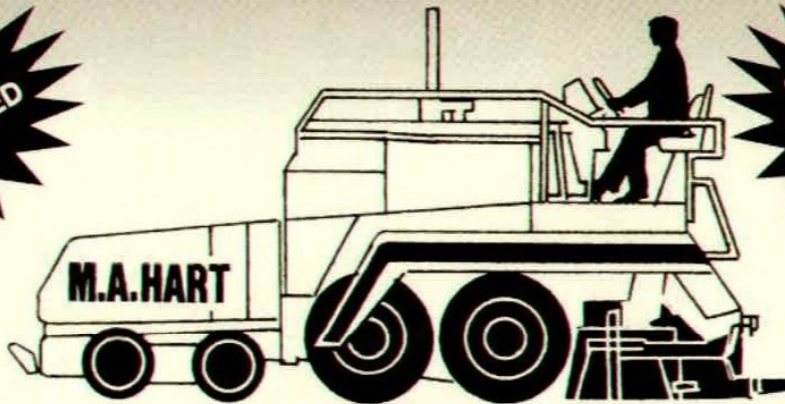

As you can see being a Centre coach takes a lot of time and requires responsibility and despite being a part time the staff are very dedicated to their jobs in our Centre.

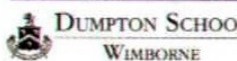

Q&A with **DANNY INGS**

Just over a year ago, you were playing at the Reebok Stadium and scoring in the FA Youth Cup before being out for the rest of the season through injury. Did you ever think you would be where you are now then?

"To be honest, no! After the game at Bolton, I was told I was going to be out for five or six months and that was not something I took very easily. It was a very hard time for me, but I had the help of Joe Roach, some of the youth team staff and a psychologist to help me keep going and keep believing. When I had the chance to come back, I worked as hard as I could and I feel very fortunate to get where I am now."

With the greatest of respect to you, when things didn't go your way in youth games just over a year ago, you'd let it affect your game, but now you have eradicated that from your game. What do you put that change down to?

"Back then, it was all about development and there were 18 of us trying to be where I am now. I let things get to me and that's because I have a lot of passion for the game and I want to do well. I want to work so hard and be a regular in the team. I think in the past, I would let that get to me if things didn't go my way. Now, I have the boys in the changing room giving me a lot of confidence, pushing me through and that has helped me a lot. Now I'm there, I want to stay there and kick on."

You have progressed so much since the youth team, how much of that is down to Joe Roach?

"Joe has helped me massively as a player. He got the negative side out of me, the side of me when I would sulk. I know that was a negative side of my game, but I only did it for my own good because it was me pushing myself as hard as I can to be the best player I can and Joe helped me to have a different focus."

As you were out for six months, was it a shock that you got a three month deal?

"I was very shocked! I only played eight games last season and was playing through an injury in my second year as a youth team player. Joe Roach pushed me through to Eddie Howe, told him that I had ability and I

was given a chance. As soon as I had that chance, I have just worked as hard as I can and I am still working as hard as I can now because I don't feel like I've made it or anything. I know that I must keep working and learning. After the three month contract ended, it got extended to a year and that meant so much to me. It has been extended again since, but that will not stop me working hard because I want to be the best player I can be."

You played in pre-season, but as soon as the League games started, you were nowhere near the first team, was that frustrating?

"It was yes, but I was only 18 in July and was the youngest one of my year, so I knew I had to have patience and work hard. I didn't expect to be in the first team early doors, but as any player would say, if you're not there then you will be somewhat disappointed and frustrated. I knew I would have to bide my time, and to be honest, I didn't think it would have been as quick as it has been. Now I'm there, I want to stay there and keep learning."

You did have a taste of first team football last season in the JPT at Northampton which must have been a great experience for you?

"It was a great experience, the build up, the preparation, the game and I took it all on board. It made me realise just how important it is when you are in the first team to prepare right and give everything in the game, or you will be turned over by good sides. I didn't come in for long, but it was pretty eventful! We got a penalty late on and I asked if I could take it! That obviously didn't go down very well with the lads! At least that showed that I was confident enough and I thought I would have stuck it away. A lot happened in such a short space of time and it made me realise how quickly things can change in a game."

