



As a manager, you need to know what you are going to get from your players and the least that you should expect is 100 per cent effort and hard work

Good afternoon and welcome back to Hillsborough for today's game against Swindon.

Due to printing deadlines over the Easter period, I'm writing these notes prior to our trip to Walsall on Saturday but we're back at Hillsborough today where we've won our last three games.

It seems funny how all the things that were viewed as a negative a few games ago are now seen in the correct light, which is that playing at Hillsborough in front of huge crowds for this division is a big advantage.

The last three games here have gone well for us in terms of results, but they have also been exactly what we expect of a team pulling on a Wednesday shirt.


As a manager, you need to know what you are going to get from your players and the least that you should expect is 100 per cent effort and hard work. We can work on the set pieces, we can work on the shape but what only the individual can do is guarantee the amount of effort he puts in.

In that respect, I've been really

pleased with the effort, desire and honesty and hence we have managed to get the results we. and the rest of the country, expect Sheffield Wednesday to get when playing at Hillsborough.

From my own point of view, I've been here just over 11 weeks and it takes time to learn what the players who you don't know can do and, just as importantly, what they can't do. If they can't or won't do something that I expect, then we have to get people in who can.

One of the things that people from



outside Sheffield seem to focus on is expectation but the crowd's expectations can never be, and will never be, higher than mine - they will be the same. We've got to get Sheffield Wednesday moving and make sure that it doesn't become a rest home for players to come to because it's a nice place to play your football. The standards we have set in the past few games at Hillsborough should become the minimum that we expect.

As supporters, you've shown another huge commitment to the club by buying season tickets for next year

and to have sold almost 9,000 at this stage is testament to the fantastic support this football club has. You all have a huge impact here and we are very fortunate that at this level we have that kind of backing.

That commitment and drive from the fans has got to be matched by every single person who works for this football club.

I've been fortunate enough to keep a few teams up and sort out football clubs who have been in really serious trouble. I've been fortunate enough to get promoted to the Premier

League twice but in doing so on each occasion, the methods have been the same - getting good players working hard.

The only way you will turn a football club around is by the improvement of players. The absolute crucial thing is signing the right players because that will dictate your success and which way your results will go.

Enjoy the match.




Miller converted the spot-kick to give Wednesday a deserved lead.



There's a saying that too much of a good thing is bad for you.


We probably all know that feeling of having overindulged in something or overdone something that has had consequences for us and others only to wish soon after that we hadn't

Membership will be available on the night, individual from £10, family £20 (parents and children).









Welcome Swindon Town

Wednesday welcome the men from Wiltshire to Hillsborough today.



Seeing Paul Hart in the opposition dugout today will be a sight that is only too familiar to Owls fans, for it was the former Forest and Portsmouth boss who was in charge of the Crystal Palace team that broke Wednesday hearts on the final day of last season.

Ex-Owl Hart took over at the County Ground from another familiar face, Danny Wilson, who guided Swindon to a surprising play-off place last season. This campaign, however, has been anything but successful, with today's visitors rooted in the bottom four.

Victory this afternoon looks a must for the Wiltshire outfit and Hart will be hoping for an improvement in fortunes from his squad.

In goal, former Wednesday custodian David Lucas has been battling all season for a starting berth with Phil Smith, and both have plenty of games under the belt. In addition, Mark Scott and young Pole Jakub Jesionkowski can be called upon if needed.

There is also competition for the left back position, with Michael Rose and Irishman Alan Sheehan both in contention. Haitian Lescinel Jean-Francois has also been picked in that role instead of his more natural slot in the centre.

Andrew Frampton has been brought in on loan from Millwall to shore up a leaky defence, which has suffered its fair share of injuries. Scotsman Scott Cuthbert has been Frampton's regular partner in the middle, whilst Ghanaian Kevin Amankwaah and Scottish utility man Paul Caddis have been vying to be first choice right back for much of the season. Nathan Thompson and Czech Milan Misun provide back-up.


The midfield area shows a lot of tenacity and experience, with Irish international and captain Jonathan Douglas likely to play alongside David Prutton, who has top-flight experience with Southampton. Scotsman Simon Ferry provides some of the craft.

There is a Scottish theme throughout

the Robins, with a fair few signed by former Wednesday boss Paul Sturrock, including another ex-Owl in Jon-Paul McGovern. Irishman Michael Timlin is likely to feature today as is youngster Matt Ritchie, an exciting wideman signed from Portsmouth.

Will Evans and Billy Bodin (son of former Swindon player Paul) are young back-ups, while Alan O'Brien is yet another Ireland international in the Town ranks. Rangy Alassane N'Diaye has signed on loan from the manager's former club Crystal Palace.

