



STADIUM SAFETY

THE CHAIRMEN. DIRECTORS & STAFF ADOPT POLICIES FOR YOUR SAFETY AT STADIUM EVENTS AND ASK YOU TO NOTE THE FOLLOWING:



GROUND REGULATIONS

Persons are admitted to this ground subject to their acceptance of the Ground Regulations and the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and the Football League which are posted in and outside the Stadium. Entry to the ground shall constitute unqualified acceptance. The club reserves the right for stewards, servants, agents and Police to remove from the ground, any person who does not comply with these rules and regulations, or whose presence within the ground is, or could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other

Throwing of any object within the ground. Taking part in chanting of an indecent or racist nature. Entry onto the field of play or the surrounding track without lawful authority or excuse.

Additionally, the use of threatening behaviour or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in ejection from the ground.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In the unlikely event of an emergency at Valley Parade requiring the evacuation of all or part of the ground, spectators are requested to, stay calm and listen for announcements over the public address system.

All emergency announcements will be preceded by a distinctive chime. The announcements may direct spectators in specified areas to evacuate through exit gates to the outside of the ground, or on the pitch.

Club stewards will assist in directing spectators to the safest locations. If

requested to vacate a particular area in the ground, spectators should do so as calmly and quickly as possible to assist in a safe and speedy evacuation.

PERSISTENT STANDING AT MATCHES

The Coral Windows Stadium is an all-seater stadium. While the Club appreciates that people will stand when there is exciting action on the pitch, it is not permissible for people to stand for long periods of the game. The Club has to make match-by-match returns to the Football League and is monitored by the Sports Ground Safety Authority (SGSA) in relation to persistent standing. In addition to complying with the requirements of the FL and SGSA, persistent standing obstructs the views of other supporters who have paid good money for tickets or may not be able to stand for long periods. So, please respect the needs of your fellow supporters and sit down -to allow them to see the game. Safety stewards will request that spectators remain seated and your full co-operation would be appreciated.



d like to also welcome Swindon boss Mark Cooper to the ground, along with his players and staff, plus Swindon's travelling supporters.

As I'm sure most faris are aware of, today is our final fixture of 2013, and what a year it has been for everyone connected with the football club.

Going through some of our fixtures from the last twelve months while writing these notes, I picked out a few of my own personal highlights.

Probably the first stand-out game of the year for us all was the Capital One Cup Semi-Final First Leg at home to Aston Villa.

I certainly don't think that night will be one that any City supporter will forget in

We showed tremendous spirit and resiliency after Villa had pulled a goal back to score another one ourselves through Carl McHugh and give us a two-goal lead to take to Villa Park.

Just two weeks later saw us travelling to Villa Park for the second leg, and who could forget the incredible atmosphere around the ground that night.

We had to withstand a lot of Villa pressure in the first half of that match and I think a lesser team might have buckled under that.

We managed to raise out game in the second half, and James Hanson's goal in that period is something that will be etched on the minds of many City fans for years and years to come.

To celebrate in front of over 6,000 of our own fans at the final whistle was also truly memorable.

We knew that we had made history that night and the feeling was incredible.

Obviously, we had to try and get our minds back on the league results after that but, if you look at the results, that was tough at times. We only won one game in between the semi and the final of the Capital One Cup.

The final itself when it came around clearly didn't go the way we would have liked but we came up against an outstanding team on the day.

The stand-out feature for me on the day, however, was the terrific support we received in the stadium from the people of Bradford.

The way the fans stayed behind the team right until the end and the atmosphere they created was very special.

Not only had the side done themselves proud throughout the cup run, the supporters of the club had also played their part in putting Bradford City back on the footballing map.

Moving on from our cup exploits, another game which I feels stands out for me is the 4-1 defeat at Exeter.

That result led us to bring in all the lads on the Sunday to watch the game back again and for a heart-to-heart.

We went through everything we felt we needed to do between then and the end of the season to help us push on.

