
In reflection...



THE 20-year old goalkeeper has made 17 appearances this term after wrestling the number one shirt away from Adam Collin. Newcastleborn Gillespie joined the club on a YTS contract in the summer of 2008, having previously been a part of the Newcastle United academy. An injury to first-team keeper Lenny Pidgeley saw him promoted to the first team squad in February 2010,

taking his place on the bench for the League One clash here at The County Ground. His eventually made his Carlisle debut at Norwich City in a 2-0 win in May 2010. That appearance made him the youngest ever goalkeeper in the club's history at 18 years and 42 days, beating the previous record set by Carlisle current goalkeeping coach Tony Caig in 1992.

Midfielder - James Berrett

MIDFIELDER James Berrett scored the only goal in Carlisle's last game at The County Ground with a 29th minute effort that secured all three points in a 1-0 triumph. Berrett arrived at Carlisle in 2010 and became Greg Abbott's fifth signing of that summer. Berrett, 23, came through the Huddersfield Town Academy and made his first appearance for the Terriers at the

end of the 2006/07 campaign. He made over 40 appearances at the Galpharm and has also played for Ireland at Under-18, U19 and U21 level. This term the midfielder has been a regular for the Cumbrians and scored his first goal of the campaign in a 4-2 home win over Portsmouth in September. His only other goal came in an FA Cup win over Ebbsfleet.



Forward - Lee Miller

UNITED completed the signing of Middlesbrough forward Miller on a two-year deal in August 2011. Lanark born Miller began his career with Falkirk and scored 27 goals in 61 appearances for the Bairns before joining Bristol City for a fee of £300,000. He scored eight goals in 50 league appearances in a twoyear stay at Ashton Gate. A loan spell with SPL side Hearts

and moves to Dundee United and Aberdeen followed before moving south of the border again to Middlesbrough on the final day of the transfer window in February 2010. The Cumbrians swooped quickly to capture his signature when the Championship side indicated that the player could move on. Miller scored 15 goals in 37 appearances last season.

Club Connections...

The visit of Carlisle United to The County Ground this afternoon will bring back memories of those who have played for both clubs. Here's a look at some of them...

Stan Harland...

QUITE simply a Swindon Town icon, Harland signed for the club the day before the 1966 World Cup Final after manager Danny Williams had waiting overnight at Brunton Park to secure his signature. The half-back had made 77 appearances for Carlisle between 1964 and 1966 after a spell at Bradford. He racked up nearly 300 appearances for Town in a six-year stay at The County Ground. As club captain, he oversaw promotion back to the Second Division in addition to making a little bit of history by lifting the League Cup at Wembley on that March afternoon in 1969.

Alan Maues...

ANOTHER member of the Swindon Town Hall of Fame, Mayes scored 83 goals in two separate spells at The County Ground. Remembered for his partnership with fellow striker Andy Rowland, in his first stint he was part of the side that made the League Cup semi finals, beating Arsenal along the way, before departing for Chelsea. Brought back in 1983, the striker spent two further seasons at SN1 and signed for Carlisle in 1985. In one season at Brunton Park, Mayes scored two goals in ten appearances.

Steve Finney...

SIGNED by Steve McMahon in the summer of 1995, Finney made a huge impact, scoring on his debut at Hull City. In his first season at The County Ground, the striker weighed in with 16 goals as Town stormed to the Division Two title. He left on a free transfer at the end of the 1997/98 season and joined Carlisle. In just a season-long stay at Brunton Park, the striker made 33 appearances and scored six times before moving to Leyton Orient.

Mike Graham...

AFTER joining Swindon on a free transfer in July 1981 from Bolton Wanderers, the defender made a goal-scoring start to his Town career, netting in a 4-1 win over Wimbledon. He made 163 appearances in four seasons at SN1 before his release at the end of the 1984/85 campaign. In 1988 he moved to Carlisle United. He made nearly 140 appearances for the Cumbrians before departing Brunton Park in 1992.







The number of goals we have scored has been great, but they don't mean anything unless we are winning games.

AFTER making over 200 appearances for a Barnet side struggling at the wrong end of League Two, Joe Devera signed for Swindon Town in the summer of 2011 hoping to challenge at the right end of the table.

