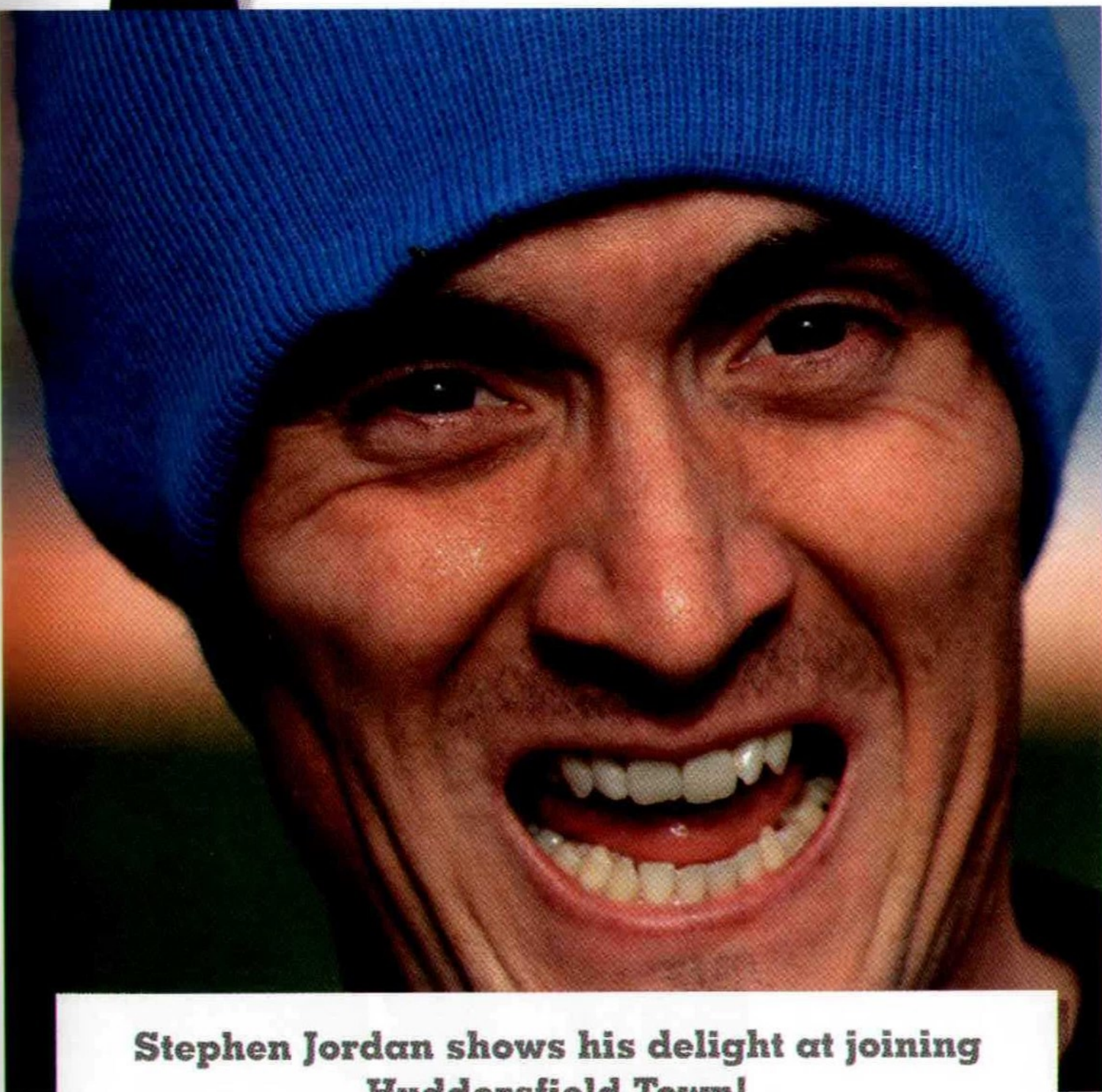

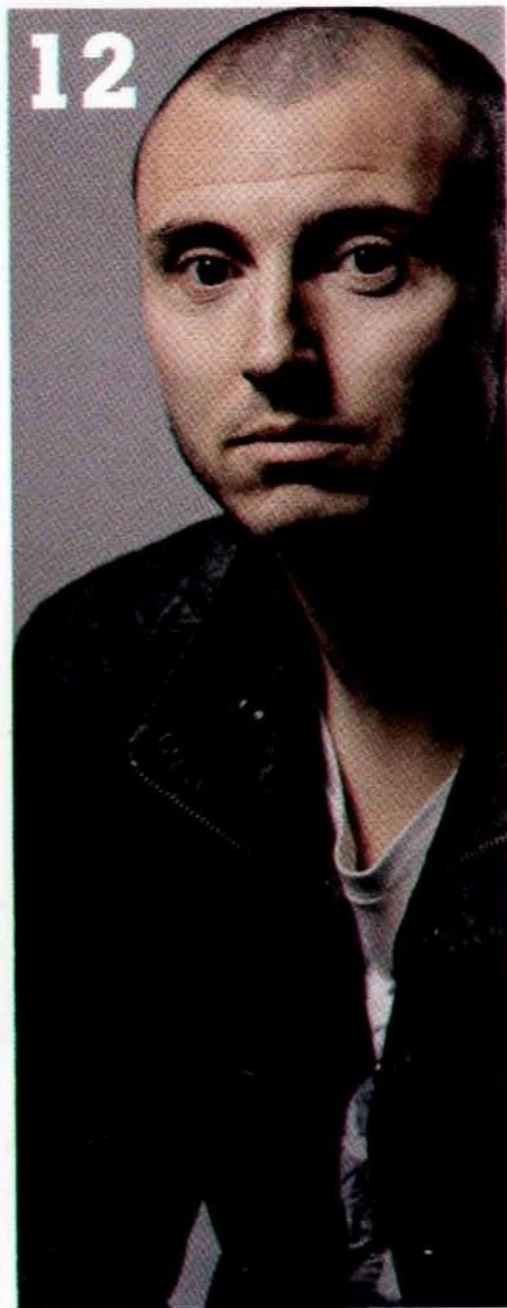

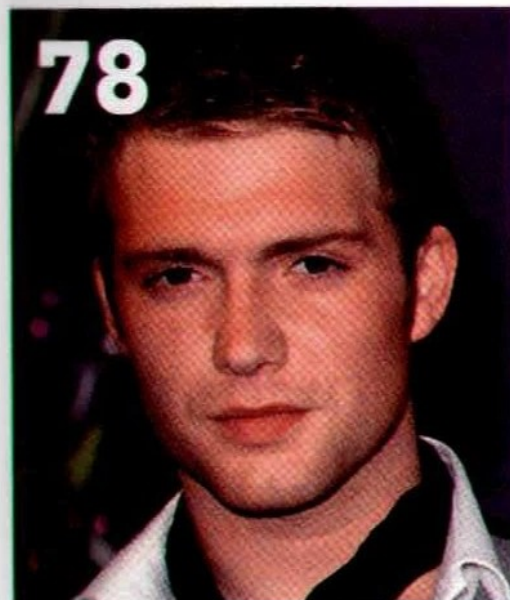

I think it's fair to say that we were all shocked by the graphic nature of Anthony's broken leg and dislocated ankle against Rochdale ten days ago, but the lads showed great togetherness and character to regroup and see out the rest of the game to record an important win over a good side.



