






**WELCOME** back to The County Ground for today's meeting with Oldham Athletic...







#### MAN OF THE MATCH

TOWN'S Number One was the Sponsors' choice as Man of the Match last weekend as Swindon ran out 3-1 winners against Shewsbury at SN1. The stopper made a number of saves in the second half to keep the scores level before late goals sealed all three points for Mark Cooper's men.

**AFTER** avoiding relegation last term, the Latics will be hoping to push on from their current mid-table position...

THE 2012/13 campaign was memorable for Latics fans in the FA Cup. A 3-2 victory over Nottingham Forest at the City Ground set up a home clash with Premier League giants, Liverpool in th 4th round. 2-1 up at the break, Oldham netted another just after half time and, despite the visitors pulling one back with ten minutes to play, held on to record a famous victory. Awarded another home tie against Everton in the next round, the Latics took the lead

before being pegged back and they were celebrating late on as Matt Smith's 90th minute equaliser forced a replay. Before that fixture however, Manager Paul Dickov stepped aside from his management duties after a poor run of results in League 1. After being dumped out in the replay at Goodison Park, the Latics appointed Lee Johnson as Manager in March. The move had the desired effect: after a 3-0 win in his first match in charge, Johnson guided

Oldham to safety. Following an impressive 4-3 win at Stevenage on the opening day of this season, the Latics have had a mixed campaign. Victory over Swindon in October preceded a run of three consecutive away wins including a 2-1 win at Wolves. In addition to reaching the JPT Area Semi-Finals, their FA Cup run was ended at Anfield by Liverpool and last Saturday produced a remarkable comeback to beat Peterborough 5-4 at Boundary Park.



IN his first managerial role, Johnson was (at the time of his appointment), the youngest Manager in the Football League when he was put in charge at Oldham in March 2013. His playing career saw him clock up 468 appearances during a 16-year period as a professional. After starting out in the youth ranks at Arsenal, he would go on to play for no fewer than eight clubs in England and in Scotland. He even played under his father, Gary, at Yeovil Town

and at Bristol City. During his time in the West Country, he clinched promotions with both of those sides, as Yeovil went from the Conference up to League 1 and with City he went up to the Championship. In the latter part of his playing career, he helped Kilmarnock to Scottish League Cup success over Celtic in 2012 before leaving in January of last year. He then took the reins at Boundary Park and, last term, steered the Latics clear of the relegation zone.



## **OLDHAM ATHLETIC**



THE Sheffield-born stopper is currently on a season-long loan at Boundary Park from Premier League side, Hull City. The 23-year old began his career as a trainee at Rotherham United then, in August 2008, he made the move east to the KC Stadium for a reported six-figure sum. He has only managed one first team appearance in his time on Humberside but has enjoyed loan spells at Grimsby Town and Yeovil Town.




THE right full-back is a product of the youth ranks of hometown club, Sheffield United. Joining the Blades whilst still at primary school, Brown progressed to become a scholar and even had 12 months as a professional. Despite not making an appearance for the Bramall Lane outfit, he signed for Oldham in the summer of 2012 and made 29 appearances in his debut season. Penned a contract extension last a immer.



GROUNDS came through the renowned Academy at Middlesbrough, making his senior bow against Liverpool in the Premier League. He would go on to make a total of 37 appearances at the Riverside Stadium. The left full-back went on to have loan stints at Norwich City. Hibernian. Chesterfield and Yeovil Town before putting pen to paper on a contract with Oldham in the summer of 2012. Has appeared 37 times in all competitions for the Latics this term.



SPOTTED playing junior football by Norwich City, Smith spent seven years with the Canaries and made his senior bow against Sheffield Wednesday in April 2009. Featured regularly as Norwich clinched successive promotions, rising from League 1 to the Premier League. With first team opportunities hard to come by in the top flight, the midfielder had loan spells with Barnsley and Yeovil before signing for the Latics in the summer of 2013.



LONDON-BORN Dayton came through the ranks at Crystal Palace and had loan spells with Yeovil and Crawley in the early part of his career. Following his release from Selhurst Park, he spent time at Glenn Hoddle's Academy in Spain before being snapped up by Scottish Premier League side, Kilmamock. He made 74 appearances in three seasons at Rugby Park before moving south to sign for Oldham in May 2013.



