IN TODAY'S ISSUE...


t's certainly been a tough week for all involved with Yeovil Town after the team's heavy 4-1 defeat away at Port Vale last Saturday.



Yes we did pull back a goal, but we couldn't stop conceding after that when Vale went up the other end and scored another.


I've got to say I didn't really hear any of the chanting from the crowd as I was concentrating on pulling the game back, but as a player you know when the crowd are with you or against you.

And summer signing Berrett, who is now close to full fitness after overcoming a thigh injury, believes Yeovil will see the benefits this afternoon.

The former Carlisle playmaker said: "We did double sessions and it was what was needed after last Saturday's game.

"It was disappointing for everyone and we just had to knuckle down this week and work as hard as we can to improve things.

"The performance at Port Vale wasn't acceptable and we all hope that everyone sees a reaction to that this weekend.

"We know Swindon are flying high in the

table. They're a good side and will pose a tough test for us.

"But this division is really tight and we know that a couple of wins will see us rocket up the table and that's what we'll be looking to do."


Berrett moved to Huish Park this summer after spending four seasons with Carlisle United during which he earned a reputation as a goalscorer from midfield.

The 25-year-old said: "I got the injury in pre-season and I then probably came back too soon because I just wanted to play.

"I got through a few games at the start of the season but the injury wasn't right and another scan showed up the

problem.

"That meant a few weeks out to properly recover but now I'm back playing and I'm totally over the injury.

"I'm now getting back to full fitness because you always need a few games under your belt and hopefully the Yeovil fans will start to see the best of me.

"I did score a few goals at Carlisle and my first season there was my best one when I ended up scoring 10 goals.

"I was scoring goals from long range and also getting into the box to score as well and I want to be doing that again.

"It was great to get into double figures for the season with Carlisle and it's definitely something I'd like to reproduce with

Yeovil."

Berrett also experienced the high of winning the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Wembley with Carlisle in 2011, when the Cumbrians beat Brentford 1-0 in the final.

He recalled: "Brentford were the favourites that day because they were going quite well in the league and I think they had quite a big budget.

"But we managed to win and it was a great experience. Playing at Wembley is every boy's dream and to win there as well made it even more special."

Berrett joined Carlisle after making a first team breakthrough at his local club, Huddersfield Town, in 2007 when he was still a teenager.

And as a Huddersfield fan who had come through the youth ranks at the club, it was another dream come true for Berrett.

He said: "I supported the club and used to go to watch the games with my dad and my brother so I was really proud to end up playing for them.

"They picked me up when I was 14 and I can remember making my debut when Andy Ritchie promoted me from the Academy.

"To play for the club I supported in front of my family and friends was brilliant and I still follow the club now."

But after making the trip to the Scottish Borders to play for Carlisle, Berrett has now gone to the other extreme and moved to the south west.

He explained: "When I was leaving Carlisle I came down here to meet Gary Johnson and was really impressed with what he had to say.

"I knew all about Yeovil and what they achieved by reaching the Championship because I played against them quite a few times for Carlisle.

Park when Carlisle came back from 3-1 down and equalised with a late own goal.

"So I knew about the club and the manager and I knew this was the place that I wanted to play my football."

After his injury lay-off, Berrett has returned to the Town team in a right-sided midfield role rather than his preferred central position.

But he is enjoying the switch and recognises the potential in Yeovil's midfield line-up.

Berrett said: "I haven't played on the right much before but I understand the position and I think I can affect games from there.

"We've got Joe Edwards and Simon Gillett in midfield with me and they're both quality players. I think we've got the potential to be an effective combination in midfield."

h, the memories. Before the grey hairs appeared and when life was fun and not filled with arguments with the next door neighbours over a lopping a tree, I began what you could just about call a journalistic career with the BBC in the county town of Swindon. It was when some bloke called Glenn Hoddle had just arrived and the club were getting over the shame of being relegated two divisions a couple of years prior for being very naughty boys indeed.

Filled with great names such as Fraser Digby, Shaun Taylor, Martin Ling and Steve White to name but four, the club climbed the first division table and ended up at Wembley where they defeated Leicester City in an epic play-off final. It was a day I will never forget. Interviewing nervous players at their M4 hotel on the morning of the match, spending time in their dressing room a couple of hours before kick-off and then the game itself. And what a game.