Hart has also raided his erstwhile employers for striker Calvin Andrew as Swindon have struggled since losing the prolific Charlie Austin to Burnley in the January transfer window. Elliot Benyon has struggled to score goals since joining from Torquay, so Hart will need to get the best out of two seasoned African internationals, Vincent Pericard (Cameroon), and the Togolese Thomas Dossevi. Jordan Pavett remains untested at this level.



Season This





Swindon's success in the Anglo-Italian Cup has often been overshadowed by their League Cup triumph over Arsenal in March 1969.

Twice winners of the tournament. one of the more bizarre European Cup competitions introduced, Town lifted the inaugural trophy at the start of the 1969-70 campaign.

The competition, played under two different formats, was initiated to reward Second Division Swindon after the club were barred from playing in the old Inter-City Fairs Cup.

Unlike previous winners of the English League Cup, the Robins were ineligible for a place in the tournament with only teams from the top tier of English football allowed to enter.

Instead, Swindon joined AS Roma, then reigning Coppa Italian Champions, in qualifying for the final of the Anglo-Italian Cup.

Before the fixture, played over two legs, the newly-promoted Robins were in league action, claiming two wins from five before travelling to the Stadio Olimpico to face AS Roma on 27 August.

Fred Ford's side lost 2-1 with Peter Noble scoring for Town, but in the second leg at the County Ground on 10 September, Arthur Horsfield put Swindon level on aggregate, scoring again in the second half.

Town's League Cup hero Don Rogers grabbed a third on 72 minutes and with Roma pushing forward to rescue the match. Horsfield completed his hat-trick to win the trophy 5-2 on aggregate.

Success in the league followed. Swindon moving into sixth place by 4 October, a position they would occupy until mid-December.

Sadly, Swindon's FA Cup dream. which had started against Blackburn (4-0) on 3 January, was ended by Leeds seven weeks later when they

defeated the Robins (2-0) in round

The club looked poised to claim one of the two promotion places in the league, but only five wins from their last 12 games handed the title to Huddersfield as Blackpool finished second.

In May, Swindon took part in the Anglo-Italian Cup, with 12 teams, six from each country, split into three groups taking part, with Town qualifying for the final against Napoli.

But the match was marred by disturbances by the home fans, including two separate pitch invasions after a Noble brace and Horsfield strike put Swindon into a 3-0 lead midway through the second half.

With little option, Austrian referee Paul Schiller abandoned the game on 79 minutes and the trophy was later awarded to the Robins by the Italian Football Federation.

The keeper

Phil Smith

Phil returned to the Swindon side when ex-Owl David Lucas was injured earlier this month and the pair have shared the goalkeeping duties over the course of this term. The 31-year-old is coming to the end of his fifth season at the County Ground having joined the Robins from non-league Crawley Town in 2006. Smith's fine form in his first season in Wiltshire earned him the supporters' Player of the Season award and although he has battled with other keepers for the gloves during his time with Town, the Londoner has continued to be a dependable last line of defence when selected.





The defender Alan Sheehan

Alan became a full time Robins player in the early stages of this term after spending the second half of the 2009-10 season on loan at the County Ground. His displays during that first stint in Wiltshire helped Town reach the League 1 play-off final and prompted his transfer from Leeds last August. The Irishman turned out for homeland club Belvedere before joining Leicester City in 2003. Sheehan appeared in the Foxes first team and on loan at Mansfield before a temporary spell at Leeds led to a full transfer. He was loaned to Crewe and Oldham during his two years at Elland Road.

The stopper

Lecsinel Jean-François

The Haiti international defender has become a popular figure with Robins fans, thanks to his impressive displays since joining the club in 2009. The 24-year-old has made over 60 appearances since arriving at the County Ground after a successful trial period following his departure from French club Guingamp. A tall, rangy stopper, he gained a grounding in the reserve teams at Paris St Germain and Sedan before first crossing the channel to spend time on loan at Scottish side Falkirk in 2006.





The ex-Owl Jon-Paul McGovern

Wednesdavites will have fond memories of the tricky winger's two-year spell at Hillsborough, in which he was an ever-present as the Owls were promoted via the League One play-off final in 2005, and the Scotsman's opener against Hartlepool at the Millennium Stadium capped off a fine first season in S6. The 30-year-old moved on to MK Dons in 2006 before linking up with Swindon a year later and he has now appeared over 170 times for the Robins. Glasgow-born, McGovern started out with boyhood club Celtic and was loaned to Sheffield United in 2002-03 before spending the following season with Livingston prior to arriving in Sheffield.






