





IT was a good point for us on Tuesday night at Crawley. Obviously it was good to get a clean sheet after conceding three goals at home to Orient so it was important that we got something from the game. We could have probably pinched it had we kept 11 players on the pitch but another ridiculous refereeing decision robbed us of that chance. into the Play-Off zone again. It would be good to get a rest and to get nearly all the players back fit and come back the following week with a fit, strong, energised squad. So far you've stayed with us and we're still in the shake-up so it's going to be a close, tight season for all the teams trying to get in to the Play-Offs. There are going to be ups and downs but we just aim to stay up and around there and make sure we have a real concerted effort to get in the Play-Offs.


MAN OF THE MATCH




AFTER finishing last season in 17th place in League 1, the Cumbrians now have a new manager to help steer them further up the table...

AT the start of last season,
Carlisle registered just three wins
during August and September.
The Cumbrians also exited both
the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and
the Capital One Cup. Just three
more wins were registered in the
build-up to Christmas before
Gregg Abbott's side tasted just
two defeats from eight over the
New Year period, including a 4-0
defeat at The County Ground
at the start of January. Carlisle
would win just three more times
over the course of the rest of the

campaign, finishing the season in 17th, seven points clear of the drop zone. 2013/14 began with a 5-1 humbling at the hands of Leyton Orient at Brunton Park. The next two matches produced successive 4-0 defeats to Bradford and Coventry. Despite a win on penalties over Blackburn in the Capital One Cup, a 5-2 defeat to Leicester in the next round saw them bow out of the competition. The Cumbrians earned their first point of the season at Colchester but, after picking up just two points from the opening

six fixtures, Manager Gregg
Abbott was relieved of his duties
in early September with Graham
Kavanagh installed as temporary
boss. The change appeared to
have the desired effect: three
straight wins arrived against
Sheffield United, Stevenage and
Notts County, a run which secured
Kavanagh the job on a permanent
basis. They have since exited the
JPT and Tuesday's win over Crewe
Alexandra was their first in the
league since a 1-0 success at MK
Dons in October.

GRAHAM KAVANAGH:

KAVANAGH began his career in England with Middlesbrough before being sold to Stoke City in 1996. In five years with the Potters, the midfielder would go on to rack up over 200 appearances and scored Stoke's last goal at the Victoria Ground. He moved to Cardiff City in 2001 then on to Wigan Athletic in 2005. He played for the Latics in the Premier League and played in a League Cup Final before joining Roy Keane's Sunderland in 2006. Kavanagh also represented the Republic

of Ireland on the international stage during his playing career. After initially joining Carlisle on loan in 2008, he made the move permanent in January 2009, signing on as a player/coach. He was appointed assistant to Greg Abbott in the summer of 2010 and, after Abbott's departure earlier this season, took the reins on a short-term basis as caretaker boss. After winning his three games in temporary charge, he was given the job full-time at the end of September.



THE stopper is currently in the middle of a one-month loan spell at Brunton Park from Manchester United. At Old Trafford since the age of 11, Amos has had loan stints at the likes of Peterborough United, Oldham Athletic and Molde in Norway. He made his Man United bow in September 2008 and played in the Red Devils' Premier League win over Stoke in 2012. Since ioinina Carlisle, he has made four appearances.



THE midfielder, who can also operate at left full-back came through the ranks at Hartlepool United and went on to make over 150 appearances for the Pools during a seven-season stay in the north-east. In the summer of 2009 he moved across to Brunton Park. Robson has now racked up over 150 appearances for the Cumbrians and his performances last season earned him a number of supporters' groups' Player of the Year awards.



O'HANLON began his career at Everton before moving to The CG initially on loan in 2003. Helped Town to the Play-Offs at the end of 2003/04 and penned a permanent deal that summer. Made over 100 appearances for Swindon before moving to MK Dons in 2006. Following a stint at Hibernian in the Scottish Premier League, he signed a short-term deal with the Cumbrians in January 2013, a deal which was extended in the summer.



