





IN TOWN

After a late season wobble, **OLDHAM ATHLETIC** managed to secure their League 1 status some weeks ago and as such go into today's clash with relegated Town with little other than pride to play for.

PAUL Dickov's side made a blistering start to the campaign, suffering just two defeats in their opening 12 games and establishing themselves as surprise play off contenders in the process.

This opening run included impressive wins over Notts County (3-0) and Brentford (3-1), before a shock 3-2 defeat to Accrington Stanley in the FA Cup first round brought the Latics back down to earth with a burnp.

Dickov's side proceeded to remain unbeaten in the run up to what was a fairly barren Christmas period, picking up consecutive 1-0 wins over Huddersfield Town and Dagenham & Redbridge in the process.

However, it has been since the turn of the year that the Latics' season has suffered, with today's visitors having registered just five wins from 26 games in 2011.

In spite of wins over Plymouth Argyle (2-0) and Brentford (2-1) in January. Oldham have suffered greatly from defensive frailties this year, with heavy home reverses to Southampton (6-0) and Peterborough United (5-0) illustrating their greatest weakness.

Dickov led his side through a 12-game winless run during February and March, including a sequence of six consecutive defeats during which the Latics managed just two goals – both scored in the 3-2 home defeat by Sheffield Wednesday.

The last meeting between the sides came back in January, with Oldham winning the rearranged fixture 2-0 thanks to goals from Chris Taylor and Dale Stephens.







The experienced goalkeeper signed from Luton Town in the summer of 2009. Brill made 89 appearances in total for the Hatters before his switch to Boundary Park. He was a teammate of former Town defender Sol Davis at Kenilworth Road and he helped Luton win the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2009.



A vastly experienced stopper, Gerrard has over 300 league appearances to his name and joined the Latics in the summer of 2010 on a free transfer. Gerrard represented Oldham during his first spell at Boundary Park as well as Everton, Nottingham Forest, Oxford United and Sheffield United.



The French striker is currently on loan from Premier League side Sunderland. He originally joined the Black Cats on trial at the beginning of the 2009/10 season before signing a permanent deal to stay at the Stadium of Light. A tall, physical striker with a turn of pace. Tounkara joined Sunderland from CS Sedan of France's Lique 2. He struggled with repeated injuries for much of his first season in England but did make 12 appearances for the reserves, scoring once. The frontman signed for Oldham Athletic on a season-long loan in August 2010, joining team-mate Jean-Yves M'Voto at Boundary Park Tounkara has scored seven goals so far this season and impressed in the reverse meeting with Swindon back in January




A product of the Oldham Athletic youth system, Millar is a winger with pace and a direct style. His energetic performances from the bench have already won many plaudits and the 18year old is tipped to have a bright future in the game. He won his first international cap for Northern Ireland at U21 level in February.




REUBEN REID

The striker joined Oldham on a free transfer from Premier League side West Bromwich Albion shortly before the close of the January transfer window. Reid had played for Brentford and Rotherham United prior to joining the Baggies and he has eight goals to his name so far this



ALESSANDRA

Yet another home-grown product, Alessandra has progressed through the ranks into a frontline striker. Alessandra scored his first hat-trick against Scunthorpe United in October 2008 and the 22-year old has now made over 60 league appearances for the Latics. He has one goal to his name this season.



The Belfast-born striker arrived at Oldham on a free transfer last summer and has international experience with four goals to his name from 31 Northern Ireland appearances His career began at Leeds United before having successful spells with AFC Bournemouth. Stockport County Cardiff City Swansea City, Dundee United and Sheffield Wednesday



A former Swindon Town loanee, Todd returned to England in January 2011 following a spell with Australian side Perth Glory. Todd played 13 games for Swindon on loan from Bolton Wanderers in the 1994/95 season. He has also represented Blackburn Rovers, Derby County and Charlton Athletic.



Trotman began his career with Oldham before a £500,000 switch to Preston North End in January 2008. He returned to Boundary Park on loan in November 2010 and is a strong defender who has also gained League 1 experience through loan spells at Colchester United, Huddersfield Town and Southampton.



Lowe joined the Latics on loan from Blackburn Rovers at the end of March and is a clever midfield player. The Ewood Park coaching staff have high hopes for Lowe, who is now gaining valuable experience in League 1. He scored his first senior goal in the recent win at Notts County.



Furman arrived from Glasgow Rangers in the summer of 2009. He turned down a new deal with the Scottish giants to sign for the Latics and has represented South Africa at junior, youth and U21 levels. With quick feet, his goal against Notts County was voted Goal of the Year at the 2011 Football League Awards.

