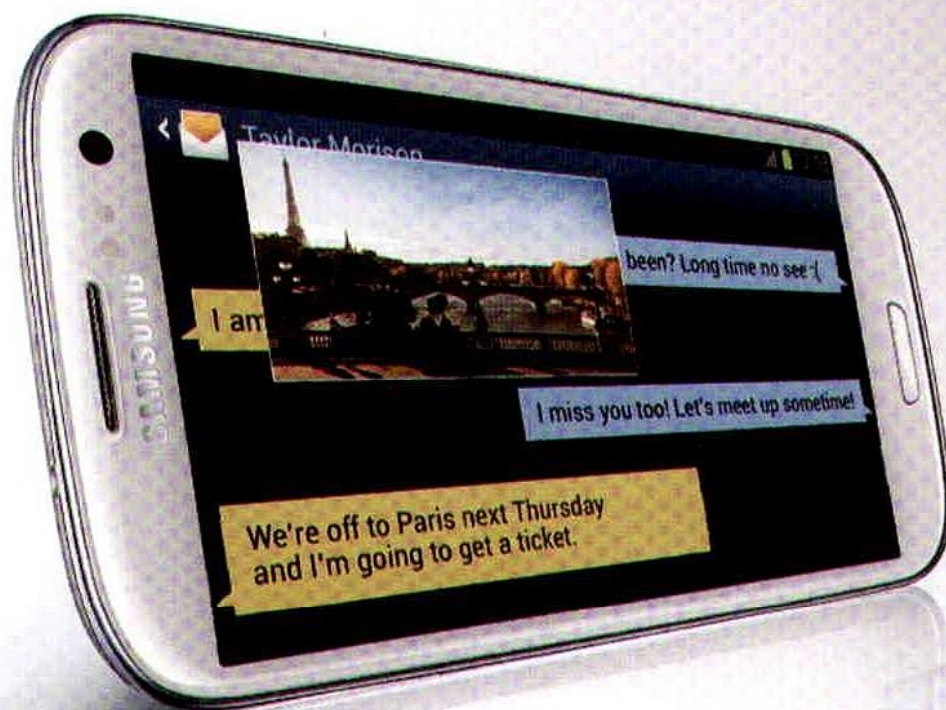

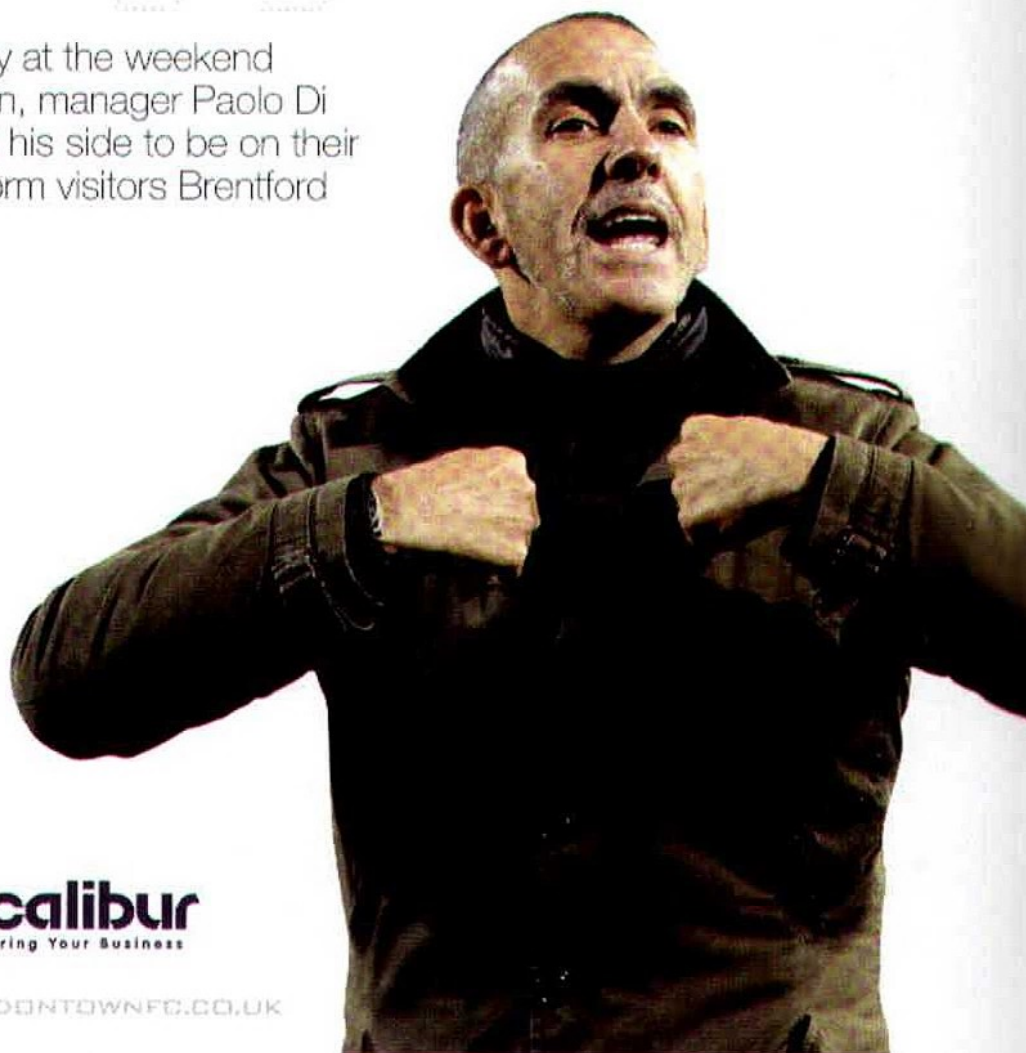

IT may have been easier for us to have played away from home tonight. Some of the players we have are young and don't have too much experience. They must not relax and think it will be easy.



It was good to get back into action at the weekend against Yeovil and it was great to make my comeback as part of a victory in front of our own fans at The County Ground...

IT was touch and go on Friday whether I would be in the team or not. The gaffer made a few changes during training so I wasn't sure who would get the nod, either myself or Nathan. I prepared for the game in the right way and having been out for a couple of weeks I wouldn't have been surprised to have started the game on the bench, but I got the nod and was pleased to be involved from the start.

The lads were superb and showed a really good attitude. We scored two good goals early on with Willo and Collo putting us 2-0 in front before Yeovil got one back. Once we conceded the goal we showed a really good desire and bounced back