On returning home ...


WE are back at The County

Ground that's for sure.


In reflection...







Forward – Billy Paynter



PROVEN centre forward Paynter arrived at Doncaster Rovers with a real point to prove following his release from Championship outfit – and Yorkshire neighbours – Leeds United. His move to Elland Road, after such a successful spell here at The County Ground, didn't pan out as planned for the Liverpoolborn striker and a continued run in the side never materialised. The

last time Paynter played at League 1 level he scored 29 goals in all competitions to help the Robins to the play-off final. In total he made 122 league starts for Swindon, scoring 45 goals before a move away in the summer of 2010. He scored his first goal of the 2012/13 season at Yeovil Town on Saturday 1st September and has scored a further four goals this term.

Gordon Greer...

THR centre-half made over 100 appearances for Kilmarnock before joining Doncaster in 2007. His spell at The Keepmoat Stadium was restricted to just 12 appearances and Danny Wilson brought him to Swindon initially on loan towards the end of the 2008/09 season. Signing a permanent contract with Town that summer, Greer would captain the side to the League One play-off final at Wembley. He moved to Brighton in the summer of 2010.

Kevin Horlock...

SIGNED by Glenn Hoddle as a full-back in 1992, Horlock would go on to play in the Premier League with Swindon. His subsequent conversion to an attacking midfielder saw him notch 12 goals in Town's title-winning 1995/96 campaign. In January 1997, he was sold to Manchester City for a then club record £1.5 million having made nearly 200 appearances for Swindon. After spells at West Ham and Ipswich, Horlock made 15 appearances for Doncaster in 2005/06.

Paul Gilchrist...

THE striker signed for Fourth Division Doncaster in July 1971 and made 22 appearances that season, scoring eight goals. In the summer of 1972, he moved to First Division side Southampton, with whom he won the FA Cup in 1976. Gilchrist came to The County Ground in August 1978 and in a 19-month stay in Wiltshire he netted eight goals in 22 appearances for the Robins.

Paul Edwards...

MANCHESTER- born Edwards signed for Doncaster aged 18. The winger would only make five appearances in the 1997/98 season for Rovers before moving back into the non-leagues. Following a trial with Town ahead of the 2001/02 season, manager Roy Evans handed him a short-term contract. After making just 23 appearances and netting once in an FA Cup tie, he left to join Wrexham.

The lads have been brilliant. I have really enjoyed my time as a Swindon player so far.

WITH injuries to Alan Navarro and Tommy Miller and with the club heading towards the busy Christmas period, manager Paolo Di Canio went searching for an experienced midfielder to help steady the Robins' ship. Step forward Danny Hollands.

The 27-year old midfielder penned a short-term loan move to The County Ground on Wednesday 14th November, shortly before the close of the transfer window and he's determined to make a success of his time in Wiltshire.

The midfielder joined Charlton in the summer of 2011 from AFC Bournemouth and kicked off the 2011/12 season with a 90-minute display against the Cherries in a 3-0 home win. He was instrumental for the Addicks in last season's League One title success and scored eight goals in 46 appearances in all competitions as Charlton secured a return to the second tier of English football. It was a debut season to remember at The Valley and the midfielder returned for pre-season in the summer looking to cement a place back in the heart of the Charlton engine room.

The season began well for the

former Chelsea middleman, who made 14 appearances for Chris Powell's side but saw Johnnie Jackson, Bradley Pritchard and Dorian Dervite preferred as a central midfield partner for Dale Stephens in early November. After scoring for Chariton's second string in a game against Barnet on Monday 12th November, Hollands agreed a switch to Swindon two days later.

COYR sat down with the Londoner after training earlier this week to gauge his views on his start to life in Wiltshire and what he hopes to achieve before the New Year.

You have played three games so far since joining the club on loan from Chariton Athletic. How would you assess your spell at The County Ground so far?

I have really enjoyed it and the lads have been brilliant. Aside from the results everything has gone quite well. I would have liked to have had a few more points on the board but in general I have enjoyed every minute of my time with Swindon so far.



The training routine here at Swindon is probably a little different to what you've had before at other clubs. How have you found it?

It's been tough and as we didn't have a game last weekend, there was a lot of running last week to make sure everyones fitness levels were tip top. Personally I feel fitter and stronger for it and I am sure the rest of the lads do as well. Every manager has different techniques in the way that they do things and the gaffer here is very, very thorough in his methods.