Despite there being a ten-point gap to the Play-Offs at the time, we weren't prepared to let the league slip away and for us to finish as also-rans.

If you look at the games after that, we went on a terrific run. The 1-0 victory over Burton Albion in April when we sealed our Play-Off place was certainly a special day.

After falling so far behind, to secure our spot with a game still to spare was a tremendous achievement.

Looking back at the Play-Off semi-final, in particular the second leg, to go to Burton, who had a very impressive home record at the time, and win in such emphatic fashion was incredible.

It was extra special as well because of the fact that it got the club back to Wembley.

The run in the Capital One Cup earlier in the season and playing at Wembley beforehand just months earlier definitely

gave us some good experience to use going into the final.

All the special nights during the cup run were obviously tremendous, but the highlight of the season for me was still getting promoted.

Ultimately, for the long term benefit of the club, we needed to get out of League 2 and into League 1.

As a result, the victory over Northampton then in the final was the biggest win of the season by far.

With regards this season, we have acquitted ourselves quite well in what is a very competitive division.

We are always looking to improve, however, and we will continue to do that.

Some of the highlights of the season so far for me have been the two home victories over Sheffield United and Brentford.

They are both teams who many felt at the start of the season would be up at the sharp end of the table competing.

The Sheffield United victory was particularly special given the game was a Yorkshire derby for the club and the atmosphere around the ground on the day was extra special.

The away win at Milton Keynes Dons last month is also a highlight for me so far this

Hopefully this time next year though, we will be talking about many more highlights and special occasions.

I'd like thank every single Bradford City fan for their support throughout 2013. The backing we receive is truly magnificent.

You, the supporters, have played a big part in the year and hopefully together we can keep moving the club forward.





HIGH POINT

Swindon gained promotion to The Premier League in 1994 under the guidance of Glenn Hoddle with whom they'd made real progress under. Town struggled in the top flight following Hoddle's preseason move to Chelsea and they registered just 5 wins during the 1994-95 season, conceding 100 goals. One of the highlights of the season was holding Champions Manchester United 2-2 draw. Town got to the top flight after beating Leicester City 4-3 in the play-off final.

LOW POINT

The 1980s was a very mixed decade for Swindon, starting off badly and ending well. They were relegated to the 4th Division in 1982 capping an unsuccessful period. It took them 4 years to escape the bottom tier when they were promoted as Champions finishing the season with an outstanding 102 points.



LOU MACARI

Former Scotland international midfielder and Manchester United stalwart Lou Macari guided Swindon to back to back promotions in 1986 and 1987 from Division 4 and Division 3 respectively. Macari was manager for 5 years and was the force behind Town's surge to eventual top flight status. He left for West Ham United in 1989 and went on to manage Birmingham City, Stoke City, Celtic and Huddersfield Town.



rior to management, Mark was a footballer and had a career which lasted over 20 years and saw him play for 16 different clubs.

He started out at Bristol City back in 1987 but joined Exeter City in 1989 having failed to feature for The Robins. He went on to feature for Southend, Birmingham, Fulham, Huddersfield and Wycombe before a return to Exeter in 1994. He spent 2 more years with The Grecians before moving to North to join Hartlepool. He had spells with

Leyton Orient, Rushden & Diamonds and Telford United before joining Hednesford Town in 2000.

A year spent with Forest Green was followed by a 5 year tenure at Tamworth where he was player manager, he then moved to Kettering Town in 2007 but playing then took a back seat as he focused more on management. Cooper managed Peterborough and Darlington between a return to Town but following a brief spell in charge at AFC Telford United he then joined Swindon Town.

MIDFIELDER STAR PLAYER

n Australian born midfielder formerly of Tottenham Hotspur, Luongo started out in the youth ranks of Sydney based side Leichhardt Tigers before being snapped up by Spurs.

