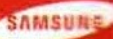

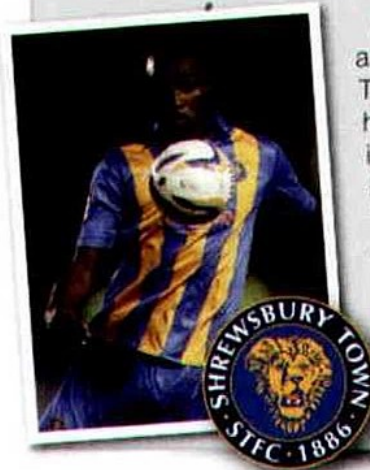
On team achievement...

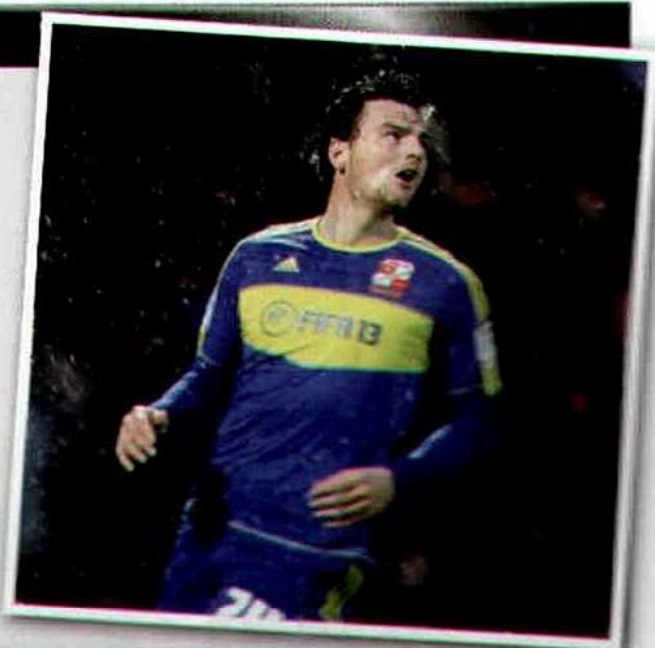
In reflection...

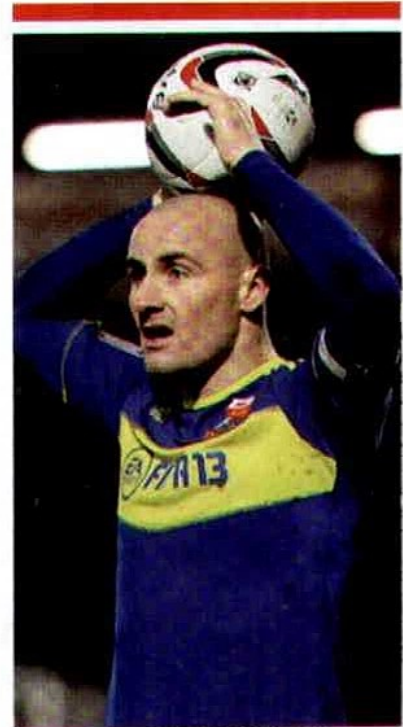

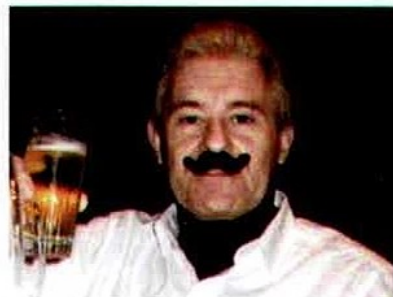

Board Report...

Good afternoon to what I believe is going to be a chilly afternoon.

MAY I first, take the opportunity to welcome to the County Ground, the directors, the guests, the football management, the team and the supporters of Shrewsbury Town FC. When we visited Shrewsbury earlier this season, it was a delightful, sun kissed late September day, what a contrast to today, but that is the four seasons for you!

