Jay has been through a lot and I am sure he will be supporting the players and passing his experience onto some of the younger lads.

This year has been another turbulent one for Swindon Town Football Club but the Play-Offs are there to be enjoyed. Our supporters have been fantastic to the football club and to the first team so please get right behind the players again this aftemoon and let's hope we can take the right result back to Griffin Park on Monday for the second leg.

Goalkeeper - Simon Moore

2012/13 Apps: 49



THE goalkeeper has had a stand-out season for the Bees and * was named joint Player of the Year at the club's Big Red Ball six days ago. He kept 12 clean sheets in 49 appearances during the League One season and will hope to make his mark during this Play-Off campaign. Moore arrived in the summer of 2009 after a successful trial spell. The 22-year-old was in the youth system at Southampton and played for Brading Town, on the Isle of Wight, and Farnborough before joining the Bees. He made his debut on the final day of the 2009/10 season and his full bow on the first day of the 2010/11 campaign. He reached double figures for appearances in the 2011/12 season before establishing himself as first choice at the start of the 2012/13 season.

Midfielder – Adam Forshaw

THE midfielder joined Brentford from Everton in the summer of 2012. He completed a permanent move to Griffin Park at the end of a successful youth Ioan. The 21-year-old initially signed for for one month but that was subsequently extended until the end of the 2011/12 season and the move was made permanent in the summer. He made his Brentford debut in a 0-0 draw against Scunthorpe United and his first start a week later against Yeovil Town. He joined Everton at the age of eight, played his first professional game for the Toffees in a Europa League tie against BATE Borisov in December 2009 and made his Premier League debut in April 2011. He could play a big part in the Play-Offs.

Forward - Marcello Trotta



TROTTA joined Brentford on loan from Fulham in November 2012, signing a deal to keep him at Griffin Park initially until January 13 2013. The Italian joined Fulham as a 16-year-old in 2009 having been on the books of Napoli and Manchester City as a youngster. The 20-year-old turned professional in the summer of 2011 and joined Wycombe Wanderers on Ioan in November

2012/13 Apps: 28

2011. He scored eight goals in eight games for the Chairboys and earned a Fulham debut after returning to Craven Cottage. Trotta, who has also been on Ioan at Watford, has made three substitute appearances for Fulham and has been involved in the Cottagers' Premier League squad this season. The striker missed a decisive penalty at Griffin Park a week ago against Doncaster Rovers.

Matt Heywood...

THE central defender played for Town during the 2003/04 play-off campaign. Heywood made 45 appearances that season and played in both legs of the Play-Off semi-final against Brighton. Despite scoring his penalty in the secondleg shoot-out, Town would bow at the first hurdle. Having made nearly 200 appearances in five years at The County Ground, Heywood departed for Bristol City before making 60 appearances in two years at Brentford. He is currently training to become a sports masseur.

Andy Frampton...

FRAMPTON played in two consecutive play-off campaigns for Brentford. In 2004/05, the Bees were knocked out in the semi-final by Sheffield Wednesday before suffering the same fate at the hands of Swansea City the following season. The defender made over 130 appearances in five years at Griffin Park before departing for Milwall. Frampton spent a loan stint with Town during the 2010/11 season as Swindon were relegated from League One. He recently won promotion from League Two with Gillingham.

Paul Evans...

DURING his four year stay at Griffin Park. Evans was part of the Bees side that made the Division Two Play-Off Final at the millennium stadium in 2002. The midfielder played 90 minutes as Brentford were beaten 2-0 by Stoke City. After a spell with Nottingham Forest, Evans made 15 appearances for Town during the 2006/07 campaign. He scored three goals in his single-season stay including a stunning 40-yard free-kick against Wrexham at the Racecourse Ground. Evans is now a masseur at Championship side Leicester City.

John Moncur...

NATHAN BYRNE:

Almost two years ago to the day Nathan Byrne was lining up for Brentford in a 4-4 draw against Huddersfield Town. A few seasons on and the defender is preparing to go into battle against his old club with promotion to the Championship at stake.



THE Tottenham Hotspur loanee joined Brentfrod during the second half of the 2010/11 season for what was his first loan spell away from White Hart Lane. He made his debut for the League One side in a home win over Bristol Rovers at Griffin Park and went on to make a total of 11 appearances in Brentford colours. He spent a loan spell with AFC Bournemouth last season before joining Crawley in September 2012.

His Swindon debut came off the bench against Oldham Athletic and he has started every game since for the Robins, deputising for Nathan Thompson in the backline. COYR sat down with the 20-year old to gauge his mood ahead of a busy weekend of football.

