

Tranmere Rovers versus Swindon Town

Tuesday 19th February 2013, Kick off 7.45pm npower League 1

"I'd like to welcome Paolo Di Canio, his Swindon players, staff and supporters to Prenton Park for tonight's re-arranged game."


"I don't think our lads will need too much motivation tonight but I just wish we'd have been able to field our strongest team. However, we've just got to get on with it. We know we didn't play well enough at Swindon earlier in the season, it was ridiculous how bad we were that night. I'd love to play in tonight's game myself and if I was one of our players I wouldn't be able to wait for it. We'll have 11 lads having a right good go because we need to get back to winning ways. Sometimes when you haven't got your strongest team out you've got lads who are willing to run the extra half mile for you. We'll need that because Swindon are full of energy.

We have to be realistic. We're fifth in the league and if somebody had said to us at the beginning of the season that we'd be fifth with 14 games to go, we'd have taken it. We can't have our bottom lip out, we're in a position nobody dreamt we'd be and we're still only two points off top. Whoever wins will go above Bournemouth, that's how close this league is. I still believe there will be ten or twelve teams involved right until the end and anybody can beat anybody.

People think the bubble has burst but we have to show them that it hasn't. You can't legislate for what has happened in the last two home games. To be down to ten men after just six minutes on Friday night completely changes the game. All your work done during the week goes up in smoke. For me, I can't honestly say I think Liam should have been sent off and if you're not sure then a yellow card is the right decision. I'm sure there will be people who think he deserved to go and people who think he didn't, and when it's a close call like that so early in the game, then a booking should suffice.

But we can't do anything about it. If we had appealed and lost they would have thrown an extra game on top and you don't win many appeals so we haven't gone down that route.

Despite the result on Friday it was great to see so many people inside Prenton Park again and the fans gave us plenty of encouragement. We'll need your support again tonight so get behind the lads and enjoy the game."





MILESTONES




"Welcome to Prenton Park for today's game.




Two of a Kind

Swindon Town

Tranmere Rovers host Swindon Town today, with the Robins looking to maintain a fine run of five wins from their last six matches...

However, Robins boss Paulo Di Canio may not have fond memories of Prenton Park, with his last visit in December 1999 as part of a star studded West Ham side ending in a 1-0 defeat to John Aldridge's Rovers in the FA Cup third round.

The Swindon manager doesn't have to look far for positive memories of previous meetings with Tranmere, however, as the Robins come to the Wirral looking to complete a winning double after a stunning 5-0 victory over Ronnie Moore's side four days before Christmas, a result which briefly led to Rovers being replaced at the top of the League One table.

That result was the first of three successive home wins

for Swindon over the holiday period, as they then defeated Portsmouth (5-0) and Carlisle (4-0), before in their most recent game, the Robins defeated Shrewsbury 2-0 on home

soil, meaning they have a +16 goal difference from their last matches four at the County Ground.

The Wiltshire side come to Prenton Park unbeaten in seven matches, and ahead of League One's few midweek fixtures, Swindon, League Two champions last season, had lifted themselves up to third in the table, seven points behind Tranmere and Doncaster who currently top the table.

Away from home this year, Di Canio's side have win six matches, defeating the likes



of Stevenage (4-0), Walsall (2-0) and Oldham (2-0), whilst other notable home results include wins against Bournemouth (4-0), Crawley (3-0) and MK Dons (1-0). Helping the Robins climb the table have been a strong group of players who have between them netted 49 league goals this season. Adam McGurk's former Aston Villa teammate James Collins, who recently struck 4 goals in a game against Portsmouth, is Town's leading scorer with 13 strikes this season, whilst

Matt Ritchie and Raffaele De Vita have added a further nine and eight goals respectively.

Another key man going forward has been 26-year old Andy Williams.

The midfielder joined from Yeovil on a free transfer in the summer and has already bagged 10 goals this campaign, including six in his last five games, with his pace and trickery a vital asset for Paul Di Canio and his side.

Other influential figures include ex-Liverpool man Jay McEveley, goalkeeper Wes Foderingham and Simon Ferry, a graduate of Celtic's academy.

Players to represent both Swindon and Tranmere in the past include Ken Beamish, Iffy Onoura, Marlon Broomes and Gary Williams, who infamously scored the goal against Exeter that kept Tranmere in the Football League in 1987.