The topic that will be on the minds of most supporters today is the recent BBC Radio Wiltshire story that relates to the club facing possible Administration! One could argue that the majority of clubs in the Football League live in fear of Administration as often so many rely on the very generous support of one key investor. For the past 24 months Swindon Town has been no exception, with Andrew Black assuming the mantle of key investor, when Sir Martyn Arbib and Andrew Fitton disengaged. For Andrew Black's on-going support we have to be extremely grateful.

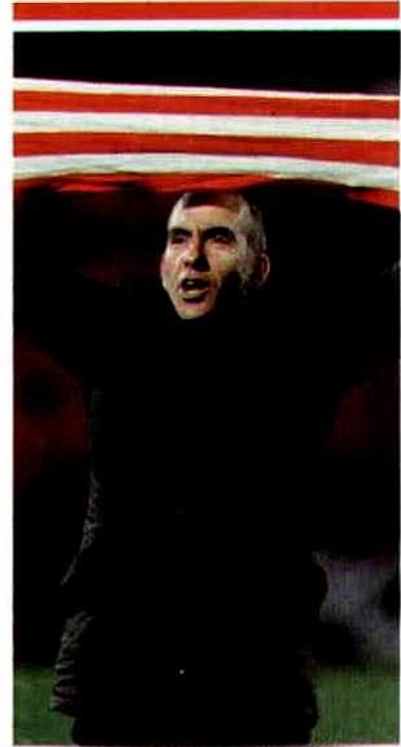
However, today we find ourselves in the position, faced by so many clubs, when your key investor declares his desire to exit the club and sell his controlling interest this is the precise position in which we find ourselves. There had been an expectation that Andrew Black would be in a position to continue his involvement thorough to the end of the season and witness the fulfilling of the ambition that was agreed upon in May 2012 i.e. promotion to the Championship. However, as any sailor will tell you, always be prepared for a sudden change in the weather and adjust the rigging accordingly. So since Andrew Black made his position known, the Board, with valuable support from professional third parties, has been actively involved in dialogue with a number of

interested parties. These dialogues continue apace.

Unlike a number of other clubs, Swindon Town is not weighed down by debt, the only debt is to the principal shareholders and in any transaction they have agreed these debts will be treated kindly. Furthermore, Swindon Town is a solid, well run club, its revenues for the year remain ahead of budget, the team is challenging for promotion and it is blessed with an exceptional team of people in every department, doing a first class job, so to any new investor it offers a real opportunity. For your part all we can ask is that you keep on supporting, keep calm and where there is a why there is a how! Right now, this is not Administration; it is a re-organisation of investors as we look for the how.

Away from all of the financial angst, well done to all of you brilliant supporters who braved the elements of last Saturday and witnessed a well-earned draw at AFC Bournemouth. Poor Paolo Di Canio got a drenching and inevitably contracted a miserable cold. Let's hope he is back in full voice for this afternoon's encounter. Last Wednesday evening I was at Leyton Orient for the final of the Samsung Win A Pro Contract final, Paolo was confined to his bed and could not make it but Fabrizio and Russell Slade made their selections and three finalists will be enjoying a week of boot camp at Leyton Orient and Swindon in early February. Good luck lads!

Good afternoon and let's hope the forecast is somewhat brighter in the weeks ahead.