THE experienced midfielder started his career with Sunderland and made 77 appearances for the Black Cats. He played 12 games for Swindon during a loan spell in 1999 and joined Sheffield United in the summer of 2004. His next move was to Derby County in 2005. Thirtwell joined the Cumbrians on loan initially in September 2006 before penning a permanent contract in January 2007. The Club Captain now has over 200 Carlisle appearances to his name.




A graduate of the Carlisle youth system, the midfielder was a renowned goalscorer for the club's youth and reserve side before making the step up into the first team. After making his debut last term, he went on to notch five times and collected the club's Goal of the Season Award. He has made 20 appearances so far this season and netted on Tuesday evening against Crewe Alegagnara.




BERRETT came through the Academy at Huddersfield Town and made his first appearance at the end of the 2006/07 season. He went on to make over 40 appearances before Joining Carlisle in the summer of 2010. The midfielder scored the winning goal when the Cumbrians last won at SN1 in 2011. Now approaching 180 appearances for Carlisle, he has also won international honours with the Republic of Ireland's Under-18s, Under-19s and Under-21s.

THE German-born versatile defender joined United on loan at the start of the month from Queens Park Rongers. Ehmer has been with the Loftus Road outfit from a young age and has progressed through their youth ranks. The 21-year-old has Football League experience with loan spells at the likes of Yeovil Town and Preston North End and has also represented South-West Germany at Under-18 level.



A left full-back, Townsend came through the ranks at Hull City. He has enjoyed loan spells at Grimsby Town and Chesterfield. During his time with the Mariners, he picked up the Supporters' Young Player of the Season award and he spent last term with the Spireites. After appearing for Hull in the Capital One Cup in August, he joined Cartisle on loan at the start of September and has made 15 appearances so far.



THE midfielder initially joined the Cumbrians on loan at the end of the 2011/11 campaign. During his first spell at Brunton Park, he came off the bench during Carlisle's Johnstone's Paint Trophy win at Wembley. At the start of the 2011/12 season he re-joined on loan before making the move permanent in January 2012. Noble has now racked up over 100 appearances and has notched three times from 23 outings this term.




THE striker began his career with Falkirk in his native Scotland before moving to Bristol City in 2003. Moved back north of the border in the summer of 2005 to join Dundee United. Moved to Aberdeen the following summer and netted over 30 goals in four years with Dons, earning him a move to Middlesbrough. Miller had further spells at Notts County and Scunthorpe before joining Carlisle in the summer of 2011.





GUY began his career at Newcastle United before joining Doncaster in 2005. The striker spent time on loan at Hartlepool and Oldham then joined MK Dons in May 2010. He had a further loan spell at Oxford before moving north of the border and spending the 2012/13 campaign with St. Mirren. Netted five times during his stint with the Buddies and joined Carlisle in the summer. Has found the net twice so far this season.



A graduate of the Carlisle youth ranks, the striker worked his way up to break into the first team during the 2011/12 campaign, making his bow in the 1-0 home reverse to Chartton in April 2012. Netted his first goal the following campaign against Ipswich, cancelling out the on-loan Massimo Luango's opener. Beck registered a further five times that season. This term, he scored the winner against Boreham Wood in the FA Cup 1st Round.

FOLLOWING last week's incident at SN1, Swindon Town released the following statement....



SWINDON Town Football Club condemns the actions of the individual who ran on to the pitch and confronted the Leyton Orient goalkeeper during Saturday's League 1 fixture.

The Club have indefinitely suspended the individual concerned until the on-going legal process is complete. During this process, the Club will be working closely with Wiltshire Police to decide on the appropriate course of action and to ensure that the maximum penalty available is imposed.

There is no place at The County Ground for so-called supporters who find this sort of behaviour acceptable and the Club would like to remind all supporters that any incident like this has serious consequences not just individually but also for the Club.

The Club would like to add that this is an isolated incident. The County Ground stadium is one of the safest in the country and we are extremely fortunate, as a Club, to have an

impeccable group of supporters whose reputation should not be tarnished by the actions of one individual.

The club would like to remind all supporters that they must adhere to the ground regulations at all times and are particulary reminded as to take note of section 11:

The following acts are offences under the Football (Offences) Act 1991 (as amended):

- The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse.
- The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature.
- The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
- Conviction may result in a Banning Order being made.



