





GOOD afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for the visit of Preston North End in this League 1 encounter...



IT was a typical local derby last weekend at Ashton Gate. It was blood and thunder and we had some good spells in the game when we had eleven men. In the first half we had possession and we defended really well. Obviously the sending off changed the game and we had to defend at times and we did it really well. That should give the players a lot of confidence but they can't just do it in a local derby in front of 15,000 with their backs to the wall. We'll try and concentrate on ourselves and try and produce longer spells of

attacking play at home for our fans. I must say that the support at Bristol City was fantastic. At the end, you were brilliant and the players commented afterwards how big and vocal the following was and it felt so much better playing to a following of that size.

We're still learning. All of us are learning. I know at times it's difficult but just keep faith in the team and I'm sure they'll reward you in days to come.




MAN OF THE MATCH



Troy Archibald-Henville

THE centre-half was the sponsors' choice as Man of the Match for his display during Town's home defeat to MK Dons. Despite a dominant display, Archibald-Henville couldn't prevent Swindon going down 2-1 to the Dons at SN1. After the match, the defender was whisked up to the Sponsors' Suite and was presented with his complementary bottle of champagne by representatives of Main Match Sponsors, Save On Tyres.





THE Lilywhites sit comfortably in the League 1 Play-Off positions and are nicely poised to launch an assault on the automatic promotion places...

DESPITE a victory in the Capital One Cup derby match against Blackpool at the start of August, it would take Simon Grayson's men until the end of the month to record their first three points of the season. That came courtesy of a 3-0 win at Walsall and sparked a run of five consecutive victories, the last of which was a 2-1 win over Swindon at Deepdale. Before that run however, they were also knocked out of the Capital One Cup by Burnley.

Three successive defeats. including an early exit from the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, preceded an unbeaten run that would stretch from the middle of October until the final Saturday before Christmas, They would win seven of their eleven fixtures in that period and saw it come to an end at home at the hands of fellow promotionchasers, Brentford, who put three past them without reply. The next time Preston would taste defeat would be in

January when they went down 2-0 to high-flying Wolves at Molineux. This remains the last time they have been beaten in the league. After an exit from the FA Cup at home to Nottingham Forest in February, North End have drawn three and won three of their last six fixtures. Their last victory came at Oldham at the start of March and, on Monday night, they played out a goalless draw with in-form Sheffield United at Deepdale.



GRAYSON represented a number of clubs during his playing career including Leeds United, Aston Villa and Leicester City, winning the League Cup during his time at Filbert Street. After finishing his career at Blackpool, he was handed the reins at Bloomfield Road initially on a caretaker basis, before steering the Seasiders to promotion via the Play-Offs during his first season in charge. After guiding the Tangerines to their highest

league finish in over 30 years, he took charge at another former club, Leeds United. Helped the Yorkshire side to promotion from League 1 in 2009/10 but departed Elland Road in January 2012. Was quickly back in management at Huddersfield Town and tasted promotion success once again with the Terriers, guiding them to victory in the League 1 Play-Offs. Left his position at Huddersfield in January 2013 before joining the Lillywhites.

THE PLAYERS PRESTON NORTH END





THE stopper came through the ranks at Norwich City, making his debut in 2009. In his time at Carrow Road, he helped the Canaries win back-to-back promotions to the Premier League and even earned an international call-up to the England Under-21 squad. After a handful of appearances in the top flight, Rudd joined Preston on loan until the end of the 2012/13 campaign in February. He is currently on a seasonlong loan at Deepdale.



LAIRD started out with Plymouth Arayle and had loan stints at Torquay United and Stevenage before penning a permanent deal with the latter in February 2008. Was a key part of the Boro side that clinched successive promotions from the Conference into League 1. In the summer of 2012, he moved north to join North End but, in his first season at Deepdale, managed 24 appearances before breaking his lea. He is also a former England C international.




