The FA Cup is a great occasion and everyone has their own fond memories of watching or playing in it, especially in the later rounds. And of course the best memories come from games when a team as upset the odds and become one of the rounds giant killers.

In the last round, we were the 'giants' who were out to avoid being embarrassed, and we knew we had to be confident in our abilities and do a professional job to progress past Vauxhall Motors. 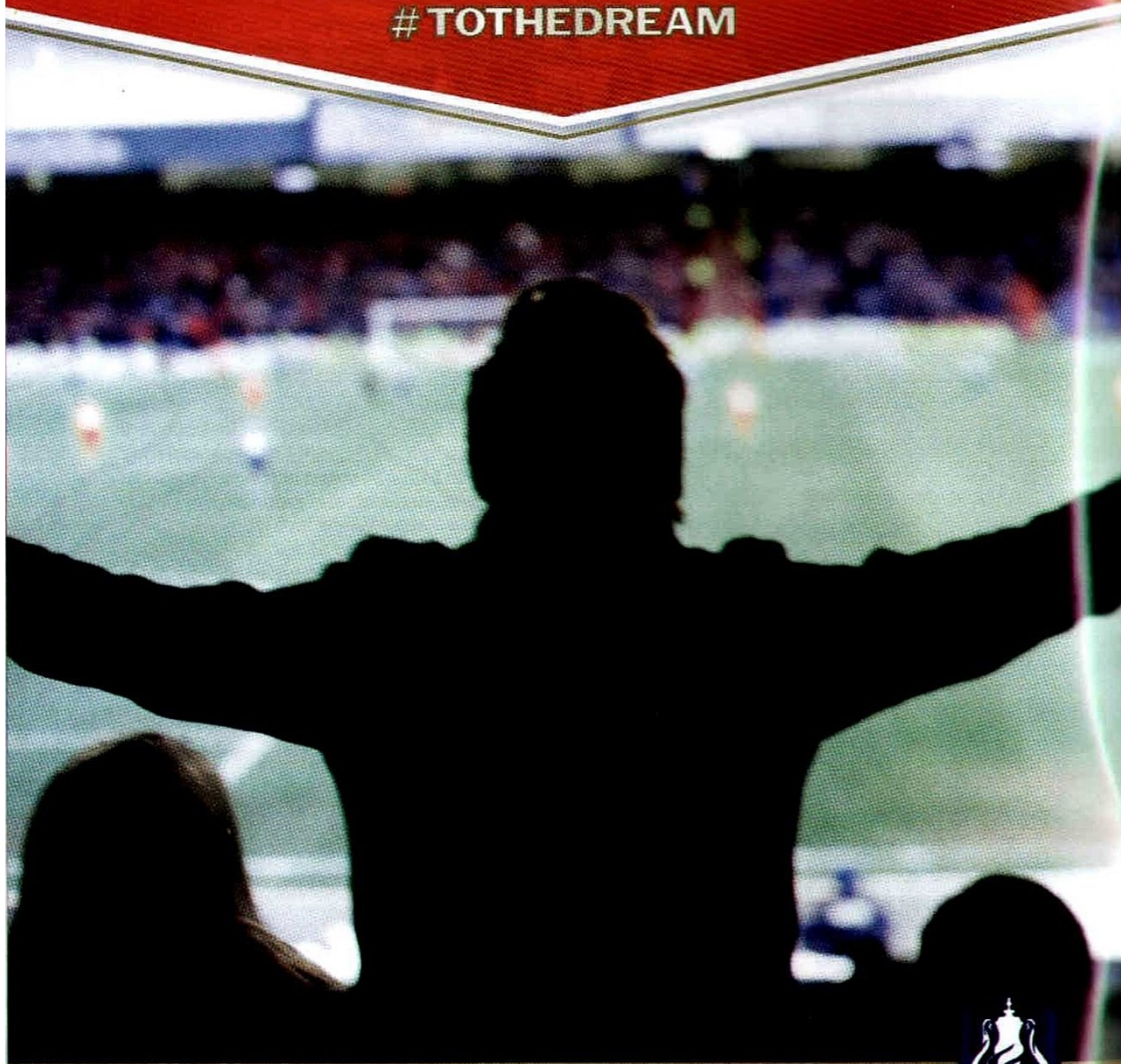

# FROM THE Boardroom

**It's a real pleasure to welcome everyone to the Moss Rose this afternoon for a FA Cup First Round Tie against our Football League One opponents, Swindon Town.**

During our 15 years in the Football League I suspect we began to take the early rounds of the Cup a little bit for granted. But relegation brings with it the requirement to qualify to take part at this stage which makes today's game just that little bit special. And this year we qualified with some style.

Our 7-0 victory over Vauxhall Motors a fortnight ago was a clear statement of intent from John and Efe's improving and very together young squad and the momentum it created helped us over the line in last Saturday's exciting victory over Wrexham. It's a cliché to say it but winning really is a habit and that's something we've got going for us as we take on a bigger challenge today.

Swindon, like Wrexham, have a great Cup heritage but history means little over 90 minutes in a winner takes all game as we admirably demonstrated last year at this stage when the Silkmen upset the odds at The County Ground.

Last year, of course, we faced a Robins team managed by the volatile Paulo di Canio who, the previous season, had branded his team chihuahuas after a League Two defeat here at Moss Rose. This year Swindon will be led by Mark Cooper who knows the Silkmen well, having played here on loan during our first Football League season, and I suspect his side might be made of sterner stuff. But given our current rich vein of form we must be in with a decent chance if we can show the same level of skill and commitment that we've seen in the last couple of games.

The challenge we face today on the pitch is, unfortunately, more than matched by the battle we need to

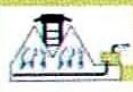
win in the back office as we continue to grapple with the consequences of relegation and the failure to maintain a challenge last season. It is self evident that a win today, against the odds, would keep alive the prospect of a Cup run that might just make all the difference but we can't build a future on such an uncertain outcome.

Our well publicised plans to create a community club cannot be completed without finding a solution to our financial problems and we need all the help we can get. There could be no better time for us all to make a difference. Let's get behind our team today from the start in the way we did back in 1997 when the current Swindon manager was a Silkman. We were unbeaten at home that amazing season and I'm sure I'm not alone in seeing a developing "against all odds" approach in the current squad which is perhaps not surprising, given John and Efe's presence on the touchline.

Our young team seem to have re-discovered the spirit of 97. Now it's time for the rest of us to play our part.

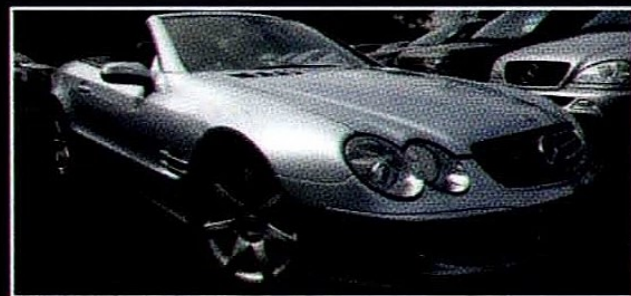

# TODAY'S Opposition



**Swindon Town FC was founded 1879, turned professional and joined the Southern League in 1894.**

The Robins reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1910, losing to eventual winners, Newcastle United and the following season they won the Southern League championship earning themselves a Charity Shield match with the Football League champions Manchester United which United won 8-4. Swindon entered the Football League in 1920 as a founding member of Division Three and defeated Luton Town 9-1 in their first game of the season, a record for the club in League matches that still stands.

After World War II the club was almost disbanded. Promotion to the second division in 1963 was short lived but in 1969, the Robins made history by beating Arsenal 3-1 to win the League Cup and secure a place in the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup, only to be robbed of the chance of playing in the competition when the FA mandated that only League Cup winners from Division One would be able to take part. They did however subsequently win the Anglo-Italian Cup, a tournament beset by hooliganism.

