





heroes back to the club and I hope they get a good reception at half-time.

WELCOME TODAY'S LEGENDS

Today is the seventh annual Legends Day organised by the Coventry City Former Players Association and around 50 former City players are expected to be present for the visit of Swindon Town.

The former players attending today cover all periods from the Second World War to the Ricoh era. Former City winger Trevor Lewis was playing for the first team in 1948 whilst at the other end of the scale Claus Jorgensen played for the club at the

Ricoh Arena (and scored the first goal at the stadium!).

Today's guests will enjoy lunch with their contemporaries before watching the match. At half-time all of our legends will be introduced to the crowd on the pitch and pose for the traditional group photograph. After the match they will be in the G-Casino mixing with supporters and being interviewed on stage by Billy Bell.

Several former players are making their first Legends Day appearance including former player and manager Bobby Gould,

former US international Gerry Baker and 1950s players Ronnie Waldock and Ken Cornbill.

In addition to our former players today we have another special guest. John Mason is the son of former Coventry City centre-half and captain, George Mason. George played for the club from 1932 to 1952 and was club captain of the 1936 Third Division Championship team. He also played for England in two wartime internationals in 1942.

1950s

Trevor LEWIS

At 91, City's second oldest player. He was a Welsh-born right-winger who played for the club between 1948 and 1953 and later played for Gillingham and local non-league sides.

Lol HARVEY

Made his debut at 17 in 1951 and gave more than ten years of service, making 148 appearances in defence before injury ended his career at 27. He was a member of the 1959 Fourth Division promotion side and an ever-present at Legends Days.

Ronnie WALDOCK

Like Lol Harvey, born in Heanor, Derbyshire. He was an inside-forward who made his debut as a 19-year-old at Millwall. He signed for Sheffield United and later played for Scunthorpe, Plymouth and Middlesbrough. This is his first appearance at a Legends Day.

Ken BROWN

A regular at inside-forward for the reserves in the mid-1950s, Ken moved on to play for Nottingham Forest, Bournemouth and Torquay and also had a successful career in non-league with, among other clubs, Lockheed Leamington.

Ronnie FARMER

A Guernsey-born, skilful midfield player, signed by Billy Frith from Nottingham Forest in 1958. Ron was one of only four players who appeared in all four divisions of the Football League for the club. He was renowned for his penalties (he only ever missed one) and a member of three City promotion teams.

Ken CORNBILL

A Birmingham-born reserve winger signed from Boldmere St Michaels by Billy Frith in 1958. Ken went on to play non-league football in the Midlands area including for Kidderminster, Lockheed Leamington and Halesford.

Ken SATCHWELL

A Birmingham-born striker, who played in the 1959 Fourth Division promotion team. Ken netted 15 goals in 28 games in 1959/60 including four on Christmas Day against Wrexham. After leaving City in 1963, he played for Nuneaton Borough and Walsall.

1960s

Graham WALKER

Coventry-born centre-half who was a regular member of the reserves in the early 1960s and was understudy to the great George Curtis.

Bob WESSON

A top goalkeeper who made over 100 appearances for the club and won a Third Division championship medal in 1964. He went on to play for Walsall after leaving Coventry.

Bob ALLEN

A Belfast-born left-sided player, who joined City after failing to make the grade at Blackburn and Wolves. George Curtis persuaded him to come to Coventry for a trial and Billy Frith signed him. Bob gave up football in 1962 to become a teacher in Wales.

Dietmar BRUCK

Bruck was born in Danzig but grew up in Coventry. He made his debut a week after his 17th birthday and went on to win Third and Second Division Championship medals. He scored City's first home goal in Division One and was the first City player to be sent off in the top flight.

Bill TEDDS

A local-born full-back who made his debut as an 18-year-old in 1961. He was understudy to Mick Keams for several seasons and had the misfortune to play in City's heaviest ever home defeat, 8-1 v Leicester. He later played for Cambridge United and Lockheed Leamington.

Alan TURNER

Hull-born Alan was one of Jimmy Hill's first signings in March 1962. Alan got few first team chances owing to the form of Machin and Gibson. He later managed Goole Town and scouted for City.

Gordon SIMMS


A Leamington-born winger, who made his name with Flavells FC, and made his debut as a 21-year-old against Colchester. He later had long service with Warwick Town.


Peter WYER

A regular reserve inside-forward in two spells at City either side of time at Derby County. He later played for Nuneaton Borough and Rugby Town.

Brian NICHOLAS

A Welsh wing-half, who grew up in Slough and played for England Schoolboys. He played for QPR and Chelsea before Billy Frith signed him for Coventry in 1958. He was a member of the 1959 Fourth Division promotion team.

Bobby GOULD

A Coventry-born striker who scored 25 goals in the 1966/67 promotion season before a long career with nine different clubs. He managed the Sky Blues twice and in between lifted the FA Cup as manager of Wimbledon in 1988.

Dennis OAKES

Dennis was one of a host of talented Sky Blue youngsters in the 1960s. A regular for the reserves, Dennis was unlucky not to break into the first team. A talented cricketer who played for Warwickshire Second XI.

Graham NEWTON

A Black Country boy signed by Jimmy Hill to boost City's 1964 promotion run-in. Graham scored three vital goals before moving on to Bournemouth. He later played two seasons in the USA for Atlanta Chiefs.

Peter DENTON

A blonde-haired winger, who won a first team call after starring performances for the reserves. The form of Ronnie Rees restricted his opportunities and he moved to Luton.

1970s

Willie CARR

The Glasgow-born midfielder burst on to the Sky Blue scene as a seventeen-year old and went on to make 288 appearances over eight seasons. He won the first of his six Scottish caps whilst only 20-years-old. A knee injury threatened his career but he went on to make over 200 appearances for Wolves and won a League Cup winners medal in 1980.

Gerry BAKER

New York born Gerry made his name in Scottish football – he once scored 10 goals for St Mirren in a Scottish Cup game – and Noel Cantwell signed him to help avoid relegation in 1968. He scored some vital goals and won four caps for USA.

