



'Let us all continue our strong support of the Football Club'

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the directors, staff and supporters of Swindon Town for today's Sky Bet League 1 fixture.

Swindon arrive here today in a buoyant mood following their excellent performance in the League last week and will be looking to build on that this afternoon under the guidance of Mark Cooper, who was recently appointed manager on a permanent basis. It is fair to say whenever we play against Swindon there is often very little to separate the two sides. We listened to the feedback we received from local residents and the comments submitted during the public consultation

process. I would like to personally thank everyone who took time out to respond during the consultation. We now await the decision from MKDP to find out whether our plans will be put forward for the next stage.

Elsewhere, I am pleased to report we have surpassed the 1,000 mark on 2013/14 shirt sales. Our all Mod Dons' strip with our Club Partners Case Security has proved to be a big hit amongst supporters with sales up 21 percent on new replica shirts compared to this time last season. While our white home shirt remains the most popular choice of the three available, we have seen figures on the red away shirt double compared to two years ago. It is fantastic to see so many of you wearing our colours at stadiummk and elsewhere in the city. If you haven't managed to get your hands on the new strip why not make the most of our Double Discount week which comes to an end tomorrow? All season ticket holders are entitled to Double Discount on production of your season ticket card or voucher, which you would have received at the start of the season.

Let us all continue our strong support of the Football Club by getting behind our team this afternoon. As I have already mentioned, historically this is a close fixture but a loud vocal support today could be what the team needs to get them over the line.






With August now in the books we focus on what will be an equally tough September and we got off to the perfect start this week with our victory over the Cobblers in the Club's 500th game.

Speaking to MK Dons Player after the win, Banton said: "It was a good win. We made it hard for ourselves by getting into a battle with them in the first half but it was comfortable.

"(The Johnstone's Paint Trophy) is something we set out at the start of the season to try and win. We want to win every game we are involved in, so of course the Johnstone's Paint Trophy is something we take seriously.

When MK Dons have scored this season, more often than not loanee Jason Banton has had a part to play in it.

The Crystal Palace winger, who joined the Dons on loan until January back in the summer, already has two goals to his name – a poacher's finish away in the Capital One Cup and a wonder-strike against Preston North End – as well as three assists, two of which came in the mid-week victory over Northampton Town.

After doing well to hand Patrick Bamford the opening goal in Tuesday night's Johnstone's Paint Trophy tie, the 20-year-old then created more havoc in the opposition box to set up Dele Alli for the game's second.

Banton did go close to adding a third lateon with what would have been a superb effort from distance but it didn't prevent Karl Robinson's side from booking their place in the next round of the competition, much to the delight of the Tottenham-born forward who insists the Johnstone's Paint Trophy is something the players and staff are taking seriously. "It was also a special occasion for the Club. I haven't been here long but I know that the 500th game meant a lot to the fans who were there and for those who couldn't make it, but are involved with the Club, I'm sure it was a big day for them too"

Banton and co. now switch their attention back to Sky Bet League 1 for today's lunchtime meeting with Swindon Town, a match which will be shown live on Sky Sports.

This will be the first time Banton has performed in front of the TV cameras and the youngster is hopeful his parent club, who are without a game due to the international fixtures, will be keeping an eye on him.

"It'll be the first time I've ever been live on Sky. I'm looking forward to it but I'll treat like any other game.

"Hopefully Crystal Palace will be watching. I know there are a few people that have been keeping an eye on me so there's not really anymore pressure but I do want to do well and impress them too."

Starting off with a 2-2 home draw with Gillingham, the former Kettering boss then saw his team win at Loftus Road before crushing the Alex last Saturday with a team that contained only four players who had been in the Town line-up that lost 2-0 to the Dons back in early April.

The summer sales of central defender Aden Flint and striker James Collins brought a reported £500,000 into the County Ground coffers, a good portion of which was recently spent on signing Australian midfielder Massimo Luongo from Tottenham after a couple of recent impressive loan



With the likes of Alex Pritchard. Ryan Mason and Grant Hall swapping White Hart Lane for loans with Swindon this summer, and ex-Tottenham youngsters Nathan Byrne and Jack Barthram joining Town on permanent deals, Cooper has plenty of promising young talent to work with this season.

Experienced central defender Darren Ward continues to hold things together at the back, goalkeeper Wes Foderingham is one of the best in the division, and after starting the season short on striking numbers, Cooper has added ex-Newcastle man Nile Ranger, Peterborough forward Nick Ajose and recently released Millwall attacker Dany N'Guessan to his options in recent weeks, the new trio all being capable of providing the firepower necessary to make Swindon serious promotion challengers this term.

THE MANAGER MARK COOPER



WHAT'S YOUR

Taking full advantage of the value of the PowrX!