Swindon then had an unsuccessful period and were relegated in 1982 to the Fourth Division but were promoted as champions in 1986 with a Football League record of 102 points. A year later they won the Third Division play-offs to achieve a second successive promotion. Manager Lou Macari left in 1989 to take charge of West Ham United with former Argentine international, Ossie Ardiles replacing him. In his first season, Swindon were Second Division play-off winners but the club were relegated to the Third Division for breaching League rules. The then chairman Brian Hillier was given a six-month prison sentence though a later appeal allowed the Robins to stay in the Second Division.

Ardiles remained in charge until March 1991, when he departed to Newcastle United and was succeeded by Glenn Hoddle who a year later achieved promotion to the Premier League.

Hoddle moved to Chelsea before the 1993-94 FA Premier League season began, and was replaced by assistant John Gorman. Swindon never adjusted to the higher level and were relegated after recording only five wins and conceding 100 goals. They have never returned to the top flight.

The club has been beset by financial difficulties throughout its recent history, having been placed into administration twice. A series of management changes were to follow culminating in Paul Hart's team being relegated to League Two in 2011.

Soon after the 2010-11 season ended the board revealed that high-profile former player Paolo Di Canio would take his first management position at the club. He lost seven of his first thirteen games, including a reversal here at Moss Rose but the Robins then broke a club record by winning ten consecutive League games and comfortably secured promotion.

Then last February, with Swindon riding high in League One and in contention for a second consecutive promotion, Di Canio announced his resignation, to be replaced by Kevin MacDonald who took them to the League One play-offs. However after a penalty shoot-out defeat to Brentford, MacDonald left by mutual consent, only three weeks before the start of the current season and only five months after taking the Swindon job. His replacement, Mark Cooper, played eight games and scored two goals for the Silkmen, on loan from Hartlepool, early in our successful first season in the Football League.

The Robins are currently well placed in League One having put our Potteries neighbours Port Vale to the sword 5-2 at the County Ground last Saturday. A delighted Cooper told reporters:

"I certainly wouldn't mind paying to watch that because the second half was at times end to end and there was some really good football from us.

"Sometimes with a young team you can make mistakes, and that's maybe what happened for their goals, but we got on track again.

"We worked on getting them to press and winning the ball back and that was evident, and it's now back on track after the crisis of losing two games."

## Wes Foderingham

The goalkeeper came through the ranks with Fulham's Academy before moving to Crystal Palace. Wes initially joined Swindon on loan in 2012 where he kept a number of consecutive clean sheets in his first games. A string of fine performances saw him earn a

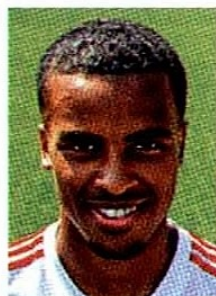
permanent contract in January 2012 and went on to help Town claim the League Two championship at the end of the season in addition to making an appearance at Wembley in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final.



## Nathan Thompson

Nathan was a product of Swindon's Academy, and among the substitutes on a number of occasions in the 2009/2010 season, but did not feature for the first team. The tough-tackling defender was a regular in the 2012/13 season as Swindon made the League One

Play-Offs. One of the standout performers of Town's season, he was named the Swindon Advertiser Player of the Year in April but missed the final stages of the campaign with an ankle injury.



## Nathan Byrne

Byrne penned a two-year deal with Swindon in the summer of 2013 after a successful loan spell the previous campaign. The defender played in both legs of Swindon's play-off final defeat to Brentford and was unfortunate to receive a red card in the second leg at Griffin

Park. Back in a permanent deal, the defender has played at left-back and right-back this season and has even played in an advanced role on the right wing, a move which brought him his first goal of the campaign against Gillingham.



## Jay McEveley

A former trainee with Blackburn Rovers, McEveley joined Derby County in 2007 after loan spells with Burnley, Gillingham and Ipswich, helping the Rams to the Premier League in 2007. The 27-year-old joined the Tykes on a free transfer from Derby in

the summer of 2010 and made 49 appearances at Oakwell. He has over 200 league appearances to his name and after impressing during his loan spell at The County Ground, he returned on a permanent deal in the summer of 2012.



## Darren Ward

Swindon's captain initially joined on loan last summer from Millwall, and the 33-year old made his Town debut against local rivals Oxford United before penning a permanent deal in January 2012. He started his career as a youngster at Watford making 67 appearances, including a

number of Premiership games before then Millwall boss Mark McGhee brought him to The Den in 2001. During his four years at the club, The Lions reached the FA Cup Final in 2004 and then had a taste of UEFA Cup action. Ward moved to Crystal Palace in a £1.1m deal in the summer of 2005 where he racked up 69 appearances before switching to Wolves. He put pen to paper on a brand new contract this summer.



## Grant Hall

The tall centre-half signed on a season-long loan from Tottenham Hotspur in the summer of 2013. After making his Town debut on the opening day of the season, in Swindon's 1-0 defeat at Peterborough United, Hall has started to form a solid partnership at the heart

of the Town defence alongside skipper Darren Ward.





### Ryan Mason

Mason signed a season-long loan deal with the Town in July 2013, joining from Tottenham Hotspur. The midfielder had made first-team appearances for Spurs in the Europa League and last season's Capital One Cup. Made his Swindon bow at

Peterborough on the opening day of the 2013/14 campaign. After an early injury, he burst back onto the scene, scoring a hat-trick in Swindon's 5-0 demolition of Crewe Alexandra.



### Massimo Luongo

Luongo joined Swindon from Tottenham on a season-long loan in the summer before completing a permanent move just before transfer deadline day. The midfielder is in his second spell at The County Ground having spent time on loan at the club at the end of the 2012/13 season. He scored the opening goal

of Swindon's play-off campaign against Brentford and played in both legs as Town were knocked out at the semi-final stage.

## SUBSTITUTES



### Alex Pritchard

Pritchard joined Town on a season-long youth loan from Tottenham Hotspur in the summer. After a spell at Peterborough United towards the end of the 2012/13 campaign, the winger made his Swindon bow at London Road on the opening day

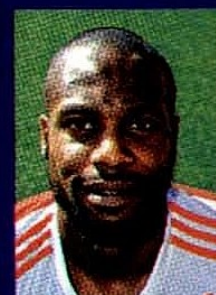
of the 2013/14 season. He notched his first Town goal in the Capital One Cup victory at QPR. Has international caps with England's Under-20s and represented his country at the recent Under-20 World Cup



### Louis Thompson

The youngster came up through the ranks at the STFC Academy and made his debut for the first team whilst still a first year scholar at Leicester City in the FA Cup fourth round in January 2012. Last term, his appearance alongside brother Nathan in an FA Cup tie against Macclesfield made a little bit of

history: the first time two brothers had played in the same Swindon side since 1947. After penning a professional deal in the summer, Thompson has made a number of appearances this campaign. He has also represented Wales at youth level.



### Dany N'Guessan

N'Guessan penned a deal until the end of the 2013/14 campaign just before the end of the summer transfer window. The former Millwall man has played for a number of clubs in the Football League, with his most prolific stint coming whilst at Lincoln

City. Has also played for Leicester City.



### Jack Barthram

The versatile youngster, who can play in defence or in midfield, penned a one-year deal with Swindon at the start of the 2013/14 campaign. Barthram had previously played with Tottenham Hotspur's youth team before his release in the summer. Scored his first senior goal in the JPT win over Plymouth Argyle.



### Nile Ranger

The former Newcastle United man put pen-to-paper on a one-year contract at The County Ground in the summer of 2013. He stepped off the bench to make his Town debut against Shrewsbury Town. Scored his first goal in the Capital One Cup victory

against QPR before notching his first league goal against Crewe at SN1.




### Mohamed El-Gabbas

An Egypt international, the forward joined Swindon in the summer from Belgian side Lierse SK where he had scored 16 goals in 90 appearances. Beginning his career with Egyptian top flight side Al-Masry, he moved to Newcastle in 2005 and remained with their youth side for two years. Returning to Egypt he rejoined Al-

Masry and made his senior debut before moving back to Europe with Belgian side Lierse SK. He joined Swindon in the summer.