INTERESTING FACT!

Swindon Town's first ever home game in the Premier League was against Oldham Athletic. The Robins held out for a draw until a late Paul Bernard goal denied John Gorman's men a share of the spoils.






The 24-year old winger has now surpassed 200 league appearances in an Oldham shirt after coming up through the youth ranks at Boundary Park. He has made over 40 appearances for the club this season and is one of the first names on Paul Dickov's teamsheet. Taylor will look to end the season in good form.



White rejoined Oldham for s second loan spell in January 2011. He had spent a successful five-game spell at Boundary Park earlier this season and scored on his debut for the Latics at Dagenham & Redbridge. He has become a regular in the side although the 19-year old is still gaining valuable Football League experience.



Lee signed from near neighbours Manchester United during the summer of 2008 on a two-year deal which has now been extended after some startling performances after being turned into a full-back. Having only made three appearances for United one of which was against Chelsea in the Premier League – he was allowed to go out on loan to Queens Park Rangers in the Championship where he made eight appearances. The United youngster was offered contracts by a number of clubs but plumped for Latics following advice from former Latics player David Eyres. 22-year old Loc is now in his third year at Boundary Park and he has been a regular in the side this term with over 40 appearances to his name.



PAUL DICKOV was announced as the new manager of Oldham Athletic on Wednesday 9th June 2010.

DICKOV entered in his first managerial position with the Latics following an experienced and distinguished playing career. He joined Boundary Park on the back of promotion from League 1 with Leeds United to the Championship in the 2008/09 season.

Dickov began his career with Arsenal and was a trainee at Highbury, having been spotted playing for Scotland at the 1989 FIFA Under-16 World Championship. He emerged as a prolific scorer at reserve level and spent the mid-1990s on the outskirts of the first team.

George Graham handed Dickov his debut against Southampton in March 1993, and he went on to score against Crystal Palace and Tottenham Hotspur at the end of that campaign. When Kevin Campbell and Ian Wright returned to the fray, Dickov found himself on the bench. He headed out on loan to Luton and Brighton in the 1993/94 season before returning to the bench in Copenhagen as a Wright-less Arsenal shocked Parma in the Cup Winners' Cup Final.

It was a similar story for Dickov in 1995/96 as he got close to sustained first-team football. The striker earned a run in the side over the Christmas and New Year period after impressing against Sheffield Wednesday. However, by now Dennis Bergkamp was in situ, Wright was at his peak and John



Manchester City came calling in August 1996 and the Scot spent nearly six seasons there before joining Leicester City in

One To Watch

Young left-back **CEDRIC EVINA** first arrived at Oldham Athletic in October on loan from Premier League side Arsenal.



Last season, Evina captained Steve Bould's FA Youth Cup side and was a key part of the FA Premier Academy League winning team. He also played 11 times for the Arsenal reserves and earned a further three appearances for Neil Banfield's second string earlier this season prior to his arrival at Oldham.


Evina made his Football League debut for the Latics in the 3-1 win at Brentford in October and impressed during his initial spell at Boundary Park before the deal was extended for a further two months. In total the defender made 13 appearances for the club during his loan spell. His first senior goal was scored at Rochdale at the end of November.

With Gael Clichy and



Armand Traore (on a season-long loan at Juventus) currently ahead of him in the Arsenal pecking order, Evina opted for a move away from The Emirates Stadium and in January 2011 the two clubs agreed a deal for a permanent switch – ending a ten-year association with the Gunners.

Evina has impressed the Oldham faithful with a series of eye-catching performances. He has been a regular in the side throughout the campaign and notched his second goal of the campaign against Hartlepool in February.



February 2002. A return to Manchester City followed as well as a successful stint with Blackburn Rovers prior to arriving at Elland Road in March 2010.

Throughout his playing career, Dickov has been involved in four promotion winning campaigns and also earned ten caps for Scotland.





OLDHAM Athletic's on-loan midfielder Jason Lowe has been described as 'an unsung hero' by his new manager.

Paul Dickov has been impressed with the impact the 19-year-old midfield man has made at Boundary Park since arriving from Blackburn Rovers.

Lowe has scored twice in five appearances for the Latics, the second a spectacular equaliser which earned a draw against Walsall on Easter Monday.

Speaking to the official website, Dickov said: "I said after the Walsall game that Jason doesn't always get the credit he deserves. He is a 19-year-old young man with a fantastic attitude and the ground he covers during the game is unbelievable.

Tason was everywhere against Walsall closing players down and winning the ball back, while he also has quality on the ball."

SWINDON Town's Interim Chairman Jeremy Wray has expressed a desire to see 'smiles back on faces' as the Robins prepare to play out their final two games of the campaign.