This will be your first involvement in the end of season Play-Offs. How much are you looking forward it?

The challenge when I arrived was to make sure we secured our place in the Play-Offs and go from there. The win over Stevenage made sure of a top six finish and now our focus is on reaching the final. We are all excited to be playing for a place at Wembley with the possibility of promotion at the end of it.

What do you remember of your loan spell with Brentford earlier in your career?

It was my first loan spell away

from Tottenham. I was 18-years old at the time and it went really well for me. I got plenty of game time and it was a good place to go for my first loan move. I know what Griffin Park is all about and I am sure it will be a loud atmosphere because it's the second leg and I know what their fans are like. Our supporters follow us in really big numbers away from home and I am sure they will make themselves heard at Griffin Park too.

You were still at Spurs when Swindon played at Brentford in March, but you have already played twice at Griffin Park this season haven't you?

Yeah, twice! I was on loan at

Crawley earlier this season and I remember playing at Brentford on the Saturday in the league and on the Tuesday after in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. They will have a strong team and Brentford play good football, so we know what to expect from them. I remember them having pace and strength in the right areas too.

Having not been involved in the Play-Offs before, how are you approaching these games as it will be a new experience for you?

I think the games will be good footballing games to watch and hopefully we can come out on top. We love playing at home because the fans are great and get right behind the team all the time. As a group of players we have to go out there and try and express ourselves. There will be a lot of nerves around but it will be which team copes best. I don't think we will differ from our normal game; we want to get the ball down and pass it as we have done over recent weeks. Previous results and league position won't come into it.

You started your loan spell at Swindon at right-back, but have now moved to left-back and seem comfortable playing either side...

The manager actually saw me play left-back the first time he saw me. I feel settled there now and I am enjoying my time there. Playing either side doesn't bother me and I am really enjoying the way we have been playing at home recently. Hopefully that form can continue into today's game.

With the second leg taking place at Brentford, have you been inundated with ticket requests from family and friends?!

I don't think I have that many people coming to the home leg but there will be plenty of family at the second leg. Most of my family live in London and they're all looking forward to coming to the game.

THE experienced winger has been a regular for Town this term after signing a two-year deal from Huddersfield Town just under a year ago following his release from The John Smith's Stadium. He made almost 200 appearances during a four-year stay with the Terriers, and was regularly involved in the end of season promotion shake-up.

He said: "This will be the fourth year on the spin that I have been involved in the Play-Offs. It's fair to say over the last few years I have been quite careful when trying to book my summer holiday! I have been involved in the Play-Offs a few times but there's no magic formula I can

pass on to the other players for this year. Each game is different and it's about which team wants it more on the day."

Roberts' final game for Huddersfield turned out to be one to remember for all the right reasons. After crushing disappointment at the end of the 2009/10 and 2010/11 seasons - he played a big part in Huddersfield's success twelve months ago.

"All the Play-Offs I have been involved in have been different in their own right and there's a story to tell from every one of them. Last year obviously sticks out because of the outcome and it was a great day out for everyone

connected with the club.

"I think every player took a penalty on the day, even the goalkeepers, and that's how the game was decided in the end. Picking the trophy up at Wembley in front of my family and friends was very special. Not many players get to play at Wembley, but to win the Play-Offs at the national stadium is the best way to go up."

Whilst those memories from Wembley a year ago remain fresh in the memory, the 29-year old also recounts the darker side of Play-Off football. He says: "I remember the final at Old Trafford against Peterborough in 2011. We went into the game perhaps





a little over confident but we got turned over on the day. George Boyd and Craig Mackail-Smith were in the Peterborough side and they really hurt us. We lost the game 3-0 and with it the chance of promotion.

"The semi-final the year before that was against Millwall and Darren Ward was in their side. We drew at home and the return leg was fairly intimidating at The New Den. We were a very young side at the time; the Millwall fans made things very difficult for us as the away side and won them the game in a way. The average age of the Huddersfield side that year was 22 or 23-years old and that was a tough place to go and play."

Roberts is now hoping to use his experience from all three Play-Off campaigns to try and guide Town to success this time around. He continues: "It's difficult to compare last season to this. Lee Clark got sacked before the end of the season and Simon Grayson took over. Huddersfield stumbled into the Play-Offs with a few results towards the end of the season and Jordan Rhodes played a massive part with a lot of goals. This season we have been pretty solid all year and have been there or thereabouts all the way through.