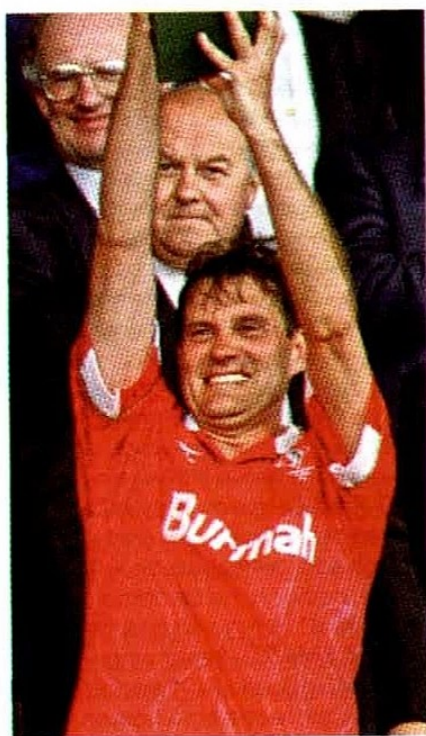

**Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS looks at Swindon Town's leading lights**

## CLASSIC CAMPAIGN – 1968-69

Danny Williams managed Swindon Town to an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968-69. The Robins were early pace-setters in the Third Division and seven successive wins climaxed with a 5-1 victory over Southport. They triumphed 6-2 at Northampton, then won 5-1 at home to Oldham, but lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Don Rogers starred as Swindon defeated Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final.



## MANAGING TO SUCCEED – GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins and helping them to promotion, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

## FAB FOUR MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Subsequently with Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town before moving to Manchester City.

## DON ROGERS

England U-23 international winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion

campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

## JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back John Trollope holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home to Halifax Town a month later and was ever-present in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63 promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. Scoring 21 goals in 770 League games for Swindon, he was their coach before managing them between November 1980 and March 1983, then their youth team boss.

## COLIN CALDERWOOD

Commanding central defender Collin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Mansfield Town, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also helped the Robins to win promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including their 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Spurs in July 1993, then Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He has managed Northampton Town, Forest and Hibernian, since assisting Chris Hughton at various clubs.



# Back to the Future

with SWINDON TOWN

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS traces what happened to four of Swindon Town's greatest post-war teams

## 1962-63 PROMOTION WINNERS

**MIKE TURNER:** Ex-England Youth goalkeeper who played 75 League games prior to joining Torquay United in July 1964, then hometown Bridport. He spent over 20 years with Plessey, settling in Poole.

**MAURICE OWEN:** Long-serving favourite, previously top scorer, who netted 150 goals in 555 League games before joining the coaching staff. He later settled back in Abingdon and died in July 2000.

**JOHN TROLLOPE:** Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss.

**KEITH MORGAN:** Right-half who netted six goals in 325 League games while at the County Ground, moving to hometown Trowbridge in July 1967. He has since been a builder and decorator in Swindon.

**KEN MCPHERSON:** Versatile centre-half who scored three times in 107 League games for the Robins. He later ran a grocery business, then was a porter at Walgrave Hospital and now lives in Nottingham.

**BOBBY WOODRUFF:** Moved to Wolves in March 1964, then Crystal Palace, Cardiff City, Newport County and Gloucester City. He was a sales rep for a sports firm before working with young offenders.



**MIKE SUMMERBEE:** Young winger who joined Manchester City in August 1965, then Burnley, Blackpool and was Stockport's player-boss. The England international became a successful businessman.

**ERNIE HUNT:** Leading scorer who moved to Wolves in September 1965, then played for Everton, Coventry City and Bristol City. He became a publican in Ledbury, then a window cleaner in Gloucester.

**JACK SMITH:** Centre-forward who moved to Brighton in January 1964, then Notts County and Margate. He managed Ramsgate and Bath City, then was Portsmouth's youth coach and died in May 2008.

**CLIFF JACKSON:** Ex-England Schoolboy who joined Plymouth in June 1963, then Bert Head's Crystal Palace, Torquay and Cambridge City. He worked in community sports projects and lives in Devizes.

**ARNOLD D'ARCY:** Winger who moved to Cheltenham in July 1964, then Gravesend & Northfleet. He was a painter and decorator with Peter Chamberlain in Swindon for 36 years, settling in Southmoor.

## 1969 LEAGUE CUP WINNERS

**PETER DOWNSBOROUGH:** Ever-present goalkeeper who made 274 League appearances before joining Bradford City in November 1973. Later working at a power station, he has settled in Elland.

**ROD THOMAS:** Welsh international right-back who followed Dave Mackay to Derby County in November 1973. Later with Cardiff, Gloucester and Newport County, he became a publican in Stroud.

**JOHN TROLLOPE:** Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss.

**JOE BUTLER:** Versatile midfielder who netted 18 goals in 362 League games prior to joining Aldershot in August 1976, then played for Witney Town. He has since run his own taxi firm in Swindon.

**FRANK BURROWS:** Central defender who became Swindon's assistant-boss. He has held various coaching and management posts, including spells in charge of Cardiff City, Portsmouth and Swansea.

**STAN HARLAND:** Ever-present captain who joined Birmingham in December 1971. He managed Yeovil and Gravesend & Northfleet, then ran a delicatessen in Yeovil until his death in September 2001.

**DON HEATH:** Winger who moved to Oldham Athletic in July 1970, then Peterborough United, Hartlepool, Crook Town and Gateshead. Settling back in his native Stockton, he became a buyer for ICI.

**ROGER SMART:** Striker who netted 43 goals in 349 League games before joining Charlton



Athletic in May 1973, then Bath City, Melksham and Trowbridge. He was licensee of The Plough in Swindon.

**JOHN SMITH:** Ex-England U-23 international who joined Walsall in June 1971. Briefly their manager, then Dundalk's player-boss, he managed a social club in Harlesden until his death in February 1988.

**PETER NOBLE:** Ever-present striker who netted 62 goals in 216 League games before joining Burnley in June 1973, then had a spell with Blackpool. He has since run his own sportswear business in Burnley.

**DON ROGERS:** England U-23 winger who reunited with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Later with QPR, Swindon again and Yeovil Town, he has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.

## 1985-86 FOURTH DIVISION CHAMPIONS

**KENNY ALLEN:** Experienced goalkeeper who made 45 League appearances before rejoining Torquay United in December 1986. Settling in Newton Abbot, he was a postman, then a driver for a hospital.

**CHRIS RAMSEY:** Right-back who joined Southend United in August 1987. He later coached football in Malta and the United States, since becoming Leyton Orient's YDO and managing Newham Ladies.

**DAVE HOCKADAY:** Left-back who moved to Hull City in September 1990, then Shrewsbury, before coaching at clubs including Watford, MK Dons and Southampton.

**LEIGH BARNARD:** Midfielder who joined Cardiff City in October 1989. He rejoined Swindon as community officer, then coached in the United States and now teaches at Abbotsfield School in Hillingdon.

**DAVE COLE:** Central defender who netted three goals in 69 League games, moving to Torquay in November 1986, then Rochdale and Exeter. He then worked at a jeweller in Cheltenham, settling in Wales.

**COLIN CALDERWOOD:** Scotland international who later played for Spurs, Villa and Forest, then managed Northampton, Forest

and Hibernian. Has assisted Chris Hughton at various clubs, now Norwich.

**DAVE BAMBER:** Striker who netted 31 goals in 106 League games before joining Watford in June 1988, then Stoke City, Hull City and Blackpool again, where he now runs his own damp proofing company.

**CHARLIE HENRY:** Midfielder who moved to Aldershot in August 1989, then Cheltenham and Fairford Town. He worked locally for Rover and now for his brother-in-law, making stainless steel urinals.

**COLIN GORDON:** Striker who moved to Wimbledon in June 1986, then Reading, Fulham, Birmingham and Leicester. He later managed Stourbridge and now has several sports-related business interests.

**BRYAN WADE:** Striker who netted 18 goals in 60 League games before joining Swansea City in August 1988, then played for Brighton, Frome and Trowbridge again. He is now a builder in his native Bath.

