WINNING the title is now our target. We have secured promotion but we want to be called champions and we must focus for the next two games.

TODAY will be a difficult game. The lads have done a great job this season but the last few weeks have been difficult. I told the players a few weeks ago not to switch off but unfortunately it happened. They realise they can do better and they know they have the capability to win the next two games.

Winning the League Two title in front of our own fans would be fantastic. It is a chance to have a fantastic celebration as champions. Four teams in this league will be promoted at the end of the season, but only one will be at the top. At the start of the season we set out to make The County Ground a fortress and we have done that. I have extra motivation for this game, not just for the records. Myself and the players want to have the opportunity to celebrate in front of a packed County Ground crowd.

Defensively we have conceded too many goals over the last two games. At Aldershot and Gillingham we weren't effective and the results were not good. There have been changes for the last two games and it is

important to keep the discipline within the side. In terms of injuries, Paul Benson missed the Gillingham game with a hamstring injury but he should be okay to join the squad again today.

Today is the final home game of the season and with the summer just around the corner, planning has already started for the

Their players will be going out to impress, perhaps to earn a new contract and to show what they can do individually and as a squad of players. This means we have to be careful. Sam Morsy...

AFTER his release by Wolves in 2008, Morsy joined the Port Vale youth set-up. He did well at that level and was rewarded with his first professional contract in the 2010 close season. He became a regular in the side in early 2011 under former manager Jim Gannon and scored his first goal for the club against Stevenage. The 20-year old has now played 28 times for the club this season.



Clayton McDonald...

THE defender joined the Vale Park ranks after being released by League One side Walsall in the summer of 2010. He began his career at Manchester City but failed to make an appearance for the club, but also spent loan spells with Macclesfield Town and Chesterfield.

Rob Taylor...

THE left-sided midfielder signed from Nuneaton Borough in the summer of 2008. He scored on his debut at Luton and settled down to be a tricky player with a sharp turn of pace. His best season to date was the 2009/10 campaign which saw him notch ten goals, one of which won the club's goal of the season award at Hereford United. He has also played for Solihull Moors and Redditch United and has 34 appearances to his name this term.



Ben Williamson...

THE striker signed on a year-long loan from Hyde United, having graduated from the Glenn Hoddle Academy in Spain. With an eye for goal, he started out with Worthing before heading to Spain. Eight goals in 12 games for Jerez Industrial then led to a six month loan at Bournemouth but injury restricted him to just five substitute appearances.

Six success

SWINDON Town's last home game against Port Vale resulted in a 6-0 victory for the Robins. The League One fixture took place on Saturday 19th April 2008 with goals from Lee Peacock, Craig Easton, Jack Smith, Michael Timlin, Anthony McNamee and youngster Ben Joyce. The Vale 'keeper that day - Chris Martin - looks set to line-up at The County Ground again this afternoon.



Goal Czech

STRIKER Lukas Magera scored his first and only Town goal for the Robins in the reverse fixture with Port Vale back in October. The 29-year old is currently on loan with Czech side FC Banik Ostrava.



Rovers and out

PORT Vale arrive in Wiltshire on the back of a 1-0 home win over Bristol Rovers last weekend, secured thanks to a 16th goal of the season from striker Marc Richards. Had it not been for administration and a ten-point penalty, Micky Adams and his side could be coming to The County Ground on the verge of the play-off places.





micky adams

the gaffer

MICKY Adams joined Port Vale in the summer of 2009 as Vale broke from the recent tradition of promoting from within the club.

Adams started out with his home town club, Sheffield United, but was released as a youngster and made 103 appearances for Gillingham, before moving to Coventry City; where he made over 100 appearances before moving on to join Leeds United.

In March 1989 he went on to join Southampton, playing for the Saints in the inaugural season of the Premier League, but eventually his thoughts turned to management.

Adams took over from Ian Branfoot as manager of Fulham in March 1996, before spells with Swansea and Brentford. He then joined Brighton, where he really made his mark. His side won promotion as champions in his second season. He then went on to join Dave Bassett as Assistant Manager of Leicester City and before long he was to take over as manager, with Bassett becoming Director of Football.

Despite Leicester going into receivership, he managed to steer them to promotion to the Premiership at the first attempt, before eventually giving up the hot seat in October 2004.

He was appointed Coventry City boss in January 2005, where he spent two seasons, and from there he had a short spell as assistant boss at Colchester United and a brief return to Brighton, before being appointed Vale boss in July 2009.

He guided Vale to the top of League Two, but decided to leave to join Sheffield United, in December 2010, with Vale in second spot, but returned to Vale in the summer of 2011.

PROMOTION without the league title from here would be rather disappointing....

SUCH has been Swindon's dominance since October that they fully deserve to lift the League 2 trophy. There is something rather apt about how these past few weeks have panned out at the County Ground. Performances haven't been fantastic but they always say that a sign of a good team is one that can win even when playing below-par.