"Last season Sheffield United had a fantastic side but we turned them over, whereas the year before we had a much better side but lost. You can't put your finger on what it takes to win the Play-Offs but all I know is that we have a very determined side and we will go all we can for success."

Having made 42 appearances for the Robins this term, the winger scored two goal of the season contenders in the away win at Tranmere Rovers in February. Whilst another spectacular goal would certainly go down well with Town fans in this Play-Off campaign, the midfielder is hoping to have added three more appearances to his name by the time he does come around to booking a well-deserved end of season holiday – hopefully as a Championship player once more.

LEICESTER City had finished one place lower than Town courtesy of our superior goal difference and had failed at the same stage the previous season.

Town had the best of the early possession but Leicester produced the most danger, with Julian Joachim and David Oldfield both denied by Fraser Digby.

But four minutes from the break it was Craig Maskell's back-heel into the path of Glenn Hoddle that opened the scoring; Town's player/manager placing his shot carefully around Kevin Poole in the City goal.

We enjoyed the break and

better was to follow.

Less than three minutes after the restart John Moncur's wide pass found Maskell on the left, who clattered a shot off the far post from the corner of the penalty box.

Another seven minutes passed before Nicky Summerbee swung over a corner which was half cleared. When Moncur knocked the ball back into the Leicester penalty area, central defender Shaun Taylor stretched his neck to put it beyond Poole to increase our lead to three.

There was little over half an hour to go and we looked home and dry. That feeling was to last just five minutes.

That was when Joachim tucked away a rebound off a post then, ten minutes later, Steve Walsh touched home a lob that had evaded Digby. We had 21 minutes to hang on to a one-goal lead.

We lasted the one.

Steve Thompson fired home to level the scores at 3-3 and turn the tables on our emotions.

Town somehow regained some composure and the tide swung again. Poole saved well from Martin Ling, a Taylor header was cleared off the line and Dave Mitchell came off second best with a one-on-one

with Poole.

But when substitute Steve White was grounded in the box under a challenge from Colin Hill five minutes from the end, referee David Elleray pointed to the spot.

Up stepped Paul Bodin to blast home from 12 yards to put Town into the Premiership. We had gone through a wide variety of emotions that ultimately culminated in relief, and began a 12-month journey in the top flight, something that every Town supporter must have dreamed about.

David Hockaday...

An integral member of Town's 1986/87 promotion-winning side, Dave Hockaday is well placed to reflect on what was a gruelling promotion campaign having clocked up 450 minutes of the five-game Play-Off showdown.

HOCKADAY, now manager of Forest Green Rovers, made over 300 appearances for the Robins before departing for Hull City in 1990. Having been a part of the promotion squad in 1985/86, he played a big part in Town's Play-Off success a few years later.

The class of 1986/87 had to go through some of the most physically demanding circumstances ever seen in Play-Off football. After a two-legged semi-final victory over Wigan Athletic, the Robins went head to head with Gillingham on three occasions before promotion was eventually secured.

The Play-Off final was over two legs in those days. What do you recall of the home and away leg against Gillingham?

In the first game Gillingham scored with a free-kick at their place that went through the wall. It was a narrow defeat and we were all feeling hard done by. We then brought them back to The County Ground and they got another goal early on and we suddenly found ourselves two goals down. Fortunately away goals didn't count double in those days! Peter Covne scored to make it 1-1 on the night and then I think it was Charlie Henry who scored the winner for 2-1, which drew us level on aggregate which forced the third game.

There was then a third game which took place at Crystal Palace as a neutral venue...

I don't know if that format had happened before or if it has been done since, but we went to Crystal Palace for a deciding match. 'Chalkie' White scored both goals and we won the game 2-0. It was a tight, tense affair and football to an extent went out of the window. We had players in the side who knew how to win games and they managed the moments well. We didn't give Gillingham many chances across the three games and deservedly won the game at Palace. We were ruthless, efficient and did the job. We were a very tight group of people and knew what was required.

That successful 1986/87 side had to play five games to win the Play-Offs, which must have been quite an ask!

Age does play a little bit of a part but it's about experience too. You have to rest when you have to and perform when you have to. You have to nail the moments and we did that. We were fit athletically and mentally strong. Most of that side went on to have very good careers and everyone knew what it took to win promotion. To go over the five games and come through it was a massive credit to everyone right from players and fans to the staff. We played five games right at the end of the season and despite not being pretty football, it was effective.

How do you view Swindon's chances in these Play-Off games against Brentford?