Only 21 years old he failed to make a league appearance for the club but did make an appearance in The League Cup penalty shoot-out loss to Stoke City in September 2011. Following loan spells with Ipswich Town and Swindon Town, he joined the latter in August 2013 for a fee of £400.000

WES FODERINGHAM **GOALKEEPER**

Wes started out in the youth setup at Fulham in 2000 as a young lad but earned his first professional contract with Crystal Palace in 2010, despite this he failed to make a league appearance and after spending time on loan with Bromley, Boreham Wood and Histon he moved on loan to Swindon Town ahead of the 2011-12 season and soon earned himself a permanent deal under Paolo Di Canio. He has been first choice 'keeper pretty much since his arrival and has made over 80 league appearances to date. Earlier in his career he had also made appearances for England at U16, U17 and U19 levels respectively

DARREN WARD DEFENDER

Club captain Darren Ward began his career at Watford in 1995 and after spending 5 years at Vicarage Road he moved to Millwall, Between 2001 and 2005 he made 142 league appearances (4 goals) for The Lions before a move to Crystal Palace. He spent a couple of years with the club before moving to Wolves. He didn't feature regularly for the club and after making only 31 league appearances in 3 years he returned to Millwall in 2010. He made a further 87 league appearances in a 3 year spell before moving to Swindon Town in 2013 following a successful loan spell.

NATHAN BYRNE DEFENDER

A young full-back, he started out at hometown side St.Albans City before joining Tottenham Hotspur's youth ranks. He turned professional in 2010 with the club but never made a league appearance and instead spent time on loan with Brentford, Bournemouth, Crawley





talented young midfielder on loan from Tottenham Hotspur he began his career with The White Hart Lane club having earlier been in the youth setup at West Ham.

Only 20 years old he is yet to feature for his parent club at first team level and has spent time on loan at Peterborough United. He has been a regular and a key player for Swindon Town during his current loan spell and is an England under 20 international

any began his career in his native France with Auxerre in 2003 before joining Rangers in 2005. He failed to break into the team with either of them and following a loan spell with Boston United, he moved to Lincoln City in 2007. During 2 years at Sincil Bank he made 91 league appearances (16 goals) leading to a move to Leicester City in 2009. He struggled to hold a starting spot and spent time on loan with Scuntherpe United, Southampton and Millwall before joining the latter on a permanent basis in 2011. He made 29 league appearances (2 goals) for The Lions during a 2 year period. Following a successful loan spell with Charlton Athletic he moved to Swindon Town in September on a permanent basis and his goalscoring form has been impressive so far this season.

Town and current club Swindon with whom he signed a permanent deal in April of this year.

NATHAN THOMPSON DEFENDER

Another young defender in Town's ranks, Nathan joined the clubs' youth setup in 2007 and signed professional terms in April 2009. Reportedly the subject of interest from a number of top flight clubs, he made his Swindon debut in October 2010 as a substitute in a Football League Trophy win against Torquay United aged only 19. To date he has made over 50 league appearances for the club.

JAY MCEVELEY DEFENDER

Born in Liverpool, Jay started out in the youth ranks at Everton before moving on to Blackburn's youth setup. He made only 18 league appearances for the club between 2002 and 2007 having spent time on loan with Burnley, Gillingham and Ipswich Town. In 2007 he moved to Derby County for a £600,000 fee and made 92 league appearances for the club in 3 years. Following loan stints at Preston and Charlton he moved to Barnsley in 2010 and after making 46 league appearances in 2 years at Oakwell he signed for Swindon Town in 2012 following a successful loan spell.

GRANT HALL DEFENDER

Part of a substantial contingent of Tottenham loanees, Grant is a towering centre half who spent time in the youth ranks at his hometown club Brighton before beginning his senior career with non-league Lewes. He didn't spend long with Lewes however before re-joining Brighton. He spent time on loan with Bognor Regis Town and Lewes

before rejecting the offer of a new contract to move to Tottenham Hotspur in 2012.

