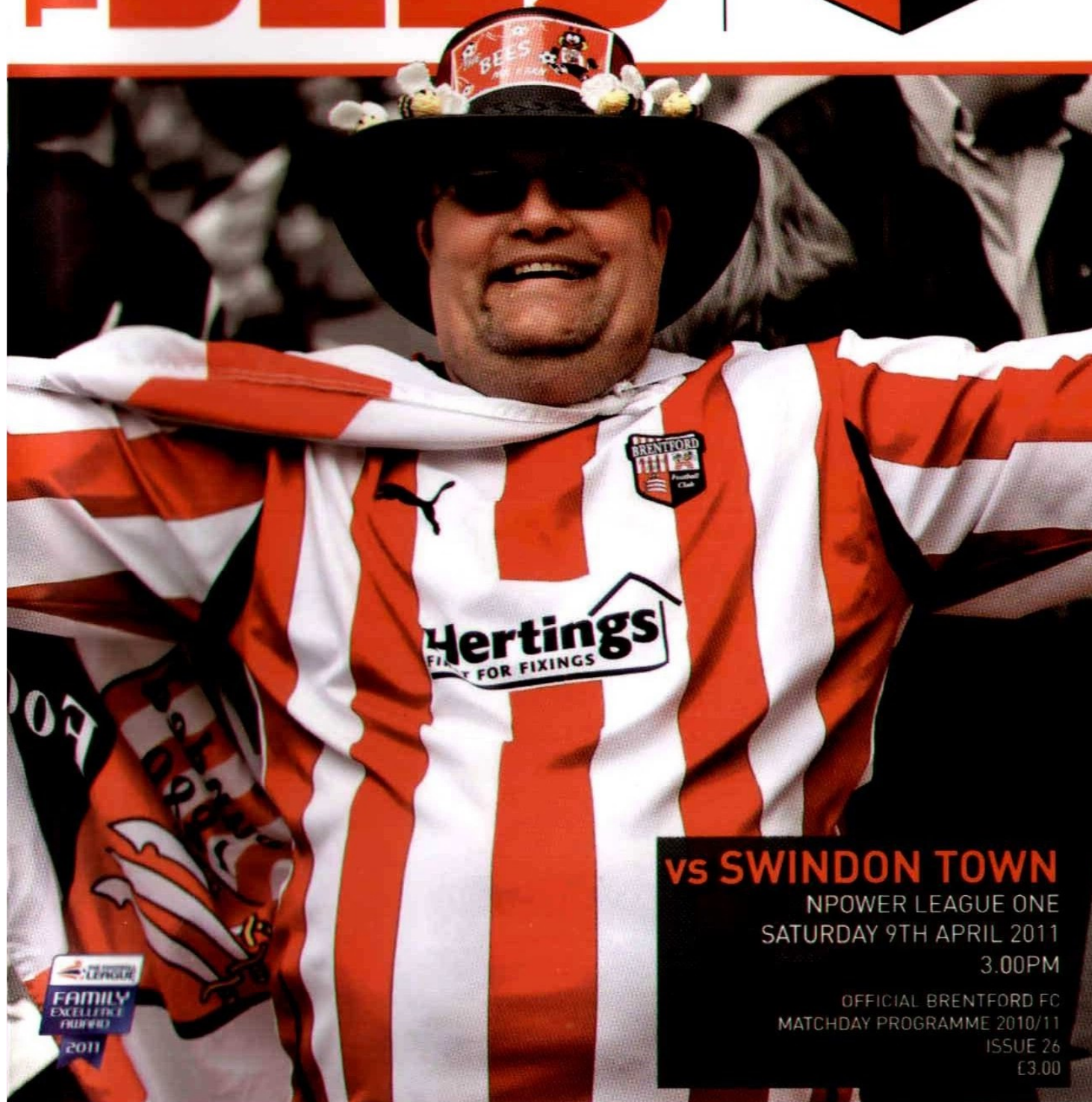

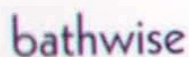

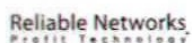

To see and hear 25,000 Bees fans was very emotional and as always you did not let us down. More about the day later.

