

#### On debuts...

THERE were some positives to take from Wednesday's game in terms of individual performances. Fede Bessone had a fantastic game and it is easy to say, but he did everything good. He moved and passed the ball well as well as his defensive movement which was good. He was crucial with some of his reactions and he cut out a chance with a fantastic covering tackle. He hasn't played many games over the last year but he has been well schooled at Swansea. His fitness can improve because he finished very tired at the end of the game. The others have come from established clubs but their intensity of training is different to us. Darren Ward can do better but he did his job and we can do work with Giles Coke. Adam Rooney wanted to play but he couldn't be effective out wide. Overall I was happy because we arrived in many goalscoring positions late on in the game with Raffaele De Vita, Rooney and Coke all having opportunities. We put a lot of pressure on the opposition and we have spent a lot of time analysing the game.

The people have to have patience because we have many players to come back - such as James Collins, Gary Roberts and Matt Ritchie. We have started the season well but we have to target being in the top areas of the league at the end of October.


#### In reflection...

THE last six days haven't been good for us in terms of away performances or results, so it's great to be back at The County Ground to have the chance to put things right this afternoon against Leyton Orient.

Against Preston on Sunday we played badly and we are under no illusions that we didn't meet the standards that we know we can reach. Our whole discipline, tempo and passing were too slow and that cost us in the end. In the second half things improved a little but not enough to salvage a result from a disappointing day all round. We got at them a lot more in the second period and showed glimpses but if we had played to our full potential throughout the game then we could have come away with something. Preston didn't offer us great quality but their desire and pressure off the ball was what won them the three points.


The County Ground has been a fortress for us and the home game against Preston in February has already been marked down for everybody. When they come down here we have to make sure we annihilate them. We don't want them to come here and get away with a 1-0 defeat, we want to go through and put in a polished performance to get Sunday's result at their place well out of our system.

Deadline day saw five new signings join the club and you could see with the performance the other night that it will take a bit of time for the new lads to adjust to the way we play. Our style of play demands each player giving 100% concentration but the new arrivals

have certainly added competition to keep everyone on their toes.

It has been a different schedule in terms of games over the last week or so but as a footballer you shouldn't really be affected by that. You build up each day for the next game and days go out of kilter a little bit. The last two games for us were played on Sunday and Wednesday so we have been looking forward to getting back to The County Ground today. We want to come out flying and produce a display that we know a team of our quality can achieve. Three defeats in a row would be acceptable and we must go out and put it right.

I would like to thank every fan that made the trip to Oxford in midweek to support us. Those of you that travelled made a tremendous noise and I'm sorry that we couldn't get the result we all wanted. Today against Leyton Orient will give us a chance to get back on track and we have had enough rest to make sure we go out and get a good win today.







## Board Report...

Swindon Town chairman Jeremy Wray discusses the latest news from The County Ground ahead of today's return to League One action against Leyton Orient...

WE come into today's game on the back of Wednesday's game at Oxford United. It's never easy to lose, especially against your local rivals.







THE central defender, who turns 30 at the end of this month, is one of Orient's longest-serving players and has now made 322 league starts in a lengthy career. Before moving to E10, he had spent the previous two years with Tranmere Rovers and made 89 appearances for the Prenton Park club, before adding to that with 102 league starts in his three years

with Leyton Orient to date. Born in Sidcup, he began his career as a trainee with Arsenal and won the FA Youth Cup with the Gunners in 2001. A switch to Wimbledon followed in 2003 and followed the club to MK Dons. After spending the second half of the 2006/07 season with Gillingham, he left MK Dons at the end of the campaign to sign for Tranmere Rovers.

#### Midfielder - Moses Odubajo



#### 2012/13 Apps: 3

THE 19-year-old winger signed his first professional deal with the O's in the summer of 2011 after coming up through the youth and reserve team ranks with the club. He spent loan spells in non-league football with the likes of St. Albans City, Sutton United and Bishop's Stortford where he scored a hattrick in a 5-0 win over Droylsden in March of this year. After recovering

from injury, he made a fine impact in his first league start for the O's on the final day of the season, scoring a stunning goal in the 2-1 win over Rochdale. He is most comfortable on the right wing but can also play at right-back. He made a total of five appearances last season but has made three already this term and looks set to play a regular part this season.