straightaway. It was nice to see Wardy pop up at the back stick with his first in Swindon colours and then Collo stuck away his second of the afternoon with a neat finish at the end.

In terms of my own performance I thought I did look a little bit rusty. When you're out for a period of time you lose a little sharpness and that extra five or ten percent can make a big difference to the way you play. 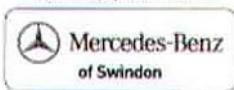


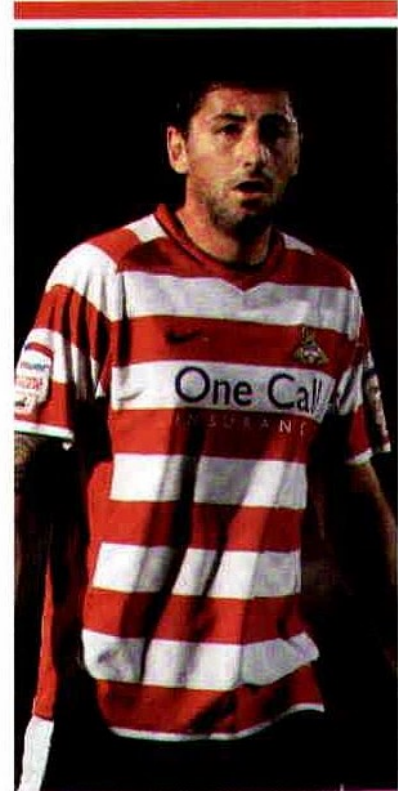
Another diary date is 1pm Sunday 17th December when the County Ground will play host to the Samsung Win A Pro Contract semi-final. Ticketing details to be advised.

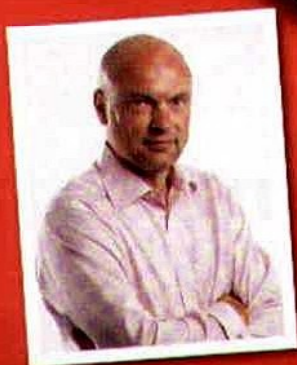

DURING Saturday's draw at Preston, manager Uwe Rösler used three substitutes with Paul Hayes, Antonio German and Scott Barron all coming off the bench. German went on to net the leveller whilst Hayes could be another who could come into the reckoning this evening. Barron was signed from Millwall in the summer and will be well-known to Town defender Darren Ward, who is on loan from The New Den.

