WELCOME TO THE ROBINS

Welcome to Swindon Town and to Mark Cooper, his staff, players, directors and fans.

We both suffered defeats in midweek – ourselves at Wolves and Swindon at home to Walsall – so both clubs will be looking for a positive reaction and to get back to winning ways this afternoon.

Swindon have made a good start to the season and find themselves just outside the promotion play-off places.

I have been interested to see what Swindon have done after their link up with Tottenham having taken several players from them on loan.

It is beneficial to clubs at our level to take good, young players on reduced wages through the loan system.

You often see big clubs abroad having tie ups with teams in lower divisions and we will have to wait and see whether that becomes widespread here.

IMPORTANT WIN

Our win against Carlisle last Saturday was important as one or two people were starting to get edgy, though the division is really close and we still have a game in hand





It was a bit nervy, especially late on, but that is only a natural reaction when you are 1-0 ahead. It was important for this group of players that we were able to dig in and grind out a win.

I thought we won the first half while the second was pretty even. To keep a clean sheet in such a tight game was especially pleasing.

TOUGH GAME

Wolves was always going to be a tough game and one of two clubs on completely different levels in terms of infrastructure. That is not making excuses, but it is a fact.

We went with a game plan to frustrate for an hour and then try and go for it, and it worked in the opening period.

Indeed, we had a great chance to take the lead, a free header from Cristian Montano. When you are away from home, those chances have to go in if you are to win the game.

Six or seven of our players were magnificent and can go away, look in the mirror and know they looked at home on a big stage in front of a big crowd.

The others weren't quite up to it, and the challenge is to get them up to the level of the others.

There were positives to take from the game at Wolves and I am sure the players will be better for the experience gained.

It is an especially busy period with games coming think and fast and a series of midweek matches. We are at Notts County on Tuesday in the game which was cancelled for the international break.

I would also like to thank you for your support at Wolves where there was a fantastic turnout and I could hear you throughout the match.

Let's hope we can give you another home win today which will get everyone buzzing.

ADAM ROONEY

Adam Rooney will be renewing acquaintances today as Latics play hosts to Swindon Town in Sky Bet League 1.

The 25-year-old spent virtually all the 2012/13 campaign on loan at the County Ground from parent-club Birmingham City.

Rooney still keeps in touch with a number of his former team mates including Darren Ward with whom he became friends during his spell in the West Country.

He said: "Obviously I am looking forward to the game, though that is also the case for everyone which I play in.

"Swindon, like ourselves, have played some good football in the early part of the season so hopefully it will be an exciting game for the fans. And it is always nice to pick up three points against one of your former teams."

Rooney also believes Swindon have profited from the close links they have established with Tottenham Hotspur in recent years.

Swindon have signed a number of players from Tottenham, either on loan or permanently, and Rooney believes their quality has enhanced the team.

Rooney added there has been a big turnover in players at Swindon since he left in May, but they have assembled a good group under new manager Mark Cooper who was Kevin MacDonald's No 2 during the second half of last season.

After initially failing to hold down a regular starting spot, Rooney became an integral part of the Swindon side later in the campaign. He made a total of 15 starts and 18 substitute appearances and his 10 goals included a spectacular overhead kick against Latics in a 1-1 draw at the County Ground in March.

He said: "Towards the end of the season I was playing every week which, as a footballer, is what you want to do.

"I enjoyed by time there and was just disappointed we missed out on promotion losing to Brentford in the play offs." OFFICIAL DAFC MATCHDAY PROGRAMME

Rooney is also able to give a first-hand account of working for Paolo Di Canio who was manager in the first part of the season before he left and was replaced by MacDonald.

He explained: "Paolo has different ways of doing things in training and also in terms of disclipline.

"It was a good experience and I took a lot from it. I can see what sort of player he was because he was so professional in everything he did. And he was right with a lot of the things he said."