THE midfielder was one of three loan players brought in by Lee Johnson at the start of January, joining from St. Mirren until the end of the season. Harkins started his career as a trainee at Blackburn before loan spells followed at Huddersfield, Bury and Blackpool. Has since played his football in his native Scotland, representing the likes of Partick Thistle, Dundee and Kilmamock and joined the Buddies in the summer of 2013.

## LAST FIVE: WLLWL LAST TIME OUT: 0-3 L vs Wolves 28.01.14



THE centre-half came to Boundary Park from his native Switzerland, agreeing a deal for the 2013/14 campaign. During his time in Swiss football, he played for Servette and FC Basel, helping the latter to two league titles and a cup in 2011 and 2012. He also appeared in the Champions League as a substitute against Manchester United. Has recently declared himself to represent Angola at international level after twice appearing in the Swiss Under-21 squad.



TARKOWSKI is a product of the Oldham youth system and was raised near Boundary Park. He made his first team bow whilst still a trainee, coming on as a substitute against Brentford in January 2011. Two months later, in March 2011, he made his full debut against Leyton Orient and was handed his first professional contract. The centre-half has since gone on to establish himself as a key component of the Latics' squad and signed a new contract last summer.




WORRALL is currently on loan from fellow League 1 side, Rotherham United. He started out at Bury before spells at West Bromwich Albion, Accrington Stanley and Shrewsbury Town preceeded a return to Gigg Lane in January 2010 after a short loan stint. Over 150 appearances later, he then moved to Rotherham in the summer of 2013 but has found first team opportunities difficult to come by. Scored in the win over Peterborough last weekend.



MacDONALD started his career with Milwall and went on to turn professional with Charlton, playing and scoring for the Addicks in the Premier League. Following his release from The Valley, he dropped into non-league football, representing the likes of Margate, Stevenage and Crawley before joining Southend. Moved to Brentford in 2008 and helped fire them to the League 2 title. In 2001, he signed for MK Dons and was most recently at Otient before joining the Latics last summor.



THE striker started out as a trainee with Coventry City before being snapped up by Peterborough United at the start of the 2012/13 campaign. Last term he spent time on loan at Southend and Bury, finding the net four times for the latter, Clarke-Harris made the move to Boundary Park in the summer of 2013 and has featured regularly for the Latics this term. He has six goals to his name in all competitions so far.



THE son of Latics' Acdemy Manager, Tony, the Oldham-born striker started his career at Boundary Park before signing for Chelsea in 2007. In his time at Stamford Bridge, he made his senior bow whilst on loan at Oxford and represented England's Under-17s. He then had a stint at Sheffield United before joining Coventry after his release from Bramall Lane. Left Coventry in the summer of 2013 and agreed a return to Oldham shortly afterwards.

# JAMES VESOLOIV

COYR takes a closer look at the midfielder who will be locking horns with Town's midfield unit in the battle for supremacy in the central third this afternoon...

**WESOLOWSKI** started his career in his native Australia playing for Northern Spirit where he was spotted by Leicester City, who moved quickly to secure his signature in 2002. After impressing in the reserves he also won admirers on the international stage, representing Australia in the FIFA World Youth Championship at the end of the 2004/05 season. In the 2005 pre-season, he suffered a broken leg in a friendly against Celtic and was out of action until the start of 2006. He came off the bench to make his Foxes debut in January 2006 in a 2-1 home defeat at the hands of Cardiff City. He made his first

start just three days later in a 1-0 defeat at Plymouth Argyle. Sadly for the midfielder, he would break his leg again in a match at Brighton in February but recovered in time to make his return against loswich in August 2006. He would go on to make 24 appearances in all competitions that campaign and netted his first senior goal in an FA Cup tie against Fulham at Craven Cottage. In November 2007, he received his first call-up to the Australian national squad but was forced to withdraw through injury. Shortly afterwards, he was an unused substitute as the Socceroos beat Nigeria in a friendly. On the domestic scene, injuries continued to hamper his progress at the King Power Stadium and, in 2008, he had a brief loan spell at Cheltenham Town. The midfielder next went on loan to Dundee United north of the border but, after just a handful of appearances, a hamstring injury cut his season short. The following campaign.

appearances for Hamilton Academicals during a season-long loan stay before signing for Peterborough United in the summer of 2010. In just 12 months at London Road, he helped Posh secure promotion from League 1 via the Play-Offs, starting the Play-Off Final against Huddersfield at Old Trafford, Just days after that victory however, the midfielder was released and joined up with Oldham. He made 30 appearances in his first season at Boundary Park but again, had his campaign cut short by a shoulder injury that forced him to miss the latter part of 2011/12. Having gone on to establish himself as a regular, Wesolowski is now closing in on a century of appearances for the Latics.