But today it's back to the all important pursuit of League points and in that respect I welcome Paul Hart and his Swindon Town squad. Swindon's plight highlights the vagaries of football inasmuch as just eleven months they were at Wembley Stadium and ninety minutes away from promotion to the Championship. Less than a year on they now find themselves in the relegation zone with a fight on their hands to retain their League One status. It's a lesson to all of us that we should take nothing for granted in this game and the fact that at times we may get close to our goals, the real work starts then

in maintaining the momentum to achieve the ultimate rewards.

Such was the case with the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. Throughout the competition we maintained the high standards I and my predecessors had set and progressed to the Final on merit. But come the day, early on we seemed to be overawed by the occasion which showed in a very lacklustre first half. However we got to grips with it in a much improved second half performance, albeit with a lack of opportunities other than that which saw Jeffrey's individual effort hit the foot of the post. But what will be will be and as disappointed as we all are let's remember that 46 other League One and Two sides weren't there to have the opportunity to win or lose.

With seven League games remaining, the nine points accumulated in our last three games have given us everything to play for. Sunday's defeat may have been disappointing but not a setback, and it is the way we respond today, both on and off the pitch, that will determine what's in store for us over the next four weeks.

The players are eager to get back out there and show what they are capable of and I'm sure you as fans will be right behind them giving them the support that has been so crucial this season.

FROM THE CEO

FOLLOWING OUR JOHNSTONE PAINT TROPHY FINAL APPEARANCE LAST WEEKEND AT THE MAGNIFICENT WEMBLEY STADIUM I WOULD LIKE TO PAY TRIBUTE TO THE TREMENDOUS EFFORT OF THE STAFF HERE AT GRIFFIN PARK AND ALL OF YOU CONNECTED WITH THE CLUB.

Taking just over 25,000 supporters to Wembley was a magnificent success and a real signal to the football world of both our intent and an indication of why I remain convinced that our ambitions remain genuinely achievable. Personally the 'Wembley' experience for me was one of mixed emotions, surreal in many ways; I nudged Alan Bird shortly before kick off to remind him to savour the full atmosphere of the day. Like all of us invested in the future success of Brentford Football Club it was with anticipation of what might be that we eagerly awaited kick off. Unfortunately as we now know things didn't quite go as we might have hoped and I found it difficult not to leave Wembley disappointed both personally and professionally. Only later that evening did the magnitude of the achievement of the day start to sink in. Many clubs will never experience a Cup Final at Wembley, as will many players, many more supporters and far fewer Chief Executives. So allow me to offer my thanks to The Football Club and our Supporters on the day for allowing me to be an extremely proud Chief Executive of Brentford Football Club. Though I have since had a number of 'friends' tell me how miserable I looked on TV as the players made their way past the Royal Box, I can offer no apology other than I'm passionate about what we do, we lost and yes I was miserable! As a final JPT note I would like to single out all those players not involved in the playing squad on Sunday who had every reason to be extremely disappointed but instead focused their energy into providing positive support for those players involved. It was a refreshing reminder that this really is a Team game.

So with Wembley out the way we move forward towards the season end with some extremely important decisions getting ever closer. The search for a long term management solution remains a priority with discussions currently taking place on the next step in the process. I am happy to confirm that the short list has now been drawn up and steady progress is being made. I should also confirm that both Nicky and Mark are included within that list and will like the others included be asked to present their management vision to the interview panel in the coming weeks. Next seasons kit designs have now been agreed in concept and I eagerly await delivery of the sample shirts. Whilst I cannot make any announcement in relation to the specific designs at this stage I can confirm that both Hertings First for Fixings and Bathwise have not only

renewed their partnership deals with the football club but increased their financial commitment. I am also delighted to have got Board approval to offer a further discount on early bird season tickets with prices hopefully having been confirmed by the time you read this. As mentioned earlier in the season I am due to meet all the companies interested in supplying match day catering services in the next few weeks to finalise our contract for next season. And finally I am expecting to see some real developments on our future at Griffin Park and whilst I know you have all suffered the ambiguity of uncertainty I think we are finally making some real progress. Accept my assurance that as soon as we can confirm any development we will.