**CHRIS KAMARA:** Much-travelled midfielder who later played for Stoke City, Leeds United, Luton Town and Sheffield United, then managed Bradford City and Stoke. He is now a summariser for Sky TV.

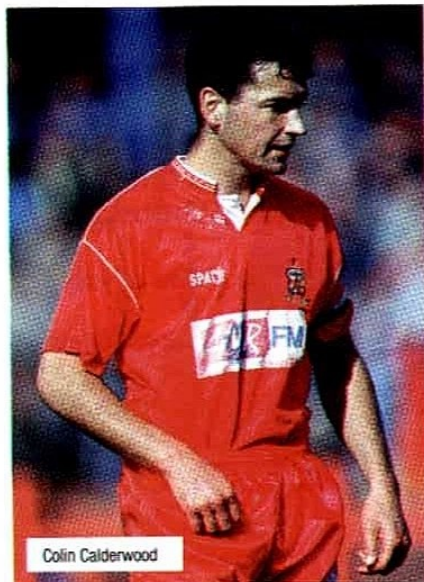
## 1992-93 PLAY-OFF WINNERS

**FRASER DIGBY:** England U-21 goalkeeper who joined Crystal Palace in August 1998, then Barry, QPR and Kidderminster. Later Swindon's commercial manager, he now works for Sports Solutions GB.

**NICKY SUMMERBEE:** England U-21 international who later played for Manchester City, Sunderland, Bolton, Leicester City, Bradford City, Swindon again and Tranmere. He is now involved in property.

**PAUL BODIN:** Welsh international left-back who netted 37 goals in 239 League games in two spells, moving to Reading in June 1996. Later Bath City's player-boss, he is now coaching back at Swindon.

**GLENN HODDLE:** Ex-England international midfielder who was player-boss until June 1993, then managed Chelsea, England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves. He runs his own Soccer Academy in Spain.



**COLIN CALDERWOOD:** Scotland international who later played for Spurs, Villa and Forest, then managed Northampton, Forest and Hibernian. Has assisted Chris Hughton at various clubs, now Norwich.

**SHAUN TAYLOR:** Ever-present central defender who moved to Bristol City in September 1996. Later Forest Green Rovers' assistant-boss, he has held coaching posts at Exeter City and Torquay United.

**JOHN MONCUR:** Hard-tackling midfielder who joined West Ham in June 1994. Since hanging up his boots in May 2003, he has become a born-again Christian and was briefly chairman of Grays Athletic.

**ROSS MACLAREN:** Scottish favourite who became reserve team boss. Later Aston Villa's chief scout and Notts County's assistant-manager, he now owns the Blue Bell Inn in Kirk Langley, Derbys.

**DAVE MITCHELL:** Australia international striker who moved to Millwall in October 1993. He has since coached Sydney Olympic, Sydney United, Parramatta Power and now manages Perth Glory.

**MARTIN LING:** Midfielder who netted ten goals in 152 League games before joining Leyton Orient in July 1996, becoming their manager. He has since managed Cambridge United and Torquay United.

**CRAIG MASKELL:** Striker who joined Southampton in February 1994, then Brighton, Happy Valley, Leyton Orient. He has since assisted Steve Cordery at Hampton & Richmond, Aylesbury and Staines.

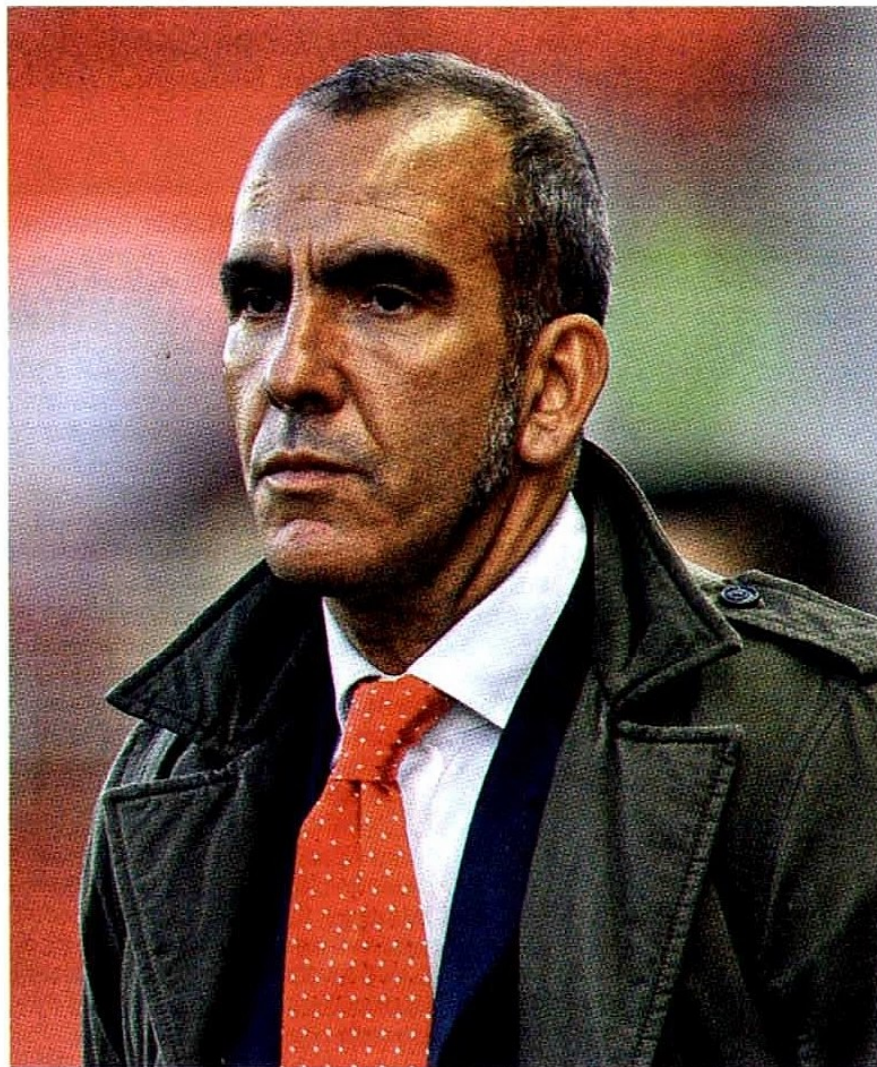


**To gauge the mood amongst the Swindon faithful we caught up with Nigel Bennett, a lifelong Robins' fan and a regular at the County Ground.**

**What have you made of your season so far?**

"I think we have to go back to the end of last season to understand

rigours of League One football. "However, as we stand today from that relatively low expectation, it is fair to say that the young players have delivered more than we expected during those pre-season days. So naturally there was a concern, particularly as a number of experienced players had left, whether their replacements would be able to cope with the

run, reveals a style that has been enjoyed by fans many times this season.

**There has been a lot of change following Paolo Di Canio's departure. What are your thoughts on his tenure in charge?**

"When Paolo joined it was fair to say that views were mixed, although the majority of fans hoped he would bring success to the club like a number of previous "first time" managers at the club, such as

Lou Macari, Glenn Hoddle, Steve McMahon and Ossie Ardiles. It soon became clear that he had both the character and ambition to generate enthusiasm and re-energise the club.

"Promotion and a league title in his first season only enhanced the reputation he was building. A fantastic start in League One then followed and another promotion year beckoned. This fell apart when the external funding of the campaign fell a little short of Di Canio's own expectations, leading to a departure that many may feel was less than graceful."

"Looking back now, it seems the financial commitment and legacy of building his "empire" would remain with the club for a long time unless drastic actions were taken, particularly around the issue of player contracts.

**The club was then subsequently taken over by a consortium. Are you now on a more sound financial footing after the issues of last season?**

"As previously mentioned, dealing with the existing player contracts was a real issue that needed addressing without the external funding available during the previous two seasons. The new board set about this and met this challenge of reducing the playing budget by nearly 50%. However, it met with a few concerned views from fans at the time as they attempted to run the club on a self-sustainable model and without resorting to outside funding year after year.