## DON HEATH:

A member of Swindon's iconic League Cup-winning side, Danny Williams signed Heath from Norwich City in 1967.

The winger would go on to make over 100 appearances for Town scoring just three goals and played virtually every minute of the League Cup run. He was on the field for all 120 minutes of the Wembley Final. The winger moved on to Oldham in the summer of 1970 and went on to play a part in the Latics' promotionwinning 1970/71 campaign before signing for Peterborough.

THE Latics seal their second Divisional title, clinching the Third Division Championship under the guidance of Jimmy Frizzell.

## 1990

**OLDHAM** reach the League Cup Final at Wembley after beating West Ham 6-3 on aggregate in the Semi-Final. Sadly for the Latics however, they are beaten 1-0 by Brian Clough's Nottingham Forest.

TOWN cemented their place in the League One Play-Offs in this encounter from four years ago. With the first half threatening to pass by without anything of note, Billy Paynter picked the ball up around 25 yards from goal. He then proceeded to crack in the opener, Seconds later it was 2-0. When Charlie Austin was hauled down in the box, Paynter doubled the advantage from the spot. Austin himself added a third just after the break before Danny Ward had Town four goals to the good just before the hour. The visitors did pull back two goals in the final ten minutes but it was too late to stop

Swindon claiming all three points.

AFTER a 68-year absence, Joe Royle guides Oldham into the top flight as they finish the campaign as Division Two Champions. They would go on to become founder members of the Premier League.





MICHAEL Smith says he jumped at the chance to be reunited with former manager Mark Cooper at Swindon Town.

Speaking after his first training session, the striker declared that he is ready and raring to go.

"I was at Darlington under the Manager (Mark Cooper) and that was one of the reasons I came," he told STFC Player. "I know how the Manager does things and I know how he works so I jumped at the chance to come here and to work with him.

# RAPIAE BRANCE

FROM Brazil's biggest clubs and facing Neymar, to cold afternoons at Bradford in League 1, the centre-half is now hoping to build on the impressive start he has made to his Swindon career...

Rapha, let's start by talking about your upbringing in Brazil. When did you first start playing football?


I actually started playing football when I was 6 years old in Japan. I went to live there with my family, my dad's an ex-player and he went to Japan for work. I started to play in the football team at school when I was 6 years old with Kashima Reysol. After that, at nine years old, I went back to Brazil. When all my family were together in Brazil, this is when I realised that this is what I want to do with my life. For me, it was not easy because my dad is an ex-player so he said to me things that were so important to me at that time. I had a good conversation with my dad where he said: "you do whatever you want. If you want to be a footballer you be a footballer. I'll trust you and be with you." My dad was a goalkeeper in Brazil. He retired and become a goalkeeper manager (coach).


A lot of youngsters in England dream about playing football. I suppose in Brazil, with the Seleção (Brazilian national team) revered the world over, everyone wants to be a footballer right?

Yes, it's true. When you grow up in Brazil everyone speaks about football so you grow up with football on your mind but there are other options, so you and your family have to be careful that you do not get caught up in it all. I think I had a good opportunity because my dad has helped me a lot and my brother plays too so my whole family love football.

So you returned to Brazil at the age of nine. What happened from that point up until you came to England?

After I came back to Brazil, I played for the school team. After that, at 15 years old, I had a chance to get into my first youth team with Guarani Football Club. They were in the Fourth Division but now they're in the Third Division. I had a good experience there. Then, after that, I went to play





at Corinthians and I had the best time of my life there. I was playing for one of the biggest clubs in Brazil, playing in my city with my family around me and I had a good manager to help me. After Corinthians I went to Porto Alegre and, at this time, I had the chance to play my first professional game. When I started to play professionally at 18 years old, I had an option to stay there or come to England and start my life here. I spoke with my family: my mum, my dad, my brothers - the people that would listen. I got a chance to say to them that I wanted a good challenge in my life. So, I came to England and I've been here for two years now and I can honestly say that was the best choice I've made in my life.