Wes Foderingham - The young goalkeeper joined Swindon following a successful loan spell in which he kept nine clean-sheets in 15 games, conceding just six goals. He kept a further 12 clean-sheets after completing a full transfer to the Wiltshire side and helped them to win the League Two title.

James Collins - Town's top-scorer so far this season, Collins has 13 goals to his name as well as two hat-tricks. The 22 year-old, who cost Swindon £140,000 at a tribunal, scored 16 goals last season for Shrewsbury as they won promotion to League One.

Andy Williams - Signed on a free from Yeovil Town in the summer, Williams initially struggled at Swindon and didn't score in his first nine games for the club. However, he now has 10 goals for the season, including six goals in his last five games; two of which came against ourselves in the 5-0 thrashing in December.

A polarising icon of the modern game, Paolo Di Canio took control of Swindon in May 2011; since authoring the most colourful chapter in club history.

The maverick forward endured a humble upbringing in a cramped backwater of Rome, where it became clear that his footballing ability was matched only by his love for S.S Lazio.

An active member of the *Iriducibilli*Ultras movement, Di Canio professed delight when scouted for the Lazio youth team; the youngster's progression thus that he soon helped the club reestablish in Serie A as a burgeoning fan favourite.

Later spells with Juventus, Napoli and AC Milan saw Di Canio develop into the finest player of a league experiencing its greatest pomp; his mercurial performances offset only by perpetual disagreement with managerial heavyweights such as Trapattoni, Lippi and Capello.

Di Canio joined Celtic in 1996, thus beginning a British career steeped in controversy; later spells at Sheffield Wednesday, West Ham and Charlton awash with enigmatic antics. Nonetheless, the Italian made a lasting impact, his famous scissor-kick goal for the Hammers a trademark moment.

A self-proclaimed fascist, Di Canio was cast into infamy upon his Lazio return in 2004; his Roman salute celebration after scoring in the Rome Derby widely construed as neo-Nazi sympathy, thus exacerbating the scepticism which engulfs the Italian.

Rounding out his career with Cisco Roma, Di Canio was tutored at the *Coverciano* school of coaching, before taking control of Swindon soon after. Noted for a demonstrative touchline style, Di Canio guided Swindon to the League Two championship with insatiable style last season, and now has his sights on further success.

Paul Harper's regular look over Football League matters



"You may have noticed a bit of wintry weather in the last few weeks. Snow and frozen pitches have caused havoc to Football League fixtures up and down the country."

"Some clubs' fixtures did go ahead though, some with the help of supporters volunteering to help clear pitches to get games on, including Tranmere's at Brentford last weekend.

But when there is a spate of postponements due to the weather, someone always brings up the topic of the winter break. As a supporter, I don't like the idea of a few weeks without football. Summers without a tournament (World Cup or European Championships) are bad enough without having a break midway through the season to endure as well!

Supporters just want to see their team play, as was shown with all those volunteers shovelling snow from pitches last weekend. None of the people who got involved were thinking "actually, I don't think we should bother, we need a break from all this". We'll do whatever we can to be able to watch our team on a Saturday afternoon.

If a winter break were to be introduced, then there is the question of when to have it. The Great British weather is unpredictable at the best of times, when would we have the break?

Christmas and New Year football is a tradition in this

country. I love that busy football period where there is a game every other day, and I know that most other football fans also enjoy it. You couldn't possibly break that tradition in my opinion.

So would it be best to have it in January, February, or before Christmas perhaps? The truth of the matter is that you never know when the bad weather will come. If you had a winter break, you could almost guarantee that the weather would be ideal for football and then worsen as soon as the break was over. Bad weather could as easily happen in July as in January. This is England!

So if a winter break isn't the answer, how about artificial 3G or 4G pitches?

Artificial pitches have come on a great deal since the days of the 'plastic' pitches at the likes of Luton Town, Oldham Athletic and Preston North End. The technology behind them is advancing all the time and they are becoming more and more like grass pitches.

They are permitted at some levels in non-league football and some clubs have decided to go with them. Last weekend, when the weather was particularly bad with snowfall aplenty, there were a number of games due to be played on 3G pitches which still had to be postponed.