On the match...

THERE have been 81 previous meetings between tonight's teams and Swindon go into the game with the upper hand, having registered 35 wins. The previous two meetings at The County Ground both finished in 1-1 draws, although the most recent of these was in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in November 2010 with the Bees winning 5-4 in a shoot-out. with the club. The powerful striker came through the youth ranks at Hull City and scored prolifically for York City before a move to Hibernian in 2007. He spent a year in Scotland before a switch to Crewe in 2008. In his first season at Griffin Park he scored 11 goals and assisted 16 more – he ended up second on the League One list for goal assists.

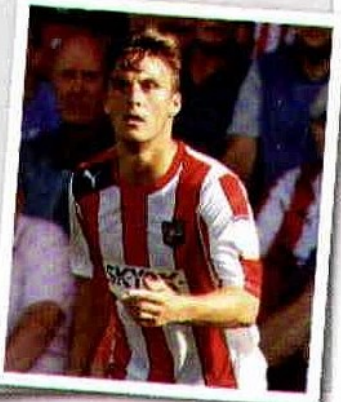
Midfielder – Sam Saunders

promotion to the Football League in 2007. He scored his first Brentford goal towards the end of his first season at Griffin Park and hit three more in 2010/11. Lee signed from Watford in the summer of 2010 and has made 60 league starts for the club since arriving at Griffin Park. He came through the youth ranks at Watford and progressed to the first team, making his debut in February 2003.

He played in the Premier League for the Hornets and made 110 appearances in all competitions before signing a two-year contract at Griffin Park. His penalty shoot-out expertise helped The Bees win four spot kick contests in his first season at the club, although he missed the end of the season – and Brentford's appearance in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final at Wembley.

Glenn Cockerill...

Ricky Shakes...

SHAKES signed for Town in the summer of 2005 and made over 30 appearances as Swindon were relegated to the basement division. Town secured promotion the following season with Shakes contributing two goals as he racked up another 30+ appearances. At the end of the campaign, he was allowed to join Brentford where he made nearly 40 appearances in the 2007/08 campaign before being released by the Bees.

Deon Burton...

THE Jamaican international was brought to The County Ground by Andy King in October 2003. Signing a month-long loan deal from Portsmouth, he played four times for the Town netting the only goal of his temporary stint in a 2-0 win over Wycombe at SN1. He joined Brentford in 2004 and spent a season at Griffin Park, helping the club reach the League One play-offs in 2004/05.

Paul Roberts...

ROBERTS started his career with Millwall before spending two years with Brentford between 1983 and 1985, making over 60 appearances. Following his release from Griffin Park, the full-back was snapped up by Town

manager Lou Macari in September 1985. Roberts made 31 appearances as Swindon were crowned Fourth Division Champions. At the end of the campaign, he was released and joined Southend United.