RYAN HARLEY MIDFIELDER

Ryan began his career with hometown club Bristol City in 2003 but failed to properly break into the first team and following a loan spell with Forest Green Rovers he moved to Weston-Super-Mare in 2006 and the following year he moved to Exeter City. In 4 years at St. James' Park he made 108 league appearances (21 goals). He spent time with Swansea City, Exeter (loan), Brighton and MK Dons (loan) before sealing a move to Swindon Town in July 2013.

YASER KASIM MIDFIELDER

Iraqi born midfielder Yaser Kasim began his senior career with Brighton & Hove Albion in 2010 having spent time in the youth ranks at Tottenham Hotspur. He made only 1 league appearance for The Seagulls and prior to joining Swindon Town he'd previously spent time on loan with Luton Town and Macclesfield Town. He has been a regular in Town's midfield so far this season.

MOHAMED EL-GABAS FORWARD

El-Gabas in an Egyptian forward who began his senior career with Al-Masry in 2008 after coming through the youth ranks. During the 2008-09 season he scored 9 goals in 24 league appearances before a move to Belgian side Lierse SK. He spent 4 years in Belgium and made 90 league appearances (16 goals). In the summer he moved to Swindon Town marking a return to English football after spending 2 years (2005-07) in the youth setup at Newcastle United. Mohamed is capped 6 times by Egypt.





NILE RANGER

FORWARD STAR PLAYER

powerful centre forward, Nile began his professional career with Newcastle United in 2009 after coming through the youth setup having previously spent time at youth level with Crystal Palace and Southampton.

During 4 years with The Magpies he made 51 league appearances (2 goals) and spent time on loan at Barnsley and Sheffield Wednesday. Released by United having gathered himself a reputation for off the field goings on he was offered terms by Swindon in August 2013. Ranger made 11 appearances (6 goals) for England under 19s.



NICKY AJOSE FORWARD

Nicky turned professional with Manchester United in 2009 after spending many years in the youth setup. He spent the 2010-11 season on loan with Bury and impressed with his goal scoring form, hitting the net 13 times in 28 league appearances. In 2011 he moved to Peterborough United for £300,000 but has barely featured and instead spent time on loan with various clubs including Scunthorpe United, Chesterfield, Crawley Town, Bury and his current club Swindon Town. Ajose is also a former England under 16 and under 17 international.



RYAN MASON MIDFIELDER/FORWARD

Another member of the Spurs' loan contingent, Ryan has been with his parent club since he joined the youth setup in 2007. In 2009 upon signing a professional contract, he went on loan to Yeovil Town and made 28 league appearances (6 goals) during the 2008-09 season and spent time on loan with Doncaster Rovers in the 2010-11 season. Mason also briefly spent time on loan with Millwall and French side Lorient before a loan move to Swindon Town.

e are obviously now approaching 2014 but what a vear 2013 has been. There has been many highlights from this year and coming towards the end of the Capital One Cup competition in January we prepared for a two legged semi-final clash with Aston Villa.

Realistically over two games there was only going to be one winner but we outplayed them in the first leg to take a 3-1 lead to Villa Park before sealing our first trip to the new Wembley with a hard fought performance and a header from James Hanson.

February was of course the month of the final and what a momentous occasion it was. On the day Swansea thoroughly deserved the victory and played absolutely superbly but it was a magnificent achievement just getting to the final in the first place. Almost 35,000 Bradford fans were at the game and the stadium was pretty much full.

April proved to be an excellent month for City who showed resurgence after looking a long way from reaching the playoffs after that defeat at Exeter in March. I think most would say the win at Torquay was the turning point as it propelled us from 11th to 9th in the table and within sight of that last play-off spot. A few weeks later a home win against Burton confirmed that we'd reached the play-offs against the odds.

May was of course the month of the play-off final and our second visit to the national stadium in only a few months. Thankfully it was to be our day and as Swansea did to us, we blew away Northampton and were deserved winners earning promotion after 6 years in League 2, something we'd all been patiently waiting

So following the pre-season months of June and July we began life in League 1 and had a brilliant start recording some excellent victories, notably against Carlisle, Sheffield United and Brentford and by the beginning of October we were 4th in the league table.

