



# GOOD afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground as we extend a warm welcome to Nigel Clough and Sheffield United.

I was more disappointed with the way we played rather than the two points dropped on Tuesday evening against Oldham Athletic. We didn't play to our strengths and got involved in a fight which isn't one of our strengths but we had to go back to work and make sure the work we have done in the lead up to the visit of Sheffield United gets us back to the level we've been at. You can also spin the results around the other way and say we got four points from two games - one at home and one away - and we would take that but, especially with us being 2-1 up with two minutes to go, you have to see that out. We didn't and we could have easily lost it in the end but we take the point and move on. I just think we panicked a bit. When the pressure comes, we still have to play our football because that is what we're set up to do and if you start kicking the ball down the pitch it becomes a fight and we're not great at that. We have to stick to our principles and keep believing in what we do because it's served us well so far.

Today, Sheffield United will get a few bodies behind the ball and try and counter-attack on us. They have got some good individuals so it will be a tough game for us this afternoon. They're up there as one of the favourites for promotion from League 1 this season and rightly so: with the end they had to the season last year after Nigel took over, they nearly got into the Play-Offs and they got to the FA Cup semi-finals going on an unbelievable run that,


had they started a month earlier, would have got them in the Play-Offs. 



Turning our attention to today's opponents and Sheffield United will certainly provide a stern test. The Blades come into this afternoon's fixture making a





# INTRODUCING THE BLADES



AFTER a whirtwind 125th anniversary season last term, the Blades are hot favourites to make a return to the Championship this time around.

A shaky start to 2013/14 cost David Weir his job in charge of United in late September 2013. Former Derby boss, Nigel Clough's installation as manager saw an upward surge in the Yorkshire side's fortunes. From the throes of a relegation dogfight, he guided United to a seventh-place finish in League 1 narrowly missing out on a place in the Play-Offs. Along with their league form, the Blades also made the semi-final of the FA Cup where they were beaten by fellow Yorkshire side, Hull City at Wembley despite having taken the lead against the Tigers. The loss of highly-rated centre-half Harry Maguire has been eased by the arrival of Andy Butler and Craig Alcock alongside ex-Town defender,

Jay McEveley. Michael Higdon has also added firepower to the Blades' frontline alongside Jose Baxter. An opening-day defeat to fellow promotion favourites, Bristol City was followed by an away reverse at Coventry City. Wins then followed over Peterborough and Crawley before they booked their place in the third round of the Capital One Cup by knocking out West Ham on penalties at Upton Park, Last Saturday's win over newly-promoted Rochdale at Bramall Lane preceded a win at Colchester on Tuesday evening. The Blades were 2-0 down at one point before Ben Davies converted a last-gasp penalty to complete the turnaround and claim an unlikely three points for Nigel Clough's side.



SHEFFIELD United could line up in a 4-4-1-1 system this afternoon at The County Ground. Nigel Clough could deploy striker Jose Baxter just off a central frontman and set his team up to try and sit deep, soak up the pressure and play on the counter-attack. They've got some good footballers: they now have the experience of former Town defender, Jay McEveley, in the back-line, Jamal Campbell-Ryce will be a threat playing out wide on the flank and will cause the Town problems by giving the Blades an outlet in the wide areas. We've already mentioned Baxter playing in 'number ten' role up front and United will look to funnel a lot of their attacking play through him. Expect the Blades to be a passing side this afternoon. They will try and pass the ball and work it forward in units then try and get it wide and cross it into the danger area. Every team now will try and make life difficult for Swindon

at The CG. They won't just turn up and wait to be beaten. One thing you can guarantee from one of Nigel Clough's teams is that they will work incredibly hard. Town will have to be ready to deal with that work-rate.

Made his name as a manager with Burton Albion, taking the Brewers to the brink of the Football League. In January 2009, he took charge of Derby County, following in his father's footsteps. After four and a half years in charge at Pride Park, he was sacked in September 2013. A month later, he had taken the reians at Bramall Lane.




### 15 Neill Collins DF







2014 has been a landmark year for the Town midfielder.
A trip to Brazil as part of the Australian World Cup squad was followed by a first Socceroos start earlier this month. Back in Wiltshire, he admits that he is enjoying life in the heart of Swindon's midfield.