AFTER signing for Huddersfield as a youngster, the defender would spend 8 years with the club. Despite loan stints at Bradford and Halifax he would go on to make over 100 appearances for the Terriers. He spent time on loan at Levton Orient during the 2011/12 season before helping Huddersfield win promotion via the Play-Offs, Became Simon Grayson's first signing as Preston boss. Has also earned international honours for England's Under-19s.



THE voungster was released by Manchester United at the age of 15 before Joining up with Preston. He came through the Centre of Excellence at Deepdale before signing a scholarship with the Academy. Made his debut for the Lilywhites as a 17-year-old in October before making his league debut against Crewe the following weekend. After marking his first start against Gillingham with a goal, the second year YTS has now scored three times in 25 outings this term.




25-YEAR-OLD Humphrey began his career at Shrewsbury Town and went on to make 88 appearances for the Shrews before moving north of the border to sign for Motherwell in the summer of 2009. The pacy winger made 150 appearances for the Steelmen and played in a number of European matches including Champions League qualifiers. After leaving Fir Park, Preston beat off competition from a number of clubs to seal his signature last summer.




STARTED out at Liverpool at the age of ten before progressing through the ranks and becoming reserve team captain. He made his Reds debut in December 2002 and further appearances followed under Rafael Benitez. He was then loaned out to Hull and made the move permanent in January 2006. Joined Tranmere Rovers in 2009 and would go on to skipper the Mersevsiders during his time at Prenton Park before joining Preston in the summer of 2012.


WRIGHT, who can operate at both centre-half or left full-back, is a product of the club's Youth Academy. The Melbourne-born defender put pen to paper on his first professional contract in December 2010. Shortly after that, he made his league debut against Norwich City at Carrow Road. Towards the end of the 2011/12 season, he featured regularly for the first team and last term, he scored twice from 41 outlings for the Lilywhites.




ROCHDALE-BORN Buchanan started his career at Bury, making his first team debut in April 2005. He would go on to establish himself at Gigg Lane, making nearly 200 appearances before joining Scottish side, Hamilton. He moved back down south to join Tranmere Rovers in the summer of 2011 and was virtually ever-present in his first season at Prenton Park. He picked up the Player of the Year Award after that first campaign then joined Preston in 2012.



AFTER making his debut for Luton Town as a 16-year old in 2003, Keane would go on to make over 260 appearances for the Hatters across four divisions; from the Championship down to the Blue Square Bet Premier. He joined Preston in the summer of 2012 and made over 30 appearances last term. The versatile irishman can play across the back line and in midfield. He has also earned international honours with the Eire Under-21s.



A familiar face to Town fans, Holmes started his career at Derby County, making his debut for the Rams aged just 15. The former England youth international then had loan spells at a host of different clubs and made over 50 appearances for Derby before joining Southampton in 2008. In his time at St. Mary's the winger would return for a second loan spell at SN1 in 2012, helping Swindon to the League 2 title. He signed for Preston later that summer.



BEGAN his career at Chesterfield and would make over 150 appearances and net 30 goals for the Spirettes. Southampton came calling in May 1997 before a move followed to Blackburn a year later. After a fruitiess season at Ewood Park, Davies moved back to The Dell. His next move to Botton would see him make over 350 appearances and net 84 goals for the Lancashire side, and earned his only international cap in 2010. He signed for Preston last summer.



THE former Blackburn trainee is in his second spell at Deepdale having originally signed for Preston on loan in 2007. He would also help Stoke seal promotion to the Premier League and enjoyed a loan stint at Plymouth before Leicester City parted with £1 million for his services in the summer of 2009. He is closing in on 150 appearances for the Foxes and signed a loan deal with Preston in October, a deal which was extended until the end of this season.


GARNER CARREST CONTRACTOR OF THE PROPERTY OF T

COYR takes a closer look at the frontman who is now banging in the goals for his boyhood heroes...

