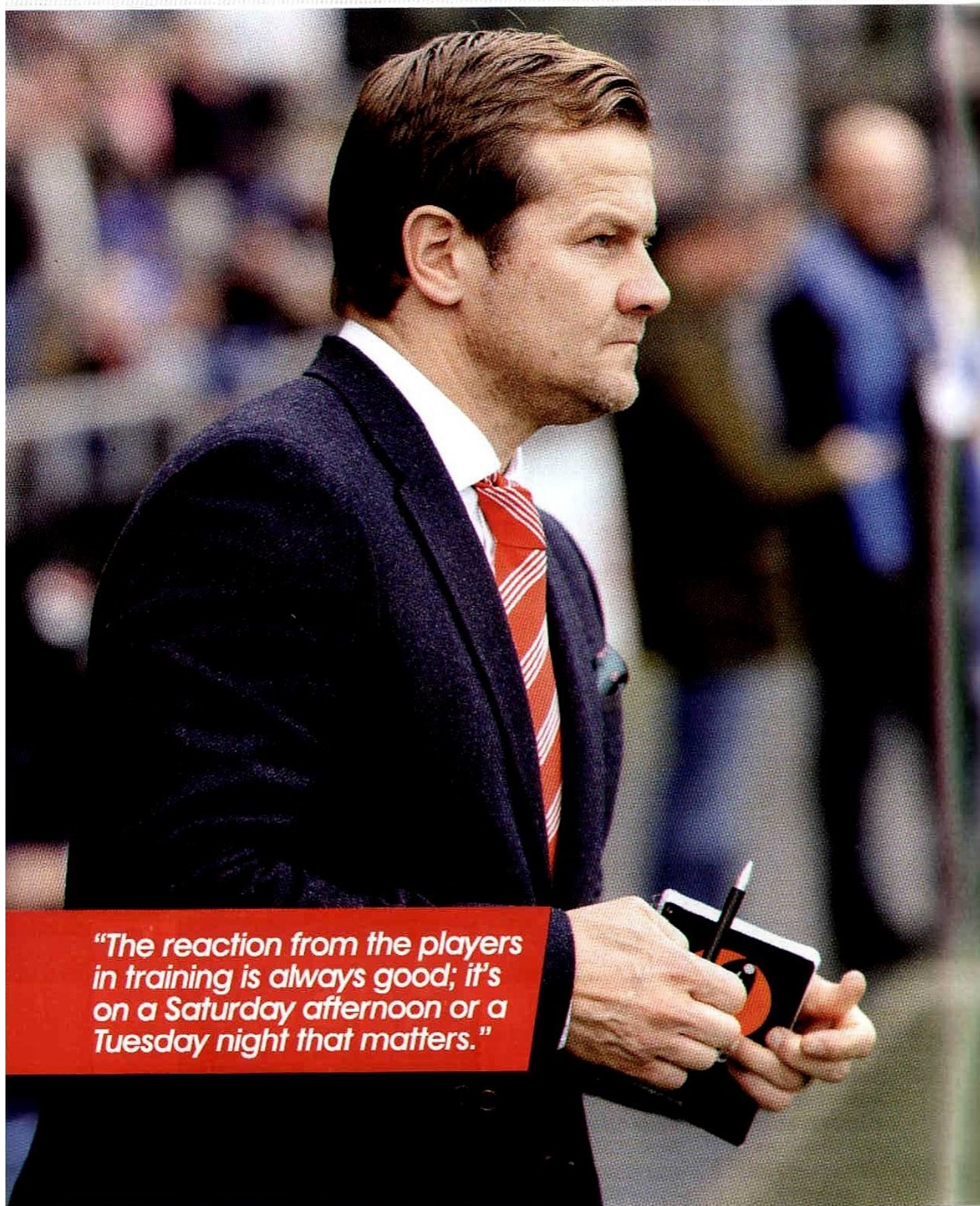

The defeat to Walsall wasn't so much a denting of pride but a reminder that if we take our eye off the ball slightly then we will get beaten and if we don't play to our strengths, which is keeping the ball away from the opposition, then we make the game a lottery. Keep behind the players as you have done all season.

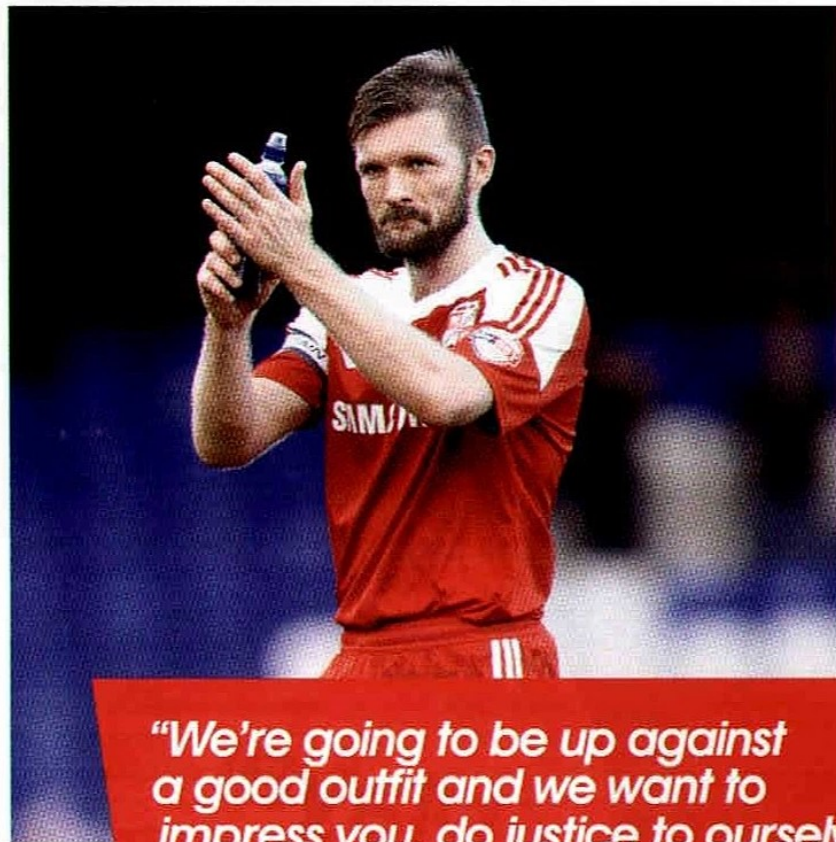

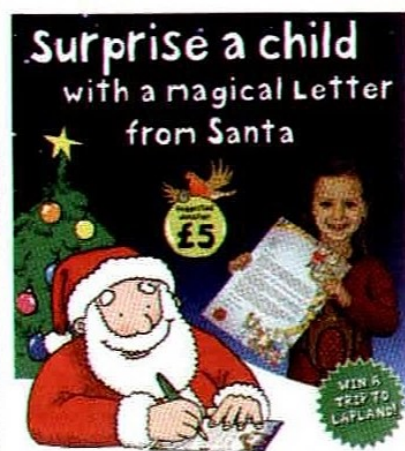

THE Valiants are back in League 1 after a campaign which saw them clinch automatic promotion...

WITH Vale still in administration as the 2012/13 campaign kicked-off, they recorded two wins from their opening three league games before winning four consecutive games in September including a 6-2 win over Rotherham and a 5-2 win at Fleetwood. The only blip came in the form of a 2-0 home reverse to fellow promotion contenders, Gillingham. In their next six fixtures, they would only drop points twice before losing at Northampton at the

end of October. An unbeaten November preceded cup exits in both the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and the FA Cup which was then followed up with three wins from four over the Christmas and New Year period. In the middle of January, a win at Gillingham sparked an unbeaten spell that would last until February where the Valiants would fail to win at home for four games. A 2-0 win at York in mid-March was then followed by a 3-2 home

victory over Cheltenham. A huge 7-1 thrashing of Burton put Vale within touching distance of promotion, a goal that was achieved despite four successive draws to end the campaign. The final day draw at Wycombe Wanderers confirmed the Valiants' place in the third tier of English football. This term has seen Micky Adams' side record a symmetrical-looking six wins and six defeats in the league including two victories from their last two fixtures.