The striker Calvin Andrew


Calvin is on loan at the County Ground until the end of this season and his first goal for the Robins was a crucial winner in their recent success at Brentford. The Crystal Palace frontman has applied himself impressively in a lone striker role since arriving in Wiltshire as Paul Hart's first signing for Swindon last month. Luton-born, the 24-yearold started out with his hometown club and appeared 67 times for the Hatters, also having loan spells at Grimsby and Bristol City, before joining Palace in 2008. Andrew spent time on loan at Millwall earlier this

The midfield man Jonathan Douglas

Robins club captain Jonathan is closing in on his 100th Robins game, having been a lynchpin of the Swindon side since his move from Leeds in 2009. The Republic of Ireland international was close to being an ever-present as Town came so close to promotion to the Championship last season, reaching the League One play-off final. He started his playing days with homeland club Monaghan United before signing for Blackburn in 2000. The 29-year-old was loaned to Chesterfield, Blackpool and Gillingham before joining Leeds in 2006, after spending the 2005-06 season on loan at Elland Road, and tallied 166 outings for the West Yorkshire outfit.







After recent seasons when Swindon have featured in the play-offs, what's gone wrong this year?

The main difference this season is that the team doesn't have a proven goalscorer. A couple of seasons ago we had Simon Cox, then Billy Paynter and more recently Charlie Austin. Losing Paynter in the summer was a blow but that was lessened with the form of Austin before he moved on a couple of months ago.

The core of the side remains to be that which got us to the play-offs last season but the players don't seem to have really produced to their potential. It was that potential which made David Prutton turn Brighton down to sign for Swindon last summer but he would probably tell you he hasn't been at his best too.

It's so disappointing to see Swindon slip so low in League 1, but when sides are in the relegation fight the luck never goes for them, such as conceding goals in the manner of the heavily deflected equaliser late against Dagenham recently.

You mention losing Charlie Austin as being a blow, but Calvin Andrew recently broke his scoring duck. How much of a presence is he in the side?

It's tough for Calvin Andrew to emulate what Austin did. Calvin has never really been prolific previously

in his career although he did do well at Brighton on loan. But his performances have brought a lot to the team and he seems to be a confidence player which showed after he scored his goal against Brentford, where in previous games he has passed the ball rather than shooting but he started to think more about having a go at goal.

He tires defences out and works hard but he's a different player to Austin who put fear into opposition defences and it was almost expected of him to score every other game. But it's not just about the strikers at this stage of the season, all the players have to chip in.

Some fans have criticised Paul Hart even though he hasn't had long in charge, why do you think that is?

Maybe because he came in with a cautious approach and said at the time of his arrival that the last six or so games which were critical rather than the ones at the start of his tenure. When we only got two points from three games against Dagenham, Plymouth and Walsall, the fans were concerned. But in all bar one of his games so far, the side have deserved more points than they have gained.

I would say the fans aren't so much against Paul Hart but more aggrieved about the situation he came into. Some fans would

say the previous manager was kept for too long and it brought Hart into an impossible situation and his appointment was made too late to make a difference.

But he has made no secret of his desire to stay as manager and be given the chance to build a team and it may do Swindon some good to get some stability. It will be a tough decision for the chairman Andrew Fitton to make in the summer but it's one that he has to get right.



The Sheffield Wednesday Complete Record

From concept to bookshelves – An Author's Tale, by Jason Dickinson


The possibility of publishing a new complete record of Sheffield Wednesday was first mooted back in 2009 with both myself and John Brodie being subsequently approached by Derby Books as prospective authors.

We had previously combined to produce 'The Wednesday Boys – A Definitive Who's Who of Sheffield Wednesday' back in 2005, while I had written '100 Years at Hillsborough' (1999) plus 'Sheffield Wednesday – On This Day' (2009).

Unfortunately, not only was I still finishing my 'Sheffield Wednesday Miscellany' book but also planning for my own wedding in June 2010. The whole project was therefore put back a year and John started the massive task of compiling the seasonal statistics while I finished my own book and went through with the nuptials!

The publishers effectively gave us a free rein with regard to content, although seasonal records, top 125 players, memory matches, grounds, manager profiles and club history are all standard in every Complete Record book produced since the mid-1980s. The first set was quite groundbreaking at the time with almost no football books having previously been published which contained such extensive information.

Dozens were subsequently produced, covering the majority of the clubs in the Football League and at the start of the 21st century the publication of revised, updated and more



comprehensive histories began.

The issue of which 125 players to include was our first task with over 200 players initially making the 'hit list'. This was whittled down, although it proved difficult not to include all the players from the early 1930s, 1960s, 1980s and 1990s! The eventual 125 therefore became a list of some of the greatest if not necessarily the 125 greatest men to

have pulled on the famous blue and white shirt.