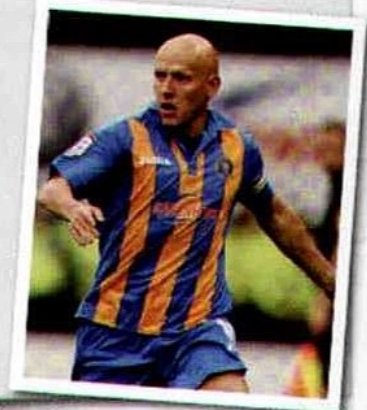
Midfielder – Matt Richards

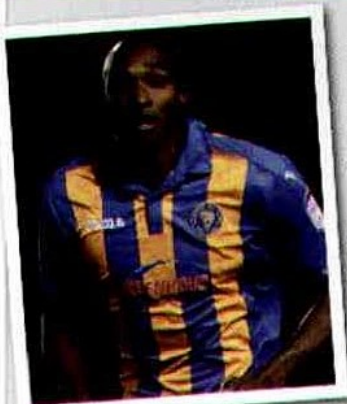

THE big frontman was Shrewsbury's first signing of the 2011 close season when he turned down interest from a number of clubs to move to the Greenhouse Meadow from Aldershot. He spent the first eight years of his football career in the non-league game with spells at Wealdstone, Woking and Yeading before Aldershot bought him for a record undisclosed fee in 2008.

Having impressed in a number of fixtures against the Shrews, manager Graham Turner was quick to land him when he became available. Morgan wasted no time to show Shrewsbury fans what he could do, scoring in early season League Cup fixtures over higher division Derby County and Swansea City. He went on to score 11 goals in league and cup. He has seven to his name so far this season.

Club Connections...

Ross MacLaren and Dave Hockaday are two names who have served both of today's clubs, as Tom Otrebski takes a look at those who have 'played for both'...

Chic Bates...

BATES has a connection with Town and Shrewsbury in both a playing and a coaching capacity. He enjoyed two spells at Gay Meadow as a player, making nearly 300 appearances. Sandwiched in between was a three year stint at The County Ground. He would go on to manage the Shrews in the late 1980s before returning to Swindon as assistant manager to Lou Macari and Ossie Ardiles during Town's leap from the Fourth to the Second Division.

David Geddis...

HAVING enjoyed First Division football with the likes of Aston Villa earlier in his career, Geddis moved to Shrewsbury Town in 1986. He bagged eleven goals in 39 appearances during his stay in Shropshire before moving south to SN1 in October 1988. He scored three goals that season including the winner against his former employers. The striker joined Darlington in 1990 having made 14 appearances for Swindon.

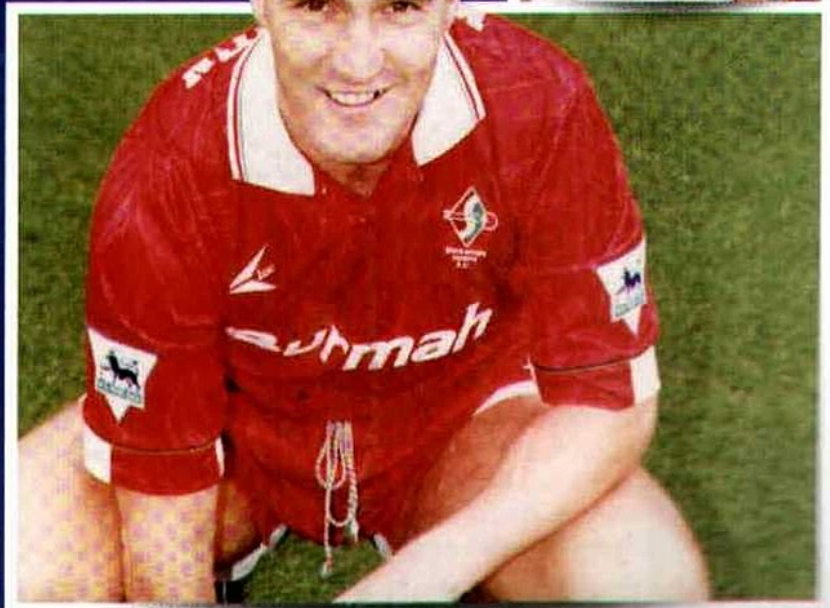
Ross MacLaren...

JOINED the Shrews from Glasgow Rangers in 1980. Made over 160 appearances in five seasons at Gay Meadow before a switch to Derby County. Brought to The County Ground by Lou Macari in 1988, MacLaren would go on to play in two Wembley play-off winning sides before becoming the first man to skipper the Town in the top flight during their solitary season in the Premier League. After his retirement from playing he moved onto Swindon's coaching staff.

David Hockaday...

