




It is a small sacrifice to make, but footballers have to live with it as these games can play a big part in having a successful season so we have to apply ourselves properly, put the work in and be dedicated.

Short Term Loan...

Alex Cisak is back at Latics after the shortest of loan spells with npower League One rivals Portsmouth, writes Tony Bugby.

The Aussie goalkeeper had only been at Fratton Park club for one week when he was dramatically recalled to Boundary Park.

"I received a tweet saying Dean Bouzanis had been sent off at Doncaster so I knew I would be returning to Latics because of the 24-hour recall clause they had," he explained.

Though Cisak played only one match for Pompey in a 1-1 draw at Coventry City, he believes his return to first-team action benefited Latics.

"It meant I got some match practice before our FA Cup tie so it was a win-win situation. It got me a game and sharp for when I played for the game against Doncaster," he continued.

The 23-year-old Cisak kicked off his second season with Latics as No 1 only to lose his place to Dean Bouzanis in mid-September.

After two months out of the first-team spotlight, Cisak jumped at the chance to join Portsmouth on a one-month emergency loan after Mikkel Anderson returned to Premier League Reading after a three-month spell at the South Coast club.

Cisak said: "Like any young keeper, I want to be playing games which is why I jumped at the chance of the loan move to Portsmouth.

"You don't want to be sat on the bench which is why I would accepted a loan move to whatever club. The fact it was a club of the size and stature of Portsmouth made it easy and it was an honour to play for them."

Cisak's debut and only one match for Pompey was in a 1-1 draw at Coventry City where they ended a run of seven successive defeats.

He said: "It stopped our losing run and it turned out to be a good point as Coventry are in great form at the moment.

"We fell behind and were under the cosh

and I made a number of key saves to keep us in the game. We kept battling and were rewarded with a 93rd minute goal from Izale McLeod."


Cisak added it was his first appearance at Coventry's Ricoh Arena which has been their home since 2007 and he was impressed with the stadium.

"It was a great experience to play at the ground which has a good surface. There was a nice, big crowd of over 11,000 and I enjoyed the day," he continued.


Cisak never got to play a home game on his loan spell at Fratton Park though he says he played there at the start of the season for Latics which again was a terrific experience.

He was impressed with the set-up at Pompey saying it is sad to see them falling on hard times. It is hard to believe they won the FA Cup in 2008 and reached the final again two years later. They also graced the Premier League until 2010. Cisak says he has no qualms about being back at Latics and his challenge is to keep hold of the No 1 spot.

"I am under contract to Latics and this is where my heart lies. I am back in the

team and I will be playing as hard as I can to keep the spot," he explained. Cisak was pleased he marked his return with victory against Doncaster which helped set up a third-round tie at Nottingham Forest.

He said: "When we conceded a goal in the first five minutes I thought here we go again.

"After a sloppy opening 20 minutes, we worked hard and showed great determination to get back into the game." Cisak is also looking forward to playing at npower Championship club Nottingham Forest in early January.

He said: "We would have loved another trip to Liverpool because those occasions don't come along very often.

"Forest is a big club and we will go there looking to win. It will also be a good day out for the fans."

Cisak added that it was a great experience to play at Anfield and put himself in the spotlight

He said: "The beauty of the FA Cup is that it puts players from lower divisions in the shop window.

"Look at DJ Campbell who got his move after scoring goals for non-league Yeading in their cup run some years ago." Cisak, who is still only 23 years of age, says he is still a babe in goalkeeping terms. He explained: "They say goalkeepers develop four or five years behind outfield players so I am still only aged 18/19. "And when you see goalkeepers David

James, Mark Schwarzer and Brad Friedel playing beyond 40, I could still have 17-plus years ahead of me if I can keep my body in shape."

Cisak already has the experience of over 100 career appearances for non-league Tamworth, Accrington Stanley and Latics for whom he played 47 games in his debut campaign.

It was back in 2004 when Cisak joined Leicester City having grown up in Hobart, Tasmania.

