Happy New Year to everyone and welcome back to Sixfields.

Welcome to everyone from Swindon Town for what is a mouthwatering game, and the perfect way to end 2011.

The turn of the year marks the halfway point in the football season and is often a time to look both backwards and forwards. We have spent a fair bit of time looking back over the last few weeks, so I want to begin by looking forward to 2012 and beyond, to what we believe will be exciting times for the club.

One project we are particularly excited about is the place we have been awarded in Rugby League's Championship One competition in 2013. Since we made that announcement at the start of the month we have had a huge amount of interest in the project, and that has been very encouraging. We have a long time to prepare for the big kick off, which will be in February 2013, but that build up time will be spent making sure this becomes a big success. All of the staff at the club are right behind the plans, and we know we need to attract sponsors and supporters for it to be the success we all want it to be. I think we will attract both commercial partners and good attendances, at least initially, the challenge for us will be to maintain that level of interest for the long term. Commercially we have again enjoyed a fair amount of success in 2011. Restaurant numbers have been good and the support of our sponsors, just like that of our supporters, has held up remarkably well through a difficult year. The club is in good shape, and when things take off on the pitch, we are in the best position we can be to take advantage with the infrastructure in place to support a successful team.

I thought we were desperately unlucky to lose the game against Burton Albion on Boxing Day. We were in charge of the game when John Johnson was sent off, and I thought that was a harsh decision. Even after that the lads showed tremendous determination, effort, passion and togetherness to stay in the game for so long. Saido Berahino hit the post with a terrific effort at 2-1 when had we gone 3-1 up it may well have killed the game off. It took another controversial decision going against us in the shape of an 88th minute penalty to finally earn Burton the points, but the general display again showed me that we are heading the right way.

The shape of the team was good, the effort was good and the spirit was there for all to see. It is not often a side is given a standing ovation having lost 3-2 at home, but that is what happened on Monday and I know we are heading the right way with Aidy Boothroyd in charge. Performances are improving and the results will follow.

As I write these notes we are in the bottom two, but I am sure we won't stay there for too long. If there were 3 or 4 games left in the season it would be a time to worry, but given the improving nature of our play, the transfer window ahead and the man we have in charge gives me confidence that we will climb the table. We are due some luck and we are due some refereeing decisions to go our way and with 20 odd games left, we have ample time to climb away from trouble.

I would like to welcome goalkeeper Shane Higgs to the club. Shane is the first of a number of new signings we are expecting in the next few weeks. He enjoyed a fine debut on Boxing Day and did enough to suggest he will be a good acquisition for the club.

It's the time for New Year's Resolutions, but rather than a resolution, I will tell you my New Year's wish. I want us to win more home games in 2012. We haven't won too many at home in 2011, so it would be nice to see some more wins here at Sixfields and to come to games to enjoy them rather than in a state of trepidation!





CAPTAIN'S COLUMN WITH JOHN JOHNSON tappy New Year

I am writing these notes as we await news from the FA on the appeal to the red card I was shown on Boxing Day. I was bitterly disappointed to be sent off, particularly so in those circumstances when I felt the decision was incorrect. The ball went up in the air, and I was just focused on winning the ball. I used my arm as leverage as you need to do to jump in that situation and all I saw was the ball. That is where my attention was and at no point did I look up or look at the Burton player. To be honest. I barely knew he was there until we clashed heads. The referee had the red card out and said he sent me off for an elbow, but at no point did I lead with or throw an elbow out. It was a genuine and honest challenge to win the ball.

That decision left us with an uphill task, playing with ten men for 70 odd minutes, but I thought the lads showed a lot of commitment, skill and courage against a very good Burton team. But for a controversial penalty decision going against us with two minutes left we would have taken a point, and we could have had all three had Saido Berahino's shot not come back off the inside of the post at the start of the second half.

That game is gone now, and while the result went against us, we can take a lot of positives out of the display ahead of what

is a very busy weekend for us. We play Swindon today and then go to Shrewsbury on Monday, and both of those teams are challenging for promotion. They will both be difficult games, but we have shown we are an improving side and we can go into both games with confidence.



THE JEFFERSON LAKE COLUMN Happy New Year

The key event of the past 12 months was the club's decision to sack lan Sampson as manager and replace him with Gary Johnson.

Just about every strand of the current storyline at Sixfields threads back to that pivotal plot twist back in March.

As a married man I am used to admitting my mistakes and I will say at this point that in celebrating the move to bring in Johnson I was dead wrong.

For what it is worth I did not agree with the removal of Sampson from office but I was fully in favour of the man who was brought in to replace him, and firmly believed he would be a success.

That he was not remains something of a mystery and without going into too much detail it would seem the club did not get exactly what they believed they would get with that managerial appointment.


But that is all in the past now, and while Christmas is often a time to reflect on the events of the past it is also a time to look ahead to the coming year.

So what can we expect of 2012 from a Northampton Town perspective? In the short term it is likely to be more hardship - Rome was not built in a day and Aidy Boothroyd has a substantial job on his hands moulding this group of under-achieving players with virtually no confidence into a side capable of winning games.

