TONIGHT we return to The County Ground for the first of three home games. Our home form this season has been amazing, but at Hereford United the players showed great character to come away with a victory.

I will start by talking about the game on Saturday, where we had to show our determination to win the game on a difficult afternoon. It wasn't a pretty game on a sticky surface but it was a typical League 2 match in some ways. Lionel Ainsworth...

AINSWORTH was born in Nottingham but made his footballing break through at rival East Midlands side Derby County. He progressed through the youth ranks and impressed enough to earn a professional deal. After his release from the Rams he made a successful switch to Hereford United in the summer of 2007 before stints with Watford and Huddersfield Town. He joined Shrewsbury last summer on a two year deal for an undisclosed fee. He was man of the match in the reverse fixture between Shrewsbury and Swindon back in August.



Mark Wright...

THE Wolverhampton-born midfielder made his breakthrough at Walsall after progressing through the ranks at the Saddlers. He made his Walsall debut in a League Cup game against West Ham and then became a feature in the side spending seven years with the Saddlers and making over 120 appearances.

Jon Taylor...

LIVERPOOL-born Taylor is quick winger who joined the squad from the youth set up at The Greenhouse Meadow. As a youth player he captained the team in his final year and made his first team bow against Chesterfield as a substitute. He went on to score four goals in five games as he broke into the first team. He had an impressive season for a first year professional, finishing with six goals in 22 appearances. He signed a new two-year contract at the end of the 2010/11 season.



Tom Bradshaw...

BRADSHAW is a young striker who started his career with Aberystwyth Town, and signed for the Shrewsbury youth team in the summer of 2009. He performed well in both the youth and reserve teams and made a breakthrough to the first team, when he scored twice as a substitute, on his first team debut against Crewe Alexandra in 2010.

Last time out

SWINDON Town's last meeting with the Shrews at The County Ground came in March 2007 with second half goals from Barry Corr and Christian Roberts enough to seal a 2-1 win. The Robins, then managed by Paul Sturrock, went on to earn automatic promotion from League 2.



Barnet bonus

THE Shrews took all three points from their away encounter at Barnet with an own goal from Clovis Kamdjo and a goal from James Collins enough to seal the win. The victory left Graham Turner's men two points from the top of the League 2 table.

Jervis faces the Blues

FORMER Shrewsbury Town youngster Jake Jervis came off the bench on Sunday for Birmingham City against Chelsea in the Premier League. Jervis, 20, made his 20th appearance of the campaign as a 71st minute substitute in a 1-1 draw against the Londoners. The striker scored three goals in 12 league appearances for Swindon earlier this season on loan.





graham turner

the gaffer

TURNER returned to the club as manager in June 2010, 26 years after leaving the club he guided into the second tier of English football back in the 1970s.

The 62-year old began his playing days as a centreback at Wrexham and Chester before arriving at Gay Meadow for £30,000 in 1973. The former England youth international would go on to spend ten years with Shrewsbury and became player-manager in the 1978/79 season.

In his first season at the helm he won the Third Division championship to take Shrewsbury into the second tier where they would spend the next decade. He also reached the FA Cup quarter-finals twice before ending his playing career in 1983.

After one further season at the club had had two seasons in charge of Aston Villa before being appointed manager of Wolves. Turner spent eight years at Molineux before joining Hereford United in 1995. However The Bulls were in trouble financially and relegation to the Conference followed in 1997. After securing their league status Turner stepped down as manager in April 2009.

He returned to Shrewsbury on a three-year deal as manager with the option of an extra year as Director of Football, and his second spell began with a 3-1 against Bradford City at the Greenhous Meadow.