My heart is here at Swindon and I will certainly be rooting for a Swindon success in these Play-Offs. There are lots of good people at the club who want to do well and I know Kevin and Mark. There is no set recipe for promotion; form goes out the window but it is two games against Brentford and a quick turnaround for the players. You need the decisions to go your way and to take the chances when they come. The players will have to be mean and horrible whilst also steering clear of injuries and suspensions. Winners do what they have to do. Hopefully Swindon can reach Wembley and take on whoever. I hope they stay tough, hang in there and believe.

Will Brentford's defeat to Doncaster Rovers a week ago play any part?

People will argue that Brentford will come here on a low after literally letting it slip through their fingers but it's not like that. Footballers are very resilient people and the team that reaches Wembley will be the one that handles the moments better. It's going to be about making the blocks, putting the tackles in and being strong mentally.

Tom Jones...

Former Town midfielder Tom Jones knows all about the highs and lows of the end of season Play-Offs as he tells COYR...

JONES joined the Robins soon after the start of the 1988/89 season and was an ever-present after making the long move south from Aberdeen. Town reached the Play-Offs at the end of his first season with the club and faced Crystal Palace over two legs in May 1989. However Town missed out on success as a 2-1 aggregate defeat followed but the Robins returned more determined the following season and Play-Off semi-final success did arrive a year later.

After a solid 1989/90 season, a Play-Off place was secured and the line-up saw the Robins paired with Blackburn Rovers in the end of season Play-Offs. The first leg took place on Sunday 13th May with 15,636 at Ewood Park to see the game.

Jones was back at The County Ground on Sunday 28th April, donning his boots once more for a charity match to raise money for the Alan MacDonald Trust. COYR sat down with the former midfielder after the game to talk about what it takes to win promotion and his personal memories of playing in the Play-Offs in Swindon Town colours

What do you recall of the buildup to the first game against Blackburn Rovers?

I remember going to the ground and passing a pub on the way in and looking out the window of the team bus and seeing thousands of Swindon fans. We played ever so well on the day and took a 2-1 advantage back to The County Ground.

How did you approach the first leg? The mentality of the team that season was that we could always win games. We knew we didn't want to go up there and get a three or four goal defeat, which would have been a tall order. We just played our normal game and didn't try and hang onto our lead. We went there full of confidence and were soon two goals up. It was disappointing to concede the goal at the end because it gave Blackburn a bit of hope.

There must have been a tremendous atmosphere back at The County Ground for the home leg too...

Yes, the ground was full and I think we scored two early goals but held on. Blackburn got a goal back but it was too little too late for them. The feeling after the game was absolutely fantastic; not just for the players and fans but for the club. It was another chance for promotion and it was magic.

Town went on to win the final with a 1-0 victory against Sunderland. How do you recall the day? I have always said that despite the politics of what was happening to the club, if we had won by four or five then there may have been a different outlook from the football authorities. It wasn't to be and we were demoted soon after winning at Wembley – which was a fantastic achievement in itself.

And what of Town's chances of Play-Off success this time around?

I fancy them. I have seen the team play over the last few home games and the tempo and the spirit has looked good. The result at Scunthorpe wasn't ideal but they have made the Play-Offs and it's down to business now. I don't think it matters too much whether you are home or away first; it's about getting the job done. A two or three goal cushion from the first leg could really open up the return leg at Griffin Park, because they will have to come out and score leaving them open to the counter. The main thing will be to come away with a winning margin of two or three goals.

The Town fans will have to play a big part play today too. You must have fond memories of big games at The County Ground?

The supporters here have always been very good and I am sure the atmosphere will be cranked up knowing that there is the chance of going to Wembley for a Play-Off final. I am sure the fans will be very vocal and give their all to support the team. Let's hope everybody concerned can raise their game and get the lead to take back to Brentford on Monday.

A Wembley winner in 1990, Fraser Digby was also a member of Town's 1993 vintage. Now back at the club as goalkeeping coach, he guides COYR through the Play-Off campaign that saw Swindon clinch their place in the Premier League.

What do remember about the atmosphere going into the first leg against Tranmere Rovers?

The atmosphere was great. We'd been on a good run prior to getting in and we've got into the Play-Offs on a bit of a roll. There was a lot of expectation after three years prior when we got promoted then relegated for financial irregularities. I think for the lads that were here there was a lot riding on it and we were all up for the game.

Town got off to the perfect start in that game didn't they?