BROUGHT to Swindon in 1983, the full back would serve the Town for eight

seasons. In his time at The County Ground, Hockaday would win the Fourth Division championship in 1986, clinch a second successive promotion in the 1987 play-offs and be part of the squad that won at Wembley in 1990. Joined Shrewsbury in 1993 and made 48 appearances for the Gay Meadow outfit before departing in 1995.

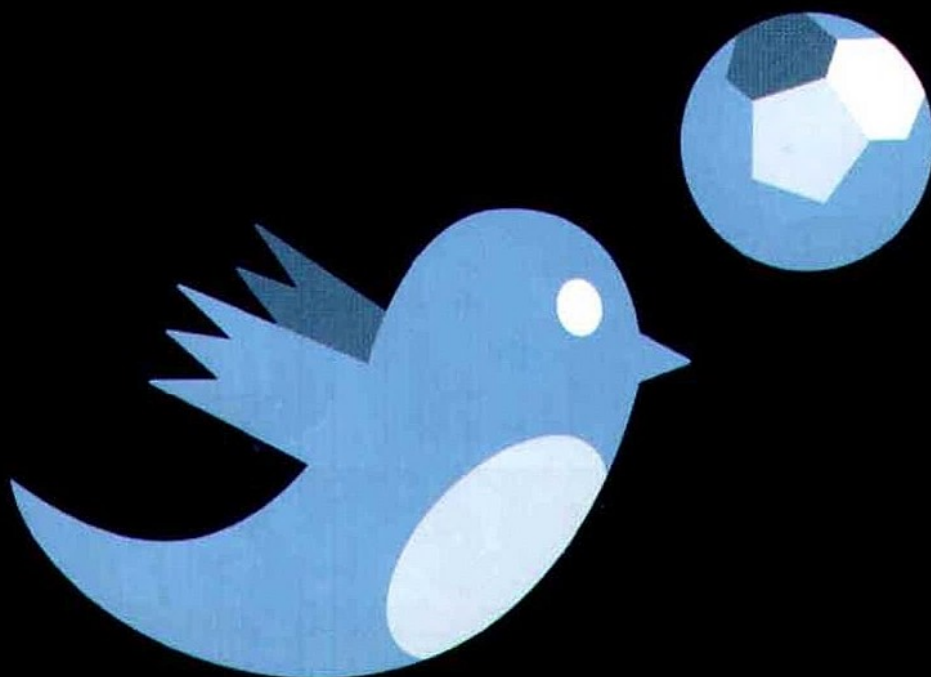

IT has been a challenging start to his Town career for Gary Roberts, but the winger is hoping Swindon fans will see the best of him in the second half of the campaign as the promotion quest gathers pace.

Signed in the summer on a free transfer after leaving newly-promoted Huddersfield Town, the 28-year old is determined to reach the second tier of English football in Swindon colours.

The winger arrived at The County Ground in mid-June and impressed on the tour of Italy before making several appearances in pre-season on home soil, including in the home friendly against Crystal Palace. However a serious calf injury saw him miss the first month of action before returning to the side in the 2-2 draw at Carlisle United in September.

Having been regularly involved over recent weeks, the wideman has now clocked up 22 appearances this term and was again threading through the ammunition for the likes of James Collins and Andy Williams at Bournemouth seven days ago. With the Robins gunning

for success this term, Roberts is hoping to be celebrating back to back promotions at the end of the campaign.

Let's start by talking about your time with Huddersfield. Was it a tough decision to leave the club so soon after their promotion having missed out before?

My mind was made up earlier in the season that I wanted to leave. As a professional you get on with the job but as things turned out the season finished on a high. I had four good years there and had a good relationship with the fans, the club and the manager. It was great to finish with a win at Wembley.

What is your favourite memory from your time with the Terriers?

There were some great times there and I think we had a 43-game unbeaten run at one point. We broke a lot of records and it was nice to be a part of. I think it will be a while before a Huddersfield side breaks some of those records that were set.