It has been a busy week for the club, with Andrew Fitton's resignation on Wednesday followed by the departure of manager Paul Hart and assistant manager Ian McParland 24 hours later. Paul Bodin has now been placed in caretaker charge of team affairs.

Wray said: "We have two important games left, we are very lucky having a Swindon man through and through in Paul Bodin and he was happy to step up at short notice as caretaker manager until the end of the season. I am very grateful to him for that.

"I have said to Paul (Bodin) and the players that it has been a tough season for all of us, so let us enjoy the remaining games of the season and get a smile on

BILLY Bodin is hopeful of playing at least a bit-part in Town's final two games of the season.

The 19-year-old striker has been given little opportunity to impress during his first season as a professional, but played 30 minutes of Monday's defeat to Sheffield Wednesday, and is itching to be involved today.

He said: "It was nice to get on against Wednesday, even though getting relegated wasn't a big moment in my career so far.

"But it was great to play and hopefully I impressed the fans and the rest of the lads with the way I played.

"Obviously it's not been a great season for the team, or for me because I haven't played anywhere near as much as I'd liked to, but now it's a fresh start and I'm desperate to be involved in the next couple of games, whether that's from the start or off the bench."



Match referee **MICHAEL NAYLOR** will this afternoon take charge of a game involving Swindon for the first time this season. Naylor has taken charge of 23 games so far this term, having issued a total of 53 yellow cards and one red card.



How did you get introduced into refereeing?

It was through a general love of the game. I played junior level football and four of us took the refereeing course and I 'got the bug' from there.

What has been the highlight of your career so far?

My highlight is being promoted to the National List, in particular my first game as a National List Assistant at Notts County was memorable.

What is the best game you have officiated and why?

It was as a linesman when Scunthorpe played Nottingham Forest in March 2007. It was the top two in League 1 at the time and Scunthorpe's biggest ever crowd. The atmosphere at Scunthorpe's tight ground

was electric; the place was completely full at 2.30pm when we went out for our warm up. Overall it was a superb day.

What are your aims as a National List Assistant Referee?

To be promoted to the Select Group.

What skills do you think you need to become an assistant referee?

You need similar skills to a referee in terms of commitment, fitness and positioning. I think where assisting differs from refereeing is concentration. You can have periods of doing very little, but you still need to be constantly switched on.

Who has been the biggest influence in your career and why?

Dave Morrall and Ron Skidmore of the Northern Counties East League were incredibly supportive. In terms of lining, I have to mention Rob Harris, though. I'd never met Rob when he first came to assess me on the Panel Line at Birmingham City. His practical advice contained in the assessment was first class. I took all his points on board and it was no coincidence that I was promoted to the National List four months later.

In your opinion who is/ was the best assistant referee?

Phil Sharp. His technique is always used as best practice and he always seems to get decisions right. When I met Phil at the fitness test for the first time last summer, he was incredibly supportive.



































































JONATHAN DOUGLAS:







Matchday mascot Rockin' Robin today celebrates ten years with Swindon Town Football Club. **TOM HARTLEY** takes up the story...

GOING FOR THE JOB ...

HALF-WAY through the 2000/01 Season, a job advert appeared in the Swindon Town matchday magazine. I was only 16-years old, so I hadn't really applied for many jobs in the past, except for working in the Football in the Community department at the club. Nevertheless I put together a covering letter, sent it in to the club, and hoped for the best.

I would like to say there were tens of applicants, eager to jump at the chance, but after the sit down interview at the back of the Town End with the club's Commercial Manager, I discovered I was the only applicant, and, by default, the job was mine!

A POSH START...

ON 28th April 2001, Swindon were playing Peterborough United at The County Ground. Swindon needed a win to guarantee Division One status for the following season. This was an important game not just for the club, but also for me, as it is the day I first donned the character, suit and persona of Rockin' Robin.

DERBY DATES...

OVER 250 matchday appearances later (including trips to Ashton Gate, The Kassam Stadium and of course, that day at Wembley) five mascot grand nationals, numerous hospital, school and fete appearances and one London Marathon, today I have been representing the club as their mascot for ten years!

Being Rockin' Robin does sound like a daft job. However, as harebrained as it may sometimes seem, to be a symbol of Swindon Town FC, week in, week out, is one of my proudest achievements. It has created many opportunities and provided a lot of memories!

A CHRISTMAS CRACKER...

who can remember that day
when Rockin' Robin met Father
Christmas? And after our altogether
enthusiastic greeting (which included a
running jump), we slid a good five-feet
in front of the dugouts - through the mudrendering his pristine suit a rather muddy
brown!