An hour in I had declared on the radio that Swindon were a Premier League team when Taylor made it 3-0. Handing over the commentary I went in search of a toilet in a Wembley Stadium which was past its best. Indeed, had I peed any stronger, one whole side of the ground would have collapsed. Three times I heard a roar from inside the stadium and having zipped up and stamped on my Embassy No 5, I returned to my seat to notice it was now three apiece.

I should have brought a bottle, I remember thinking to myself in the knowledge that every big sports game required superstition and moving from a seat when everything was going so well was clearly going to be a disastrous thing to do.

Back where I started, I pulled up the mic and started voicing my thoughts to the 15 Swindon supporters who were back in Wiltshire and not in this revolting

part of London town. A dive that Tom Daley would have been proud of had he not been a twinkle in his mother's eye from Chalky White led to a late penalty, converted by Paul Bodin from 12 yards and Swindon were a top flight club after all. For a season. One in which they conceded 100 goals.


The night that followed the Wembley win was nuts. The M4 was filled with flags and banners from almost every bridge and I swear to this day I have never seen a man more drunk than midfielder John Moncur that evening. His blood could have fuelled a moon-bound rocket.

outh has been at the heart of Swindon Town's spectacular start to the League One season. Having halved the club's wage bill from two years ago, recruiting and improving young talent is the mission which boss Mark Cooper is fulfilling with some style in the opening months of the campaign.

The recent 3-0 victory over Barnsley was achieved by a Robins' side with an average age of just 21 years old, and the boss has no plans to change his winning formula.

"They want to learn and work, they are a fantastic bunch," said Cooper, who told BBC Points West he sees himself as "a father figure" to the squad.

"Whether it is losing on Xbox the night before and they're having a sulk, it's all about trying to find which button to press."

It is a far cry from the big-spending days of Paolo Di Canio, the controversial manager who led the Robins to their last promotion push, when they lost out in the play-off semi-finals to a Brentford team which would go on to be beaten by Yeovil Town at Wembley.

One survivor from those days is striker Andy Williams, a familiar face at Huish Park having spent two-and-a-half seasons with the Glovers.

He said: "In the previous regime, it was a standard League One style football, this time we are doing it a little more entertainingly.

"I do not think there is one player who can say they have not got better since they came to the club and that's showing on the pitch."

Cooper's kids have had their critics who doubt his young charges' ability to mix it with the division's best for the entire season, but, for now, the boss is enjoying watching them play.

"We have to make sure we maintain the standard and I am sure people will say that when the pitches get bad, we will not be able to play," he said.

"When that happens, we'll have to come up with something but, at the minute, we're just enjoying it."

There's plenty of 'hired help' among today's visitors with loan signings including defenders Jordan Turnbull and Jack Stephens, both borrowed from Premier League Southampton, and midfielders Louis Thompson and Amari Bell, on loan from Norwich City and Birmingham City respectively.

Thompson's older brother, Robins' captain Nathan, has been a key part of a solid spine to the visitors' side.

Behind him keeper Wes Foderingham has been influential with Iraq international midfielder Yaser Kasim in the middle of the park and frontman Michael Smith up front.

Goalkeeper Wes Foderingham has told Swindon Town he expects them to match his own ambitions of higher-division football.

The 23-year-old, who is out of contract in the summer, is one of a number of players which the Robins are hoping to tie down to new deals.

His form in the past six months has earned Foderingham admiring glances from a number of clubs, albeit without attracting any firm offers.

However, the keeper, described by his manager, Mark Cooper, as the best in the division, has said he wants to move up the League at the County Ground.

He told the Swindon Advertiser: "I see my future higher up the football pyramid, if that is with Swindon - fantastic.

"I won't sit here and say that I want to play the rest of my career in League One because I don't.

"Hopefully we get promoted this season and I can be playing football in the Championship."

Foderingham, who began his career in the academy at Fulham and had a spell at Crystal Palace, made his League debut three years ago having joined Swindon from Palace before being signed permanently by then-boss Paolo Di Canio three months later.