THE players talk effusively about coach Luke Williams, so we woke him up after a late night at Crawley to find out what makes him tick....

What is your assessment of the 0-0 draw at Crawley?

We were pleased because we've been so inconsistent away from home. We're trying to make sure we don't concede goals and instead give ourselves a chance of winning in the latter stages of games rather than chasing them. It's not exactly the way we want to play in the future – our ideal solution is to control the game more, which we're capable of – but when you keep conceding and losing it can chip away at confidence

And that can lead to an expectation among players to lose games, which needs to be nipped in the bud.

Exactly. We've had to compromise our style and sacrifice some attacking flair for a bit of stability. You're spot on, it can start to become a feeling of another away game we're going to lose, but hopefully after the win at Colchester and the Crawley draw the players will start to think they've got a chance of getting something on the road.

In last week's programme, Nicky Ajose explained that our inconsistency on the road can exert more pressure on us at home, because the need to win home games is greater. Would you agree?

That has happened to some extent because you can see we're not quite as fluid at home as we were. Nicky is spot on, it comes from us not performing away from home and putting additional pressure on ourselves.

Do you think there's also a case whereby teams have studied our style, and that perhaps we have had to combat sides that simply look to stifle us at The County Ground?

It's a massive credit to the players that they've been able to worry teams coming to The County Ground. Opposition sides know that it we get into our stride it can be difficult to stop us and we've seen teams try and come up with a plan to stop that from happening. That, combined with putting ourselves under pressure with poor away

form, is a cocktail that can make us tense, and which can lead to players being less likely to take risks.

Last Saturday's defeat against Leyton Orient; do we just put that down to the fact that they're a decent side?

If it was the first day of the season and we were told Orient were going to be in this position at this stage of the season, then I don't think we'd be expected to beat them. Yet the start we've had means we're now expected to beat everyone at home. The performance wasn't areat but we feel we could have got something out of the game. I just feel expectations have got carried away a bit. That's no bad thing because we want fans to be ambitious and it means we've shown them something that makes them feel like that. We just need to be careful that we don't put too much pressure on ourselves and remain realistic.

Those rising expectations highlight perfectly the fickle



nature of football, because the outlook wasn't so high in the summer.

Football is a spectator sport and we are there to provide entertainment for the people who work hard all week and who look forward to the weekend. We have a duty to provide entertainment and to some extent we have done that, but because of that expectation levels have soared.

And while the players are also learning to play at this level, let's not forget that both you and Mark are learning as you go along too. It has been evident that you're both trying to learn from some of the ups and downs we've had so far, both defensively and with different styles of play away from home.

Absolutely. My background has been to try and coach and develop players and Mark has got much more experience of competitive football and the ups and downs of a full season. I've learned so much from Mark and he's been very good to work with when it comes to understanding that side of the game. You're right, we're reinventing ourselves and brainstorming all the time.

My impression of a coach is that you watch football all the time, how close is that to reality?

Pretty close! We're a team who watch ourselves a lot. We feel that if we are good at what we do it will be difficult for anyone to stop us. Other teams base their philosophy on working out what other teams do well and put that first. There's nothing wrong with that, but we believe that with the players we've got, if we get our bit right it'll be difficult for any team to beat us. So we watch ourselves, but we also watch the opposition to see if they have any

outstanding attributes that we need to give special attention to. Then we use that to work on the training ground.

Some coaches seem more hands on than others and you seem to like working closely with Mark as a partnership?

For any manager to be able to accept a coach that has ideas and wants to have an influence shows a real strength in my opinion. Some managers can be protective and want things their own way, but two heads are better than one and Mark is very good at allowing the coaching staff to contribute our suggestions. He obviously makes all the final decisions, but he's liberal and very open-minded. I think we work well together and that comes from the gaffer setting the tone.

In a way, you have the better role because Mark is the one who faces all the pressure from the board and the public!

Absolutely no doubt, the manager has to take all the pressure, all the stick, and he does that well. I can be behind the scenes, so I'm fortunate!

It's clear the players – and Gus Poyet in the Chelsea programme – think effusively of the role you play. Why is that, do you think?