CLITHEROE-BORN Garner began his football journey at Blackburn Rovers, rising through the tiers of the youth system at Ewood Park before joining Carlisle United on loan in January 2007. He netted his first senior goal in a 4-1 defeat at the hands of Yeavil Town in February of that year and would find the net a further four times before the season was over. Having done enough to impress the powers that be at Brunton Park, the Cumbrians then parted with a six-figure fee to bring him to Carlisle on a permanent basis later that summer, breaking the club's record transfer fee in the process. In his first full season in Cumbria, Garner netted fourteen times, a run which alerted the attention of Nottingham Forest. The former European champions


forked out over £1 million for the striker's services after just a year in the north-west. His first campaign with Forest yielded eight goals from 30 appearances but the following campaign would see him make just 21 appearances, 16 of which came before the end of November 2009. After being brought back into the first team fold, he did find the net in his final two outings that season, against Blackpool and Scunthorpe. The first half of the 2010/11 season was spent on loan at Huddersfield Town although he failed to score during his stint with the Terriers. As the calendar moved into 2011, the striker was sent out on loan to Scunthorpe where he fared better than he did in Yorkshire: six goals arrived from 18 appearances. After three seasons at The City Ground, Watford was Garner's next destination in the summer of 2011. However, the fresh start only brought one goal in his first season at Vicarage Road and the first part of last term was spent on loan back at

Carlisle, Whilst at Brunton Park, he rediscovered his form in front of goal, scoring eight goals between the start of October and the end of November. At the conclusion of his loan deal with the Cumbrians, Watford agreed to cancel his contract in January 2013. He then joined Preston on an 18-month deal but failed to find the net before the season was over. This season, after opening his account against MK Dons back in August, the die-hard Preston fan has seen the goals flow since the start of November and now has 20 goals to his name in all competitions. His last goals came in a double-salvo at Oldham at the start of the month.



DAVID LUCAS:

AFTER coming through the youth ranks, Lucas made over 120 appearances for Preston including the 2004 First Division Play-Off Final defeat to West Ham. After spells with Sheffield Wednesday and Leeds, Danny Wilson brought him to SN1 in the summer of 2009. He was a virtual ever-present as Town made the League One Play-Off Final. After defeat to Millwall, Lucas would find his 2010/11 season interrupted by injuries and, after Swindon's relegation, was allowed to leave at the end of the campaign.



signing couldn't have wished for a better start to his career at SN1. He told COYR this week that he's now looking to the future and reveals his biggest pet hate...

Growing up in Wallsend, what were your earliest football memories?

Kicking a ball about in the street probably. I've got an older brother too so, in the end, there were about 15/16 lads who all used to play in the street. In terms of playing for a team, it was initially Whitley Bay Boys before Wallsend. I remember my mate's 'mam' came over to ours with a trophy that he'd won for the Under-8s or Under-9s and I remember thinking to myself "I'm miles better than him". His dad was actually a coach too so I got involved with Wallsend Boys Club that way.

Wallsend Boys Club have produced a number of professional footballers over the years. What was it like walking in the footsteps of some of those great players?

Funnily enough, there's a shirt that you get given when you sign for Wallsend. It's a warm-up top with all the players who have ever played for Wallsend then made it big. I always wanted my name on the back of that shirt. You've got the likes of Stevie Bruce, Michael Carrick and, of course, Alan Shearer. It was an honour to play for them; it was all I ever wanted to do.


Playing as a striker, someone like Alan Shearer must have been someone that you looked up to?


Massively, Being a massive Newcastle fan as well as playing for Wallsend. I always had Newcastle shirts with 'Shearer 9' on the back.

How did the move to Darlington come about?

I remember going for a trial at Blackburn and that didn't work out. Someone at Blackburn knew someone at Darlington and that was the link, so I went on trial at Darlington. After 45 minutes, the coach pulled us and said "I want you to come back". From there I got offered a scholarship.

Of course it was there that you first worked with Mark Cooper. What are your memories of him from that time?





Good memories. I initially got released from Darlington before then though. When we were still in League 2 and Simon Davey was there, I got released on the Thursday and was told I'm not getting a pro contract. Then on the Saturday, we were that short on numbers that the manager wanted us to play. I had a good game and managed to score my first goal. The manager said afterwards "I'm going to offer you a contract." Then he went in the summer and that's when the gaffer (Mark Cooper) first came in. He hasn't changed at all. He's still the same man. I did enjoy my time at Darlington: it meant I could still live in Newcastle and we used to train in Durham so it wasn't too far to travel. Just playing in that 27,000-seater stadium was good.