Thankfully Pilks' diagnosis was as good as we could have hoped for and following a successful operation he is now back at home, so his road to recovery is now underway. He comes from a very close knit family and he'll receive the best help he can from them, as well as the Club, as he focuses on getting back out on the pitch.

As I have said many times before Anthony is an immensely talented player who can go all the way to the top and we'll certainly miss his ability during the run-in this season. However, his teammates have rallied around him brilliantly since the injury and they want to achieve promotion this season as much for him as for themselves now.

On the pitch the lads picked themselves up after that difficult evening and recorded another great win at Bristol Rovers last weekend. Our squad isn't huge but it's packed full of quality, so when we lost Gary Roberts in the pre-match warm up we could reshuffle and start the

game with real intent – taking the lead inside five minutes thanks to a great goal from Jordan Rhodes.

We created a number of chances following the opening goal, especially in the first half, but couldn't capitalise and it led to a few frantic moments towards the final whistle. However, the lads showed their superb battling qualities again to secure another vital three points.

I've already mentioned Jordan and it is a great boost for the Club that he has signed a two year contract extension that will keep him at Huddersfield Town until 2015. Although Jordan can still improve further as a footballer, he has a superb eye for a goal and that is the most valuable asset any striker can have. His 18 goals this season have also earned him another call-up to the Scotland under-21 squad, so congratulations to him on that front too.

Aidan Chippendale also made his debut during the Bristol Rovers win and that was well earned. 'Chippy' has worked very hard in training and our development games all season and is an exciting young talent who enjoys running at defenders, just as any good winger should. He made a positive impact down at the Memorial Stadium last week and hopefully he will continue to work hard.

Today we welcome Swindon to our Stadium, who have endured a tough season after going so close to promotion last season. I was sad to see Danny Wilson leave the County Ground recently but in Paul Hart they have a very experienced and able manager and they definitely have quality in their squad, so we will have to be at our best today to get another win.

THE 28 YEAR-OLD FORMER TRANMERE AND BARNESLEY MAN HAS PROVED DURING HIS TIME WITH THE TERRIERS THAT HE IS EQUALLY ADEPT AT PLAYING IN DEFENCE OR MIDFIELD. KAY PLAYED OVER 40 GAMES FOR TOWN LAST SEASON WITH THE MAJORITY IN A CENTRAL MIDFIELD ROLE. HOWEVER, THE YORKSHIRE MAN HAS SPENT THE MAJORITY OF THIS CAMPAIGN AT CENTRE HALF CHALLENGING JAMIE MCCOMBE AND PETER CLARKE.

Kay doesn't believe he has a set position and is just happy to be playing and playing well:

"As you go through your career you end up placing in a few different positions – especially if you have the ability to," commented Kay.

"I arrived at the Club from Tranmere as a central midfielder; however, I have played a lot of my career at centre back. As long as I am playing I am not too worried about what position I am in – all I worry about is playing well and keeping my place."

Despite not playing as many games as he did last season, Kay is pleased with the way the season has gone and is hoping to regain his place once he returns from injury.

"The season has gone ok – I have missed a few games through injury and also because I wasn't selected. When I did get back into the team ahead of the Hartlepool game I played well and unfortunately picked up an injury which put an end to that. Hopefully I shouldn't be out for too much longer and I can regain my place."

"The Gaffer has brought in some quality players over the last year – the standard of training has gone up a notch. Every game you play could be your last if you don't play well – there is always someone waiting in the wings vying for your position."

Kay received plaudits following his performances at Hartlepool and Yeovil and was even rewarded by the Football League when he was named in their team of the week.

" I LOVE PLAYING FOOTBALL WITH THE LADS WE HAVE GOT HERE AND AM REALLY ENJOYING MY TIME AT THE CLUB."

"If you ask any footballer, not one would say they like to sit on the bench or not make the squad – especially when the team is playing well. The fans had really got behind me after my performance at Hartlepool and after my goal at Yeovil I was emotional and felt it was right to go in and celebrate with them – the fans are fantastic for away games, we always get a good following wherever we go.

"I know I got booked for my celebration but a lot of the lads jumped on my back, which didn't help my cause! Without going into too much detail I think there are some rules regarding celebrations which are a bit silly and perhaps the one that got me booked is one of them."

Town have got nine games including today's game until the end of the season and Antony believes the games against Peterborough and MK Dons could have a massive bearing on Town's promotion challenge.

"We have got nine massive games including today until the end of the season. They are all massive games, however, the clashes against Peterborough and MK Dons are escalated slightly because if we win we could dent their promotion hopes. If we win those games then hopefully our fate should be in our own hands and we can do the business. The lads have shown their determination to hold on to results in recent weeks with the 1-0 victories over Hartlepool and Bristol Rovers last Saturday."

Antony's contract is up in the summer which has been the subject of many discussions amongst Town fans.

"There have been a few discussions regarding my contract situation. I would like to extend my contract here, I love playing football with the lads we have got here and am really enjoying my time at the Club."

Despite not been on the field, Kay was shocked like us all by Anthony Pilkington's injury and wishes his friend well during his recovery.

"I have seen an injury like Anthony's on TV but I had never previously been involved in a game when an injury like that has taken place. All the lads wish him the best and a speedy recovery. I have spoke to him by text and over the phone since the operation happened and he is in good spirits. As you may have seen from his twitter page he has got a big pot on at the moment, so he is on the road to recovery and I am sure he will come back a better player."

Gladly it is highly unlikely Antony will be available for today's clash against Swindon, however, he hopes to be back in action in a few weeks.