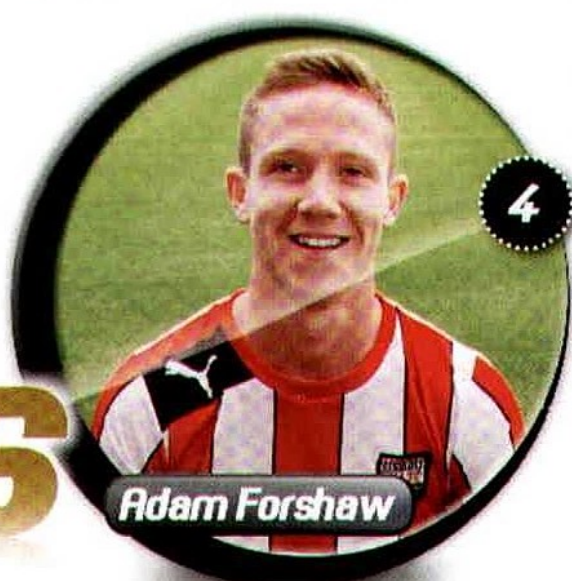

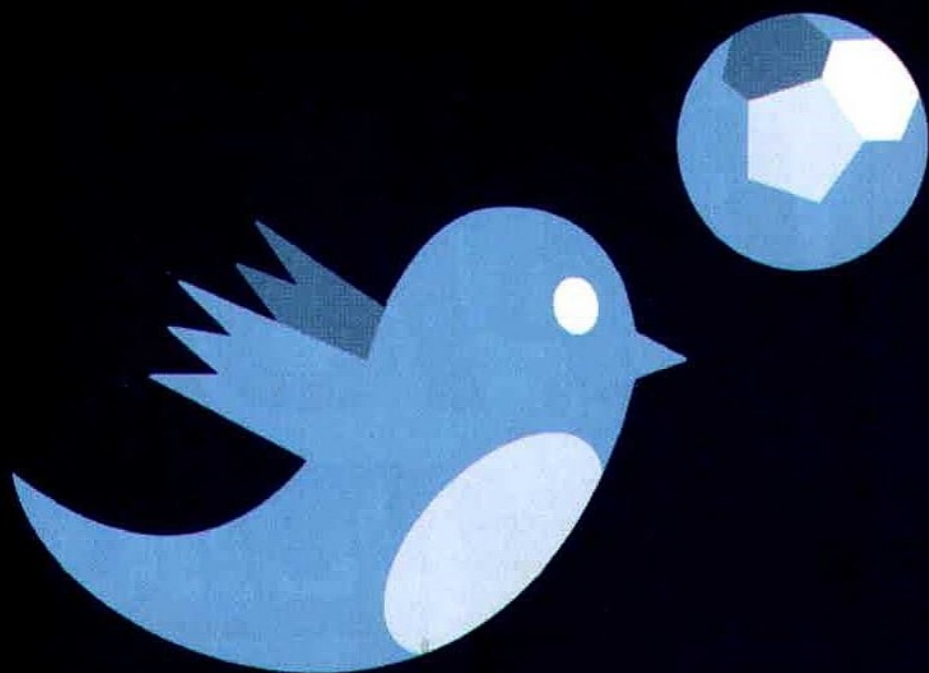

NEW loan signing Chris Martin has fond memories of playing against Swindon Town and now the 24-year old is hoping to make a success of his temporary Town spell having swapped the yellow of Norwich for the red of Swindon.

Martin made his first appearance in a Town shirt at the weekend as he came off the bench in the first half against Yeovil Town, as he returned to familiar territory. The striker was an integral member of the Canaries' squad which won promotion from League One in the 2009/10 season, scoring 23 goals to help fire the club to promotion. Having scored the winner in the corresponding fixture at Carrow Road the previous October, Martin came to Wiltshire in March of 2010 hoping to complete the double over the Robins. Strike partner Grant Holt plundered home the opener just after half-time before a thunderous header from Gordon Greer brought the majority of The County Ground crowd to their feet. It's a moment that sticks in the memory of most Town

fans as well as the club's latest recruit, who has been handed the number 24 shirt.

"Norwich were unlucky not to take all three points. I remember 'Holly' scoring the opener and then I think it was Gordon Greer who scored a really late one to level the game.

"As a Norwich player then it was a disappointing end as we were ahead for long periods of the match. Swindon had a very good side back then and gave us a tough game. It was a really good season for Norwich and of course Swindon did well and went on to make the play-off final at Wembley.

"The one at Carrow Road in October is one that sticks in the memory as well. I managed to get the winner in that game against Swindon so hopefully I can have some of that success here now I am playing for Swindon!"

As a modern footballer there is little time for planning when it comes to loan moves and Martin's switch to Swindon certainly followed suit. Having trained with Norwich last Wednesday, he was at home

when the phone call came to tell him of a potential Swindon switch. A few calls later and with a sat-nav postcode in place, the move was on. An overnight stay in a Swindon hotel ensured he was at The County Ground in the early hours of Thursday morning for a medical before joining his new teammates for training to get his Town career up and running.

He said: "I was happy to go ahead with the move and when I heard about the interest last Wednesday I just wanted to get things sorted and get on with it. I saw Swindon got promoted last season and the momentum seems to still be here. I have seen the club has more than held their own this season and there's a positive feeling around the place."

"The lads are a good bunch here and everyone has been friendly. As soon as I got to the training ground on Thursday morning everyone made me feel welcome."

The striker had little hesitation in making the move to Wiltshire and although there were other offers on the table for a move away from Norfolk - he believes his temporary switch to join Paolo Di Canio's men will prove to be the right one.

"There is a good group of players here and this is an ambitious club. I'm sure under the manager we can have a bit of success during my time here and it's going to be an exciting few months."