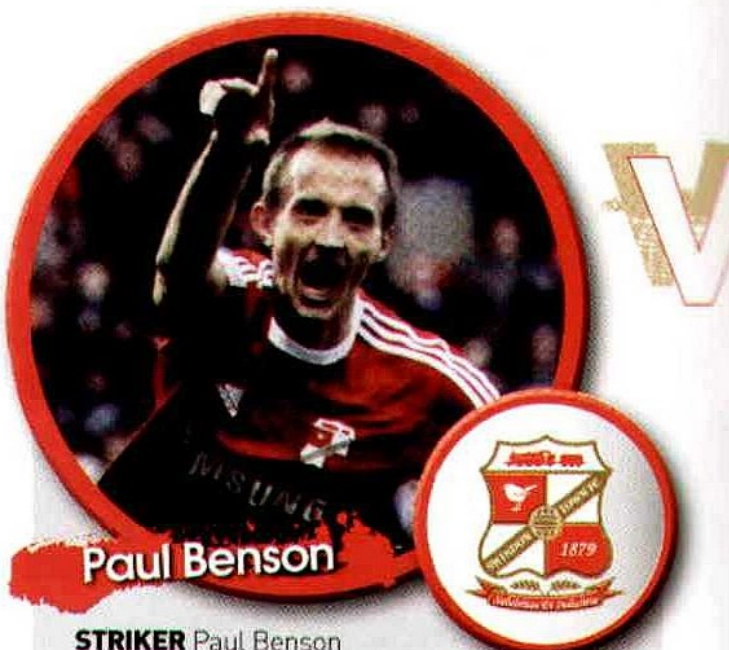

TOWN captain Paul Caddis believes his side have what it takes to seal an automatic promotion place, stating home form will be the key to success.

Caddis scored the opener for the Robins on Saturday at Hereford United and praised the character of his teammates after a tough workout at Edgar Street. He said: "Saturday was a difficult game in tough conditions. "Saturday's goal at Hereford was an example of that but it was great to keep the run going. It was a horrible game but we came through it and showed real battling qualities."

The Swindon story...

I attended Wootton Bassett Comprehensive School and having been spotted by Swindon playing for the County Schools side, I was invited to come along for a trial at The County Ground. John Trollope was the manager at the time and after the trial game against Bristol City I joined the STFC Centre of Excellence. A few years on I had progressed through the system and was offered a two-year youth team scholarship. This was back in the summer of 1993, just as the first team had won promotion to the Premier League, so times were good! One of my jobs as a scholar was to clean the away dressing room each home matchday so it was tremendous to see Premier League players

every game. In 1995 I was offered a two-year professional deal by Steve McMahon, but after being released in 1996 I began on the coaching ladder.

Non-league football

When I left Swindon footballing wise I was keen to continue playing and had a brief spell with Scarborough before joining Gloucester City in the Southern League. After a couple of seasons with Gloucester I joined Bath City where Paul Bodin was manager! I had five good years with them, playing alongside the likes of Paul, Steve White and David Mayhew. After Bath I had an interesting time with Worcester City (alongside Darren Bullock!), Merthyr Tydfil and Forest Green Rovers before a returning to Bath.

Coaching career

Playing part-time football allowed me to continue with my coaching career and I achieved my UEFA 'A' License in 2000. Having joined the Swindon Town Football in the Community scheme in 1996 to jointly manage the project with Clive Maguire, we have both been able to see the fantastic progress that has been made. The coaching programme has gone from a small team running a holiday course with 30 children attending, to today which sees around 2,500 children per week participate in a wide variety of FITC activities.