Swindon could have secured promotion on Saturday 14th March against Plymouth but, following the sad passing of Paolo Di Canio's mother, it wouldn't have been right to have celebrated such an occasion without him or indeed while he had far more important matters on his mind. Likewise, the title could have been secured last weekend but perhaps the footballing gods wanted the whole event to be played out at The County Ground? Who knows but whatever the outcome today, Swindon's players and staff deserve to celebrate at the end of the season because the reversal in early season form has been remarkable.

I'm sure everyone has their own opinion on the following subject but I felt it appropriate to reflect on my favourite five games from across the season whilst covering



the club for BBC Wiltshire:

5) Crawley Town 0-3 Swindon Town (Tuesday 13th September 2011) – After a tricky start to the season, this was the first time we really saw Town assert their dominance on a promotion rival. Many would have taken a draw that night but it was an astute performance and one made sweeter following the remarks from the then Crawley manager Steve Evans before the match.

4) Swindon Town 4-1 Huddersfield (Saturday 12th November 2011) – Given Huddersfield's remarkable unbeaten run at the time, this was a monumental FA Cup victory. It was probably the hardest 1st round draw Town could have got at the time but they brushed their League One

opponents aside with a classy second-half display.

3) Swindon Town 2-1 Wigan Athletic (Saturday 7th January 2012) – It's not often that you'll see a League Two side fancied by the bookies to overturn a Premier League team but that was the case in this one. I saw no way back for Town when they fell behind in the first-half yet the team believed an upset was on the cards and so it proved.

2) Northampton 1-2 Swindon Town (Saturday 31st December 2011) – This was far from a vintage performance but I've selected it purely because I think it proved to be a huge turning point in the club's season. A last-minute goal from Alan McCormack and 'that' celebration from manager Paolo Di Canio will live long in the memory.

1) Southend 1-4 Swindon Town (Tuesday 31st January 2012) – Without doubt, this was the best I've seen Swindon play across the season. The first-half in particular was a joy to behold and the manner in which a fellow title-chaser was disposed of was clinical. It was the first night when I truly knew that Swindon were destined to win the league.

Here's to another memorable game at the County Ground...

TOWN interim chairman will pause to celebrate if we finish the job today, but then it's eyes down for 2012/13 with the Championship in our sights...

How does it feel to finally be promoted?

I feel relieved. It feels like we've limped over the line a little bit at the end, but promotion is measured over 46 games in a season and the table doesn't lie. I'm absolutely delighted.

How did you celebrate last Saturday night when promotion was assured?

I was conscious not to celebrate too much. I had a nice glass of wine, but I'll wait until Saturday night when [hopefully] we win the league to celebrate properly, with our fans and in our own stadium.

You must feel very proud of what the club has achieved this season?

Absolutely. You only have to look at how we all felt at the end of last season. There was a low feeling after relegation, it was depressing. We needed a catalyst, a change and now

we're on an upwards curve. The change in 12 months is remarkable, but football can do that.

What would it mean to actually win the title this Saturday?

Promotion is one thing, winning the league is another. To win the league proves you're the best team over 46 games, just like relegation last year confirmed that we deserved to go down after 46 games. There were no hard luck stories – we deserved to go down. So now we focus on winning against Port Vale, because winning the league would be the ultimate achievement.

So many highs this season... what were your favourites?

I don't think you can underestimate the importance of the Rotherham game earlier in the season. We were on a run of bad results and it followed the Leon Clarke incident... so

that win against Rotherham was a real watershed moment. That was the game when the team really pulled together. Seeing the players celebrate with the manager, Alan Connell's two goals - it was a great moment.

I would also say the two FA Cup wins against Huddersfield and Wigan should be up there. They were two special games that allowed Paolo to pit his football philosophies and values against serious opposition. I'll always remember the way we played good football as a team in those games.

At the beginning of the season you said Paolo's enthusiasm would be infectious. Did you have any idea just what impact he would have?

You only have to see how much he is still revered by West Ham fans and the way they still sing his name to see that he leaves an indelible imprint. And yes, we're aware that their fans are singing his name! He has an enthusiasm that just rubs off on everyone around him. Just look at when we lost at Oxford. How many managers would have done what he did at the end of the game, to go to the fans and lift them in the way that he did to the extent that they went home feeling positive after a disappointing defeat. He knows how to work the crowd, it's an ability he has. He wears his heart on his sleeve, always has and always will. But he's not just improved this football club, he's lifted the whole town.

You mention the West Ham fans singing Di Canio's name... are you prepared for a couple of weeks of speculation?

I think it's inevitable if

West Ham don't go up either automatically or through the play-offs. West Ham have said they're sticking to their plan and have given Sam Allardyce a vote of confidence. The sooner we get Paolo's contract put to bed the quicker we can move on and show how committed he is to this project.