Rooney added MacDonald did a good

job in difficult circumstances after succeeding Di Canio explaining it was far more laid back and he allowed them to play with more freedom in matches. And of his move to Boundary Park in the summer, Rooney says he was impressed with the set up when he initially trained with Latics pre-season. And he says that helped persuade him to sign permanently for two years with the option of a third.


Rooney said: "The lads were great and I was impressed with the club and the way it is run.

"I liked the way the team played and you could see the ability there is in the squad.

"I also watched the run in the FA Cup last season when everybody seemed to have Oldham as their second favourite team because of those games against Liverpool and Everton.

"I also played against them for Swindon and scored an equaliser with an overhead kick which is the best goal I have ever scored. I probably should have won the game as I also had a good chance late in the match."

Rooney, who has scored three goals for Latics, also relishes the competition for front places with Charlie MacDonald, Jonson Clarke-Harris, Danny Philliskirk and Kirk Millar all vying for front places. "Everybody can see what a good squad we have and competition all over the pitch. We also have numbers in defence and midfield which we need as we have a lot of games coming up and it is a long season," he explained.

It will soon be eight years since Rooney kicked off his career in England at Premier League club Stoke City.

Rooney, an Eire international at all levels from under-17's to 21's, had been spotted by the Potters in his native Dublin playing for junior team Crumlin United, where Robbie Keane began his playing days. Earlier he had spent eight years at Home Farm and a spell at Cherry Orchard, two clubs renowned for producing players who went on to enjoy great careers. Rooney, who arrived at Stoke as a 17-year-old, soon found himself in the first team as manager Johan Boskamp was keen to champion youth.

He said: "I finished 2005/06 strongly and was looking forward to the next season only for there to be a change of owner, manager and philosophy and that restricted my development.

"And that is why I went out on loans to Yeovil, Chesterfield and Bury to try and get games rather than watching the team play every week."

Rooney added that the two-month loan at Yeovil, where Russell Slade was manager, was an "eye opener" as he started only one game and came off the bench twice. However, he says the loans at Chesterfield and Bury in 2007/08 were more positive as he played regular and

also struck a scoring groove.


Rooney's career from Stoke took him to
Scotland and three season's at Inverness
Caledonian Thistle.

He said: "When Tony Pulis told me Inverness had come in for me, I wasn't even sure where it was.

"They asked me to spend one week with them pre-season to see whether I liked it and was prepared to give it a shot. "I enjoyed it and joined them permanently after a loan could not be arranged. "I was in and out of the team during the

"I was in and out of the team during the first season, but managed to get a proper run in the second and had a great season as was also the case in my third one."

Inverness were relegated from the



Scottish Premier League in his first season, but won promotion back to the top flight at the first attempt. Rooney has some great memories at minnows Inverness who beat Rangers at Ibrox and also recorded a couple of

victories over Celtic.

"It was a great experience to play in stadiums like Ibrox and Celtic Park. The atmosphere was great," he continued. When Rooney's contract expired, he plumped for a return to England with Birmingham City who had shown interest. And he says it was a great experience playing for them in the Europa League against Portuguse team Nacional and Braga, Club Brugge who they beat in Belgium, and Slovenian side Maribor. "We finished the group on 10 points and didn't go through so were desperately unlucky to miss out with such a big points total," he said.

Rooney also got to play at Manchester City in the Carling Cup and star in the FA Cup in that 2011/12 campaign as they beat Wolves and lost to Chelsea after a replay.

He found himself out of favour when Lee Clark became Blues' manager which is why he decided to move on loan to Swindon.

And after Rooney was released by the Blues, Latics stepped in to bring the striker to Boundary Park for a new chapter in his career.

SPOT ON ROONEY SECURES

Latics' second home victory of the season in Sky Bet League 1 was especially satisfying for Lee Johnson whose side beat Carlisle United 1-0.

Adam Rooney's first-half penalty (pictured) earned three important points meaning Latics stretched their run to three games unbeaten. There was a significant tactical change as Danny Philliskirk switched wide right to enable Charlie MacDonald to partner Rooney up front.