Martin first came to the fore with Norwich back in the New Year of 2007 with five goals before a call-up to the England Under-19 squad a few months later. He then scored four times

in the 7-0 FA Cup first round win over Paulton Rovers in November 2009, his first senior hat-trick, before signing a new three-and-a-half year contract in January 2010. A key component of the 2009/10 title-winning season with 23 goals to his name, the frontman spent the majority of last term in the Championship with Crystal Palace. With Norwich now an established Premier League side, his appearances have been limited to three outings this term with his last in a Norwich shirt coming with a 70-minute display against Doncaster Rovers in the Capital One Cup in September. It's been a tough few months, but he's eager to get back to what he knows best; playing regular football and scoring goals.

"The first few months of the season have been hard for me to be honest," he explains. "I wasn't involved in many of the Norwich squads and it's hard when the rest of the lads were travelling to away games and I wasn't a part of it."

"Although I have played a couple of games in the Premier League and cups this season, I want to be playing week in, week out and Swindon have given me that chance."

"It can become very hard when you are sat around and not playing, which is what any footballer wants to do. The main reason why I am here is to get game time."

The aforementioned three-and-a-half year contract will come to an end at the close of the 2012/13 season. With opportunities limited in the top-flight this term, Martin knows just how important making a success

of his time in Wiltshire could be.

"At my age and stage of my career it's imperative that I am regularly playing football. My deal with Norwich is up next summer and that's been a driving factor to get out on loan and I am happy that Swindon Town came in for me.


"If I am playing games and scoring goals then the rest



should take care of itself. Hopefully I can score a few goals during my time with the club and help the team get a few wins."

Town fans got their first glimpse of the striker on Saturday afternoon when he came off the bench as a late first half replacement for Andy Williams, the scorer of the opening goal in what proved to be an emphatic win over Yeovil Town. Having watched the opening 44 minutes of the game from the Town bench, the 24-year old was eager to make an impact for what was his first appearance in a Swindon shirt.

"It was a brilliant performance by the lads and I was happy to get a few minutes on the pitch. The most important thing was of course the win, but it was nice to get out there and get a feel for it.

"When Andy went down he looked like he was in a bit of trouble so I was prepared to come on, but he battled through before coming off. I went on the pitch in unfortunate circumstances but it was good to get involved."

Martin felt he should have got his name on the scoresheet, but saw a second half opportunity fly narrowly wide with the Robins in rampant form, climbing to third in League One.

"I was disappointed not to have scored my first for the club if I am being honest. I did have a good chance but the most important thing was the three points because if we want to be challenging at the top of the league then we're going to have to keep getting results. It's still early days and nothing is decided in November so we just have to keep working hard and strive for success."

The striker believes Swindon's high fitness levels could play a key part in the club's drive for success this term. He is well placed to compare and contrast the differences in play between the top-flight and League One, having faced the likes of Manchester United, Stoke City, West Bromwich Albion and Chelsea during the 2011/12 season.

"The tempo is more of a sustained tempo in this division. In the Premier League you get a little bit of time to sit off and