When the list was finalised, I started work on the individual profiles and around four months later, in the summer of 2010, the 48,000-word document was finished and sent to fellow Owls historian Lee Hicklin for checking/proof reading.

We had already decided to include

a colossal appendix section in the rear of the book and it was my task to attack this mammoth project. I believe the final result is perhaps unique and I doubt whether the records listed below have ever been published together in the same book:

- 1 Every first team friendly, result, scorers and attendance from 1867
- 2 Every reserve team friendly, result, scorers and attendance from 1867
- 3 Seasonal records for first team, reserves, 'A' team, 'B' team and Youth team from 1889
- 4 Season ticket prices since World War II
- 5 Aggregate/average crowds since 1889
- 6 Player of the Year since the award began
- 7 All Youth Cup results and scorers from 1952
- 8 Financial records from 1899 with turnover, players' wages and profit/loss
- 9 Full details of all foreign youth tours from the first trip in 1957.

The heart of the book is the seasonal records, with this section greatly expanded from the original Complete Record books. In addition to the standard results, scorers and crowd figures, this section now includes a league table, 'Did You Know' feature, half-time score, all unused substitutes and, where possible, a copy of the match programme from that specific season. This has significantly consumed more time than any other part of the book with well over a year spent to get the information to a proof stage with constant checking having, hopefully, eradicated any errors. Over 120 seasons are detailed in the book. from glory to despair and all those campaigns in-between.

Another section to tackle was the history of the club's various grounds, from formation back in 1867, Little has been published previously on pre-Hillsborough playing venues so this provided a unique task. With help from noted Sheffield United historian Denis Clarebrough, I was able to pinpoint the rough location of the club's previous grounds and on a sunny day last year I was chauffeured around Sheffield by my wife Michelle, with camera in hand, visiting Hunters Bar, Heeley, Olive Grove and Highfields! Previous research had shed light on the subject and contemporary evidence was used to build what I believe to be an accurate picture of the pre-Owlerton days.

The 25 'Memory Matches' were again subjective and for obvious reasons became more and more difficult to pick as more and more games were played - for instance the 1987 Complete Record could not possibly contain the 1991 League Cup win, the 1993 semi final win over the Blades or the 2005 play off final.

The final submissions, before the initial 31 December 2010 deadline. proved to be the manager's profiles and history of the Owls. For the last three months of the year, I worked late into the night and many early mornings, with the club's managers submitted in mid-December and my 27,000-word club history finished just before the festivities - it was time for a drink and lie down!

That is not the end of the story, though, as February 2011 saw the 670-page proofs delivered to our respective front doors and the painstaking proof reading process began! The task was simply huge and time off work was one solution. for me, to ensure the task was completed before the 11 April deadline. Our correction sheets were e-mailed, along with Howard Wilkinson's foreword, just before I set off for Brighton on 9 April!

We now have a small window as we await the finish of the current campaign for the corrected and revised proofs to arrive. Work is nowhere near finished, however, with this season's statistics page to




include a profile of new boss Gary Megson. I also have all 2011 records to add (such as academy records and Player of the Year) plus the events to chronicle since Christmas.

The information is also constantly changing with caps for Reda Johnson and Liam Palmer having to be added to the comprehensive 'internationals' section, while the departures of Danny Wilson (at Swindon) and Kevin Pressman (at Scunthorpe) required another update e-mail.

The very last item to be sent will be the full player records for inclusion in the rear of book, which lists the 943 players, in alphabetical order, along with appearances/goals record plus details of their debut and last games. There is no doubt that the word 'Complete' has been taken literally in our approach to the book and hopefully the final product will be a welcome addition to the bookshelf of any Wednesday fan who has even the slightest interest in the history of our famous old club.

'The Sheffield Wednesday Complete Record' will be published by DB Publishing in July 2011, price £25.

The young goalkeeper has relished his run of first team fixtures for the Owls and feels he is growing in confidence with every game.

The 22-year-old has earned plenty of plaudits since making his debut against Southampton last month and has been delighted with his recent displays – particularly at Hillsborough, where the Owls have won their last three games.

O'Donnell told 'Wednesday': "As time has gone by, I have grown more and more confident playing games. Obviously there are areas I have to work on but that's normal for a goalkeeper of my age."

Having made a bright bow at St Mary's, O'Donnell followed that game with another encouraging performance at Dagenham & Redbridge. But a taste of first team football at Hillsborough was something the young custodian was particularly looking forward to.

He has now featured four times in S6, with three of those games ending in victory for Wednesday and two without conceding.

"It's everything I expected really," he explained. "The crowd and the atmosphere are fantastic. Apart from my first game when we played Brentford, I've been really pleased with how things have gone.


"When we played Colchester, I was disappointed we conceded so late to take the clean sheet away.