It's been a proper rollercoaster season. As well as the highs there have been fallouts, a huge turnaround of players, an excitable manager, derby defeats... what were the most challenging elements?

The start was tough. Losing four of the first five games... all those who suggested Paolo's appointment was a gamble were preparing for the end. Then the Leon Clarke incident happened! Yet rather than culminate in the end, it had the opposite effect. Everything since then has been incredible.

We get to see Paolo on the side of the pitch, but can you give us an insight into what he's like as a person off it?

The person you see on the sidelines and in press interviews is the real Paolo Di Canio. Sometimes the odd sentence is taken out of context and made into something more than it is, so to understand Paolo you have to listen to his interviews in their entirety. What he says is what he believes and on the whole he's proved to be right on many occasions. He has made mistakes but he has held his hands up. The continued movement up the league table since the beginning of the season is testament to his standards. And the one thing I have learned is that it has been

done without any complacency. The next game is always the toughest and his preparation for that next game has always been second to none.

How quickly will you and Paolo begin to look at the current playing squad and potential targets for next season?

Work has already started in earnest and targets have been identified. Paolo knows where he wants to strengthen the squad and he has targeted players for those areas. We will pursue those so that the squad is in better shape for pre-season. In that respect, we have learned a lot from last summer.

How would you assess the club's spending this year in comparison to the budget at the beginning of the season? Has the club spent more than expected?

I think we'll be bang on budget. We have benefited from good attendances this year. Factor in the cup runs and there has been an increase to the turnover and money coming in, which has balanced the higher costs with regards to the playing staff. The playing budget has been high and some of the signings made earlier in the season didn't work, but this summer we will be better for that experience, we will be more prudent. There will be no rushed signings, the whole experience will be better.

What are your expectations for the 2012/13 campaign?

Promotion is absolutely realistic. We have momentum and we are halfway towards our target, which is to reach the

Championship. You only have to look at what Stevenage have achieved on a small budget to see what can be done and we have scope to go again. Paolo believes absolutely in the prospect of promotion and we continue to reassure him that we match that ambition.

Are you planning on becoming full-time chairman this summer at the AGM?

When the AGM comes round, if the Board decides that they still want me then I'll stay. I have enjoyed this season.

You've mentioned work will begin on the Town End this time next year, can you elaborate?

Our success on the pitch and subsequent return to League One has brought the stadium redevelopment back into focus. Nick Watkins has done a lot of good work on this, particularly with the Council and he has enjoyed a series of successful meetings. It is not unrealistic to think that work can begin on the Town End next year, the Town End being the area of the stadium we hope to start with. It's exciting and helps increase the feel good factor around the club.

Is there a similar design/stand that you can share with us to give us some idea of what the club is thinking?

It won't be a copycat of another stadium anywhere else. We've looked at clubs such as Derby and Preston but you have to remember we're working stand by stand here. It will have an individual look. We're really pleased with the plans and we think fans will be as well.