Ernie HUNT

A Swindon-born striker signed from Everton by Noel Cantwell in 1968 for £70,000. He scored 49 goals in 164 games including the memorable donkey kick. Ernie played for Wolves in the Second Division championship decider in 1967 which attracted 51,000 to Highfield Road.

Trevor GOULD

The younger brother of Bobby and a member of the first Coventry side to play in the Youth Cup final. Trevor went in goal in the final when the keeper was injured. He had a short-lived first team career and went on to play for Northampton. He was later a coach for the Sky Blues.

Roy BARRY

Talismanic centre-half signed from Dunfermline for £40,000 in 1969 as the replacement for George Curtis. A broken leg interrupted his City career and cost him a full Scottish cap but he went on to make 92 appearances. He later played for Crystal Palace, Hibs and East Fife and managed Nuneaton and Oxford United.

Ian GOODWIN

A Lancastrian mid-fielder produced by City's prolific youth policy. He drove his brother for a trial at Ryton, made up the numbers and got signed up. His brother didn't! He later played for Brighton and Nuneaton.

Billy RAFFERTY

A Scottish striker signed from Port Glasgow Rovers who broke through to the first team in 1970. After three years, he moved on and played for seven other clubs in 11 years, scoring regularly wherever he went.

Jimmy HOLMES

In 1971, the Dublin-born defender was the youngest ever Eire international at 17-and-a-half and made his City debut six months later. A member of City's 1970 Youth Cup final team, Jimmy made 149 appearances before a move to Spurs in 1977. He later played for Vancouver Whitecaps.



Quintin YOUNG

A tricky Scottish winger signed from Ayr United by Noel Cantwell who bemused full-backs (including England's Terry Cooper) for a while before moving to Rangers in 1972.

Alan GREEN

A Worcester-born striker who was a member of the 1970 Youth Cup final team and England's 1971 Little World Cup winning team. He played more than 150 first team games for the club and later played in the USA for Detroit and Washington.

Colin STEIN

An all-action Scottish centre-forward who scored prolifically for Hibs and Rangers before Gordon Milne signed him for £140,000 in 1972. He won 21 caps for his country and linked up well with Tommy Hutchison.

Tommy HUTCHISON



The legendary winger was voted City's best player ever and played more than 300 games between 1972 and 80 after joining from Blackpool for £140,000. Tommy won 17 Scottish caps and played in the 1974 World Cup finals in Germany.

Barry POWELL

A Kenilworth-born midfielder, who slipped through City's scouting net and joined Wolves. Gordon Milne signed him in 1975 and he made 180 appearances over five years. After leaving City he played for Derby, Portland Timbers, Swansea and Burnley as well as in Hong Kong.

Brian ROBERTS

A City youth product who hailed from Manchester. 'Harry' made 249 appearances in a ten-year career at City. In 1982, after almost 200 games he scored his first goal in a 3-0 win at West Ham and weeks later scored another against Norwich. Now a school teacher and matchday host at the Ricoh.



1980s

Ian WALLACE

Wallace was one of the most popular players to play for the Sky Blues. Ian scored 60 goals in four seasons, many of them alongside Mick Ferguson. He was unlucky not to have won more than three full caps for Scotland. In 1981, he joined Nottingham Forest for £1.25 million.

Peter HORMANTSCHUK

Coventry-born full-back who came through the ranks and made his first start in a famous 1982 cup win at Manchester City and tamed the mighty Tommy Hutchison. He was forced to retire because of a knee injury but later played for Nuneaton.

Dave BENNETT


Manchester-born forward who joined from Cardiff in 1983 after playing in the 1981 FA Cup Final for Manchester City. He returned to Wembley with Sky Blues and scored the first goal in City's famous victory. He is now an FPA committee member.

Micky GYNN

Former Posh midfielder Gynn was signed by Bobby Gould in 1983. He spent almost ten years at City making 291 appearances including appearing in the Wembley victory in 1987. During the cup run he scored vital goals at Stoke and in the semi-final against Leeds.

Kirk STEPHENS

A local-born full-back who made his name at Luton under David Pleat before joining the club he supported in 1984. Sadly injury ended his career after 37 games for the Sky Blues. He is now president of the FPA.



Paul CULPIN

A Leicestershire-born striker who scored prolifically for Nuneaton but struggled to win a place at City. A member of the 1987 FA Cup winning squad, he later scored for fun at Northampton.

Dean EMERSON

A Salford-born midfielder who played so well for Rotherham against the Sky Blues in 1986 that John Sillett signed him. Before injury in March 1987, he was on the verge of an England call-up but missed the final and was out for almost a year.

David SMITH

A Gloucester-born left winger who broke through to the first team under John Sillett. He went on to win ten England under-21 caps and played 177 games for the Sky Blues. He later played for Birmingham, West Brom and Grimsby Town.

1990s

Lee HURST

A Nuneaton-born midfield player, who made his debut in 1991 as a full-back. He converted to a midfield player in 1992 and was a great success. He was looking forward to a long career when he sustained a serious injury at an army training camp in 1993 which effectively ended his career.

Dave BUSST

The tough Birmingham-born defender was out of the George Curtis mould. He was snapped up from non-league Moor Green by Don Howe in 1992 and he was in the first team within 12 months. He tragically broke his leg at Old Trafford in 1996 as his career was taking off.

John WILLIAMS

Nicknamed 'The Flying Postman', the speedy striker scored City's first ever Premiership goal against Middlesbrough in 1992 on his debut. He scored two more in his second game at Tottenham to become a firm fans' favourite.

Steve MORGAN


An Oldham-born defender signed by Bobby Gould in 1993 who made his debut as a sub in a 3-0 win at Arsenal. Steve was the regular left-back for 18 months and scored a stunning free-kick in a win at Stamford Bridge in 1994. He later joined Wigan where he won a Division Three championship medal.

2000s

Claus JORGENSEN

A Danish midfielder signed by Gary McAllister from Bradford City. Claus has the honour of scoring the very first goal at the Ricoh in 2005. He won ten caps for the Faroe Islands and later joined Blackpool where he won a League One play-off medal.