THE striker joined Orient's growing Irish contingent when he signed a two-year contract with the club in July 2011. Dublin-born Mooney's early career was spent in his homeland, where he played for Shamrock Rovers, Longford Town and Cork City before earning his move to Reading in August 2008. His appearances for the Royals were restricted to Carling

#### Craig Easton...

**EASTON** joined Leyton Orient in 2005 from Livingston. After 80 appearances and six goals in two years at Brisbane Road, Paul Sturrock brought the Scotsman to The County Ground in the summer of 2007. After three years at Swindon and after Town's play-off final defeat, Easton was allowed to leave at the end of the 2009/10 season. During his three month spell in Wiltshire, the midfielder scored on his league debut for the club and notched once more before his loan finished. Carlisle joined Orient in June 2004 making over 50 appearances and scoring 5 goals in 18 months at the club. He then played for the likes of Exeter City and Torquay United before most recently spending time with Southern Premier League Truro City.

#### John Smith...

A graduate of the West Ham academy, Smith spent a campaign with Leyton Orient in the mid-1960s, making nearly 40 appearances for The O's before departing for Torquay United. He signed for the Town in June 1968 and played a key role in helping Town win the League Cup and secure promotion to Division Two.

#### Nigel Gray...

GRAY was a product of the Leyton Orient youth system. He made over 200 appearances for Orient between 1974 and 1983 before moving to Wiltshire. Between 1983 and 1985, Gray made just 33 appearances and spent time on loan at Brentford and Aldershot before being released at the end of the 1984/85 campaign.

# Goal Trail

**Images:** Puttyioot Rob Noves A hat-trick at Stoke City in the Capital One Cupsecond round saw summer signing James Collins quickly secure fans' favourite status with the Town faithful.


THE 21-year old striker produced a fine performance at The Britannia Stadium to help earn Town a place in the third round stage of the competition for the first time since 1996/97 when the Robins travelled to Old Trafford to face Manchester United. Whilst Collins and co won't be mixing it with Sir Alex Ferguson's finest in the third round stage this time around, the most recent cup draw saw Town drawn at home to Burnley and few would bet against another bout of cup magic for Paolo Di Canio's men.

Collins arrived at The County Ground on the back of two productive seasons with Shrewsbury Town. He rejected the offer of a new deal with the Shrews and has now scored 28 goals in 71 league starts in a promising start to his senior career.

The Coventry-born striker started his career at Aston Villa where he worked his way through the youth ranks before a first taste of senior football came in the shape of a loan spell at Darlington in October

2009. He made his professional debut in a 3-0 loss at the hands of Barnet but went on to score twice for the Quakers before a return to Villa Park. Despite a trial with Scottish club Aberdeen prior to the 2010/11 season. Collins remained an Aston Villa player. Following Martin O'Neill's departure, caretaker manager Kevin McDonald included the striker in his 20-man squad that travelled to Rapid Vienna in the UEFA Europa League. A second loan spell away later that season saw Collins join Burton Albion on an emergency loan in October 2010 and he scored two goals in his first three games for the Brewers. With first team opportunities limited at Villa, he signed a permanent 18-month contract with Shrewsbury in January 2011 and made a success of his time with the Shrews, helping the club win promotion to League One last season.

Whilst Collins' hat-trick at Stoke was his first at senior level, he also scored a quick-fire treble for the Republic of Ireland Under-21 side against Liechtenstein in a



4-1 win in October 2011. Those three goals in the cup have helped propel the frontman to the top of the Town scoring charts and he is eager to get amongst the goals again this afternoon as the Robins return to League One action against Leyton Orient. Russell Slade's men have endured a difficult start to the campaign and are yet to register a win in three attempts.

COYR sat down with the striker earlier this week to gauge his views on a busy start to life in Wiltshire and what he hopes to achieve as the 2012/13 season unfolds.

well and hopefully shown people that we mean business this season.

#### Is it true that you had to cut your holiday short to return for pre-season training?

Yeah! I had booked my holiday quite a while in advance and at the end of last season didn't expect to be coming back so soon for training. You have to make sacrifices when you start a new job and cutting short my holiday was a small price to pay for signing for a club like Swindon. I lost a few days break but all the fitness work we have done is paying off now.