Cast your mind back to the summer of 2011. You signed for Charlton and were heading down south to the bright lights of London...

It was crazy, I'd been to London when I was younger because I had family down there but I couldn't remember it. I had to get used to repeating myself three or four times so people could understand me! I've got better though and my accent has softened a little bit but that was the most difficult thing. It's one of my pet hates repeating myself and I had to do it four or five times. I still have to do it here a little bit but that was the biggest thing.

You made your Charlton debut against Halifax in the FA Cup before going out on loan to Accrington...

That's right. I had played about 20 games in the Conference before so I knew what to expect but League 2 is a bit tougher. I thoroughly enjoyed going out on loan. Also, making my debut for Chartton was special.

Tell us about that first half hat-trick for Accrington against Gillingham...

It was a crazy first 45 minutes. I can't even remember the first goal but I remember I got an assist that game and I think we won 4-3. I can't really remember the goals to be honest but I've still got the matchball at home back at my house in Newcastle.

Then you made your full Charlton debut in the League Cup against Leyton Orient in a London derby. That must have been a real baptism of fire?

That was good. I'd never played at The Valley before. There were only about eight or nine thousand there but it was the biggest crowd I've ever played in front of. You can tell that when the stadium is full the atmosphere would be amazing but it was really good just to get out and play. I'd never played against a League 1 team before and we were a Championship team at the time so I really enjoyed it.


Then last season you spent time at Newport and at Colchester. That must have been a big jump to go from the Blue Square Premier back into League 1?

I'd say so but there was a gap between coming back from Newport then going to Colchester. At Newport I worked with Nathan Jones who is now number two at Brighton and he's a really good coach. He brought my game on leaps and bounds. The spell at Newport did wonders for my game then going to Colchester I was ready for the big jump. I learnt a lot but being in that environment at Colchester around players like Clinton Morrison and Freddie Sears who have been in the Premier League, it was good to pick their brains.

I really enjoyed that. The manager, Neil Ardley, and all his coaching staff were tremendous with us they used to stay behind after training with us and do all sorts with us. It's obviously a fan and family orientated club - I know the whole story behind that and I actually got quite a few tweets when I scored against MK Dons but I really enjoyed my time there. That was also the first time I wore the number nine shirt too.

I suppose that 'Number Nine' shirt must resonate a bit more with you being a Geordie?

It's all I wore when I was younger. Like I said before, I lived in Newcastle shirts with 'Shearer 9' on the back. It's all I ever wanted so to get one with my name on the back was a great honour especially for Wimbledon with their history too.

You signed for Swindon in January and made the perfect start – three goals in two games including two on your debut...

I couldn't have asked for a better start. The lads have been really good since I've joined as well. They take the mick out of the accent too but they've been spot on.

Looking back, would you have liked to have gotten more out of your time with Charlton?

I would have liked to have made more appearances but that's football. I felt I never really got a proper chance but, having said that, I learned so much. And Mark Cooper. What's it like to be working with him again?


It's nice to be working with him again, knowing what he's about. He's the only face I knew here before I signed. I still talk to him about the Darlington days and it's good to have that common ground.

I'm learning all the time and I'm still only 22 so, as long as I can keep learning and keep doing well I can continue to move forward. I don't like setting targets though. If I ever did I'd keep them to myself!







Known for his distinctive afro haircut, Berry also sported a rather well-groomed beard, even having a parting in the middle of his moustache.



UNDER-18S Manager Jamie Pitman takes time out from his busy schedule to pen the latest Academy update...

OVER the last couple of weeks, we have produced some really good performances. A lot of the stuff that we've been doing through the week and trying to implement alongside what the first team are doing is really starting to come to the fore. Playing on the 3G pitch really helped in terms of being able to play some good football. Against Bristol Rovers on the 3G surface we totally dominated the game in possession and it really highlighted exactly what we were trying to do so, I'd say that was probably the stand-out performance of late. Obviously, they're always very difficult games against Rovers. They have a lot of ability and they're usually strong lads as well; we really dominated that game and won 3-0.