He has appeared for England at Under-16s, Under-17s and Under-19s level and is the visitors' undisputed number one ahead of Tyrell Belford, who joined from Premier League giants Liverpool on a two-year deal last summer.



The Iraq international sat out the recent visit to Newport County in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy after picking up his fifth booking for a rash challenge in a League One fixture with Sheffield United.

That led the boss to warn the 23-yearold, who has been a star of the visitors' impressive start to the season, about his conduct in future.

Cooper said: "He shouldn't be getting five bookings because you don't need to tackle, you don't need to give teams an opportunity to stick the ball into our box.

"He makes a tackle early on, gets booked and they get an opportunity to stick the ball in our box."

Teenager Louis Thompson, 19, the brother of the skipper, and Amari Bell, on loan from Norwich City and Birmingham City respectively, have been regulars including in the 2-1 victory over Leyton Orient last weekend.

Both seem certain to start in defensive positions in what is likely to be a five-man midfield with Australian international Massimo Luongo and Kasim in the middle and Nathan Byrne and Bell down the flanks.

Ben Gladwin, who signed from Non-League Marlow Town last autumn, got his first goal for the club in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy defeat to Plymouth Argyle on his return from an ankle ligament injury which kept him out throughout September.


He is another option available to manager Cooper today along with Brad Smith, who is on loan from Liverpool, Jake Reeves, and Irishman Anton Rodgers.

One player who needs no introduction to the home fans among the Huish Park crowd today is striker Andy Williams.

The 28-year-old has had two spells as a Glovers' player including scoring 17 goals in all competitions in the 2011-12 season before deciding on a move to the Wiltshire club.

However, he made a brief return at the



start of last season when he played nine Championship games, failing to find the net before picking up a cruciate ligament injury which put him out for the season.

His start for the Robins this year has been far more impressive finding the net six times in the club's opening 14 games.

Another familiar face to Glovers' fans. striker Jonathan Obika, will not feature today having picked up a shoulder injury at the end of September, putting him out for five months.

The former Tottenham Hotspur youngster, who arrived from White Hart Lane for a reported six-figure sum, has had four spells on loan at Huish Park with a record of 17 goals in 70 appearances.

His record for his new employers is far more impressive with five goals in his first five matches before picking up the injury.

The absence of Obika puts the spotlight on fellow frontman, Michael Smith, who has netted eight times

already this season including four goals in the club's first two games.

But, the North East-born striker has deflected praise onto the club's defence despite netting again in the recent 2-1 victory over Levton Orient.

Smith said: "I think we dealt with Orient's physical game well in the end but it was a bit edge of your seat stuff in the last few minutes.

"I think we're showing the maturity now in the squad, especially in defence I think they were outstanding, so credit to them."

Manager Mark Cooper's confidence in his side's frontmen was underlined by his willingness to allow George Barker to head out on loan to League Two side Tranmere Rovers this month.

He has made eight appearances for the Robins this season with youngster Connor Waldon turning out four times.

Swindon Town boss Mark Cooper has used his side's exit from the Johnstone's Paint Trophy to warn them against complacency after a spectacular start to the season.

The Robins boss, who took the job last August after the resignation of Kevin MacDonald, told his players to take note of the 3-2 defeat to West

Country rivals Plymouth Argyle where they were three goals down just 10 days ago.

He told BBC Wiltshire: "It shows the players that if they're not quite right, what happened in the first half happens.

"But when they listen and do things properly, we dominate the game.

"Hopefully that's reminded the players about that slap in the face I've been talking about."

The majority of Swindon Town fans will admit they were not overly enamoured with Cooper's appointment in summer 2013 with much of his playing and

managerial career being in the lower reaches of the game.

However, no supporter can fail to have been impressed with his tenure to date, having achieved a solid eighth place finish in League One last season and starting impressively this term.

His previous biggest job saw him manage Peterborough United where he lasted just 13 games, winning just one, before being dismissed.

The midfielder, who started his career at Bristol City and played more than 180 times for Exeter City, also had managerial spells at Non-League Darlington, where he won the FA Trophy, Tamworth and AFC Telford United.