### LET'S start with last summer. Talk us through your Brazilian experience...

There was a lot of training before we even got to Brazil. That was about four weeks before the first game of the World Cup so that involved training every day imagine a mini pre-season, puttina in 100%, trying to prove yourself. The intensity was up there with the most I've ever experienced. I think it was a mixture of people trying to prove themselves and people trying to get fit for the games and, at first, it was pretty hard to adapt to but towards the end I got there just in time for the World Cup. Then the World Cup was just something different. In between every game it was kind of boring; you were isolated from everyone - family, friends, even people in Brazil. We stayed in our hotel and we weren't allowed out because there was too much security needed. It just went 360 on game day and it was the biggest experience I have ever had. The crowds were unreal. Even the lead-up just being on the bus to the ground with the

maximum security and all the fans outside, it was massive. Obviously, the games were edge-of-theseat, especially the first two. Chile were the hardest team to play against on the ball because they pressed the living daylights out of you. Watching that was thrilling let alone playing. The Netherlands game was amazing because it looked realistic that we could win the game. We had the chance to win the game and I think we had a shot off the line then they went up the other end and scored but the whole experience was massive. Having the big players just sitting next to you in the same room - you couldn't repeat that experience.

### Did the senior players in the squad - the likes of Tim Cahill help you to settle in?

Definitely. Especially Timmy. He was around the younger ones even if it was just playing FIFA between training sessions or by the pool, he was always around. Even when I got called up he was messaging me and following me on Twitter straight away. He

### busy summer was it a smooth transition to get back into training?

I had two weeks off but I'm not the type that can just sit around while everyone is working so I felt that I needed to be back. I trained once or twice then went into the second half at Yate. It felt like the season was still going. It was a friendly so it wasn't as intense as normal but I had to look back and think "I'm back already" and it didn't feel like the season had really ended. That was a bit of an awakenina because I knew that this year would be a big year for me so, realistically, I had to get back to where I was at the end of last year. I wasn't far off because I had been training all summer.

### Fast-forward to Scunthorpe. You take just four minutes to open your account but what was the celebration all about?

To score four minutes in was acod! I think the celebration was for the team a bit because we were written off before the season had even started. Then, four minutes in we start off with a bang and it was basically saying "we're Swindon Town and we mean business." Nathan Thompson brought us into the huddle and said to us that from the off no-one has given us a second look and this is our time to prove everyone wrong, It's not about them, it's about us but if no-one backs us then we'll do it ourselves. We came out, scored early and everyone's shoulders relaxed and everyone thought the same: we were going to be alright. Whether we win or lose, we'll always have our style.

### You look like you're enjoying

Oh yes, I love playing in that midfield especially with Yas and Louis. We all have a different role and we know that role. Last year, people were in and out of the team and we all tried to do every

yourself playing in that midfield...

made sure if there was anything I needed then I could call him. With a lot of the boys, you felt comfortable enough to ask them questions and advice. Even people like Mile Jedinak and Mark Bresciano - they are good people to have in the squad when you're coming through. I've experienced going on loan somewhere and the older players wouldn't even talk to you so it's hard to adapt but this was something different. Those players made it an easier process to get on with the boys and feel at home.

You come back from Brazil and you're straight into preseason action to Yate. With your role rather than do that one role really well. Now we've got a good balance, especially us three in midfield. Yaser knows his role and Louis can offer things both defensively and in an attacking sense and he won't stop working for the team. I've got those two so I know I can focus on myself and when the ball does come to me I can do a little bit more myself.

### After a great start to the season, you were recently called up again to the Australia squad. When did you find out that you were starting against Saudi Arabia?

It was two days before the Belaium game. I came on against Belgium and did well and people were talking about me. I thought I had a pretty good chance of starting and, with the way the rotation goes, I had it in the back of my mind that I had to be ready to start even if I didn't. We did a bit of shape work the day before and he (the Manager) put me in the team that was going to start. It's exciting to start for your country; that's massive.

### Who were you stood next to during the National Anthems?

I was next to Bailey Wright and Alex Wilkinson, So, stood next to two centre backs, I looked really small in comparison.

### Most of us mere mortals can just dream of playing for our country. Describe what it was like stood there while the Anthem is playing...

I wasn't actually focusing on the words. I was mumbling, going along with it and looking for people I knew in the crowd and just soaking up the experience. Then, when the camera came across I tried to look away and that distracted me a bit but I try not to get caught up in the moment. In any game I try and be relaxed but I couldn't help but be nervous for that game. I know it was only a friendly but it was a massive thing for me and my family and

everyone back home to see me.

### You played in the 'Number 10' role behind Tim Cahill then you were the supporters' choice for Man of the Match in Fox Sports Australia's online poll...