#### Tell us what it was like to play for clubs like Corinthians and Porto Alegre. Did you ever get the chance to play with the first team?

Yes. When I was at Corinthians we had this 11 v 11 match with the first team every week or every month, so we did have contact with the players. But when I was there, Corinthians were playing in the Second Division so they didn't have any of the players they do now like (Alexandre) Pato but we did have good contact with the first team.

#### Let's move on to England. Was it a bit of a culture shock when you first arrived?

I came to Brighton when Gus Poyet was there. He brought me from Brazil just for a trial because at that time I did not have a European passport. I'm from South America and to play in England I needed a European passport. I came for 10 to 15 days just to train and

see what the football is like in England. At that time I think Brighton were playing in League One in 2010/2011 and they got promoted that year. After that, I had a conversation with Gus and he said: "Rapha, I really like you. I want you to come to Brighton to play. I'm going to offer you a contract" but I still needed a passport so I went back to Brazil to sort my papers out first.

#### Talk us through your time at Brighton.

When my passport was ready, I came to Brighton and played in friendlies and with the reserves for nine months but I never played for the first team. After this, I went back to Brazil again and I had a chance to stay there. Then, my agent called me and asked if I wanted to come back to play in England. So he took me to Whitehawk, When I went there and saw everything - the pitch, the team - I said "no, I don't want to stay, it's not what I want in my life." Then I spoke with my family and everyone said that I should keep going and that good challenges are going to come, so I said I would play half a season. After six months and at the end of the season we got promoted and

15. PLASTIC PITCHES

**WE** continue our look back at what was acceptable in the 80s by this week taking a look at plastic pitches...

THE visit of Oldham today, combined with the recent bout of poor weather that has put paid to fixtures up and down the country, provides a fitting opportunity to take a look back at the experimental plastic pitches that were introduced into English football in the 1980s.

Former England Manager Terry Venables, then boss at Queens Park Rangers, was the man who pioneered the installation of artificial surfaces at Loftus Road at the start of the decade. Before long, the likes of Preston and Oldham soon followed suit. Swindon never beat Oldham at Boundary Park whilst the club used an artificial surface between 1986 and 1991.

It was argued that an artificial surface was far easier to maintain than proper grass. Some QPR supporters even claimed that plastic pitches added excitement to games by producing lively action and higher ball bounces. It was also mooted that plastic pitches could be the 'saviour of English Football'.

However, a harder surface often resulted in injuries and supporters even had a u-turn in opinion, complaining that the football was dull to watch.

Town's experience of another plastic pitch, this time at Luton, would end in heartbreak at the Semi-Final stage of the Simod Cup. Despite Kieran O'Regan's equaliser,

the Hatters took their place in the Wembley Final after a 2-1 win in extra-time.

Would the result have been different had the game been played on natural grass?

**ACADEMY** Manager Jeremy Newton takes a break from his preparations for the forthcoming audit to pen the latest Academy update...

I look up from my desk as I'm writing these notes and all I can see are folders everywhere. There are mountains of documentation all over my office as we're building up for the audit. The audit tool from the Premier League had to be submitted on Thursday so that's why things are a little bit all over the place at the moment, It is all organised and, by the time you are reading this, it will already have been sent away. It has been 18 months of continuous hard work uploading lots of data for the audit tool. The Premier League auditors will be here for five days in February and they'll look through everything from our coaching programme to the finances and everything we do within the Academy. All the documentation details how we deliver the Academy programme. The auditors will also interview all the full-time staff alongside other club staff including the First Team Manager to see that what we're doing is working alongside the first team and that we're sharing the same philosophy. Recently, our Under-15s have played Southampton and Bristol City and are due to go to Liverpool in early February. We're governed by our games programme within the Category Three remit. However, at this moment in time, a lot of clubs don't run an Under-15s side so we have to try and



get additional games for our Under-15s. With the standards of our Under-15s it's actually quite easy to get the games and that's been reflected by playing the likes of Stoke City, Arsenal, Everton, Manchester City, Liverpool, Bristol City and Southampton. The 15s, along with the rest of the Academy, are doing really well and it's very pleasing that the First Team Manager takes a real aenuine interest in the Academy. He recently went and watched the Under-11s and Under-12s so it's a breath of fresh air to know that he is interested. He's starting to pick up names of the kids now which is fundamentally important and means he can really familiarise himself with the players. This week the Under-16 reviews will take place where they find out whether we're

going to be offering them youth contracts. It doesn't get any easier telling these boys that their initial futures don't lie here at Swindon Town Football Club. Having said that, we hope they've had a great experience here. Some of the players have had the experience of playing all over the world and hopefully that will give them a good understanding and experience for wherever they end up.