Allow me to take this opportunity on behalf of the Chairman, Board of Directors, Management Team and Players to thank you for your wonderful support so far this season and assure you of our commitment to achieving our long term ambitions.

INCE LEAVES NOTTS COUNTY

➡ Paul Ince has left his job as manager of Notts County after just over five months at the helm.

The former England midfielder, who only took charge last October, left Meadow Lane by mutual consent after a run of five straight league defeats.

County chairman Ray Trew said: "The recent run of results, which saw us win just once in March, meant that we were all in agreement that we had to address the situation.

"When we sat down to discuss the matter with Paul, it became clear

that we were in agreement that a parting of the ways would be the best way forwards for all parties."

Ince signed a three-and-a-half year deal when he took the job at the end of October and replaced Craig Short.

The ex-Manchester United midfielder's managerial career started by helping Macclesfield avoid dropping into the Conference before he had two spells at MK Dons, during one of which he led them to League One and victory in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final, and a brief stint at Blackburn.

Head scout Carl Heggs has taken over on a temporary basis but suffered a 2-1 home defeat to Rochdale in his opening game on Tuesday.

It means County are now just a point and a place above the relegation zone.



SMITH AGREES NEW DEAL

➡ Walsall manager Dean Smith has signed a new two-year contract to stay at the club until the summer of 2013.

The former Leyton Orient and Saddlers defender took charge in January following the sacking of Chris Hutchings.

He has led Walsall, our next opponents, to within two points of safety, having been eight points adrift when he took over.

Chief executive Stefan Gamble said: "The impact Dean has had since stepping up to first-team level is clear for all to see.

"Performances, and crucially results, have improved dramatically and we have given ourselves as real chance of avoiding relegation, something that was almost unthinkable at the turn of the year."



LATICS STAYING PUT

➡ Oldham have confirmed that they will be staying at Boundary Park for next season and maybe beyond.

Earlier in the season the club had made noises about possibly moving to a new stadium but they could not get permission to build on their preferred site.

PROBLEMS CONTINUE AT PLYMOUTH

➡ Struggling Plymouth are still fighting for their lives both on and off the pitch following their 10-point deduction for going into administration.

The Professional Footballers' Association has helped with wages for players and staff for April, and defender Roman Larrieu told the club's website: "We've been asked to do it and that's the only way forward for us and for the club, so we are going to do that."

Reports have also emerged of a rival bid who want to take over the club and lead them out of administration.

Meanwhile Argyle's 17-year-old full-back Jack Stephens has joined Southampton for £150,000 but cannot play for his new side this season as he has signed outside the transfer window.

Swindon are suffering a horrific season and are in danger of following an appearance in the play-off final with relegation just 12 months later.

The Robins had a tremendous campaign in 2009/10, finishing fifth, and beating Charlton on penalties in the play-off semi-finals, but they lost 1-0 to Millwall at Wembley.

Striker Billy Paynter and captain Gordon Greer both moved on in the summer, to Leeds and Brighton respectively, and the team made a poor start from which they have never really recovered.

Three points from their first five games left them next to bottom and although three consecutive victories followed it proved to be a false dawn.

Since those opening eight games, Swindon have won just four more times in the League and are currently on a winless run of 18 matches stretching back to their 4-2 win at Charlton at the start of January.

To make matters worse their other key striker Charlie Austin left to join Burnley at the end of the January transfer window and since then they have scored just eight goals in 14 matches.

Manager Danny Wilson resigned at the start of March and has been replaced by Paul Hart.