"It is highly unlikely I will be playing today - although I would love to be but my injury is probably going to keep me out for at least two weeks. I went over on my ankle against Rochdale after going up for a header and have bruised my ankle ligaments. It has been over a week since the injury and there is still some swelling around my ankle but hopefully once that goes down I will be able to start training again."

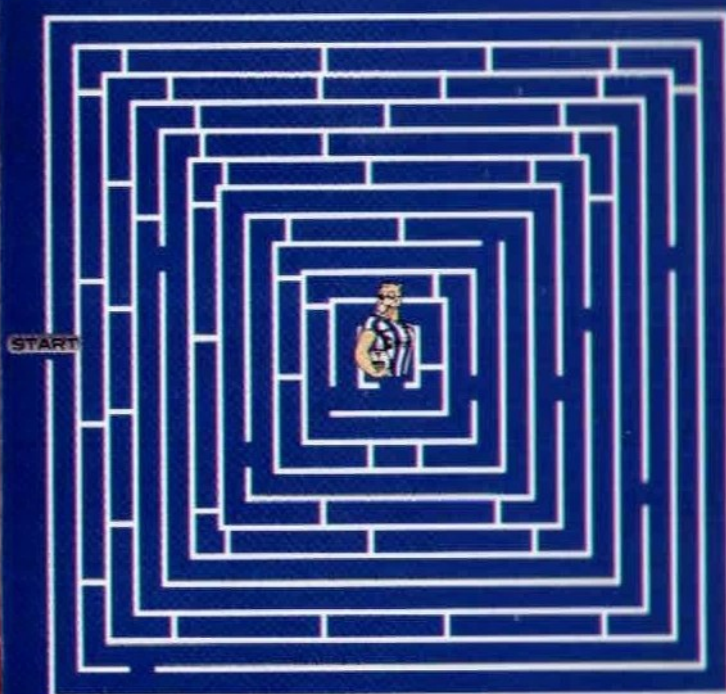

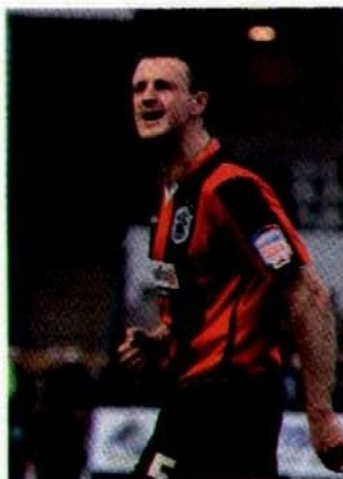

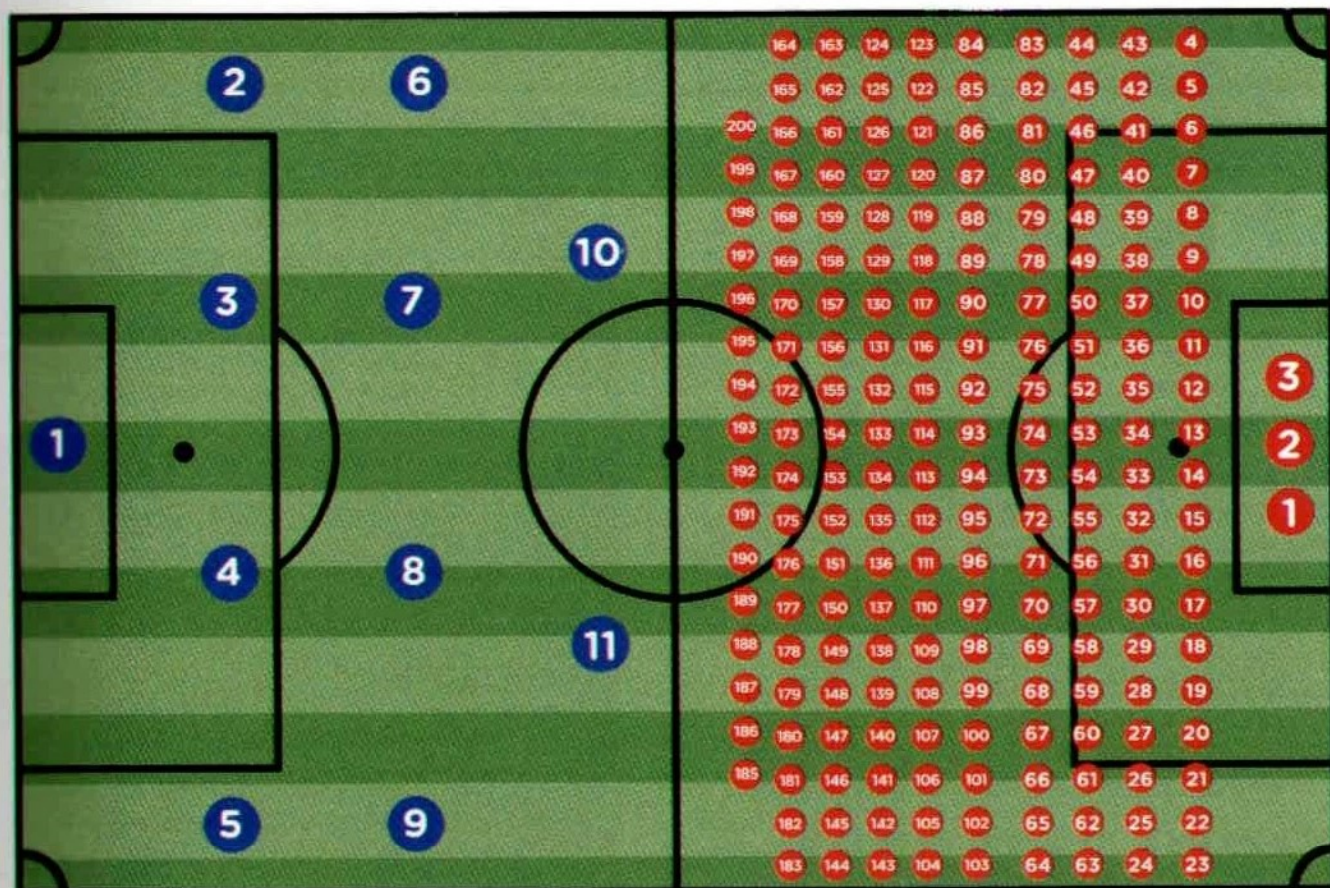

IN MY NOTES FOR THE ROCHDALE GAME I HIGHLIGHTED THE BIG CHANGES THAT ARE ON THE AGENDA FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND ACADEMIES. ALSO DISCUSSED AT THE SAME FOOTBALL LEAGUE MEETING AT LEICESTER WAS THE SUBJECT OF PLAYER WAGE CONTROL.