KCOLUMN

...WITH CARL BAKER

Tuesday night was such a great win and for the first time this season all the lads got straight on the coach and got on their phones immediately to check the other scores.

Lads were shouting down the bus that Yeovil had lost and that today's opponents, Swindon, had been beaten by Bury. I know we have to concentrate on our own performances but I think it showed just how much it means to all the players here and how much we want to get promoted.

The win at Bournemouth was different to most of our other away wins this season because we didn't have that much of the ball and it was just about keeping our shape and our discipline and taking our chances when they came along.

In fact, we've had that done to us a few times at the Ricoh this season so it was nice to go and do it to someone else!

We know now that we have to turn our home form around and really start to pick up more wins here to go with our away form. We have to start that today because when we are playing teams who are up there with us we are not only picking up three points for ourselves, we are stopping them from getting the three points too.

For me, personally, I think it's great that we are playing teams in and around us because it means that the season is still very much in our own hands and we don't want to get to May and have any excuses. We still think that promotion is there for the taking.

I said a couple of weeks ago just how important I thought our strength in depth was going to be and I think that is already proving to be the case. We have been without Richard Wood and Blair Adams, but we've brought in Aaron Martin and Carl Dickinson as cover.



And I was really disappointed to hear that Stevie Elliott could be out for the season because he has been one of our best players in the last few games after getting his chance in the team. But we've brought back Cody Mac and were able to bring David Bell on the other night so it all helps.

Then you've got someone like John Fleck, who is an outstanding young player, but he is not in the team at the moment. We all know that we have to be on our game or Flecky will be there to take his chance with both hands and, who knows, at this stage of the season it could be someone like him who comes on and gets an important goal somewhere that gets you into the promotion places.

All the lads have been right behind Lee Carsley. I have been close to him since he came to the club and he's always been there to have a word with me, well before he took on the role as caretaker manager.

He said to me at the start of the season that he thought that this was going to be my year and when it comes from someone who has achieved what he has in the game, you have to take it on board.

Thanks for your support and enjoy the game today. Hopefully we will have bridged the gap between ourselves and the top six even further by 5pm.

I THINK IT'S GREAT THAT WE ARE PLAYING TEAMS IN AND AROUND US BECAUSE IT MEANS THAT THE SEASON IS STILL VERY MUCH IN OUR OWN HANDS AND WE DON'T WANT TO GET TO MAY AND HAVE ANY EXCUSES. WE STILL THINK THAT PROMOTION IS THERE FOR THE TAKING.





Following the popularity of our last nostalgic journey into the past, PUSB has once again linked up with football authors Derek Hammond and Gary Silke.

The Hummel 'test-card' card sported by the Sky Blues between 1987 and 1989 is one which tends to split fans right down the middle in the 'love it or hate it' stakes.

We would say 'like no other', except for the similar division of opinion on the infamous 'T for Talbot' shirt of 1981-83, the all-white affair City donned in the early 1960s before switching to Sky Blue and, of course, the chocolate and coffee Admiral away kit of the late 1970s.

Coventry weren't alone in opting for the tight pinstripe look from the Danish manufacturer. As this advert of the time

shows, Aston Villa and Southampton, not to mention the Danish national side, donned variations of the design. Spurs' navy-blue away kits were also adorned with innovative diagonal stripes in eye-boggling navy and purple, light blue and white.

There's one other remarkable thing about the Sky Blues' Hummel kit, which once again splits fans right down the middle.

Did you realise the logo sported by the team for all those years is, in fact, a stylised bumble-bee? Or that 'Hummel' is itself German for 'bumble-bee'?







It was good news for the Sky Blues on the fitness front too as Ball continued his comeback with 84 minutes on the pitch.



ONE OF THE LADS

...WRITTEN BY STUART COURT



The past year has seen Coventry City celebrate 50 years of the 'Sky Blue Song'. The song written by then-manager Jimmy Hill and John Camkin is one that still resonates with the City faithful.

Ronnie Farmer who played 311 games in a near 10-year-spell at Highfield Road and will be here today as part of Legends Day, was one of the few present at the song's first airing.

Farmer, a midfielder who found the net 52 times during his Coventry career was on the bus when Hill and Camkin first presented the famous song.

Farmer said: "Jim and John were writing the words but needed a tune to go with it. It was on the way back from Peterborough, I think. It was where they decided on the boating song and they got everyone to sing it with them. Jim told me not to bother though, as I couldn't sing!"

Farmer, now 76, joined from Nottingham Forest in 1958 when the club were in Division Four and under the guidance of former player Billy Frith.

Frith, with Farmer in his side, led the Sky Blues to promotion that year and after missing out on promotion in 1961 the club then decided to make a move which saw Billy Frith replaced by Jimmy Hill.

The departure of Frith was one Farmer says he felt about bad about. He said: "Bill was a great bloke. He was the one who


brought me here. I was upset when he left because as a player you feel that it was your fault."


When Farmer first met the new manager his affinity to the club was nearly brought to an end, Farmer remembers: "When Jimmy first came, he tried to sell me!"

"I was injured and I was struggling a bit to get back to fitness. He called me in and told me he wanted me to leave in a swap for Willie Humphries. I said that he hadn't seen me play. He told me he didn't think I'd be good enough. He eventually relented and gave me so many games to prove myself."

"After those games, he offered me a two-year contract to stay."

With Hill aware of his abilities, City started their climb up the league ladder. It was a climb which Farmer was promised by Jimmy Hill.





Farmer said: "When he gave me the two-year deal, he told me that we were going to go after it and you trusted his word because we all knew this team was good."

After a promotion in 1964 to the Second Division, Farmer said it was clear that the club was going places

He said: "It was brilliant under Jim. We were slowly pushing on. Ronnie Rees came in up front, Willie as well. Willie used to get me penalties with his pace because he was too quick and defenders would just hack him down."

According to Farmer there were other reasons for the upturn on the pitch under JH, one being the personality of the legendary manager.

He said: "He was just like one of the lads. Most of the time when he lost it, it was with the forwards. When he came in, it all changed. We were given our own gear, a pair of boots and the rest of it when we used to have to fight for gear because the club wasn't very well off."