A year and a half later, the defender has a League Two winners medal to his name and played 90 minutes at Wembley in front of 49,000 as the Robins reached the final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. He also played in the FA Cup fourth round tie at Leicester City a year ago. All in all it has been a successful start to life at The County Ground for the 25-year old and having tasted success, he's now hungry for more.

Quiet off the pitch, Devera's presence on the field has certainly not gone unnoticed. He made a big contribution last season, making 35 appearances and scored twice – both in big wins against Dagenham and Southend. Although he's still to register his first goal of the 2012/13 campaign, Swindon Advertiser journalists Sam Morshead and Andy Warren opted for Devera as first goalscorer for a charity bet

ahead of Tuesday's big win over Portsmouth. Despite his lack of prowess in front of goal, defensive matters are far more of a priority for the 'futbolista', who was linked with a step up to the international stage with Venezuela prior to his move to SN1. COYR caught up with the defender on Wednesday afternoon to discuss his time at Swindon so far.

It's been a busy first half of the season for you - the win over Portsmouth made it back to back 5-0 victories for Town. Things are going well defensively at the moment aren't they?

It's been good but the most important thing is that we have taken three points from the last couple of games. The number of goals we have scored has been great, but they don't mean anything unless we are winning games. Thankfully the wins have been coming and everyone's happy.

What do you remember of the win over Tranmere before Christmas?



We started the game really well and got straight at them. We prepared for the match really well and we were all raring to go when it came to the Friday night. There were a lot of positives to take from the game and of course scoring five at home was fantastic. It was one of the standout performances of the season against a Tranmere side who had been flying. The atmosphere at the game was brilliant and it was great to send the fans home happy.

Did you expect to repeat the feat against Portsmouth?

It was one of those games when we weren't sure how they would come out. Izale McLeod had left and they had a couple of others out, but we stuck to our game plan and played well again. We had to deal with what they had in the opening half hour or so but we finished the game really well and 'Collo' did a lot of damage in the second half having come off the bench. It was another big win and the lads were really pleased with it.


You had some tough times during your Barnet days, so it must be nice to have been on the right side of some big wins?


I know what you mean, it's tough for Portsmouth at the moment and I am sure their players will continue to fight on. It's been a really difficult time for them but we are fighting for something too. You can't worry or feel for the opposition too much because we have jobs to do and that's winning games. I went through several relegation battles

before I joined Swindon and yes, it's nice to be challenging for promotion again this season. Portsmouth had some tricky players and brought on David Connolly in the second half, but for us, every clean sheet is as good as the next and it was great not to concede again.

The home form seems to be turning the corner now. How much pressure did you feel as players at the start of the season?

We carne into League One on the back of a fantastic season last year and there was some pressure, but we've knuckled down and have got things back on track. The pressure isn't off now though, far from it. There are different pressures depending where you are in the league. If The pressure isn't off now though, far from it.





you are in a side battling against relegation then that brings different challenges compared to going for promotion. We have worked really hard this season and I am sure that hard work will continue.

There were a number of new signings last summer and a few loanees have come in since then. How are you getting on with the rest of the squad?

It's been good. Every player adds something to the squad and whilst there is plenty of competition for places, that brings out the best in you. The loanees have come in and done well and a lot of the lads that were already here have all continued from where they left off last year. I get on with the lads pretty well and there's a car-sharing school with myself, Aden and Si going to and from training. It's not really a car share because we just use Flinty as a taxi service!

The County Ground has been a real fortress over the last few games. How have you found playing at home?

The results speak for themselves but we can't just look at the last two 5-0 wins and expect to be winning games now. We have to keep our focus and take each game as it comes because we have to keep the wins coming.


You have built up a decent central defensive partnership with Darren Ward recently, how have you found playing alongside him?



He has really good experience and it's been great playing alongside him. We have been working hard defensively and hopefully we can keep the clean sheets coming, whoever gets the nod to play at the back. Nathan Thompson and Alan McCormack have been at full-back over the last few games and they've played their part too. We have a competitive squad and that keeps you on your toes.

Your appearances haven't been limited to the heart of the defence this season. Tell us what it's been like playing at right or left-back?

I have been pleased to have been playing in a winning

team, that's the main point. Any footballer will say they just want to play regular games and I am no different. I prefer centreback but I don't mind playing at full-back. I had played left-back a couple of times before but if I can help the team then that's fine with me.

You're 26 next month, how would you assess your career so far?