THE TOP JOB ...

THERE was that time, when after the departure of Andy King, I thought it might be a good idea to apply for the Swindon Town manager's job as Rockin' Robin. I put together a CV and covering letter, which appeared on the desk of the Chief Executive! This also found its way in to the local newspaper and Sky Sports News, as they ran a story on Rockin' Robin picking a team of bird sounding footballers such as Robinson, Peacock and Parrot!

A highlight for me was running the London Marathon as Rockin' Robin. The idea was put to me by the mascot at Watford (Harry the Hornet) that the mascots should run a marathon together.

About 20 of us entered and expected to finish in six hours. I completed the course in a swift but incredibly painful time of four hours and four minutes. This time is, as far as I am aware, the fastest a mascot has ever completed a marathon.

HAPPY MEMORIES...

ONE memory that stands out is attending a fundraising party for a young girl in Swindon who was diagnosed with cancer. I went along to the party and danced with the children, and met Charlie, who was very unwell. This to me brought home the power of Rockin' Robin. As entertaining and fun as the character is, it can also connect with young people in a

unique way. I will never forget the feeling I had, holding Charlie on my lap and making her smile.

After ten years of service, I would not change a single moment of havoc, cheekiness, fun or frolics. Being Rockin' Robin is quite simply the most fun you can have dressed up in a furry costume! I couldn't have done it without the support of my stepfather. Terry, who has been, if you like, Rockin' Robin's personal assistant, and has helped me get in to the suit at almost every appearance. Thanks also to Mother Robin (Helen) who has ensured that Rockin's legs and shorts are looking pristine every Saturday! I would also like to offer a massive thank you to Chris Tanner, who has always been the lead negotiator in getting Rockin' Robin to away games, out of trouble (Withdean, 2004), on TV and into the matchday magazine. Chris has been Rockin's agent - if you will!

Here's to another ten years of penalty taking, hair-rubbing, drink-shaking, away team annoying, autograph signing and fun-filled representation of Swindon Town!

Where are they now?

HIMIY ALLAN

A veteran of more than 400 appearances for Swindon Town, **JIMMY ALLAN** was back at The County Ground for last weekend's visit of Notts County in League 1.

ALLAN attended the game with members of his family as a guest of the STFC Supporters Club. The goalkeeper began his career at Brora Rangers before being invited to sign an apprenticeship with Swindon Town in 1970.

"I was playing for Brora in the Highland League as a sixteen-year old," said Allan, recalling his arrival at SN1. "A newspaper reporter up in Scotland was a friend of Fred Ford, who was the Swindon manager at the time. I was invited down for a trial and things went from there."

Allan impressed during his trial spell and he was offered a professional deal with the Robins in July 1971. The 'keeper made his first team debut against QPR just six weeks later, keeping a clean sheet in the process.

"I was on the bus on the Saturday going to go to West Ham and wondering why there were two 'keepers there as Roy Jones, the regular reserve team 'keeper, was also on the bus. Fred Ford called myself and Kenny Stroud aside and told us that we would be playing against QPR the following week - we couldn't believe it!

"At the time I was living close to the ground, on Shrivenham Road, so I went home to relax. I think the nerves got the better of me because I arrived at the ground really early on the day of the game to try and get myself focused for the game."

Allan has fond memories of his debut, which came at the age of just 17, against a formidable Queens Park Rangers side in front of an expectant County Ground crowd.

"The QPR game was brilliant - a fantastic

day," explains Allan. "We were playing against the likes of Terry Venables and Rodney Marsh. The Swindon players were really good and helped me through the game. They were able to cope with a young, novice goalkeeper making his debut at 17-years old.

"My debut was helped by playing in a team that had so much quality in it. The Swindon side on my debut included John Trollope, Frank Burrows, Stan Harland and Rod Thomas. All in all we probably had the greatest backline in the country at the time. It was a pleasure to play with such great players."

In 1971 Allan made six more first team appearances but he was then made to wait for further opportunities, much due to the form of Peter Downsborough. However, after Downsborough was sold in 1973 – Allan was handed a regular run in the Town side.

"We had some great cup runs during my time with Swindon," continues Allan, who will be 58 in November. "A game that really stands out for me was when we played Fulham at Craven Cottage. They had George Best, Bobby Moore and Rodney Marsh; a tremendous team. We drew 3-3 at Fulham and brought them back to The County Ground for a replay.

"We knew we didn't get the right result at Fulham so went out with fire in our bellies to do everything to get the result. I felt sorry for Gerry Peyton, who was making only his third or fourth appearance for Fulham. We put five past them! We did ourselves a tremendous favour by producing some top form."