And the whole of the Cisak family – parents Adam and Anna and younger sister Ewelina – relocated from Down Under to help him.

"I really appreciate what sacrifices they made to help me succeed," he said. Cisak has also had to deal with adversity after sustaining a serious wrist injury which kept him out for 18 months and which at one stage threatened his career. It was sustained in the warm up before Leicester's FA Cup tie against Crystal Palace.

"The physios told me my career was over so I was thinking at the age of 19/20 what I was going to do with my life. It was a difficult and depressing time," he continued.

Cisak added it was hard trying to get fixed

up with a new club after being released by Leicester when clubs became aware of his wrist injury.

"Accrington were the only ones to take a chance and the rest is history," he continued.

Cisak was a regular in the Accrington team in the second half of the 2010/11 campaign which coincided with an upturn in their fortunes

He said: "When I broke into the team, they were fighting relegation and we ended up making the promotion play offs.

"We had a great run of results and it was a great experience being part of it." It was during this spell that Cisak came to the attention of Latics who signed him in the summer of 2011 for an undisclosed fee. He is one of a four strong Aussie contingent at Boundary Park - he is joined by fellow keepers Bouzanis and Liam Jacob and midfield man James Wesolowski Cisak, who has played for Australia at under-20 level, says he is not looking at furthering his international career. He said: "It is always proud to represent your country, but I am simply concentrating on playing and doing well for Latics. "I will continue to work hard and keep my head down. I love it here and, if I play well for Latics, everything else will take care of itself."

Jonathan Secret

Do you have a hero in your life, sporting or otherwise?

Do you play other sports and if so is there one that you excel at?

No..I do not seem to have the time with having a young family. My brother (Mathew) is very good at cricket. He plays for Thornaby CC, a local club in Stockton near Hartlepool.

Were did your football career first take its shape?

What is the changing room banter like at Boundary Park?

It is very good. There is always a lot of mickey taking going on. You have to be thick skinned to be a footballer. But whenever there is something going off around the changing rooms you can bet your bottom dollar that Jose Baxter and Lee Croft are involved in some way. They are like a double act.

Matt Derbyshire's loan spell from Nottingham Forest will draw to a close after this afternoon's npower League One match against Swindon Town.

The striker, who was playing in the Champions League for Greek champions Olympiakos a couple of years ago, has provided some lasting memories.

Derbyshire has so far scored six goals for Latics, possibly seven as there is some dispute as to the one at Colchester last Saturday. He would have hit double figures had a further four not been chalked off when replays clearly showed they were all onside.

After finding himself out of favour at Forest, Derbyshire has welcomed the chance to play regular first-team football as he has made 19 appearances for Latics. Derbyshire jumped at the opportunity to sign for Latics as he found himself out of favour at Forest where he was one of eight strikers at the City Ground.

He said: "If you are not playing regular football, you can quite easily be forgotten and that is what happened to me over the last couple of years.

"I had been out through injury and nobody therefore knows where you are and what you are doing. "I am grateful I have had the chance to play 19 games, hopefully 20 including today, for Oldham Athletic."

Derbyshire added that playing games and regaining

match sharpness was the main objective of the loan spell and the goals have been a bonus.

"It has been nice to score a decent number of goals and I have also stayed fit so there have been a lot of positives," he said.

Derbyshire has enjoyed his front partnership with Jose Baxter saying he would love to play alongside him again in the future.

He said: "He is unselfish and works hard off the ball which I also like to do. He is perfect to play alongside.

"Jose drops back in the hole when we don't have possession and picks up the ball and is always looking to put players through on goal and it has been a great partnership."

Derbyshire also thanks Latics' manager Paul Dickov for bringing him to Boundary Park.

He said: "I would like to thank the gaffer for bringing me here and putting his faith in me and for playing me week in, week out.

"Thanks also to the lads for making me so welcome over the last three months. I have enjoyed my time here."


Derbyshire also believes Latics can have a successful season.


