czech mate

NEW signing Lukas Magera made his first Town appearance from the bench against Bristol City six days ago and the Czech frontman is eager to make an impression in his debut season in England.

DURING his brief appearance at Ashton Gate, the 6'4 striker showed exactly why the Town Board and management were so pleased to secure his signature with some imposing play and the frontman may be afforded another opportunity to feature against the Saints this evening.

Capped four times by his country, the 28-year old striker has spent the last few seasons with Politehnica Timișoara and played for his country against Scotland in a UEFA Euro 2012 Qualifier last October. Magera's arrival followed the recent additions of Spanish winger Lander Gabilondo and QPR striker Leon Clarke to SN1 in what is now an impressive County Ground line-up.

And having penned a two-year deal with the Robins, Magera is looking to make it a successful



first campaign in the hustle and bustle of the English game.

"I played in England last season for my last club, Timișoara, against Manchester City and I enjoyed the atmosphere in those games.

"Swindon is a very good club and the stadium here is impressive. The standard of football in England is good and the atmosphere at the games is great."

He added: "For Swindon to be in League 2 is not good and I want to help the

team win promotion. Swindon is a big team and there are quality players here. The aim is to go straight back into the third level

of English football and I want to play.

"I want to play football the right way and hopefully I can settle into the side and play my part."

Danny Fox...

FOX arrived from Burnley on a four-year deal for an undisclosed fee in August 2011. The left-back boasts a wealth of top-flight experience having played in both the English and Scottish Premier Leagues. Cheshire-born Fox started his career with Everton before moving on to Walsall in 2005. A move to Coventry in January 2008 followed before Celtic paid £1.5million for his services. He then joined the Premier League with Burnley, where he made 14 appearances in the top division for the Clarets alongside Saints midfielder Jack Cork.

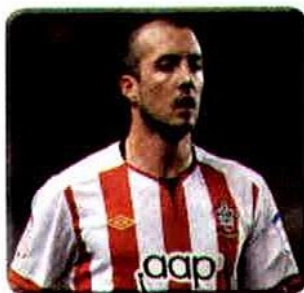


Bartosz Bialkowski...

A Polish international goalkeeper who signed for a nominal fee from Górnik Zabrze. The promising youngster caught the eye of former boss George Burley while on trial with Hearts. Bialkowski joined Gornik in 2002 and made his Polish League debut in October 2004. He made seven appearances for them before switching to the Saints.

Morgan Schneiderlin...

SCHNEIDERLIN joined Saints from RC Strasbourg in June 2008, having been previously recommended by Saints former Academy supremo Georges Prost. The French starlet signed a four-year contract in a deal that could rise to 1.5 million Euros. Schneiderlin is primarily a defensive midfielder but can also play in a more attacking role if required. He has progressed into a regular feature of the Saints side after a steep learning curve in his first year when the club was relegated from the second tier.



Steve De Ridder...

BELGIAN winger De Ridder joined Saints for a significant undisclosed fee in July 2011. He arrived from top flight Dutch side De Graafschap and is a right footed attacking player who can play naturally on either wing, and he signed a three year contract at St. Mary's ahead of the 2011/12 campaign.

For the record

THE last recorded win for Southampton at The County Ground was in November 1963 with a 2-1 victory. Town have enjoyed a good run of recent home form against the Saints, winning the last two encounters 1-0.



First round romp

SOUTHAMPTON booked their place in Round Two with a 4-1 home win over League 2 side Torquay United in front of 6,541. Southampton's goals came from Steve De Ridder, Richard Chaplow, Rickie Lambert and Jonathan Forte.

nigel adkins

the gaffer

SAINTS appointed Nigel Adkins on Sunday 12th September 2010 following the dismissal of Alan Pardew as the club's manager earlier that month.

He joined from Scunthorpe United, a club that he had a 14 year association with having served as the club's first team physio from 1996 until 2006, becoming a key member of the Glanford Park coaching set-up during this time.

Following Brian Laws' departure in 2006, he was placed in caretaker charge of the first team. He was appointed on a full-time basis midway through what turned out to be a promotion winning season.

Scunthorpe were unfortunately relegated from the Championship after just one year, but the club regrouped under Adkins.

Formerly a goalkeeper in his playing days, Birkenhead born Adkins made 86 appearances over four seasons with Tranmere Rovers. After a spell at Wigan, he then also spent three years as player-manager of Bangor, guiding them to two League of Wales titles which brought them a brief taste of UEFA Cup football.