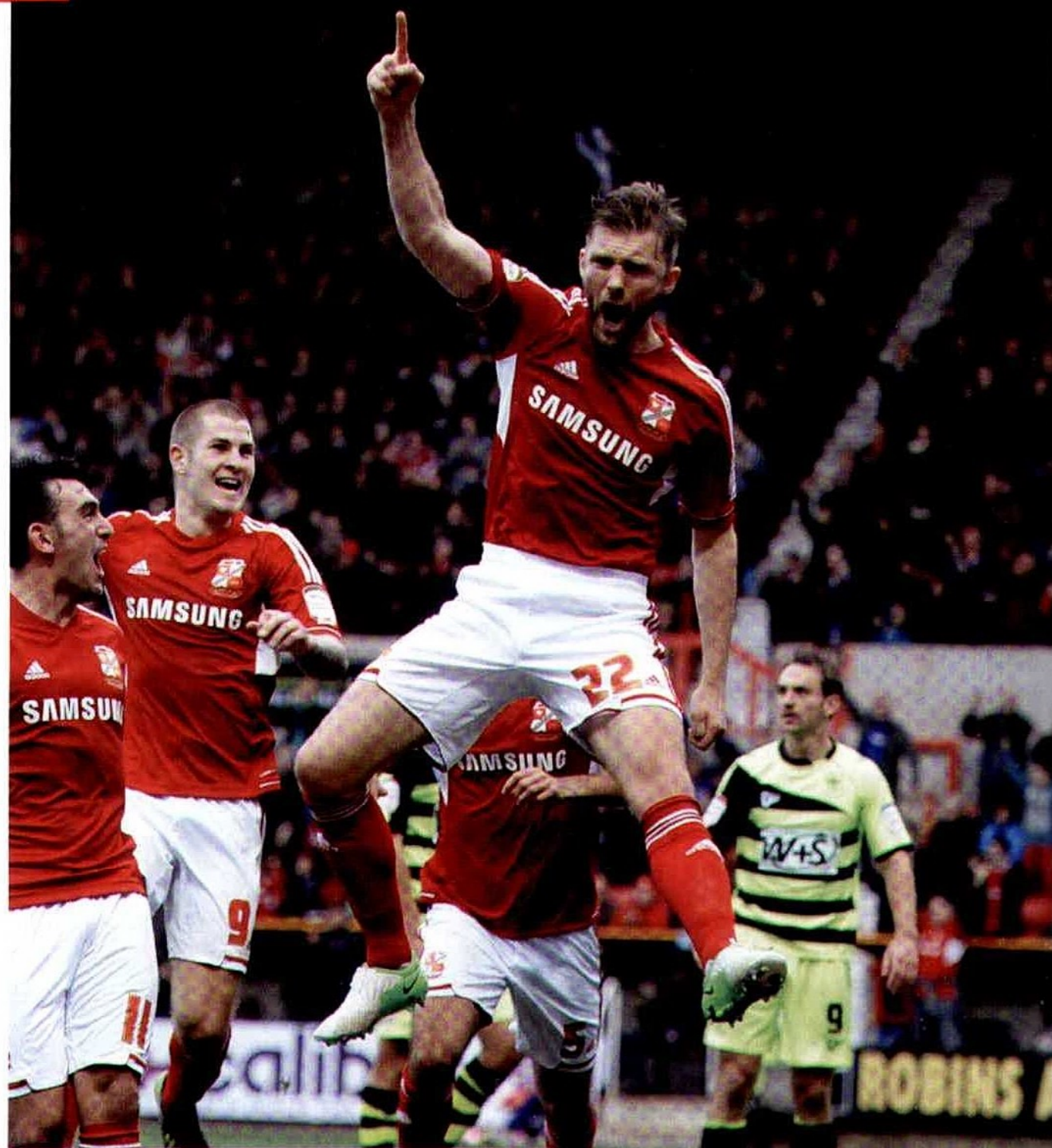
play but from what I saw at the weekend against Yeovil, the high tempo seems to suit the game here at Swindon. We scored some good goals, made quite a few chances and it was a good start.

"I haven't played many games this season so I need to get my head down, keep working hard and try and score as many goals as possible. I like to get the ball to feel and would like to think that I am good on the ball. As a striker I will be judged on goals. Of course it matters that you put in a good performance and contribute, but I know I need to be on the end of things and score. Hopefully that's where I will earn my money!"

Martins will not have to wait long for his next opportunity to try and strike gold. Town's busy League One fixture schedule sees Brentford make the trip along the M4 this evening and having got his first taste of life in a Town shirt at the weekend, the striker is eager to make his mark should he get the nod against the Bees.

"We are in good form and the lads are looking forward to getting going again. You can't dwell on a victory too much, the same as you don't want to dwell on a defeat. You have to keep looking to the next game and Brentford will come here trying to make life difficult."

If Martin can rediscover his scoring touch with the Robins, then his transition from yellow to red will be complete. With a determined attitude and over 50 goals to his name, you get a sense that it won't be long until the 24-year old has a smile upon his face once again.

Last week Zlatan Ibrahimovic scored a goal which had pundits across the continent scouring dictionaries for original hyperbole.

TO be fair to the PSG striker, his 35-yard bicycle kick lob of Joe Hart was pretty darn special, and it got me thinking about what it's like to be in a stadium when something similarly brilliant takes place.

Different people see excellence in different ways, and therefore the debate about what constitutes a truly sensational goal probably has no conclusion.

However, it's still good clean fun and so I'd like to put forward the top Swindon Town 10 goals I have ever seen.

The criteria for selection is simple - the goals had to be scored while

I was inside the ground, as a paying fan or as a journalist covering the game.

Bear in mind I've only been watching Town since 1994 and therefore my options are much more limited than some, but let me know what I've missed. There have been so many stand-out moments, for various reasons, that I'm sure my memory has failed me in some way.