The manager stated he wanted to the make the most of the free week with no FA Cup game last Saturday. Just how hard was the training?

We were told at the start of the week what was coming so all the lads knew what was coming! The longest distance we ran was 400m but we did quite a few of those. We ran throughout the five days training and it was all done for a purpose and for good reason. Like I said I feel stronger for it and hopefully that fitness work will pay off going into the Doncaster game and beyond.


Central midfield is a very demanding position fitness wise, have you always been a pretty comfortable runner?


In my position you're used to doing strides of the pitch so the fitter you are the easier it is to get up and down. Hopefully the work last week has done me some good and I am really looking forward to getting back into the thick of the action with a match.

You started your career with Chelsea. What was the regime like there when you started off and can you draw any similarities with the current managerial set-up here at Swindon?

Chelsea are a very big club and they've had some great managers, all of whom have their own way of doing things. Claudio Ranieri was there during my time there and was not too dissimilar in his ways to the gaffer here. Jose Mourinho came in after Ranieri and there wasn't so much running then which you had to adapt to. Overall I really enjoyed my time with Chelsea and it set me up for my career in the game really.

Training with the first team there helped me a lot and that was all part of my football education.





Which players that you came through the ranks at Chelsea with are still in the game?

Robert Huth and Carlton Cole are probably the stand-out ones that I can remember training and playing with. They were great players and training with the first team there helped me a lot and that was all part of my football education.

Who were your footballing heroes when you were growing up?

My footballing hero is Edgar Davids. Like myself, he is a left-footed central midfielder and he had a great career in the game. Frank Lampard was at Chelsea when I was there and his goalscoring record is one of the best in the game, so I tried to learn from him in terms of the way he arrives in the box. They both had, and in Frank's case continue to have, great careers at the top level and any player would want to try and learn off them.

Were you surprised to see Edgar Davids pop up at Barnet in League Two?


I thought he was finished playing wise but he's made a comeback hasn't he? He has done a good job since he has gone there though and has helped them turn things around a little.

Looking at your own start with Swindon against Yeovil, it was a decent result but we haven't quite kicked on from there yet...

It was a great result to start off with but it's been a bit of a personal disappointment that we didn't get more from the games against Brentford and Notts County. If you look at the stats we didn't do badly and perhaps should have taken more points, but football is a results business.

Charlton Athletic won League One last season and you played a big part in that with 46 appearances. What do you think it takes to get out of this division?

It's a very tough league to get out of. You have to go to some horrible places and

can't always get the ball down and play football. Last season teams would regularly come with five in midfield and try and make it very difficult for us to break them down. Luckily enough for us we adapted our game a bit and came through. Winning promotion was a great achievement. I can see similar qualities in the side here at Swindon. There are quality players who can unlock defences and we have some great defenders here too.

Today's game against Doncaster Rovers provides the perfect opportunity to get back to winning ways after back to back defeats. What are you expecting?

It's a massive, massive match. We all feel nice and fit and the last two results were especially disappointing given they were against teams close to us in the league. If we play to our full potential and a few things go for us, more so than they have done over the last few games, then I'm sure we can get a result.

Being back at home could be an important factor too. What have you made of The County Ground so far?

The fans have been brilliant in both games to be honest with

you. Against Yeovil we scored a few good goals and it was an impressive performance. I am sure the fans will have been happy with that result but we didn't manage to reach those levels against Brentford. A win against Doncaster would give everyone a bit more confidence going into the all-important Christmas period.


Speaking of being back at home, how have you found the short-term relocation from London?

I am enjoying things overall but it was hard to leave my family behind in London. My wife has been great with the kids but I have been fully focused on how things run here at Swindon. I feel like I have adjusted to what the manager wants from his players and I really feel a part of what's going on here.

Your loan deal is up in early January. Is it too early to look beyond then or are you taking each game as it comes?

What happens beyond January is out of my hands really. I will continue to train hard and give it everything I have when I get out onto the pitch and take things from there. The priority is a win against Doncaster to get us back up to where we want to be.


Premier Bound...

TWO goals to the good at half-time. County cruised this game to complete their sixth away victory on the trot on this Sunday fixture, but there was an element of 'what might have been' about the encounter.