The Play-Off final must have been an incredible experience, especially scoring a penalty at the end!

It wasn't such a great game but it was a special day. To be down and out after missing the first couple in the shoot-out was difficult, but thankfully I managed to score in the shoot-out and we came back and got through it to win promotion at the third time of asking.

Having already decided to leave the club, how did you feel celebrating at the end of the game?

You get caught up in the moment but I had lost two years on the spin in the play-offs with Huddersfield to Millwall and Peterborough. I felt I should enjoy the celebrations just as much as anyone.

What was the biggest factor in your move to Swindon?

To be honest I spoke to a few other clubs and didn't really get a summer holiday because I was trying to get things sorted. It was the first time in my career that I had been out of contract and I decided to see what my options were. I came down to Swindon, met the manager and liked what his plans for the club were and the players that were coming in. I fancied a new challenge and Swindon was the place for me.

How much of a factor was the distance?

I obviously spoke to my family about it because you can't just cart them around the country willy-nilly. As it was it was the right deal and it was perfect for football reasons.

Your memories of The County Ground prior to joining were mixed weren't they?

Yeah, I scored a goal here a few seasons ago with Huddersfield in a 3-1 win back in 2008 I think it was, which was my first season with them. I try to remember that more than when I broke my arm in 2010! That was a big factor in my career but I have come back from it and I have tried to put it behind me.

The FA Cup game between Swindon and Huddersfield last season must have given you an indicator of what was going on at The County Ground...

Exactly, I remember the tempo Swindon played at that day and the work-rate of the team was really impressive. I don't think Huddersfield took the game as

seriously as they should have – but Swindon did really well and totally deserved to win the game.

You tore your calf muscle four days before the new season, must have been a big blow!

Pre-season was really hard but it went really well overall. I felt as fit as I had ever done going into a new season and the work we did in Italy was really beneficial. I was in tip-top condition and felt great going into the Palace game. I had a little niggle which developed into something worse and I missed quite a bit of action. I am fully fit now and am looking forward to a clear run and being regularly involved.

You are now fully fit and have been regularly involved of late. What was it like to play at Bournemouth last weekend given the torrential rain?

It was hard to run or change direction never mind kick the ball! It just shows how much character we have in the camp here because all the boys really got stuck in and we got the point. You will have seen the celebrations when Willo scored and everyone was delighted. Those are the games that you look back on at the end of the season and it could prove to be a crucial one. It brought us a little bit closer together too.

You scored seven goals last year in 45 appearances. Is it time to pull the trigger a little more?

You are right and I should be on seven or eight goals by now. I have hit the post a good few

times and have had a couple cleared off the line, as well as missing a couple of guilt-edged chances. I know I have to chip in with a few more goals and hopefully my luck will change in front of goal soon.

The balls you put into the box are often early deliveries. How is your understanding developing with the front players?

The players we have up front are all good in the air. It's similar to when I was at Huddersfield with Jordan Rhodes because he would always ask me to just get a touch out of my feet and then box it. He'd get on the end of so many of them and he was a

tremendous finisher. We have good strikers here and they have been scoring plenty of goals of late.

You have now made over 300 league appearances, but what has been the most important lesson you have learned as a professional?

I would say just to keep working hard and never ever get too down. You will have bad spells as a pro through injuries or not being selected but you can't let yourself get too down. It's the same when you enjoy some success because you cannot get too carried away – it's a fine balance.

The stats have made excellent reading of late for Swindon players and fans. How do you look at the current state of play?

The manager won't let anyone get above their station that's for sure. The results have been going well but after every game we still watch clips to try and keep improving. The gaffer keeps our feet on the ground and after the Shrewsbury game we have four away games on the spin, so it's going to be a tough period.

There have been some very promising signs this season. What do you make of the current Swindon Town squad?

I have been around a good squad over the past few years at Huddersfield and I have a similar feeling here with Swindon. It's a tight group and the work-rate on the training ground is fantastic. We have a special thing here and you can see the boys are quite close. The banter is good and we have a chance of achieving something this year.