Farmer also credited the role the people around Hill had. He said: "Along with Jim, Alan Dicks and Pat Seward were the best coaches I played for in my career. We were trying 4-3-3 formations in training. Pat used to set up firsts against seconds games where the seconds wouldn't have a striker, but they'd still win. He was ahead of his time."

But possibly the biggest factors for City and their climb up the leagues were continuity and an unquestionable team spirit.

Farmer recalls: "The team came up through the leagues, pretty much all together. The back four with George (Curtis) never changed it seemed. Players like Ronnie (Rees), Dave Clements came in with Brucky and we started to gel together. We were together for 10 years and we knew how each other breathed."

That continuity of players bred camaraderie, with Farmer, George Curtis and Bill Glazier at the heart of the more memorable stories.

"Bill, being a goalkeeper, was a nutter," he said. "One day he drove down the hill to Ryton and drove over the pitch and with the boggy field, his car got stuck with track marks there. To this day, I don't think Jim knew who had done that."

As for his captain, Farmer remembers when a young apprentice Bobby Gould discovered Curtis's fiery side. Farmer said: "We used to train at the ground and one day Bobby came in and George asked him to clean his boots. Bobby told him to do it himself. George stood up, in just his jockstrap, and chased Bobby up the tunnel and up the stands. Chasing him in his bare feet shouting for Bobby to take his punishment, it must have been nearly an hour before he caught him."

Fifty years on and as a member of the former players association (CCFPA), Farmer is a regular at the Ricoh and still shares the same laughs with his former team mates.

He said: "I was speaking to Bill a few years ago and asked if he'd ever conceded a hat-trick at Highfield Road and he said no. I told him he had, from me. I scored one just before he joined. He wasn't impressed."

"George is the same, when I see him I take the micky out of him and run."



The Di Canio days are over (for now) but that's not to say things will be dull at the County Ground from now on.

The eccentric Italian's exit was as dramatic as his appointment and at the time of writing the managerial merry-go-round could yet come full circle as he is one of the favourites for the post he just left!

After leading the Robins to promotion and second place in League One, Di Canio left a fortnight ago when the upcoming takeover of the club was not completed by a deadline he imposed.

That continuing uncertainty, coupled with the sale of one of his star players, Matt Ritchie, to promotion rivals Bournemouth, was too much for him to take.

It brought to an end a successful and entertaining 21-month stint as Swindon's manager, which included a Johnstone's Paint Trophy final appearance at Wembley and promotion from League Two as champions.

While the drama that accompanied Di Canio was no surprise the defensive solidity the former flamboyant frontman instilled perhaps was. Swindon conceded just one goal in 17 home matches prior to a 1-0 defeat to Leyton Orient in September, which was also the first time Wes Foderingham was beaten in the 2012/13 league season.

The keeper has since taken his tally of clean sheets to 16 this term so while Di Canio may have moved on Swindon still have the players to do so too.

It remains to be seen how the new Swindon board – who completed their takeover soon after the manager's departure – will take the club forward, but with Town fourth in League One there is sure to be life after Paolo.


After Paolo Di Canio's colourful reign as manager came to an end a fortnight ago, followed by the departure of several members of his backroom team days later, Darren Ward and Tommy Miller have been given the task of guiding the Robins.

A statement on the club's website on February 20 said: "The pair, who have the full support of the first team squad, have been consistent performers for Town this season and have the combined experience of around 1,000 professional games."

After a draw against Preston in their first game in charge, the duo saw the side slip to defeat against Bury in midweek – the club's first defeat since November.



Coventry-born Collins is a product of Aston Villa's youth system. While at Villa, he spent time on loan with Darlington and Burton Albion.



Welcome to our regular feature 'Who Are Ya?' where we get the inside track on the opposition by speaking to someone who is in the know.

For this fixture we spoke to Sam Morshead, chief sports writer at the Swindon Advertiser.

How long have you followed the club?

It has been about three-and-a-half to four years in various roles.

Most memorable moment during that time?

They had a League One play-off final in 2010, but they lost to Millwall, so that was memorable for all the wrong reasons including Charlie Austin's miss. Promotion last season was very memorable, as was

going to the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final, even though they eventually lost to Chesterfield.

What is the club's most historic moment?

There are two that people will argue about. The 1969 League Cup Final when they beat Arsenal 3-1 and promotion to the Premier League in 1993 when they beat Leicester City 4-3 in the play-off final.

How do they line-up?

It has been 4-4-2 every game since Paolo Di Canio arrived at the club. The last couple of games they have resorted to long balls down the channels and have fallen apart a little bit. They usually pass it through the midfield and make the most of the pace up front. There has been a lot of grind and graft recently, but no true class in midfield. That's partly because of injuries and partly through transfer restrictions.

Who should we look out for?

Wes Foderingham in goal is one of the best young keepers in the country. Here on the Advertiser sports desk we really do rate Andy Williams up front. He has a lot of pace and he always looks a threat, even if he isn't having a great game.

How have the caretaker managers done?

Tommy Miller and Darren Ward were appointed joint player caretaker managers and it's not really proven to work on a matchday. They are trying to play while managing and doing the tactics and the quality of their performances has suffered as a result.

Is there anything unique about the club's supporters?

There can't be very many clubs at this level who have this many people so keenly dedicated to picking up news about the club. The traffic to our website and the number of people who interact about the club through Twitter is pretty amazing.

Which games are the fans most up for?

Oxford United is by far the biggest game. Bristol Rovers and Bristol City are also considered big games but Oxford is by far the biggest. There is a real hatred of each other from the supporters, so that always makes for a special atmosphere!


What are the club's ambitions for the season?

It has to be automatic promotion considering the position they have got themselves into. I don't think missing out on automatic promotion would be considered a failure, but if they missed out on a play-off spot, that almost certainly would.