Rooney forced an early save from

Carlisle 'keeper Mark Gillespie, but received a let off not long after. Joseph Mills was dispossessed near the by line and cut into the box before keeper Mark Oxley did well to beat out his angled shot. Latics had to rejig their side after only quarter of an hour when MacDonald limped off with an ankle injury as Kirk Millar got an early chance to impress.

Millar, who had impressed Johnson in training yesterday, had an early chance when his drive was deflected narrowly wide for a corner. The breakthrough came in the 25th minute when Latics won a penalty after referee Mark Heywood ruled that Rooney had been fouled by Conor Townsend

Rooney picked himself up to squeeze home his spot kick despite the best efforts of Gillespie who got a strong hand to the ball low to his

Millar brought a decent save from Gillespie as Latics were the better side in the opening stages. It was only late in the half that Carlisle became more of a threat













THE POINTS

Matty Robson's free kick dipped just over the bar and David Amoo failed to connect in front of goal to a Robson cross as he looked certain to head home an equaliser. The lively Millar almost made it 2-0 soon after the restart when he curled a shot from the edge of the box which looked set for the top corner only to land on the roof of the net. James Wesolowski brought a decent save from Gillespie low to his left to beat out his drive.

Carlisle also had their moments as Mark Beck headed wide from six yards when completely unmarked.
Latics were still a threat going
forward as Jonathan Grounds
headed wide from a corner and
James Tarkowski saw a header clear
the crossbar following a Philliskirk
free kick.

Substitute Lee Miller came close twice in quick succession to equalising moments after making his entrance.

First he headed wide and then another header brought a great save from Mark Oxley and Amoo's followup shot was blocked. Latics could have sealed victory late on when Gillespie athletically tipped over a shot from James Dayton. And from the resulting corner, Genseric Kusunga headed over at the far post as a second goal continued to elude them. (pictured on page 15)

It made for a nervy five minutes of stoppage time, which had been signalled, but which became six-and-a-half, though Latics' game management was excellent as they didn't take any unnecessary risks to in securing the win.

FAIR PLAY IN THE FOO

HENRY FRANCIS LOOKS AT THE NEW FFP REGULATIONS.

For the first time, English league football clubs have regulations in place that is designed to restrict each clubs' spending, in order to avoid dire financial situations like Portsmouth, Coventry City, Luton Town and Bury have experienced recently.

In the Premier League, clubs are permitted to lose up to £105m this season.

There are no wage restrictions on clubs with less than a £52m wage bill, but if they are above this threshold clubs may only add £4m to the wage bill.

Sky Bet Football League chiefs have established a different system for each league. In the Championship, £8m is the maximum loss allowed, with Premier League "parachute payments" significantly helping those who are relegated from the Premier League.

In League One, clubs have no maximum loss restriction, but do have regulations on the wage bill. The Football League has imposed that League One clubs may only spend up to 60% of their Monthly revenue on the wage bill, with a 5% decrease on that threshold should the club be of League two status.

Punishments vary from points deductions in the Premier League, to transfer bans in League One and Two, with fines imposed in the Championship as well. However. is this fair?

If Latics were purchased by a rich

benefactor next week, would the club ever be able to get back to the Premier League under these rules?

Oldham Athletic attract 4,480 fans per home game on average (according to ESPN), with £20 the price of an average ticket here at Boundary Park.

If three home games are played throughout the month, £240,000 of revenue comes through tickets alone which leaves an allowed £40,000 a week to be spent on just the players alone not counting other staff.

Top players in League One demand incomes of around £4,000 a week and Oldham have to maintain upwards of an 18-man squad, meaning that salaries such as those are far too expensive if we are to keep within League regulations.

Consequently, Latics fail to attract the best players, and remain in League One just as we have done for the last 17 years.

These FFP regulations restrict growth and change to football's status quo.