Today we face Shrewsbury Town and the game at their place earlier in the season was quite tight. What do you remember of that one?

It was a hard game and they were tough to break down. We missed a few chances early doors but came away from there with the win. They are not the most flamboyant side we will face but they've lost just once in their last 11 games and will come here looking to continue that unbeaten run. They have drawn seven games in that period and will not be an easy side to take on. When teams come to The County Ground we need to get on the front foot and get at them from the off.

And how about a goal from yourself today...

Coupled with a win, that would be perfect, absolutely perfect...

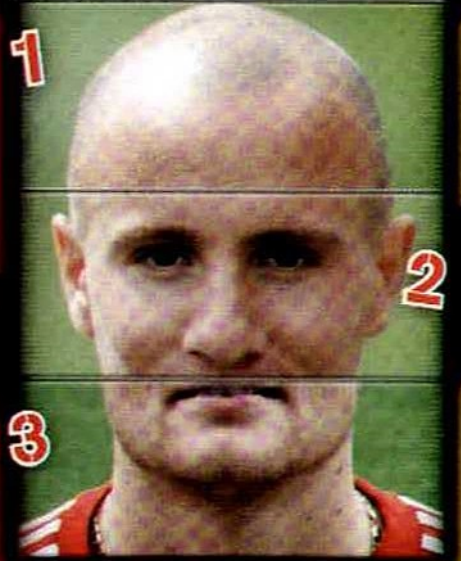

Earliest football memory...

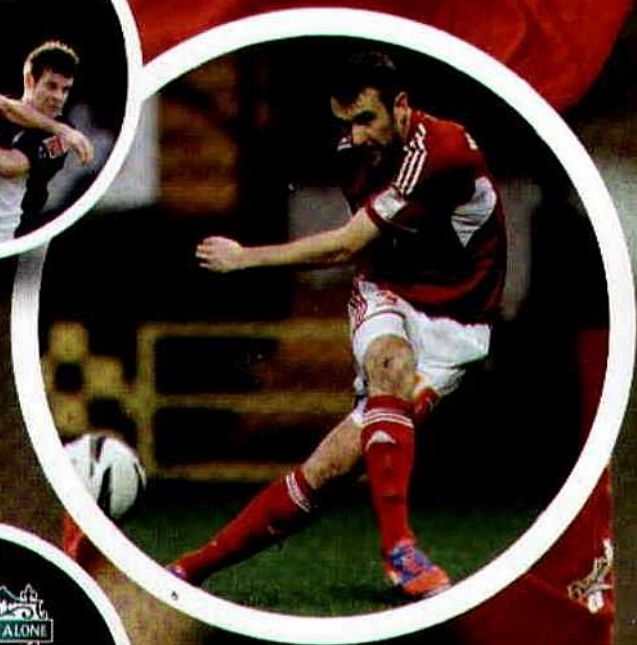

Favourite stadium played at...

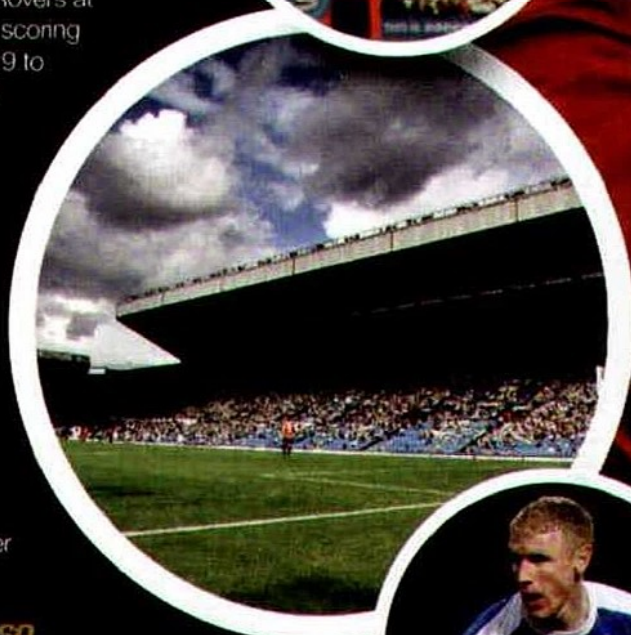
ELLAND Road. I played there when they had just won promotion from League One and the noise levels were incredible.