I'm a simple beast who is just very passionate about football and passionate about being a team. I like to try and show support when players are going through a tough time and I see it as my role to highlight things players do very well when they're struggling. I also try and introduce some realism and explain that just because they're out of the team today doesn't mean that'll be the case tomorrow. So I see my role is to support the players and

I think they like people who are passionate about the game. I'm always there and prepared to go the extra mile for our players.

They seem to appreciate your honesty...

People say that in football you need to be careful because people are out to get you. That's not just football, that's in every walk of life. I've been criticised before for giving too much respect to players with the risk being that they can throw that back in your face. Yet I don't want to change the way I am. I know that a good person or a strong character will respect that I give people the benefit of the doubt.

Yaser [Kasim] explained in a previous interview that it's your ability to give as much time to players perhaps not in the starting XI that has helped him in the past.

This is one of the differences between the role of the manager and that of the assistant or first team coach. The manager has so much pressure that he has to focus his efforts on the starting XI. I know that long-term every player is going to be important to the group, so they all need to be made to feel important. When the attention is focused on the starting XI and you're not in it, that's when a player can start to feel less important. I don't have as much pressure to focus on the eleven going on to the pitch, so I can focus on evervone. It's a massive thing for a footballer to feel important. They're defined by what they do in a match compared to people who simply go to work to pay the bills. Some people can be defined by their taste in music or their hobbies. but footballers are defined by what they do for a day job, and if that's taken away it can be very difficult for them. It's important that everyone feels they have support.

And just looking at our squad, there is a mix of players, some who have played at a higher level and others trying to break in from non-league level, all with different experiences and expectations. Presumably they all have to be managed differently?

It's difficult, and it's hard for the players to stay focused all the time because they're young; they haven't had a great deal of life experience and football is so competitive that you have to give everything every day with no promise of getting anything back in return. You can live your life property, train hard every day and still not be anywhere near the squad, so that requires support and guidance. Football is a great life, but you have to work hard for it.

And one of the main frustrations you must face is that you can prepare the team to within an inch of its life, but if one or two players simply aren't feeling it on the day there's nothing you can do. The fruits of your labour are totally dictated by others: is that frustrating?

You try and ensure that you've done everything you can so that if something goes wrong, it was because of something that was out of your hands. As long as you do your bit and you give your players everything in the week, and you receive the same in return, that's all you can do. The essence of a good group is where everyone is trying to give their maximum. That's what we're trying to create here.

From communication and motivation, to tactical awareness and planning, there are so many skills involved... it's quite hard this coaching lark, right? If you speak to anyone else in football they'll tell you it's consuming, that it can take over your life. There aren't many moments when you're not thinking about a previous performance or a player who's not performing to their peak - you're constantly questioning yourself why these things are happening or thinking about what we need to work on to make things right. Yet we wouldn't have it any other way!

And coaching methods are constantly evolving, so it must be hard keeping up with that while actually doing your day job?

It is. People always talk about this 'magic formula'. True, sometimes things seem to fall together at the same time, but just when you think you've cracked it you go and endure a poor result or performance and you're left scratching your head again. Sometimes you can prepare in the same manner but get a different outcome, so you just have to continually tweak things to predict things that might happen. It's tough.

The coaching pathway is always under scrutiny in this country. Is that fair?

For me it's very simple. In this country we have a global Premier League in which English players are up against the rest of the world. If you're a good player playing in Europe, you know you can earn more money playing in England. So whilst, say, Portuguese clubs are having to bring through young players because they're losing their best players to England, our youngsters are facing competition for places. They're not getting the experiences of other youngsters around Europe because they're facing more competition.

Who has influenced your coaching career so far?


Mark [Cooper] is the first person I've worked with at first-team level and he's been out of this world. And then of course there's Gus [Poyet] at Brighton, who was awe-inspiring. As a player, he was impressive and to meet him and work with him day in, day out, he didn't fail to live up to the same expectations. As a man he was friendly, a good person who was very driven and morally very fair. He was very passionate about football and a huge influence on me.

So, having been at the club since the summer, what are your hopes and dreams for the rest of the campaign?