"It is obviously early days yet, but many necessary changes to meet that challenge appear to have been made and we can only hope that the words and figures add up at the end of the day. You are currently in seventh position in the league."

**What are your hopes for the rest of the league campaign?**

"More of the same. The football has been very entertaining and the style has been a joy on the eye. Many have questioned the young players' abilities to see through everything that is thrown at them during the season, but to date they have

met most of those challenges full on. With only goal difference separating us from a play-off place, hopes are high that we may have an exciting season and perhaps even go further than last season."

### **What are your favourite FA Cup memories supporting Swindon?**

"Well, there are many over the years. Going back to the 1960s, maybe a win over West Ham containing Geoff Hurst, Martin Peters and Bobby Moore shortly after the World Cup win was a highlight. A win over Premiership Wigan two seasons ago as a League Two team under Di Canio was the first "giant killing" many younger fans will have experienced, but out in front would be the

5-0 replay victory over Fulham who had stars such as George Best, Rodney Marsh and Moore (again) playing for them back in 1977."

### **What do you remember about last year's tie between the teams?**

"The match was played following a 4-0 away success by Swindon the previous week and was one where the fans and team pre-match were in confident mood. On the day Town just didn't play well and a stunning free kick from 40 yards and a bizarre own goal saw the visitors triumph."

### **Do you think that you will reverse that score this time around?**

"Cup ties like last season when the favourites fall are just so unpredictable. No doubt this season Swindon will again be pre-match favourites but it is all to play for. If Swindon turn up and play to the level seen many times this season I can fully expect to see them running out this time as winners. If they don't, then Macclesfield will have a chance of securing a second consecutive win."

# 10 Things

## YOU MIGHT NOT HAVE KNOWN ABOUT SWINDON



**1** Swindon was a small market town, mainly for barter trade, until roughly 1848. This original market area is on top of the hill in central Swindon, now known as Old Town.



**2** Swindon was the home of two of the greatest radio DJ's in history. Mike Smash and Dave Nice were legends of the airways on Fab FM, broadcasting from Fab Towers, Swindon.



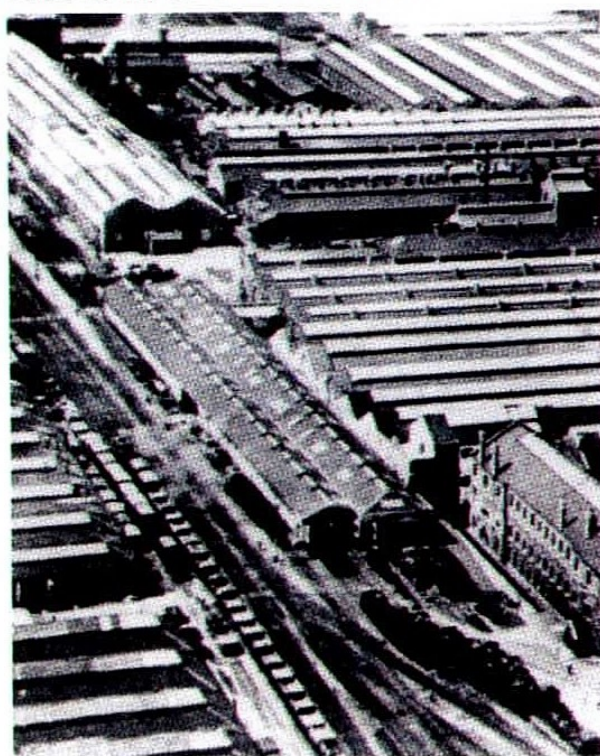
**3** Other less fictional people from the town are Julian Clary, Melinda Messenger and Billie Piper.

**4** Legend has it that there is a multi-storey car-park in Swindon where it is reputed that there are no echo's after 7pm. There is no record if this is down to a

sudden evening influx of ducks every day.

**5** The original Saxon settlement of Swindon sat in a defensible position atop a limestone hill. It is referred to in the Domesday Book as Suindune, believed to be derived from the Anglo-Saxon words swine and dun meaning 'pig hill'.

**6** In 1840, Isambard Kingdom Brunel chose Swindon as the site for the railway works he planned for the Great Western Railway and increasing the growth in the area sparked 30 years earlier by the canal network's arrival.



**7** Noel Gallagher named Oasis after seeing the word on an Inspiral Carpets gig poster which listed the Oasis leisure centre in Swindon as a venue.

**8** The NHS has its basis in the town as workers of the Great Western Railway paid a small amount into an overall healthcare pot starting in 1871, offering care for workers and their families. Ranging from dental treatment to artificial limbs, it was later used as a blueprint for the NHS.

**9** The town also boasts the UK's first lending library which also offered teaching lectures and lessons.

**10** When football was suspended during the Second World War, the War Department took control of the County Ground and used it to house Prisoners of War in huts on the pitch.

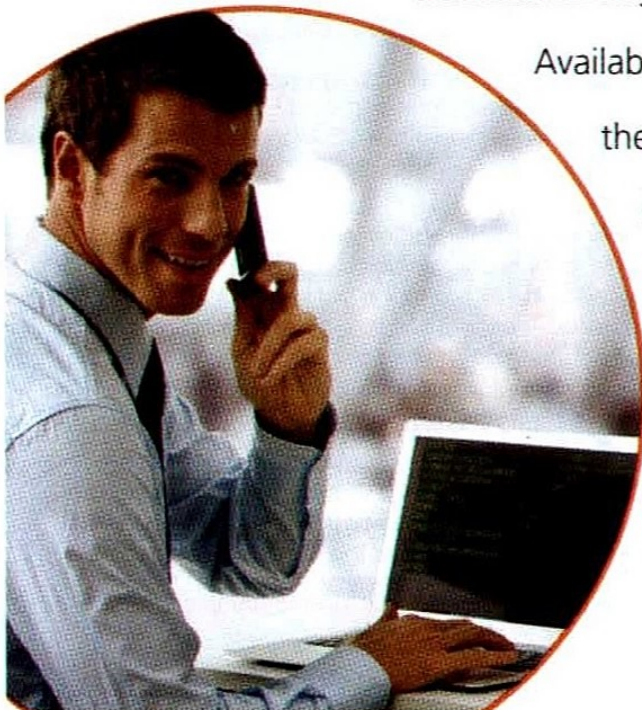

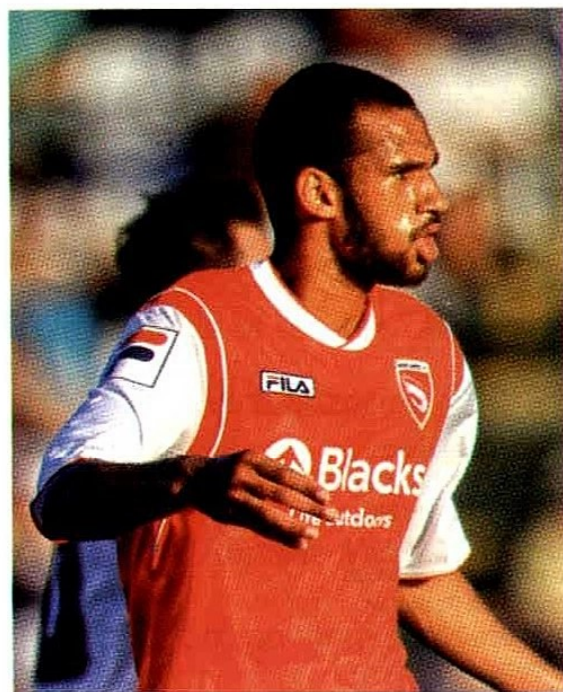


# Formerly Of...



## TONY DIAGNE

**It is often said the FA Cup has lost its magic.**



The so-called 'big four' are accused of fielding weaker teams in the earlier rounds, whilst likely relegation candidates jeopardise progression to stand a better chance of retaining their divisional status.

But, try telling that to any Macclesfield Town follower who witnessed their two goal victory at Swindon Town in the first round proper just over a year ago.