I didn't know that until a while after the game when I was doing interviews, Filling Bresciano's boots is massive. I wouldn't say it was pressure but it was nerve-wracking filling his boots. Playing a lone '10' is massive in any team: you're the pinpoint of the attacking play, you're right in the middle of it all the time and you have got to be prepared for that. I had a decent game, I didn't do anything special, just did my own thing and worked hard. Working hard gets you praise too. Working off Tim is easy. The way he plays is really intelligent and he's a natural goalscorer. I knew I could give it to him and he'd give it to me. All the boys were trying to find me too.

### Was there a final message from the manager or from someone like Tim?

The manager works a bit differently. He gives advice to the team and not so much individually but Timmy says "get on the ball and razzle." No-one is going to have a go at you if you lose the ball and that's what I like. Here at Swindon no-one cares as long as you work hard and do the right things afterwards and it's the same at Australia. I got some good feedback after the game and a lot of good things I can work on. Brad Smith did well too. Straight off, people said "wow, he's quick." He's a massive threat. When he does have possession he can bomb on and you know he's going to get back in a second. You see that at Swindon he's always the first one back to defend.

### Back into action at Bradford last week. You really had to arind that result out...

In the back of my mind I was thinking "knowing us we'll concede in the 90th minute"


but it's the group we have this year. Everyone's got each other's back because we all get along really well and we take that onto the pitch. No-one wants to be at fault for letting all the other boys down. That encourages us to dig in, make those last-ditch tackles and put our bodies on the line.

### I presume the same result against Sheffield United would be most welcome?

It will be interesting. They'll be up there this year; they've spent a lot of money and are looking like one of the serious sides in League 1 but so are we, so we'll see what happens. It will be a good game. I'm looking forward to it - I look forward to every game but Sheffield should be massive. There should be a big crowd and hopefully we do what we've been doing.

TOWN'S Sports Scientist is back in the Treatment Room and explains how the squad dealt with the recent break.




**DESPITE** no fixture a fortnight ago due to our international players being called up to their respective national sides, the squad continued to train as normal. To ensure the players kept their match fitness, training was tailored to the desired intensities. What the squad lost in game time, they gained in recovery. This was welcomed, especially after the series of Saturday-Tuesday games that we had leading up to it combined with the very taxing game in the Capital One Cup against Brighton. It is always a bit nerve-wracking when you haven't played in a while but at Bradford, the team showed good levels of fitness, determination and we got a really good away win at Valley Parade. With this next set of

Saturday-Tuesday games coming up, the players that are playing keep themselves ticking over. The starting XI are getting their physical conditioning from their game time. # FANATIC'S Words Dave Wallis



BACK in 1971, publication began of a weekly magazine called 'Book of Football'. Not the catchiest name for a football magazine but certainly succinct...

seventy five parts at 23p apiece and advertised on TV, it built up into a library of 1,500 pages which formed a comprehensive overview of football in the seventies and today offers a fascinating picture of a bygone era of the sport we all love.

This was a grown-ups publication. A welcome change for this young student of the game, bored with the 'what is your favourite breakfast cereal' asked of every football 'star' in 'Shoot'.

But that didn't stop a set of players' pictures being published each week, which were to be cut out and mounted in an album for a full pictorial display of every top flight team's squad.

So this magazine seemed to target both Dad and sonny Jim. One to read every word of the in-depth articles, while the other familiarised himself with Division One's players as he stuck the pictures in the book.

Regular articles included The Clubs, The Players, Matches to Remember and Tactics.

Fabric of Football often delved into the murkier side of the game such as the demise of Acctington Stanley and the betting scandal that brought life bans for Jimmy Gauld, Peter Swan, Tony Kay and David (Bronco) Layne in 1965.

Another article focused on The affluence that spreads football poverty' which showed that 3,409,000 supporters had attended matches at The Big Four' of



Liverpool, Everton, Manchester United and Manchester City in 1970/71.

In comparison, only 1,978,000 had visited Lancashire's 'other' ten Football League clubs, which comprised of Blackburn, Bolton, Blackpool, Burnley, Bury, Oldham, Preston, Rochdale, and (would you remember?) Southport and Barrow.

Refreshingly, this was perceived as a reason for concern, rather than a trumpeting of the top clubs and hang the rest.

Over the course of its life, every club in England, Scotland and Wales had its own feature.

An article on Asa Hartford, a player whose career looked in tatters after being diagnosed with a hole in the heart while undergoing a medical during a proposed transfer from West Brom to Leeds, was dealt with in depth, with sensitivity and with medical insight. Hartford went on to play without consequence until 1987.

One piece speculated on the

merging of the London-based clubs to form one team to face European competition on a weekly basis.

Under the headline 'Could'
Division One become second best in Britain?' the writer suggested English football could play second fidalle to Europe. It's important to remember that when reference is made to 'Division One' we are talking about what is now known as the Premier League...


not the Championship or even League One!