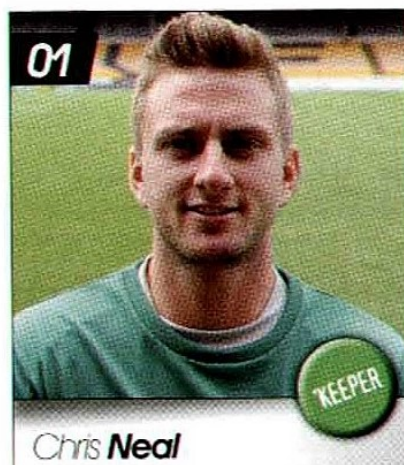
AS a player, Adams represented a number of clubs as a full-back after graduating from the youth ranks at Gillingham. He would go on to have notable spells with Coventry City, Leeds United and Southampton, plying his trade in the top flight with the latter. The Yorkshireman cut his teeth in management with Fulham, leading them to promotion in 1997. After brief stints with Swansea, Brentford and a caretaker role with Nottingham

Forest, he took the reins at Brighton and Hove Albion in 1999. Led the Seagulls to the Division Three title then departed for Leicester City and took the Foxes into the Premier League. His next job was at Coventry City and he briefly returned to Brighton before being appointed at Port Vale for the first time in 2009. Following a brief hiatus at boyhood club Sheffield United, he went back to Vale Park in 2011 and guided the Valiants to promotion last season.

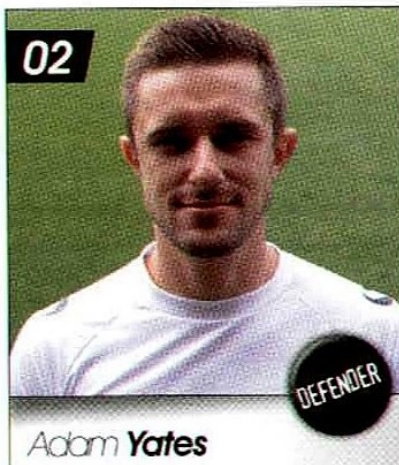

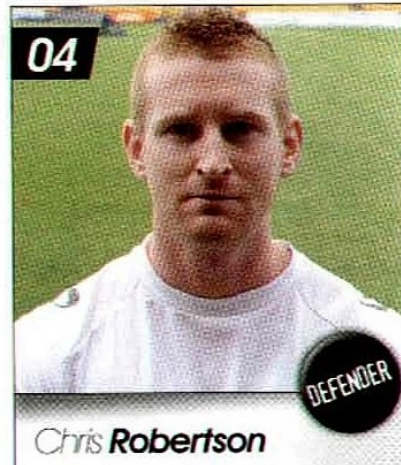

**Chris Neal**

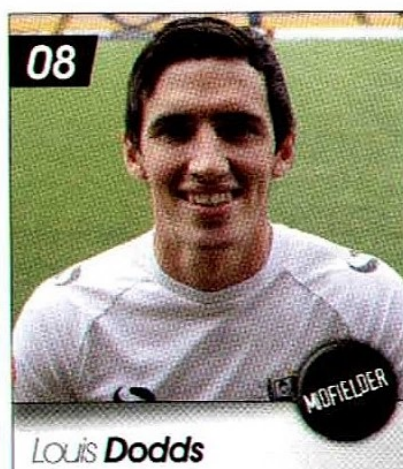
THE goalkeeper began his career with Preston North End and enjoyed time out on loan with Tamworth, Morecambe and Shrewsbury before joining the Shrews on a permanent basis in July 2009. In three years at Greenhous Meadow, Neal was part of the side that won promotion from League Two in 2012 and signed for Vale that summer. Last season, he made over 50 appearances in all competitions as the Vallants clinched promotion to League One.

**Adam Yates**

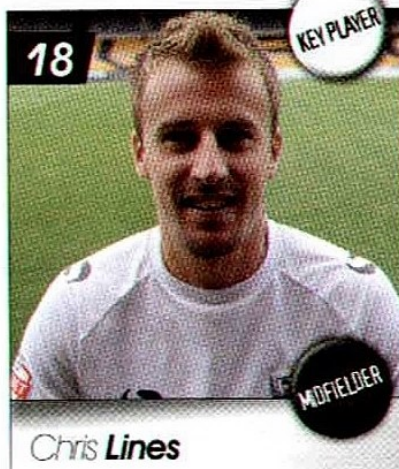
THE locally-born right-back started out with Crewe Alexandra and had a stint on loan at Halifax Town before making the switch to Morecambe in 2006. After helping the Shrimps into the Football League, he had a brief loan spell at Burton Albion, then moved to Vale Park in the summer of 2009. He has made over 150 appearances for the Vallants and was a key component of Vale's promotion-winning side last term.

**Chris Robertson**

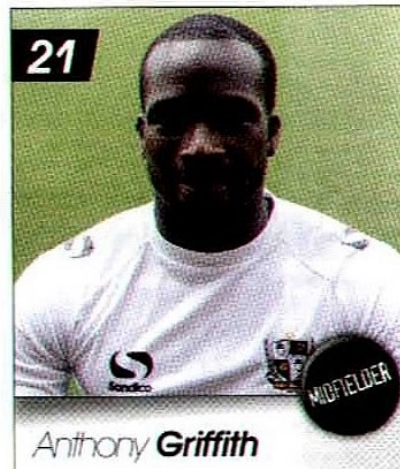
THE Scotsman came through the ranks at Sheffield United before swapping Bramall Lane for Plainmoor and Torquay United in March 2007. In five years on the South Coast, the centre-half racked up close to 200 appearances for the Gulls and moved to Preston in January 2012. After a season and a half at Deepdale, he made the switch to Port Vale in the summer. He has been ever-present for the Vallants this campaign.

**Louis Dodds**

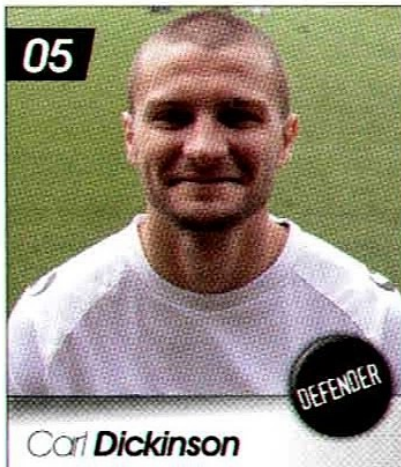
THE midfielder, who can also play up front if necessary, learned his footballing trade at Leicester City and spent time on loan at Northwich Victoria, Rochdale and Lincoln City in the early part of his career. He signed for Port Vale in the summer of 2009 and has now clocked up over 200 appearances for the Vallants. Dodds made 30 appearances last term as Vale clinched promotion from League Two, contributing seven goals.

**Chris Lines**

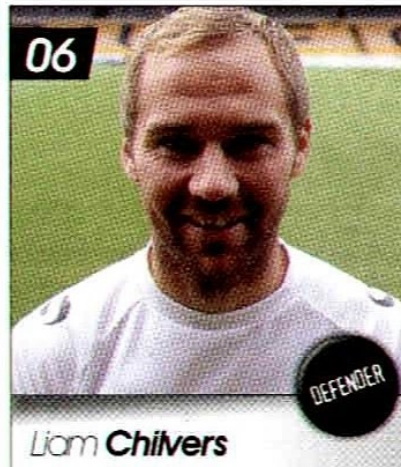
LINES began his career further along the M4 with Bristol Rovers. He made over 150 appearances for his hometown club before moving to Sheffield Wednesday in August 2011. In a two-year stay at Hillsborough, the midfielder helped the Owls win promotion from League One in 2012. Last term, he made 18 appearances in a loan spell at MK Dons. In July, he joined Port Vale and has made 14 appearances so far this campaign.