League 1 is obviously more of a difficult division than League 2 due to the quality of teams including clubs such as Wolves, Peterborough and Preston who have such strength in depth in terms of the players and budgets available to them however, I think we're coping very well with the step up.

Overall this year has been second to none and our achievements didn't go unnoticed as the club was invited to the BBC Sports Personality awards in Leeds just a few weeks ago; present amongst some of the great sporting names it was an honour to be there.

Let's hope we can head into the New Year with three points from today's match!


ver the years we have signed about ten players from Swindon Town, some I remember very well, some not so.

I think the first was Ken Lambert a centre forward signed in November 1954, before my time I hasten to add, he stayed just the one year before moving to Matlock Town. Bruce Walker a left winger signed in 1968 was supposed to be a fast winger who would cause defences problems. In the event he like Lambert stayed one season playing twenty nine games and scoring once. Gareth Edds was another one season wonder who came from Swindon. Edds was signed in July 2003 just as City embarked on their centenary season. Gareth made his debut for City in a 2-2 home draw against Norwich City on the opening day of the season. He made his final appearance as a substitute in a 1-0 defeat at Millwall on the final day of the season. Edds moved onto the MK Dons the following summer, the Dons were also relegated along with City at the end of the 2003-04 season. Paul Evans was another former Swindon player, he joined City for a second time in July 2007 as Stuart McCall built a side he hoped would be good enough to achieve an immediate promotion back to League One. During his first spell Evans proved to be a decent acquisition with a powerful shot, he was pretty good from set pieces too. I was

just watching a replay of our game at Ipswich in 2002 when Evans scored an equaliser from a free kick, in the second half he hammered a thirty yard drive at the Ipswich goal, it cannoned back from the crossbar. His second spell was not so memorable, Paul made only twenty five appearances before moving to Halifax the following year.

In the summer of 1966, manager Willie Watson signed two Swindon players, Tom Hallett came to Valley Parade along with Wilf Shergold. Tommy would be appointed club captain immediately and made his debut alongside Shergold in City's 2-1 defeat at Southend on the opening day of the season. Wilf who was a talented athlete played alongside Tommy as what was called left half back then. Unfortunately I don't think we saw his best play and he was used sparingly by the manager. Wilf made his final appearance in a goal less draw at home to York in March 1968, he was released in the summer and joined Poole Town having played just thirty games. Tommy Hallett was around quite a bit longer he made two hundred appearances for City scoring twice. He would surely have made more appearances had it not been for injury, he missed three months of his inaugural season due to a knee injury. Tom missed four league games in the following two seasons which culminated in promotion in May



1969. The following season saw Tom break his goalscoring duck when he scored our first goal in the 1969 Boxing Day victory over Halifax Town, his second came in a 1-0 win at Plymouth. Tom's final appearance came in a 2-0 home defeat by Swansea in April 1971.


Undoubtedly the most notable signing City made from Swindon would be David Layne. The centre forward was signed for a fee of £8,000 bringing the Sheffield born goal scorer to Valley Parade. City were in a poor state when Layne signed for us. City found themselves in the bottom four places of Division Three when they brought Layne to the club in December 1960. He made his debut in a goal less draw at home to Hull City. We had to wait four games for David's first goals, he scored both goals in a 2-2 draw at Bury, the second being a thirty yard pile driver apparently. Unfortunately his ten goals during the rest of the season were insufficient to keep City above the drop line and we began the 1961 season back in the basement division. That season saw David score thirty four league goals this total remains a record for the club, he also scored twice in the FA Cup. His goal scoring feats made him a target for other teams and it was no surprise when Sheffield Wednesday spent over £20,000 to take Layne to Hillsborough. His last appearance for City came in a 5-3 home win over Wrexham, Layne scoring twice. That season he scored three hat tricks in his total of thirty four, at home to Crewe and Gillingham, and at