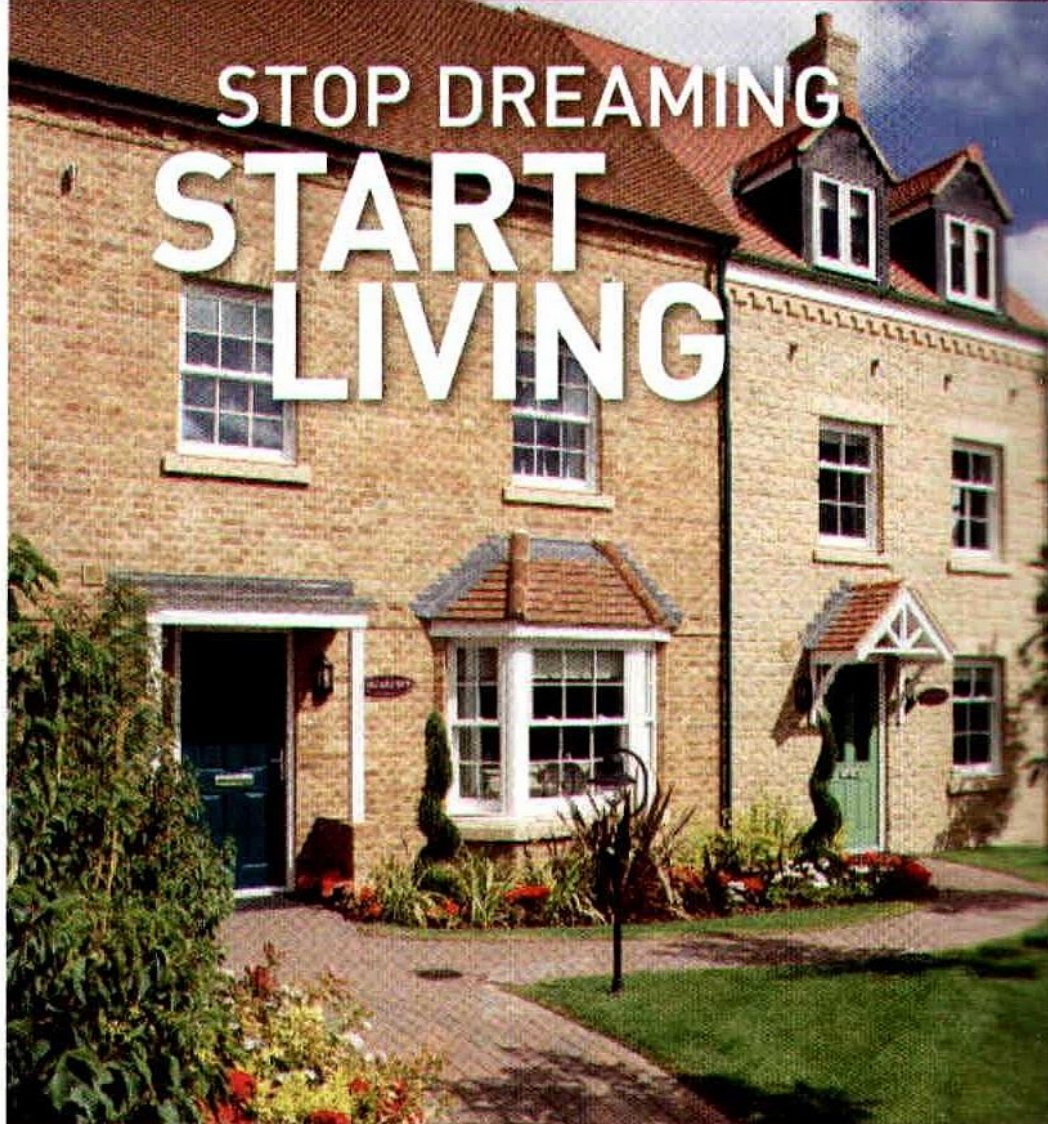

SWINDON look irrepressible at present.

SEVEN straight wins in the league for the first time in 25 years and an uncanny ability to brush aside teams from either end of the league. The victory at Hereford on Saturday was a prime example of why Town look destined for bigger things. It was a real scrap on Saturday - not quite of the same proportions of Derek Chisora and David Haye a few hours later but nevertheless, a whole-hearted display on a pitch that resembled that of a Sunday League surface. Swindon's slick passing style had to be adapted but promotion credentials come to the fore when a team express their capabilities of mixing it up when necessary. Five months ago, Swindon might have crumbled and conceded a late equaliser to Hereford a-kin to the reverse fixture back in October. Yet we're watching a different team now; a settled side that has a winning mentality and plenty of character to go with it.

Tonight is the first, and arguably the toughest, of three consecutive home games for the club. The visits of Shrewsbury, Accrington (Saturday) and Burton Albion (next Tuesday) hand Swindon the opportunity to cement their place in the League 2 automatic promotion spots. I wouldn't be surprised if, by the end of that trio of County Ground encounters, Town are top of the table. There is a chance they could get there tonight if both Southend and Cheltenham slip up but with matches against Aldershot and AFC Wimbledon respectively, you'd expect they'll have to wait a little longer.