**Anthony Griffith**

AFTER starting his career with Doncaster Rovers, Griffith spent time on loan at Oxford, Darlington, Stafford and Halifax. The central midfielder then moved to Port Vale in 2008, making over 150 appearances in his first stint at Vale Park. After moving to Leyton Orient ahead of the 2012/13 campaign, the Montserrat international spent just one season in East London and was back on loan at Vale between March and April of this year. Re-joined permanently in the summer.

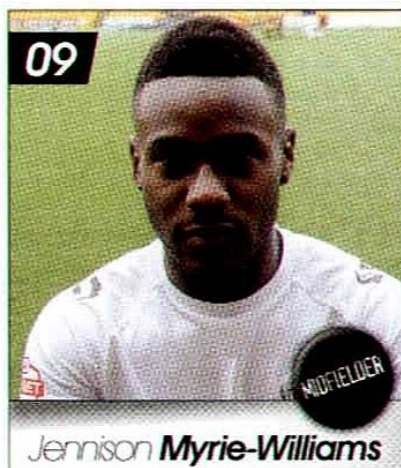
DICKINSON, who can play both at centre-half and at left-back, began his career at Vale's local rivals, Stoke City. He helped the Potters win promotion to the Premier League in 2008 and had loan spells at Blackpool, Leeds, Barnsley and Portsmouth before moving to Watford in the summer of 2011. Last season, he spent time on loan back at Fratton Park and at Coventry. Was snapped up by Vale boss Micky Adams in the summer.

**Liam Chilvers**

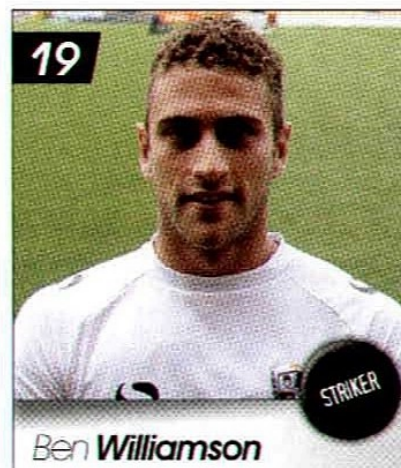
THE versatile defender started out at Arsenal and had loan spells at the likes of Northampton, Notts County and Colchester before joining the Us on a permanent basis in 2004. After moving to Preston and making over 100 appearances at Deepdale, he joined Notts County permanently in 2010. He had a stint at Telford and two separate stays at Port Vale before signing for the Valiants on a permanent deal in the summer.

**Doug Loft**

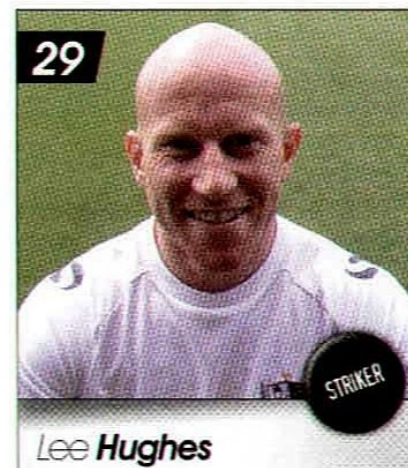
A product of the youth academy at Brighton, the central midfielder made the majority of his appearances for the Seagulls from the substitutes' bench. Following a loan stint at Dagenham and Redbridge in 2009, he moved to Vale Park later that summer. After recovering from a punctured lung injury in the 2010/11 season, Loft has now racked up over 150 appearances for Vale. This term, he has found the net four times already from midfield.

**Jennison Myrie-Williams**

THE winger began his career with Bristol City and was on loan at Cheltenham, Tranmere, Carlisle and Hereford before departing Ashton Gate in July 2009. After joining Dundee United, Myrie-Williams spent just over a season at Tannadice and moved to St. Johnstone in September 2010. Moved back down south in 2011, joining Stevenage. Following a short stint at Port Vale during the 2011/12 campaign, he signed a permanent deal in May 2012.

**Ben Williamson**

THE striker is a graduate of the Glenn Hoddle Academy and started his career at Hyde United. Following a short loan spell at Bournemouth, where he made only five substitute appearances, Williamson turned down a contract with the Cherries to join Port Vale on loan. After impressing in pre-season, he joined permanently in the summer of 2012 and found the net nine times as the Valiants clinched promotion from League Two last term.

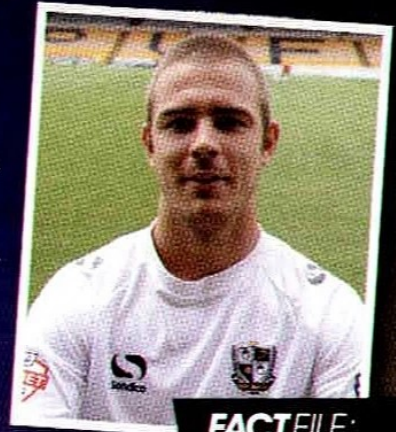
THE veteran striker began his career at Kidderminster before signing for West Bromwich Albion in 1997. In four years at the Hawthorns, he plundered 79 league goals, earning him a big-money move to Coventry City. After just one season however, he moved back to West Brom. Joined Oldham in the summer of 2007, and also played for Blackpool before making the switch to Notts County. Notched over 60 goals for the Magpies and moved to Vale Park in January.

TOM POPE

COYR takes a closer look at the prolific front-man who will be looking to add to his goals tally this afternoon...

THE Stoke-born, self-confessed Port Vale fan began his career at Crewe Alexandra, breaking into the first team towards the end of the 2006/07 season. He notched his first senior goal against Bristol Rovers in August 2007 and went on to notch a further six times that campaign from 28 outings. The 2008/09 season produced a further ten goals for the striker, promoting Rotherham United to part with £150,000 for his services in the summer of 2009. After netting his first two goals for the Millers in a League Cup tie against West Brom, the striker would only register four more times over the course of the next two seasons and joined Vale on loan in the latter part of the 2010/11 season. He penned a 12-month deal with boyhood club Port Vale in the summer of 2011 after scoring three times during his loan spell. In his first full season with the Valiants Pope only notched five times from 45 outings but hit the ground running in 2012/13. He announced his arrival by hitting four goals in Vale's 6-2 win over fellow promotion

contenders Rotherham. At the same stage last year, the striker already had a massive 15 goals to his name. By the New Year, that tally had increased to 23 including another hat-trick in a 4-0 win over Bristol Rovers. After four goals in four games in January, he suffered somewhat of a goal drought, not finding the net at all in February. At the end of March, another hat-trick, this time against Cheltenham, put him back on track. His final goal of the campaign against Rochdale put Vale on the brink of promotion and he finished the season with a whopping 33 goals in all competitions. He has already notched six times this term and scored the winner in last weekend's win over Gillingham.

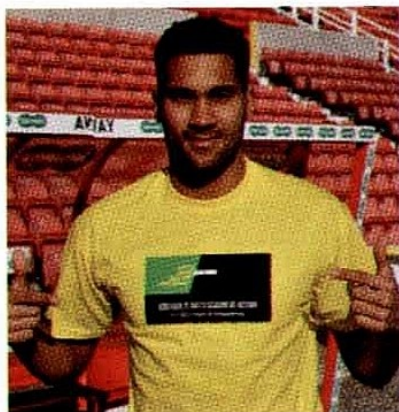

TOWN goalkeeper Wes Foderingham was, this week, announced as part of a new initiative, entitled the Next 20, launched by Kick It Out to champion 20 young football stars across the Premier League, Football League and Women's Super League (WSL).