We scored early but do you know what - I remember that we won 3-1 but I couldn't tell you who scored! We'd gone a goal up early on and we were all over them. I think they were lucky to get a late goal or a jammy goal but I can't remember that one. I thought we won 2-0 but that shows you how much I can remember – it was a long time ago we're talking 20-odd years ago! It was a good game and we went to Tranmere with a good lead.

What about the second leg? There must have been quite a hostile atmosphere at Prenton Park that night?

It was a bit hostile, but to tell you the truth I can hardly remember the game now. All I do remember is making a save from a header and John Aldridge then swearing it was over the line. I just laughed at him and said: 'You know full well it wasn't over the line'. I think it was one of the best saves I ever made. I always remember that but other than that I remember when their fans came up to our fans and gave them scarves and things * like that. For a situation that you were expecting to be quite hostile it turned into something goodnatured.

I remember that we won 3-1 but I couldn't tell you who scored!

What was the atmosphere like in the dressing room afterwards?

After the disappointment of Wembley three years earlier it was just fantastic because it was the old Wembley, the home of football and a great place to play. There were plenty of alcoholic beverages on the way back and there was a party on the coach all the way.

And what about the final itself at Wembley, what are your memories from the Leicester City game?

To go 3-0 up in the time we did then to go from thinking 'this is in the bag already' to all of a sudden they get back into it and score three goals and we've got our backs against the wall. Fortunately Chalky then got fouled – he swore he got touched. I couldn't tell because I was too far away – and then Paul stepped up and put the penalty away and that was it then.

You're involved behind the scenes now of course – can you draw any similarities between the side back then and the current crop?

It's difficult but I just look at fate sometimes; we'd been on a bit of a run as we were in 1993. I believe we lost the last game before we went into the semi-final game like we did at Scunthorpe on Saturday. We were in sixth, Tranmere had the disappointment of not going up despite finishing a number of points clear of the fourth-placed team so they were on a bit of a downer and we capitalised on it. We went and got a good home advantage to take to Tranmere and if we can do the same today then that would be fantastic.

A few of the lads in the current squad – the likes of Tommy Miller, Gary Roberts and Darren Ward – have been involved in the Play-Offs before. Is their experience going to be invaluable?

I think it will. You always get nervous but I know what the Play-Offs are like. If we can keep the lads grounded, keep them bubbling over then it will be a good experience. The young lads have just got to milk it in, enjoy it, don't get uptight and don't get nervous. They have to just go out there, enjoy it and do the best you can.





Charlie Austin...

Having made his name during Town's 2009/10 Play-Off campaign, Burnley hotshot Charlie Austin has backed the Robins for success this time around.

AFTER making the step up from non-league Poole Town to sign for Swindon in September 2009, the frontman was handed his full debut in the away encounter at Carlisle United two months later and hasn't looked back since. He helped the club reach the end of season Play-Offs with 20 goals from 38 games and scored in the first leg victory over Charlton Athletic at The County Ground.

Currently recovering from an appendix operation ahead of a well-deserved end of season break, COYR caught up with the Hungerford-born 23-year old to discuss goals, the Play-Offs and his time as a Robin.

You've scored 28 goals in 40 games this season for Burnley, not a bad return again for you...

It was a good season overall but I missed a few games with injuries. I was out for a month in January and missed the final few matches of the season having had my appendix out. I was the leading scorer in Europe for a time which was nice. My teammates at Burnley have helped me out a lot though because they are the ones who have created a lot of those opportunities for me to finish off.

This season included a return to The County Ground in the Capital One Cup, what do you remember of that night?

For me personally it was good to come and play at The County Ground but it didn't turn out to be the best of nights for Burnley Football Club. I didn't get the best of receptions but the fans did chant my name at the end of the game which was nice. A lot has happened since I left Swindon but it was strange walking into the away dressing room that night.

What did you think of the Town performance that night?

Swindon put in a very good shift and we didn't really have an answer to it. It was a strong display and they have gone on to make the end of season Play-Offs and I hope that success continues for them.

We won the first game at home and went to Charlton with the advantage.

Your first season with Swindon saw you score 20 goals in 38 games. That launched your Football League career didn't it?

It was madness what happened in that season really. I scored my first goal at Carlisle on my full debut and that was a dream come true. Danny Wilson showed great faith in me to give me a start and it went from there. In the second half of the season we turned in some great results and Billy Paynter and I formed a really good partnership.

What are your memories from your Play-Off involvement with Swindon?