This is a longstanding point of discussion at club meetings, but historically little substantive progress has ever been made and so player wages have continued to spiral upwards, creating huge losses, a mountain of debt which is never repaid and a trail of club insolvencies.

In June 2010 the Football League set up a "working group" in each of its three divisions looking at how to develop workable cost controls by which all 72 clubs can be bound.

In October 2010 Greg Clarke, new Football League Chairman said

"Everyone connected with the game understands why clubs spend more than they earn. For every club, there is a temptation to spend more cash because of the correlation between money and league position"

Then recently in February 2011, when giving evidence into a Parliamentary inquiry into football governance, Clarke warned that clubs are heading towards "the precipice" due to too much debt, saying;

"There needed to be a sea-change in the way clubs were run. Debt is the biggest problem. If I had to list the 10 things about football that keep me awake at night, it would be debt one to 10. The level of debt is absolutely unsustainable. We are heading for the precipice and we will get there quicker than people think."

Clearly, self-regulation is the preferred route but it is tougher the higher you go — because the gains for success associated with risks being taken are so much greater. When you get to the Championship, it's difficult to constrain clubs trying to gain promotion to the Premier League.

So what's the position on player wages now? There is little restriction currently. Clubs can generally commit to spend whatever they want – it is down to individual Director decisions.

Against this backdrop, the most interesting development in terms of controlling costs at the top of the game is the decision by UEFA to introduce "financial fair play rules". Simplified into a single line, UEFA

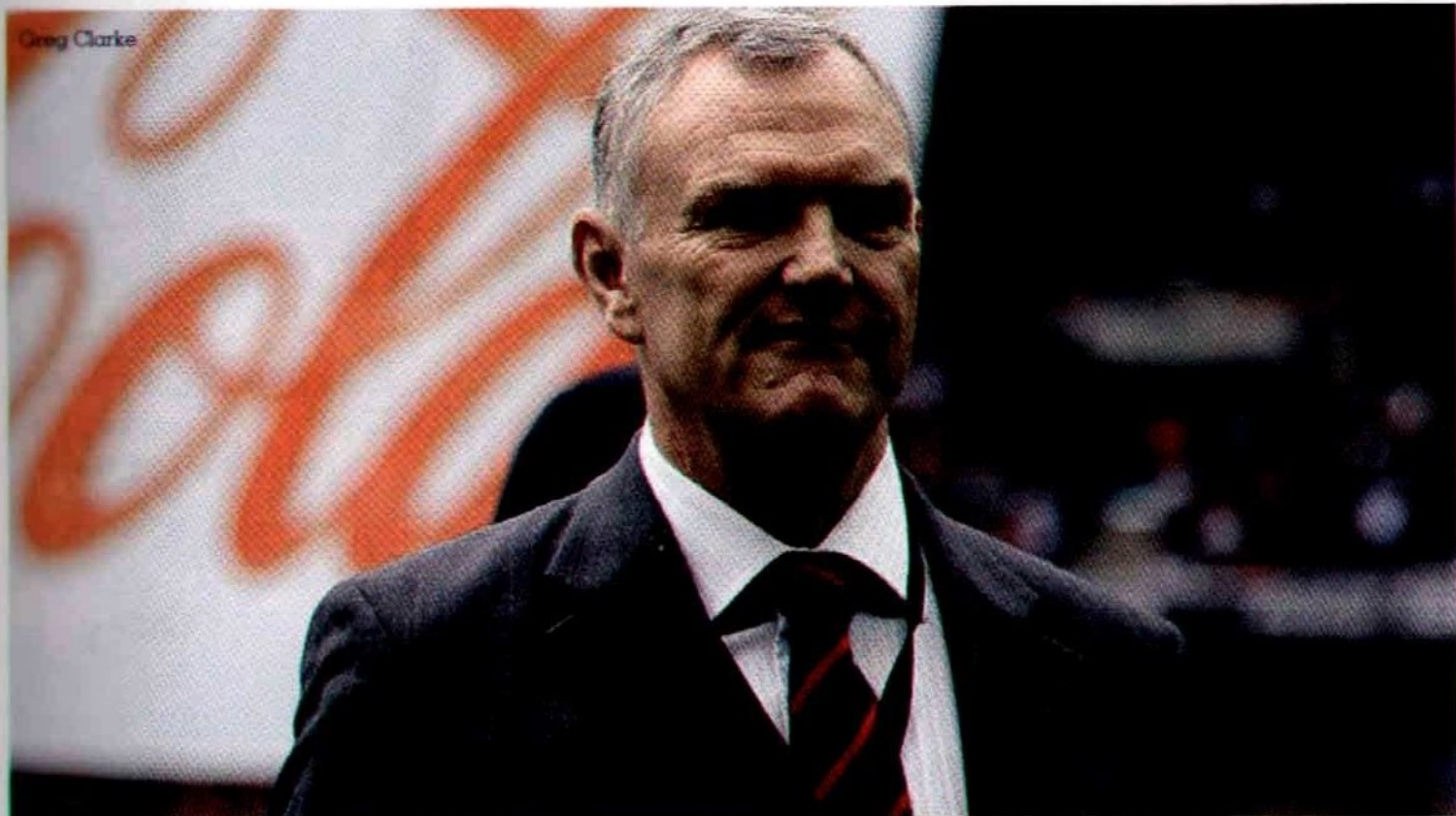
says that clubs will — from 2012/13 — have to demonstrate that their expenditure (including wages) is in line with revenue — or they will be barred from UEFA competitions. Watch out Chelsea and Manchester City!

At the other extreme, it may surprise you to know, in Football League Two, club salary caps are already in place and operating under the radar! That means they already cap their player wage budget at 55 per cent revenue - not individual player's salaries though, so they can pay any player, any salary within their limit. Penalties exist for breaches. The very basic premise is that if you cap your wages as a percentage of revenue, you probably won't go bust. The financial health of Football League Two has improved.

Under these rules, the HTFC turnover would give us a limit of around £2.5m-£3m. That is considerably less than what we pay now! Like many clubs we will have to change the way we operate.