Other articles speculated about the formation of a GB team to replace the individual home nations and just how ridiculous a player would look if team shirts ever featured sponsors' logos.

The magazine followed Fred Ball, a Stake City supporter on his way to an away game at Leeds. It compared Jimmy Greaves with new kid on the block Trevor Francis. The regular back page constituted a complete season's worth of records, showing the cup progress and final table of every season since 1870.

There was something for everyone in 'Book of Football', a magazine that (unusually) dian't suffer in quality of writing or material throughout its life.

Today it offers a unique view of football in the seventies. But not only that, it shows that many of the concerns that we have today were recognised, debated and feared forly years ago.










R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

THE County Ground of sixty years ago was a very different place to the one we know and love today.

There were no floodlight pylons or 'magic' roundabout on view close by. The main stand, on the north side - which included the only available seating - was a ramshackle, wooden structure, parts of which dated from 1896. On the south side there was a simple shelter that straddled the terraces either side of the halfway line but the Town end stand was relatively new, having only been built in 1938. The ground capacity was almost twice what it is today - just over 28,000 having packed in for a recent F.A. Cup Fourth Round tie, against Stoke City in February 1952.

By early 1958, the directors had come up with an ambitious proposal to provide cover on

all four sides of the ground, with seating numbers being close to doubled.

On 16th April of that year, a successful bid of £3,400 at an auction in Aldershot secured the purchase of the 'Tattoo'

double-decker stand that - with its external staircases - would become a familiar sight on the Shrivenham Road side until 1994. Unfortunately, it would but cost eight times that amount to transport it to Swindon and re-

erect it!





The plan was to have everything in place for the first season in the new Third Division - with the old south side shelter being relocated to the Stratton Bank. But the latter never came to fruition and the whole project was delayed to such an extent that by the time first visitors Wrexham arrived on 23 August the new stand was still a mere shell.

It would be 18th October before the top tier opened - 1,426 seats with the most expensive centre ones priced at six shillings (30p!) The stand was not officially unveiled for a further fortnight, when the Mayor Alderman Fred Kina led the proceedings in front of a near 20,000 crowd present for the local derby with Reading.




WITH Swindon hovering around the Play-Off places in League 1, Town's big number 9 admits that he is looking forward to the forthcoming run of fixtures

I'M obviously pleased because we've won 6 out of 6 but the biggest thing for me is, all the time that we're winning, then it's easy for the players to buy into what we're doing.

IT makes my job easier and I think it becomes a better place to work in when you are in a winning environment and I tend to think that the youngsters learn better and auicker in a winning environment so all the time we're winning I'm happy. I think that they're improving all the time and even on the training ground we're going through different things and they seem to be picking things up quicker because they're buying into what we're doing.

Video analysis is something that we're quite big on with the Under-18s. The game gets filmed and then, on Saturday night, each player will receive an email with their individual clips attached. They'll watch that over the weekend, then we give them a reflection sheet for them to fill out and bring into me on Monday or Tuesday. Normally, we give them a reflection sheet after the game and they tended to reflect on what I've said after the game - you can almost hear my voice on the reflection sheet. We changed that because we wanted them to have their own opinion and to reflect on the game from what they've seen rather than from what they've remembered and what they've heard from me in the dressing room afterwards. We feel that is a vital part of it. On top of that, I watch the game back myself. Then we watch the




clips together and I go through negatives and positives of what we've done and how we can improve. I usually do that on a Friday because it's then fresh in their minds for the next day. A lot of teams do it on a Monday from Saturday's game whereas I feel it's better done on a Friday. You can see the stuff we do on the training ground and you can see the stuff we talk about on the analysis clips: where can we improve etc. I think a lot of footballers are visual learners anyway - they learn from what they see, so it's easier this way. You show them the clip, we go on the training around, we do it and then we improve on it. I'm not saying it's the key to why we've been so successful but I think it's been a massive part

This week we play Oxford away. I'm not really bothered about the opposition - we just focus on ourselves and just concentrate on what we do. We never change from what we do: we control the possession, we have done in every game. So far we've had an average of 68.85% possession over our seven games. I expect them to be like all teams at youth level - very fit, very strong and competitive so we've got to deal with that.

I hope it's about time now that people are sitting up and realising what we're doing as a football club because we're playing exactly the same way as the First Team; we're dominating possession, we've had about five Youth Team players in a First Team shirt this year already. I think it's now about time for people to start sitting up and realising what we're doing.