There are good memories from that night. We beat Charlton 2-1 in front of a full house and The County Ground is always a hard place to go, but there's an extra buzz around with a big crowd and for a Play-Off game. The return leg at Charlton was a fantastic occasion. The fans were great and it turned out to be a great evening for the club.

Do you believe the order of the games plays a big part?

I don't think it matters too much. I have only been involved in one set of Play-Off games but psychologically it can play a part and for the fans too. When I was with Swindon we won the first game at home and went to Chariton with the advantage. Unfortunately we conceded two quick goals but we went on to win through to Wembley. There are two games and you need to put in a big performance in both to reach the final, irrespective of whether the home game comes first or second.

How much did you learn from playing in the Play-Off final?

Personally if I could go back again I would have knocked the ball two yards right about 18-yards out! You have to go there with no fear and make the most of the big occasion. You can't worry about things too much, just go out and play your own game.

So if Swindon do achieve the dream and win promotion, you could be playing at The County Ground again next season!

Who knows, but it would be nice to see Swindon win promotion and to reach the Championship.

Ritchie began the campaign as an integral

member of the Town side and his early season form had scouts returning to The County Ground in numbers to monitor the winger's progress. He scored the opener in the first home league game of the season against Crawley Town before further important strikes against MK Dons and at former club Portsmouth. His goal in the 5-0 demolition of Tranmere Rovers before Christmas proved to be his last in a Town shirt before securing a move to AFC Bournemouth on transfer deadline day in January. In total he made 122 appearances for Swindon.

Where is he now?

The midfielder was able to celebrate last weekend as the Cherries wrapped up the season by securing promotion to the Championship, finishing second behind Doncaster Rovers.



Paul Benson Apps/goals: 13/3 On Ioan to: Cheltenham Town

Benson opened his goalscoring account for the season with the opener

in the televised Capital One Cup first round win over Brighton & Hove Albion in August. The frontman was regularly involved in Paolo Di Canio's plans until a loan move to Portsmouth in November. He scored twice in seven games for the Fratton Park side before joining League Two promotion chasers Cheltenham Town in late January until the end of the campaign. He has scored four goals for the Gloucestershire side and could be involved in their own Play-Off plans.

Where is he now?

The striker sustained an ankle injury in Cheltenham's defeat at Plymouth Argyle at the start of April but is available for the Play-Offs against Northampton Town. He was recently co-commentator for BBC Wiltshire's Town coverage at MK Dons.



Returned to: Charlton Athletic

A regular in the Charlton side at the beginning of the season, Hollands' move to SN1 offered the chance of first team football

after losing his starting place at The Valley. The 27-year old became more assured with each game in a Swindon shirt and his composed displays in the engine room saw Town lose just twice during his ten-game spell in Wiltshire. He returned to Charlton after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal of his left foot in the home win over Shrewsbury in January.

Where is he now?

The midfielder is still recovering from the injury sustained at Swindon and has not played a first team game since returning to The Valley.



Chris Martin Apps/goals: 12/1 Returned to: Norwich City

The striker joined the Robins on

Thursday 15th November on the same day that Danny Hollands signed on Ioan. Martin, who lacked match fitness according to Paolo Di Canio, played two minutes of Premier League football in Norwich colours before making his Town bow from the bench in the home win over Yeovil Town. His Ioan deal was extended

Bostock joined Toronto and made his debut in the 2–1 home victory over Sporting Kansas City...

in early January and Martin's first Town goal came from the penalty spot in the win over Shrewsbury Town. The frontman returned to Carrow Road in early February following the draw at Crawley Town.

Where is he now?

The frontman joined Derby County in late February and scored for the Rams in home wins over Leicester City and Peterborough United.

John Bostock

Apps/goals: 9/0 Returned to: Tottenham Hotspur

The creative midfielder returned to Wiltshire for a second loan spell at the end of August, having played four times during the League Two campaign last term. His first appearance for Town in 2012/13 was as a half-time replacement in the away defeat at Preston North End. He was named in the starting line-up for the home draw with Coventry City and kept his place until the home defeat by Brentford. He made nine appearances before returning to White Hart Lane.

Where is he now?

The 21-year old joined Toronto on Friday 8th March 2013 and made his debut the following day in a 2-1 home victory over Sporting Kansas City. His contract with Spurs is up this summer.

Federico Bessone

Apps/goals: 6/0 Released: Joined Oldham

The Argentinian-born leftback had his contract cancelled at Swansea City allowing him to sign for Swindon on a free

transfer. With Swansea in the Premier League, the 28-year old was frozen out of the first tearn picture and was forced to look elsewhere for regular football. He made his Town debut at left-back in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy first round in early September and followed that up with another 90-minute display in the home

defeat by Leyton Orient on Saturday 8th September. Bessone would make just four further appearances in a Swindon shirt due to injury

before departing in early January following the expiry of his short-term deal.