In League One, clubs are already "shadowing" these rules, which mean we are all putting it in place and measuring compliance – but without the penalties for now. We are all seeing how it goes, refining and developing the rules. 2011/12 looks like being the "trial" season with the full system coming for 2012/13 along with penalties! There is a lot of detailed work to come, especially around the rules during the transition period but the feeling of clubs is that radical reform is coming.

The Championship is also now looking at the Premier League model of "financial fair play rules" and the Football League model – each is a different way of achieving the same result. In early March 2011, Reading Chairman Sir John Madejski warned of the need to install a salary cap or "a lot of clubs will disappear".

Progress is slow but there seems to be a momentum building across all the Football League – and crucially

in the Championship. It is easy to see why there is a shift, when you look closely at the colossal amounts of money which is being lost by owners in that league.

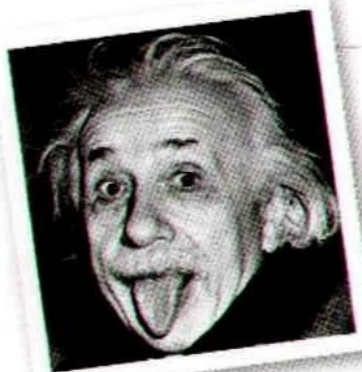
In our discussions with other clubs and Greg Clarke, HTFC has throughout the "New Era", under Dean Hoyle, been a very strong advocate of Football wide collective action to control unsustainable wages. We voted in favour of the new "shadowing" system as a

step forward in 2010, and again to take this to the next stage at Leicester. Acting alone is indeed a noble aspiration, but in practice is pointless and competitive suicide, the Clubs must all move collectively, through regulation.

As Dean Hoyle frequently states, owning a club is very expensive and there is not a queue of new investors waiting to come into the game. By making football ownership more affordable it will attract people and perhaps even increase the scope for fan ownership.

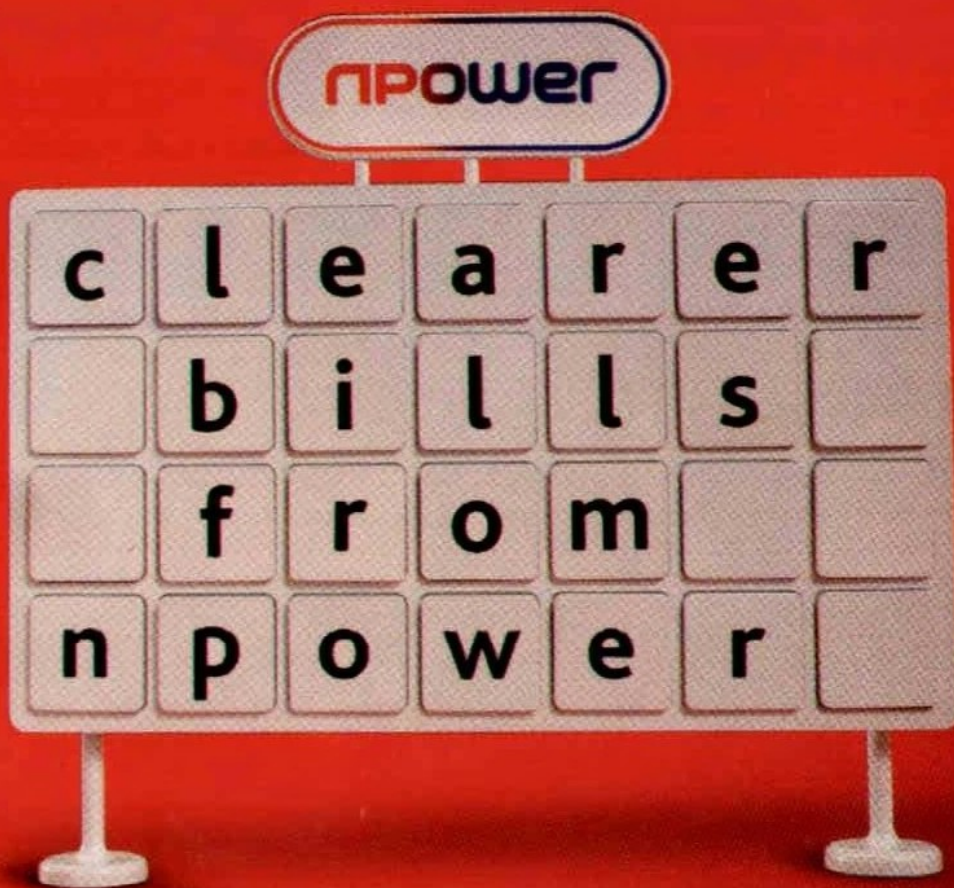

TODAY'S GAME IS DEDICATED TO THE 'LEVEL PLAYING FIELD' CAMPAIGN, WHICH IS AN ANNUAL INITIATIVE RUN BY NADS (NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF DISABLED SUPPORTERS). GUAH TALKED TO DAVE HEATHERILL AND CARL DICKSON – TWO DISABLED FANS WHO WORK VERY CLOSELY WITH THE CLUB.

My name is Dave Heatherill and I have been watching Town since 1960 when my Father introduced me to football at Leeds Road. I have now notched up over 50 years of watching town, so goodness knows how many games I have seen! Certainly when the blue and white faith hits you it stays in your system forever - I can't understand these people who support the big clubs and live nowhere near them. I have been a season ticket holder since we moved to the new Stadium in 1994. Watching and supporting Town is one big rollercoaster ride!

On a match day I like to get to the ground early so I set off in my car around 1.45pm to arrive at 2pm. I can then park up in one of the disabled parking areas, and meet up with other disabled supporters in the car park area. Since 2003 I have been Chairman of the Disabled Supporters Club, so we are always on the look out for potential new members.

Huddersfield Town Disabled Supporters Club



The Disabled Supporters Club have been going since 1999 – our website is www.htdsc.co.uk. We hold monthly meetings at Almondbury and we have a very good relationship with the Club, who are very understanding and helpful. We also take an interest and contribute to the Club's Academy, and we have a representative on the Development Association.

Even in the car park you strike up conversations with the regulars about the club's results, news,

tactics and the opposing team. And then on to the gate entrance where we meet more Disabled Club members and the many friendly supporters who have time to chat. On the way to my seat in the front row of the Direct Golf Lower stand we have time to speak to more disabled supporters, the stewards and the regulars who come down to have a chat; this truly, as the club says, is a family friendly club!

My seat is on the front row just along from the away team dug out, so we have had many interesting discussions with away team coaches and managers!