He guit the AFC Telford role after just five games in charge, one draw and four defeats, to take over as assistant manager to MacDonald at the County Ground before stepping up 15 months ago.

Cooper's father, Terry, played for both England and Leeds United, while his son, Charlie, is on the books at Championship side, Birmingham City.

fter no less than 11 separate loan spells in six years, former Tottenham striker Jon Obika is revelling in settled life at the County Ground.

The 24-year-old signed for Swindon on a two-year contract in September, ending an eight year stay at White Hart Lane which included just four first team appearances.

But Obika, who this week said goodbye to life in hotels by moving into a new apartment in Swindon, is pleased to be taking to the field on a regular basis.

"I feel settled, and I have always wanted a club where I can actually just get my head down and play and be part of the first team, so I definitely feel settled.

"I have been on a lot of loans so you get used to the travelling and there are no excuses. On the Saturday the fans and everyone else just wants to see you perform well, so as a player that's part of your job to adapt to any situation.

"Everyone wants to play and when you're given an opportunity you have to show why you want to play so I'm thankful for the opportunities and I feel that when the injury clears I will be back and ready to go."

The Enfield-born forward who has enjoyed loan spells at Yeovil (x4), Millwall, Crystal Palace, Peterborough, Swindon, Charlton (x2) and Brighton has hit the ground running at Swindon, scoring five goals in as many games helping promote the Robins to third in the table.

But a shoulder injury picked up at the end of September threatened to rule Obika out for three months, only for the

Spurs youth graduate to receive some encouraging news.

"The first thought was that I would spend three months out but the good news from the surgeon is that he doesn't want to operate because it's healing rapidly and they've given me three weeks out. I'm recovering well so I'm taking each day as it comes but the shoulder feels solid.

"At any time of the season an injury is frustrating, but to come here in the first five games when you're just finding your feet and playing well and scoring goals it was quite tough to take, but I've been through some injuries in the past so you kind of know the mental attitude you have to have towards a setback."

In fact, Obika has enjoyed a record



equalling start to life at the County Ground. By scoring in his first four matches the striker matched all-time record goal scorer Harry Morris' record set in 1928, a fact that flattered Swindon's number 20.

"I scored two on my debut and you can't ask for much more than that, and we won as well so it was like a double bonus and I feel it's always good to get your confidence going straight away because it's a long season and you need to take each game as it comes.

"I remember I played in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and found out that fact (I matched the record), but Harry Morris who scored in those four games on the trot scored nine goals I think so I said I was quite far off still! But it was nice to hear something like that."

Although now a permanent fixture, this is Obika's second spell in Wiltshire having enjoyed a loan spell at the club in 2011, but the striker doesn't believe his previous experience at the County Ground played a part in his arrival this summer.

the manager when I came, plus I knew a lot of the players now and a lot of them have come up from the Tottenham ranks and I had good conversations with them.



MOLONEY: 'WE'RE HUNGRY TO MAKE THINGS RIGHT'

ull back Brendan Moloney is hoping that a week in football is indeed a long time as Yeovil Town aim to give their campaign a brighter complexion in seven days.

The Glovers start today in Sky Bet League One's bottom four, having slipped below the relegation line following a 4-1 defeat at Port Vale.

Three wins so far this season have done little to aid Yeovil's case, but after a week of hard work on the Huish Park training pitch, Moloney insisted the squad boasted the spirit to launch a league climb.

The Irishman said the Glovers – who he joined from Bristol City in the summer – were hungry to make amends, starting today against Swindon Town.

"it wasn't the result we wanted and we know that our performance wasn't good enough," he said. "Everyone was extremely disappointed in the result, but we're working hard now and we've got a home game this weekend where we want to put it right.

"Everyone just wants to put that game behind us now and try and look forward to the next one. It's great that we've got a three-game week next week, so if we have a good week we can put it right."

Twenty-five-year-old Moloney started his career at Nottingham Forest, making 51 appearances across six-and-ahalf-years that included loan spells at Chesterfield, Rushden and Diamonds, Notts County and Bristol City.

He switched to Ashton Gate in January before heading down the A37 during the closed season as fans' favourite Luke Ayling headed in the opposite direction.