Where is he now?

Bessone signed for League One rivals Oldham Athletic in late March and travelled to The County Ground with the Latics' squad on Friday 29th March. He was injured in his third training session and left the club shortly after. "Federico made a big effort to join us but, sadly, it didn't work out for either party," explained Oldham boss Lee Johnson.



Dean Parrett Apps/goals: 3/0 Returned to: Tottenham Hotspur

The youngster arrived at The County Ground as part of a treble deadline day loan capture from Tottenham Hotspur. Parrett came to Swindon having already had loan spells at Aldershot Town, Plymouth Argyle, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town in previous seasons, but failed to make the desired impact as a Robin. He made his Swindon debut 24 hours after signing against Oldham Athletic and played 90 minutes in a 1-1 draw. He was replaced after 82 minutes at Doncaster Rovers and lasted just 69 minutes in the defeat at MK Dons before returning to White Hart Lane.

Where is he now?

After seeing his loan spell at Swindon cut short, Parrett returned to Spurs to link up with the Under-21 squad gunning for the Barclays U21 Premier League title under the stewardship of Senior Professional Phase Coach, Chris Ramsey – himself a former Swindon player. Giles Coke Apps/goals: 5/0 Returned to: Sheffield Wednesday



Signed on deadline day in August, Coke agreed a half-season loan deal to remain with the Robins until January. He featured twice for the Owls before his switch to Wiltshire and made his

debut for Town in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Oxford United in early September. All but one of his five appearances in a Swindon shirt came away from home, as he played just five-minutes of football at The County Ground – which came as a late substitute in the 4-0 home win over AFC Bournemouth in September. He returned to Sheffield Wednesday in early October following the recurrence of an injury sustained in pre-season, much to the disappointment of the Town management.

Where is he now?

Coke returned to full fitness at the turn of the year and returned to Championship action for the trip to Hull City in mid-January. He is now a regular in the Sheffield Wednesday side and has made 15 appearances in the second half of the campaign.

Tickets Please...

Today's match against Brentford will be the final home game for the STFC Box Office Manager, Brian Powell. A familiar face for many Town fans over the years, Brian will retire at the end of the season after forty-two years of faithful service at The County Ground...

HE started work at the start of the 1971/72 season and has seen the highs and the lows at SN1: from crowds of around 2,000 in the old Fourth Division right through to the lofty heights of the Premiership in the early 1990s and back down to the basement again.

He has seen no fewer than 23 different managers hold office at SN1 as well as countless players and members of staff. He told COYR what life was like in the Ticket Office when he started and how it all began for him.

"A group of us all worked on the railways." he said. "The railways manager then took early redundancy and took over the ticket office. There were six of us who worked in there besides him.

"The matchday ticket office used to be located by the County Ground Hotel which is the brick building new used by bootball in the Community. There were six or seven windows which were all manned.

"A lot of the ground was terracing in those days so a lot of people would pay at the turnstiles. We only really had the Arkell's Stand. The old south stand which is now the Don Rogers Stand used to have terracing underneath and the seating on top but they

closed that for safety reasons. You paid cash on the turnstiles and the main seating was sold from the main reception."

For over 30 years, Brian juggled his work in the Ticket Office with a full-time job and believes it takes a special kind of person to work in the pressure cooker environment that is the STFC Box Office.

"For my main job I worked on the railways for 40-odd years and took early retirement in 1997," he explained. "I worked part-time here at the ticket office between 1971 and 1997 on matchdays. I even came out during the week when it was busy. I'd use up my annual leave believe it or not to come and help them out!

"I carried on working part-time from 1997 onwards but then people left and I ended up working more than full-time hours in charge of the ticket office from about 2001. I've worked with loads of people over the years. They don't seem to stick it because it's a pressured environment. It's something you've got to be adapted to."

Technology has advanced at an unprecedented rate since the early 1970s but Brian says that, surprisingly, the art of selling tickets has hardly changed.

"You wouldn't believe it but we had a computerised system back in 1971! On that system you could also book tickets for any shows in London. We had plans of all the London theatres but for some reason or another it didn't seem to work that well."

The ticket office is arguably the busiest area of the ground on matchdays with Brian at its epicentre. He talked COYR through his matchday routine and remembered how one manager even told him how to do his job.