#### How do you feel you have settled into life at The County Ground?

Things are going well and we have had a half-decent start to the season too. We have had some good performances and the cup displays against Brighton and Stoke have stood out as well.

#### What has surprised you most since joining the club?

Nothing has really surprised me because when I met the gaffer before I signed he told me exactly what he wanted and what he expected of me this season. Sunday's result at Preston aside, we have generally played really


#### Was the Stoke game the most memorable of your career so far?

I'd say so because I scored my first goal for Swindon on the night as well as my first competitive hat-trick. It was a memorable tie for me, the club and the fans. It's not often that you go to a Premier League side and beat them on their own ground.

The second goal, We had worked really hard on the routine in training during the week before the game to get across the marker and it came off. It was





the one that I was happiest with because of the hard work that went into creating and finishing the opportunity.


on the pitch at half-time. Bullard then scored and recreated it as a celebration.

#### Fitness is a key weapon in Town's armoury, how fit do you feel compared to previous campaigns?



# Swindon Advertiser...

What's in a name? In the Advermobile on the way up to Stoke last week, cued by the emergence of the Britannia Stadium on the horizon, my colleagues Andy Warren, Dave Evans and I started debating the relative merits of branding football stadia for a little extra income.

OUR game is as rapidly evolving as a business off the pitch as it is a sport on it but does the focus on consumerism, sales targets and satisfying the bigwigs detrimentally affect the very soul of the nation's favourite pastime?

Once upon a time, when shirts were free of conglomerate insurers, Danish beers and transnational airlines, when a substitution didn't come with a loud "in association with" blurting over the PA system and when the World Cup didn't need official partners to get by - was football at its purist?

Nowadays, many a club's heritage can be quickly bypassed by investors keen to make a quick buck.

In many cases it can help clubs survive, build and thrive, and that's not the point I'm arguing.

For me fans have to recognise the slow evolution of our game as a business. It's not a seismic shift, it's one small step at a time.

But I know plenty of Bournemouth fans who will be heading to Dean Court on a Saturday, not the Goldsands Stadium; I know several Newcastle supporters who won't be visiting the Sports Direct Arena any time soon, they'll be cheering on the Toon from the terraces of St James' Park.

Are we happy to sacrifice part of our history in pursuit of success or survival? Honestly, I think the answer is yes - particularly when times are hard economically and we're happy

for anyone and everyone willing to invest in our club to do just that.

Sometimes there are extremes - such as the Malaysian rebrand of Cardiff from blue to red over the summer, a move based on market research in the Far East.

But, even there, fans of the Bluebirds (whose nowcontradictory nickname still remains) have slowly come to accept that, if they really aspire to Premiership status, they need the millions of chairman Dato Chan Tien Ghee and his board.

In League One, rebranding is still in its infancy - but I have no doubt it will spread through the Football League over the coming years.

That is the nature of football in the modern world, a sport dominated by big business at the top end and reliant of small business at the bottom.

If we want our game to survive and thrive, we'll let the money men do the talking.




# Premier Bound...

AFTER a storming start to 1992/93, Town's results started to slip away slightly, and annoyingly it coincided with a couple of local derbies where pride was at stake.

A 2-1 reverse at Millwall preceded this West Country meeting with Bristol Rovers, when the first home points were surrendered on 12th September.

Dave Mitchell headed the opener from a John Moncur cross half way though the first period, but a Marcus Stewart penalty after a Shaun Taylor push brought the visitors level after 69 minutes.

Two minutes later another Town header, this time from Craig Maskell, his seventh goal in just five matches gave us the lead once more, but John Taylor snatched a point for Rovers with four minutes remaining.

Incredibly it was the fifth time in consecutive matches that we had conceded a goal with fewer than four minutes remaining

The game came less than a month after Town had triumphed at Rovers' adopted Twerton Park ground by 4-3.

Referee David Ellerey had infuriated home fans by pulling back play to award Town a free-kick with Dave Mitchell clear on goal, but the man in black would redeem himself at Wembley at the season's end.





PAUL Merchant who was coach of Green Meadow Under 9s. One of my friends at school told me to come along to training so I went there, did well and joined.