MANAGING TO SUCCEED

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten leading Swindon Town managers



GLENN HODDLE ▶

SAM ALLEN ▶

Sam Allen gave Swindon Town outstanding service in various capacities. Previously a clerk in the GWR offices, he spent seven years as a Swindon director before becoming their secretary-manager in July 1902. Allen made several shrewd signings and guided Swindon to the Southern League championship in 1910/11 and 1913/14, also twice leading them to the FA Cup semi-finals. Taking Swindon into the Football League in 1920, he plotted further FA Cup runs and remained in charge of team affairs until becoming secretary only on the arrival of Ted Vizard in April 1933. Allen held that post until his death on New Year's Day 1946.

BERT HEAD ▶

Bert Head plotted Swindon Town's 1962/63 promotion success. Signing professional for Torquay United in October 1936, the defender moved to Bury in February 1952 and was assistant-boss before becoming Swindon's manager in October 1955. He produced several fine players including Mike Summerbee, Ernie Hunt, Don Rogers and Rod Thomas before returning to Bury as manager in August 1965. Appointed Crystal Palace's boss in April 1966, Head guided them to the top-flight for the first time in 1968/69 and had a spell as general manager. He was later manager and director at Bath City and died in February 2002.

DANNY WILLIAMS ▶

Danny Williams guided Swindon Town to a promotion and League Cup 'double' in 1968/69. A former wing-half, he turned professional with hometown Rotherham in October 1942 and starred in their

1950/51 Third Division (North) title triumph. Williams made a club record 459 league appearances for the Millers before becoming trainer-coach in July 1960 and he was then manager prior to taking charge of Swindon in August 1965. Leaving the County Ground in July 1969 to manage Sheffield Wednesday, Williams then managed Mansfield Town before re-joining Swindon as boss from March 1974 until May 1978. He now lives in Bournemouth.

FRED FORD ▶

Fred Ford plotted Swindon Town's 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. He was a centre-half with Erith & Belvedere, Arsenal, Charlton Athletic, Millwall and Carlisle United. Ford then coached Bristol Rovers before becoming Bristol City's manager in July 1960. He guided them to promotion in 1964/65 and discovered several notable players before coaching Swindon from September 1967 until his appointment as Bristol Rovers' boss in April 1968. Returning to Swindon as manager between October 1969 and May 1971, Ford later coached Torquay United and was then Oxford United's chief scout until his death in October 1981.

LOU MACARI ▶

Former Scotland international midfielder Lou Macari managed Swindon Town to the Fourth Division title in 1985/86. He won all three major Scottish honours with Celtic before moving to Manchester United in

January 1973, featuring in three FA Cup finals including their 1977 triumph. Joining Swindon as player-boss in July 1984, he also guided them to promotion in 1986/87 and the Second Division play-offs in 1988/89. Macari left in July 1989 to manage West Ham United and briefly Birmingham before leading Stoke City to the Second Division title in 1992/93. Re-joining Celtic as boss, Macari later managed Stoke again and Huddersfield Town.

OSSEY ARDILES ▶

Former Argentina international midfielder Osse Ardiles was unlucky not to lead Swindon Town to the top-flight in 1989/90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. Ardiles helped them win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to Queens Park Rangers in May 1988.

Appointed Swindon's boss in July 1989, Ardiles plotted their 1989/90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991 and then managed West Bromwich Albion and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE ▶

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle plotted Swindon Town's 1992/93 First Division play-off final triumph. Signing professional for Spurs in April 1975, he





starred in their 1981 and 1982 FA Cup final successes and was a finalist again shortly before joining Monaco in June 1987. Hoddle helped win the French League title in 1987/88 and was appointed Swindon's player-boss in April 1991, scoring once in 64 league games while at the County Ground. Moving to Chelsea in a similar capacity in June 1993, Hoddle guided them to the 1994 FA Cup final and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

STEVE McMAHON»

Former England international midfielder Steve McMahon managed Swindon Town to the Second Division title in 1995/96. Initially with Everton, he joined Aston Villa in May 1983 and moved to Liverpool in September 1985. He starred as they won the League Championship three times and FA Cup in 1989 before he was reunited with Peter Reid at Manchester City. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in November 1994, McMahon made 42 league appearances and remained in charge until September 1999. He managed Blackpool to promotion in 2000/01 as well as two LDV Vans Trophy final triumphs and has since coached Australian side Perth Glory.

ANDY KING»

Former England under-21 midfielder Andy King managed Swindon Town to the Second Division play-offs in 2003/04. Signing professional for Luton Town in July 1974, he joined Everton in April 1976 and appeared in the 1977 League Cup final. King moved to Queens Park Rangers in September 1980 and then West Bromwich Albion a year later before re-joining Everton in August 1982. After spells at Wolves, Luton again and

Aldershot, King became Mansfield Town's boss in November 1993. He was assistant-boss at Grimsby and Swindon, where he was appointed manager from November 2000 until August 2001, then again between January 2002 and September 2005.

PAUL STURROCK»

Former Scotland international striker Paul Sturrock guided Swindon Town to promotion in 2006/07. A legend at Dundee United, he starred as they won the Scottish Premier title in 1982/83, Scottish League Cup twice and were Scottish Cup finalists four times. Sturrock became their coach in June 1989, was then St Johnstone's boss and then re-joined Dundee United as manager in September 1998. Taking charge of Plymouth in October 2000, he plotted two promotion campaigns before going on to manage Southampton. Sturrock led Sheffield Wednesday to promotion in 2004/05 and was then Swindon's boss for a year and has since managed Plymouth and Southend.



“I THINK IT'S JUST A CASE OF BIDING MY TIME. I TRAIN MY HARDEST EVERY DAY BUT IF YOU ARE NOT GETTING GAMES THEN YOU NEED TO GO ELSEWHERE TO GET THEM AND I HAVE BEEN LUCKY ENOUGH TO COME HERE AND IT'S ALL ABOUT GETTING ON THE PITCH.

With all the attention on Mark Robins's departure last month, the same day signing of Carl Dickinson went almost unnoticed.

But that isn't something that bothers the no-nonsense full-back, who is concentrating solely on giving his all for the Sky Blues, no matter who is in charge.

Dickinson, 25, played under Robins during a loan spell at Barnsley during the 2009/10 season and didn't think twice about taking up his offer to join City after Blair Adams suffered a knee injury in last month's defeat to Yeovil.