The Next 20, which was introduced as part of the organisation's 'Season of Action' to mark its 20 year anniversary, will see players including Wesley, Arsenal full-back Carl Jenkinson, Sheffield United defender Harry Maguire and Everton Ladies star Toni Duggan raise awareness of Kick It Out through a varied set of activities within the community.

Wes, who studied at Phoenix High School in London, signed for Swindon permanently in 2012 after impressing during a loan spell from Crystal Palace. The 22-year-old hopes that his profile, both in football and the wider community, will help him promote the importance of equality and inclusion.

GRANT Hall has been one of the first names on the team sheet since his arrival on loan from White Hart Lane. Here, he analyses the season so far and says finding consistency is the key to Swindon's hopes of promotion...

Few would have predicted two defeats in a week after a string of consecutive wins; how have the players reacted to the past seven days?

It's been a bit of a weird one having won three in a row, starting with the win against Notts County and then leading to the win against Rotherham. As a defender, to have three clean sheets as well was brilliant, and so to then lose two games and concede the goals we did has been disappointing.

What do you think the problem has been?

We just weren't at it at any stage in the game against Walsall. We could have played the whole night and we wouldn't have got a result. It just wasn't our night. Walsall are a good side and they did a very good job on us. Oldham was a bit tougher to take because I thought we did enough to get something from the game. To come back into it and level at 1-1, we then had a decent 20-minute spell and

I thought we were going to go on and win it. So to lose 2-1 is very frustrating. It was disappointing to be 1-0 down in the first place, but to go behind again having got back into it was hard to take.

I think teams are starting to realise the way we play now and they set out their team to do a job on us by pressing us higher up the pitch. We need to realise that and play higher up the pitch ourselves and look for different solutions to win the game. Hopefully we'll bounce back.

We obviously have a very defined style of play, so how can we guard against the fact that teams are, as you say, 'doing a job' and pressing us higher up the pitch?

We've been discussing it throughout the team and we've talked about turning teams round for the first ten or 15 minutes. That will force them to drop off and that will hopefully enables us to play a bit. I think that's just down to us on the pitch.

You've played a lot of games so far - how are you enjoying life in League 1?

I needed the experience. I hadn't been on loan at this level and I needed that physical challenge against experienced players. I think I'm learning more and more and getting better with each game. At the start I felt I made a few mistakes, but I'm continuing to learn from them and it's that experience that I need.

I imagine you hoped to play every week, so you must be delighted with the opportunities you've had so far...

I knew I needed to work hard in pre-season. I also knew that if I was given a chance I had to take it, but I didn't expect to start every week straight away. I was prepared to work hard and see where things went from there and obviously I wanted to play games; that was the point of coming here. I've really benefitted from the experience.

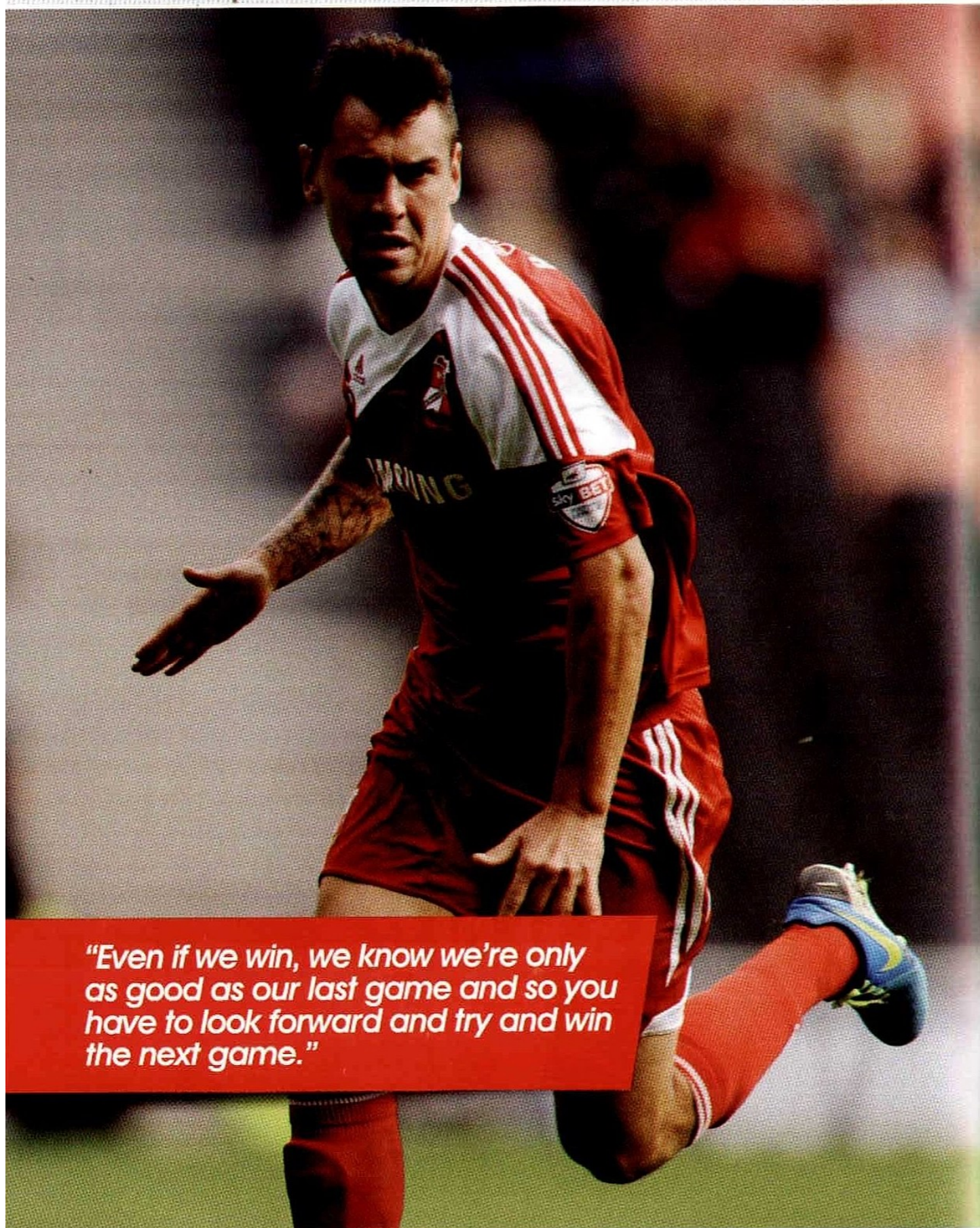

What is it like for a young defender playing alongside someone with Darren Ward's experience? What does he offer a young player?

He's been there and done it all and he's helped me massively on and off the pitch. We talk to each other all the time about football, whether it's games or training and certain situations we've been in. He's been massive for me.

Tell us a little bit about the loan experience... is it difficult moving away from home and playing for a different club?

I'm enjoying it, to be honest. I was at Brighton originally for four years and then joined Tottenham, which was the first time I moved away from home. That took time to get used to and it was the same here. Obviously I knew one or two of the players, which helped, and I feel I've settled in quite quickly.

We've all got places of our own now [as opposed to staying in hotel rooms] and that's been a big help as well.

How do you respond to losing games; are you downbeat when we get beaten or can you put a loss behind you?

Obviously it's not nice losing, but I try and take positives from every game. You try and work on things in training. Even if we win, we know we're only as good as our last game and so you have to look forward and try and win the next game.

Do you watch the Football League Show, even if we lose?