Head of Sports Science, Fitness and Conditioning Damien Doyle continues his column in REDDOT. This week he talks about the importance of lifting the right weights the right way...


I've noticed quite a few mistakes that people were making with their weights; make sure this isn't you by following these simple quidelines:

- 1. Don't use a weight that is too heavy for you. If you want to go for a heavier weight make sure it's a weight you don't lose form with. It's better to go lighter and do an exercise with better form than a heavy weight and risking injury to yourself.
- 2. Get your tempo right. People go through weights hammer and tongs, getting through 13 reps in 15 seconds. Slow it down!
- 3. Contract your muscle correctly. Make sure you properly contract the muscle you are supposed to be working, focus on the muscle groups and maximise their output.
- 4. Go through the full range of movement. If you are going to do a bench press and only go halfway down you're note engaging all of your muscle fibres.
- 5. It is not a competition. Remember, when you're lifting weights it is not a competition with your mates, the only person you are competing with is yourself. Be the best you can be and do the weight you can do you'll be better off in the long run.

Bamford, who turned 20 on Thursday, hopes to guide MK Dons to success in his six-month loan spell by scoring goals galore and in the process he hopes his name becomes one Jose Mourinho, manager of his parent club Chelsea, cannot forget.

The striker spent two short loan spells with the Dons last season, making 14 appearances and scoring four goals. In his eight appearances this campaign he already has four goals to his name, including one on Tuesday night in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy win over Northampton Town, and he has no plans of slowing down.

Bamford was Karl Robinson's number one target in the summer,


the Dons boss made no secret of it, and it turns out the youngster couldn't wait to head back to MK1.

"It was an easy choice to come back here. Usually when a young player goes out on loan there is a team of five people at Chelsea who sit down, discuss it, watch the team before you go and monitor your progress. Eddie Newton is part of that set-up and with him being here before there was a strong connection and he knew what the team was all about, what the Gaffer wanted to do and the team's ambitions.

"I knew everyone, knew what the team was about, I enjoyed my time here and I wanted to come back and give promotion another shot with the team. I came back, more or less, to a team which had stayed the same. It made it easier to give myself targets, such as how many goals to get. I've set myself a target of 15 by the time January comes so we'll see how that goes. It is a bold target but I'm ambitious.

"I am loving it at the moment, there is nothing better than playing football especially for a young lad week in, week out and when I am

scoring goals I am a happy guy."

Lincolnshire-born Bamford will be looking to continue his goal scoring form this afternoon when the Dons take on Swindon Town. With the match live on Sky Sports he will also have the chance to show Chelsea and Mourinho what he is capable of, but he also wants his old school mates to see what he has been up to since leaving the education pathway behind.

"I was very excited when they announced that Mourinho was coming back, I think it was a big statement of intent and I do think Chelsea will win the League this year. I've met him once, when I went back to Chelsea on a day off he was having lunch in the cafeteria, it was a short conversation, not a full-on meeting.

"It's in the back of my mind that he is ultimately the man I need to impress. For me, the more goals I score the more my name will get thrown about, but the Gaffer here has reminded me that just by playing well people will talk about me but that doesn't curve my hunger for goals.

"I don't think I have ever played on TV, it is something I am looking forward to but everyone will approach it the same as we would any other match. It's nice knowing that some of my friends who are in Australia in gap years can watch the game; it will give them a

chance to see what I'm doing."

One man who has been impressed with Bamford's form in 2013/14 is Dons boss Robinson, His top goalscorer has been able to adjust to several different positions, from his favoured role as a striker, to the man in the hole and out wide and each time he has been equally as comfortable. However, Bamford's mindset is fixed on becoming one of the most feared number nines in the country and to achieve that he has been doing his homework on the Premier League's current star strikers.

"Even though I am playing quite a lot my development is

still very important and to be fair Karl and Gary have been amazing with me. We sit down and watch video footage all the time, discussing things I've done well and where I can improve. Once we've looked at my footage we'll watch clips of Luis Suarez or Robin van Persie and the next training session we will work on specific things to try and work on their movement, bits of their game which I can add into my own game.

"The way that they play the game is as similar as I can get to someone at the top level. I love watching their movement, it helps that van Persie is left-footed and likes to peel off the shoulder and work in behind the number nine and



Suarez likes to come short as well, so watching them will help me mix my game up."

While he may look up to Premier League superstars, Bamford knows where to turn if he needs bringing down a peg or two.

"My dad is probably my biggest supporter and biggest critic! If I have done something wrong he will definitely tell me, if I've done something good he'll tell me I'm alright. I like it like that though, he keeps me grounded. I know within myself when I have done something well so if I've done something bad I don't mind being told"

Today's look at former Dons features a player who enjoyed the best spell of his career whilst with this afternoon's visitors, and a current teammate of his who helped out the men from MK1 in their earlier days.