"I made a few good saves in that game so it was obviously disappointing that they scored such a late goal but in that instance I think the win was more important. Since then we have gone on to keep clean sheets so I am happy with that.

"It was unbelievable to finally get the first clean sheet against Tranmere, I was chuffed to bits. It was what I wanted in the first game but it wasn't to be. I was delighted that it finally came and hopefully it was the first of many more to come.

"Clean sheets are what you want as a goalkeeper."

O'Donnell admits his early season frustration at his lack of involvement with the Owls but highlights his loan





spell at Grimsby as a key part of his development.

After ten appearances for the Mariners, the Sheffielder believes he is better for the experience and recognises the importance of playing competitive football.

"It was difficult not being involved in the squad with Wednesday but I went out on loan and was happy with my spell at Grimsby," he said. "I got myself some first team football there,

which stood me in good stead to come back here and make my debut at Hillsborough, which is what I have always been aiming for.

"If somebody would have offered me this opportunity at the beginning of the season I would definitely have taken it.

"It's important that I'm playing games at this stage of my career and I think I've done myself no harm when I've been called upon this season."

He added: "It's massive that our home form has turned around because that was the main concern.

We've won our last three games at home and now we need to finish as high as we can.

"I have got to keep working hard in training and perform when I'm in the team and if I do play in the remaining games, I would like to keep more clean sheets and be part of a winning team."

We're having a good run at Hillsborough and that's good for the fans and good for the team.

Owls ace Johnson is remaining fully focused on finishing the season as strongly as possible as the curtain beings to close on the 2010-11 campaign.

Today's clash against Swindon is Wednesday's penultimate game on home soil, with an S6 meeting against Exeter on the final day of the term to come.

But Johnson views these two fixtures - together with next Saturday's visit to relegation-threatened Bristol Rovers - as a big chance to finish the season as strongly as possible and is particularly keen to keep hold of the winning formula the Owls have discovered at Hillsborough.

Wednesday head into this

afternoon's match on the back of three successive home wins over Colchester, Tranmere and more recently Hartlepool.

That impressive form in S6 has seen the Owls put clear daylight between themselves and the drop zone and JJ is out to extend that run this afternoon, which would mark four league wins on the bounce at Hillsborough for the first time this season.

Speaking ahead of the trip to Walsall on Saturday, Johnson said: "It's really important that we keep focused and pick up as many points as we can.

"We've got three games left to play and we want to win them all because the fans deserve it for the support


they have given us. We're having a good run at Hillsborough and that's good for the fans and good for the


"If you're going to do well in any league you need to be constantly picking up points at home and that's something we seem to have put right recently."

The 30-year-old has been a bright spark in spells for the Owls this season and, when at his best, has been truly unstoppable for opposing defenders with his blistering pace and tricky footwork.

Boss Gary Megson concurs that the Jamaican is capable of producing big things in this division and also in the leagues above.







Speaking after Wednesday's last outing at Hillsborough - the 2-0 success over Hartlepool - Megson told the assembled media that there are few players better than Johnson outside of the top flight when the winger is on his game. But both Megson and the player himself believe there is room for improvement.

With bags of ability to run with the ball and breeze past players, a key asset JJ is desperate to add to his game is goals.

Although impressive when they come, the pace ace has been on target just four times this season with strikes against Yeovil, Bristol Rovers, Hereford and Peterborough.

Johnson said: "I work a lot in training on my running and on my shooting and I want to turn that into goals on the pitch because it's always good for me and good for the team when I score.

"I missed the start of the season when I was injured and it is not easy to come straight back into the team but I'm always working hard in training to improve my fitness and fight for my place. We have a lot of good players here and we know we have to fight for a place in the team and that's what I have been doing."

With only three games remaining until the season reaches its conclusion, JJ admits it has been one of the most frustrating campaigns of his career to date and a major disappointment on many levels.

He reasoned: "We feel as though we've let the fans down too often this season and only the players can put that right. The fans come and support us home and away and we recognise how important they are and we need to improve.

"I think we have done that lately and have been near the levels we should have been all season. It's really important that we start well next season and put as many points on the board as we can.

"Our form has massively improved and we know that's a big thing if you want to be successful in this division. When you look at Brighton, who are champions, and other teams up there going for promotion, they are strong at home and I know we can be like that with the players we have and the fans behind us."

Although Wednesday look set to finish their League 1 campaign in the relative comfort of mid-table, there is still plenty to be decided in the division - particularly at the bottom, where the battle to avoid the drop is in full swing.

Visitors today Swindon know nothing less than three points will form a huge dent in their bid to escape relegation to the bottom tier.