And he didn't feel the matter needed extra consideration following the manager's decision to move to Huddersfield.

"I know Mark from when he was at Barnsley and I know how good a manager he is," said Dickinson, who penned a 28-day loan deal with the Sky Blues.

"As soon as he asked me to come and play for him then I snapped his hand off but 12 hours later he was on his way."

"You can see why he has been offered the job, when you look at how he has taken the

lads here from where they were to where they are now, challenging for the play-offs. I wish him all the best."

"It didn't have any effect on my decision. At the end of the day I am here to play football and it doesn't bother me who the manager is."

Neither did it worry Dickinson to be thrown straight in for City's game with Bury, days after signing ("I prefer it that way," he says) and since then he has settled in well.

This has been reflected in the fact that City have kept three clean sheets – and recorded three victories – in the four games Dickinson has played.

"I am really enjoying it here," he said.

"We had a little set-back against Crewe but since I have been here, I have really enjoyed it, all the lads have been brilliant, the staff, everybody."


"I am just looking to work as hard as I can, get some games in and hopefully put in some good performances."

"I've been pleased with my performances. Obviously there is a bit of rustiness there because I hadn't played in two-and-a-half months before the game at Bury. But I feel better and a little bit sharper every game."

"I am still getting used to the way some of the lads play but we have had four games and three clean sheets so I think it has been alright."

Such a positive start has been a welcome boost to Dickinson, who has endured a trying time with parent club Watford this season.

After an impressive first season at Vicarage Road, the defender has been forced to watch from the sidelines for most of this



term after the new ownership replaced Sean Dyche with Gianfranco Zola and proceeded to employ a controversial transfer policy, which includes loaning ten players from sister clubs Udinese and Granada.

But as the defender himself admits, there is little he can do while the current approach gets results.

"It's been a frustrating season to be honest," said Dickinson, who has made just six appearances for the Hornets this campaign.

"I played a lot of games last season and felt I had a good season and then there was obviously a changeover at Watford. They have brought a lot of players in and have gone a different way.

"But if you look at the table now then it is paying off so it's not as if I can bang on the door and ask why I'm not playing when they are doing so well.

"I think it's just a case of biding my time. I train my hardest every day but if you are not getting games then you need to go elsewhere to get them and I have been lucky enough to come here and it's all about getting on the pitch."

The defender did get some playing time earlier this season when he joined Portsmouth on loan. It was his second spell with Pompey and it is a club he has developed huge affection for but given the situation at Fratton Park, that was not a sustainable solution.

He said: "I feel really bad for Portsmouth because the fans, the staff behind the scenes and the lads don't deserve what is happening there. I really hope they can get something sorted because they are in a nightmare situation."

Conversely, the state of play at City is one that suggests there are good times ahead.

"I have been really impressed," said Dickinson.

"You look at some of the lads here and you can tell they should be aiming for the play-offs if not automatic promotion. Coventry need to be playing in the Championship and from what I have seen they have the players to do that.

"There is a great set-up with the training ground and the stadium and everything is in place for the team to get promoted so it is all about picking up results now."

Dickinson knows exactly what it takes to win a promotion having played a key role in one of the biggest success stories in English football in the last ten years.

The defender was a stalwart in the Stoke City side that made the jump to the Premier League and has since gone on to establish itself as a top-flight club in every respect.

And Dickinson is clear in his belief that such success is as much a result of a team's collective attitude as it is their ability.

He said: "Nobody expected us to get promoted but the togetherness we had in the changing room at that time went a long way.

"Everybody had each other's back no matter what. We all got on well with each other, there were no egos and I think if you have that tight-knit group then it takes you a long way.

"If you are all willing to fight for each other then it matters a lot.

"You could have a squad full of lads who have ability but if they are not willing to fight

for each other and be tight as a group then that ability is only going to take you so far.

"Lee Carsley has been saying that when you can look your team-mate in the eye and know that he has got your back then that goes a hell of a long way.

"If you do achieve anything special then you can look around and know that you have done it together."

The fact that Dickinson's former Potters team-mate Andy Wilkinson is set to be the best man at his wedding this summer is testament to the strength of the bonds formed within that Stoke side.

Stoke as a city also felt the positive impact a promotion can bring when Tony Pulis's men held on for a draw against Leicester to secure their place in the Premier League.

And Dickinson is certain it would be impossible not to notice the difference a promotion would make to Coventry too.

"That was, apart from my debut, probably the best day I have had in football," he said.

"I will never forget that. To be a part of that group and what we achieved was something special. If that could happen here then the lift it would give, not just the club, but the whole city as well, it could be a massive boost for everyone."



LETTER TO FOUNDER CLUBS

2nd March,

Every year it is becoming more and more difficult for football clubs of any standing to meet their friendly engagements and even arrange friendly matches. The consequence is that at the last moment, through cup-tie interference, clubs are compelled to take on teams who will not attract the public.

I beg to tender the following suggestion as a means of getting over the difficulty: that ten or twelve of the most prominent clubs in England combine to arrange home-and-away fixtures each season, the said fixtures to be arranged at a friendly conference about the same time as the International Conference.

This combination might be known as the Association Football Union, and could be managed by representative from each club. Of course, this is in no way to interfere with the National Association; even the suggested matches might be played under cup-tie rules. However, this is a detail.

My object in writing to you at present is merely to draw your attention to the subject, and to suggest a friendly conference to discuss the matter more fully. I would take it as a favour if you would kindly think the matter over, and make whatever suggestions you deem necessary. I am only writing to the following - Blackburn Rovers, Bolton Wanderers, Preston North End, West Bromwich Albion, and Aston Villa, and would like to hear what other clubs you would suggest.





INFORM: SUCCESS TO CONTINUE AFTER SECURING FURTHER FUNDING

After its success as a pilot scheme, the Sky Blues in the Community project 'InForm' has received a grant from the Big Lottery Fund to embed it in Coventry for the next five years.