I don't think the side will get relegated. I've said this before and they have come very close but I do think they have enough about them - and the right manager to scrap their way to safety.

So here's hoping that after the last managerial appointment ended in such near-disastrous circumstances, that the latest one will be much more successful, and that all concerned can look forward to a much better year in 2012 than was endured in 2011.

came about.

"My agent phoned me a couple of weeks ago to say that the manager here was interested in talking to me," he said.

"I met Aidy Boothroyd straight away and we had a good chat about what he expects and what he needs.

"I trained with the lads for a couple of days after that and I was more than happy to sign."

Although Higgs has been without a club since leaving Leeds United at the end of last season, he has not been short of offers, as he explained.

"I've had some interest from other clubs in the last five months but nothing that has really appealed to me like the offer to come here did.

"I know the league position isn't very good at the moment but I think with a few changes things can turn around very quickly and that's what made the move so appealing for me."

For a keeper of his experience, with more than 300 career appearances and a club like Leeds United on his CV, it must have been hard for Higgs to be without a club for a period.

"The last few months have been quite difficult and having been in football for 17 years it is quite strange when suddenly you don't have that routine any more," he admitted.

"It did cross my mind that maybe my career was done for but like I say in football things can change very quickly and I'm delighted to be here.

Maybe it was the break that I needed and I'm really looking forward to the challenge here."

Having been at the club for over a week now, what are his first impressions?

"There is a good bunch of lads here, there is a lot of them and there are a few names to learn.

"The work ethic in training is excellent and everyone has been very positive and upbeat."

His ability to dominate a penalty area and organise his defence are two attributes that Aidy Boothroyd spoke about when he brought Higgs to the club, and the keeper believes they are roles he can fulfil.

"I like to think I am quite vocal as a goalkeeper but I'm sure people will have their own opinion on that," he said.

"The manager wanted to bring someone with experience in and I like to think of myself as quite a commanding goalkeeper and I like to talk to the back four as much

"I've played in League's One and Two for most of my career, it's relatively simple football but if you do it right and you are effective then you can easily get on a run of winning games.

"The manager is working really hard on getting the team organised first and foremost and if we can get that right then hopefully we will build from there."


Higgs enjoyed an excellent debut against Burton Albion on Boxing Day, making a string of fine saves in what was a dramatic, controversial and ultimately frustrating afternoon.

"I thought we looked a really good side against Burton," he said. "The work rate was fantastic and we took a lot of positives out of the game, despite the result. We were a man down for most of the game but we created a lot of chances and showed a lot of spirit and I felt we were unlucky with their penalty decision late on. It was a 50:50 call but the decision went against us on that occasion."

Apart from Burton's late penalty, the decision of the referee to send John Johnson off early in the game was another big talking point, and Higgs felt that also went against the Cobblers. "I thought the sending off was unlucky, it looked like a clash of heads to me from the angle I was looking at. The referee said it was an elbow but it didn't look like that to me.

"If we can keep the effort, spirit and quality of performance we showed on Monday we will soon climb the table. I am sure about that."

Aidy has stated that the team is not far away from where he wants it to be but he also knows that there are still some areas that need strengthening. Some players have already been released, a decision that gave them extra time to find a club. Others undoubtedly will go and there will be the usual speculation as the transfer window opens as to whether certain players will be coming or going.

I certainly don't have a crystal ball as to what will occur but it will be interesting to see what happens.

So to conclude may I wish you and yours a Happy New Year and I hope 2012 will be full of good things for all of us Cobblers fans. I am sure we will all settle for mid table obscurity for this season as an aim with further progress next term.




Morecambe travel disruption

Supporters travelling to Morecambe next Saturday are advised that there will be a full closure of the M6 / M1 interchange, the Catthorpe Viaduct, on Saturday 7th & Sunday 8th January.

Roadworks will require the full closure of:

- M1 Northbound between junctions 19 (M6 North off slip) and 20 (including closure of the M1 Northbound on slip at junction 19)
- . M1 Southbound between junction 19 (A14 off slip) and 18
- . M6 Southbound from the A14 off slip at M1 junction 19.


Cup, won the Plate competition that day.

Gavin Field, at 88, is entitled to look back and reflect on all his years of involvement in sport - and in particular the 60 years he has spent helping the Cobblers both at the County Ground and since 1994 at Sixfields.

It is not simply the Cobblers who have benefited from Gavin's energy and enthusiasm over the years. For more than 25 years he was a volunteer driver for Crispin's and the Volunteer Bureau. "I was their longest serving driver," he told me, "It kept me busy but I feel it was worth it."

He has ventured into football management as well, as he reminded me when we looked back to the days when, as a young reporter on the Chronicle & Echo, I played myself in the Northants Thursday League. For 27 years Gavin managed Highland Rangers, just about the most successful civilian team in what was at the time a pretty hot league.

I played for Thursday United, the perpetual back markers with only the occasional victory to keep us going, and I cannot remember any of those being against Gavin's side.