10. Royce Brownlie v Barnet, August 8, 2006 - The Aussie came off the bench to announce his arrival in Wiltshire with a stinging 25-yard piledriver that almost broke the net at the Stratton Bank end of The County Ground.

9. Tony Grant v Hull, January 20, 1996 - Grant was another debut goalscorer, marking his first appearance following his loan transfer from Everton with a delightful chip against the Tigers during the Division Two title-winning campaign.

8. Paul Evans v Wrexham, September 9, 2007 - Evans' 40-

yard free-kick at The Racecourse Ground may have been in a losing cause, but it was a thing of beauty.

7. Mark Walters v Bolton, March 6, 1999 - Walters had several candidates for my top 10 - including a thunderbolt against Stevenage and a lovely volley against QPR, but it was this inch-perfect set-piece effort which gets the nod.

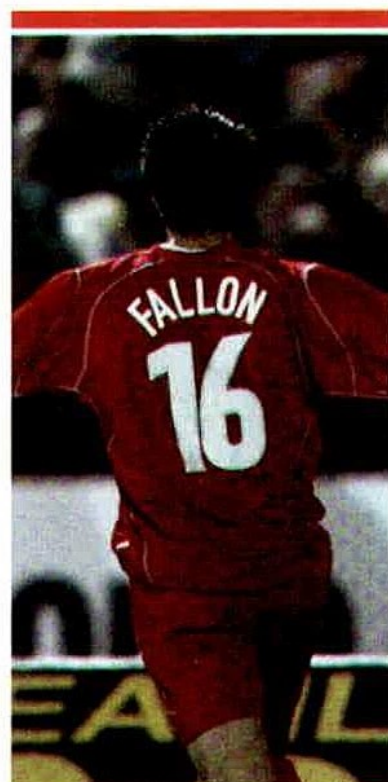
6. Andy Gurney v Wrexham, September 12, 2003 - Utility player Gurney scored a handful of memorable free-kicks during his time with Swindon, most notably at Leeds in the League Cup, but it was the individual run from halfway and pin-point finish that makes this strike stand out.

5. Jan Aage Fjortoft v Brighton, November 9, 1994 - This was one of my very first games as a newly-converted Town fan. Fraser Digby's long ball had Colin Pates kicking air and the Norwegian produced a brilliant first-time volley to beat Nicky Rust.

4. Marlon Broomes v Birmingham, February 26, 1997 - Broomes was a wasted talent. He came on loan to Town with a rich reputation and only enhanced it in Wiltshire but his career never reached the heights it promised. This 35-yard bullet was his only Swindon goal.

3. George Ndah v Sheffield United, January 9, 1999 - Mention acrobatics in a Swindon shirt and everyone instantly recalls Rory Fallon, but Ndah's swivel-volley from 18 yards was technically perfection.

2. Simon Cox v Walsall, January 27, 2009 - It's so hard to

separate this strike from Fallon's. Cox's one-touch control and instant lob against the Saddlers is mesmerising. It never gets old to watch.

1. Rory Fallon v Bristol City, April 10, 2004 - Because of the opposition, the New Zealander gets pride of place at the top of my list. Ridiculous skill and absurd audacity combined to produce one of the very best goals The County Ground has ever seen, by popular opinion. Better than the Ibrahimovic effort? You decide.

A 25 yard Nicky Summerbee free kick flew wide, as did a David Kerslake effort, then Ling, facing his former club, added the third on 24 minutes with a right footed volley.

But five minutes before the break Ian Benjamin struck from 15 yards to reduce the arrears, and with eight minutes of the match remaining former Town defender Jon Cornwell turned home a Scott Ashenden cross to give Town supporters a nervous few minutes.

Kevin Horlock still had time to strike the crossbar before the game concluded with another three points for Town.

Ling was happy, saying 'I owe Southend one for a terrible last year at Roots Hall'.

We will remember...

Former Town striker Alan Fowler would have celebrated his 101st birthday today so, to celebrate this anniversary, COYR takes a look back at 'Little Alan' and his time at Swindon before he tragically lost his life...

YORKSHIRE-born Fowler began his career with Leeds United before he was brought to Swindon by manager Ted Vizard in May 1934. The inside-forward would go on to score over 100 goals for the Town before the outbreak of the Second World War curtailed his career. He finished as top scorer in three of his six seasons at The County Ground and scored one of the fastest ever hat-tricks in September 1935. In August 1944, he was killed in action at Caen whilst serving his country. He was just 32.