TODAY is our final meeting at The County Ground for three weeks as the Swindon Town roadshow travels up and down the country in pursuit of League One success.

It is certainly going to be a pivotal time if the Robins are going to make any sort of impact on the automatic promotion places come the end of the season, while a decent points haul is a must if the club are going to challenge for a play-off spot.

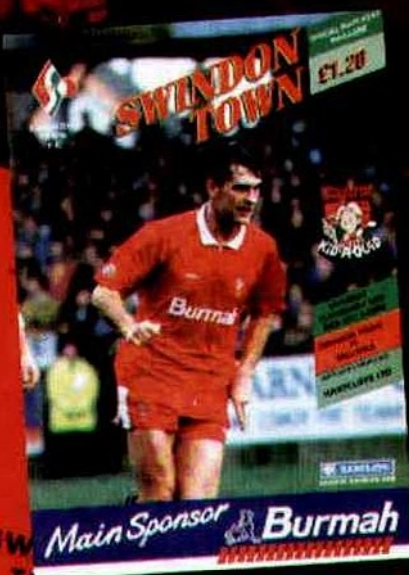

HIGH flying Millwall came to Swindon for this mid February game, with the Lions chasing an automatic promotion spot while Town looked to cement a place in the play-off frame.

The match though belied Millwall's position as the visitors made little impression on our rearguard. Keith Stevens fired a shot well over Fraser Digby's crossbar, before Town, and Glenn Hoddle in particular, dictated play.

The player/boss spotted keeper Kasey Keller's vulnerable positioning and struck a 35 yard free kick towards goal, only to see Keller scramble the ball

away. The reprieve was to be short lived.

As half-time approached Hoddle supplied the through ball for Steve White to place his 12 yard shot past Keller to give us the lead. Dave Mitchell just failed to double the advantage before Town left the field to a standing ovation.

Then it was time for the defenders to get in on the act. A clever dummy by Martin Ling saw Paul Bodin collect a Nicky Summerbee pass and hit a 20 yard left footer for his fourth goal in consecutive games.

Seven minutes from time a Summerbee corner was exquisitely flicked to the far post by Hoddle, where predatory centre back Shaun Taylor despatched his ninth goal of the season.

Taylor was happy. 'It's unusual for me not to score with my head and even more so to get one with my right foot.'

Bodin was happy. 'I love seeing the ball hitting the back of the net and I'm enjoying every minute right now.'

Hoddle was happy. 'It was one of our best all round displays of the season.'

It seems everyone was happy as Town finished the day in sixth place, four points ahead of seventh placed Grimsby.

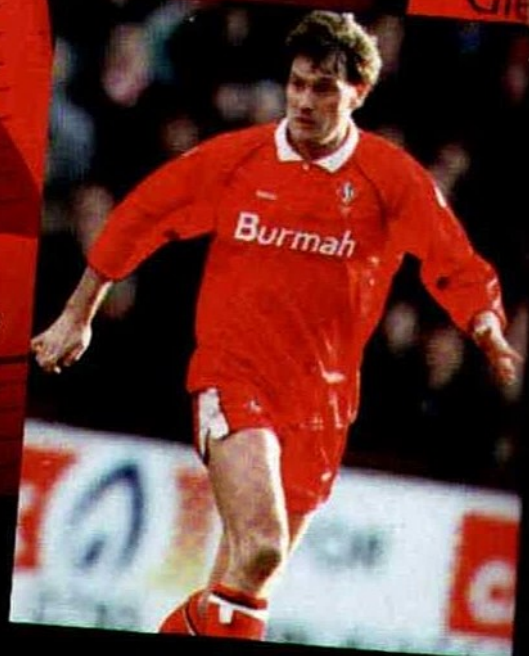

The Promotion Story...