"I was able to run the team because I worked in a shop and Thursday was early closing day," he recalled.

"The opposition was often pretty tough, particularly the teams from the various army units in the area.

"For instance the Northamptonshire Regiment often had young professionals doing National Service available. I remember one was Ken Nicholas, a local boy who at the time was with Arsenal. Both the Borough and the County Police had teams and the standard was not too bad at all."

Gavin has many memories of his business life as well as his sporting connections and he was happy to share some of them with me.

There was one moment I really enjoyed while I was in the sports equipment business," he said, "And that was having a photograph taken with England batsman Geoffrey Boycott and England's World Cup-winning goalkeeper Gordon Banks along with special boots I had made for

"There was a shoe firm in Northampton at the time named Kingswell and they made the boots for me. Gordon was the first player I can remember to have a coloured pair of boots - and these were red.

"There was another occasion I remember very well involving footwear when it was the Cobblers who needed help, in a hurry. I had a call at home from 'Mac' McCormack, the club trainer at the time. because he was worried about the weather.

"It was a cold, icy spell at the time and although the pitch was playable it was going to be difficult. He wanted me to find non-slip boots for the players and I needed to move quickly.

"I chased around, weighed up several options and finally settled on a set of basketball boots that GT Hawkins supplied for me from their factory which at the time was on The Mounts. The building remains but the firm is long gone.

"I rushed them up to Mac at the County Ground, the match was played, with the opposition struggling for a foothold, and I had been able to do the club a good turn. Did we win? I'm not sure, but I think we did.

"Over the years there have been many memories of players and of matches and in particular I remember the feeling of anticipation back in the 1970s when we drew Manchester United in the FA Cup. We had battled through several rounds, and some replays, to be there and then we were beaten 8-2.

"But the memory is not all bad because it was the time George Best scored six goals which made it one of those days when it was good to have actually been there.

"I remember so many great characters amongst our own players and always think of them as friends. I was always fond of Roly Mills - and remember he always had to have different sized boots. One foot was size 7, the other 71/2."


These days Gavin's health problems mean he is unable to drive and he is quick to pay tribute to those people who are always there to support him.

"My dear wife Mary (they have been married for 55 years) and my family are wonderful," he told me, "And I owe a great deal to my friend Ray Caswell because he keeps me mobile when it comes to helping at Sixfields.

"He has been assisting the club for more than 30 years himself and he makes sure I can keep going. He is a true supporter and one time when the club finances were in trouble he even turned up with large jars of coffee and loads of teabags for

"I feel I have been part of the club family and it has been a pleasure to do it. Although I have never been paid the club has been very good to me. In return they know I will always come when they need me - like the little job I do of looking after the door for reserve team games."

Cobblers chairman David Cardoza was delighted to pay tribute to Gavin when I talked to him. He said, "Gavin has given us wonderful help over so many years. As a club we would be lost without this kind of support from within the local community. We are grateful to Gavin, and all the other volunteers who never let us down."



I feel I have been part of the club family and it has been a pleasure to do it. Although I have never been paid the club has been very good to me.



The end of 2011, the start of 2012, and so what will the New Year bring?



And I can check that anywhere in the world at any time as well. Wonderful, should I suddenly have a burning desire to compulsively check the latest scores in the Greek Super League or the French Lique 2. In fact, it's probably fair to say technology has completely changed the way we indulge our obsession with the beautiful game.

It's brilliant and a far cry from much simpler times before smart phones and the interweb when you had to wait to get home and wait for Final Score to furnish you with all of the day's results. It certainly added an air of tension to the day's proceedings.

One of my earliest childhood memories is, in fact, sitting down with my father watching goal flashes from the vidiprinter - which actually made a printing noise while a gurning Steve Rider runs through what's happening around the grounds from the Grandstand studio.

This would become a weekly ritual on a Saturday afternoon, as would my father cursing, screwing up his pools coupon and then throwing it away in disgust because once again he had failed to predict the correct draws. He did win £53 once, although I'm sure the losses down the years more than outweigh that.

A red letter day in the Bazeley household was when my parents decided to invest in a TV that had Teletext capability, opening up a whole new world of information and up-to-the-minute scores from any games taking place around the country that day.

Digital television and the information super highway have all but killed that. It's still there in a modified form, although without the same sort of charm that the blocky, pixelated mine of information that page 302 of Ceefax had to offer.

Oh sure, ITV had page 401 (later 410) on Teletext, but like everything they do when it comes to sport there are a lot of places that do it so much better, Indeed, an entire 38 pages of BBC Ceefax were devoted to the latest football news, results, fixtures and tables.

It really came to life on game days, allowing you to keep up with the


latest scores while watching the TV. Indeed, the beauty of the 'Mix' button meant you could have the goals up while watching highlights from the British Superbike Championship or the 3.20 from Newbury.

Page 312 was always a good one bringing you snippets of news from around the football universe - sometimes with up to 12 different sub-pages. Of course, if you spent too long trying to read about Bournemouth's latest loan signing then the page would move on and you'd have to wait five minutes for it to come back.