Perhaps there simply isn't an answer to Mother Nature."


Alas, Fergie was left with sangria on his face when chairman Martin Edwards called to say Gazza had joined Spurs for a British-record £2m.

Still, the blue half soon came round when his 46 goals in 100 games yielded two league titles.

Alfredo Di Stefano

Has any player ever been more intrinsically linked to a club than Alfredo Di Stefano to Real Madrid? The Argentine's arrival from Columbian side Milionarios in 1953 turned the Spanish outfit into the finest side in the world, and it was thanks to his stunning record of 307 goals in 396 games that they won eight league titles and the first five European Cups. But it could all have been so different.

In early 1953, it was Barcelona who had made the first move. However, with scouts, agents and representatives from Milionarios, River Plate (his former club) and Barca all muddying the waters, Madrid president Santiago Bernabeu nipped in and persuaded the striker to join them instead.

Trouble was, somewhere in the mayhem, Di Stefano had already signed a contract for Barcelona. In the end, the Spanish FA decided he would spend two years at both clubs. Quite why Barca never took up their option has never been deduced.


Match Report BURY O Tranmere 1



The Trophy Cabinet



... Tony Coombes has the keys

Maybe the smallest item to so far grace the Dixie Dean trophy cabinet is what at seems at first to be an ordinary matchbox, a typical piece from the period before the Second World War.

While many working class boys became great collectors of such simple remnants, mainly due to the thriving tobacco industry, this one particularly in Wirral must have gone down a storm for all those interested in the hobby, while celebrating major achievement for its local football club.

In the shape of a miniature paperback book, the item stands around six centimetres in height and

displays on its outer covers an initial fixture list for Rovers' inaugural, yet disastrous 1938-39 season in Division Two - which at first must have set the supporters' pulses racing at the thought of Southampton,

Nottingham Forest,
Manchester City, Sheffield
Wednesday, Tottenham
Hotspur and West Ham
United etc all visiting
Prenton Park on an even
playing field.

While the printed fixture information was all but 100% accurate, with no league postponements whatsoever, the eventual playing record was a complete and forgettable whitewash with just six wins, five draws and a whopping 31 defeats. To add to the misery by Saturday April 29th 1939, Rovers had conceded one goal shy of 100, while scoring 39 in reply.

There were a small number of celebratory pieces of memorabilia issued for Tranmere's success of the previous season, and throughout the close season of 1938, other items soon followed such as this one.

It's still unclear how many were actually produced, but the manufacturers were national. The boxes themselves were sold at one penny from Jack McRae & Sons printing works, based in Green Lane near to Cammell Laird Shipyard and adjacent to Green Lane train Station.





Ashton's Row



La Liga at Prenton Park

La Liga is today perhaps the greatest league in the world football with clubs such as Real Madrid and Barcelona fielding some of the greatest players the world has ever seen.

Prenton Park has not entertained the likes of Barcelona or Real Madrid but the ground has hosted other La Liga regulars in recent years. In 2004 Tranmere Rovers entertained two familiar names in Spanish football Racing De Santander and Club Athletic Osasuna in pre season friendlies.

Racing De Santander was formed in 1913 and reached La Liga in 1929. Over the decades the club have moved between the first and second division of Spanish football. Santander had finished 17th in the 2003-04 season and it team included the current West Ham player Yossi Benayoun.

Club Athletic Osasuna was formed in 1920 and reached La Liga in 1936 and like Santander they have moved between the top two leagues over their history. Their most notable manager was Rafa Benitez who after only nine games at the club was sacked. In the 2003-04 season Osasuna finished 13th and their team included the current Sunderland player Carlos Cuellar.

Although neither team was a giant of Spanish football they both offered an interesting fixture for Tranmere. Brain Little saw these two games a good test for his new signings.

One of the new signings trying to impress the manager was Jason McAteer who had joined Tranmere from Sunderland that summer after being let go from the club.

The first game was against Santander on the 25th July at Prenton Park. This was the first game in Santander's tour and they would go on to play Port Vale and Cardiff City. The build up to the game was muted with both sides seeing it as an opportunity to test new players and formations before the start of the season.

With such an unexcited atmosphere surrounding

the game its not surprising the score matched the lacklustre build up.