WAYNE Rooney's goal against Newcastle for Everton when he was just breaking through into the first team. It was a live TV game and I remember watching and thinking what a player he was.





# The Promotion Story...

**This** season, Town will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the club's historic, first ever promotion in 1963. COYR will be taking a monthly look back on the highs and lows on the road to promotion...

TOWN began their Football League Division Three campaign away from home on the 18th August, 1962. Cliff Jackson secured a point for Swindon at Barnsley. Three days later, Bert Head's men registered their first win of the season with an emphatic 4-1 thumping of Coventry City at The County Ground. A quick-fire brace from Arnold Darcy and a strike from Jack Smith had the Town three goals up inside half an hour. Despite the visitors pulling a goal back before the break, an own goal with seven minutes to go put a gloss on the score-line.

The following Saturday, the Town were brought back down to earth with a bump, losing at home to Northampton Town, who would go on to pip Swindon to the Division Three title. An early goal from Cliff Jackson saw Town lead until the 67th minute when the visitors equalised. Darcy put Town in front once again five minutes later. However, in the following ten-minute spell, the Cobblers drew level before scoring the winning goal eight minutes from time.

A return trip to Coventry was next up for the Town on Tuesday 28th August, the first of three away fixtures in a row. The visitors could not repeat their performance from the game at The County Ground and went down 2-0 thanks to two first-half strikes at Highfield Road.

September began with a trip to table-topping Queens Park Rangers. Roger Smart put the Town in front before two goals in two minutes saw Rangers take the lead. Jack Smith notched just before the break to send Town home with a share of the spoils. Three days later, Ernie Hunt's first goal of the season earned Swindon a point at Brighton and Hove Albion

On 8th September, Town's third home game ended in only their second victory of campaign: a 2-0 win over Hull City. Left-back John Trollope opened the scoring ten minutes before the break before Ernie Hunt, playing at inside-right, secured two points for the

Town with a goal in the 75th minute.

#### The Journey...

By Train: Brunton Park is situated about a mile from Carlisle Citadel station, but is relatively easy to get to. Upon exiting the station's main entrance. walk the short distance around the Crescent until reaching Warwick Road. You will be able to see the old Main Stand and the strangely-shaped roofs of the Warwick Road end after walking for about twenty minutes. There are directions to the away supporters' turnstiles above the Carlisle United club shop.

By Car: Getting to Carlisle is relatively simple.
Leave the M6 at junction 43 and take the A69 towards the centre. After a mile the stadium can be found on the right hand side with the club shop easily visible.
Car parking is available close by in the club car park or street parking.

## Staying Over...

#### The Premier Inn:

(Postcode: CA3 CHR)

The hotel is within walking distance of the stadium and is a competitively priced option.

Alternatively, The Hallmark Hotel Carlisle is luxury option in the centre and is located fronting Carlisle's historic Court Square or The North Lakes hotel. The North Lakes Hotel, some 20

miles south in Penrith, is ideally located for fans wishing to venture out and take in some of the stunning scenery around the Lake District.

#### Grab a Bite...

Nando's: The centre of Carlisle has a number of options for pre-match grub. From Italian, Spanish, Indian, Mexican, Chinese, Thai, Turkish, Greek as well as good old traditional British food, there is an option for

> everyone. If you are a fan of Nando's then there is an outlet on Warwick Road in the centre.

#### Enjoy a Drink...

#### Wetherspoons:

Wetherspoons in the centre of Carlisle bears the name of Woodrow Wilson, who became the 28th president of the United States in 1912. The pub is potentially the best option for Town fans as the Beehive, traditionally a designated away pub, no longer accepts visiting fans. A wide selection of refreshments are available at Wetherspoons with food also available for supporters.

#### Things to do...

Carlisle Castle: Standing proudly in the city it has dominated for nine centuries, the castle was a constantly updated working fortress until well within living memory. Now its rich and varied visitor attractions reflect its long and eventful history. Even before the medieval castle was begun, this site was an important Roman fortress. With a new exhibition, a programme of guided tours, a picnic area, a unique gift shop and being so close to Hadrian's Wall, the castle makes for a full family day out.

views of the pitch are pretty good and unobstructed. An away day at Brunton Park is usually an enjoyable one, especially given Town's visit this year takes place on a Saturday in mid September – not the middle of January!