You had a good spell at Dorchester on loan this season. Did you have any hesitations of dropping to Conference South?

"At first, I took it as a little bit of a negative, thinking the manager may want to get rid of me, but he sat me down and said he wanted me to get experience

because he believed in me. I took that on board, went to Dorchester and it was the best thing that could have happened to me. After I'd been there, I got offered another new contract for two more years. I played ten games there and scored seven goals and we went from bottom of the table to 11th and hopefully I played a big part in that. I enjoyed every minute at Dorchester and I have a lot of respect for all their staff and supporters who were brilliant to me."

You got recalled just in to your third month there, was it frustrating to not be in the team here?

"Not at all, I took it as a positive. There was an injury to Marc Pugh so I came back as cover, but it was just good to be back and around the first team because that's where I want to be."

When did you know you would be making your full debut at MK Dons?

"It was the day before in training. I was chucked right in at the deep end and the Gaffer said that I deserved the chance because I'd worked hard in training. It didn't go as I would have liked it though and I was gutted that I came off because it was a massive opportunity for me. I knew the reasons why, and for me it was massive to be in the squad at Swindon and I felt I did well when I came on. I get a buzz every time I'm named in the squad. If Bradders and Fletch said I was going to be on the bench, I'd still take that as a massive opportunity because I'm only 18 and there are a lot of experienced lads in the squad. I'm just really grateful that I'm there and hopefully that's where I can stay and do well for AFC Bournemouth."

You've had to contend with a managerial change, has that affected you at all?

"No, I don't think it has. Eddie and Jason helped me massively, but I worked a lot after training by myself and continue to do that and keep pushing myself. They were great for me and the club, but I know that Bradders and Fletch can do a great job. They have put so much in to it and have a massive knowledge of the game and we all back them 100%. For me, to have the continuity is very important. When a manager comes in from away from the club, they will look at the squad and look for experience over youngsters, so I'm over the moon that it's Bradders and Fletch now and I am getting opportunities and I know I must take them and kick on."

In their first games, it has been a great team ethic and you must be pleased with your contribution?

"I have been yes, when the lads are under pressure, I'll

always drop in and work as hard as I can to relieve that pressure. I think I've been doing that well and I think that's what has kept me in the team. I put a great deal of work in to every game, trying to close down defenders and winning the ball back. As a team, we work so hard and deserve every result we get."

A year ago you were playing for the youth in front of a handful of people, and now you are playing in front of nearly 10,000! You must have to pinch yourself at times!

"I do yes and this is what I want. At this age, I never expected to be near the first team yet, and it's like a dream come true for me to be doing what I'm doing in a game I love so much. The reality is that I'm here and I have to enjoy every moment of it. As a footballer, you want to do the best at whatever you do, whether it's in training, team talks, playing matches, whatever it is, you put 100% in and you get rewards for that and I have got rewards. I have signed a few contracts this season already and I think that's down to my hard work and that won't stop now, I will continue to work as hard as I can to stay in the team and do well for this club."

At such a young age, what are your ambitions in the game?

"My ambitions now are just to stay in the team. I look at Brett and Josh and Brett did well here and left and Josh went so quickly. I'm not that sort of person, I want to learn my trade before I think of anything and I just want to do well for AFC Bournemouth. I'm 100% committed to this club and I will continue to work as hard as I can for this club."

It's an incredibly exciting time to be at Bournemouth.

"It's an absolute buzz. We're pushing for promotion and I know there are a lot of good teams up there, but I think potentially we have a good side and can get promotion, there's no point being here if you don't aim for that. A lot of teams have spent money. We don't have that, but we have a great team spirit and morale. We take that on to the pitch, work hard for each other and that has got us our success and I honestly believe we can carry that on."

Finally, everything must be pretty perfect for you now!

"I couldn't be happier, I've never been happier in my entire life! Football is my life and I want to be the best player I can be and I think I can achieve that at this club. We have good staff, great players and fantastic support and there is nowhere else I'd rather be." ■

THROUGH THE YEARS

Part Forty

After the difficult first season in Division Two, Harry Redknapp moved into the transfer market to bring former youth team player Kevin Bond back to the club.