This is the 10th season out of the last 11 that Town have spent in this division.

The one exception was the 2006/07 campaign when they bounced straight back from relegation by finishing third in League Two.

Swindon have also been members of the Premier League – for one season, 1993/94, which was the competition's second year.

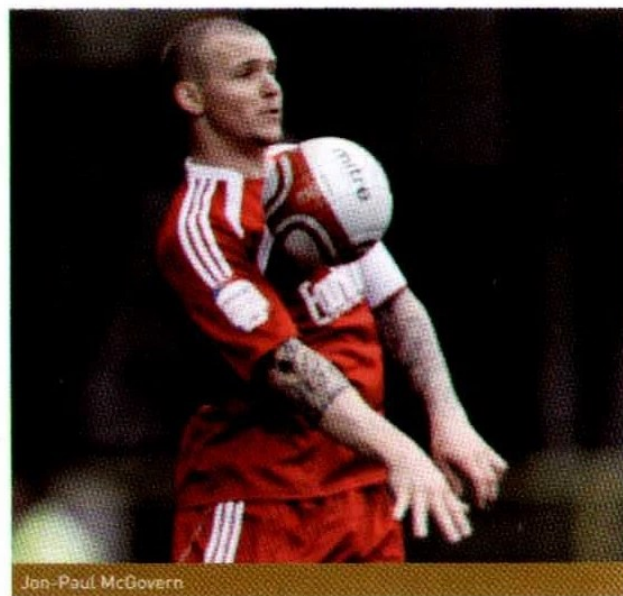

Swindon have a good recent record at Griffin Park and continued that last season with a 3-2 win.

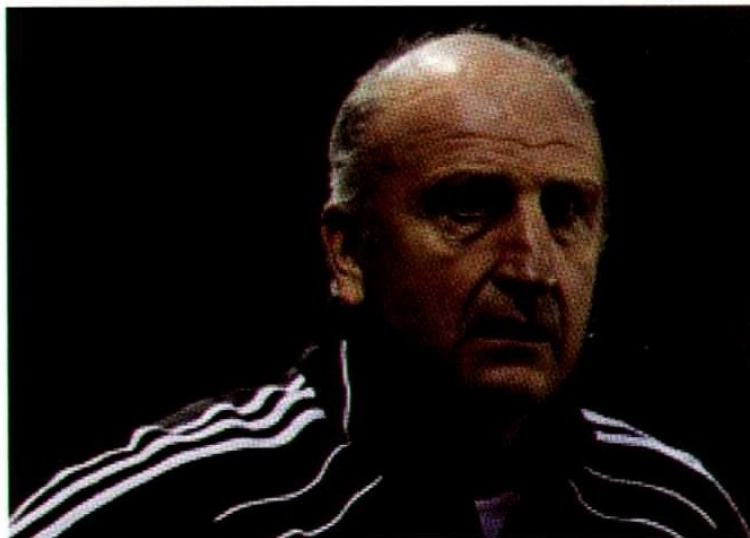
Alex Revell and Ben Hutchinson put them 2-1 up early on before in a frantic final 15 minutes, Carl Cort pulled one back, Revell restored the advantage only for Charlie MacDonald to reply to set up a nervous finish.

Their previous visit finished goalless in October 2005, leaving our last win over them here in January that year.

Grant Smith headed Town into the lead but Deon Burton dived to head the equaliser before Stephen Hunt won it late on, in his first game after a three-month injury lay-off, when he lashed the ball home from 18 yards.

THE MANAGER

As mentioned earlier, **Paul Hart** took over in a caretaker role just over a month ago.

He has previously managed Chesterfield, Nottingham Forest, Barnsley, Portsmouth, QPR and Crystal Palace.

He also had a long playing career as a centre-half, representing Stockport, Blackpool, Leeds, Nottingham Forest, Sheffield Wednesday, Birmingham and Notts County.