The clubs with the largest income will remain the biggest clubs. Noone will be able to challenge that. If Latics were to challenge, the only way to do so would be to either increase attendance (which has not really changed in the last ten years) or increase ticket prices.

If this becomes the case, the fans lose out, and football stops being a working man's sport.

Nevertheless, should Athletic combine grit, determination and skill to reach the Championship once again, attendances may increase and better players may be attracted to Boundary Park.











of debt in English football and halt the increase of Football League clubs going into administration with the gates at grounds up and down the country being locked shut. On the other hand, the Football League's new FFP regulations could have significant impacts on the most important people in football, YOU, the fans.





WOLVES RAIN ON LATICS' PARA

It took an unfortunate mistake to send Latics on the slippery slope to defeat by promotion-chasing Wolves at rain-sodden Molineux. Goalkeeper Mark Oxley's handling error, which could be attributed to the wet conditions, handed Wolves the breakthrough they were struggling to make.

The good work of the goalless opening period was undone by second-half goals from James Henry and Leigh Griffiths.

Lee Johnson had frustrated Wolves, a Premier League side less than 18

months ago, by packing his midfield with five players, a tactic which he admitted worked to a point in the first half.

Once Henry was handed the opening goal, Latics threw caution to the wind as they brought on strikers Adam Rooney and Jonson Clarke-Harris as they chased an equaliser. Strikers Charlie MacDonald, who was ruled out through injury, and Adam Rooney lost their places from Saturday's home win against Carlisle.

Montano and Carl Winchester were recalled to reinforce the midfield while Danny Philliskirk operated as the lone front man.

Wolves' wealth of riches was such that Eire international striker Kevin Doyle had to settle for a place in the bench.

Latics' game plan worked to a tee in the opening half as Wolves only occasionally threatened to break the deadlock.

Indeed. Montano could have given Latics a 19th minute lead with his free header from six yards which sailed over the crossbar.

Oxley was untroubled until the latter stages of the half when he clawed out a free kick by Bakary Sako from under the crossbar. From the resulting corner, Danny Batth's downward header looped over the crossbar.

And in stoppage time, Oxley made an excellence full-length save low to his right to turn away a drive from Henry.











Hatth flashed a header narrowly wide soon after the restart before Wolves made the breakthrough in the 50th minute.

Sako fired over a low cross from the left which the diving Oxley could only push out as far as Henry whose shot trickled over the goal-line in slow motion which only served to add to the agony.

Johnson quickly reverted to Plan B as strikers Rooney and Jonson Clarke-Harris were brought on for Winchester and James Dayton. Clarke-Harris had an early shot blocked as Latics remained in the game until 11 minutes from time when Wolves struck again.

Former French under-21 international Sako was against the provider with a long ball which

skidded off the sodden surface to deceive Jonathan Grounds and enable Griffiths to burst clear as his shot flew in off the upright for his ninth goal of the campaign.

Latics' third change was injury enforced as Joseph Mills limped off with a hamstring problem to be replaced by David Mellor.

There was a little flurry from Latics as Montano broke clear only for keeper Carl Ikeme to save bravely at his feet (see above image). He then athletically turned over a drive from Philliskirk.


Pentagon





BUTCHER BARLOW ITCHING TO GET BACK IN



Stuart Barlow's entrance into professional football was very much Roy of the Rovers as there are rarely such stories in the modern-day game.

The former Latics' striker thought his dream had disappeared at the age of 20 when he was working in the butchery department of his local Asda supermarket and playing with his mates on a Sunday morning. Barlow had been on trial intermittently at Everton for two years when he landed his lucky break after being selected to play for a Barclays Premier League X1 in a representative game in the Isle of

He explained: "Clubs were asked to provide two players, but nobody from Everton wanted to go so I was sent. "We won 4-0 and I scored a hat trick which prompted Everton to finally offer me a contract. Had I not played at that game, it may never have happened."