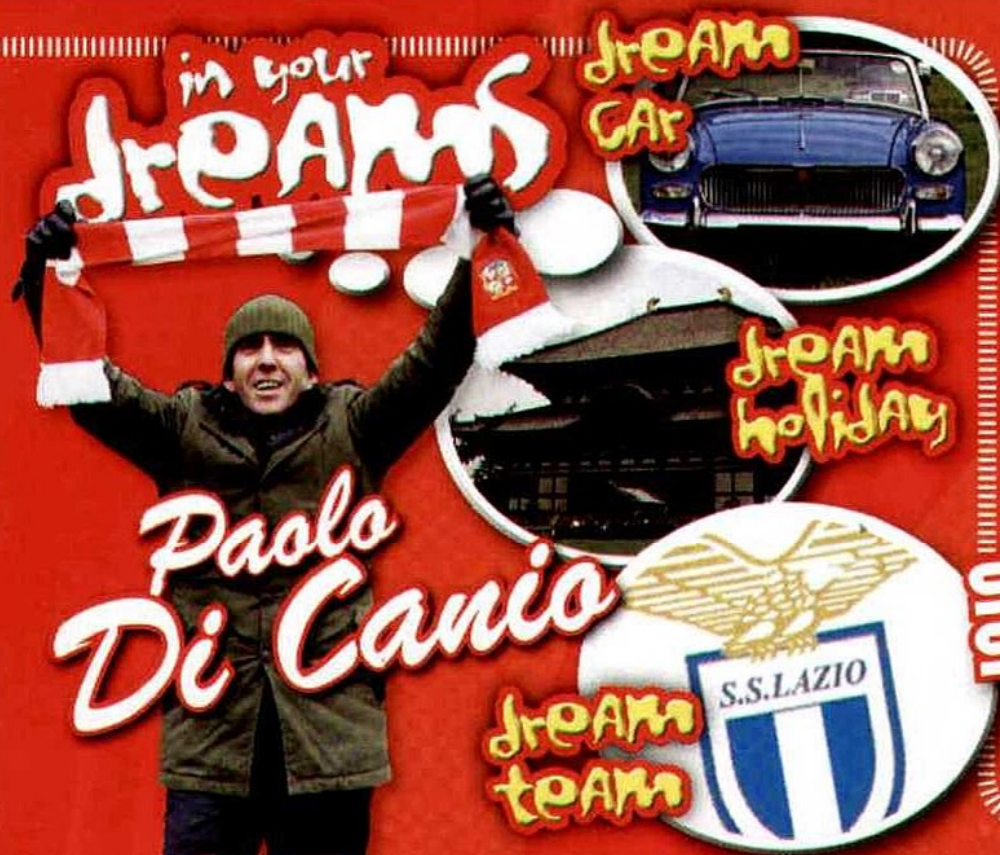

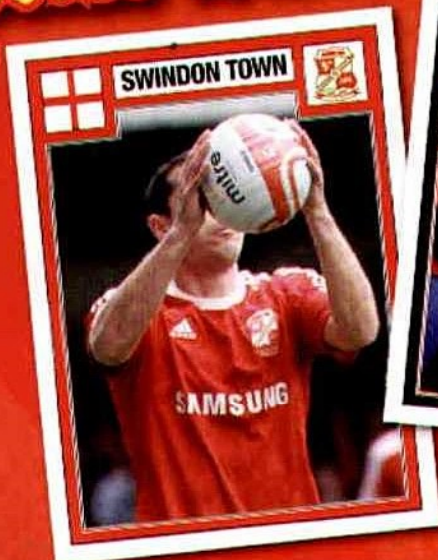

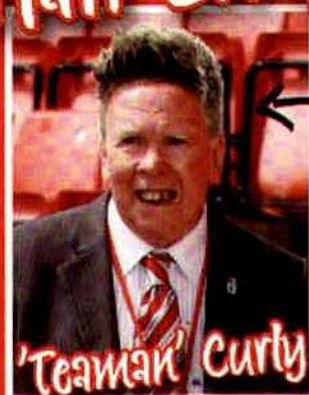

the season remembered

Awards - The Robins are hoping to lift the ultimate award today, of course, but the trophy cabinet has already been replenished. Matt Ritchie won the FL Player of the Year Award - the club also winning Best Matchday Programme and Family Club of the Year - before he was later inducted into the PFA team of the season alongside wingman Paul Caddis. The club has also won the Ronnie Radford Award having been voted for the greatest giant-killer for the 2-1 win against Wigan Athletic in January (see G).

Bradford City - The County Ground enjoyed an average crowd of 8,208, peaking at 12,113 (against Oxford) prior to today's visit of Port Vale. Only Bradford averaged more (10,441). In total, 180,580 fans have seen the Reds in action in SN1.

Charity - Wiltshire Air Ambulance have had a season-long affiliation with the club and the relationship will see a Charity Match staged at The CG on Wednesday 2 May with a Paolo Di Canio XI facing a star-studded WAA team. See page 39 for more information.

Did it my Wray! - It's not very often Swindon Town trend on Twitter, but following the appointment of Di Canio as Swindon manager that's exactly what happened. The appointment brought unprecedented media attention. No-one knew what to expect. Now, with promotion assured and one of the most entertaining seasons in living memory almost behind us, the chairman surely deserves a pat on the back.

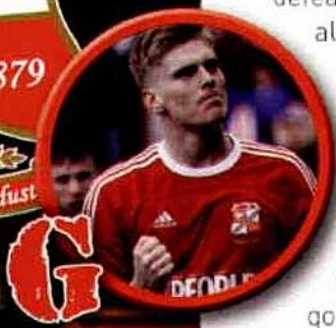
England's no.1! - Look up the word 'bargain' in the dictionary and you'll see a picture of Wes Foderingham, the former Crystal Palace stopper proving to be one of the buys of the campaign. He kept nine clean sheets in 15 games during an initial loan spell - six in a row at home - before signing a permanent deal. A run of eight consecutive shut outs followed in 2012, beating Peter Downsbrough's record from 1968/69. He has 21 shut outs in all.

Fortress - When Di Canio announced he wanted to turn The County Ground into a fortress, he wasn't joking. Should Town avoid defeat this afternoon they will have lost only one game at home all season. The less said about the offending match the better...



Giantkillers - "I was lucky to experience a magic moment as a player and I would love to do the same as a manager," said the boss before the visit of Premiership strugglers Wigan in January. Alan Connell's equaliser set up a blistering second half culminating in Paul Benson's first goal for the club, a deflection off his leg from a Matt Ritchie shot. "It was definitely the luckiest goal I've ever scored!" said the striker.