A Town debutant made an immediate impact last weekend. Dave Wallis tells the story of an STFC Hall of Famer who did likewise 35 years ago...

A week ago, new signing Michael Smith made a great start to his Swindon career when he scored twice on his Town debut, but 35 years ago, another Swindon debutant went one better.

Michael's namesake, Town manager Bobby Smith, paid 580,000 to Watford for the services of striker Alan Mayes on 8th February 1979. With a weather-induced break until 24th February, Alan had plenty of time to meet his new teammates before his first competitive action. The five foot seven inch frontman signalled his intent with a devastating start at Rotherham.

At the time, Town were fourth in Division Three while United were mid-table.

With the game goalless as the half-time oranges were being prepared in the Millmoor changing room, Mayes registered his first Swindon goal as the clock ticked over to 45 minutes.

Striker Trevor Phillips equalised for the home side 11 minutes after the restart, but our new man was to capture the first of many 'a-Mayes-ing' headlines before the afternoon was done. Nineteen minutes into the second period he struck again, before rounding off his debut with a treble just two minutes later.

Alan had begun his career at QPR without making an appearance and, after a loan spell at Northampton, joined the Homets at Vicarage Road. Fifty goals in 112 Town games saw Chelsea fork out £200,000 in December 1980 to take Mayes to Stamford Bridge but, in July 1983, and despite a goal in almost every third game for the Blues, he was back at The County Ground on a free transfer.

Playing as part of a poor Fourth Division team, he plundered another 32 goals in 72 games before leaving once more in June 1985.

Spells at Carlisle United and Newport County followed, but he wound down his playing career with a 12 match, six goal stint at Blackpool, during which Alan popped up to add his name to the scoresheet at The County Ground one last time. On this occasion however, his strike helped inflict the ignominy of a 6-2 home defeat on Town in August 1986.

In all competitions, Alan Mayes' name appeared on the credit side of Town's scoresheet no fewer than 82 times in 184 matches. Now a member of Town's Hall of Fame, the man he beat three times on his Swindon debut also holds an interesting statistic: Tom McAlister was Rotherham's keeper on that day in February 1979.

Perhaps deciding 'if you can't beat them, join them', he had a twelve-month spell at The County Ground starting in May 1980 and, making just one first team appearance, he kept a clean sheet in a 3-0 home win over Plymouth Arayle.


Alan Mayes may have had many moments of glory in a Town shirt, but there can't be many Town keepers who hold a 100% clean sheet record in their entire County Ground career!





Swindon finished bottom of the league in 1933, Sam reverted to Secretary. He remained in that position until he died on New Year's Day 1946, aged 77.



THE Town Ladies dropped valuable points when they were beaten by two goals to one by Southampton Saints in the South West Combination.







## OUTSIDE THE BOX



PONTING

**SWINDON** Town Hall of Fame member and Matchday Hospitality Host, Phil King, reflects on recent results and reminisces about the plastic pitch at Boundary Park...

WE'VE seen two fantastic results at home under difficult circumstances. Looking back at the Peterborough game, playing them in the final of the JPT, how do you approach it? You've got to look to win it. Nile Ranger was in the starting line-up which was a boost. When he plays he makes a bia difference. If you can get him training and playing week-in, week-out, it's is massive for this football club. To get the victory they did is a plus psychologically. Then during the Shrewsbury game at home the conditions were awful. I feel a bit of frustration because ball retention is important to us and sometimes you can hear the crowd groaning but it is important. If we kick it long and lose if then we'd get even more frustrated. In fairness, we could have lost last week and at one point I was thinking "I'll take 1-1". We come into this game off the back of a fantastic point at Walsall. For me, they're the best I've seen at The County Ground this season so to go and nick a point was fantastic. We had another plus in Michael Smith who has scored three goals in two games and is an instant fans' favourite. The lads must be full of confidence after two home wins. The away form is not the best but if we can contribute on our travels then why not look at a Play-Off spot? Oldham have picked up and Lee Johnson has done a cracking




job up there. No game is easy now but Swindon at home with a full-strength squad and with Nile Ranger and Michael Smith up front, things are looking really positive. We need to stick with them at home: it's all about finding that balance.