Barlow went on to play for Everton making 71 appearances in the Premier League before his career took him to Latics, Wigan Athletic, Tranmere, Stockport, Bury and Morecambe.

The 44-year-old Barlow was assistant manager at Skrill North side Colwyn Bay last season and is looking to get back into the game - he has his UEFA 'B' coaching licence and is currently studying for the 'A' one.

SIGNING FOR LATICS

I had only signed a new three-year deal at Everton in July 1995, but early the next season found my opportunities limited.

Joe Royle was Everton manager and he informed me Latics were interested in me and I subsequently spoke to Colin Harvey, who was Graeme Sharpe's No 2.

I had a couple of chats with Joe who told me he wouldn't stand in my way as I was not involved with the first

I felt I was going nowhere at Everton and, rather than staying and may be getting on the bench one or two times, I decided to leave to play regular football.

Latics wanted me and I was happy to sign for a fee of £350,000.

BOUNDARY PARK HIGHLIGHTS

When you sign for a new club, you are keen to get off to a good start. especially when you have signed for a decent fee which makes the expectation of fans that much

Mine could not have been better as I scored at Boundary Park in a 2-2 against Millwall.

I also scored a hat-trick in a 3-0 win at Bradford. It was the first of my professional career and was a sweet moment.

It was also against my old mate Eric Nixon who was in goal for Bradford so, as you can imagine, there was some banter.

When I came to Latics it was strange having Graeme Sharp as my manager as earlier in my career I was sat alongside him in the dressing room at Everton.

We had a good relationship as well as the usual fallouts which happen in football. He was always there as a friend and today we still get on well.

LEAVING OL12PA

Neil Warnock replaced Graeme as manager and he was certainly a character.

There was trepidation when he took over because of his reputation but we soon all loved him.

While opponents hate them, his



FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS SELECTS TEN KEY MATCHES AND **EVENTS THAT HAVE SHAPED SWINDON TOWN'S POST-WAR ERA**

1963 - PROMOTION WINNERS


Swindon Town clinched promotion to the Second Division for the first time on 14th May 1963 as Roger Smart's late goal secured a 1-0 victory over Shrewsbury Town in front of 20,273 at the County Ground. Bert Head's young side had won just one of their first six games, then top scorer Ernie Hunt netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 victory over Brighton. Cliff Jackson scored three times in a 4-3 win at Millwall and Jack Smith did likewise in a 5-0 victory over QPR as Swindon overcame the 'Big Freeze' to maintain their promotion challenge. They hammered Colchester United 6-1 and finished Third Division runners-up.

1969 - LEAGUE CUP WINNERS

Third Division giantkillers Swindon Town defeated Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the League Cup final at Wembley Stadium on 15th March 1969. Danny Williams' side had beaten Torquay United 2-1. Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn Rovers 1-0, Coventry City 3-0, Derby County 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 to reach the League Cup final. Roger Smart gave Swindon a 35th minute lead against Arsenal but Bobby Gould equalised on 84 minutes before Don Rogers scored twice in extra-time. The Robins also won promotion that season, losing 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' and finishing Third' Division runners-up on goal average.

1970-SWINDON'S ITALIAN JOB

Swindon Town beat Napoli 3-0 in the Anglo-Italian Cup final on 28th May 1970. Fred Ford had replaced Danny Williams as manager the previous summer and Swindon



finished fifth in the Second Division in 1969-70, their highest position at the time. They also defeated Blackburn Rovers 4-0, Chester 4-2 and Scunthorpe United 3-1 in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 to Leeds United in the sixth round. In the Anglo-Italian Cup, Arthur Horsfield scored twice as the Robins hammered Juventus 4-0 at the County Ground en route to the final. Two goals by Peter Noble plus another from Arthur Horsfield defeated Napoli in Italy.