After tussling with a Merseyside giant, COYR looks back on the first months of 1963 as Town rubber-stamped their promotion credentials by reaching the summit of the Third Division....

AT the end of January, Town continued their FA Cup campaign at home to First Division giants Everton. Having successfully negotiated a path through to Round Four, Bert Head's side faced a Toffees team that would go on to win the First Division title, remaining unbeaten at Goodison Park all season. Unfortunately for Swindon, Harry Catterick's men brought their top form to The County Ground, running out 5-1 winners. Four goals to the good at the break, Jack Smith's second half strike was a mere consolation for Town in front of over 26,000 at The County Ground.

The start of February saw a return to league action for Swindon as they welcomed Crystal Palace to SN1. A solitary goal from Arnold Darcy on the stroke of half time was enough to secure two points for Town and maintain their position in the top two of Division Three.

Further snowfall meant that the Robins had to wait until February

23rd to play their next fixture earning a valuable point in a 3-3 draw at Watford. Ernie Hunt equalised for Swindon before the home side edged 3-1 ahead. Mike Summerbee notched then Hunt scored his second of the afternoon with 15 minutes to play to secure an away point.

At the end of the month, the re-arranged Wednesday night trip to Wrexham saw them come away with another away point thanks to a goalless draw at the Racecourse Ground. Significantly, the point took the Town top of Division Three on goal average above previous pace-setters Peterborough United.

March began with a local derby double-header. Bristol City were the visitors to The County Ground on 2nd March and Town claimed the points coming back from two goals down to win. A penalty from Ernie Hunt got Town going and Mike Summerbee equalised just past the hour mark. With nine minutes to play, Jack Smith hit the winning goal.



The following Friday, Bert Head's men travelled to Reading and came away with their first away victory since the middle of November. Despite going a goal down after eight minutes, Ernie Hunt's 66th minute penalty hauled Swindon level. Ten minutes later, Hunt struck again to secure a vital away win for Town, keeping them top of Division Three.

The Journey...

By Train: The closest railway stations are Rock Ferry and Birkenhead Central, both link through to Liverpool Lime Street. From Rock Ferry station turn right and walk up Bedford Road until you reach a roundabout. Then turn right into Bebington Road and walk along this road until you reach the Sportsman pub. Then turn left into Prenton Road and you will reach the ground and away fans turnstiles on your left. From Birkenhead Central cross the road, turn right, then at the roundabout turn left onto Borough Road (A552) Heswall. Go through four sets of traffic lights and at the fifth roundabout, walk straight through onto Borough Road and the Ground is on the right hand side after passing the Prenton Park Pub.



By Car: From M6/M56 join the M53 and exit at Junction 4 and take the B5151 Mount Road from the fourth exit of the roundabout. The ground is then signposted. After two and a half miles when Mount Road becomes Storeton Road, turn right into Prenton Road West and the ground will be visible on the right hand side.

Hotel Villa Venezia: A family run hotel which has a small number of rooms and is close to the stadium as well as featuring a popular on-site Italian restaurant if you'd like to have an away day with a difference. A larger hotel option is The De Vere Village Hotel in Bromborough which has a large number of rooms, free wi-fi, a gym and a heated pool.

Pizzeria: There is a pizzeria at Villa Venezia which is a popular destination whether you arrive in time for a full lunch or only have time for a quick pizza. There is a car park on site and the menu includes pasta, pizza and plenty of seafood!

In their place three new stands were built to take the capacity to almost 17,000. Swindon fans will be housed in the Cowshed Stand which is behind the goal and can hold up to 2,500 away fans. The stand is a fairly new stand and has uninterrupted views of the match and the concourses include fast food and a licensed bar.

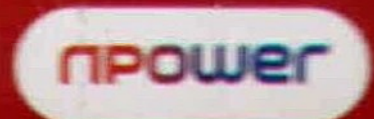