It's also a big evening for Wes Foderingham. If you're a regular listener to BBC Wiltshire's sport coverage, I'm sure you'd have heard us discussing the young goalkeeper's impressive record in the sticks. Amazingly, he's yet to concede a goal at the County Ground in the league since joining from Crystal Palace. That's 630 minutes of home football in League Two which, at any level, is a remarkable feat. If he manages a shut-out again this evening, it'll be the first time since the 1986/87 season that the club have kept eight consecutive home clean sheets in the league. To equal that record against the shrewd Shrews would, I'm sure, be even more appealing....

BILLY Bodin's goal last Tuesday was a proud moment for a player desperate to succeed at his boyhood club. With two goals in three starts, he's hoping he can help write a new chapter in the club's history to rival his dad's achievements.

SOMETIMES, you just know. A player can strike a ball and before the net bulges you already know the outcome. Think Joe Cole's howitzer against Sweden in the 2006 World Cup, Danny Inverdale's shin roller against Peterborough or Oliver Risse's piledriver against Crewe on the opening day of the current season.

Billy Bodin's effort certainly falls into this category. No sooner had the leather of his boot struck the ball with the ferocity of a sledgehammer you were on your feet and mouthing the words 'what a strike' before Michel Kuipers had felt the ball whistle past his face.

Pick that one out, son.

For 19-year-old Bodin, who'll turn 20 the day before Town play at Wembley in March, it was a sweet moment. The youngster has always believed in his ability to perform for Swindon Town and he has the club's DNA

flowing through his veins, but it hasn't been an easy road to the first team. A shining star at youth and reserve levels, Town supporters had also always harboured high hopes for a player with the potential to follow in his dad's footsteps and write his own chapter in the club's history. This season could be his chance.

The youngster returned from a loan spell at Torquay United in January more determined than ever to become successful in Swindon. He'd done enough in Devon for Torquay boss Martin Ling to request his services on a more permanent basis, but Di Canio seemed to have seen enough to believe the youngster could play a part in his own promotion project. He was right. Bodin added the icing to the cake by scoring the fourth, a tap-in in the 4-1 win away at Southend United and while he was cup-tied for the

JPT victory against Barnet, he returned with devastating effect on Tuesday night against Crawley with Town's second goal of the night, leaving The County Ground with a ringing endorsement from his manager.

"He has taken his opportunity and he worked so hard," enthused Di Canio at full-time. "I am very pleased for him and it was a magnificent goal. We spoke a few weeks ago about him and he has shown the desire to be here. He showed a lot in training and he has been given his chance."

"I played in a lot of games last season and a few at the beginning of this one and I didn't score, so to get one in such a massive game..." says Bodin, clearly proud and relieved of his latest contribution. "Now I've managed to notch in two games and in both games we've beaten strong and important opposition. They've been big wins for the team and that's been great – it's nice to score but the points are the main thing. The Crawley win was huge, one of the biggest games of the season. We have two games in hand but we just need to keep winning to get to the top of the table."

It's indicative of the Swindon team this season that personal achievements are put to one side. The team comes first, always. Bodin is no different. Such has been the long wait to make a mark on this Swindon team he would have been forgiven for revelling in his night of glory. Not so. "It was good to get a goal but even better to get the three points."

When asked if he'd ever



scored one like that before, a wry smile falls across his face. Yet it must have been good, for before an immaculate-looking Bodin was allowed to leave the dressing room area to go home he was greeted by a proud dad with a congratulatory high five.

"Cads threw it across my body and the only option really was to shoot," he says modestly. "Thankfully it went in! I haven't scored one like that in a while... not since I was younger! I'll definitely be going home and recording it to watch again. As soon as I hit it I thought it was in and I was already off celebrating when it hit the net."

Bodin's goal was reward for a tough evening in which he came up against two of the most physical defenders in League Two.

got," he explains. "We watched videos to see their weaknesses at the back and we knew if we got the ball behind them on the floor we'd get chances. Thankfully our lads didn't kill me too much by putting the ball in the air! When you see the size of the centre halves you prepare yourself for a tough game and sometimes in League Two it can be a battle, but we dealt with it. I had good delivery down the sides and it paid off.

"We knew what was coming all over the pitch but the back four and midfield stayed strong early on and coped with them. We knew they'd be quite a strong and direct team, so I thought we dealt with it quite well."