1980 - LEAGUE CUP SEMI-FINALISTS

Bobby Smith guided Swindon Town to the League Cup semi-finals in 1979-80. The Robins defeated Portsmouth 3-1, Chester 2-1, Stoke City 2-1 and Wimbledon 2-1 before strikes by Alan Mayes and Andy Rowland plus two own goals overcame Arsenal 4-3 after extratime in the fifth round replay to reach the semi-finals for the second time. Goals from Andy Rowland and Alan Mayes gave Swindon a 2-1 first-leg victory over Wolves in front of 25,650 at the County

Ground on 22nd January 1980 but Wolves won 3-1 in the second-leg at Molineux three weeks later to triumph 4-3 on aggregate and went on to lift the trophy.

1986-RECORD BREAKING CHAMPIONS

Swindon Town stormed to the Fourth Division title with a record 102 points in 1985-86. Lou Macari's side made a poor start in the League but defeated Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday en route to the League Cup fourth round. Kenny Allen arrived from Torquay and Dave Bamber from Portsmouth as Swindon soared to the top of the table with 14 wins in 16 matches. They set a club record of 13 consecutive home victories with a 3-1 win over Burnley and clinched the title with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield. Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon scored 35 goals between them, while skipper Colin Calderwood was ever-present.

1987-PROMOTION PLAY-OFF WINNERS

Lou Macari plotted Swindon Town's 1986-87 Third Division play-off final

triumph. Six victories in eight games catapulted Swindon into the promotion race, then Jimmy Quinn returned from Blackburn and Phil King arrived from Torquay. They starred as Swindon gained seven straight wins and qualified for the play-offs in third position after remaining undefeated in their last 11 matches. The Robins beat Wigan Athletic 3-2 in the semi-finals, then fought back from a 1-0 first-leg defeat to draw 2-2 with Gillingham in the final. Two goals by Steve White clinched a 2-0 victory in the final replay at Selhurst Park on 29th May 1987.

1990 - SWINDON DENIED PROMOTION

twindon Town won the 1989-90 second Division play-off final but were denied top-flight status after an illegal payments scandal. Ossie Ardiles' side had soared into the promotion frame with seven wins in nine games including a 6-0 victory over Stoke City and signed David. Kerslake from QPR in November. Alan McLoughlin, Duncan Shearer

An McLoughlin and Ossie Ardiles


and Steve White starred as Swindon maintained their challenge with just one defeat in 13 matches and finished in fourth position. They beat Blackburn Rovers 4-2 in the play-off semi-finals, then Gary Bennett's own goal defeated Sunderland 1-0 in the Wembley final on 28th May 1990.

1993 - SWINDON REACH TOP-FLIGHT

Player-manager Glenn Hoddle was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992-93 First Division play-off final success. Swindon were early pacesetters and Ross MacLaren's return inspired a run of seven victories in nine games. Dave Mitchell netted three times in a remarkable 6-4 win at Birmingham City and Swindon qualified for the play-offs in fifth position. The Robins defeated Tranmere Rovers 5-4 on aggregate in the semi-finals, then goals from Glenn Hoddle, Craig Maskell, Shaun Taylor and Paul Bodin secured a thrilling 4-3 victory over Leicester City in the final watched by 73,802 at Wembley Stadium on 31st May 1993. Wembley Stadium.

1996 - HIGH-FLYING ROBINS

Swindon Town stormed to the Second Division title under player-boss Steve McMahon in 1995-96. They had plummeted from the Premiership to Second Division and newcomers included Wayne Allison, Steve Finney and Mark Seagraves. Swindon were early leaders, winning seven of their first nine games, and Kevin Horlock netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 victory at Bristol Rovers. They remained in pole position and took Southampton to an FA Cup fifth round replay. Ian Culverhouse and Mark Robinson



were ever-present, while leading scorer Wayne Allison and Shaun Taylor also starred as they won the title by nine points.