We used to have helpers come along at half time with tea or coffee but now we have a food and drinks trolley. The Club have over 242 places for wheelchair supporters (16 Away) and 26 positions for Visually Impaired Supporters, and unlimited places for the Ambulant disabled. Altogether there are 14 disabled access toilets in the ground.

Well my build-up to the game is over, and we await the kick off - all we wish that the team gives 100% to enable us to win another three points. I know a win gives you an excuse to go for a pint, but a defeat can linger with you all week!

When it comes to disabled supporters of Huddersfield Town, they don't come any more committed than Carl Dickinson! (main picture)

An accident with a bailing machine in a textile factory at the age of 10 left Carl with disfigured arms, but that hasn't held him back and Carl is now a vital part of the Huddersfield Town family.

"I was born and bred in Milnsbridge so I've always taken a keen interest in Town's results from afar, but the truth is I never had anyone to go to the matches with until the start of Andy Ritchie's reign as manager," Carl told Give Us An H.

"I went to the Play-Off Final at Cardiff with a friend, but to be honest I hated it! Looking back I don't know why exactly, but it did set me back a little.

"My next game was a pre-season friendly at Hucknall just after Ritchie had taken charge – it suited me perfectly as my in-laws live in Chesterfield.

"After that I was hooked, but I must say that (Ticket Office Manager) Sue Beaumont is the main reason I started to volunteer at the Club. She was fantastic in helping me get tickets – particularly in teaching me the process for away fixtures. She made me feel so welcome and it was then that I decided to give something back."

Manager Biog - Paul Hart

The Lancashire-born manager was a defender during his playing career, beginning his career at the start of the 70's; making over 500 appearances for seven different clubs.

Initially playing for Stockport County, he moved to Blackpool where he made over 100 appearances for the Club in five years, scoring 15 goals. Hart then left the relegation-bound seashiders to join Leeds United, signing for £300,000, making 191 apps for the Yorkshire club. Moves to Nottingham Forest, Sheffield Wednesday, Birmingham City followed before ending his eighteen year career at Notts County in 1988.

Hart didn't wait long to get his foot in the door of management when the following season after retiring from the game he took charge of Chesterfield for three years. But a decade gap follows before the ex-defender took the Nottingham Forest job in 2001 and since then Hart's reputation has only continued to grow with further managerial roles at Barnsley and Rushden & Diamonds. Hart then got his big chance when he became caretaker manager of Premiership side Portsmouth in February 2008 until the end of the season, following the sacking of Tony Adams.

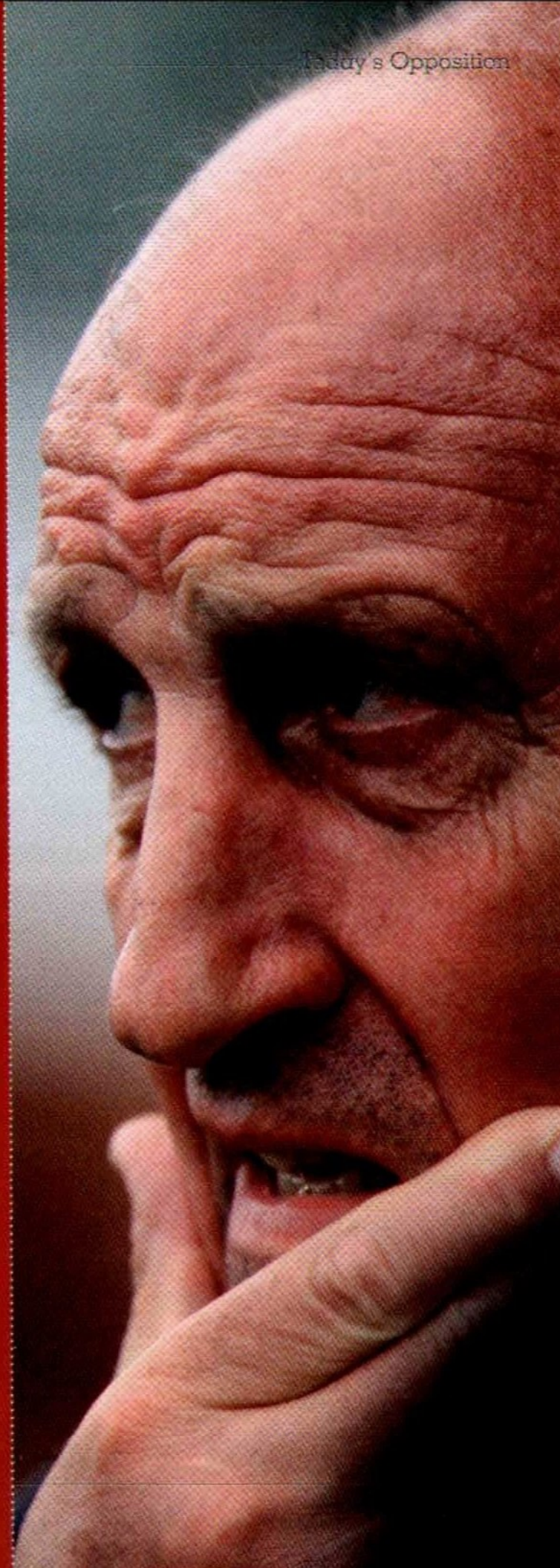
Hart seems to keep getting the hardest jobs in football, the man to keep the football club up so to speak. As last year, Hart was given that exact task, with then struggling Championship side Crystal Palace in March 2010; he successfully kept Palace in the Championship. He firstly capitalised on a powerful surge by Clyde Wijnhard to fire home, then six minutes later the tricky midfielder smashed a stunning volley into the Swindon net from a Wijnhard knock-down. Town duly finished the game in cruise control with Gorré, Wijnhard and Stewart all going close to record their fourth successive victory.