High-interest loans - Paolo Di Canio utilised the loan market with varying degrees of success. Goals from Jake Jervis and Ronan Murray helped us negotiate key JPT games while Liam Ridehalgh shone before Jay McEveley added further experience to the left full-back position. In front of him, Lee Holmes has impressed since seeing sense and swapping Oxford for Swindon. John Bostock performed well last week, while Daniel Boateng, Cristian Montano and Ahmed Abdulla impressed in parts. In the other direction, Billy Bodin impressed at both Torquay and Crewe, Lukas Magera returned to Banek Ostrava while Mehdi Kerrouche temporarily joined Oxford.



Ins and outs - Michael Rose was shown the exit door and others quickly followed. David Prutton, Vincent Pericard, Jakub Jesionkowski, Scott Cuthbert, Alan Sheehan, JP McGovern and Lescinel Jean-Francois all departed before Jonathan Douglas ended a long-running 'will he, won't he' saga by joining Brentford. Kevin Amankwaah, Ibrahim Atiku, Matt Clark, Leon Clarke, Will Evans, Elliot Benyon, Michael Timlin, Alberto Comazzi and Jordan Pavett all departed as the season developed. Twenty players moved in the other direction, starting with Joe Devera in May and finishing with Chris Smith in February. Soon, the fun starts all over again!



Johnstone Paint Trophy - Wembley is a distant memory, sadly, but the excitement leading up to the final against Chesterfield will live long in the memory. More than 30,000 Town fans made the journey to North London. Next time it'll be third time lucky under the arch!



Kerching! - As chairman Wray explains elsewhere in the programme, the cost of assembling this season's playing squad exceeded expectations. However, that was counterbalanced by double-pronged success in the cup competitions. Reaching the FA Cup fourth round via a full house against Wigan and going all the way to Wembley in the JPT have all boosted the coffers.

Late show - The pre-season fitness regime was described by some as brutal while others fell by the wayside as they struggled to keep up. Yet all that extra running paid off as Town went through a spell of winning games late on. Kerrouche bagged two late on away at Crawley while other late goals ensured victories against Rotherham [h], Plymouth [a], Gillingham [h] and Northampton [a].

Minute's silence - Sadly, Di Canio lost both his parents this season. Yet the minute's silence held at Aldershot's EBB stadium showed a huge bond between the Italian and the supporters. "I would like to say a big thank you to not only the fans, but to the people of Swindon," he said. "To see all the Swindon Town scarves at Aldershot was fantastic, and the only two colours in the sky were red and white."

Norcia - Project Paolo began in the Perugian town of Norcia and consisted of running, lots and lots of running. Town later beat a local team of amateurs 11-0, with Matt Ritchie, Raffaele De Vita and Jonathan Smith scoring two each and Billy Bodin, Simon Ferry, Joe Devera, Kevin Amankwaah and Callum Kennedy all finding the net.

Oxford - Oxford completed a rare double over us, but Town fans will look back on the subplots with fonder memories. Di Canio, of course, bought into the rivalry. He celebrated Town's goal in the home defeat with a touchline sprint. Afterwards, he suggested Swindon should have won 8-1 and despite defeat at the Kassam he remained defiant. At the final whistle, he pointed to the sky to suggest Town going up and then to the floor, to suggest Oxford would stay down. Then there was the James Constable transfer saga, Paolo lodging a bid in January.

Pick that one out! - Swindon have scored some remarkable goals this season. You'll decide your own favourites, but Matt Ritchie's pile-driver against Gillingham in October will take some beating. "It was a really crucial goal for us," he said.

Quiet - Hats off to the 38 hardy souls who watched Macclesfield Town in action at the County Ground on a cold Saturday in January. Did they all come in the same coach?

Riot - Remember the riots? They started in London and filtered through the country, meaning Town's Carling Cup first round tie against Bristol City scheduled for August 9 was postponed until August 24. Swindon later won 1-0, Di Canio celebrated at full-time and the post-match celebrations were born.

Steve Evans - "It's a massive week for us when the Di Canio Circus rolls into town," said Crawley manager Evans ahead of Town's visit to Broadfield in September. "People like him make me laugh," said Di Canio, but his players provided the greatest response by winning 3-0. Twice.

Turning point - Three wins and three draws preceded the New Year's Eve visit to Northampton, where Alan McCormack's late winner not only ensured a vital win - and a pitch invasion from the manager - but kick-started a run of ten consecutive wins. "It was a very special moment," admitted Di Canio afterwards.

Under the lights - There was a stage when Tuesday nights equalled football at The County Ground. Town's JPT and FA Cup exploits - plus the weather - meant that from January 10 the Reds played on eight Tuesdays before the end of March. "It was hard on the old legs!" joked Paul Benson.