There was always the hold button, but progress in Teletext technology meant that in later years you would be able to navigate the sub-pages at your own leisure. That also went some way to removing the agony of having to wait for the page to scroll round and tell you how your team were getting on in their crucial Coca-Cola Cup tie.

ITV did have the BBC beat with their regional goal show on a Sunday afternoon where Kevin Piper and a rotating cast of talking heads (Barry Fry, Alan Brazil and John Deehan) would chew over Saturday's games. You miss these things from the past, but like that brown Coventry City away shirt and the North American Soccer League, they're probably best left there.

"We want to make sure that the coach education side of things is the best it can be as well as making sure that the off field stuff is right as well.

"We need to build up the awareness and make sure that all the local schools are involved.

"That's the type of expertise we want to pass on and we want the team to be successful."

Gary Campbell of the Northampton Demons added, "It's a fantastic opportunity for our club.


"As a community club we have made massive strides over the last five or six years and this move gives our players something to aim at.

"With Northampton having a Championship One club in 2013 it gives us an opportunity to propel the club up and bring some more professionalism into the club."



MIKE SUMMERBEE

Football historian Leigh Edwards profiles one of Swindon Town's finest-ever players

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town.

A son of former Preston and Barrow wing-half George Summerbee, he was born in Preston and moved to Cheltenham as a youngster when his father became Cheltenham Town's manager. Mike was the first wave of young players introduced by Bert Head at Swindon and made his League debut in the Robins' 2-0 victory at home to Bournemouth three months before turning professional in March 1960.

Summerbee scored his first League goal in Swindon's 4-3 win at home to Colchester United the following month and missed just one match in 1960-61. He formed an exciting right wing partnership with Ernie Hunt and was a key figure as Swindon won promotion for the first time in their history in 1962-63. Other young stars who played for Swindon during this period included Cliff Jackson, Don Rogers, John Trollope and Bobby Woodruff.

Mike featured prominently as Swindon stormed to the top of the Second Division in the opening weeks of the 1963-64 campaign and began to attract the attention of bigger clubs. Summerbee was Swindon's leading marksman and 'Player of the Year' in 1964-65, netting 39 goals in 218 League games for the Robins before moving to Manchester City for £31,000 in August 1965.

He was Joe Mercer's first signing for City, the manager had played alongside Summerbee's father in Aldershot's star-studded wartime team and followed young Mike's progress. Mike was ever-present in City's 1965-66 Second Division title triumph and starred as they won the League Championship in 1967-68, the FA Cup in 1968-69 and

League Cup and European Cup Winners' Cup in 1969-70. He missed the latter final through injury but was awarded a special winner's medal.

Summerbee made his full England debut in the 1-1 draw with Scotland in January 1968 that confirmed Sir Alf Ramsey's team as the winners of their European Nations Cup group and winners of the Home Championship. He kept his place for England's 1-0 victory over Spain at Wembley in the European Nations Cup quarter-final first-leg and scored his only international goal in the 1-1 draw against Switzerland in November 1971.

A fashionable dresser in the 'Swinging Sixties' Mike was part-owner of a boutique with George Best. He was a League Cup finalist again in 1974 and played over 300 games in the top-flight before moving to Burnley for £25,000 in August 1975, then had a spell with Blackpool before becoming Stockport County's player-manager.

Mike was a colourful character and a genuine personality as well as a player with skill in abundance. He retired from the game to concentrate on his business activities, including a bespoke shirt making company, combining these with a successful career as an after-dinner speaker and also appearing alongside Pele in the film 'Escape to Victory'. His son Nicky followed in his footsteps, playing for both Swindon and Manchester City.





DIARY OF THE DECADE -

50 years on...

Football historian Leigh Edwards recalls Northampton Town's 1961-62 season.



Match 23

9th December 1961

Attendance 10,059

NORTHAMPTON TOWN BRENTFORD

Cobblers: Chic Brodie, Theo Foley, Roly Mills, Mike Everitt, Terry Branston, Derek Leck, Ron Spelman, Cliff Holton, Pat Terry, John Reid, Barry Lines.

Northampton Town stormed to an emphatic victory at home to Brentford. Roly Mills replaced the injured Tony Claypole at left-back. Northampton raced into the lead on four minutes when Pat Terry centred and Cliff Holton scored from close range. Terry headed just wide from Ron Spelman's cross, then former England star Johnny Brooks missed a good chance to equalise. Gerry Cakebread saved well from John Reid on 35 minutes and Peter Gelson denied Barry Lines. Northampton swarmed all over the Bees in the second half with Terry scoring again on the hour, then Lines netted after 70 minutes. Holton and Lines scored further goals in the last ten minutes.

Match 24

16th December 1961

Pat Terry stung the Hornets with two goals at the County Ground. Cliff Holton skippered Northampton against his former club and had an early shot blocked on the line, then Ron Spelman had an effort disallowed shortly afterwards. Holton headed a Barry Lines centre just wide before Dave Bowen's side broke the deadlock on 23 minutes. Spelman shot from just inside the penalty area and Terry put out a foot to deflect the ball into the net. Holton headed against the post a minute later but Northampton doubled their advantage after 36 minutes when Spelman crossed and Terry dived to head past Dave Underwood. There were few chances in the second-half.