It's been good. There is a lot of hard work but that's how it goes in football. I enjoyed my time with Barnet but the move to Swindon came at the right time and last season was fantastic. It was great to be a part of a title-winning side and we got to the cup final too.

And the history books will say you were Paolo Di Canio's first ever signing as a manager. June 2011 must feel like a long time ago now!

It does! A season and a half has passed and a lot has happened since then. I have really enjoyed my time here. When I first joined I wasn't used to training every day and whilst that's been tough it has helped me improve my game. It helps keep my focus and this is the fittest I have felt in my career.

What's been your favourite memory from your time with Swindon so far?


Although we didn't win the game, I am going to say playing at Wembley last season. It was great to reach the final and it would have been fantastic to have won it, but playing at Wembley was special to me. I used to drive past it everyday and always wanted a chance to play

It was a typical early season game. We were going through a difficult spell and it was a bit of a frantic opening up there. They've had a tough season which will make today's game all the more important.

What are you expecting from today's encounter?



Match Analysis...

James Collins scored four times as Town kicked off 2013 in style with a 5-0 demolition of Portsmouth at The County Ground.

THE striker notched a
12-minute hat-trick before
wrapping up the scoring while
Danny Hollands also registered his
second goal in two games.

Early on, Andy Williams and forward partner Chris Martin both saw efforts kept out by the Pompey goalkeeper before Wes Foderingham was forced to tip over Mustapha Dumbuya's dangerous cross.

The second half saw Collins take centre-stage. Introduced as a 60th minute replacement for Martin, it took the striker just one minute to find the net, heading home Matt Ritchie's accurately centred comer.

He added another five minutes later. A cross from the left was not cut-out by the defender allowing Collins to snaffle possession, turn neatly and plant the ball in the bottom corner of the net.

The former Shrewsbury man also turned provider for Town's third goal, laying the ball on for Danny Hollands who drilled home from 12 yards.

Just four minutes later, it was four. Ritchie did well to bring down a long pass before delivering a wonderful cross for Collins to nod home past Eastwood and into the corner.

With seven minutes to play, the summer signing notched a fifth goal for Town. Alan McCormack's cross from the left came all the way across to Collins who headed home past the helpless Eastwood.

was sent a document on Wednesday that made me stop for a second and just think "wow".

I don't know who put it together, or when, where or why, but I what I do know is it reiterated just how impressive last year was for Swindon Town.

According to this single piece of paper, if the city of Manchester was momentarily discounted from English football, Town would have been the most successful club of 2012.

Now obviously this is in the basest of terms, ignoring Premier League titles etcetera. But still. Wow.

The statistics read as follows: Swindon played 46 league games last year, taking 92 points in the process. That's an average of two points a game which, when you take into account the Robins have been playing as a newlypromoted side for half that period, is quite frankly ridiculous.

Twenty-eight wins accounted for the vast majority of that haul, eight draws rounded it up, and there were only 10 defeats. Just 10.

I remember not so long ago a 10-game losing streak was about as common as a winter cold at The County Ground.

But the facts don't stop there. Apparently, Town's defensive record - based on purely goals conceded - was second only to Manchester City in clubs in the Premier and Football League. You know, the team who've spent the best part of an oil well on foreign imports over the past 12 months. Astonishing.

Of course, stats like these don't necessarily mean anything. Manchester United didn't win a trophy in 2012 and still ranked the most successful club of the year on results alone.

However, it doesn't hurt to

take stock of exactly what we've witnessed, collectively, at Swindon Town over the past 52-and-a-bit weeks.

Talking of extraordinary performances, the red half of the County Ground press box went a little bit potty as James Collins took the term "supersub" to bonkers new levels on New Year's Day.

There were a few sore heads fumbling about for an introduction to a match report after 60 mundane minutes before the striker popped off the bench and wrote himself into the Town history books.

Four goals and an assist in 22 minutes is more Roy of the Rovers than, well, Roy of the Rovers. No Swindon player had ever managed a hat-trick as a sub before, let alone a quickfire quadruple.

It was hugely entertaining, and followed on from the 5-0 demolition of Tranmere before Christmas. We're all getting a bit spoiled for goals, aren't we?

Well consider this... in November 1965 the Robins managed five goals or more in three consecutive games. Reading were trounced 5-0, Merthyr 5-1 and Mansfield 6-2. What are the odds of a repeat this afternoon?