Victory - 28 wins out of 44. Not bad, huh? To put that into perspective, Town overtook last season's point's haul of 41 by January 2.

Woof! - Defeat at Macclesfield prompted the boss to go barking mad. "For some players if he has a Chihuahua character then I can't make a Chihuahua into a Rottweiler," he said. "I can make a shy Chihuahua become a proud Chihuahua but it remains a Chihuahua. I can't make a Chihuahua into a Rottweiler so a few of my players at this moment are Chihuahuas away from home."

X-rated - There were touchline bans for the boss - "I give them permission to ban me for the rest of the season. We will win the league anyway" - while his contretemps with Leon Clarke made national news. On the field, Alan McCormack picked up ten bookings, Oliver Risser saw red at Northampton while trialist Leon Knight showed his frustration before a ball had even been kicked after failing to land a contract.

Youth - Miles Storey and Leigh Bedwell were handed professional contracts a week ago that will see them train with the first team in 2012/13. Congrats fellas, now get your heads down!

Zoo - Di Canio began the season discussing a team of uncaged lions. The dog references followed (see W) before, in January, Aden Flint was forced to tackle a rogue squirrel who attempted to halt proceedings during the 2-0 home win against AFC Wimbledon.

- classic encounters - hay hits a treble

SCOTTISH frontman Chris Hay hit the headlines by hitting a hat-trick for the Robins as they put four goals past visitors Port Vale at The County Ground back in October 1997 in front of 8,048...



Swindon Town 4 Port Vale 2

4th October 1997

AFTER a six-goal mauling at Maine Road seven days earlier, it was no surprise that manager Steve McMahon made five changes for the visit of Vale, although two were enforced through illness.

One was the introduction of Craig Taylor - younger brother of Shaun - for his senior debut. And the former Dorchester man did not disappoint, firing home a 35-yarder midway through the second half.

But the man-of-the-match accolade went to Scottish striker

Chris Hay, who hit a hat-trick but could easily have had five. His first, five minutes after the break, cancelled out a 37th minute effort from Dean Glover that had Fraser Digby beaten from 30 yards.

Three minutes later, Hay headed narrowly over and missed another chance from close in shortly after Taylor's long-range strike. But the ex-Celtic man struck twice in the last nine minutes.

Mark Walters provided the pass for the first, when Hay went round keeper Paul Musselwhite to net from a narrow angle. And the hat-trick was completed when he collected a Digby clearance before again rounding the keeper.

Martin Foyle netted a consolation for the visitors a minute later, but Town's victory went some way towards eradicating the debacle in Manchester.

Despite this, the board decided to continue with the policy of picking the team in consultation with the trainers, rather than appointing a manager to have full control of team affairs.

STEVE Foley's second-half equaliser against Middlesbrough at the County Ground proves to be enough



to confirm a place in the Division Two play-offs thanks to results elsewhere. It means they can relax briefly ahead of the final league game at Stoke City and that for the third time in four seasons, Swindon will be part of the post-season games to determine promotion.

Most memorable match

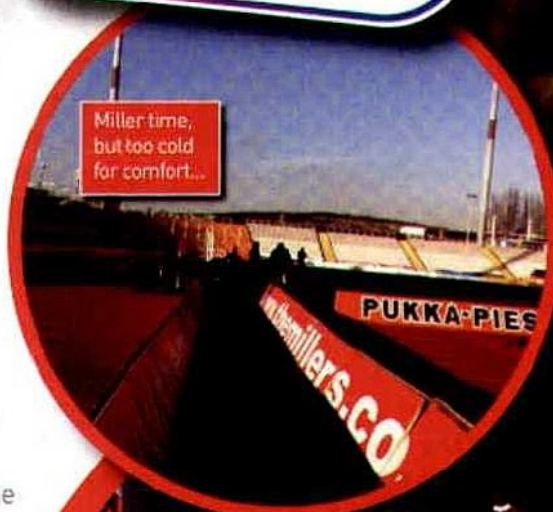
THE season has been full of great games and it's hard to narrow it down to just one. Bristol City early on in the Carling Cup was fantastic – winning at Ashton Gate and playing so well put a marker down for the season really. Subsequent FA Cup victories against Huddersfield Town and Wigan Athletic in the FA Cup also stand out. The club also won The Ronnie Radford Award for the FA Cup run which was another notable achievement. What happened at Sixfields at the end of December against Northampton is probably the moment of the season though. It was all slightly bonkers, but it's what we've become used to this season at Swindon Town!