Player Profile Ron Spelman

Winger Ron Spelman helped Northampton Town to clinch promotion in 1960-61.

He turned professional with Norwich City in November 1960 but had few first-team opportunities and joined Northampton in November 1960. Making his debut in the following month's 1-1 draw at Rochdale, he netted three goals in 33 League games for the Cobblers before moving to Bournemouth in exchange for Arnold Woollard in March 1962 and featured in their promotion near-miss.

He followed Bill McGarry to Watford in September 1963, then played for Oxford United and Wisbech Town. Later a publican in Norwich, then a driver for Fyffes, he died in June 2006.

David Gilbert found lan Benjamin in the box who twisted and turned his way around Alec Chamberlain to score, three minutes later the scores were level as Tony Adcock received the ball from substitute Tom English and powered a shot into the top corner of Peter Gleasure's net.

Warren Donald sent in a telling cross that Trevor Morley read well and headed home at the far post but the cheering had hardly stopped before that man Adcock brought the scores level with a near post header again from a Tom English pass.

A draw looked on the cards until Terry Baker palmed a Benjamin shot on the line and despite Eddie McGoldrick putting away the rebound the referee had blown for the penalty.

Alec Chamberlain got his hand to David Gilbert's spot kick but failed to hold it as it bounced up and over the line to give the Cobblers yet another win.

Mark was on the books of West Ham United where he won England youth international caps but never made the first team.

After a loan spell at Bournemouth he joined them on full terms but despite being a regular first team player in their Third Division side he was released at the end of the season and Graham Carr brought him to Northampton.

The experiment of playing two wingers in Mark and Phil Cavener did not work but despite this Mark played in 39 league and cup games and scored six goals during the 1985-86 season.

The signing of Eddie McGoldrick heralded the end of Mark's Northampton Town career and after playing in the opening game of the 1986-87 season he was dropped and in the September he joined Cambridge United.

He then spent several seasons in the non-League circuit turning out for Kettering Town, Enfield, Barnet, Irthlingborough Diamonds, Bourne Town, Warboys Town and Brixworth.

Mark moved into computer programming and now runs his own business setting up websites and web browsers for national companies. Among his clients are British Gas, Royal Mail, Sainsbury's, Hotpoint and Barclaycard.

Oxford United have signed Australian striker Matthew Fletcher on a short-term contract, Fletcher, 19, was

Gillingham are keen to tie up a permanent deal for Bristol Rovers striker Jo Kuffour when the transfer window reopens in

January. Kuffour, 30, is currently on a three-month loan deal at Priestfield. Gills boss Andy Hessenthaler also wants to bring West Ham United striker Frank Nouble back to the club on loan after the 20-year old striker impressed in his previous loan spell, scoring 5 goals in 13 appearances.



Bolton Wanderers boss Owen Coyle is reportedly eveing a move for Crawley Town defender Kyle McFadzean in

January. The highly-rated McFadzean, 24, joined the Red Devils in August 2010 and played a major role in their promotion last season.



Rotherham's Lewis Grabban has meanwhile been linked with a move to Sheffield, with both Wednesday and United believed

to have shown an interest in the striker. Grabban, 23, has to date notched 13 times for the Millers this season.



In more paper talk, West Ham United boss Sam Allardyce is reportedly set to offer Southend United £500,000 for Kane

Ferdinand. The young midfielder is the cousin of Rio and Anton, who both came through the Hammers academy. Southend chairman Ron Martin has meanwhile confirmed that the club are in the 'advanced stages' of starting building work on their Fossetts Farm stadium. The Blues were given permission to construct a new ground on the site over 3 years ago and the new stadium is being funded in part by supermarket chain Sainsbury's, who in return will build a store at the club's current Roots Hall home.



Gloucester City are in talks with Cheltenham Town about renewing their groundshare deal for next season. Gloucester

have been without a permanent home since losing their Meadow Park ground to flooding in 2007 and have played at Whaddon Road since 2010 having previously shared with Cirencester and Forest Green Rovers.



Plymouth have re-signed much-travelled striker Nick Chadwick on a short-term deal. Chadwick, 29, was a free agent

after leaving Stockport County. He initially joined Plymouth in a £250,000 move from Everton in February 2005 and spent over three seasons at Home Park, scoring11 goals in 83 games.



Macclesfield winger Colin Daniel has signed a one-year contract extension until the end of the 2012-13 season.

The 23-year-old initially joined the Silkmen on loan in March 2009 and signed permanently at the Moss Rose following his release by Crewe.




Shrewsbury have extended the loan of Everton midfielder James Wallace by another month. Wallace, 19, who played

Lewis was first named on the bench for the game against Crewe three weeks ago, the first



While we are continually assessing our young players, our planning for the following season goes up a notch once we get beyond the turn of the year. Decisions are made about which players we will look to retain, which players we will release, and at the top end of our age groups, who we will be offering a scholarship to.