Anthony McNamee joined the Dons from Norwich City in August 2011, and after making his debut as a substitute at Carlisle went on to make six more appearances off the bench before being loaned to Wycombe Wanderers that November.

Starting out with Watford in 2003, he had loan spells with Barnet and Crewe, making five League starts towards the end of the 2006/07 campaign, and eventually netting two goals from 34 League starts and 57 substitute appearances for the Hornets before joining Swindon in January 2008.

Moving on to Carrow Road two years later after netting three goals from 62 League starts and 17 substitute appearances for Town, he helped the Canaries to the League One title that season and to promotion to the Premier League the following term, scoring one goal from 12 League starts and 20 substitute

appearances, before moving on to MK1

Signing a permanent deal with the Chairboys after his loan period expired, he was released at the end of the 2011/12 campaign, spending last season with both Macclesfield and Aldershot before joining Skrill Conference outfit Woking this summer, appearing off the bench in last Saturday's home loss to Gateshead.

Mark Ricketts was a starter for the Cards against Gateshead, the former Charlton trainee having been a regular midfielder for the club since joining them in the summer of 2009.

Loaned to the Dons in November 2005, he made his senior debut in an FA Cup draw at Lincoln City, then played in the replay as well as five League games before returning to The Valley in early 2006

Joining Ebbsfleet United that summer after being released by the Addicks without making a senior appearance for the club, he spent three seasons with the

Fleet before moving to Woking, missing just one game last season as the Surrey-based club consolidated after promotion to the fifth tier the previous campaign.







The Dons travelled down to Essex on Saturday boosted by the return of trio Brendan Galloway, Charlie Burns and Aaron Weston, all of whom missed the disappointing defeat to Portsmouth the previous weekend.

The returning trio seemed to have a positive effect on the Dons, who started the game brightly, going close to opening the deadlock with a number of chances early on.

It was no surprise, then, when they took lead on 7 minutes courtesy of Kelvin Osei-Addo's first of the morning. The striker showed great strength to break free of his marker down the right flank before firing a powerful strike past the 'keeper.

The young Dons continued to dominate possession after the goal, keen to extend their slender cushion, and they went close to doubling their advantage when Kabongo Tshimanga was fouled in the Southend box, however the first-year failed to beat the United goalie with his penalty.

Tshimanga, though, did net his first goal first season just before the break when he reacted the quickest to an initial blocked effort to slot home from 6 yards.

The half-time interval didn't seem to affect the Dons as they continued to dominate the second half and they all-but made sure of the points on 64 minutes when Osei-Addo, after being played through by a fantastic ball from Weston, rounded the Southend 'keeper and finished into an empty

Defender Luke Tingey then went close to a fourth with a terrific 30-yard drive before Osei-Addo completed his hat-trick with a near post finish after cutting in from the right.

Despite the scoreline, Southend United continued to work hard and they were rewarded with two goals in the space of a minute - the first coming courtesy of a long-range effort from their left winger which sailed over the head of Burns and the second due to a lack of concentration at the back from the visitors.

Any hopes of a dramatic comeback, though, were dashed three minutes into injury time when Osei-Addo netted his fourth in similar to fashion to his previous strike.

Southend did add a very late consolation with the final kick of the match after Kyran Wiltshire was adjudged to have fouled a Shrimpers striker in the box but it wasn't enough to affect the result.

Countries like Spain and France allow "B' teams to compete in the League structure, up to the second level in the former and the fourth level for the latter, and even though there's more chance of me one day being able to reverse down my driveway without going over the neighbour's lawn than that competitive situation ever happening in this country, some form of what I would loosely describe as a 'farm team' scenario might not be the worst thing in the world for the English national teams. Providing of course the two relevant clubs sing from the same hymn-sheet.

Allowing 'B' teams up to the third tier would certainly add a new dynamic, the sexiness of the opposition. And to illustrate the point, I go back to the two recent home friendlies.

First up were Rayo Vallecano, a team that finished eighth in La Liga last season and who brought their full squad to take on a similarly full-strength Dons. The gate for that was under 4,000, whereas a week later a basic development squad game between the Dons and

Tottenham pulled double that amount. Why? Because it was a big Premier League club that was in town, and I guarantee that if the Dons had the likes of Arsenal 'B' and West Ham 'B' in their fixture list those games would pull more than some of the games slated here for this season. The young



players in the 'B' teams would be getting senior experience in an environment they were comfortable with, whilst their opponents would be getting the chance to test themselves against good quality opposition. The Premier League Under-21 League is a waste of time in my opinion. I saw a few of the games last season and I've seen tougher tackling at a spelling bee. If nothing else young loan players learn the basic rudiments at League level, no matter what billet they get posted at.


That said, I'm still expecting a good game today. Swindon come into the match on the back of a 5-0 win last Saturday. They also didn't have the delights of the JPT in midweek.