He continued: "I have been surprised by the standard of players here – there are no bad ones.

The 21-year-old goalkeeper, who hails from Shepherd's Bush, is a former Fulham trainee who had two years at Crystal Palace where he headed out on loan to Bromley, Boreham Wood, Histon and finally Swindon. Having arrived at the County Ground as cover for injured Phil Smith, Foderingham's form was such that he persuaded manager Paolo Di Canio to make the move permanent last season.

Matt RITCHIE

The subject of a reportedly huge transfer bid from Bournemouth last season, the former Portsmouth trainee is renowned as one of the finest wingers in lower-league football.


Aged 23, Ritchie graduated through the academy ranks at Portsmouth and made a Football League debut while on loan at Dagenham in 2008. He impressed Daggers boss John Still during his initial spell, scoring on his first start, and after completing a full season at the club returned to Fratton Park to be rewarded with a fresh two-year contract.

Notts County secured Ritchie's services for the first half of the 2009-10 season, before he switched to Swindon, initially on loan, under boss

Danny Wilson.

The following campaign saw the player again move temporarily to the County Ground and after excelling, the club signed him permanently on a two-and-a-half year contract on January

7th, 2011. Ritchie has continued to flourish under the guidance of Paolo Di Canio. As the Robins claimed the title in style, the winger won the individual award as League Two's player of the year.



FOCUS...

James COLLINS

Collins was hot property before he made the move to Swindon for the start of this season:

The 22-year-old striker made his way through the academy structure at Aston Villa but, despite at one time being named in a squad to travel to Rapid Vienna in a UEFA Europa League clash, he didn't make a first-team appearance for the club.

Collins' first loan spell was at Darlington in October, 2009, on a threemonth basis. He scored two league goals before returning to Villa. The forward then linked up with Aberdeen on a trial at the start of the 2010-11 season, but ultimately remained at Villa Park.

A loan at Burton was successful in October, 2010, bringing with it two goals in his first three games for the Brewers.

Collins made a permanent move to Shrewsbury at the start of 2011 and early in the following season his name rose to prominence thanks to a goal against Premier League Club Arsenal in the League Cup.



Danny HOLLANDS

The arrival of a player who made his name at Bournemouth on loan is one that gives the Robins plenty of experience of life in a successful League One club's engine room.

Hollands (27) started his career at Chelsea as a trainee, where he turned professional in November, 2003.

The Ashford-born midfielder was captain of both the Blues' youth and reserves sides but had to wait until a loan at Torquay before making a professional debut.

Hollands made a total of 10 appearances for United, scoring once as the club survived relegation to the non-league ranks on the last day of the 2005-06 season.

After being released by Chelsea, Hollands moved to Bournemouth on a two-year contract ahead of the 2006-07 campaign.

He went on to make a total of 219 appearances for the Cherries across five seasons with the club, before opting not to renew his deal after the club failed to make it into the Championship through the play-offs.

Charlton acquired his services at the start of a 2011-12 season which

Aden Flint


The former Alfreton Town defender is an England 'C' international, who signed for Swindon at the start of the 2010-11 season.

Flint (23) had a spell back at Alfreton during his first campaign at the County Ground, but he has featured 14 times in League One this season.

Joe Devera

Of Venezuelan origin, Devera (25) made his name in professional football at Barnet, where he established himself as a dependable right-back.

Making a debut for the Bees in 2005, he spent the next six years at the club before moving to Swindon in June, 2011.



Troy Archibald-Henville

A summer signing from Exeter, Archibald-Henville is a versatile player who can operate equally at centre-back or at the base of midfield.

The Tottenham trainee (24) helped Exeter into League One during his first spell on loan at the club in 2008-09 and eventually made that move a permanent one.

Darren Ward


Now 34, the experienced centre-back is currently on loan at the County Ground from Millwall.

Ward is in his second spell at The Den and has made more than 200 league appearances for the Lions in a career which has seen also him represent first club Watford, Crystal Palace, Wolves and Charlton.