The end of the season may seem a long way away, but trust me, it's not. Decision time for a lot of the young players is actually a lot closer than that, as it is common practice to give some trialists a chance to play in the last few matches of a season, looking ahead to the following campaign.

As a group the under 18 squad have been a little inconsistent this season. We have played well in periods, but we have often struggled to put in a complete 90 minute performance, and that is something the players will need to work on, both as individuals and as a group as we move into the second half of the season.























When Paolo di Canio was appointed Swindon Town manager last summer, you knew the Robins would bring excitement, glamour and drama to League 2 this season, and they have not disappointed.

While the first few weeks of the season did not go to plan - the Robins beat Crewe on the first day of the season but then lost four league games in a row - three successive wins at the start of September got the ball rolling.

That was a sign of things to come, and a long unbeaten run stretching back to the end of September that only ended with a narrow 1-0 loss at Torquay United on Boxing Day, shows just how tough this afternoon's game will be. In that long run they recorded some impressive results, including a 3-0 win at Crawley Town, a 2-0 success over Gillingham and a 4-1 FA Cup triumph over Huddersfield Town, who at the time had not lost a league game for 43 matches.

Paolo Di Canio

Di Canio was born in Rome, in the district of Quarticciolo. He signed for Lazio, în 1985; here he remained until 1990, moving to another of Italy's biggest clubs, Juventus. He stayed there until 1993 and successive seasons saw him join first Napoli and then A.C. Milan. In 1996 he joined Celtic in Scotland, and his successful season in Glasgow (scoring 15 goals in 37 appearances) saw him make a move to the English Premier League as he joined Sheffield Wednesday for a sum of around £4.2m. Whilst in Sheffield, Di Canio was the club's leading goal scorer for the 1997-98 season with 14 goals and he became a favourite of the fans.

In January 1999, Di Canio signed for West Ham United for £1.7m and helped them to qualify for the UEFA Cup through the Intertoto Cup. He was also the OPTA player of the season 1998–99. He scored the BBC Goal of the Season in March 2000 with a volley against Wimbledon, which is still considered among the best goals in Premier League history and was named as the Premier League's goal of the decade in a December 2009 Sky Sports News viewers' poll.

In 2001, he won the FIFA Fair Play Award. The previous December, in a match against Everton, in a noteworthy display of sportsmanship, Di Canio shunned a goal scoring opportunity and caught the ball from a cross instead as the Everton goalkeeper Paul Gerrard was lying injured on the ground after he twisted his knee attempting a clearance on the edge of the box. FIFA described the act as 'a special act of good sportsmanship.'

In 2003, he was released on a free transfer and after turning down Leeds United he signed a contract with Chariton Athletic for the start of 2003–04. Whilst at The Valley he helped the club secure its highest league finish since the 1950s. However, he only scored four goals for the Addicks, all of them from the penalty spot.



Even though he had already signed an extension to his Charlton contract, in August 2004 he returned to his home team of Lazio. He scored in the Rome derby, just as he had in 1989, leading the team to a 3–1 victory over A.S. Roma in January 2005. In the summer of 2006 he joined Cisco Roma, but they failed to win promotion via the play offs, despite securing a runners-up position in the regular season. He subsequently agreed to stay with Cisco for another season, in a second attempt to win promotion to Serie C1 with the Roman side.


On March 10, 2008, Di Canio announced his retirement from football, ending his 23-year playing career before the end of the season due to injury. In an interview he revealed that his dream would be to manage former club West Ham, and he applied for the position after the resignation of Alan Curbishley in September 2008.


Di Canio has a UEFA Pro Licence and on 20 May 2011 he was appointed manager of Swindon Town, following the club's relegation to League Two. Di Canio began his career as a manager with an emphatic 3-0 win over Crewe.


In The News

Meet the Squad

Mattia Lanzano

Italian goalkeeper Mattia Lanzano departed native side USD Gavorrana 1930 in July to sign a two-year deal with Town. The 20-year-old custodian travelled with the squad on the pre-season tour to Italy, and made his debut in the 11-0 win over Norcia. Lanzano competes with Phil Smith and Mark Scott for the number one jersey at the County Ground.

Callum Kennedy

Former Reading youngster Callum Kennedy was first granted a taste of first team action by former Town boss Paul Sturrock. The youngster made a surprise start in the 4-1 win over Brentford in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in September 2007. After being taken on the club's pre-season tour to Austria in 2008, Kennedy was handed a chance to impress in pre-season with games against Cardiff City and Plymouth Argyle, Numerous substitute appearances then followed in season 2008/2009, before he made his full debut against Carlisle United at the start of December 2008. He was awarded a new one-year contract in the summer of 2009 and competed with Lecsinel Jean-Francois for the left-back slot before a pelvic injury sustained mid-way through the season kept him on the sidelines for the remainder of the campaign. Despite his lack of first team action in the face of injury and the form of Alan Sheehan, Kennedy signed a new one-year deal in January 2010. After loan spells at Gillingham and Rotherham United during Season 2010/2011, Kennedy returned to the County Ground as first-choice left-back for this season.