It's difficult. It's a strong league with a lot of good sides and there has been a lot of investment by other clubs. It's not easy to put expectations on our group because they were put together at a late stage, but I think we can look forward to more convincing and sturdy performances. The fans have perhaps been a little frustrated when we've collapsed in games or given naïve performances, so I would hope we can address that. As to where we'll finish? I don't know.


Players are always striving to play at higher levels, but what are your long-term ambitions as a coach? Are you interested in management?

My strength is to get the very best out of players and I'm not sure if it's easy to do that as a manager. Managers need to concentrate on the next game, which inevitably means you will upset players and not give them all the attention they need. So, for me the key is to keep working and players and be the best I possibly can be. I'll see where that takes me.














11. TECHNOLOGY

WE continue our look back at what was acceptable in the 80s by this week focusing on the advancement of technology in football...


FOOTBALL has evolved into a different beast altogether since the 1980s with a whole catalogue of advancements in technology within the game transforming the sport we love for the better.

Big screens and scoreboards are now commonplace in football grounds across the world with fans now being able to watch instant replays just in case they missed the action on the pitch. LED advertising boards are also a common sight at football grounds with many clubs now opting to replace the old wooden boards as seen during the 80s. Swindon have opted to move with the times this season and have installed LED advertising boards around The County Ground as well as installing a big screen TV. Very advanced indeed!

Whereas once upon a time you could just pay cash on the gate to gain entry into a game, ticket purchasing has also evolved with most clubs now encouraging fans to purchase their tickets online in order to gain access to a whole host of enticing reward schemes. Swindon have taken this to a whole new level with the introduction of STFC MyWorld which aims to reward the fans with loyalty points for every ticket purchase they make.

However, one of the biggest advancements of technology in the game has been the recent inclusion of goal-line technology after a long and drawn-out debate over whether or not it should be introduced into the modern game, despite enjoying unprecedented success in cricket and tennis. Hawk-Eye were awarded the contract to provide the goal-line technology for the Premier League back in the summer, which means an end to instances such as Frank Lampard's wrongly disallowed goal against Germany in the 2010 World Cup. The Football League are now thought to be considering installing the system in the latter stages of the League Cup this season, as well as future league matches, which can only be viewed as a huge step for the game in this country.

A lot has changed in football since the 80s, with not all of the changes being for the better but the advances in technology have certainly enriched the game we all know and love.




ACADEMY MATTERS

ACADEMY Manager Jeremy Newton rewiews the latest news from the youth set-up at The County Ground...



I think we were all disappointed by the initial result in the FA Youth Cup but, having said that, it gives you time to reflect back. It is a result stage and it is a highlight of their development playing in the FA Youth Cup. We hope to do better than that but from an Academy point of view and from a progression point of view, it's about individuals. It's about Tyreke Johnson playing as an Under-15 in the Under-18s and hopefully one or two others. For the second years it's about getting through at the end of their Under-18 year. We've got a good core of ten first year scholars and that will be massive and beneficial for their individual development as well as our Under-18 side for next season.

The Under-13s and Under-16s will be doing their evaluation reports next week with the coaches and members of staff. This is a multi-disciplinary report which will include their sports science programme as well as their technical, tactical, social and psychological reports. The Under-15s go to Arsenal next Wednesday for a development game. The U15s have had some good fixtures recently against Aston Villa and Everton so Arsenal will be another good test for them. The U18s will be given a plan for their training schedule over the Christmas period. The Sports Scientist at the Academy will do that for them so hopefully they'll come back raring to go, especially the second years because they only have four months left to try and secure that professional contract. It's something that myself, Jamie Pitman, Luke Williams and Mark Cooper will have to sit down and discuss and go through where we are with the Under-18s. Hopefully they'll show Luke and the Manager that they're good enough to earn that professional contract.

RETRORED

DAVE Wallis profiles a manager from Town's past who suffered the pain of relegation and the joy of a league title whilst at SN1...

ON 21st November 1994, the man who had led us through the promised land of the Premier League was sacked. John Gorman had tried his best but had been unable to prevent us dropping straight out of the top flight and the Town board reverted to a tried and tested formula when they appointed his successor.

Young player/managers taking their first steps into management had worked for us in the past, so the arrival of Steve McMahon on 28th November seemed a logical choice to lead Town into a bright new future.