THE PLAYERS

Paul Smith [12] (ex-Margate and Crawley), who made his Robins debut against us in the Carling Cup in 2006, received a late call-up to start against Hartlepool last Saturday when former England under-21 international **David Lucas** [1] (ex-Preston, Sheffield Wednesday, Barnsley and Leeds) injured his back in the warm-up. Polish under-21 international **Jakub Jesionkowski** [26], who has not appeared this season, was drafted on to the bench.

The defence seven days ago featured **Paul Caddis** [6] (ex-Celtic) at right-back, **Alan Sheehan** [21] (ex-Belvedere, Leicester and Leeds), who was on loan at the County Ground last season, at left-back and former Bee **Andy Frampton** [5] (ex-Crystal Palace), currently on loan from Millwall and who made over 150 appearances for us in four-and-a-half seasons, sharing central defensive duties with Haiti international **Jean-Francois Lescinel** [19] (ex-Paris St Germain and Sedan).

On the bench were vice-captain and right-back **Scott Cuthbert** [2] (ex-Celtic) and left-back **Michael Rose** [3] (ex-Manchester United, Chester, Hereford, Yeovil and Stockport) while centre-half **Kevin Amankwaah** [15] (ex-Bristol City, Yeovil and Swansea) is available but former trainee **Nathan Thompson** [23] has an ankle injury.

Saturday's midfield consisted of **Jon-Paul McGovern** [7] (ex-Celtic, Livingston, Sheffield Wednesday and MK

Dons), captain and Republic of Ireland international **Jonathan Douglas** [4] (ex-Blackburn and Leeds), former England under-21 international **David Prutton** [10] (ex-Nottingham Forest, Southampton, Leeds and Colchester), who cost Saints a £2.5 million fee, and on loan Portsmouth winger **Matt Ritchie** [22], who had a similar spell with the Robins last season.

Substitutes were **Simon Ferry** [8] (ex-Celtic), who was on loan from the Bhoys for all of last season, former Republic of Ireland under-21 international **Michael Timlin** [10] (ex-Fulham) and on loan Crystal Palace player **Alessane N'diaye** [29].

Alan O'Brien [18] (ex-Newcastle and Hibernian) and **Billy Bodin** [31], son of ex-Town legend Paul, are also available.

Up front were January deadline day signing **Elliott Benyon** [24] (ex-Bristol City and Torquay), who had hit 14 goals for the Gulls before his move, and on loan Crystal Palace striker **Calvin Andrew** [30] (ex-Luton).

On loan Leeds and former USA under-20 player **Mike Grella** [27] provided an attacking alternative from the bench while **Vincent Pericard** [9] (ex-Juventus, Portsmouth, Stoke and Carlisle) is back in training following a knee operation.

DID YOU KNOW THAT ON 9TH APRIL IN 1413 HENRY V WAS CROWNED KING OF ENGLAND.



ALSO...

1921 Approximately 4000 fans watched Brentford and Southend United share the points in a 2-2 draw at Griffin Park. Bert Spreadbury and Reg Boyne scored.

1927 Claude Craddock's goal was just a consolation as Brentford lost 2-1 away to Plymouth.

1928 Bill Berry converted a penalty as Brentford drew 1-1 away to Norwich City.

1932 Teddy Nash made his last appearance of the season in goal – but couldn't stop Mansfield beating Brentford 2-0 at Field Mill.

1938 Brentford scored three goals at the Hawthorns with Dave McCulloch scoring twice and Gerry McAloon netting. Unfortunately West Bromwich Albion scored 4 and ran out 4-3 winners.

1949 Joe Crozier was in goal as Brentford lost 3-0 to Grimsby Town away.

1955 Jim Towers and Frank Dudley scored twice as Brentford beat Crystal Palace 3-0 at Griffin Park.

1960 Jim Towers was the Bees match winner as Brentford won 1-0 against York City at Bootham Crescent.

That goal was Owusu's 18th of the season, bringing him level with Burgess.