On Saturday, the Owls are back on the road for the final time this season, taking on Bristol Rovers, who are

also out to make a late escape from danger at the wrong end of League 1 and Johnson believes it's highly important his side stays focused.

He went on: "It's up to us to take as many points from these games as we can. We know Swindon can be a good team, they beat us earlier this season and when teams are fighting for their lives, they can be really dangerous.

"If we don't stay focused on our jobs and are not at our best, then Swindon can win this game. We know what is on the line for them today but we have to be strong and keep doing our jobs and keep working hard.

"It's not been a great season for us but we will come back next season better for the experience we've had and hopefully much stronger."



BOYZ MEN

JASON DICKINSON CHARTS YOUNG OWLS WHO GRADUATED FROM THE ACADEMY TO THE FIRST TEAM

GORDON OWEN

Born in Barnsley on 14 June 1959. Owen was a football nut as a youngster and as a teenager was known to play for three different sides over a weekend.

His experience in the 'rough and tough' world of Sunday league certainly did the youngster no harm and he was subsequently signed as a professional in November 1976 - the Owls paying the princely sum of £50 to his Saturday side, Ward Green.

The lively former Barnsley Boys winger slotted straight into Wednesday's youth side and was quickly elevated to the reserve team although he appeared for the second team on a trial basis, just a few days before he officially joined the Owls. Owen finished the 1977-78 season as Central League top scorer with six goals and made the first of 60 senior appearances for the club in a Christmas holiday game at home to Rotherham in December 1977.

His best season at Wednesday came under Jack Charlton in the 1978-79 campaign when Owen featured on 28 occasions, scoring three times, before dropping back into the shadows at Hillsborough. He remained a peripheral player and spent three months on loan at Rotherham in 1980 before further temporary moves to Doncaster and Chesterfield preceded a full transfer to Cardiff in August 1983.

He was reunited with old Owls boss Len Ashurst in the Welsh capital and four years later - while on Bristol City's books - he appeared at Wembley in the final of the Associate Members Cup (today's JPT). His league career, which spanned 331 games, ended at Exeter City in 1991 and he then appeared for Frickley Athletic and Farsley Celtic before eventually dropping into the Wragg Over-35 League, winning the League Cup with Tom Treddlehoyle in 2000.



LUKE BODEN

Left-footed attacking midfielder Boden joined the Owls' academy in the summer of 2004, making his debut in the November Youth Cup win at Doncaster.

Mosborough lad Luke (born 26 November 1988) became established in the youth side during the 2006-07 season in a central midfield role and made his senior debut as a late substitute in a Championship game at Plymouth in August 2006. He was rewarded in July 2007 with his first professional deal and named as a

ROCKY **LEKAJ**


Although born in Peja in modernday Serbia, Rexhap Lekaj was brought up in Norway and was a citizen of the Scandinavian country when he was spotted by Wednesday scouts in the Nike Cup, playing for FC Grei.

He subsequently joined the Owls as a scholar in the summer of 2006 and a year later the talented winger was handed a three-year professional deal. Before being upgraded to the professional ranks, he won a Norwegian Under-19 cap and burst onto the first team scene during the 2006-07 season, being named in the matchday squad on seven occasions and twice appearing from the bench.

Rocky remained a bright prospect in the early years of his playing career with the Owls but started to fall out of contention after the end of the 2008-09 season, despite finishing reserve team top scorer with ten goals to his name.

A loan spell to Norwegian side Sandefjord in 2009 was ruined by injury and Lekaj - nicknamed Rocky by his peers - failed to make a senior appearance before his contract was cancelled by mutual consent in March

He briefly appeared for Norwegian side FK Lyn before they hit financial problems and were forced to declare bankruptcy and resign from the Norwegian Second Division in June 2010. He later signed for Fourth Division outfit Romsas.

first team substitute, making three appearances, during the season that followed as he tried to become an established member of the first team squad.

Boden's career looked to be drifting away from Hillsborough in the early stages of the 2008-09 season, when he spent time on loan at both Chesterfield and Rushden & Diamonds. He was subsequently recalled and enjoyed what proved to be the highlight of his Owls career, a run of 12 senior games, three from a starting berth, as Brian Laws' side finished in a comfortable mid-table position in the Championship.

A loan spell at Northampton followed in August 2009 and despite being named on the bench on several occasions, his last appearance proved to be on the final day of the 2008-09 season and his contract was cancelled by mutual consent in January 2011.

Almost a month after leaving Wednesday, Luke signed a contract with Florida-based side Orlando City and is set to feature for the newly-formed club in the inaugural 2011 season of the new USL Pro League - a league created to act as the national second tier of the US game.

JOHN **LINIGHAN** THE NEARLY MAN

Signed as a YTS trainee in July 1990, North East-born Linighan joined on the same day as his twin brother Brian.