[Laughs] I like to watch it, to be honest. Even if we've lost I like to see how and why we conceded the goals again because you don't get to see the bigger picture when you're playing. I think it's important to do that to enable you to work on things in training.

Presumably you watch videos of your own performance whether we win or lose, as well as analysing the opposition?

Yes, we tend to watch videos on a Friday or on a Monday if it's a Tuesday game. We like to see how the opposition sets up but also how we've done certain things in previous games.

Having spoken to a couple of players this season, there seems to be a very good team spirit in the camp. Would you agree?

Yes, definitely. I would say it helped me settle when I came here. I knew some of the Spurs boys as well as Ryan Harley and Yaser [Kasim] from Brighton, so that helped. But we're all in it together, there are no separate groups and we all get on well with each other.

There is a lot in common between you all in that you're all young guys trying to make a name for yourself...

I think that's right. A lot of us are young and we're all out to try and prove a point and further our careers. Everyone's working hard and the aim is to go up at the end of the season.

Just turning your attention to the FA Cup draw [Swindon were drawn away to Macclesfield], what do you make of it?

Every game is important for us and we'll just be trying to win the game and try and get a big draw later on, like we did with Chelsea in the League Cup.

Who is the best player you have played against so far in your career?

I'm going to have to say Fernando Torres when we played against Chelsea in the Capital One Cup. His movement and work rate were unbelievable.

Who's got the worst haircut at the club?

Massimo Luongo (on Twitter)

(Laughs) I know he's battered me about this. Definitely not me! There are a few safety trims around at the moment and they know who they are!



You made your professional debut for Brighton in the FA Cup, so do you have fond memories of the competition?

That's right. I made my full debut against Wrexham at the Amex Stadium and because it was my first professional start I'll always remember it. I had a good game that day as well, so it's a happy memory.

Tell us a bit about your time at Brighton. You advanced through the club's Centre of Excellence only to be released and then later re-signed?

I was there from the age of 12 through to 16 and got released. I went to Lewes for a period of about 16 months and that really helped my development. Being released was tough to take, but looking back I think it was the right decision because I wasn't ready. I hadn't matured and going to Lewes changed me as a player and a person. I knew a few players at Lewes and the manager was keen to get me down there. I was 16/17 and playing in the Conference, so I couldn't complain. In that league you get big physical players and so as a 16/17 year-old lad you have to grow up pretty quick and learn what's what. I was playing with players like Danny Cullip and Anthony Barnes, lads who had played Championship and Premier League football, and they helped me a lot. I grew from there and kicked on when I returned to Brighton.

And after that, the decision to leave Brighton to join Spurs must have been a tough one?

It was tough because Brighton is my hometown and my home club. I thought about it for ages

and I sought a lot of advice from my parents and people like that, but at the time it felt like the right decision because things weren't working well at Brighton. Since I've gone to Spurs I've been happy and it has also given me the opportunity to come here, which has been invaluable.

And presumably the chance to work and train with some of the players and coaches at Spurs has been pretty handy, too?

Quite a lot of the youngsters train with the first team and that experience day in, day out can be very helpful for a young footballer. Andre [Villas-Boas] is a top manager as well. He's tactically very knowledgeable and he's been great for the club.

What's your grandmaster plan then? Is it a case of returning to Tottenham and trying to crack their first team or are you looking to put yourself in the shop window while you're here?

I'm not really looking that far ahead, to be honest. I'm really enjoying playing at the moment and the advantages that brings. Hopefully I can continue to play a part for the rest of the season. I'll take each game as it comes and see what happens at the end of the season.

Port Vale today then at home, it's important we get back to winning ways...

It's important we do that. We're at home and I know the crowd will get behind us. Hopefully we can put the last week behind us. We need a positive result.

It seems the biggest task we have this season is finding a level of consistency. When we

play well we're unplayable, but it's finding that level on a weekly basis.

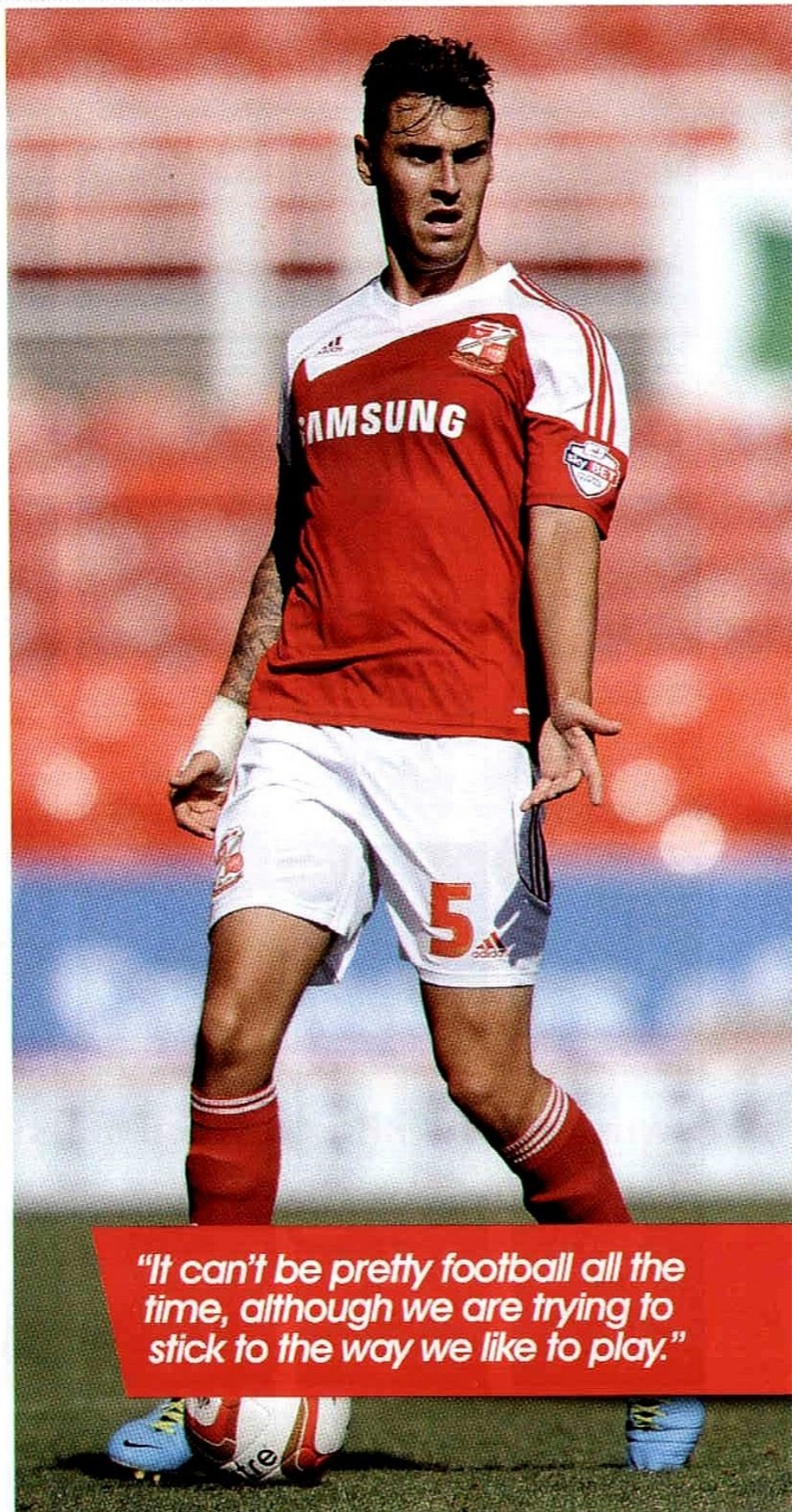
You're right, but we're a young team and we still haven't played together that much. I think we need to learn to close games out and sometimes try and win ugly. It can't be pretty football all the time, although we are trying to stick to the way we like to play. Hopefully it'll work more times than not and we'll be in and around the play-offs at the end of the season.