I haven't spoken to Scott Gemmell. the manager, regarding Callum's performance yet - I normally do that at the end of the week - but, from an Academy point of view, we're very pleased and hopefully he's done himself good by showing he's good enough to get into the Victory Shield squad. The Scottish, Welsh and Irish FAs along with the English FA send an

email out every season listing boys that are able or that can play for their respective countries. At the moment we've got a few Welsh players that are quite young but they're already aware of them. Hopefully that will continue with the other countries as well.

The Under-9s and Under-10s inductions have started. Every age group will have their own induction and it gives us a chance to have a chat about the Academy, where we're going with it and where we've been. Mark Cooper even came down and helped me with the Under-9s and Under-10s. I give them a little talk about the Academy, the games programme, the EPPP and the new syllabus and player packs. This season, we've gone with injury booklets as well. There is so much documentation for the players, it's about them taking in as much information from these booklets and evaluating their performances. The Manager has

spoken about how important the Academy is and where we want it to go and he is always down there. It's where we want him to see them. He goes around and looks at the Under-15s and Under-16s, which could be the next ones coming through but he also goes and spends some time with the seven and eight year-olds. It's a great thing to see the Manager down there and interacting with all the players and staff as well.





WE welcome Sheffield United to The County Ground this afternoon who, like ourselves, have enjoyed an encouraging start to the season including their 3–2 victory at Colchester in midweek and I am sure we are set for another entertaining game today.

**OUR** win at Bradford City last weekend was achieved with another fantastic team performance and, after surviving the setback of conceding an early penalty and then going behind through an own goal, the players showed great spirit and doaged determination to eke out victory in front of 12,500 partisan supporters at Valley Parade. Wes Foderingham was on top form, with a magnificent penalty save and he kept our noses in front late in the game with a number of great saves. Mark Cooper described his performance as 'world class'. These pressure situations where the team has to really dig in but still manage to come through with the victory by 'doing whatever you have to do' to get across the finishing line and take the three points, are where the foundations of a winning mentality are laid! Congratulations to Jon Obika on his goalscoring return to Swindon. He will be delighted to get off the mark with two opportunist goals both scored from close range where his anticipation and reactions were auicker than that of the Bradford defenders.

The midweek draw with Oldham was probably a fair reflection of the 90 minutes and, whilst we did not quite reach the standards of previous matches, it was disappointing not to see the game out once Andy Williams had nudged us ahead so late in



the day. Jon Obika scored his third goal in the two games played at the start of his career here at Swindon Town.

Talking of centre forwards, who could not be impressed by Chelsea's £32 million swarthylooking gunslinger Diego Costa with seven goals notched in just four Premier League games to date. We sometimes question why the top goal-scoring centre forwards always command such huge transfer fees but the prowess of Diego Costa should surely give us the answer. The centre forward position is widely accepted as the most difficult position to play on the football pitch and there are a number of very good reasons for this: 1. Be able to control passes with your back to goal sometimes with two or three defenders in close attention and sometimes with the ball fired into you at chest or head height. 2. Be able to turn and run at defenders to create

a goalscoring opportunity. 3. Must chase all hopeful or mishit forward passes. 4. Must close down defenders - especially with the high press now seen as a popular tactic. 5. Oh and by the way, of course, the hardest job of all: regularly stick the ball into the back of the net because if you don't, your position will be under scrutiny from supporters, press and manager alike.

So far this season Costa has traumatised eight centre-backs and four goalkeepers and his hat-trick of goals against Swansea last weekend all came from a central position, between the two goal posts, just six or seven yards out. He is a supreme predator. Like a shark to blood, he scents the opportunities, moving into position and before the defenders can scream for help the ball is in the back of the net. He is a great example for young centre forwards - the Swansea hat-trick was achieved with the minimum of movement, just slight body adjustments of a few yards, whilst watching the route of the ball and the assisting player with the eye of a ruthless, gun-slinging assassin ready for the coup de grace!

Once again, let's get behind the team as they go in search of victory.

#### **R&W** looks ahead to Swindon's trip in the JPT to Rodney Parade in Wales.



NEXT up for the Town on the road is a trip across the Severn Bridge to Newport County. This will be the first meeting between Swindon and Newport in Wales since September 1986 when Lou Macari took his promotionchasing side along the M4. On that occasion, the two sides played out a 2-2 draw. Town fans of a certain age will remember that Swindon were consigned to Fourth Division football for the first time in their history at the hands of Newport County. John Trollope's team travelled to Wales needing a win to retain their Division Three status. Tommy Tynan's 81st minute penalty condemned Town a 1-0 defeat. Last term, Mark Cooper's men reached the Area Final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. The winners of the tie at Rodney Parade will face Plymouth Arayle in round two.