The project began as a pilot in September 2011 after significant inequalities were noted regarding men's health in Coventry. Males in Coventry have a significantly shorter life expectancy compared to both Coventry females and England's population as a whole. Also, men living in more deprived areas of the city are living shorter lives compared to those living in more affluent areas. As a result of these findings, Sky Blues in the Community saw the opportunity to offer a project that supported men in improving their current lifestyle behaviours to lead longer and healthier lives.



InForm as a whole project has a number of different approaches to supporting men in Coventry – including weekly football sessions, events at Coventry City FC home fixtures, the 'Man Mile' charity fun run and many other community based events. The main body of the project delivers free weekly football sessions at different venues across the city.

These sessions are run by professional FA qualified coaches and also offer informal advice and key information about different health related topics. The pilot proved very popular, with 96 men aged between 18 and 52 years attending weekly sessions. Headline statistics saw 77 per cent of participants improve their cardiovascular fitness, 69 per cent lose weight and 96 per cent report that the project had helped them to become more active on a regular basis.

Coventry City's first team captain and Health Ambassador for Sky Blues in the Community, Carl Baker, is in full support of the project. He said: "As a professional football player I understand the importance of eating a balanced diet and training regularly. I think the InForm project is a great way to promote and support local men in getting active and thinking more about their own health.

"Football is a fantastic sport that not only helps people get active and fit but also provides a great opportunity to socialise too. Building friendships and having a bit of banter between team mates goes a long way towards having a positive well-being."

After gaining this substantial grant from the Big Lottery Fund, the InForm project is able to continue for at least another five years and expand its presence across the city working with all men including more vulnerable groups such as those with mental health issues, homeless males as well as job seekers. Sky Blues in the Community hope that this will be an influential step towards improving the health of men in Coventry.


A season saving men's lives with Prostate Cancer UK







Gregor Riach, CCFC Academy manager, said: "It was a great response to the win over Crewe in the last match.


"The apprentices took the same mind set into the game against Barnsley who have a very good academy.



Max Clayton came off the bench to score the winner with his first touch as Coventry and Crewe met for the fourth time this season.


Coming into the game off the back of a 2-0 win at Crewe four days earlier, City started brightly and took a deserved lead through Leon Clarke on 12 minutes.

MANAGER'S VIEW

Coventry caretaker manager Lee Carsley said: "The manner of the two goals was disappointing.

"Obviously you can do something about a set-piece because you can set up, sometimes in open play you can be pulled around a bit but from a set-piece you can defend it a lot better.

"For the second goal, the defence was all over the place. Their player has gone to hit a diagonal pass, it has turned into a through ball and we were badly out of shape.

"We started well. We knew it was important to start the game fast. We made a good start, got the goal and had a few chances.

"We were positive in our play and I couldn't see them coming back into it, I could only see us winning it.

"We have shot ourselves in the foot and given them a leg up and the second goal was poor.

"We went through the systems they can play and we were expecting them to play something different so there were no surprises."



Manchester City should have taken the lead shortly before the half-hour mark but somehow Chelsea Nightingale missed from two yards out.

Coventry's first real chance of the half came when Jade Formaston headed over from a corner.

The second half turned into a more balanced affair with Welsh international Hayley Ladd impressing in the middle of the park.

Young came close with a header after some good work down the left on the hour mark before the Sky Blues created their best chance of the match.

On 66 minutes, Helen Dermody delivered an inch-perfect cross from a corner which was met by the head of Formaston but her effort rattled the crossbar.

Both sides made changes as they pushed in search of a winner and it eventually came for the visitors six minutes from time.

An attack down the left picked out Buffer completely unmarked in the area and as the Sky Blues defence claimed for offside, the City striker was able to stab the ball home past Wood.

Holloway's side turn their attention back to the Premier League tomorrow when they travel to league leaders Sunderland.

Elsewhere, midfielder Ladd has received another international call-up to the Wales side ahead of the Algarve Cup in March – an annual invitation event held in Portugal.

The event brings together senior teams from all over Europe and beyond, with Wales having been invited to participate on a regular basis over the last ten years.

Wales take on hosts Portugal (March 6), Mexico (March 8) and Hungary (March 11) as they look to find a way out of Group C.

The matches will be in preparation for the next FIFA Women's World Cup qualifying matches.



LEGENDS DAY: A BRIEF HISTORY

CCFPA's Legends Day 2013 is the seventh annual gathering of former players since our foundation in December 2006.

We estimate that of a current total membership of 207, over 100 different former players have attended at least one Legends Day and another 40 or so have attended other events organised by CCFPA.

Today continues the tradition with FPs and their guests enjoying a pre-match meal and mingling and reminiscing with fans and colleagues around the lounges at the Ricoh Arena where some will be interviewed.

They will watch the game from some of the best seats in the house and take part in a half-time parade when they are welcomed onto the Ricoh pitch by the Sky Blue Army.



After the game, there will be more socialising around the lounges and the formal part of Legends Day is completed, courtesy of G Casino, with the fans from the stage of Lady Gs with CCFPA's Billy Bell leading the fun.

The first Legends Day in February 2007 (a 2-2 draw with Cardiff City) cemented the inauguration of the Association in a truly memorable day with many FPs returning to the club for the very first time, reuniting with colleagues who they may not have seen for half a century.

Returning FPs included a number of veterans who played for the Bantams (as the club was known before the 1960s Sky Blue Revolution) some of whom like Eddy Brown, Stan Smith and Jack Evans are sadly no longer with us.

An emotional reunion ensued with grown men in tears at the sight of legendary heroes like Bill Glazier, George Hudson, Willie Humphries (who flew in from Northern Ireland) and Colin Stein (who travelled from Scotland).

Around 40 veteran CCFC players attended our second and third Legends Days in 2008 and 2009 and among a number of first attenders in 2008 were Jeff Blockley and Peter Bodak and the late Eric Dobbs came for his only Legends appearance. Dave Clements flew in for the first time from the USA to attend the following year's reunion and Brian Hill, Neil Martin and Albert McCann made their sole appearance to date.


At the 2010 Legends Day dinner, a wonderful supporter of CCFC and CCFPA Joe

Elliott accepted the position of our Honorary Life President (and a signed shirt personally presented by his own hero George Hudson). Over 40 FPs saw City draw with Sheffield Wednesday in March.