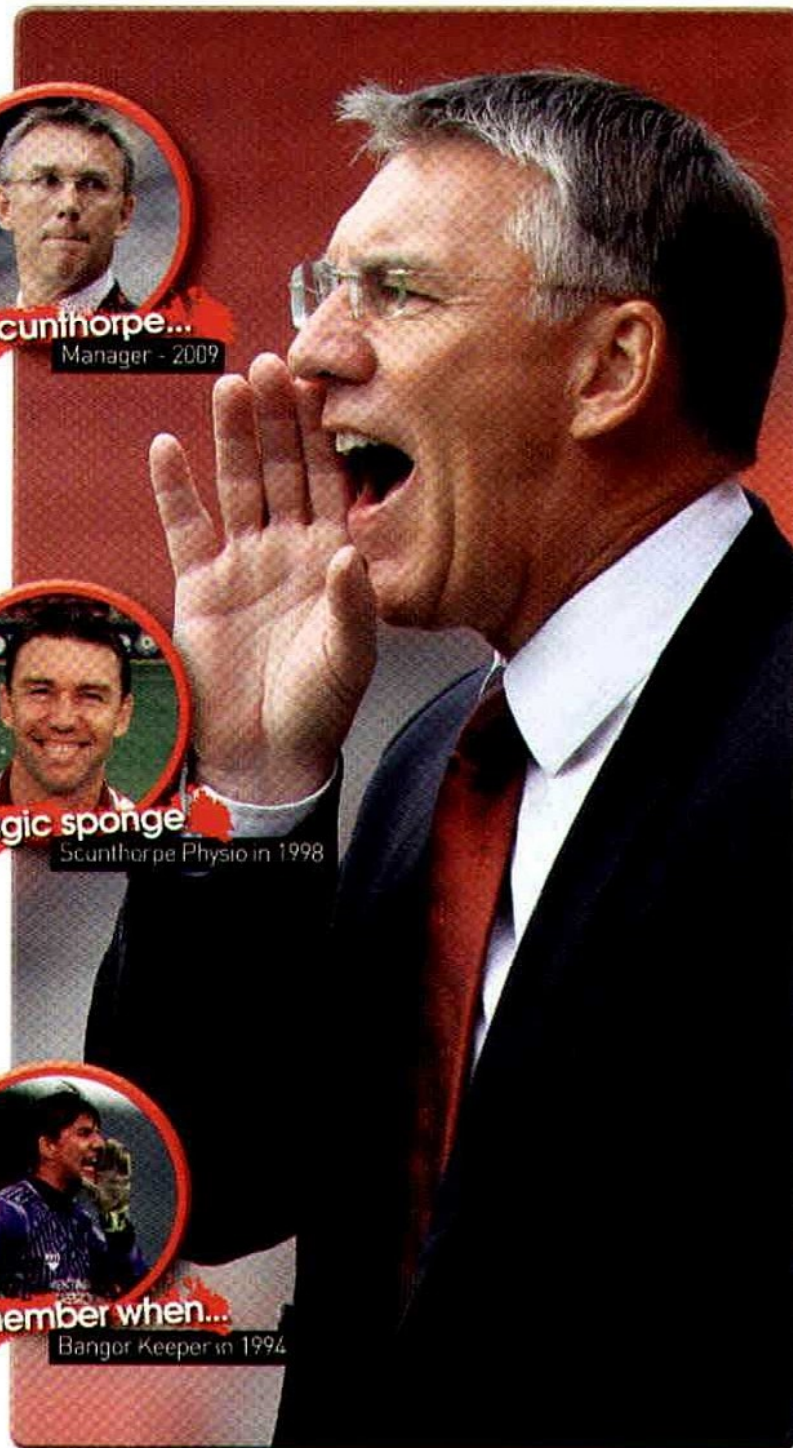

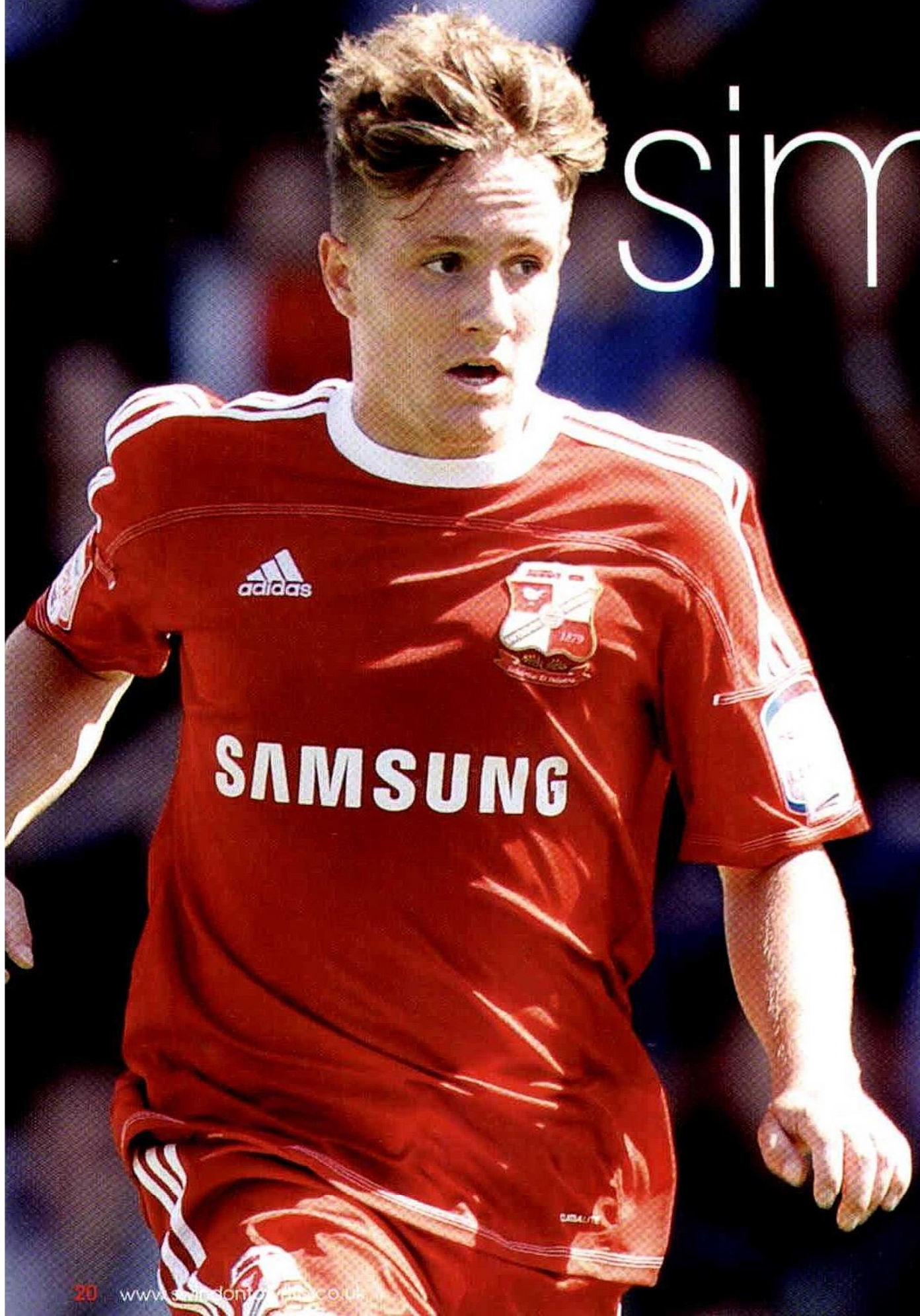

Having looked set to be frozen out for another County Ground campaign, Town midfielder Simon Ferry is beginning to make his way back from the cold.

AFTER his whirlwind debut season in a Town shirt – which of course climaxed with Wembley defeat to Millwall – Scottish livewire Ferry found his second campaign at The County Ground far less to his liking.

Managerial uncertainty, niggling injuries and lack of form meant the 23-year-old was forced to spend much of what was a miserable year on the sidelines, making only 20 starts.

And though the opening of the new term had taken a concerningly similar course to the last for Ferry, the Scot has forced his way into the reckoning in recent weeks, and he could not be more delighted.

"Obviously I'm really happy to be back in the side, especially after being out of it at the start of the year as well," he said.

"To be honest I was sat watching so much last year that I'd just got used to it and it looked like I was going to be doing it for a while again this year.