His sibling would progress to make three senior appearances for the Owls but centre half John had to be content with youth and reserve team football during four years at Wednesday.

His form in youth football saw John handed a professional deal in the summer of 1992 and he scored four times in 51 appearances for the second team before being released in June 1994.

CAN YOU HELP?

Sheffield Wednesday academy manager Sean McAuley is urging potential landlords and landladies to contact the club with regard to housing SWFC scholars.

With the academy seeking to recruit talent outside of the Sheffield area and even overseas, the need to provide accommodation for the young Owls is higher than ever.

McAuley explained: "Further on from the recent advertisements on finding homes for our scholars outside of the Sheffield area, it is really important

that we get interest from people wanting to help us develop our players.

"There's no need to think too much about wondering whether you're the right person, we've had good people who have not done this kind of thing before who have taken in lodgers and have been very good.

"We have also got a database of people we have used in the past and hopefully they may consider reapplying. But we're also looking for new people because it can be a really interesting situation to take on board aspiring new footballers and try and help them through the programme to become a professional."

The academy boss believes the experience of providing a home for a scholar at the club can be very rewarding and that the relationships can stretch beyond the two years the young talents will be in the programme.

He added: "We still keep in touch with one of the landladies who would maybe consider taking somebody on a part time basis. She still keeps in contact with the likes of Derek Geary. Alan Quinn and Owen Morrison.

"I think she has been invited to one of their weddings so it's not just a twoyear thing, it can turn into something that lasts and be more of a family situation than just a roll in, roll out scenario. While it's only for two years, the majority of the relationships that develop last a little bit longer." And time is of the essence for the academy to build a database of potential homes with the players set to report to the club in July.

McAuley explained: "We're desperate to get this up and running because our players report back in July. It's not as if we're looking for a select one or two, we want a database of people because throughout next season we will be recruiting players to come up on a Friday night and play a game on a Saturday. We're spreading the recruitment net far and wide now.

"We'll also have foreign trialists coming in, so we need to house them in and around this area in order for them to feel comfortable and produce their best football."

OWLS SUFFER DOUBLE DEFEAT

With the academy season drawing to a close, the Under-18s slipped to heavy defeats at the hands of Liverpool and Barnsley.

A 3-0 reverse at the hands of Liverpool was followed by a 5-1 loss last weekend against Barnsley and boss Sean McAuley deemed the latter performance as unacceptable.

He said: "They are big defeats on the face of it. In terms of what we were looking for, we took a lot of positives from those games because decisions are being made for scholars to become professionals.

"Those are the types of games that you want your players to step up and say, 'I deserve a pro contract.'

"Sometimes it's easy for us to make the decisions if the performances aren't there and the performances weren't there in those games.

"Liverpool was OK but against Barnsley, the performance was not acceptable. A positive we can take out of it is that it confirms that we may have made the right choices about who should be gaining professional contracts at the club.

"We have one Under-18 game left to play against Middlesbrough and we will be playing our Under-16s in that game. Our Under-18s have played a lot of football, the apprentices have played in all of the reserve games, so I think we can make a fair assessment on them by now."

The Programmes

Were they admission tickets or were they programmes?

Whatever your opinion, two small 10cm x 10.5cm items which covered the admission and detailed the squads were issued for Wednesday's pre-season Dutch tour in July 2008. The Owls played two games on the ground of HSV in Heiloo against Haarlem and Stormvogels Telstar in just 48 hours and came home unbeaten.

On arrival at the ground, supporters paid their five Euros admission fee and were handed the 'programme'. To the dismay of all serious collectors who had made the trip, the gateman then tore off the serrated top right hand corner as a sign of proof of payment.

On opening the gatefold-style programme fully, the left-hand page detailed the team squads. Wednesday's group of 26 players included new signings, James O'Connor and Chelsea loanee Jimmy Smith, and also included was Etienne Esajas, who would feel at home in his native Holland.



It is interesting to note now that almost three years later, only seven of that squad remain at Hillsborough.

The centre and right-hand pages are a welcome message from the management of the hosts – the HSV Club of Heiloo, and thankfully it is written in English. Also covered is a very brief insight into Wednesday's two opponents on 15 and 17 of July 2008. Both are top-flight Dutch sides.

HFC Haarlem is the club where Dutch legend Ruud Gullitt began his career and Stormvogels Telstar are Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink's first employers.

The reverse side of these three pages are the cover, a large advert and the names of the match sponsors.

A nice clean copy of each programme with the cover intact, i.e. no torn corner, would be worth £3 today



The Matches

Goals from Deon Burton and Marcus Tudgay gave the Owls a 2-0 win against Haarlem in the preseason opener that satisfied Brian Laws as a decent workout and left the manager praising the support his team received from a large band of followers.