Our style of play finds the defenders with a lot of time with the ball at their feet – do you enjoy that?

I feel pretty comfortable with that style to be honest. We played that way at Brighton and it was the same at Tottenham, so I like having the ball at my feet. This style inevitably means we have to take the odd risk at times and while you can hear the odd noise from the crowd when we do that, you have to realise that sometimes we have to take risks if we're going to make a success of it. When we're 'at it' we're unstoppable. The 5-0 win against Crewe was the perfect example, same with the 4-0 win at Rotherham. But the key to our success this season will be how we can win games when we're not firing on all cylinders.

It all comes back to finding that consistency, which must be as frustrating for the players as it is for the supporters and the coaching staff...


Going from winning three games in a row and conceding no goals to losing twice in a week and conceding five is not ideal, so we have to try and find a level that makes us more consistent. The trick is just finding a way to win when we're not playing well.

ACCEPTABLE IN THE 80s.

9. 3PTS FOR A WIN:

WE continue our look back at what was acceptable in the 80s by this week focusing on one of the greatest innovations ever to take place in football...

BACK In the 1980s football was in trouble. Deep trouble. Haunted by the ever-constant threat of hooliganism not to mention dwindling attendances, football was crying out for a radical change and a figure to bring a fresh approach to the beautiful game that had become ugly and tainted by unsavoury violence and boring, predictable football.

The figurehead for the spark football was so desperately longing for came in the shape of Jimmy Hill, a man whose talent and hunger to bring fresh ideas into the game he so loved and adored was unmatched. Responding to the cry of help from the footballing fraternity, Hill constructed a working party of club Chairmen with the sole aim of putting the fun back into football and ridding it of its negative, stale image.

And so the three points for a win rule was born just in time for the 1981/82 season. Teams were now more concerned with winning as there was an extra point at stake which, as a result, ushered in a new breed of attacking play that had been sorely lacking from the British game before the rule change. More goals were scored on average by both the home and away side and the number of draws also fell which

further proved just how much genius there was behind Jimmy Hill's ground-breaking idea.

FIFA were so impressed by the impact that three points for a win had on the British game that they decided to implement the innovation in time for the World Cup in the USA in 1994 in order to promote more attacking play.

The 1980s produced many memorable moments in the history of football but Jimmy Hill's remarkable and extremely important idea was arguably one of the most vital and revolutionary of them all.

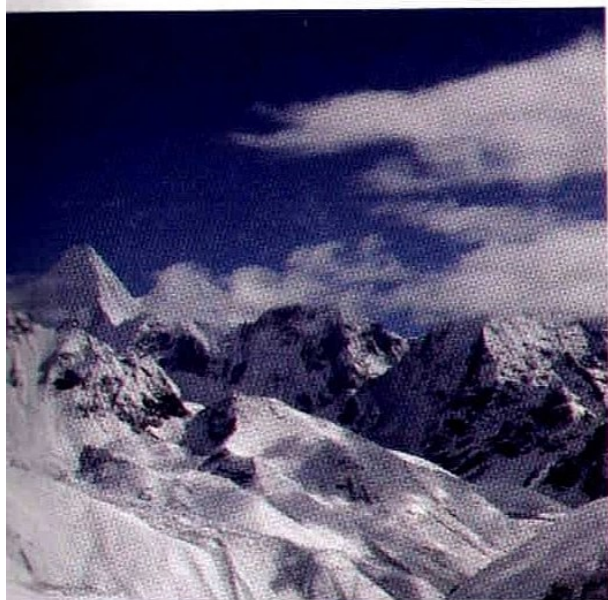


OVER the last couple of weeks, I have been fortunate to be part of an Extreme Classroom Project which I spoke about in the Chelsea programme. It was the third Classroom Project involving kids in the Engage Network who all have their own individual needs and problems and this gets them out of their school environments to challenge them both physically and mentally. The first one

was in the Arctic and last year I was on the trip to Tanzania which was called the 'hottest classroom' and the third one this year was the 'highest classroom' where the main aim was to get to Mount Everest's base camp. We fulfilled that and went even further to a summit at five-and-a-half thousand metres. The majority of the group made it up to there and it was a good trip - the hardest thing I've ever

done. I don't think I'll be doing that again: it drains you with nine to ten hours of continuous trekking and motivating the group to get up there. Believe it or not I found it ok getting to the top but the hardest thing was coming back. It took us about nine days to get there due to acclimatisation days and rest days. Then it took us three days to get back. Coming down sounds easy but you put a lot of

strain on your knees and ankles and some of us found it a bit hard on the way down. We had a good support team of three doctors, around 40 Sherpas and guides and, from a sporting mentor point of view, they could rely on myself, as well as former rugby players Lewis Moody and Thinus Delpont along with a number of others. We tried to rally the troops but the kids helped us through it as well. It's

been manic since my return to the Academy. Everything is back to normal: kids are everywhere, we've had lots of games and training. With this being half-term week, the kids were in training and took part in various festivals at places like Barnet, Portsmouth and Manchester City and the Under-15s have been gearing up for forthcoming games against Everton and Liverpool. I've been straight back in to it

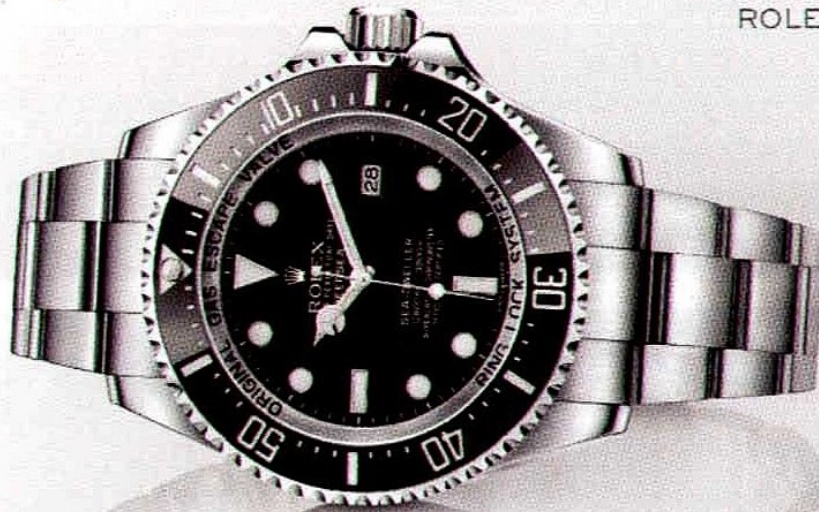
but I wouldn't have it any other way.

DAVE Wallis looks at the very early years of Swindon Town Football Club and how the club arrived at its present name...

IN the beginning...

Supporters with replica shirts in their wardrobes may own attire that shows the confusion regarding the beginning of Town's existence, something that taxed the Town historians for years.

In 2006/07 we sported shirts that lauded 125 years of Town's history, as 1881 was celebrated as being the founding year of our club. There was even an end of season evening dinner to celebrate the event.

Then, later in 2008, a new badge was agreed upon that showed the year of the club's formation as 1879.

So, what was that all about?

What was never in contention was that in 1881 a football match between an Old Town cricket club called 'Spartans' and a group of players calling themselves 'St. Mark's Young Mens' Friendly Society' took place.

The game not only resulted in a 2-2 draw but ended in something far more significant to modern day Town supporters. It was accepted that the 'Swindon Football Club' you are watching today was born.

And that's the way history was written for well over one hundred years.

But just a few years before the end of the last century, it emerged that the Swindon Advertiser reported on a match on 13th December 1879 between 'Swindon Association

Football Club' and a team called 'Rover FC'. The Reverend William Pitt, who was captain of the 'Spartan Club' before moving to Liddington in 1881, was the common denominator, indicating that the name Swindon was pinned to a club as early as 1879 and preceding the accepted version of events by two years.

