
GOOD evening and welcome to tonight's Capital One Cup first round match against Torquay United.

DESPITE the 1-0 defeat,
I thought it was good
performance at Peterborough
on Saturday. We didn't get
what we deserved and I felt
we deserved a point. There
were some very promising signs
from the players that took part
and the lads were frustrated
because they felt they should
have got something out of
the game.

I think the longer the group stay together and have a chance to play together the better they will get. At the moment it's a work in progress and the players are all still getting to know each other and still gelling.

Going back to my old stomping ground of London Road I think that the team went out and put a show on. Credit to the lads; at times they cut Peterborough open but we just couldn't find that equaliser. Peterborough would say "they've got a good team" and I think they were pleased they managed to come away with a win.

It will be far from an easy game tonight against our visitors Torquay United. They've signed some experienced players who know League One and they have an experienced manager in Alan Knill. They'll think they've got every chance of causing an upset but if we play how we can and threaten the goal a little more than we did on Saturday

POKE came through the youth system at Southampton before loan spells at Oldham, Northampton and Woking. Secured a loan move to Plainmoor in February 2008 and signed a season-long loan the following summer until an injury curtailed his campaign. He returned to Devon in another loan deal before joining Brighton. After a fruitless spell with the Seagulls, he signed a permanent deal with Torquay in the summer of 2012.



A product of the youth system at Barnsley, Tonge made his debut for the Tykes in 2004. He spent four years at Oakwell before a temporary switch to Gillingham. The defender then secured a permanent move to Rotherham United. He would spend the next six years with the Millers before being released by Rotherham at the end of last season. Was snapped up by Alan Knill in the summer.



NICHOLSON made his professional debut for Sheffield Wednesday in 2000 after graduating from the youth ranks at Hilsborough. The left-back has enjoyed spells at Northampton Town, Forest Green Rovers, Notts County and Scarborough. In the summer of 2007, he made the move south to Torquay and has become a firm fans favourite in his six years at Plainmoor. Has also earned international honours with the England C squad.



HARDING started life with the original Wimbledon making his debut for the club in November 2003. The midfielder has loan spells with Forest Green Rovers, Aldershot Town and Grays Athletic before signing permanently for the Shots helping them to promotion from the Conference. After four years in Hampshire, Harding has since played for Wycombe and Northampton before putting pen to paper on a deal with Torquay this summer.




SON of Swindon legend Paui, Billy graduated from the youth ranks at SN1, making his debut at Dagenham & Redbridge in October 2010. After a brief loan spell at Torquay, Bodin notched his first senior goal against Southend United before scoring a sturning left-foot volley against Crawley at The County Ground. After another loan stint at Crewe Alexandra, the Weish Under 21 International signed a two-year deal with Torquay last summer.



THE winger represented
Northampton Town as a schoolboy
but was soon snapped up by
Premier League glants Aston Villa
where he would go on to graduate
from the youth ranks. After a spell
in the reserves and with first team
opportunities difficult to come by,
Cameron spent time at Rotherham
United before being snapped up
by Torquay boss Alan Knill in the
close season.

DOWNES left his native Australia to sign for Chesterfield and went on to captain the Spireites. The Australian under-23 international spent eight years with the Derbyshire club and had a spell down the M4 at Bristol Rovers before departing. Signed a one-year deal at Plainmoor in July 2012 after impressing whilst on trial. After his first campaign in Devon, he was rewarded with the Player of the Season trophy.



PEARCE came through the ranks at hometown club Birmingham City and in his early career he enjoyed spells with Notts County and Port Vale. While on loan at Scunthorpe he helped the Iron achieve promotion to the Championship via the playoffs. Signed for Huddersfield Town in January 2010. Has latterly been with Notts County and Barnet before signing a two-year deal with the Gulls in July 2013.



MANSELL started his career at Luton Town breaking into the first team as an 18 year-old in 2001. Oxford United was the midfielder's next stop and he, was a regular in the campaign that saw The U's relegated from the Football League. Signed for Torquay but couldn't stop the Guils' relegation. Helped the Devon side back into the Football League. He was given the Captain's armband by manager Paul Buckle and enjoyed a prolific spell under Martin Ling.



CHAPELL came through the youth ranks with hometown club, Sheffield United, he went on to make his debut in 2010. Was sent out on loan to Burton Albion in the autumn of 2012 before joining the Gulls in a loan spell towards the end of last season. The youngster made a permanent move to Plainmoor in the summer, despite originally agreeing a new deal which would have seen him back with Sheffield United.



BENYON is now in his second spell at Torquay United having rejoined in February 2013. Began his career at Bristol City before moving to the Gulls in 2007. Finished as United's leading scorer and Player of the Season in 2009-10 and he left to join Swindon in 2011. After a difficult spell at SN1, he secured a loan switch to Wycombe Wanderers. He then signed a permanent deal with Southend in January 2012.



KNILL was appointed manager in the summer after a spell as interim manager at the end of last term following the departure of former Town favourite, Martin Ling. As a player, Knill turned professional at Southampton and played for Halifax, Swansea, Bury and Cardiff. He began his managerial career with Rotherham before a successful spell at former club Bury and was recently with Scunthorpe before taking the reins at Torquay.

Coaching staff additions

SWINDON Town are delighted to announce two new additions to the first team coaching staff.

Luke Williams joins as a First Team Coach while Michael Cooper will fulfil the role of Sports Scientist.

32 year-old Williams has spent the last three seasons at Brighton and Hove Albion where he was in charge of the Under 21s and was a coach with the reserve team. He has also been an FA Skills Coach and has worked at Leyton Orient and at West Ham.

Cooper qualified as a Sports Scientist from the University of Hertfordshire, where he spent a year working with Championship side Watford. The 24 year-old then studied for a Masters Degree at Loughborough University where he worked with the University's first team. He also has recent experience of working with a Premier League club.

Tour success

BEFORE the start of the new campaign, the Town squad spent a week in the Algarve on a preseason training camp. Based on the southern coast of Portugal, the players were put through their paces by caretaker manager Mark Cooper in temperatures that reached on and over 30 degrees centigrade.

Skipper Darren Ward, Wes Foderingham and Andy Williams all assessed the week away.

"It's always good to get away in pre-season," said Ward, "Getting to know the new players and getting back into some hard training - it's been good. The weather has been nice as well which always helps!"

Foderingham added: "Training has been hard obviously because of the heat. We've done a lot of work with the ball which is good but we've bonded really well and we're all coming together."

Finally, Andy Williams
commented: "The lads that
have come in are all of a similar
age and it's been easier to gel
together and me and Wardy have
also found it easy to integrate with
everyone. It's been positive and it's
definitely helped to develop us as
players but as people as well."