However Rovers did show some good qualities with McAteer exhibiting his skills around the pitch. McAteer set up several good attempts for Dadi and Dagnall but both were saved by the Santander keeper. The best chance of the first half fell to Dadi who got on the end of a beautiful cross from Roberts but sadly hit the post.

In the second half Rovers lost their rhythm giving Santander more possession and the Liverpool Echo stated 'This was the first match of the Spaniards pre season fixtures, but the La Liga outfit still showed enough quality to push Rovers on the back foot.'

New signing Theodore Whitmore showed real quality in the game for Rovers but failed to find the back of the net. The game finished 0-0 and all hoped the second fixture against Osasuna would be a more lively affair.

Unfortunately the game against Osasuna was just as uneventful as the Santander game. Little continued to test his starting eleven positions and in the second half Little sent out a completely different team to face the Spanish side.

Danny Harrison had the best chance of the first half to score for Rovers after being set up by Dadi. However the game seemed to be running a similar course as the Santander game with neither team really pushing for the win. Even when Tranmere performance picked up late in the second half after Calvin Zola and Chris Dagnall came on a goal did not look likely. The game finished 0-0.

On surface these two games should have gone down in Tranmere folklore as teams from one of the best leagues in the world came to Prenton Park to layout their wares but instead due neither sides' real enthusiasm we ended up with a drab affair soon to be forgotten.

Who? What? Where? When?

We take quite a long journey back in time today, even if the front cover of the programme kept all the details a mystery! As anybody who had the misfortune to follow Rovers to The County Ground before Christmas will testify, the footballing gods never seem to look kindly on us during our trips to Wiltshire. Back in 1985, as we travelled South on Saturday 2nd November, we were perhaps hoping to catch The Robins in a complacent mood, though, as they celebrated their midweek Milk Cup victory over top flight Sheffield Wednesday.

Perhaps our optimism was misplaced though, as, prior to a blip against Port Vale the previous weekend, Swindon had rattled off five straight league victories to see them zoom up the Canon League Division Four table.

The Programme Inside and Out

As I mentioned above, the front cover made no mention of the opponents or match date meaning that the unusual coloured print would have been identified for the whole season's fixtures. As you can see, the price was prominently marked and gave reasonable value for thirty two pages of mostly interesting content.

On the "Face to Face" page, Town Player-Manager, Lou Macari was quizzed by Editor Dave King. He opened by asking why former Tranmere keeper, Scott Endersby had not played against Sheffield Wednesday. Lou's version of events was that he had refused to play unless the club granted him a free transfer, following a dispute over wages. With his club sitting in ninth position, Lou was quite cautious when asked

about their promotion prospects. Surely, even in his wildest dreams, the former Manchester United and Celtic star couldn't have imagined how the season would pan out!

Under the heading "Improved Fortunes" there were updates on former Swindon players who had been successful away from The County Ground. Pride of place went to Colin Bailie, who had featured prominently for Third Division Reading during their record breaking run of twelve successive league victories.

The "Seen and Heard" column was full of entertaining snippets such as the revelation that former Liverpool striker David Hodgson had reacted badly to Sunderland's Milk Cup exit at Swindon earlier in the season and thrown a cup of tea over his manager, Laurie McMenemy! Not surprisingly he now found himself on the transfer list! The double-page coverage of

Tranmere understandably concentrated on our flamboyant player-boss Frank Worthington, who also happened to be the second highest scorer in Division Four.

Match Facts

Tranmere Rovers are set to run a Futsal and Education Scholarship programme at Prenton Park.

The two year course will commence in the new academic year starting in September 2013 and the Club has now begun the recruitment process locally. We will be recruiting between 16 & 18 students.

Following an initial expression of interest in 2011 and recent lengthy discussions with the Football League Trust we have finally been given the go ahead to run flagship education programme.

The course, administered nationally by the Football League Trust with tyseducation providing the learning platform, consists of eight to ten hours of education and eight hours of Futsal a week with four of those hours being team play in a fortnightly league taking place at a central North West venue.

All students will study a level 3 BTEC National Extended Diploma in Sport which is worth up to three A Levels allowing access to university and further study.

Our current community education officer Andy Heywood will become the tutor for this project as part of his education work linked to our activities.

We will utilize our community coaches to deliver the Futsal coaching and game programme.