That day, defender Tony Diagne who has now moved onto pastures new, netted a wonder free-kick and remembers the day like it was yesterday.

"It was an amazing feeling," he said.

"It was by far the best goal of my career and to come in such a big game made all the difference.

"It was made even sweeter by the fact they are a League One outfit and substantially

higher than we were."

Between January 2011 and the summer of 2013, the Abergenville born man made 77 appearances for the Silkmen.

He was a firm fans favourite during his first season which saw the club relegated from the Football League.

Despite this obvious disappointment, Diagne says he looks back fondly at his time in Cheshire.

"I really enjoyed my time at the Moss Rose," he said.

"I was playing in League Two and loving my football but I struggled a bit when we went down into the conference.

"The fans at the club are great as they always get behind the team which is what you need."

Diagne was just 21 when he signed on mid-way through the 2010-2011 campaign.

Being the outgoing, friendly young man that he is, he easily made friends within the camp and considers his former colleagues lifelong friends.

"I am in contact with some of the lads I played with all the time.

"I still keep in touch with Emile (Sinclair), Hamza (Bencherif) and Colin (Daniel) to see how they're doing and we also try and see each other as much as diaries allow."

After struggling to hold down a place in the Silkmen's starting eleven, Diagne joined Lincoln City on loan in March of this year.

A move back to League football beckoned and in the summer, he ventured north to Jim Bentley's Morecambe to ply his trade at the Globe Arena.

And, the 23-year-old believes he made the right choice.

"I am thoroughly enjoying my time at Morecambe," he explained.

"Firstly, I'm back playing League football and I like the town and area as it's nice and quiet just like Macclesfield.

"I like to be able to concentrate on my football and I am able to do that here.

"I hope we can go on a cup run of our own as to replicate the feeling and experience I had with Macc would be brilliant."

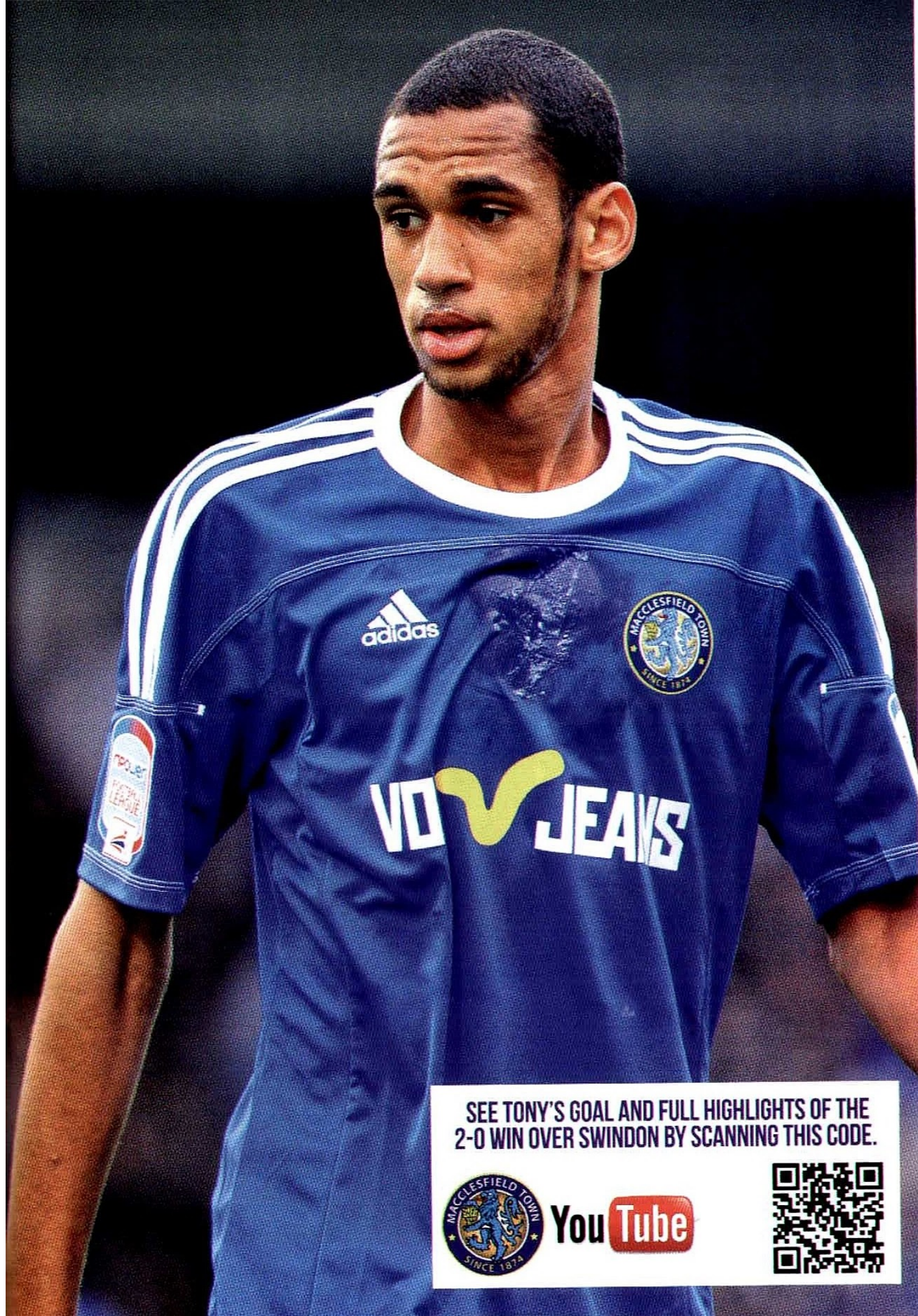
That 40-yard free-kick at the County Ground last November will be forever ingrained in the FA Cup archives.

But Diagne will have to wait if he is to repeat that moment with his new club.

"I don't take the free-kicks at Morecambe," he added.

"Ryan Williams is in charge of that duty and is the best at taking free-kicks but maybe one day I'll have a go!"

# On This Day

Usually we review matches played on this day by date in all competitions but today we are using poetic licence to look at some of the matches played in the First Round of the FA Cup.

## EARLY DAYS

The first ever entry in the FA Cup competition came in the 1882-83 season when Lockwood Brothers travelled from Sheffield and left 4-3 winners. A crowd of well over 1000 lined the edge of the pitch and by the time ten minutes had been played Sadler had scored twice but the visitors then hit back with two goals, however, Sadler completed his hat-trick just before half time to give the Silkmen a 3-2 lead. In the second half the stronger Lockwood side, which included players who were members of the Sheffield sides, scored twice leaving the Silkmen with a narrow, but well fought defeat.

The Silkmen entered the competition for the next five seasons, only progressing to the second round once in 1884-95 beating Hartford St John's 9-0 before going out to Leek 8-1 in the second round. Qualifying rounds were then introduced.

## CHESHIRE LEAGUE

There was a long wait until the 1960-61 season before the first round was reached again. Having triumphed over Northwich Victoria, Linotype, Congleton Town and Nelson, Southport dismissed the Silkmen 7-2 in the first round. This was the first occasion in which Macclesfield had appeared on the Football Pools coupons.



Qualifying Round victories in 1967-68 against Bacup Borough, Witton Albion, Hyde United, Wigan Athletic pitted Macclesfield away against Third Division Stockport County. A 1-1 draw at Stockport, Macclesfield's goal scored

by Bill Calder, gave the Silkmen another opportunity at the Moss Rose. Before a crowd of 8944 Stockport's Kevan opened the scoring in the third minute but the Silkmen were undaunted with Fred Taberner equalising shortly after. On 25 minutes Taberner converted a penalty but the referee ordered it to be re-taken because of an infringement, this time Brian Fidler took the kick and gave the home side a 2-1 lead which they held on to despite Stockport throwing everything at the Silkmen.

## NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE

The First Round was reached on eight occasions during the nineteen seasons the Silkmen were competing in the Northern Premier League, but they were defeated at this stage of the competition every time usually by Football League opposition.