2012 - SWINDON'S TITLE TRIUMPH

Paolo Di Canio managed Swindon Town to the League Two title in 2011-12. The Robins kicked off with a 3-0 win at home to Crewe but lost their next four games before just one defeat in 21 matches, including a club record ten successive wins, catapulted them to the top. They beat top-flight Wigan Athletic 2-1 in the FA Cup third round and reached the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final but lost 2-0 to Chesterfield at Wembley Stadium, Swindon clinched the League Two title in style as two goals by Paul Benson plus others from Matt Ritchie, Aiden Flint and Alan Connell beat Port Vale 5-0 at the County Ground on 28th May 2012.





Mark McGhee stumped up £500,000 and wasted no time in making Ward a first-team regular at the New Den forming a formidable partnership at the back with Matthew Lawrence and helping guide them to the 2004 FA Cup

Final.

After four seasons and over 140 appearances for Millwall, Ward moved across London to join up with Crystal Palace in a £1.1 million deal. 12 months later Ward was on his travels again. The reliable centre half headed to the Midlands to sign for Wolves on a three-year deal only to endure a similar fate as had already been bestowed on him at Palace, great first season and then loaned out for the remainder of his time there at former clubs Watford and Millwall while in between stepping out with Charlton Athletic.


'The Peckham Beckham' then returned to Millwall on a permanent deal in 2010 before being loaned to Swindon Town last season. Former manager Paulo di Canio signed Ward to a permanent deal in January 2013. Ward has been ever-present in the league for The Robins so far this season and even finds time to write his own blog on a variety of issues including health, fitness and well-being.

STARMAN **NILE RANGER**

At 22, Nile Ranger still has plenty of time to erase what can only be described as a sketchy start to his career as a professional footballer.

Ranger made his professional debut whilst as a substitute for Newcastle United in a Championship match against West Brom. The former Crystal Palace youth star then went on to appear for The Magpies when they returned to the top flight of English football and even managed to grab a goal at Stamford Bridge against Chelsea.

After two brief loan spells at Barnsley and Sheffield Wednesday, Ranger was released from the North East club. Having previously had trails at The County Ground before signing for Newcastle, Ranger was offered the chance to return and impress the management team with the possibility of winning a deal. Ranger signed a one-year deal at the start of the season with the option of a second and has turned out 13 times in league and cup so far. The six-foot-two-inch forward seems to be enjoying his football and has struck a chord with strike partner Dany N'Guessan managing nine goals between them. Ranger has stated he hopes to change supporters' perceptions of him with his displays on the field, a sentiment encouraged by his new gaffer Mark Cooper. A goal here today would go towards that but the one time England U19 starlet will come up against one of the best centre halves in this division in the shape of our very own James Tarkowski, an interesting battle awaits this afternoon, one that promises to be last the whole 90 minutes.









DANY N'GUESSAN

French forward Dany N'Guessan will be strutting his stuff in attack for Swindon Town this afternoon, N'Guessan started out at Auxerre before coming to these shores when he signed for the famous Glasgow Rangers. The big striker never threatened to break into Paul Le Guen's plans and was loaned to Boston United, which led to Lincoln City securing his services on a permanent deal. N'Guessan's form for The Imps impressed which alerted Leicester City who stumped up the compensation money bringing the Frenchman to his fifth club, and still only 21-years old. Clubs six, seven and eight followed via loans at Scunthorpe, Southampton and Millwall where he eventually signed permanently before arriving at Swindon if the start of this season. N'Guessan is already a hit with the Robins faithful with his eye for goal and hard-work othic. His manager has described him as the sort of player who would chase pigeons; let's hope that's all he's chasing here at Boundary Park today.



KEEP AN EYE ON...

YASER KASIM

The only Iraqi in English football is on show for the visitors today, Yaser Kasim. Kasim a product of the Tottenham youth system spending three years there before turning down professional terms opting to try his luck elsewhere. After months spent as a free agent, Kasim was offered the chance of a short-term deal with Brighton and Hove Albion, one which he duly accepted confident he had enough in his locker to impress then manager Gus Poyet and secure a longthier deal. That he did, but in three years he had only managed to turn out once for the Seagulls having to try his luck on loan at Luton and Mansfield before being released at the end of last season, Swindon boss Mark Cooper wasted no time in snapping up the midfielder who has featured in all the clubs league fixtures this season. Kasim in an intelligent passer of the ball who can also mix it with the more domestic style of play.