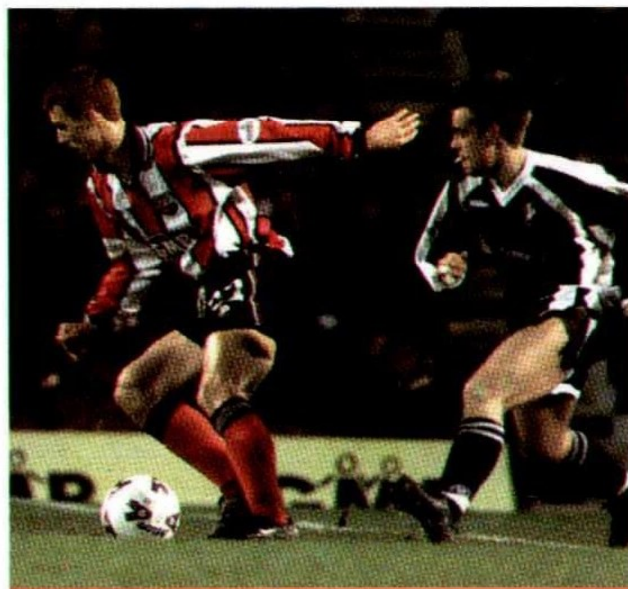
In-between the goals Swindon had fought back and Bees midfielder Steve Sidwell had to be alert to clear two separate chances off the line.