## VAUXHALL CONFERENCE

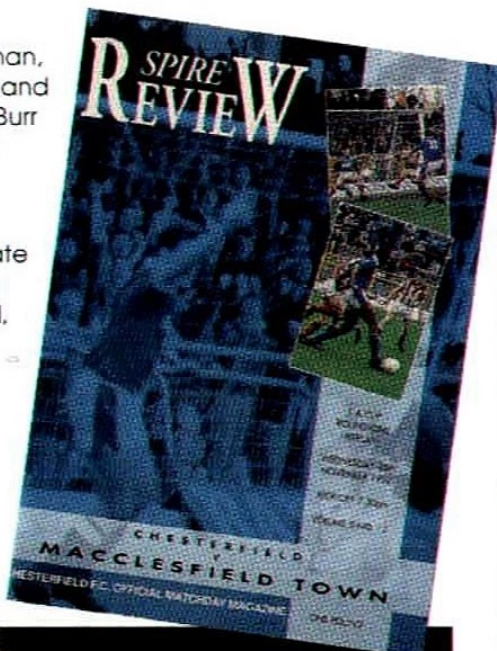
There were some memorable first round ties during the 10 years as a Conference club starting in the first season in 1987-88 when after defeating Stalybridge Celtic, Chadderton, Marine and Whitby Town in the Qualifying Rounds a home draw against Fourth Division Carlisle United was witnessed by a crowd of 3500. Losing 1-0 at half time the Silkmen fell further behind early in the second half.





But undaunted, Mike Hardman, John Askey, Graham Tobin, and in the dying minutes, Steve Burr all scored to produce a 4-2 victory.

1992-93 saw another unforgettable run. A fortunate 1-0 win at Glossop followed by success against Hucknall, Horwich and Netherfield gave the Silkmen a tie against Division Three Chesterfield, the league side surviving a 0-0 draw at the Moss Rose. For the replay a convoy of Bostocks coaches made the journey to Chesterfield



on a damp Tuesday evening where the Silkmen took the lead after four minutes, Richie Mitchell scoring. Turnbull equalised for the Spireites in the first half, the score remaining 1-1 at full-time. In extra time Richie Mitchell gave the Silkmen the lead but hopes were dashed when Chesterfield equalised for the second time. The penalty shoot-out was taken at the end occupied by the Silkmen supporters with big goalkeeper Steve Farrelly the hero saving three consecutive penalties to give the Silkmen a 3-2 win.

## THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE

And so it was good-bye to the Qualifying Rounds and straight into the First Round. In 1998-99 former Conference rivals Slough Town came to the Moss Rose taking a 2-0 lead, but two late goals from Graeme Tomlinson and



Efe Sodje gave the Silkmen a replay which produced another action packed match. Ben Sedgemore gave the Silkmen the lead in the seventh minute but Kenny Hughes, who had been involved in an incident with manager Sammy McIlroy at the end of the original match, levelled shortly after. Macclesfield were then reduced to 10 men when Efe Sodje was dismissed and to make matters worse Stuart Whittaker had a penalty saved. The score remained 1-1 at full-time and after extra time. The Silkmen won the penalty shoot-out 9-8 with goalkeeper Ryan Price scoring Macclesfield's 10th penalty, Graeme Tomlinson having missed the first penalty.

In 2001-2002 Conference side Forest Green Rovers were the opponents who





twice same from behind at the Moss Rose with two penalties to earn a replay. On a cold and damp evening former Silkman Mark Cooper gave the home side the lead but only four

goal disallowed and Mark Cooper missed a penalty. In the ensuing penalty shoot-out, with the penalty count standing at 10-10, each team having missed a penalty, Kevin Logan missed the 12th penalty for Forest Green Rovers but leading scorer Lee Glover made no mistake to give the Silkmen an 11-10 victory, a then record number of penalties (24) for the competition.

Walsall were the visitors to the Moss Rose on Monday 13 November 2006 for a televised tie. The match ended goalless with Macclesfield unable to take the initiative when Walsall were reduced to 10 men. The match

was punctuated

10 minutes into the second half when 36 footballs were catapulted over the Star Lane End stand by pranksters. The replay was won by a single goal, Jimmy McNulty scoring his first-ever senior goal to win the tie and give the Silkmen their first win that season after a run of 21 consecutive matches without a win. At this time Paul Ince was manager supported by his

influential assistant Ray Mathias.

Southend United were held to a 2-2 draw at the Moss Rose in 2010-2011, the Silkmen's goals scored by Colin Daniel and Nat Brown. Macclesfield travelled to Roots Hall for the replay having never won any of their previous six encounters there. The referee insisted that Macclesfield could not play in their usual away black strip as he felt that it clashed too much with Southend's traditional blue kit. Macclesfield played in white shirts with no numbers on the back. There were just 36 Macclesfield supporters to see Emile Sinclair score the first goal following one of his trade mark runs. Just as it looked as though victory was on the cards, Josh Simpson equalised for Southend three minutes before full time. In extra time, Aristote Nsiala, on loan from Everton, gave the Silkmen the lead but Barry Cort equalised for Southend. In the penalty shoot-out the Silkmen were leading 4-3 when Nat Brown stepped up, the Southend 'keeper thought that he had saved the shot but just as he was celebrating the ball spun over the line to give Macclesfield victory by 5-3, their first ever victory at Roots Hall.

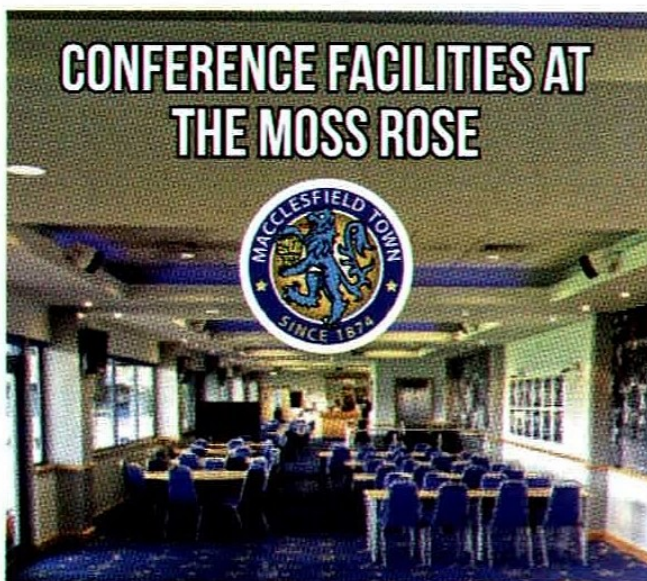

# Staff Interview

Continuing our interviews with some of the people behind the scenes at Macclesfield Town, we spoke to goalkeeping coach Bill Gorton about his life at Macclesfield Town.



**How would you describe your role at Macclesfield Town?**

"I'm the goalkeeping coach for both the Youth Team and the first team, currently working with Rhys, Ritchie and the younger lads. I'm in two or three times a week, and help out with the youth team game on Saturdays as well as the first team match in the afternoon, and warming up the 'keepers before the match."

**When did you first start to work with the Silkmen?**

"It was when the Centre of Excellence first started and I've been here ever since, so it's 14 or 15 years now."

**Have you worked with the senior side throughout?**

"In my time with the first team I've worked with internationals like Alan Fettis and Boaz Myhill as well as Lee Martin and Steve Wilson going back a little further. So I've been able to be involved with some very good players."

**And did you teach Asmir Begovic how to score after 13 seconds?**

"I don't think I can claim that one, but I did coach him on and off when he was with the club. It's always been good and I really enjoy coming in and working with the lads and you always like to see someone you've worked with going on to have a good career."