Quite well? That's an understatement. Few teams will put six past Crawley with no return. More importantly, it's another game ticked off with three points on the board and all at the expense of a promotion rival.

"The main aim is to get promoted into League One," he explains. "That's where we should be. Last season I was part of a side that got relegated, which wasn't nice. But now I think we can really push on. Everyone is buzzing here at the moment, which compared to the doom and gloom last season is a welcome change. The manager is buzzing and the players are all buzzing, so hopefully we can finish the job."

It's all a far cry from the night Bodin played his last game in Swindon colours before heading down the M5 to Torquay. Bodin had started the first match of the season against Crewe and was involved again away at Dagenham and Redbridge,

when Swindon were abject at best. Bodin started in attack alongside Raffaele De Vita, a partnership that wouldn't be seen again.

"It was difficult at the start of the season, being involved and playing and then going out on loan," he explains. Ironically his next opponents were Dagenham again, this time in the yellow of Torquay. Two weeks later he got his first goal of the season, against Cheltenham, his first of five under Ling.

"Playing as many games as I did at Torquay was nice but I would have rather it had been here," he says. "The main thing is to get experience. I played almost 20 games and so I learned a lot while I was there. It helped me. Playing every week gets you fitter and I just want to do that here now. My aim at the start of the season was to play 30 games this season. I'm nearly there already and to be honest I didn't expect to be starting games here, so it's great. I actually thought at the start of my loan period at Torquay that maybe my chance at Swindon had gone. I saw the club bringing in players and I thought I might be shipped out in January, but thankfully I've come back and proved I can do something – hopefully I can keep this run going. I just want to keep scoring as many goals as I can."

Bodin certainly seems to have returned a better player. He's always had ability, of course, but he seems fitter, stronger and – if possible – more determined. He also comes armed with invaluable inside knowledge about a side now among Town's promotion rivals.

"Torquay haven't got a big

squad but they're a good passing team," he says.

"They're similar to us in that respect and they got another three points on Tuesday night, so they're really flying. I think they'll be on our toes at the end of the season but all we need to concentrate on is winning our own games."

Bodin now feels part of a Swindon squad he believes is the best in the division and one of the recent successes is his burgeoning partnership with Paul Benson. The duo have clearly clicked and at the final whistle Benson, who helped himself to Swindon's third, made a point of congratulating his partner in crime before

leaving the pitch.

"Playing with Paul has been great," admits Bodin. "His link up and hold up play has been fantastic, so playing with him has been good for me. For both of us, Matt Ritchie and Luke Rooney are great and talented players and as soon as they get the ball you know they're going to be a threat. That makes it easier for us in attack."

The fact that Bodin has come into the side at all shows not only that his manager has faith in him, but that Di Canio is utilising every member of his playing squad. Alan Connell has also been in fine form and Bodin has done well to work his way back into contention. The competition for places is now red hot.

"We've got a big squad and sometimes you need a rest. I just need to keep working hard and hopefully I'll get games. If I can keep scoring in training hopefully I'll get my chance. I've been working hard in the sessions and the manager has noticed, so I just need to keep doing that."

Hard work and head down is an attitude that will go a long way under Di Canio. One thing's for sure, no matter how many goals Bodin scores, or the quality of his strikes, he won't be letting his recent goalscoring form go to his head.

"The manager won't let any of us take our feet off the gas, so hopefully we'll just keep pushing on. He says every game is the biggest of the season, that's how we have to look at it."

And they don't come much bigger than tonight's. Eyes down once again...

AFTER easing to a 3-0 victory at Gay Meadow a fortnight earlier, Town made just one change for this Second Round second leg tie in the Littlewoods Cup. Alan McLoughlin was left on the bench and Steve White came in to partner Duncan Shearer up.

The first leg had been sewn up before half-time, McLoughlin scoring twice in eight minutes following a 12th minute opener from Duncan Shearer.

There was no further scoring before the break in the second game, although there was no shortage of action. Town had at least a dozen attempts on goal, while the visitors could not manage to direct a single effort

on target.