McMahon's playing record was impeccable: starting his career with Everton, the scouser made the seemingly perilous trip across Stanley Park to Liverpool via Aston Villa and demanded respect wherever he went.

Seventeen full England caps came as the combative midfielder rubber-stamped his authority before his arrival from Manchester City. And nothing demonstrated his competitiveness better than the red card that was waved on his Town debut.

Division One Town were in turmoil when he arrived, undergoing a massive wage bill review forced by relegation the summer before. Sound familiar?

That, coupled with the understandable desire for the new manager to make his own mark meant the departure of some well loved faces, something that would be better

received if the outcome proved successful than if not.

Jan Aage Fjortoff departed Swindon for Middlesbrough for £1.3m when £3m to £4m had been regularly discussed, and when the season ended with the relegation that everyone had feared under Gorman, McMahon didn't necessarily endear himself to supporters by deflecting all blame despite having over half a season to turn things around.

But 1995/96 saw us storm back with the Division Two title, leaving second placed Oxford United trailing nine points in our wake. That was more like it!


Back at the level we were when Steve joined us, hope again rose for a promotion challenge back to the Premier League.

Instead, consecutive 19th and 18th place finishes

meant we spent two seasons concentrating on the wrong end of the table, and, as time passed, the unconditional support of chairman Rikki Hunt seemed almost a millstone to McMahon.

Fans grew disenchanted with the style of play on offer and saw little likelihood of any change in fortune. On 23rd September 1998, Steve was relieved of his duties at The County Ground after a pitch demonstration demanding the chairman listened to the fans.

When Gorman had been sacked in 1994 we occupied 16th place in the table. When McMahon left we were in the same position. A four year round trip, encompassing relegation and a title to get back to exactly where we had started.

TOWN'S Sports Scientist Michael Cooper is back in Coaches' Corner this week, looking back on a busy week of fixtures for Swindon...



THE players are now at a stage where they're maintaining their level and it is up to us to make sure we just keep them ticking over ready for the following game and the following performance. At this time of year the weather changes and the pitches they play on are getting heavier and that takes time for players to adjust but the lads are in good shape. They've been doing their pre-training work which involves a lot of injury prevention and that hopefully gives them a bit of protection to ensure they don't break down in this transition period due to the weather. The changing conditions don't change what we do in relation to the conditioning side of training but we also keep a look out just in case anyone looks leggy or tired. We keep it in mind that

their legs will potentially be heavy and they have stiff backs because of it so we try and accommodate that with what we do in 'pre-hab'. We've had three games this week on different pitches. Obviously the change in surface has a big part in dictating how we play and how other teams play. From my point of view we've been going a bit easier on the players over the past couple of days leading up to the game. It's important that we're really mindful of treating them properly so they can do well this afternoon. There have been a number of injuries in recent weeks but (not that I want anyone to be injured) taking players through end-stage rehabilitation is an enjoyable part of my job. I think

the players quite like the end-stage rehab as well because it's a good sign to them that they're close to coming back.

I'm thoroughly enjoying my time at the Club. I'm getting to know Swindon as a place, Swindon as a Club and I really enjoy every day. The staff are brilliant, the players are brilliant and it makes my job a lot better when they're receptive to what we do. That said, with the change in weather, the earlier evenings and it getting colder, it makes all of these adaptations and changes easier to work around because the players buy into everything we put to them.

THE build-up to a busy Christmas period began with the visit of Southampton to SN1...

A draw at Anfield the week before had earned Swindon plaudits from Liverpool's fans and staff but next up for John Gorman's side were Southampton, who made the relatively short trip up to north Wiltshire in the final game before Christmas. Saints were just one place and three points better off than Swindon which meant that a win would take Town level on points with lan Branfoot's team. The game was just 12 minutes old when Paul Bodin fired Swindon ahead in front of a jubilant Town End. The visitors did manage to level

before the break through Matt Le Tissier who raced past the Swindon defence and slotted past Fraser Digby. Just past the hour mark, Keith Scott netted what proved to be the winning goal, his fourth strike since joining Swindon in November, Town held on to record a crucial three points, - only their second since promotion to the Premiership nearly seven months beforehand.