The son of former Cherries manager John Bond signed from Southampton. There was also a very significant player coming in with Ian Bishop signing from Carlisle. Bishop had impressed two years previously for the Cumbrians at Dean Court and he was to prove to be one of Redknapp's most astute signings. Also coming in was Shaun Teale from Weymouth. The centre half would have to bide his time for his opportunity, but when it came, he took it with both hands.

David Armstrong, who had joined at the start of the previous season, had managed just 11 appearances for the club in an injury hit 1987-88 campaign and retired from the game. Also leaving the club was the popular Tommy Heffernan.

The 1988-89 season started with a difficult trip to newly promoted Sunderland. The 18,000 crowd were silenced when Shaun Close gave the Cherries the lead, but eventually they hit back and Bournemouth started with a creditable draw. There were once again jibes at the Cherries status as giants Chelsea provided the first opposition in the league at Dean Court. Richard Cooke headed the only goal of the game in a memorable win, but Chelsea continued to upset the Cherries after the game, saying that grounds like Dean Court should not be allowed to host such games! After a 2-1 win at Brighton, they could only look up at Bournemouth! A first defeat came at Swindon, where despite a 3-1 reverse, the game was remembered for a virtuoso performance from Bishop. A 2-1 win over Oxford in the next game was a high point of a disappointing period.

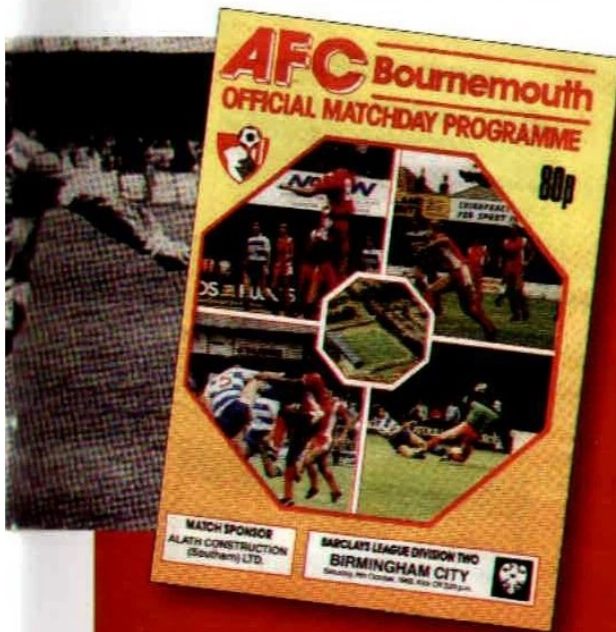


First Division Coventry knocked the side out of the League Cup with a 7-1 aggregate win and there were no league wins in six. It was during this period that one of the heroes of the 1986-87 Championship winning team left the club. Carl Richards played his final game for Bournemouth in a disappointing 1-0 home defeat against Birmingham City, and a couple of days later, he was at the club who had just triumphed at Dean Court, moving for a £70,000 fee.

The side though responded with three straight wins. The run was started with a 1-0 win over Ipswich at Dean Court, with Ian Bishop scoring his first goal for the club with a brilliant free kick. Shaun Brooks then ensured three points at Bradford with the only goal of the game. The excellent run was continued with a 2-0 win over promotion favourites Crystal Palace at Dean Court. Their supporters gave their former player Trevor Aylott unrelenting stick. Aylott replied with a goal in a superb 2-0 win!

After a 1-0 home defeat by Manchester City, Redknapp produced a real gem in the transfer market, bringing in former England international Luther Blissett from Watford. He scored on his debut at Barnsley, but the game was marred by a number of decisions that went against the Cherries as they went down 5-2 and had Mark Newson sent off. Blissett then made his home debut on the following Tuesday against Hull City. There was plenty of hype surrounding such a high profile signing, but after a tedious first half, few in the crowd would have remained so enthusiastic. The second half though went down in Cherries folklore as Blissett came alive and scored four in a 5-1 win!