The course also offers the opportunity for vocational qualifications, such as level 1 and level 2 football coaching and level 1 futsal


coaching thus giving the opportunity for a career in football coaching.

Youth to go on summer tour of the Netherlands

Tranmere have been selected as one of three clubs to go on LFE's Pre-Season Tour of the Netherlands this summer.

Rovers, Middlesbrough and Chesterfield fought off intense competition from fourteen other Football League clubs and won their place after a rigorous application and selection process.

The tour, which will help the clubs in their preparations for the 2013-14 season, will see the youngsters go head to head against some top Dutch clubs, which for many will be their first experience of playing continental opposition. The English sides will all play a minimum of three matches on the twelve day tour which will include fixtures against the likes of De Graafschap, Feyenoord, Fortuna Sittard, NEC Nijmegen and Vitesse Arnhem.

The initiative, which is fully subsidised by the Leonardo Da Vinci fund for Life Long Learning, has been in operation for four years through LFE.

In that time 13 English clubs have travelled to mainland Europe and taken on opposition from Sweden, the Netherlands and Germany. And while the chance to sample a different football culture is one attraction, Tranmere's Head of Youth, Shaun Garnett believes the trip offers much more.

"It's not just about football," said Garnett. "The lads get the chance to go out and spend a couple of weeks away from home in a new environment and sample a different culture and lifestyle."

"It's a massive tool for us in terms of using this trip to help them develop as people."

The trip which usually lasts around a fortnight will see all three English clubs based at top Eriedivise sides. And while personal development is on the agenda for Garnett, he also admits that both he and his players are relishing the chance to take on some of Europe's elite players while having world class training facilities at their disposal every day.

"I've been back at Tranmere for eight years and we haven't been on tour once so the prospect of going out there next summer is really exciting," added Garnett.

Dan Jolley, Projects Manager at LFE, says: "This is the fifth year we've been awarded funds for our 'Leonardo Life Long Learning' programme, which is good news on two levels. 'A HOLE IN ONE'

"Golf's European Tour has raised its curtain for 2013. The first tournament was in Durban, South Africa and I noticed that there were some unusual prizes up for grabs."

This event was the 'tournament of champions' who supposedly are the best at winning tournaments and presumably don't spend too much of their time in 'bunkers' so I wonder what use a 'digger' will be for them — unless it's for the construction of their latest 'holiday home'.

I noticed after the event that Scotsman Paul Lawrie had won the 'digger '- so perhaps he'll use it when designing a new course in the Highlands.


This all got me thinking about some of the most unusual 'hole in ones' – I seem to remember Martin Kaymer's waterskimming trick-shot to hole in one during practice for the 2012 Masters which you can watch on 'You Tube'. Vijay Singh produced a similar shot at Augusta National in 2009 – but perhaps the most amazing 'hole in one' was by a lady called Elsie McLean back in 2007 – it was the first of her life and came at the grand age of 102.

Not that age should be a barrier to achievement, indeed comedian Bob Hope, a life-long golfer achieved his first at the age of 90 in Palm Springs while at the other end of the age spectrum 3 year old Jake Paine (presumably the youngest ever) holed out at Lake Forest in California on the 66 yard 6th hole in 2001. Some record keepers insist that a hole must measure at least 100 yards to count – and if that's the case then England holds the record with Matthew Draper aged just 5, who set the record at the 122 yard 4th hole at Cherwell Edge, Oxfordshire. Matthew even beats the great Tiger Woods who made his first hole in one aged 6!

Some golfers are recorded as being prolific at holing out – Norman Manley of Long Beach, California is credited with 59 of them – including two in a row would you believe on successive par 4's.

Apparently you can even work out the odds on you achieving this momentous feat. Francis Shield PH.D made a study for 'Golf Digest' showing odds of 3,000 to I for a professional tour player increasing to 12,000 to I for your average club player. The difference of course being that whereas the 'pro' might win a car or a 'digger' if you achieve it at your local club you end up buying everyone else a drink which costs you a fortune.

And if you think a 'hole in one' is well within your powers then the best advice I can give is take out some insurance – believe it or not there's an insurance offer out there that will cover you for up to £200 towards the drink bill should you hit the 'perfect shot'. Fore!!!!!"