I remember playing on the plastic pitches at Oldham and Luton back in the 80s and you can make a case for plastic pitches with the current weather. Speaking as a defender, sliding tackles are great in the wet weather and it's quite a nice feeling in many ways - on the astroturf you get third degree burns. That Oldham side in the late 80s were very good on the

plastic. If they were on form you couldn't get near them. I'm a firm believer that football should be played on grass, It's the same for both sides: you have to combat all conditions and stand up and be counted. I've been really impressed with some of the lads who have stood up in this weather and dug deep, got tackles in and helped defend. To be sat where we are and to be two games away from Wembley, we've got to be proud with what Mark Cooper and the team have done.





**TOWN'S** Sports Scientist Michael Cooper is back in Coaches' Corner this week and discusses how the recent weather has affected his work...




THE recent weather and chopping and changing between the training ground and various other locations is never ideal, we just make do with what we can. We always get what we need to get done whether that is at the training ground or elsewhere. It's a shame we don't have anywhere we could use regardless of what the weather is doing. I take the warm-up aspect of training which involves a lot of sharp footwork and changes of direction. This tends to cut up the grass and unfortunately with the recent weather, the pitches down at the training ground have been pretty badly

affected so we are constantly finding somewhere else to make sure the boys are getting that kind of work into them before training. Something that we have been doing for a while is yoga. It was player-driven really and the Manager backed it all the way. The exercises they do on a daily basis stem from yoga so it's just about having a different stimulus there for the boys to get their teeth into and enjoy. One of the most satisfying parts of the job is when you see a long-term injury come back into the fold like Troy Archibald-Henville and Tijane, who are both on the road to recovery.

It's satisfying to see that they are getting through it and it's only a matter of time before they make an impact on the Manager's matchday plans. Last week against Shrewsbury, Jay McEveley and Ryan Mason picked up innocuous injuries that couldn't be helped. On Tuesday at Walsall, everyone came through unscathed and you always breathe a sigh of relief when everyone makes it through because everyone wants Swindon to be fully equipped for every game.

STILL licking their wounds from a hammering at Everton the week before, Town turned their fortunes around by seeing off Spurs at The County Ground...

THIRTY minutes had been played at SN1 when Nicky Hammond spilled a cross from the Tottenham left and Nicky Barmby gleefully accepted the chance to smash home the opening goal into the empty net. It took Swindon just eight minutes to respond. A long clearance downfield was flicked on into the path of Jan Åge Fjørtoft. The striker then beat former Town skipper Colin Calderwood to the bouncing

ball and found himself clear through on goal. He advanced into the area and steadied himself before drilling the equaliser underneath the advancing Erik Thorstvedt. Then, with ten minutes left to play. Town were awarded an indirect free-kick inside the box. Nicky Summerbee's thunderous drive ricocheted off Thorstvedt before dropping to Adrian Whitbread. The defender snapped up the opportunity to prod home from close range and seal a third win of the season for Swindon.





**IT'S** now 21 years since Swindon welcomed Oldham to The County Ground in what was Town's first ever home match in the top division of English football.



THE image of new Manager John Gorman slumping to the ground as Paul Bernard scored a late winner became a staple on "They Think It's All Over" and summed up how the season was going to go.

Not that it did the Latics much good in the end either, with both clubs relegated at the season's end and, for now, not to return. Though, don't get me started on what might have been if Jan Åge Fjørtoff's second goal at Maine Road hadn't been disallowed...

For plenty, it is just history, or barely remembered stuff from childhood. You could pay on the gate for some matches and not every game was subjected to the same intense scrutiny it gets now.

Fjørtoft and Gunnar Halle both seemed like exotic foreign additions - today they would not get a single eyelid batted.

With so much time having passed, both clubs compete today feeling as if the gap to the top division is substantial, which is not to say that the boards of both clubs are doing anything other than working hard to make as much of a success of things as they can

with the money and support they have.

But the scary thing is that an assault on the Premier League again would likely cost millions.

The worry is that the top division is so remote, that it feels as if even a well-run club with an intelligent choice of manager can't return without that massive backing. Somehow, something needs to be done to make sure the possibility of dreams being realities can live again.