The Cherries attacking options were further boosted for the next game as Colin Clarke returned on loan!



Blackburn were the visitors and both Clarke and Blissett were on target in a 2-1 win. Blissett kept up his goalscoring run with goals in the draw at Plymouth and the home win over Walsall.

Boxing Day saw the side once again being made to play away at Leicester – once again at 11.30 in the morning! The result was the same as the previous year though with Clarke scoring a late goal to ensure a 1-0 win in his final game for the Cherries. Blissett then returned to his old club Watford with his new side, but the Cherries suffered their first defeat in six, going down by the only goal of the game.

1989 started with the visit of Brighton, with 10,627 seeing a brilliant game. Blissett was again on target, with the winner coming from a well worked corner routine that was fast becoming a trademark of the Cherries play, with John Williams flicking the ball on and Mark Newson adding the finishing touch.

The Cherries were now looking with one eye on the play-off places as they travelled to Blackpool in the FA Cup in a break from the League. The game though was marred by some terrible actions from Blackpool fans towards Blissett. Blissett answered though by scoring the only goal of the game late on, celebrating by just standing and staring at the perpetrators.

Back to league action and there was a real shock in the next game. The side made the long trip to Boothferry Park to take on Hull City and were simply torn apart as the Tigers took revenge for their 5-1 mauling at Dean Court with a 4-0 success of their own. Sunderland then won 1-0 at Dean Court despite a great performance from the Cherries.

It was north east opposition again in the next match as Bournemouth made the long trip to Hartlepool for the Fourth Round of the FA Cup. Hartlepool on the day were terrific, and deservedly went ahead. The Cherries gained a fortunate penalty with Blissett slotting home, but once again, Bournemouth were left with a sour taste in the mouth after Hartlepool fans were disgraceful towards Blissett, with Blissett speaking out about eradicating racism in football.

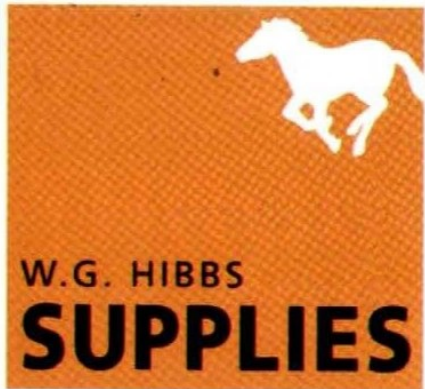
The 1-1 draw meant both sides were in the hat for the Fifth Round and the prize was a home tie against Manchester United! Three days later, the replay was held at Dean Court, with an excellent crowd of 10,142 seeing a true classic. Hartlepool may have been two leagues lower, but put in a spirited display, though their cause wasn't helped as they scored two own goals! Bournemouth finally ran out 5-2 winners to earn the right to face Alex Ferguson's Manchester United at Dean Court.

Bournemouth were back at home as they had to concentrate on the league and a seasons best crowd in the league of 11,571 saw West Bromwich Albion visit. It was another wonderful game, with the Cherries winning 2-1. Richard Cooke was on target as well as home grown talent David Coleman. Coleman had been on the fringes of the first team for a number of years and the West Bromwich game saw him enjoy a rare start and his goal was his first. He never managed to really establish himself in the side and eventually went in to non-league football, before tragically passing away aged just 30 from meningitis.

The downside to such a great win was the loss of ever present Bond through injury. He was replaced in the game by Shaun Teale, who finally made his debut, but quickly established himself in the side.

Next up was another match against a midlands club as Bournemouth travelled to Birmingham City. The Blues were struggling and just 6,444 saw the game at St. Andrews, including a large contingent from Bournemouth. The Blues were fighting for their Second Division lives, but in a scrappy affair, it was Mark Newson who scored the only goal of the game.

That meant that the Cherries would go in to the Manchester United match in fine form and real play-off contenders in what was fast becoming the greatest ever season at the club. ■

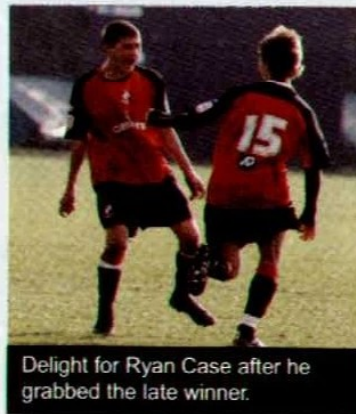
Alex Parsons gets away from his marker.