"But I did ok off the bench in the first couple of games, and I've

always put my all in in training and obviously the gaffer's taken note of that which is great for me.

"Now it's just up to me to keep the place in the team, which won't be easy because we've got a lot of decent midfielders here, but I'm confident I can do it."

Indicative of Ferry's recent revival was his typically all-action display in last Wednesday's Carling Cup first round win over Bristol City, in which he played a significant role in helping create Raffaele De Vita's 71st minute winner.

And ahead of tonight's second round clash with another Championship side, Southampton, the midfielder is hopeful that higher league opposition can again bring the best out of himself and his teammates.

"The game against Bristol [City] came at a pretty good time for us I think, because it gave us the chance to get over the Oxford game, and luckily we were able to do that," he said.

"All the boys were really up for it and I think we were the better team throughout the whole game,



and easily deserved to win it.

"To be honest we should have been two or three up at half-time, and you did start to wonder whether that would come back to haunt us in the second half.

"But we did well to carry on playing the way we had been, and we definitely deserved the win in the end.

"Playing against teams from higher divisions always brings a bit extra out of lower league teams, and you always go into it a bit more fired up.

"We proved the other night that we shouldn't fear teams from the Championship, so there's no reason why we can't get a result against Southampton."

Aside from a 4-1 thrashing at St. Mary's last March, Town have fared well against Southampton in recent years, with three consecutive triumphs over Saints preceding that defeat in what proved to be Danny Wilson's last game in charge at SN1.

And having been involved in two of those three victories,

Ferry is desperate for a repeat performance in front of what is set to be a healthy crowd at The County Ground tonight.

"I wouldn't say they see us as a 'bogey' team, but we've done well against them in the past few years and hopefully we can do the same on Tuesday," he said.

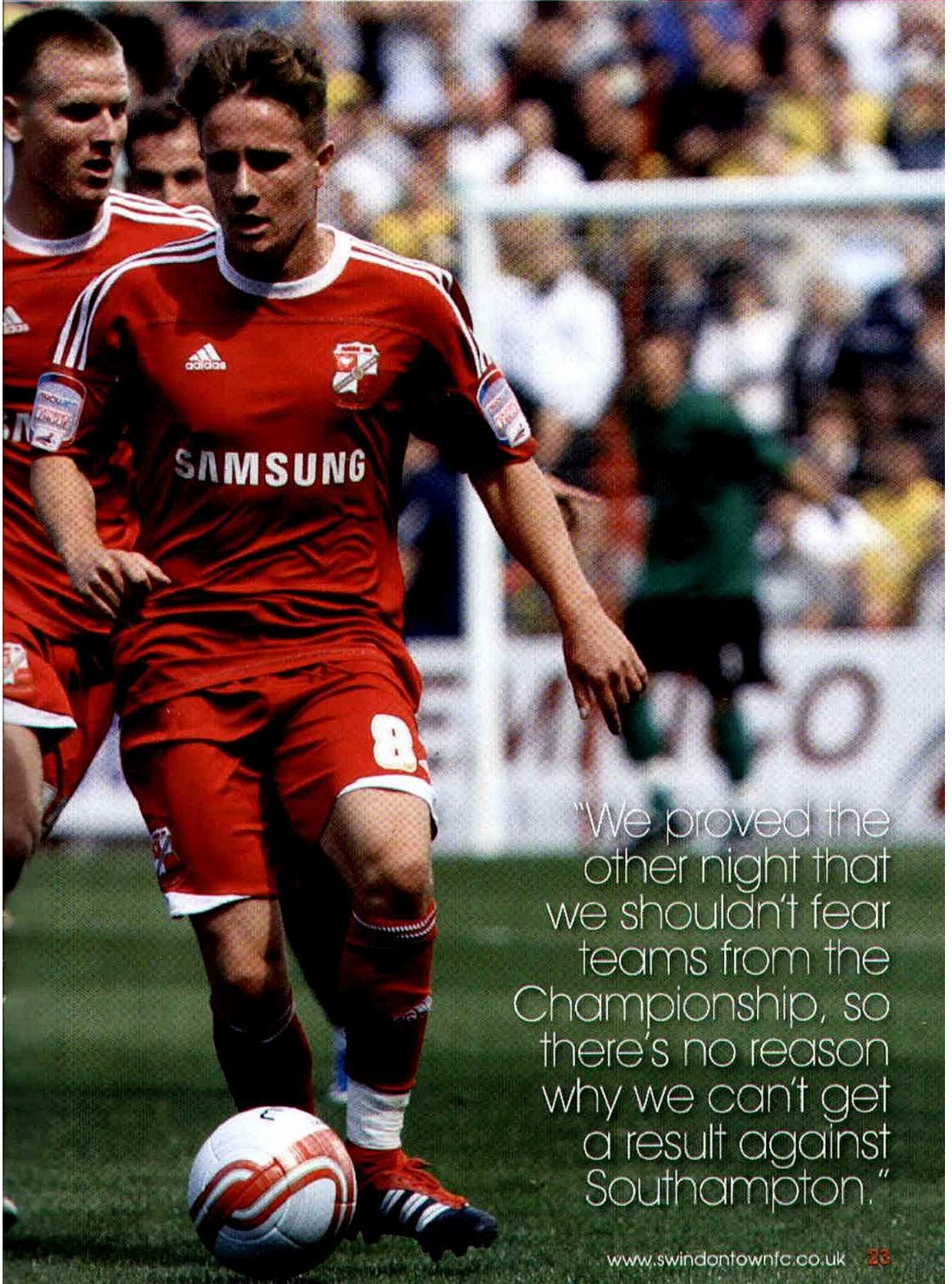
"Obviously the 1-0 game at St Mary's where Charlie [Austin] scored in the second half sticks out for me, and to get that feeling again on Tuesday would be unbelievable.