Simon Ferry

The Scottish midfielder, born in Dundee, began his career with Celtic but after not featuring for the first team decided to try his luck down south.

The 24-year-old signed for Swindon after spending the 2009-10 campaign on loan at the club and continues to be a pivotal figure.



Alan Navarro

The 31-year-old became a Swindon player during the summer, swapping life in the Championship with Brighton for the County Ground.

Liverpool-born midfielder Navarro started off at Anfield and after moving to Tranmere, he has also represented Accrington, Macclesfield and MK Dons.

Tommy Miller


Miller (33) made Swindon his seventh professional port of call when signing for the Robins on a free transfer during the summer.

Fresh from aiding Huddersfield's ascension to the Championship, the industrious former Hartlepool, Ipswich and Sheffield Wednesday man brings know-how to Swindon's midfield.

Adam Rooney

The Republic of Ireland under-21s international is on loan at Swindon from Birmingham, the club he signed for after a prolific three-year spell north of the border with Inverness.

Rooney (24) was born in Dublin and started his career in England with Stoke City.



Gary Roberts

Now 28, winger Roberts is a winger who pushed through the ranks in Wales before becoming a highly effective player at Accrington.

ROD THOMAS: Welsh international right-back who followed Dave Mackay to Derby County in November 1973. Later with Cardiff, Gloucester and Newport County, he became a publican in Stroud.

JOHN TROLLOPE: Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss

JOE BUTLER: Versatile midfielder who netted 18 goals in 362 League games prior to joining Aldershot in August 1976, then played for Witney Town. He has since run his own taxi firm in Swindon.



LEIGH BARNARD: Midfielder who joined Cardiff City in October 1989. He rejoined Swindon as community officer, then coached in the United States and now teaches at Abbotsfield School in Hillingdon.

DAVE COLE: Central defender who netted three goals in 69 League games, moving to Torquay in November 1986, then Rochdale and Exeter. He then worked at a jeweller in Cheltenham, settling in Wales.



Latics recovered from a nightmare start to their secondround tie against Doncaster Rovers to record a resounding 3-1 victory in this FA Cup 2nd round tie.

It was not so much the victory, but the quality of the performance for the last 70 minutes which stood out as Latics outplayed the team which is joint top of npower League One.

Robbie Blake's early goal for Doncaster was cancelled out by Reece Wabara's header in first half stoppage time. Matt Derbyshire then took centre stage in the second period scoring twice in the space of seven minutes to seal victory which could even have been more emphatic given Lee Croft and Cristian Montano both hit the crossbar.

Doncaster took the lead in the fourth minute following an unfortunate slip by Wabara let in David Syers on the



right and he cut the ball back for Blake to fire Doncaster ahead. Latics were certainly wobbling in those early stages and only a terrific save from Cisak to turn over a Syers shot prevented the visitors from establish a 2-0 advantage.

Athletic were twice denied by the crossbar as Croft and Montano struck the frame of the goal. Montano had earlier been released by an exquisite pass from Jose Baxter only to see his lob land on the roof of the net. But in first half stoppage time, Wabara came up with a timely equaliser, his first goal for the club, as he headed home Baxter's free kick from six yards.

Latics went off at the break with the momentum in their favour and they continued where they left off in the second period.

They carved out a series of chances

after the restart with home keeper Gary Woods saving well from Croft while Baxter and Derbyshire also had openings.

Latics' patience and perseverance paid off as they took the lead for the first time in the 70th minute after a neat passing move which ended with Dean Furman's shot being parried by Woods as Derbyshire slotted home the rebound from close range. It ended a run of nine games without a goal and it was rather like waiting for an eternity and then two buses arriving simultaneously as he struck again seven minutes later.

This time the passing move was slick as Latics carved a way through the Doncaster defence with Furman, having an excellent game, squaring the ball from the left for Derbyshire to slot home.