Best and worst press box

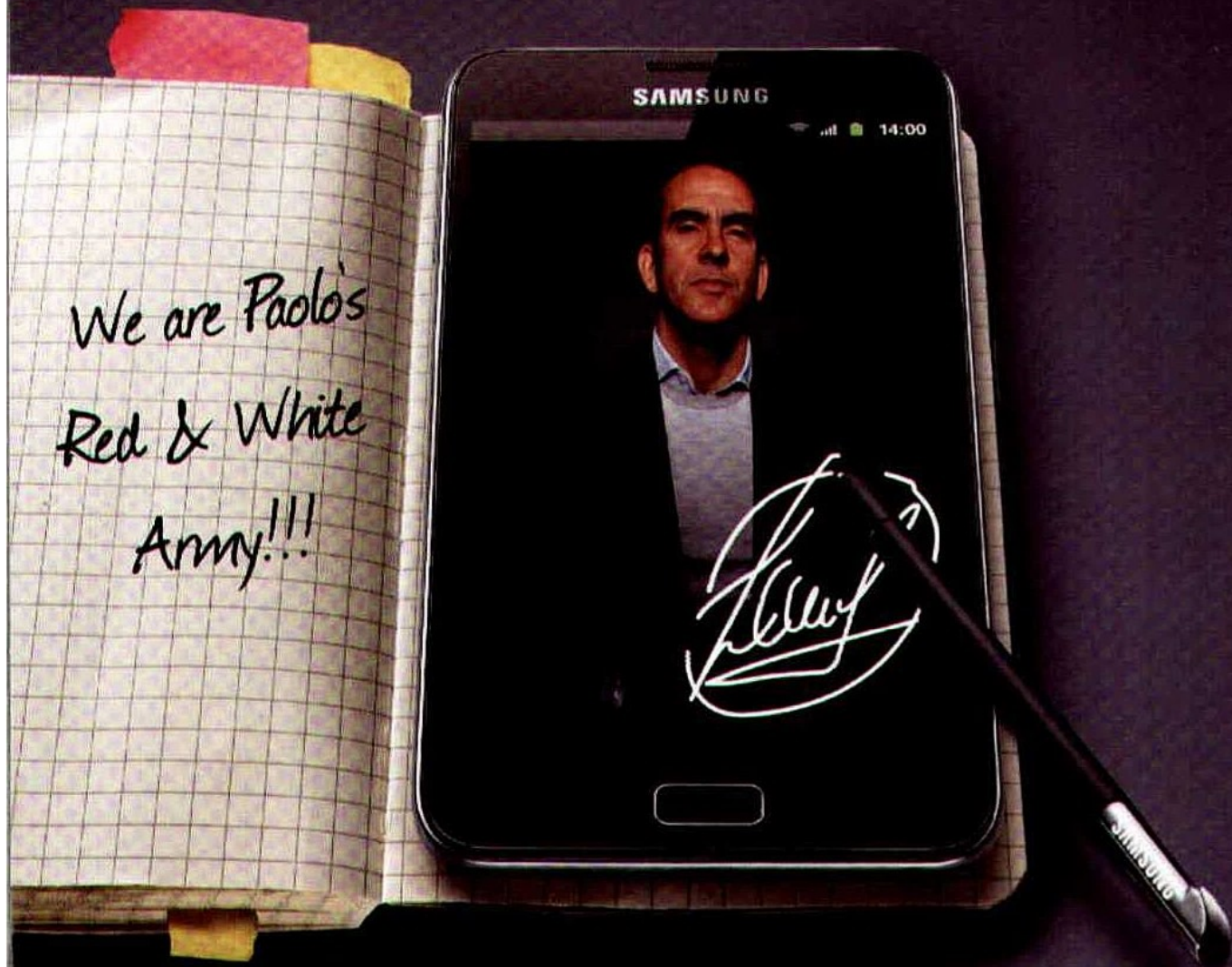

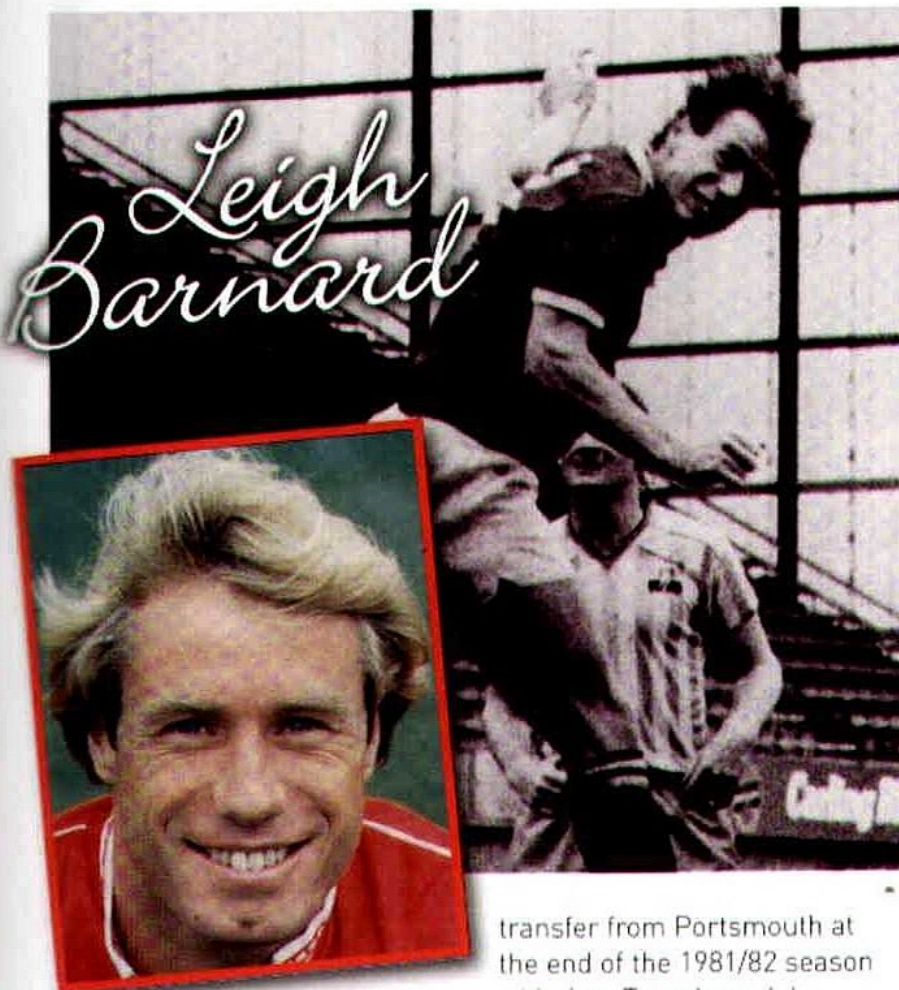

swindon town hall of Fame

A left-sided midfielder, Barnard made a big impact in a Swindon Town shirt...



LEIGH BARNARD - Born in Eastbourne, Leigh Barnard made over 260 appearances for the Robins after arriving from Portsmouth in July 1982.

The midfielder began his career as an apprentice with Portsmouth in 1977 and appeared in 79 games for the club before falling out of favour in 1982 and being loaned out to Peterborough United.

He joined Swindon on a free

transfer from Portsmouth at the end of the 1981/82 season with then Town boss John Trollope pleased to have added the hard-working player to his squad. Trollope said: "Leigh has the kind of appetite for work that Roger Smart used to have in midfield and you can't ask for more than that".

Barnard's first season with the Robins was a success and he went on to become a regular first teamer and played in every League game. He scored four goals in 46 appearances that