"The season started well for us at home against Crewe and we scored three but things didn't go our way result wise against Oxford.

"If we can play like we did against Bristol City and get the ball down and play then I don't think we will be too far away.

"There'll be a decent crowd in I'm sure. The support this season from our fans has been incredible and I can't wait for the visit of Southampton - it's going to be a brilliant game."

'a nil-nil annihilation'

THE Saints come marching in to Town this evening for tonight's Carling Cup tie. To mark the occasion Paul Plowman delves into the archives to remember a Littlewoods Cup clash back in October 1986...



Swindon Town 0 Southampton 0

8 October 1986
Attn: 9,453

HOW this Littlewoods Cup tussle of almost 25 years ago ended goalless is a mystery. Town outplayed their visitors from start to finish, prompting manager Lou Macari to label it 'a nil-nil annihilation'.

He had just seen his side hit the woodwork three times, have two efforts kicked off the line, force 16 corners to Saints' one - and miss a penalty for good measure!

Chris Kamara had been the guilty party from the spot, firing wide in the 17th minute following Mark Wright's trip on Dave Bamber. And the midfielder had another chance to put his side ahead before the break when, on

the half hour, his shot cannoned off the outside of Peter Shilton's right-hand post.

The England keeper was at full stretch in the opening seconds of the second half to again deny Kamara, then pulled off a better stop from Bamber in the 62nd. But he was beaten seconds later by Bryan Wade - only for Gerry Forrest to come to the rescue with a goalline clearance. A 70th minute Bamber header came back off the bar for Wade to hammer in, but the ball hit Forrest and was again cleared.

Shilton's best save of the night came when he got down to push away a Bamber effort from close range. But still Town poured forward and with six minutes remaining it looked as though substitute Steve White had finally ended the stalemate. The jubilant scenes on the touchline at Bristol City last week proved Paolo Di Canio's desire to make Swindon a success.

THE collective embrace at full-time between the manager and his backroom team was one of relief given the results that had gone before but also damning evidence that hard work does pay off.

Di Canio told me that after that victory in the League Cup at Bristol City, he and his technical staff went back to his home and watched a DVD of Shrewsbury's previous match ahead of the team's meeting last Saturday. Saints have been very good in the Championship so far and warrant their place in the upper echelons of the division. Unlike some of their close compatriots, they seem to be treating this competition with the respect it deserves. The 4-1 win first round win over Torquay United is

testament to that.

It baffles me why sides are comfortable fielding 'weakened' sides for the League Cup. Away from the silverware and possible European qualification – an incentive in itself – it's the supporters who end up being short-changed.

A third of the Premier League teams that have already played their second round ties are out. It even prompted one top-flight manager to say he was glad to be eliminated. Add to that the 11 Championships sides that have already been disposed of by lower league opposition this season and the argument over the value of this competition rears its ugly head again.

One thing is for certain. Neither side tonight will be waxing lyrical about a second round exit.