Earlier this week, we actually played against Bristol Rovers again because the Football League didn't like us playing league games on the 3G surface so we played up at the training ground. It was a difficult surface and the wind was really strong but that's no excuse really. We went down 1-0 and should have really got something out of the game but we just seemed to lose a little bit of belief in what we were trying to do. With Matty Jones and Curtis Da Costa out on loan we are a very young side and hopefully that will stand us in good stead for next year.





We want to win as many games as possible but it's ultimately about the lads' development and it's come on ten-fold in recent months due to the fact that we've really increased the intensity in training. We were really fortunate that we were able to use some of our funding from the LFE to get some heart rate monitors for us to manage the players' loads during the week. That has made a massive impact on their training because we can give them data to show them if they're either not working hard enough or if they're working too hard.

At the moment, we're playing (pretty much) Saturday/Tuesday. We're trying to get as many games in as we can and we're also trying to get the Under-16s out of school but obviously it's


an important time for them. What we want to try and do is bridge the gap between the U-16s and U-18s now so that development becomes auicker and hopefully then we will be looking into getting players into the first team like Will Randall and Matty Jones, who have been involved in some capacity this year. The aim is for them to be even more advanced in their development so that they are ready earlier. It's important that the U-16s get their GCSEs. That's vital but we're trying as best as we can to get as many games as we can before the end of the season so that, next year, they know exactly what the development process is going to be like for them.



RETRORED

IN this week's Retro Red, Dave Wallis looks back to nineteen years ago tomorrow when a player who tested Town fans' patience to the limit, then won them over and became a cult hero, departed SN1....

HE was a 6ft 3in striker who had international credentials with Norway, who arrived for a huge sum at a time when we were on the crest of our highest wave ever and who spectacularly underachieved.

Then, when many had given up on the man ever justifying the faith of such a huge fee and who seemed to epitomise the despair that came with the realisation of Town's inability to compete at the top level, the man in question came so good that he re-wrote fans' interpretations of him.

Swindon manager John
Gorman invested £500,000 in
Jan Åge Fjørtoft as we set about
commencing our first ever Premier
League season and, after 22
games, our new man hadn't hit
the target once.

There was talk about loaning. Jan (the man) back to Lillestrøm in the hope that he could recapture the form that had enticed us to part with so much cash. But almost as soon as the idea was mooted, Jan began a run of form that could have made all the difference to our season had it started earlier.

Beginning with a goal against lpswich Town in the FA Cup he notched a further 13 times in the remaining 17 matches in our solitary Premier League season. Then the inevitable, and well documented, drop back into Division One followed and we struggled to mount a challenge to return.

Jan continued to score goals,

with 26 in the 1994/95 season often bringing about his trademark 'aeroplane' celebration. Then dawned the 23rd March 1995 and the departure of the man who had scored 38 times in just under 90 outings.

By then, Gorman had been replaced by Steve McMahon and the new manager, under pressure to reduce costs in a manner that has become so familiar since, accepted a £1.3m bid from Middlesbrough to take our, by now, talismanic striker off our hands.

Today, we remember the inevitability of the sale of Matt Ritchie when the books urgently needed to be balanced, and it's in this light that we might have some sympathy with McMahon.

But, with Fjørtoff departing on transfer deadline day and with money newly available for McMahon to demonstrate his astuteness in the transfer market, the Scouser chose to spend £340,000 in acquiring left back Jason Drysdale from Newcastle United.

Selling your top-scorer and replacing him with a costly defender tested supporters' understanding to the limit and ultimately, we suffered consecutive relegations, failing to score in six of the eight games immediately after Fjørtoft's departure.

Over the course of the next three seasons, Drysdale made a total of 54 appearances before being released to Forest Green Rovers. The injury-prone defender always carried the baggage of being the man that Fjørtoft's fee was spent on but, unlike Jan, Drysdale's Town career started badly and didn't improve.