In December 1973 City signed goalkeeper Peter Downsborough from Swindon. Downsborough had been goalkeeper on the occasion of their greatest moment, when they defeated Arsenal 3-1 in the Football League Cup Final in 1969 at Wembley. Peter was not the tallest of goalkeepers, but









he had a great knack of knowing when to intervene, and when not to, he was also a good penalty stopper too, he made his first penalty save in his fourth game at Doncaster. He made two hundred and fifty two appearances for City, playing 650 league games during his career. His debut came in a 1-0 defeat at Crewe just before Christmas 1973, I thought John Ritchie was a little unfortunate to lose his place to Downsborough, but no one can complain at the service the stalwart keeper was to give for City. He remained City's number one choice in goal until season 1978-79 when John Napier signed Steve Smith as a replacement. Peter began the season as the number one choice but injury hampered the season and he shared the duties with Smith with Peter making just twenty five appearances, his lowest total in his years at City. He made his final appearance for City in a 6-0 home win over Crewe in April 1979.

Finally on behalf of everyone at the club may I wish you a very Happy New Year, see you back in 2014.




These Christmas games are tough but we are strong at home and will certainly fancy our chances, however we do need to start picking up more points than we have

that fast, Phil Parkinson wasn't sure if it had actually gone in.



FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS LOOKS AT SWINDON TOWN'S LEADING LIGHTS

CLASSIC CAMPAIGN 1968 69

Danny Williams managed Swindon Town to an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968-69. The Robins were early pace-setters in the Third Division and seven successive wins climaxed with a 5-1 victory over Southport. They triumphed 6-2 at Northampton, then won 5-1 at home to Oldham, but lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Don Rogers starred as Swindon defeated Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final.



MANAGING TO SUCCEED **GLENN HODDLE**

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premier League in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

FAB FOUR









MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965. amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road Later playing for Burnley. Blackpool and Stockport County, he is a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town. (1st photo)

DON ROGERS

England U-23 international winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon. (2nd photo)

JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back John Trollope holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home to Halifax Town a month later and was ever-present in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63 promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. Scoring 21 goals in 770 League games for Swindon, he was their coach before managing them between November 1980 and March 1983, then their youth team boss. (3rd photo)

COLIN CALDERWOOD

Commanding central defender Colin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Mansfield Town, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and starred as Swindon won the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also helped the Robins to win promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including their 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games for Swindon, he moved to Spurs in July 1993, then Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest He has managed Northampton Town, Forest and Hibernian, since assisting Chris Hughton at various clubs. 1962-63 PROMOTION WINNERS

MIKE TURNER: Ex-England
Youth goalkeeper who played 75
League games prior to joining
Torquay United in July 1964,
then hometown Bridport. He
spent over 20 years with Plessey,
settling in Poole.

MAURICE OWEN: Long-serving favourite, previously top scorer, who netted 150 goals in 555 League games before joining the coaching staff. He later settled back in Abingdon and died in July 2000.

JOHN TROLLOPE: Record appearance holder who became Swindon's coach, then manager from November 1980 until March 1983. Awarded the MBE, he had a spell as the Robins' youth team boss.

KEITH MORGAN: Right-half who netted six goals in 325 League games while at the County Ground, moving to hometown Trowbridge in July 1967. He has since been a builder and decorator in Swindon.

KEN McPHERSON: Versatile centre-half who scored three times in 107 League games for the Robins. He later ran a grocery business, then was a porter at Walgrave Hospital and now lives in Nottingham.

BOBBY WOODRUFF: Moved to Wolves in March 1964, then Crystal Palace, Cardiff City, Newport County and Gloucester City.

He was a sales rep for a sports firm before working with young offenders.

MIKE SUMMERBEE: Young winger who joined Manchester City in August 1965, then Burnley, Blackpool and was Stockport's player-boss. The England international became a successful businessman.