JAY McEVELEY

Jay McEveley comes to the Ice Station today with a wealth of experience in the Football League having played for a vast array of clubs since bursting onto the scene with Blackburn Rovers back in 2002. The former Scotland international made a name for himself during his time spent at Derby County where he helped them gain promotion to the Premier League in an unforgettable day at Wembley beating West Bromich Albion 1-0 in the playoff final. The full back was loaned to Preston and Charlton before a permanent move to Barnsley in 2010 where he would go on to make over 40 appearances for The Tykes. In March 2012 he was loaned out again this time to Swindon. McEveley is an important player for Mark Cooper who will be relying heavily on him to perform in today's game.

MASSIMO LUONGO

Born in Sydney, Australia, Massimo Luongo started his youth career at APIA Leichhardt Tigers back in his homeland before being brought to England by Tottenham Hotspur. The cultured midfielder was never to feature for the North London side and spent time on loan at Ipswich before a spell at the County Ground where he made his debut against Lee Johnson's Latics during the second half of last season. Luongo went on to make 13 appearances prompting the Robins to sign the player permanently for £400,000. Luongo has featured in all of Mark Cooper's starting line-ups so far this season. Luongo will see a familiar face today in the form of Latics' striker Adam Rooney who was part of the Swindon set-up last season, friendship will be a mere after-thought when the referee blows his whistle to get this one underway.



HAVE THE WHEELS COME OFF AT ORIENT?

THE juggernaut that is Leyton Orient was finally derailed in mid-week, with a 3-1 defeat to Coventry ending a 12-game game unbeaten run.

Tipped to struggle in August, the mighty O's won ten and drew two of their opening League One games to ensure that relegation will be the last thing on their minds come May.

The question is, can they turn a good start into a good season?
Let's start with the good news.
Orient's 32-point haul from 12 games is better than any team in the Football League has managed in four years.

Doncaster Rovers, promoted as champions from League One last term, had only half that number at the same stage.

But now for the bad news: In that same period, of the teams leading after 12 games, only eight actually went on to win promotion. Here are the teams who fell away

2012-13 LEICESTER PTS: 25 Championship

Steamed to the summit but slumped out of contention after a miserable Christmas. A doubt for the play-offs at one stage, the Foxes made sixth at the death but were agonisingly beaten by Watford in the semis after Anthony Knockaert's late penalty miss allowed Troy Deeney to net a last-gasp winner at the other end.

2012-13 TRANMERE PTS: 30 LEAGUE ONE

Last year's Leyton Orient, unfancied Rovers stunned everybody by going unbeaten for their first 12 games before – you guessed it – a 3-1 defeat. O's fans will hope it isn't an omen as Tranmere first missed out on the play-offs and now sit at the foot of League One after a wretched start.

2011-12 SOUTHEND PTS: 25 LEAGUE TWO

Surprise leaders for much of the season, Paul Sturrock's men were rarely out of the top three until a catastrophic loss of form. Four wins from their final five games very nearly propelled them back into the mix but they missed out on third place by a point to Crawley Town and were soundly beaten in the play-offs by Crewe.

2009-10 CHARLTON PTS: 28 LEAGUE ONE

After a 7-1 defeat on the opening day, Norwich eventually cruised to the title. But elsewhere, one of the tightest promotion battles for years saw the likes of Charlton, Leeds, Millwall, Swindon and Huddersfield battling for the final automatic spot. On a dramatic final day, Leeds sealed the deal, with the second and sixth separated by just six points. Phil Parkinson's cash-strapped Addicks missed out by two points and lost to Swindon in a play-off semi penalty shoot-out.