He added: "The cup games with Arsenal were memorable too. We played against a very good side and played so well. I remember Spurs coming here to Swindon as well. The ground was absolutely packed with people watching the game from half-way up the floodlight just to get a view! We had an immense following in those days for a fantastic club."

His career was ended in October 1983 when his left arm was shattered during a challenge with Rochdale player Steve Johnson. The injury was so severe that only this year has Allan been able to move the arm 'pain free'.

"It was down at the Town End goal. I came out for a ball and smashed my arm just below the elbow. I had several operations and had to have it re-plated just before Christmas in 2009. I have only just got the all-clear on 22nd March this year after having a graft and another plate put in. Now for the first time in 27 years I am out of pain."

He announced his retirement in 1986, completing 371 league appearances and 108 clean sheets for the club and was rewarded with a testimonial match against Chelsea in May of that year. After a move to Devon at the end of his playing days, Allan is still living in the county as well as keeping his eye in on goalkeeping matters.

"I am doing a bit of coaching with the team my son plays for, although my son is off to University soon. The keeper they have down there is very useful and I'm hoping to do some more coaching with them next year."

Back to the basement, we've turned full circle since I began my broadcasting career in the early-eighties, just as the 'rollercoaster years' began.



THE Town were relegated to the bottom tier of English football for the first time in 1982, at Newport. In 1985/86, after a slow start, Swindon moved to the top of the table at the turn of the year and went on to become Fourth Division champions with a then best-ever points total, 102, and broke several club records in the process, including 14 successive home victories, a stark contrast to the current sequence!

So what was the most memorable match? It was a 4-2 win against Chester at The County Ground to confirm promotion. "Real Roy of the Rovers stuff", says manager Lou Macari as his team twice comes from behind in front of more than 12,000 fans, under lights—what a night! I recall waiting at the door of what is now the Chairman's Suite

to interview members of the squad. Colin Calderwood, David Cole and Chris Ramsey all made more than 50 appearances during that campaign. The title follows with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield, with four games to go.

In the days pre-internet and without blanket television coverage, radio created some fabulous pictures and we (Vic Morgan and I) worked through the night to produce a souvenir cassette. We later learn that goalkeeper Kenny Allan subsequently kept a copy in his car for inspiration. High praise indeed!

Ups and downs didn't lead to the lowest rung of the Football League ladder again until 2006/7, so becoming the first side with Premier League experience to play at that level. Only for one season, but with two managers!

Dennis Wise (& Gus Poyet) racked up 18 points from the opening six fixtures before an exit to Leeds soon after. Adv Williams (& Barry Hunter) assume caretaker control before the arrival of Paul Sturrock. 'Luggy', a great football raconteur, secures another promotion, automatically, with a last-day 1-1 draw with Walsall here. Remember Jerel Ifil's bullet-header?! He and Jack Smith make the most starts. What about the last transfer window activity? Five new faces in the final week, including Barry Corr, who's just notched up 20 goals this term for League 2 Southend United It'll be like Swindon present v Swindon past when the Town play the Shrimpers next term.

Let's hope we display similar bounceback-ability from August onwards!

"The large section at the back of the Swindon end was, as usual, very loud with their hearty chants and typical antics. Sadly, the Sheffield Wednesday fans were in poor voice, even when they were 2-0 up!"

Club shop: 8/10

"The shop had a wide range of kits and other memorabilia and seemed to be doing a brisk trade on the day of the game."





THE only player to represent the full England side whilst with Swindon Town throughout its 130-year history. Harold Fleming was plucked by then Town boss Sam Allen from local football. He scored on his league debut and was offered a professional contract just five days later. Within a few months of his arrival. Town gained their first ever victory over a Football League side in the FA Cup and he helped take them to the semi-finals of that competition twice - whilst still a non-League club. Fleming picked up his first full England cap less than two years after arriving at The County Ground and he netted a hat-trick in a 6-1 win over treland in Dublin in 1912. He suffered a painful groin injury in the semi-final replay against Barnsley, which kept him out of the game for ten months. In 1920, at the age of 33, he scored four goals in Town's record 9-1 defeat of Luton.



TODAY marks the 124th anniversary of Fleming's birth. The statue - created by local sculptor Carlton Attwood - was unveiled at a memorial match against Charlton on 2 May 1956, nine months after Fleming's death, by the visiting manager Jimmy Seed. The idea was instigated by Town's then vice-Chairman Eric Lane. In total Fleming scored 204 goals in 337 Swindon Town appearances. Fleming passed away in Swindon on 23 August 1955, aged 68