November is a month dedicated to remembrance and Swindon Town would like to pay tribute to all the former players who made the ultimate sacrifice in defence of their country. Six players with connections to Swindon Town were lost during the Great War. Albert Milton and Freddy Wheatcroft were still on the club's payroll at the time. Milton died in Belgium in October 1917 while

Wheatcroft was killed in France in November 1917. Arthur Beadsworth, Jim Chalmers, Billy Kirby and William Brewer were the other former first team players that tragically lost their lives during World War One.

Fowler joins Jim Olney, Bill Bryan, Albert Powell and Bill Imrie on the list of players who were victims of the Second World War.

A plaque dedicated to the memories of Fowler, Imrie and Olney can be found in the reception foyer at The County Ground.

Nottingham Castle: The castle was built by William the Conqueror's son after the Norman invasion, the first incarnation of the Castle being built in 1068. The history of Nottingham Castle is chequered with sieges, murders and intrigue – it was known as the legendary home to the Sheriff of Nottingham, Robin Hood's mortal enemy. When the castle was destroyed after the Civil War, it was replaced by a magnificent ducal mansion in 1674. Then in 1875 it was converted into the first municipal museum and art gallery.



The Stadium...



Meadow Lane: (Postcode: NG2 3HJ) Town fans will be seated in the Jimmy Sirrell Stand. The stadium is now a smart arena following an extensive redevelopment during the early 1990's. Both sides are single tiered stands, the larger of which is the Derek Pavis Stand. This is the main stand containing the executive area and having the players' tunnels and team dugouts at its front. The stadium, as at The County Ground, features a set of four floodlight pylons.

Hughes could line up against Town this weekend and he has now scored 58 goals in 126 league appearances for the Magpies.

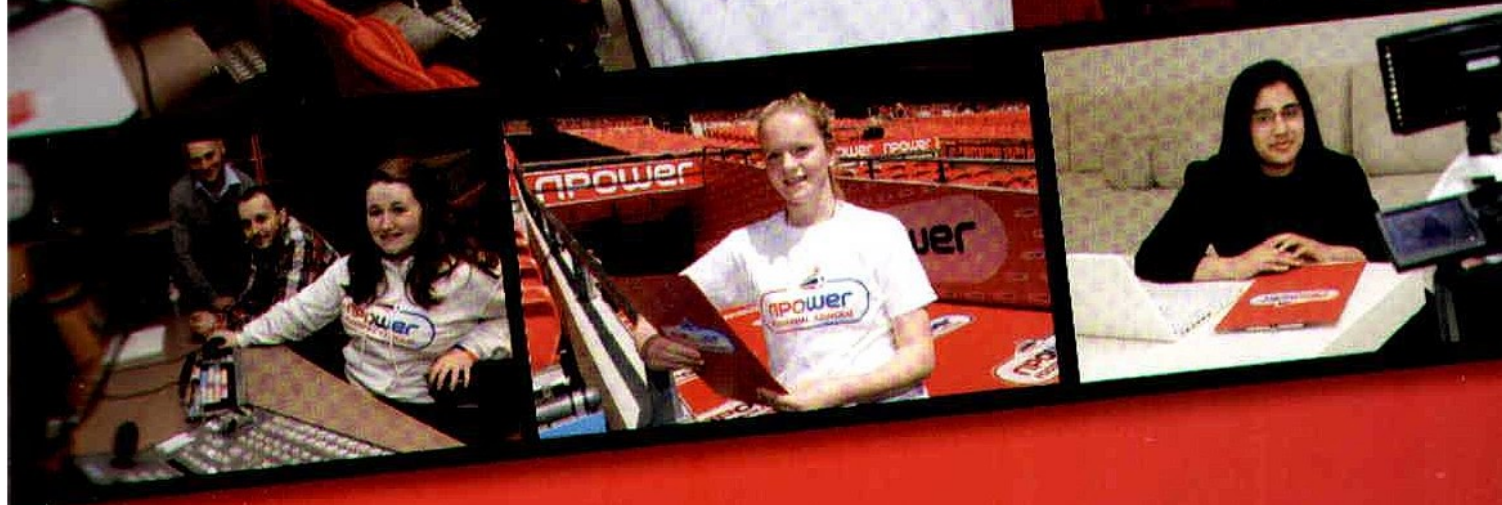