ERNIE HUNT: Leading scorer who moved to Wolves in September 1965, then played for Everton, Coventry City and Bristol City. He became a publican in Ledbury, then a window cleaner in Gloucester.

JACK SMITH: Centre-forward who moved to Brighton in January 1964, then Notts County and Margate. He managed Ramsgate and Bath City, then was Portsmouth's youth coach and died in May 2008.



PLAYER INTERVIEW:

ALAN CONNELL



CITY STRIKER ALAN CONNELL SAYS HE PERSONALLY ENJOYS PLAYING IN THE TRADITIONALLY HECTIC CHRISTMAS SCHEDULE AND IS LOOKING FORWARD TO THE QUICK TURNAROUND IN FIXTURES AHEAD OF THE NEW YEAR.

'Today's game comes only three days after the Rotherham game and personally I enjoy the hectic schedule over the Christmas period. People in football have been wanting a Winter break and perhaps there is an argument for that but I enjoy the games, either playing or watching the Premier League games on the telly and being involved in it is something I've always liked and it is a tradition in this country.'

'By the time today's game comes around Christmas festivities may have died down a bit so in all honesty the first thing I'll be wanting to do is get back to the bread and butter of playing football. I always found that as a kid when you're off school you're on your holidays and you're just wanting something to do like watch football or play football and it's the best thing for anyone associated with football'

Following on from Boxing Day's game against Yorkshire rivals Rotherham United, Connell believes that City have been

posed with two real tests coming up against two of the division's better teams but despite lacking home victories of late, the spirit and attitude of the team backed by a large crowd gives them every chance in these games.

'Boxing Day's game against Rotherham and another difficult one today against Swindon will be two tough tests for us due to that fact they're both good sides and that there is only 3 days between both games, because of this I'm sure everybody will be needed. I personally fancy Rotherham and Swindon to both be in the top 8 this season challenging for the top 6 places."

'Swindon play good passing football which will make it difficult for us, but obviously we're at home so we fancy our chances; we've not been great at home in terms of results lately but we always keep going right to the end and I think our attitude and spirit is always very good and that's probably rescued us a few points this

This time last year Connell hit a rich vein of form and bagged 4 goals in the month of December; late winners at home to Torquay and Accrington respectively before a brace of penalties in a home loss to Rochdale exactly a year today and he is hoping for a repeat of that form this time around.



City produced a spirited second half performance and did pull a goal back through substitute Andy Gray for his first goal in his second spell as a Bradford player.

There were chances for both sides in the early stages of the game and after Lee Tomlin had seen a shot blocked in the goalmouth it was Garry Thompson who almost turned the ball in after Nahki Wells had broken away out wide and aimed a cross towards him.

Lee Tomlin was proving to be a dangerous player for the hosts and he came close once again to opening the scoring when he fired a shot narrowly wide of the target from 18 yards out after bursting into space.

Six minutes later things got worse for City as the hosts doubled their lead, Britt Assombalonga received a pass just outside the area and with a neat turn he escaped his marker before rifling a shot into the bottom corner.

United were well on top at this stage and could've and perhaps should've scored a third goal. Tomlin escaped the attentions of a couple of markers in the area and dinked a chip pass through to Assombalonga who could only cushion a shot marginally wide of the target on this occasion.

Gary Jones came close to getting City back into the game when he met Wells' pull back with a firm first time shot that went straight at Bobby Olejnik, either side of him and it'd have surely been a goal. The two best Peterborough players on the day Assombalonga and Tomlin could've scored their sides' third goal before the interval. Assombalonga hit a half volley a yard wide after connecting with Jermaine Anderson's cross and Tomlin ended a powerful run with a shot that went wide of the post.

The Bantams did get back into the game when the impressive Kyel Reid produced a near post cross that was turned in by Andy Gray who was making only his first appearance of the season.




15. LIONEL MESSI OR CRISTIANO RONALDO AND WHY?