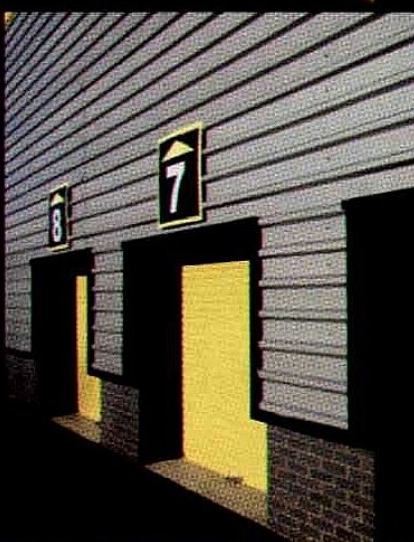

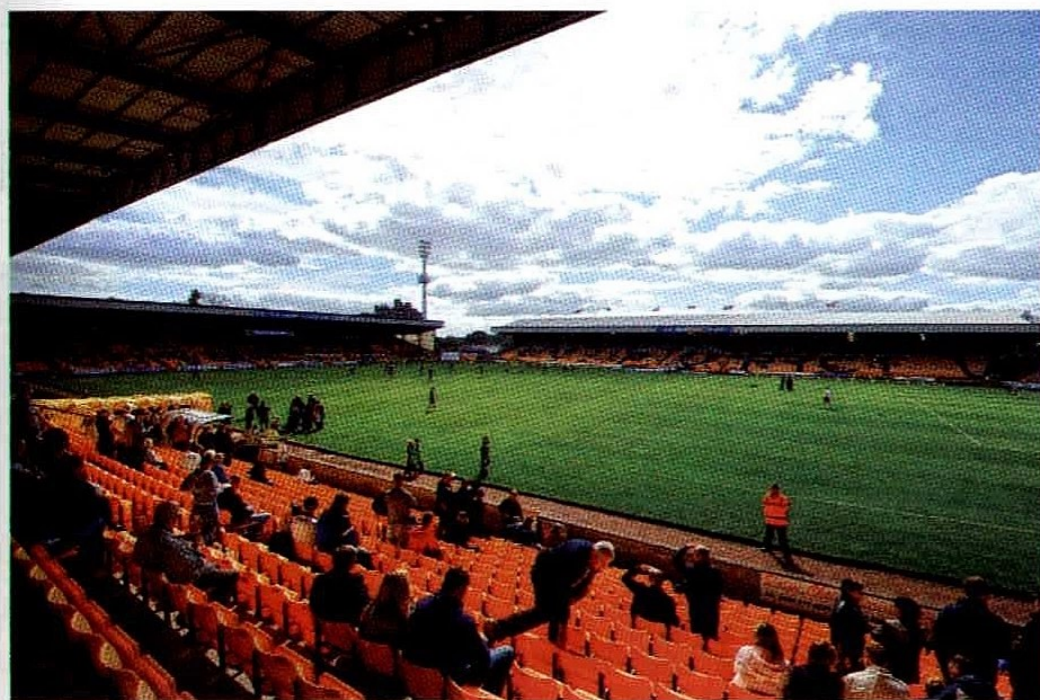

### Football clubs and the media – sometimes it can be a weird relationship.

In the last fortnight reporters have been stopped from doing their jobs by two famous footballing names.

Newcastle United have banned three local papers – The Journal, The Chronicle and the Sunday Sun – for their coverage of a fans' protest march.



In the same week Port Vale slapped a ban on The Sentinel because chairman Norman Smurthwaite reckons they've been running too many negative stories. He's also thinks they should pay £10,000 to cover the League One club. It's all a bit unseemly and, worryingly, seems to be happening more and more.

Football sells papers (and positive stories will often shift more) and clubs need the media to spread the word and stoke interest. It has to be a two-way thing.

We could debate all day about whether clubs should be allowed to restrict access to journalists. At the top of the game it, arguably, already is.

For many managers, press conferences are something to be endured and some clubs are less than helpful when it comes to grabbing a word with a player. Just ask our lads on the Football League Paper.

The NFL in America, which draws huge audiences at home and across the world, run a slightly different ship.

Gagging the newspapers and those nasty journalists simply doesn't happen. In fact there are rules – reporters are allowed into the dressing rooms ten minutes after the game where everyone must be available for interview. That's everyone.

Star players have to be put up for interview in the week leading up to games and they also have to

be available for the opposition's media too.

We're fortunate here at The NLP – and we're grateful for it. Without managers, players and chairmen picking up their phone or calling us back there would be no paper in your newsagents on a Sunday morning.

As a small team it is impossible for us to get round and meet everyone face-to-face at training, games or at weekly press conferences (for those that do have them).

Thankfully managers are happy to help us get in contact with their hat-trick hero and promote their club.

Recently some have been getting a bit more, let's say, professional and want any contact to be given the green light. Frustrating when you're trying to juggle ten stories and already have a number in the contacts book for the player you want to speak to.

In my first weeks at The NLP I remember ringing a sacked Step 5 boss who refused to speak to me until I read his statement, which was promptly sent through by his advisor.

Now us hacks will all tut and roll our eyes and there will be people reading this column now thinking, 'typical bloody journalist expecting everything his way'.

Whatever the relationship, essentially, both football and the media need each other. Who needs the other more, I'll let you decide.



# Action Replay

**The Silkmen's winning run at the Moss Rose continued as Wrexham visited last weekend, but the Silkmen left it late to seal the three points.**

# Danny Rowe



**The Silkmen's progression to the First Round of the FA cup came thanks to a 7-0 win over Vauxhall Motors in the qualification stages only a fortnight ago. And star of the show was winger Danny Rowe who netted his first second and third goals for the club in the space of 15 second half minutes.**

A summer signing, Rowe, who had been with Barrow last season has also spent three years with Stockport County as well as a brief loan at Northwich. He impressed for Barrow last season with seven goals from the wing. He was also part of the Silkmen's side which picked up another three points last weekend, and and we spoke to him after the Silkmen's win over Wrexham.

**As good a match as any to open your account, was that the biggest win you've played in?**

"In senior football it is, definitely. I've had a few big wins in youth football but since getting to this level, you don't win many by that sort of scoreline, and to have chipped in with a hat-trick was really good.

**And that was the first time you've taken the match ball.**

"Again, I've scored a few hat tricks in junior football but you can't really count those. I was very pleased to have come in and contributed so much because there were a few of us who hadn't been playing much who got a chance, and I think all of them did well on the day.

"I should have had four really, so a shame I couldn't get that last one to make it 8-0 and add to the

record books a little bit more."

**So on to Swindon, after playing in another win today, are you confident you'll get a game?**

"Hopefully I'll be selected. Obviously it'll be a tough game against a side who are doing really well a couple of divisions above, but we'll happily take on the role of underdogs and go out there and see what happens. We're in a really good run of form at the moment and anything can happen."

**You played against Macc in the Cup last season, are you hoping to do with Macc what you couldn't do last season?**

"Definitely. We had a good little run with Barrow last season in getting to the second round, but lost here in the replay. And we knew that it was Cardiff in the next round and then saw Macc playing Wigan, so I'd love to be involved in another good cup run with Macclesfield this season."

**The side has been enjoying some good form, and you were out of the side earlier in that. Is that hard, or are you just happy that the club are getting the results?**

"It's a bit of both really. You want the team to be doing well, but you want to be out there on the pitch. It can be frustrating, if you're not getting a chance but when they are winning so regularly, you can't expect to just drop in. And the lads who aren't in the side now will be feeling the same, and it's up to me to keep playing well to keep them out. There's a good set of lads, and some very good players, especially in my position, so there is a lot of competition and you can't relax for a moment."

**We registered another good win against Wrexham, were you all resigned to it being a draw?**

"It felt like we had controlled a lot of the game, and felt that we deserved to be winning. They hadn't threatened us much or had many chances, and we've given them a couple of scruffy goals, so we were all a bit disappointed that it looked to be ending with a draw. But with the form we are in, we know that there's always a chance for another goal and it was a great header by Jenno to win it for us, especially with the second hat trick in two games.

"Hopefully someone else can pop up with three goals against Swindon now, but the club might be running out of balls to give out if they do."

**So can we repeat history from last season and get past Swindon?**

"Why not. There are always a few shocks in the FA Cup and with the way we are playing, there's no reason that Macc can't be one of them again."