Aden Flint

Aden Flint joined Town from Blue Square North side Alfreton Town in January 2011, after having been pursued by Danny Wilson for a

considerable time. Flint, 21, had attracted interest from the likes of Colchester United, Derby County and Luton Town with his performances for Alfreton, but chose to move to the County Ground on a two-and-a-half year contract mid-way through the January transfer window. The defender, who has also received two international caps at England 'C' level, made his debut in the 1-1 draw with Rochdale at the County Ground on February 5th. He was thrust straight into the starting line-up on the opening day of the 2011/12 season, being named man of the match in the 3-0 win over Crewe Alexandra.

Voe Devera

Joe Devera became Paolo Di Canio's first signing as Town boss in June 2011. Devera linked up with the Robins after an established spell with Barnet and will hope to use his considerable experience to help Swindon to success.

The 24-year-old, who is of Venezuelan descent, made 177 appearances during a six-year career with the Bees, and was named the club's Player of the Year in 2008 and 2011. A product of the Barnet youth system, Devera can play at either right-back or centre-back, and has added much-needed depth to the Town defensive line.

Alberto Comazzi

Experienced defender Alberto Comazzi signed a two-year deal at the County Ground in July following lengthy talks with the club. The 32-year old progressed through the youth team ranks at AC Milan before spending time with the likes of Como, Monza and Verona. Comazzi spent last season at Spezia, before arriving in Wiltshire for his first spell in English football with Town.

Paul Caddis

Paul Caddis signed alongside fellow

Celtic youth team graduate Simon Ferry in August 2010 for a combined undisclosed fee. The 23-year-old penned a three-year deal, and his capture concluded a lengthy pursuit from then Town boss Danny Wilson. Caddis can play in many different positions, but is predominantly a right-sided defender. Along with Ferry and former Robin Scott Cuthbert, Caddis came through the ranks at Celtic and enjoyed much success at youth team level, before making 25 appearances for the Bhoys in 2009/2010, including starts in the Champions League, Caddis made 42 appearances in the ill-fated 2010/11 season, and was voted Fans' Away Player of the Year.

Simon Ferry

Along with Paul Caddis, Simon Ferry made the permanent switch from Celtic in August 2010, penning a three-year deal. The midfielder had enjoyed a hugely successful season at SN1 in 2009/2010, making 42 starts and scoring twice in Town's play-off campaign. Having joined Celtic at the age of 12, Ferry progressed through the ranks at Parkhead along with Caddis and former Town teammate Scott Cuthbert, enjoying much success. However, he was sidelined for nearly two years with a serious ankle injury, and 2009/2010 was his first full season of professional football, a season in which he was agonisingly close to success. Ferry made 25 appearances during the 2010/11 season and was often a frustrated figure on the substitutes bench, especially during the second half of the campaign.

Matt Ritchie

After two separate loan spells, Matt Ritchie signed a two-and-a-half year contract at with Town in January 2011. Ritchie made his full debut for the club in the 2-0 Johnstone's Paint Trophy







second round win over Torquay United at the County Ground, before going on to make 34 appearances during the rest of the season, scoring 12 times.

A bustling attacking midfielder, the 22-year-old was voted Fans' Player of the Year for his efforts in 2010/11.

Etienne Esajas

Etienne Esajas signed for Town after impressing during a three-week trial at the club last summer. The Dutchman scored in each of his friendly appearances for the club against a Marche XI and Swindon Supermarine, and put pen to paper on a two-year deal at the County Ground shortly afterwards. Esajas, who made 65 appearances for Sheffield Wednesday during his previous stint in English football, spent season 2009/10 with Dutch side Helmond Sport.

Alan McCormack

Alan McCormack signed a two-year-deal at the County Ground in July 2011. Following his release from Charlton Athletic, the Irishman trained with Paolo Di Canio's side for a week before putting pen to paper. McCormack started his career at Preston North End, before a series of loan moves preceded a switch to Southend United. He went on to make 130 appearances for the Shrimpers, scoring 15 times during three seasons at the club between 2007 and 2010. Charlton Athletic secured his services last summer following Southend's relegation to League 2, and McCormack went on to make 24 appearances for the Addicks, scoring once.

Oliver Risser

Oliver Risser penned a two-year-deal at the County Ground in July 2011, and was named club captain shortly after. The 30-year-old is a Namibian international who has played in Norway, Germany and Greece during his career. A powerful defensive midfielder, Risser can also play as a centre-back.

Jordan Pavett

Jordan Pavett won a nationwide competition to sign a professional contract with Swindon Town. Pavett, 19, beat more than 3,500 amateur players to the dream prize in Samsung's 'Win A Pro Contract' competition. He took part in series of regional and national trials before lining up in the final at the County Ground in January 2011. Striker Pavett, from Maldon, Essex, was then one of three players selected to train with the Wiltshire club, and picked as the winner by boss Danny Wilson after impressing the Robins' coaching staff. Pavett, who has spent time at Ipswich Town and Colchester United, joined Swindon after working as a plumber with his dad's firm. The striker was handed the number 14 shirt by Paolo Di Canio ahead of the 2011/12 season and featured during the pre-season tour of Italy.