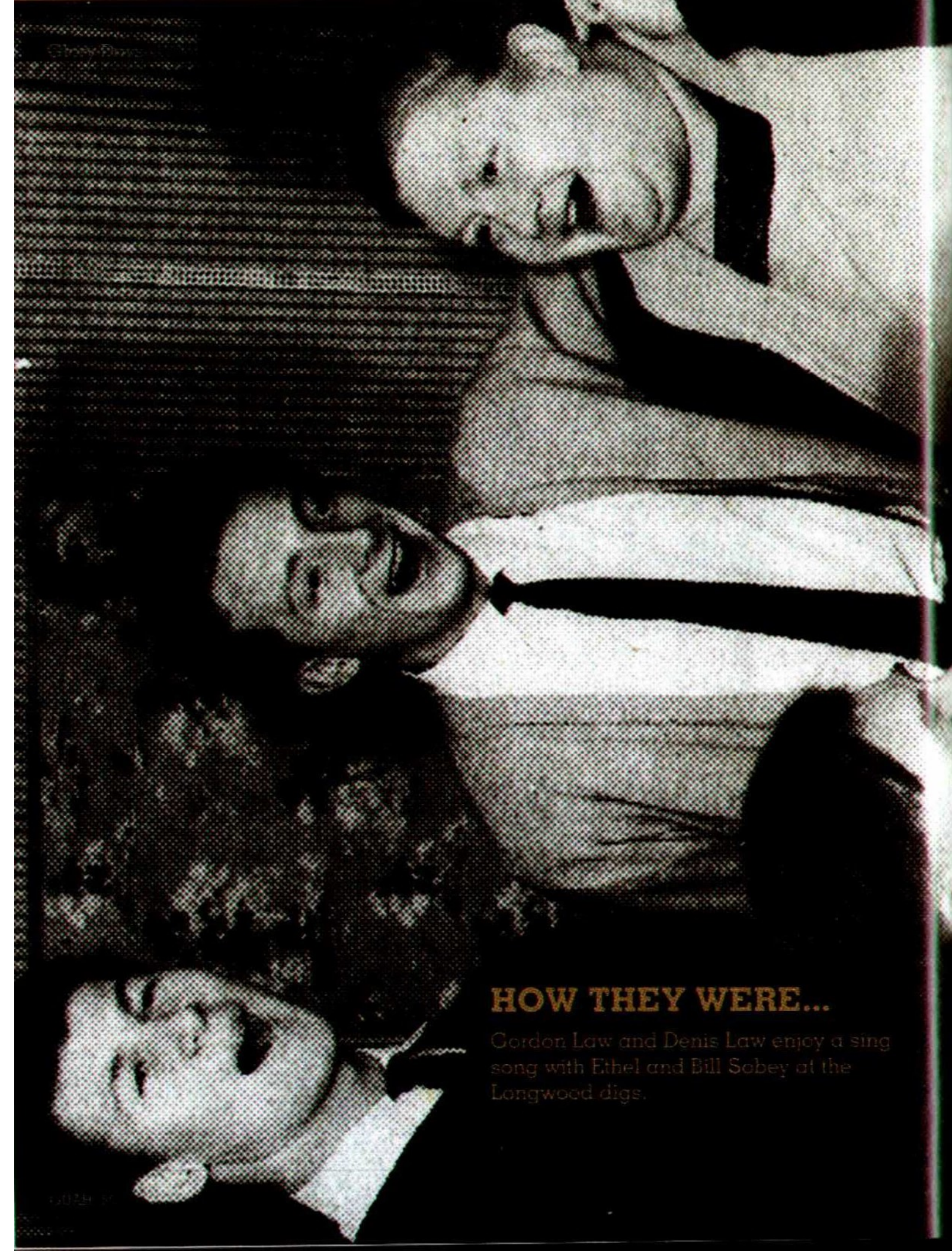

Imagine jumping into a pool with them on your summer holiday, or enjoying a fun swim together at your local KAL leisure centre.

Swimming is the best exercise your child can do – it works all their muscles, improves their cardio-vascular system and puts no strain on their joints and bones. But best of all – children LOVE swimming because it's fun.

And on a more serious note, children are naturally drawn to water and should learn to swim as soon as possible to avoid any terrible accidents.

Kirklees Active Leisure (KAL) runs more than 400 swimming lessons every week across the district. All our teachers are fully CRB checked and have years of experience in producing little swimmers.

For youngsters, we offer ducklings (under 3s) and water confidence (3 – 5 year olds) in which a parent or guardian goes into the water with the child. Ducklings is great for bonding with your child and getting them used to being in the water; water confidence classes begin to teach children how to swim.

It is desirable for children to go to

water confidence classes before a beginner class, but not essential.

Beginner classes are now available for children from age five, which is a year younger than previously, after which they can progress through the grades. These classes are for a group of children, with no adult in the pool.

If your child is not a beginner, they will need an assessment to see which class to place them in. Each course lasts for 12 weeks and costs £55.20.

Another bonus is that children can swim for free during public swim sessions for the duration of their course – so they can practise what they have learned. This is a great bonus, particularly if you have more than one child.

To enrol, ring your local centre or pop in. Alternatively, look at our swimming lesson page at www.kirkleesactive.co.uk/swimming

All our pools also offer one to one lessons with an instructor for £19.75, which are fantastic if your child needs a bit of extra help or responds better away from a group.

Lessons are run specifically for children with disabilities at Scissett Baths, Holmfirth Pool, and Stadium Pool.

Alternatively, why not try a lesson in waterpolo (Stadium Pool, Huddersfield Sports Centre), Triathlon swimming (Holmfirth) or diving (Spenborough Pool). Rookie lifeguard lessons are held at most centres too.

KAL runs adult beginner and improver classes too. If you are a complete beginner or nervous swimmer, why not come to our low-cost classes? (Just £10 for six lessons). Ring our swim development team on 01484 234127 or email them KALswimmingdevelopment@kirklees.gov.uk for more details.

And for those who are confident swimmers, why not try our new Swimfit programme? This is a water-based fitness programme available for people at four levels. Some sessions have an instructor, but this is mostly a programme to do in your own time in the pool and see real results.