Ramsey netting a goal, which was quite a rarity. Chris can now be seen regularly as part of the coaching team at Tottenham Hotspur.



Zambian Visitors



LAST month, the football family mourned the passing of one of English football's greatest players COYR pays tribute to a true football gentleman.

SIR Tom Finney was the archetypal one-club man. Between 1946 and 1960, he made over 400 appearances for Preston North End and scored 187 goals. On the international stage he also earned 76 caps for England, scoring 30 goals and represented his country at the 1954 and 1958 World Cups. Finney was also crowned Footballer of the Year in 1953/54 and in 1956/57. After his retirement, he continued to serve Preston North End as the club's President.

Town legend Don
Rogers told COYR
earlier this week
that Finney was an
inspiration to a whole
generation of young
footballers. "He was
two-footed and he
could play on either
wing," he recalls. "I was
only a nipper at the time
(when he was playing) so I
can't remember much but I
remember that he was a very
good player. He was a nice

man and always came across as very nice in any interviews he gave. He was a true football gentleman: you could tell that by the way he spoke. What a nice fellow he was and what a good player he was."



COACHES' CORNER


COACHES CORNER:

AS we approach the home straight in 2013/14, Town's Sports Scientist, Michael Cooper, explains the importance of recovery sessions...

IT'S a very hectic period throughout February and March and, at this stage of the season, you could say that players may suffer from an accumulative fatigue. What I would say is that our vouna sauad are doina very well considering it is the first season in senior football for the vast majority of them. Like marathon runners need miles in their leas before they enter a big race, the same applies to footballers. This season will not only teach the players a lot mentally, but their bodies will adapt physically to the demands this season has presented.

At the moment we've been using our recovery methods a lot which are essential. We employ them to make sure the players are ready for games that occur in quick succession. A recovery session consists of 4 parts:

- Low-level, steady-state cardio
 This gets the entire vascular system working, focusing on the legs. This lasts for around
 minutes and is done on a reduced weight-bearing machine such as a bike or cross-trainer.
- 2) Foam roll and stretch - Used to alleviate soreness and stiffness from the muscles and help players get full mobility back into their joints.
- Pool-based dynamic movements - The buoyancy of the water reduces the load off



the body and provides enough resistance to activate the muscles whilst the different exercises are performed.

4) Contrast bathing - Hot and cold baths are used to rapidly open and close the blood vessels to create a flushing effect of waste products out of the muscle. These baths are set at 37 and 10 degrees Celsius respectively.


Our periodisation plan is designed to try and ensure that a player's fitness improves throughout the season. We want them to start at a certain level in pre-season and get better, as opposed to starting at a high level and burning out by the end of the season. On a positive note, once we get through March, we've got a lot


of Saturday-Saturday fixtures. This gives us the opportunity to get our conditioning work in. The conditioning work varies from 1v1 work, to small-sided games, right up to an 11v11. The principle being that we train the players and try to get them involved in every aspect or scenario they'll encounter out there on the playing field.

Now, it's all about keeping them on the home straight, keeping them fit and making sure the way they end the season is how they start the next. Last weekend's performance away to Bristol City, playing for 40 minutes with ten players, is a testament to each of their fitness levels at this point in the season.

After consulting with his linesman, referee Brian Hill produced a red card for the Frenchman. Spurred on by their advantage, Town went searching for an equaliser. Shaun Taylor's long ball forward was punched clear. The ball was then pumped back into the box where a number of red shirts appeared to leave it to each other before Jan Age Figrtoff arrived to drive home the equaliser from inside the six-yard box and secure a point for Swindon.

GOALKEEPER: David Button -Brentford

The former Tottenham youngster recovered from a bad start to his Brentford career by bouncing back to keep seven clean sheets as Brentford won nine consecutive games in the league. Has pulled off some big saves with the Bees looking a good shout for automatic promotion to the Championship.

RIGHT-BACK: Mathieu Baudry -Leyton Orient


