

On today's visitors...





SADLY our involvement in the Capital One Cup came to an end at the fourth round stage on Tuesday night against Aston Villa. It was a game of two halves really but despite going 2-0 down, we created plenty of chances. Villa kept the ball very well and showed their quality and they made us work hard. FORMER Swindon Town winger Anthony McNamara joined the Silkmen at the end of August and has made four appearances for the club so far this term, although was an unused substitute in the 1-0 win at Grimsby Town last weekend. 23-year old frontman Wade Fairhurst scored twice in the first three games of the campaign and is another option for Steve King off the bench, alongside youngster Jack Mackreth.