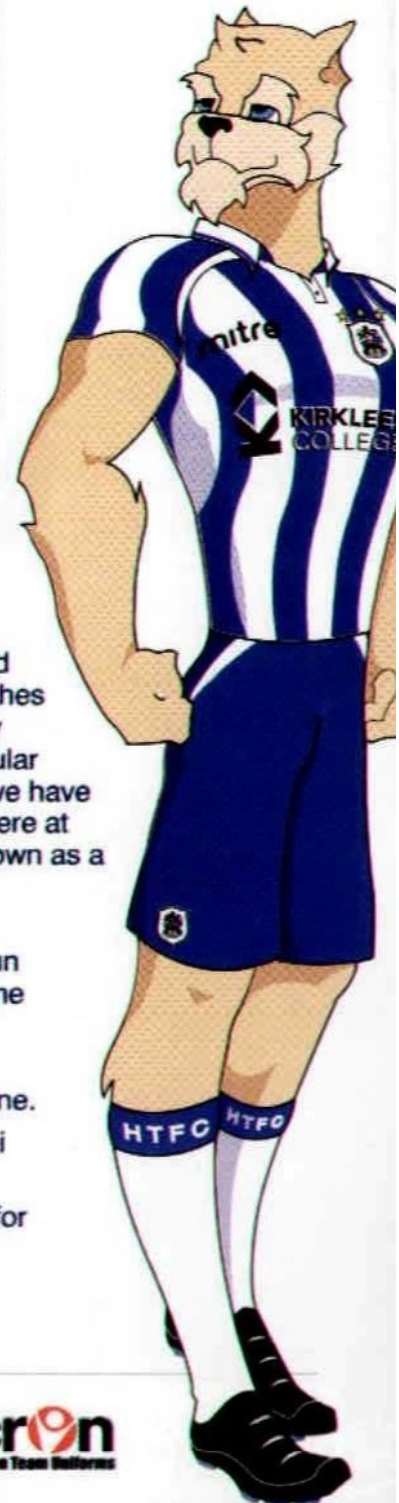
Schools with differing backgrounds and cultures team up to take part in various activities throughout the day ranging from football, multi-sports and of course the renowned Kids Zone.

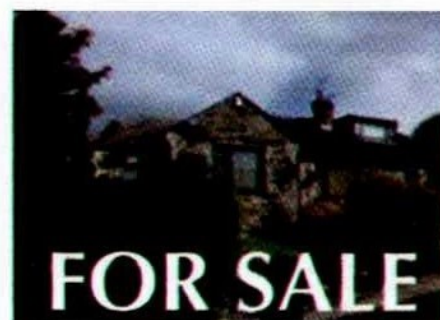

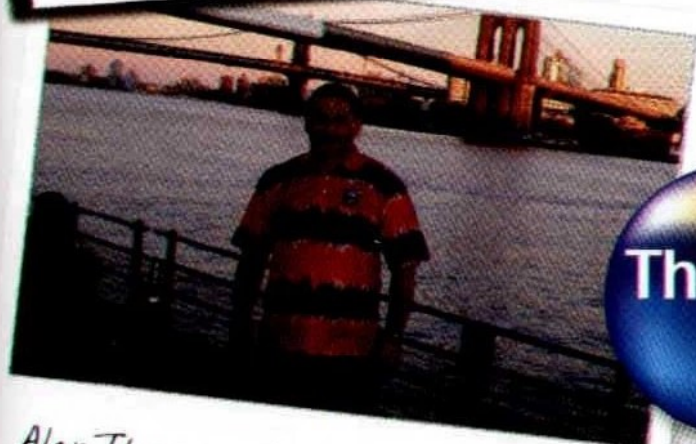

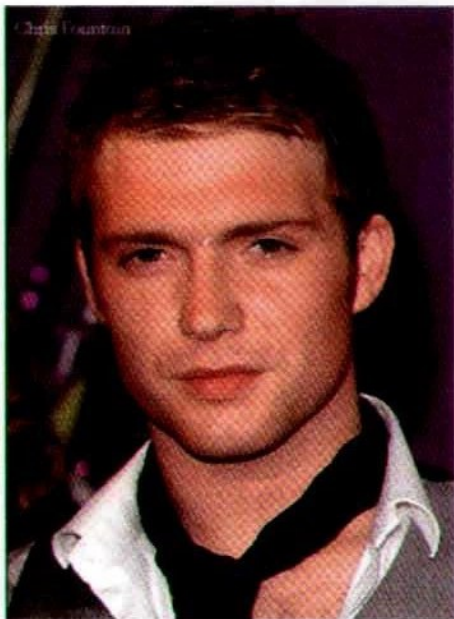
The Good Mood League is made up of several teams that train on a weekly basis and play in tournaments quarterly. The main difference between this league and others is that the players are current mental health service users, with conditions such as obsessive compulsive disorder, schizophrenia and bipolar disorder.

Playing football has psychological and physical benefits to the service users from anger management to anxiety control but the most beneficial is that it gets service users out of the house and socialising with other people.

Now in its third successful year the Good Mood league aims to eliminate stigma & discrimination that can be attached with mental health. It also provides a boost to service user's mental wellbeing through regular exercise. Playing football can play an important role in improving not just physical fitness but also self esteem. It's about belonging to a team, meeting people and taking part in games like today.

Nationally one in four people will have a mental health problem at sometime in their lives and

Huddersfield Town's 'Football in the Community' are committed to using football to tackle both the discrimination faced by sufferers as well as assisting with people to live more independent and fulfilling lives.

As a football club Huddersfield Town are celebrating the 'Level Playing Field' campaign by playing this match today and Football in the Community Officer Paul France has recently expressed his delight in the support the Club has been able to offer the Good Mood League and its

participants. The 'Level Playing Field' is an annual initiative, run by NADS (National Association of Disabled Supporters), which has the backing of the FA, Premier League, Football League and the Football Conference which is focusing on facilities and services for ambulant disabled supporters this year. The term 'ambulant disabled' generally refers to people with a wide range of disabilities who are not regular wheelchair users. The theme for the 2011 campaign is Good Access = Good Business.

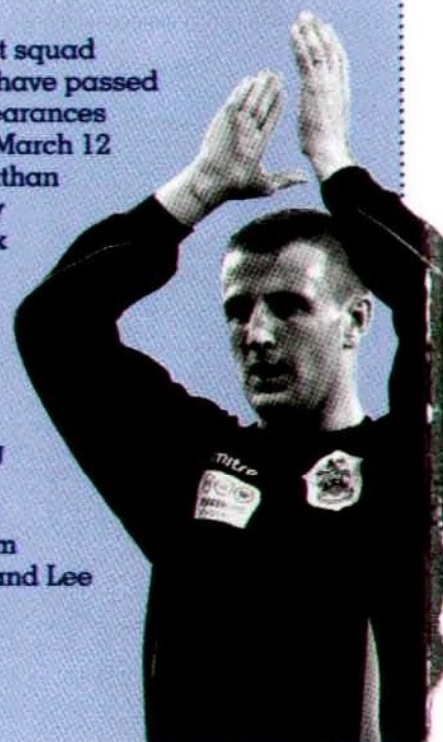
PETER CLARKE THE CENTURION!

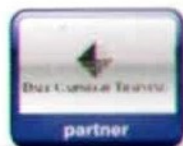

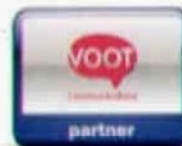