Alan Connell

Swindon Town clinched the signing of Grimsby Town striker Connell for an undisclosed six-figure sum in July 2011. The 28-year old frontman put pen to paper on a two-year deal at the County Ground. Connell arrived at Blundell Park from Bournemouth in July 2010 and scored 25 league goals for the Mariners last term - finishing the campaign with 29 in all competitions. A popular player in two spells at Dean Court, the former lpswich trainee has won promotion to League 1 on three separate occasions and enjoyed prolific spells with Torquay United and Hereford United.

Mark Scott

A 20-year old goalkeeper who is yet to make his first team debut for the Robins, but will look to take his chance during the current campaign.

The stopper started his career with Southampton as an eight-year old and spent six years with the Saints before being released. He then linked up with Whitchurch United and played Under 16's football for the non-league side

before his performances caught the eye of Aldershot Town FC. After a year with The Shots, he made a move to Swindon in the summer of 2007. Established himself in the youth team during the 2007/08 season and also played in a number of reserve games. 2008/09 started well for Scott, who was included on the bench for the League One encounter with Leeds United in September 2008 after an injury to Peter Brezovan. The 6ft 3in stopper spent a loan spell with Chippenham Town during the early stages of the 2009/10 campaign where he gained further experience at first team level.

Lander Gabilondo

Spanish winger Lander Gabilondo signed for Town in August 2011. After arriving on trial soon after the start of the campaign, he impressed the Town management before being awarded a one-year deal. Born in San Sebastian, he came through the youth system at Real Sociedad where he turned professional at the age of 18. He then moved to La Liga rivals Osasuna where he played 159 games in the Spanish 2B division. Described as a mobile, tricky, orthodox winger who likes to take on full-backs - Gabilondo made his first Swindon appearance from the bench against Oxford United.

Vonathan Smith

Swindon Town secured the signing of York City midfielder Jonathan Smith in June 2011. The former Forest Green Rovers man joined the Robins for an undisclosed fee, signing a two-year contract at the County Ground. The 24-year-old was highly-rated during his time with the Minstermen.

Phil Smith

Goalkeeper Phil Smith joined Town in July 2006 from Crawley Town and made his first start for the club in the Carling Cup defeat by Brentford in August 2006. A dependable customer, Smith was made to wait for his chance









which came following an unfortunate injury to Peter Brezovan in the October. The keeper had impressed enough to be handed a new two-year contract by Christmas of his first season and played a definitive part in the promotion campaign, making a string of superb saves to earn his side numerous points. His heroics between the sticks in the 06-07 season didn't go unnoticed by the fans, who named him their Player of the Season in May 2007. Smith had made over 50 appearances for The Robins before the start of the 2008/2009 season. He enjoyed regular spells in the side in September, November and December but after losing his place to Peter Brezovan in the New Year, returned to the starting line-up. The 30-year-old endured a frustrating campaign in 2009/2010 in the face of David Lucas' imperious form but still made some telling contributions to the campaign, not least in the Play-Off Semi-Final second leg against Charlton Athletic at The Valley, in which he made a string of excellent saves and helped Town secure a place at Wembley. He

Alessandro Cibocchi

made 33 starts in season 2010/11.

Paolo Di Canio sealed his tenth signing of the summer with the capture of left-back Cibocchi in July 2011. The 28-year-old joined Town on their pre-season tour of Italy, and did enough to convince Di Canio he was worth a contract. The Italian has signed a two-year-deal at The County Ground, and will compete with Callum Kennedy for a first team place this season. Cibocchi made his first appearance for the Robins in pre-season at Swindon Supermarine.

Liam Ridehalgh

Huddersfield Town left-back Liam Ridehalgh signed for the Robins on a one-month emergency loan on Tuesday 27th September 2011. The defender broke into the Huddersfield Town first team during the 2010/11 season, making his first team debut against Charlton Athletic on 28 August and going on to make 26 appearances for Lee Clark's side. Unfortunately his season was cut short when he sustained a broken foot during a game at Tranmere Rovers in early April, but he signed a new two year contract later that month. 20-year old Ridehalgh first joined the Huddersfield Town Academy at Under 12 level and manager Lee Clark believes the time is right for the player to gain further experience. Ridehalgh made his Swindon debut from the bench in the League 2 clash at Macclesfield Town at the end of September.

Ronan Murray

Swindon Town signed Ipswich Town striker Ronan Murray on loan last month. Murray came through the Academy at Portman Road and has progressed through to the first team squad but is yet to feature for Paul Jewell's side this term. He gained some valuable league experience last season in a loan spell with Torquay United and has been capped up to U19 level with the Republic of Ireland. The frontman came off the bench for the Tractor boys in the Carling Cup defeat at Chelsea in January last year and made a total of 20 appearances during the 2010/11 season.





An honourable mention should also go to the arrival of Aidy Boothroyd, which has given us all some hope that good times are around the corner.