ORIENT ARE NEXT TEAM IN COURT

The next visitors to Dean Court will be Leyton Orient, who arrive in four days' time. While Bournemouth's last League win at Brisbane Road was back in 1948, Orient have also struggled on their travels to Dean Court in recent years - losing on their last six visits, and not winning here since a 1-0 success in February 1992 during the last few months of Harry Redknapp's reign as manager. The O's have recently been in the news as chairman Barry Hearn fears that if either West Ham or Tottenham are allowed to take over the Olympic Stadium - which is only two miles from Brisbane Road - after 2012, his club's future will be under serious threat. Last week, Hearn hinted that Orient may be interested in moving to the Olympic hockey stadium instead.



Back on the pitch, O's boss Russell Slade recently allowed former Bournemouth loan player Aaron Brown to join League Two side Stockport on a month's loan. The two Aaron Browns who have recently played in the Football League are often confused - but this is the tall central defender who played at Dean

Court for Tamworth in their FA Cup giant-killing win here in 2005, before joining the Cherries on loan from Reading later that same season. He has since had spells with Walsall, Yeovil, Redditch, Burton, Telford, Truro and Aldershot before joining Orient last summer. The "other" Aaron Brown, a midfielder who counts today's visitors Swindon among his former clubs, is currently with Darlington.

SMITH CONFIRMED AS WALSALL BOSS

Walsall announced on 21 January that caretaker boss Dean Smith was handed the role on a full-time basis until the end of the season. Smith led the Saddlers to two draws and a defeat during his time as caretaker, and since he was appointed permanently they were beaten at Exeter and drew at home to Oldham. But although they have remained anchored to the bottom of the League One table for much of the season, Smith insisted: "I know the position we are in and what we need to do - I'm looking forward to the fight." Smith's first signing has been Norwich midfielder Matthew Gill, who has arrived on a month's loan and made his debut against his former club Exeter. Meanwhile, Northern Ireland international forward Steve Jones, who has been at the Bescot Stadium since the summer of 2009, has

joined Scottish Premier League side Motherwell on loan for the rest of the season.



CHARLTON BAG WRIGHT-PHILLIPS FROM ARGYLE

One of the more high-profile recent moves in League One has involved Plymouth striker Bradley Wright-Phillips, who missed Argyle's defeat here at Dean Court in early January as he was on the verge of moving to Reading. The Royals then decided against

pursuing the deal because of medical issues, but Wright-Phillips was soon on his way from Home Park after joining League One rivals Charlton for an undisclosed fee which will help Plymouth settle their tax debts. Former Manchester City and Southampton striker Wright-Phillips, 25, said: "Charlton are a club which I'm sure is heading in the right direction and as soon as I spoke to the manager, I knew I wanted to be a part of it." The Addicks have lost the services of midfielder Lee Martin, who has been recalled from his season-long loan spell at the Valley by parent club Ipswich, while a striker heading back to Plymouth has been New Zealand international Rory Fallon, who cut short his loan spell at Ipswich to return to the Pilgrims.

Aside from Wright-Phillips, another notable move away from Devon was that of highly-rated Exeter midfielder Ryan Harley, who has joined Championship side Swansea on a free transfer - then immediately rejoined the Grecians on loan for the rest of the season. Harley would have been out of contract at St James Park in the summer, and manager Paul Tisdale has defended the decision to allow him to move. Tisdale explained: "The facts are that he was free to walk away in a few months' time and he could sign a pre-contract with another club, even if he's still on contract with us. Only one club was looking to spend money on him, and they didn't offer a great deal of money. I can't believe anybody would not want Ryan with us for the rest of the season."