Further research had shown the Reverend Pitt had given an after-dinner speech in 1911 to celebrate Swindon Town's Southern League championship-winning season, during which the clergyman proclaimed long and hard how he had formed the club back in 1879.

All told, it was concluded that the original club named Swindon Association Football Club began in 1879. A renaming to Spartans subsequently took place, before the name was revised to what we all know it as now in 1883.

Swindon Town Football Club.

All this is more surprising

bearing in mind that Old Town, and what was known as New Swindon, weren't actually merged into one borough, and hence one entity, until 1900.

Well-respected Town historian Paul Plowman is credited with piecing the story together and bringing about the revised history that shows 'Swindon' as a football club began in 1879.

Just think... And Stan Harland of Spartans lifts the 1969 League Cup, having defeated the mighty Arsenal by three goals to one.

Today it would feel strange to support our club, and not have the name of our town in its name. How different could our memories have been?

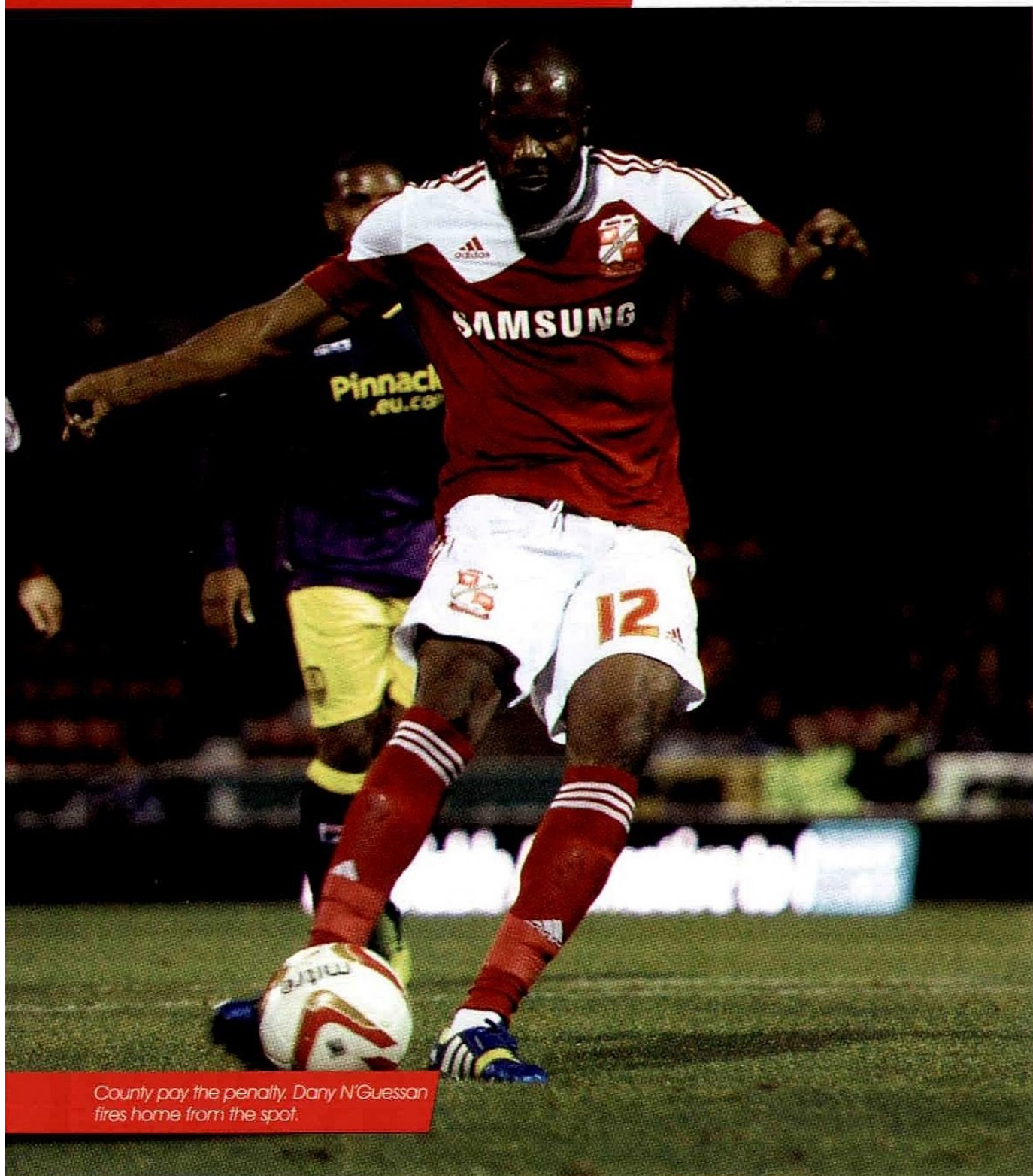

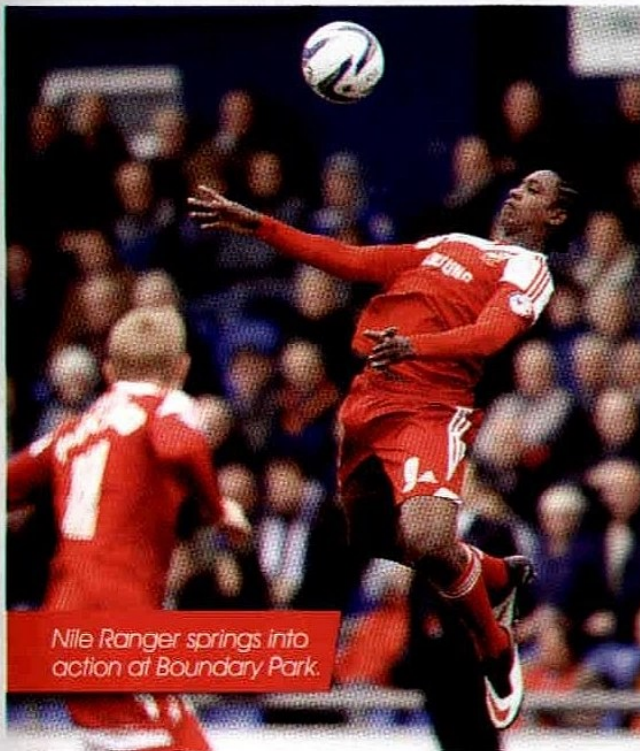

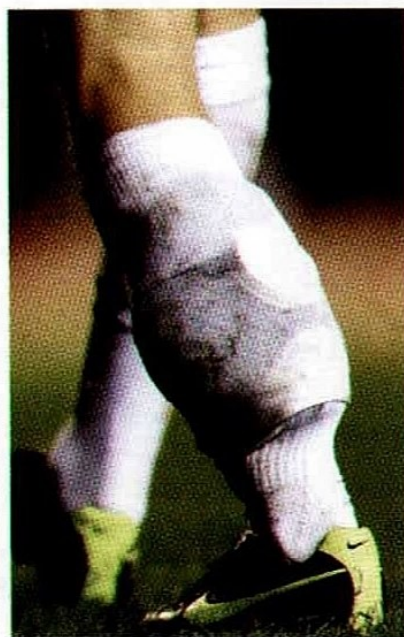
TOWN Physio Paul Godfrey is back with a new edition of PG's Tips. This week, he offers advice on injury recovery...



ACUTE muscle & ligament strains – When somebody suffers a soft tissue tear or strain to a muscle or ligament, most people know to follow the long-standing acronym R.I.C.E or Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation. Some will even take over the counter medication like anti-inflammatories (e.g. Ibuprofen), but what is far less known is how to optimise the acronym. The finer details to each component are key and are anti-inflammatories actually what you should be taking?