ELM PARK

For the football fan over the age of forty football, as we know it, has changed dramatically in recent years.

Many of the famous old 'Grounds' have disappeared; here game by game we re-discover the famous stadiums of the Football League.

Elm Park was the home of Reading football club for 102 years. Elm Park was home for the Royals until the move to the Madejski Stadium.

The first game was held on 5th September 1896 between Reading and A Roston Bourke's XI - which saw Reading leading 7-1 before the match was prematurely ended due to torrential rain. The final competitive match at Elm Park saw Reading play Norwich City on 3rd May 1998. The ground consisted of four stands: North (known as Norfolk Road), South (Tilehurst Terrace, also referred to as the South Bank), West (Tilehurst End) and East (Reading End, also referred to as the Town End). Both the North and South Stands were covered, while the east and west stand were uncovered terraces. The East Stand was reserved for away supporters, as well as a small section of the North Stand.

The record attendance was achieved in 1927 when 33,042 watch Reading beat Brentford 1-0 in the fifth round of the 1926/27 FA Cup. As a result of the Taylor Report, Reading were forced to implement changes to the ground which reduced the capacity to 14,800. Elm Park, however, was representative of a very different time. It was clear by the start of the 1990s that it would need to be either replaced

altogether or renovated beyond recognition, and the arrival of John Madejski at the club granted the opportunity. By the middle of the decade, Reading were knocking at the door of a place in the Premier League and, despite the occasional lick of paint, Elm Park didn't fit with this vision.

UNUSUAL FACT

Most fans know Reading as either the Royals or the Royal Blues. However in the early days Reading carried the nickname 'The Bender Boys'. However, even I am not getting involved in this one. Thankfully it was dropped in the early nineteen twenties.

LATICS AT ELM PARK

Athletic and Reading faced each other on 15 occasions at Elm Park. Reading winning 10 times, Latics triumphing on just four occasions with one game finishing as a draw. The games produced 56 goals averaging 3.5 goals a game. Latics' best performance was a 3-1 win in 1995 thanks to goals from Graeme Sharp, Gunnar Halle and Lee Richardson.





U'S TURNED OVER IN ESSEX

Latics produced one of their most complete performances of the campaign registering a 2-0 npower League One victory at Colchester United.

Goals from Jean-Yves M'voto and Matt Derbyshire didn't do justice to dominant Latics who triumphed for the first time in eight visits to the Essex club. The first win at Colchester since 2002 was fully merited as manager Paul Dickov explained: "At times our attacking play was devastating and we could have won by more but for their goalkeeper who gave a really good performance and was probably their man of the match.

Latics made a tentative start before they finally clicked into gear and carve out chances against opponents who looked low on confidence after recording only one win in their previous seven games.



Jonathan Grounds, overlapping on the left, was the first to test home keeper Mark Cousins after half an hour.

Latics made the breakthrough in the 33rd minute when M'voto powered home a terrific header from a Lee Croft corner. It was the centre back's second goal of the campaign, an unstoppable effort which went in off the underside of the crossbar. They were unlucky not to finish the half with a bigger advantage. Cristian Montano cut the ball back from the left for James Wesolowski, ghosting into the box from deep, to shoot wide when it looked as though he could not miss. Jose Baxter then had a goalbound shot blocked by Magnus Okuonghae.

Montano had a chance soon after the restart to increase Latics' lead, but scuffed his shot wide. Montano then forced a decent save from Cousins before the second goal came just after the hour.

Croft released Derbyshire with a delightful pass. He burst clear on the right and saw his shot partially blocked by Cousins before trickling over the line via a defenders heal. There was some doubt as to whether Jose Baxter got the final touch, but Derbyshire made it clear he was claiming his seventh goal of the campaign.

Croft and Montano both forced brilliant saves from Cousins while in stoppage time Latics ought to have won a penalty.

Baxter was clearly pulled back as he burst into the box and, to the amazement of everyone at the Weston Homes Community Stadium, Referee Ian Williamson waved play on.