In the first half, goalkeeper Lee Grant had to dive at the feet of Laurens ten Heuvel whilst at the other end Leon Clarke was upended in the area but no penalty was awarded.

Two minutes into the second half the Owls took the lead when Burton, left unmarked, strode forward to open his account.

On 68 minutes, Wednesday increased their lead. Wade Small got to the by-line and crossed a perfect ball for debutant O'Connor. His low shot was parried by the goalkeeper to Tudgay, who turned cleverly around his marker and slotted the ball home.

Two days later the side followed up this win with a more impressive 3-0 victory against Stormvogels Telstar - all the goals coming in an eightminute rush in the second half.

Tudgay had an early chance following Grant's huge clearance and a minute later. Clarke's shot rattled a post. Then midway through the half Clarke forced keeper van Heulen into a fine save when he latched on to Luke Boden's pass.

On 35 minutes, boss Laws made his first substitution, bringing on

Jermaine Johnson to replace O'Connor. This meant a slight change in the playing structure with Johnson going out wide on the right wing and Sean McAllister, who had been doing a sterling job in that role, moving to the centre of midfield.

Laws made two more changes at the break, bringing Burton on for Clarke, while Spurr took over from Mark Beevers in the heart of the defence. The inspired changes almost produced the goods immediately when Burton drove in a shot that rattled the woodwork. Then Johnson had a shot that narrowly missed the

On the hour, the goals which Wednesday had threatened started to come. First, Tudgay got up to meet Spurr's cross to head the Owls ahead and six minutes later, following a corner. Burton headed home.

Johnson made it three on 68 minutes, taking a pass from Burton and dribbling past three opponents before driving into the back of the net.



The season that was 2008-09

- · When Wednesday won their first away match of the campaign (27 September 2008), it was at Charlton 2-1. The hosts' goalscorer Luke Varney was to subsequently have a loan spell some six months later at Hillsborough (he also returned for a second spell early the following campaign). The Charlton match also signalled the final appearance in an Owls shirt for Wade Small, who ran from the halfway line to fire in a superb goal - past Nicky Weaver!
- 7 January 2009 marked the appointment of Lee Strafford as SWFC chairman to replace Dave Allen, who had left Wednesday some 14 months earlier. Also appointed on the same day was Nick Parker to the position of chief executive.
- What turned out to be a real red letter day was 7 February 2009. After a mere 95-year wait, the Owls finally completed a memorable 'double' over local rivals United with a 2-0 win at Bramall Lane to go with the 1-0 win at Hillsborough back in October.
- When Wednesday travelled to Jon Otsemobor's Norwich and won 1-0 on 4 April 2009, it was the Owls' EIGHTH successive league win over the Canaries in four seasons. having already won 3-2 earlier in the campaign at home. In the previous season, the Owls won 1-0 at Norwich and then 4-1 in May 2008 in front of Wednesday's biggest crowd of the season - 36,208. In the previous season, Wednesday won 2-1 away and 3-2 at home and in 2005-06 there was another double to record. Both victories were by 1-0 - the away game in October marking Aston Villa's Gabby Agbonlahor's debut in an Owls shirt and the match at Hillsborough the following April seeing Paul Gallacher in the Norwich goal just a year after leaving Wednesday, where he played for Paul Sturrock in an eightgame loan spell.






Home form will be key for us next season and having that engrained habit of doing well on our own patch will be essential, so here's hoping for another win here today.

Coming into training every morning and getting the afternoon's free to do whatever I want.


What's the worst injury you've suffered?


What is the best way to spend a Saturday night?

I went to see Scream 4 the other day it was rubbish and would tell anyone going to see it not to go!



Sheffield Wednesday Football Club has policies and procedures in place to ensure your safety and comfort whilst you aftend matches at Hillstonough. However, an incident may occur which is beyond our control and it is important that you are aware of how we intend to look after you in the event of an emergency. As part of our safety management we employ professionally trained stewards who are located at various points throughout the stations, if partial or full evacuation of the stands is necessary announcements will be broadcast over the stadium's public address system and stewards will direct you to a place of safety. If such an event occurs take all of your belongings with you and proceed quickly and quietly under the direction of the stewards. Our evacuation procedures have been planned to guide you to a place of safety. If for any reason we are unable to allow you to re-occupy the stands you will be advised immediately and, if it is safe to do so, you will be allowed to return to your car or coach. Please note that in the event of an emergency no vehicles will be allowed to leave the car parks unless directed to do so by the Police. This advice is provided as information only and we hope that we will not need to implement our emergency procedures during this match.