DAVIES QUILTS NOTTS FOR DERBY

After rejecting three bids from Derby for Ben Davies in the space of a week, Notts County finally agreed to sell the midfielder to the Rams

after he submitted a transfer request. He has made the short move along the A52 to Pride Park for an undisclosed fee reported to be around £350,000. Magpies boss Paul Ince said: "I can understand where Ben is coming from, he is 29 and has a great opportunity to play in the Championship. He's been a fantastic player and a fantastic pro, but it annoys me that he has to go to this length to get away from the club." Moving in the other direction the day after Davies's move was Derby winger Dave Martin, who has joined Notts on a month's loan. Also leaving Meadow Lane recently has been defender Stephen Hunt, who has joined Lincoln on a month's loan, while Ince has resigned Liverpool defender Stephen Darby on loan for the rest of the season.

Meanwhile, as well as Davies, also leaving League One for an undisclosed fee - albeit moving to League Two rather than the Championship - is Tranmere striker Ian Thomas-Moore, who has joined Rotherham where he will link up with his father, Millers boss Ronnie Moore, who has signed his son for the second time after bringing him to Prenton Park in 2008 when he was Tranmere manager.

POSH CAPTURE KENNEDY AND BASEY

While Peterborough striker Craig Mackail-Smith has been the subject of plenty of speculation during the transfer window, returning Posh boss Darren Ferguson has wasted no time in making a couple of signings of his own. Leicester left-back Tom Kennedy has moved to London Road on loan for the rest of the season with a view to a permanent move. The former Rochdale defender joined the Foxes last summer but his opportunities there have been limited, and he had a loan spell back at Dale earlier this season. Ferguson said: "Left-back is an area we needed to strengthen and I have always thought highly of him." Another recent recruit has been ex-Charlton defender Grant Basey, who has been handed a deal by Peterborough until the end of the season following his recent release by Barnet and a successful trial with Ferguson's side. Leaving London Road has been defender Exodus Geohagbon, who has rejoined ex-Posh boss Jim Gannon at Port Vale, where he will remain on loan for the rest of the season.

As well as Kennedy, another out-of-favour Leicester player moving to League One on loan is winger Dany N'Guessan, who has joined Southampton on loan for the rest of the season. The Saints have also made

Brazilian forward Guly do Prado's loan move from Cesena permanent for an undisclosed fee, while tying former Bournemouth loan player Adam Lallana to a new four-and-a-half-year contract.

NEWCASTLE TEENAGER JOINS POOLS

Hartlepool boss Mick Wadsworth has signed England Under-19 international striker Ryan Donaldson on a month's loan from north-east giants Newcastle, with an option to extend the deal. Donaldson made his Pools debut a week ago as they drew 1-1 with Notts County. Meanwhile, another Premier League 19-year-old moving to League One on loan has been Liverpool forward David Amoo, who has joined Milton Keynes Dons on a month's loan. Manager Karl Robinson, who formerly coached at Liverpool's academy, said: "David will bring us genuine pace and explosiveness high up the pitch, which is something we have lacked at times this season." However, Robinson has lost the services of fellow striker Sam Baldock for a few weeks after he suffered a recurrence of his hamstring injury.

BEEES GRAB GRABBAN AS CORT DEPARTS

Brentford boss Andy Scott has been busy in the transfer window, signing Millwall striker Lewis Grabban on a free transfer after two loan spells at Griffin Park - while releasing injury-hit striker Carl Cort by mutual consent. The Bees have also recruited Wales midfielder Owain Tudur Jones on a month's loan from Norwich, while leaving Scott's squad on loan has been centre-back David McCracken who has gone to Bristol Rovers for a month.

While Grabban has departed Millwall, moving to the New Den has been defender Darren Purse, who has left Sheffield Wednesday by mutual consent and penned a deal at Millwall until the end of the season. Midfielder Luke Boden has also left the Owls by mutual consent, although moving to Yorkshire has been former Bournemouth goalkeeper Nick Colgan, who was a free agent after leaving Grimsby and has now signed for Huddersfield until the end of the season. Meanwhile, ex-Huddersfield skipper Jon Worthington has returned across the Pennines after joining Bradford on loan from Oldham, while Oldham's neighbours Rochdale have signed goalkeeper Owain Fon Williams from nearby Stockport for the rest of the season. ■