But on the hour White put Swindon four goals up on aggregate - hitting a low right-foot drive from ten yards after taking substitute McLoughlin's pass. And White added another 15 minutes later when he latched on to a long clearance from Fraser Digby and shrugged off

David Moyes' challenge to ram the ball home.

Willie Naughton grabbed a consolation from the spot after Colin Calderwood's

push on substitute Carl Griffiths. But Town had the last word six minutes from time.

A shot from Ross MacLaren rebounded off the crossbar for Shearer to be given the easiest of finishes, tapping the ball over the line to take the final aggregate score to 6-1 and to earn his side a Third Round home tie with Bolton.

This was a good opportunity to spend two hours with our talented girls in preparation for our next game, which is away against Tottenham Hotspur on Friday 13th April.

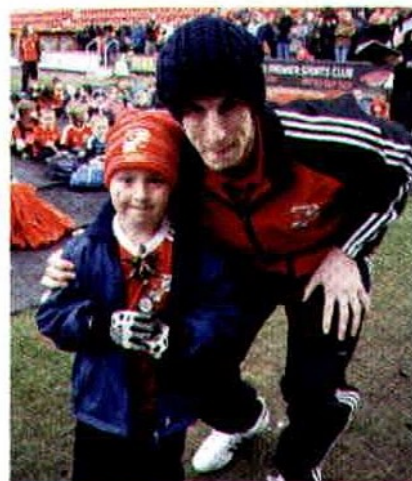
The coaches have spent time putting the girls through their paces whilst planning and assessing the girls ahead of the 2012/13 season.

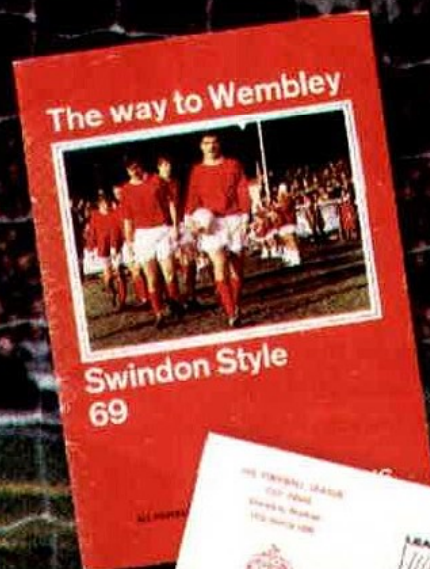
SWINDON born and bred, Roger Smart made over 400 appearances for Town but none will be remembered more warmly than that of 15th March 1969 when he netted the opening goal in the League Cup final against Arsenal.

NOT that Smart was a stranger to finding the net on important occasions. Back in the final home match of 1962/63 he produced the 88th minute goal against Shrewsbury that clinched Town promotion to Division Two for the first time ever.

An established first teamer since 1963/64, 'Smartie' took to the Wembley turf with a reputation as a hard working and adaptable inside forward, where his work rate allowed Don Rogers the luxury of time and space that his skills thrived upon.

As the game got underway Town goalkeeper Peter Downsborough turned a Jon Sammels shot from the edge of the box around the post, but Smart was almost on hand to tuck home a Bob Wilson fumble at the other end.

Then it was Smart again who released Rogers through the centre of the park, who saw his one-on-one blocked by Wilson's legs with the goal almost at his mercy.

But then came Smart's moment of history. Town played a ball towards the Arsenal right side of defence and Ian Ure looked to shepherd the ball back to his keeper. But Wilson, rather than picking up the ball in these pre-backpass rule days, panicked and stuck out a leg to clear. Peter Noble stole the ball and turned it towards the Arsenal goal with Wilson stranded ten yards from goal.

Peter Simpson tried desperately to close down the marauding Smart but struck his clearance at the oncoming Town man. Smart swept the ball passed him and between Wilson and Ure, as the Gunners' men tried in vain to recover their positions, crashing the ball emphatically into the net from the goal line.

Smart then ran delightedly back towards the half-way line as Wilson stamped the ground dejectedly.

There could be little doubt that Arsenal had been the architects of their own downfall, and the Gunners pressed for an equaliser throughout the second half.

With the game approaching full time and with Downsborough performing heroics to maintain Town's lead, Bobby Gould chased down a long ball and somehow turned it past the Town custodian to force extra-time.