Legends Day 2012 last March saw a record 51 FPs at the Ricoh Arena to see the Sky Blues beat Portsmouth and 'newbies' included Ron Wyllie, 80-year-old Billy Gray, Dennis Oakes, Peter Denton, Howard Clark and recently retired Marcus Hall. Most memorably, the deliberately withheld secret of CCFPA's 200th member was revealed to be another Legends day newbie Terry Yorath.

THE GREATEST NIGHT IN THE CLUB'S HISTORY

“ THE OFFICIAL

Coventry City's fifth round FA Cup win over Sunderland in 1963 was arguably one of the finest achievements in the club's history. It convinced many doubters, in the city and further afield, that something remarkable was happening under the leadership of Derrick Robins and Jimmy Hill at Highfield Road.

City had taken three games, all in the space of seven days, to beat Second Division Portsmouth and set-up a juicy tie with Second Division leaders Sunderland on a Monday night.

The teams knew that the winners would face Manchester United in the sixth round in just five days' time.

Cup fever was running at epidemic proportions but Hill confidently stated 'There will be room for all, the ground holds 45,000'. He could hardly have known that that figure would be surpassed long before the kick-off time, when all the gates had been locked with thousands out in the streets. Three gates were broken down by determined fans and by the time the gates were secured, the ground was bursting at the seams. The official gate was 40,487 but there were more like 50,000 inside the seething cauldron when the game started with fans clinging precariously to the floodlight pylons and standing dangerously on the stand roofs.

The first half was dominated by Sunderland, playing like a side on the verge of Division One, passing the ball confidently,

quick in the tackle and showing more urgency than the Sky Blues.

City had just three half chances, one falling to Dietmar Bruck from John Sillett's cross and the others to 28-goal Terry Bly, one which hit the side netting and the other was well saved by Jim Montgomery in the visitors' goal.

Slick Sunderland took the lead after 23 minutes. Full-back Nelson punted a low hard ball into City's goalmouth, and Irish international Johnny Crossan forced it wide of Bob Wesson from an angle.

As the second half progressed, City gradually built up the pressure with

BELL IS GLAD TO BE BACK

Coventry City midfielder David Bell has described his injury spell as the 'worst ten months of my career' after featuring in the 2-0 win against Bournemouth.

The former Luton Town man has had a succession of injuries, including a metatarsal injury, which has kept him out of the City side since April 2012.

Bell came on in the 74th minute for Gary McSheffrey and provided the cross which lead to the penalty, which was converted by captain Carl Baker.

The 29-year old was delighted to get back on the pitch for the Sky Blues and admitted the last ten months have been 'horrible'.

Speaking to cfc.co.uk the clubs official website the City winger said: "It's has horrible. There has been plenty of up's and down's where I thought I was clear of injury, but then I got knocked back again.

"It has been terrible and has definitely been the worst ten months of my career. I just hope all that is now behind me and I am absolutely buzzing to get back on the pitch.

"It was a great three points to be involved in as the team really had to battle so it is a great day for both me and the side.

"I have been available for a little while but because I have been out for so long, it was a case of getting some development games and working towards match fitness.

"I played an under-21 game on Monday so I was happy with my fitness. I was just on a high, buzzing with adrenaline to be back playing for Coventry."

Interim first team manager has recently commented that he believes the club hasn't seen the best of David Bell and the midfielder has been thankful of Carsley's support.

He added: "I speak to (Lee) Carsley quite a lot and he has always been really supportive of me. Throughout my injury and when I have got back training, he has always been there to talk to.

"The advice I needed from him has been superb because he has fantastic playing experience. He has took over the reins here and he has been superb with all the players.

"He tries to fill everybody with confidence. He has a lot of confidence in the players and believes we can achieve which is important."



MCDONALD RECALLED AS MARTIN JOINS


Coventry City recalled striker Cody McDonald from his loan spell with League Two side Gillingham after gaining approval from the Football League.

The 26-year-old had been with the Gills since the end of January, netting four goals in seven appearances his last goal being the winner in last Saturday's 1-0 victory away at Chesterfield for Martin Allen's men.

The Sky Blues recalled the striker to help bolster their attacking options following minor knocks picked up during last weekend's 2-1 home defeat to Crewe. McDonald came on as a 90th minute substitute for Leon Clarke away at Bournemouth in midweek.

City further bolstered their squad with the addition of central defender Aaron Martin from Southampton on loan until the end of the season.

The 23-year-old started his career in non-league football with Eastleigh as an 18-year-old before being signed by the Saints in July 2009



He has since made 22 first team appearances for the club and scored one goal for Southampton in their 2-1 FA Cup win over the Sky Blues in January 2012.

Martin, who also made five loan appearances for Crystal Palace during a loan spell earlier this season, will wear the number 35 shirt and made his debut away at Bournemouth on Tuesday night helping Lee Carsley's side to an impressive clean sheet.

Having already tasted promotion from League One, Martin spoke to cfc.co.uk on his aim to achieve the same feat whilst on loan at the club.

He said: "Obviously, I am still only young and I want to develop as a player so getting games is really important. But, I really want to get promoted. There is nothing better than that feeling of success at the end of a season.

"I had two promotions with Southampton but to get another one with Coventry would be absolutely brilliant. I have trained with the players just once but you can tell there is a good core of players here.

"As the side showed against Bournemouth, we took our chances and we kept a clean sheet which is what you need to do to get promoted.

"I have learned a lot this year and even though I haven't played that much, I definitely learned more about all sides of football.

"I am a lot more relaxed when I do play and Nathan (Cameron) was excellent against Bournemouth so that makes it easier to come into a side.

"I want to stay in the side in every game until the end of the season. I have got to make sure I impress the manager each game and work well with my team-mates.

"There is some great quality at the club so I have to make sure I am on top of my game in each match to keep my spot in the side."

Finally young City duo Lee Burge and Aaron Phillips have extended their loan spells at local Blue Square Bet Premier side Nuneaton Town stretch to 20 April, 2013.