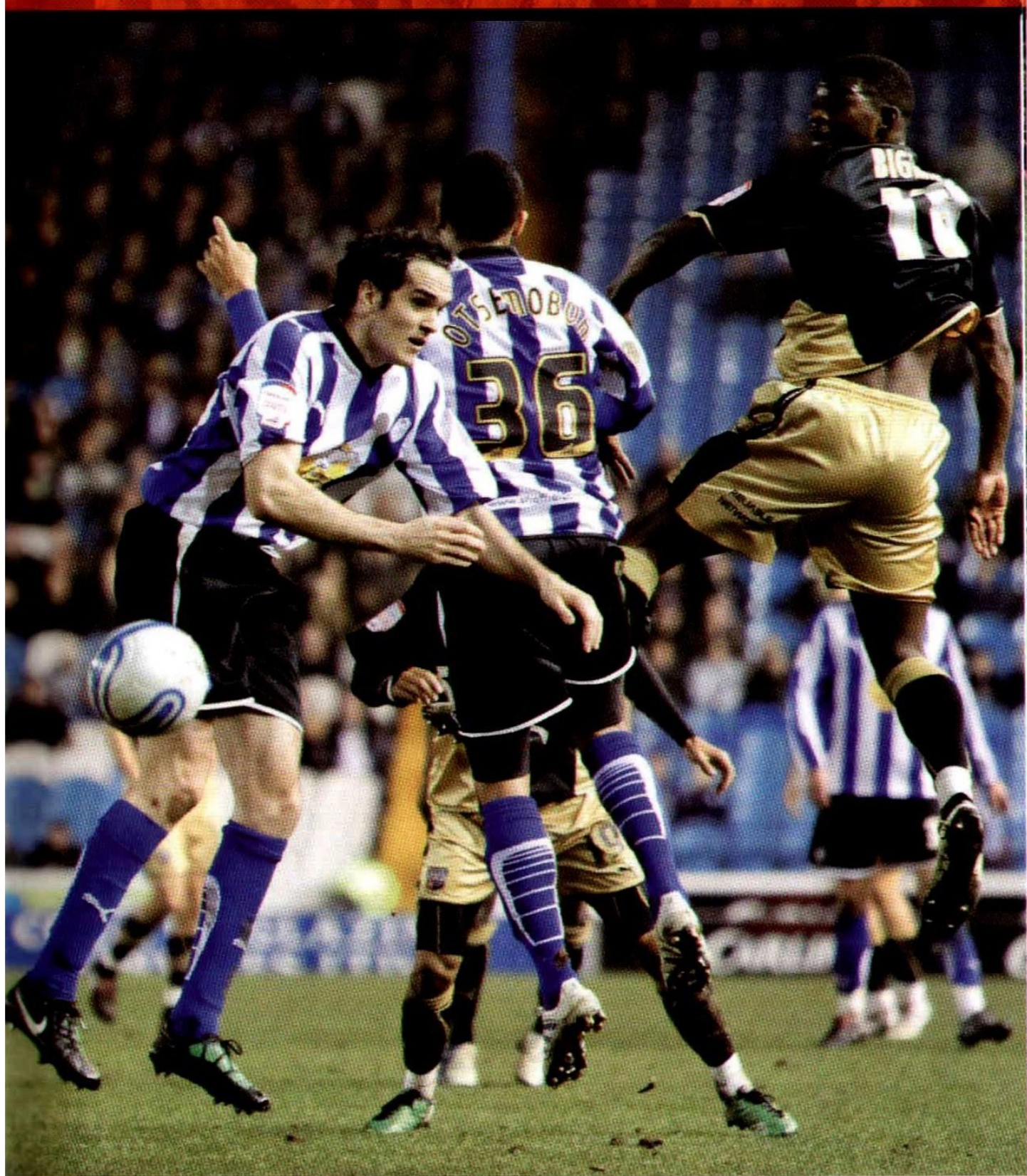

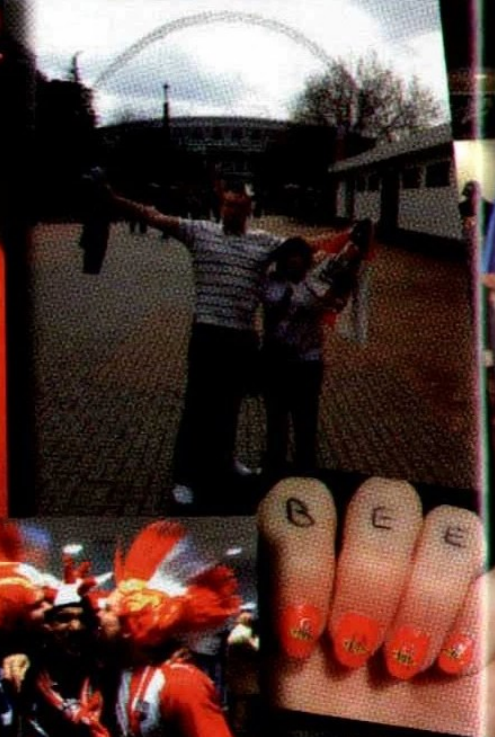

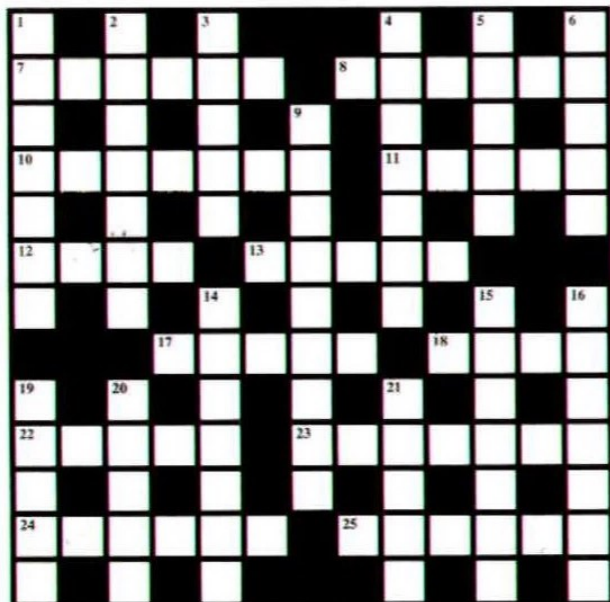