Even if by some unbelievable turn the Robins manage that absurd feat, which you wouldn't put past them at present, they'll have to go some to match the best three-game scoring run in the club's history.

That came in 1908 when Town notched 24 goals in three games, spread over two seasons. Now that would be something special.





PAUL Bodin popped up with the winner in this fight for a play-off place clash with Wolves on the last day of January, following on from his midweek goal at Grimsby where Town lost by two goals to one.

Martin Ling had struck lucky with a ball rebounding back to him on the right, allowing him to deliver a telling cross for Bodin to forcefully head home off a post past Wolves keeper Dave Beasant.

The decisive goal came in the 69th minute, by which time Town striker Craig Maskell had contrived to spurn a good chance just before half time. Steve White had combined well

with Bodin, whose cross flashed across the six yard box only for Maskell to place his shot wide.

The result could have been very different however, with the visitors hitting the woodwork three times, the first of which coming as early as the second minute from future Swindon front man Andy Mutch (Pictured).

Ex-England forward Steve Bull (Pictured) perhaps had the best chance to take a point back to the Black Country, but his header from ten yards went wide with around five minutes of the match remaining.

Goalscorer Bodin commented:

"They could have snatched a draw at the end. Maybe it was our turn for a bit of good fortune. We face a series of vital six pointers at home and we badly needed a win from this one."

The result saw Town lav seventh in the table on 41 points, while Wolves stood just one point behind, but three positions lower.

Carlisle Cup Classic...

COYR takes a trip down memory lane and revisits a famous cup encounter against today's opponents...

THE early part of January is traditionally reserved for the third round of the FA Cup but with both sides today no longer involved in that most famous of domestic cup competitions, COYR looks back at an FA Cup tie from 28 years ago that saw Town pull off a cup giantkilling.

Swindon were sitting in midtable in Division Four as the calendar ticked over from 1983 to 1984. Jimmy Quinn had rescued a point the week before at Peterborough United while the Cumbrians had drawn at home to Huddersfield.

After thumping Kettering Town 7-0 en route to Round Three, the draw pitted the Town against Second Division opposition in Carlisle United.

The two sides met at Brunton Park on 7th January, playing out a 1-1 draw. Jackie Ashurst put the home side in front only for Andy Rowland to equalise in the 68th minute and take the tie to a replay at The County Ground.

The following Tuesday,
Town produced an inspired

performance under the floodlights, putting their higher division opponents to the sword.

With five minutes to go before the break, Dave Hockaday flighted a deep cross from the right that found Jimmy Quinn at the far post, allowing the striker to guide home the opening goal with a diving header.

After withstanding a period of pressure early in the second half from the visitors. Paul Batty added a second with just over twenty minutes to play. His left-footed effort from 12 yards rattled through a crowd of players before nestling in the back of the net.

Alan Shoulder stroked home an effort from the penalty spot minutes later to give Carlisle hope and set nerves jangling among the home supporters around SN1.

With eight minutes to play, Andy Rowland collected a short free-kick on the edge of the area and hooked the ball into the corner of the net, securing a famous cup victory for Swindon.

The Journey...

By Train: The nearest train station is Pokesdown which is around one mile from the stadum and is around a 15 minute walk away. However, most trains arrive at Bournemouth Central, which is around a half an hour walk to the ground. Either try to get a train to Pokesdown or take a taxi. If you do arrive at Pokesdown Station, then exit and turn right down the main Christchurch Road (A35). Proceed for about 400 metres and then turn right into Gloucester Road. The Goldsands Stadium is located down the bottom of this road.

By Car: A 91 mile drive from The County Ground, the journey is a relatively simple one and follow the A338 towards Bournemouth. The ground is situated on the left of the A338 on the outskirts of town. You should be able to spot the tops of the ground floodlights on the left. Otherwise leave the A338 via the slip road which is sign-posted Kings Park/Football traffic. You will then reach a small roundabout at which you take the second exit into Kings Park Drive. The entrance to the stadium and car park are down this road on the left. Parking is available at the stadium.

Staying Over...

The Norfolk Royale: The

Travelodge in Boscombe is a cost-effective option for Town fans whilst The Norfolk Royale is a slightly more upmarket option. The Norfolk is an award winning premier AA four-star hotel and is ideally positioned within a short stroll of the resort's major attractions. If you want to blow the 2013 budget early on then try