Despite Smart seeing a headed effort turned onto the post by Wilson, the added thirty minutes were to belong to another Town Wembley goal-scoring Legend.

But without Smart's scrambled effort 34 minutes in, Gould's strike would have seen Arsenal climb the steps to take the League Cup trophy.

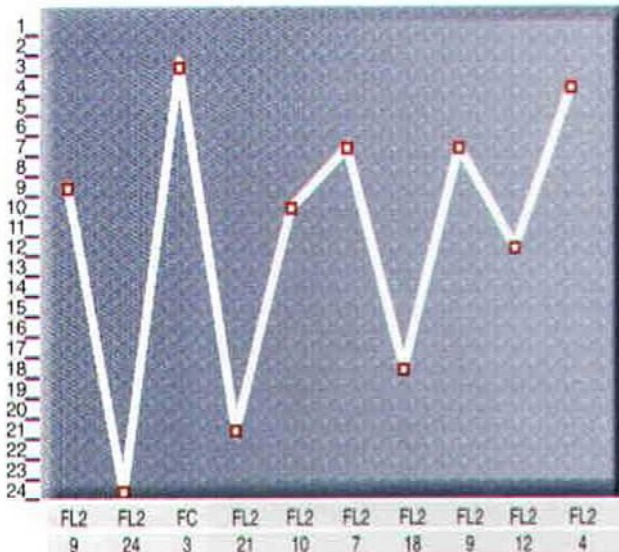

The Cayman Islands Government were extremely welcoming to the club and it is hoped that a long-term relationship will be established.



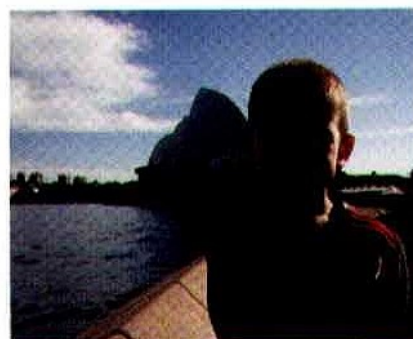

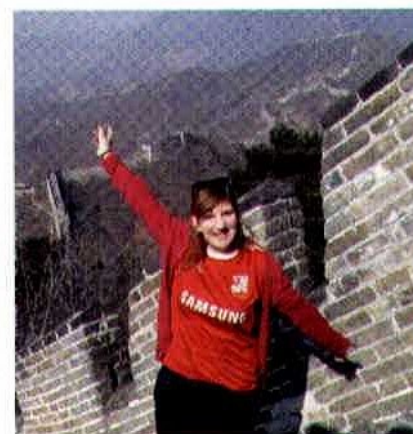

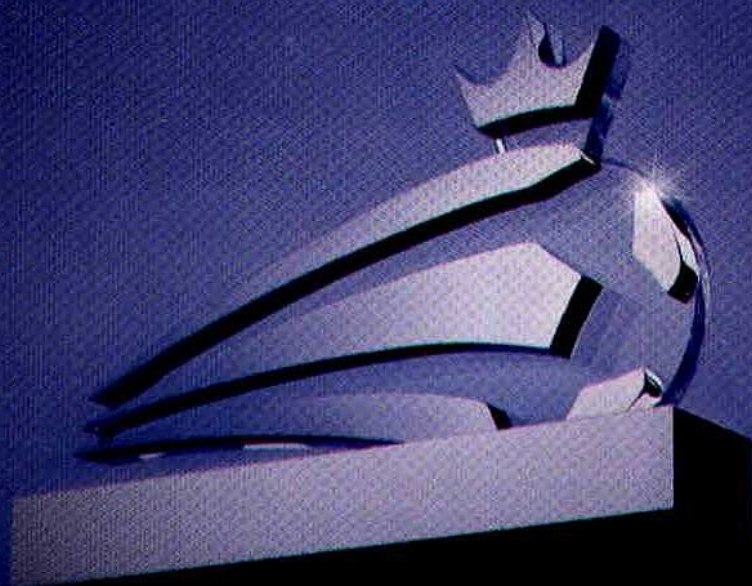