"Paul Sturrock used to come in and have a cup of tea with us quite a lot," he chuckled. "Lou Macari was quite interesting. I remember for all-ticket games he used to come in and say "go out and sell all the tickets that are left!" when we weren't allowed to sell on the day on police instructions!

"On matchdays at the moment I manage the matchday ticket office because that's where all the activity is. I prepare all the windows for the operators and we sell until about 3.10pm. We then close up and I have to book up all the sales then I go back to the main ticket office. Then I have to do my match return and get all that squared off so I don't see a lot of the match itself I just listen to it on the radio."



Despite being hard at work while the rest us of are being entertained by the boys in Red and White, Brian has witnessed a huge chunk of Swindon Town's recent history first-hand and admits that he's enjoyed every second of his time at the club.

"I've had some wonderful times but bad times as well," he remembered. "I've been through administration a couple of times and not getting paid. Those were the really bad times. Obviously promotion years are good because everything is on a high round here. I've seen many ups and downs.

"When we were in the Fourth Division we had tremendously low gates of around 2,000 and they actually closed the matchday ticket office and put us all on the turnstiles. I worked turnstiles for a couple of years before things improved. That was when John Trollope was manager and they had to cut costs everywhere. They actually asked the matchday operators if they'd work for nothing just to make more money for the club. A lot of us did work for nothing to keep the club afloat."

He continued: "My standout memory actually comes from before I started here: the League Cup final in 1969 when we beat Arsenal. I was actually at Wembley then. The other match that stands out is when we beat Arsenal in the League Cup in 1980 when Andy Rowland scored in extra-time. We had a full house at the ground and with the terracing in those days it was a tremendous atmosphere.

"Another one of my favourite memories on the pitch is when Steve McMahon was here and we went up to Division One or what is now the Championship. We had a sell-out last game here against Stockport which wasn't a very good game - a 0-0 draw - but that season stands out vividly. That was when Shaun Taylor got several goals from centre-half. What a tremendous inspiration to the club he was."

As the curtain falls on his time at Swindon Town, Brian says he will continue to back the boys including during this season's (hopefully extended) encore.

"We have a horrendous amount of injuries at the moment," he said. "Brentford beat us twice but you never know in football: funny things happen."

As an integral part of the fabric at SN1 for so many years, Brian will be sorely missed by everyone. He was presented with a gift by Supporters' Club Chairman Roger Bunce at the recent end of season dinner, to mark his years of service at the club.

The Journey...

By Train: Remember this fixture takes place on Bank Holiday Monday, so please check with operators before travelling. If you want to avoid the journey in, then stop at Ealing Broadway and take a 65 bus that stops right outside Griffin Park. Brentford railway station is a five-minute walk away from the ground and is on the London Waterloo to Reading line. To get from the station to the ground, exit onto Station Road. Take the first right into Orchard Road, right again into Windmill Road and then first left into Hamilton Road which leads into New Road and the ground.

By Car: It's an easy journey along the M4 this one. Leave the M4 at Junction 2 and take the A4, going around the Chiswick Roundabout so that you end up coming back on yourself. Continue along the A4 and at the first roundabout take a left onto the B455 (Ealing Road). THE BEES UNI The around is located about half a mile down the road on your right. Town fans are advised to park north of the A4 where there are a number of free spaces with no parking restrictions.

The Weir: Those with a finer palette may want to sample The Weir pub and restaurant which is



located around a ten-minute walk from the stadium. The Weir is an independent gastro pub, trading for nearly a decade and serving both local and corporate customers. It is located on the river tucked away from Brentford High Street on the corner of the delightful Georgian square, The Butts.

Enjoy a Drink...

The Griffin: Located on the away corner of the ground is a well-kept awardwinning pub. It gets very busy so supporters are advised to arrive as early as possible. There is parking nearby and WiFi is also available on site, as well as a range of food options and outside seating. The Griffin is also featured in the Good Beer Guide and is an ideal option for those looking for a pre-match pint. Fans of real ale could try the Magpie and Crown on Brentford High Street, who have guest ales every week.

Dave Ward:

ANOTHER familiar face in the ticket office will also be retiring at the end of the season. Dave Ward joined the staff at SN1 in the mid-1970s and says he has lots of good memories.

"I worked on the railways issuing tickets and then got asked to come in on matchdays," he said. "I went on to take over the running of the away ticket office.

"I'm going to miss it like hell. Waking up in the morning and not coming in here is going to seem very strange but I think it's right that I spend more time with my family.