season, scoring his first of the campaign just before half-time in the 4-0 home win over Mansfield Town in front of 3,920. Town finished the Division Four season in eighth place, with Wimbledon topping the division.

The following season saw him score seven goals in 36 appearances for the club, although Swindon finished the season with a lower-half finish in 17th position.

A left-sided midfielder, Barnard was loaned out to Exeter City during the 1984/85 season after showing poor form in a Freight Rover Trophy match against Torquay United. In all he appeared six times for the Devon club, scoring twice, before returning to the Swindon first team the following season and scoring a goal against Mansfield Town that clinched the Fourth Division Championship for the team.

He lost his regular first team place in 1987/88 and did not appear in the first team again until the beginning of the 1989/90 season. He was eventually transferred to Cardiff City in October 1989 for £17,500 where he went on to appear 69 times, scoring nine goals.

After being released by Cardiff City he became Swindon Town's first ever Football in the Community development officer.

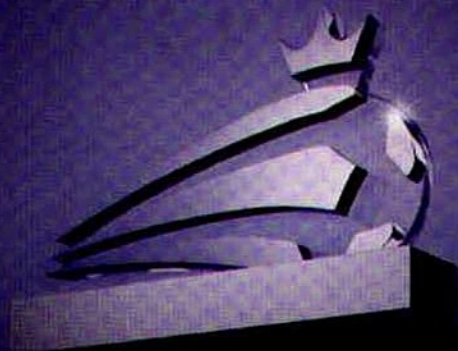

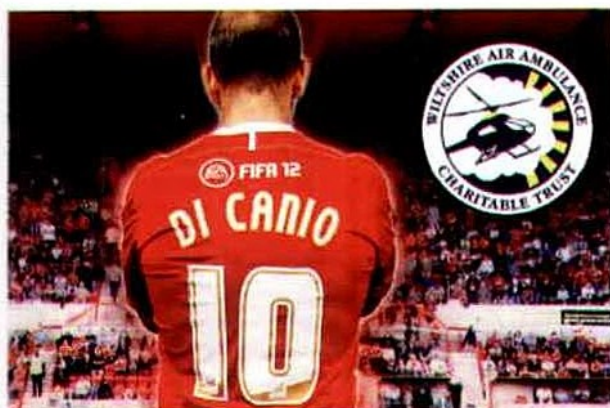