Rest – This is the most important part of the whole process and one that is rarely followed well, often due to the busy lives everyone is leading. A few days of altered loading through the damaged tissue can make a massive difference to the time the tissue takes to heal. Walk less, use crutches or a walking boot.

Ice – Most people will use a bag of frozen peas for 20 mins once or twice and consider this sufficient. Ice needs to be applied (best wrapped in a wet tea towel) for between 20 – 30 mins every hour you can from the moment the injury occurs and for at least the next 48 hours (depending upon the extent of the injury, it might be more), this includes through the night!



Be aggressive with the Ice, but watch the skin for ice burns.

Compression – When the injury is not being iced, it should be compressed. Ideally, use a professional (e.g. a Physio) to strap the injury correctly, this way the injury will get the correct compression and additional protection offered by a strapping. Alternatively use a compression bandage like a Tubi-grip, but do not simply apply via a double layer. Use a graded compression i.e. the maximum compression should be below the injury, some at the injury and

less above the injury. This way you will be encouraging the swelling to move up the limb away from the extremity.

Elevation – This is the easy bit. Keep the injured part higher than the groin (if you have injured your leg) or higher than the arm pit (if you have injured your arm). The idea is that along with the ice and compression you are trying to minimise any swelling and the swelling you do get will flow to the lymph nodes located in your groin and armpit, where the body deals with such fluid.

For R.I.C.E to work, do each part well and often and then seek professional advice for the remaining rehab, but what you do to the injury in the first 48 hours will make all the difference to the time the injury takes to heal overall.

Anti-inflammatories – Great for pain, but also some studies have shown that these types of medication also slow the rate at which an injured soft tissue can heal. Paracetamol for pain is far better and doesn't have the side effects. Anti-inflammatories have their place, but not for injured muscles or ligaments.

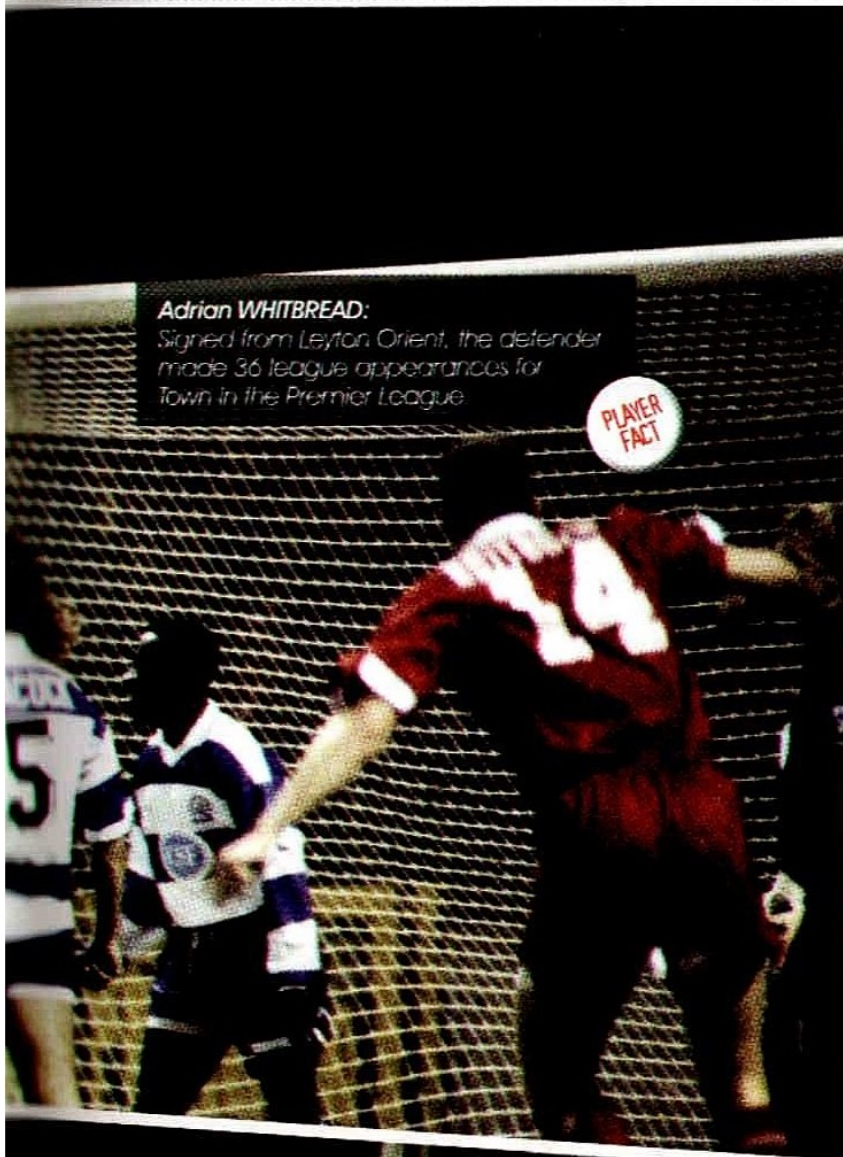

THE night of the 24th November 1993 is a date that will forever be etched into the history of Swindon Town Football Club as a new signing wrote his name into STFC folklore...

PAUL Bodin's late penalty the previous Saturday had earned Town a point at home to Ipswich after new signing Keith Scott had notched on his debut. It was Scott who would go on to become Swindon's hero after the 90 minutes against QPR. The task against the Rs was made harder for John Gorman's men after just 18 minutes when defender Luc Nijholt picked up his second yellow card in as many minutes to earn himself an early bath and leave the home side a man down. Just before the break, Swindon made the crucial breakthrough. Paul Bodin's cleared corner came back out to the left back. With another swing of his left boot, he sent a cross back into the danger area where it was helped back across goal towards the lurking Scott (pictured far left on the main image) who turned the ball home from close range. After a nervous second half, the Town held on to record their first victory in the top flight of English football much to the delight of Manager, John Gorman. "It's thoroughly deserved," he said. "We shouldn't have waited this long for this to happen. There have been people writing in to newspapers saying that there is no spirit in the team. Are they joking or what? Have you ever seen spirit like we've got here?"

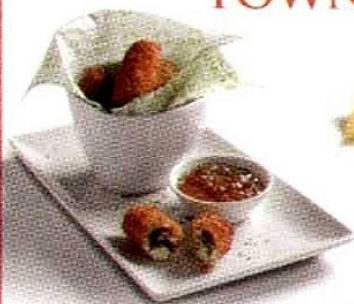

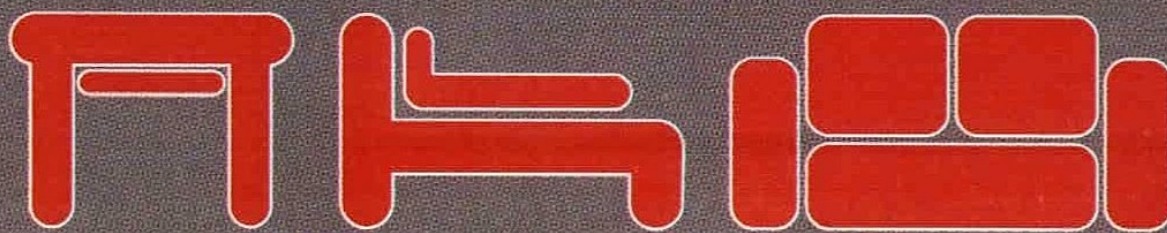

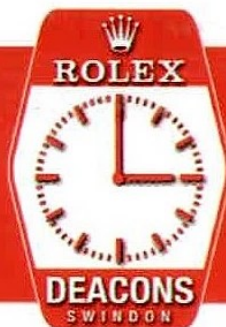