Tommy Johnson had already given indication of his intent in front of goal before he placed the ball underneath. Nicky Hammond just before the half hour mark, then Mark Pembridge grabbed the second from a free kick on the edge of the box five minutes before the break.

The brace left the Rams in control of the game, and when Martin Kuhl crashed a 25

yarder passed Hammond for the third on 57 minutes many at the County Ground would have thought the result was a foregone conclusion.

But there was plenty of drama still to come before the final whistle

With John Moncur and Steve White replacing Summerbee and Dave Mitchell the game was just three minutes from the end when Micky Hazard nodded home a Hoddle free kick for Town.

Immediately County's Paul Kitson broke down the left and arrowed over a cross to Ted McMinn who made the score 4-1.

Then at the other end once more Craig Maskell intercepted a poor clearance and curled the ball home from the edge of the box.

Incredibly the drama was still not over.





Liverpool are a quality side and they had a huge lift with the first goal. They scored two quick ones but all credit to our lads because they kept going right until the end. I said before the game that if we were going to get anything from the evening then we probably needed nine or ten top performances from our lads, whilst also catching Liverpool on an off night.

That's the FA Youth Cup over for another season but there were some fantastic goals scored in the early rounds and the challenge now is to return to the league against Oxford United and get straight back to winning ways.

The Promotion Story...

As Town's 1962/63 promotion campaign moved from one year into the next, COYR continues the look back at the fortunes of Bert Head's men...

AFTER scoring 12 goals in their last four league games, Bert Head's side next headed for the south coast and a fixture with Bournemouth and Boscombe Athletic where they played out a 0-0 draw.

On 15th December, Barnsley were the visitors to The County Ground in what was the final home fixture before Christmas and the final home fixture of 1962. Goals in either half from Mike Summerbee and Jack Smith were enough to see off the Tykes 2-1 despite a late consolation strike.


On Boxing Day, Swindon made the trip north to play Bradford Park Avenue. Unfortunately a double from Derek Williams handed the home side a 2-0 win. Interestingly, that was the last time that Town played at Park Avenue; Swindon's promotion combined with Bradford's relegation and subsequent rejected re-election to the Football League in 1974 meant that Swindon's defeat in 1962 was the last fixture played at Park Avenue between the two sides.

As the season entered 1963, freezing conditions across the Christmas and New Year period resulted in several games falling

foul of the weather. As a result, Bert Head's side next stepped out onto the field of play in a home tie against 6th-placed Queens Park Rangers on 12th January 1963. Clearly the festive period must have re-energised the Robins: lying a place below QPR in the Division Three table, the Town produced a stellar performance, putting five goals past their West London opponents without reply and farmously tackled the icy conditions by donning basketball shoes instead of normal football boots.

Jack Smith opened the scoring before the break and Don Rogers added a second just after the hour mark. In the final ten minutes, Bobby Woodruff notched a third goal and Smith completed his hat-trick with two strikes in the final three minutes. The result took Town above the visitors and shot them up to second place in the table.

Swindon had to wait until the 26th January to play their next fixture, an FA Cup third round tie at Luton Town. A double from Cliff Jackson secured Town a 2-0 win and sealed their progress into the next round where they would face the might of First Division side Everton at The County Ground.

By Train: The Metrolink line from Manchester to Oldham is available and the closest Metrolink station to Boundary Park is Freehold which is around a 30 minute walk away. The nearest railway station is Mills Hill, which is a similar walking distance away from the ground. Both of these services depart from Manchester Victoria. If arriving from the South at Manchester Piccadilly railway station, then catch a Bury bound tram from the adjacent Metrolink station for Manchester Victoria. If your train ticket takes you through to Oldham then the cost of the Metrolink is included.

By Car: Leave the M62 at Junction 20 and take the A627(M) towards Oldham, Take the second slip road off the A627(M) following the signs for Poyton (A663). At the top of the slip road you will find a large roundabout that around it has a McDonalds and a KFC. Turn left at the roundabout onto the A663 towards Royton, Boundary Park will be visible on your right. Take the next right hand turn into Hilbre Avenue which will take you up to the large club car park, situated behind the demolished stand.

Staying Over...

Central Premier Inn: Oldham Central Premier Inn is closest to the stadium and is just 150 yards away. Oldham town centre is only two miles away or there is a retail park within walking distance. There is also an onsite Brewers Fayre restaurant serving a range of pub classics.