However, Moloney readily admits the start to his South Somerset career has gone far from plan, starting League One games against Doncaster Rovers and Gillingham before dropping from the first team.

Injury extended his spell on the sidelines before he was recalled to face Vale ahead of the injured Seth Twumasi.

He said: "When I first came I was in the team but then went out of it through a dip in form. When I came back in I had an injury so it's not been the start I wanted.

"I will keep working very hard and keep going. Hopefully when I get that next chance I will be ready to come in and do a good job."

Being unafraid of hard work is not just a quality boasted by Moloney, the player himself believes the squad has the ethic to recover after an indifferent start.


With more than ten faces arriving at Huish Park in the summer and manager Gary Johnson accepting they are taking time to gel, Moloney revealed they were getting closer by the day.

He said: "We have a great bunch of lads in the squad, everyone gets on and everyone is willing to put in the work.

"As the time goes on everyone will get to know each other a lot better and hopefully everything will come together so we can kick on. Everyone is working very hard and wants to for the team and each other.

"After a few bad results people's confidence might be a little bit down, but in football a couple of results can change things so quickly. That's what we're hoping to do, starting this Saturday."

t's been a tough start to the season if you're a Yeovil Town fan. Following our historic debut campaign in the Championship, this season has, for one reason or another, not clicked just yet. But all is far from lost and we are still only in October so no reason just yet to man the lifeboats.

A year ago this weekend, we were recovering from a 4-1 defeat away from home (ouch!) and two years ago, we had just exited a horrid run of seven defeats in eight league games. We have form for not having form at this time of year!

And that is why I'm very optimistic for the season. Why? Many reasons actually. Because we usually start slowly and finish well, as we did when we reached Wembley in 2012-13. It's always disappointing to not have the points on the board early doors as every team goes into August dreaming of great things and expectant of what's to come. But 23 League One teams aren't top of the table at the moment, 18 clubs aren't in the play-offs and a dozen of them can't be in the top half either.

Although last Saturday's defeat was frustrating, it is far from terminal. The previous six games before the Vale Park debacle included a great away triumph at Bradford City, a superb win at home to Peterborough United and a point against Crewe where Joel Grant hit the woodwork in stoppage time. I've always been a fan of 'what if's' so 'what if' the Jamaican attacker had scored? Well, we would be six places higher up the league in 15th and just four points off the top six.

And therein lies the second issue. The league is still so scrunched up that two or three wins and suddenly you look upwards and not downwards. Also, recently, we have had the bare 18 or less to choose from but gradually the long term injured are returning to the squad. Someone worked out that we have suffered 15 injuries already with many

of them more serious than a strain or a bruise. That's a lot to deal with a quarter of the way through the season.

Finally, there's also the question of the squad gelling. It will happen in time but look at last season's Premier League surprise package, Liverpool. Finishing runners up to Manchester City, they had to rebuild their team this summer after the sale of Luis Suarez and yet the seven or eight new signings haven't glued together as Brendan Rodgers would like. It's the same as Tottenham the year before; sold Gareth Bale, reinvested the transfer kitty into a plethora of players and struggled initially. But those teams will come good and so will we, it just takes time.

Earlier this month, Gary Johnson celebrated seven years as Glovers boss over his two spells. In four of those years, we have won silverware; proof, I think, to back the man, back the club and remember our motto — Achieve By Unity.



ast Sunday, on a dramatic final day, Liverpool pipped Chelsea to the title on goal difference. The title race went right to the wire, but with the Blues losing to Manchester City 2-1, Liverpool stole a march and won the league after winning their final match 3-0, sparking celebrations lasting into the night.

I'm not, of course, smoking something and believing the Premier League finished last weekend, I'm talking about the conclusion of a phenomenal title battle in the inaugural season of the Women's Super League. Our very own ladies team have been more than competitive in the second tier of the competition, finishing fifth in their first season at national level, but the real drama has been in the top level of the competition, and what a finale.

Liverpool won out in a title battle that was a three horse race with Chelsea and Birmingham City right down to the final day. The Reds were the only one of the three protagonists to win their final fixture; had either of the Blues won their game, they then would have been Champions. The drama shifted this way and that but the Anfield side emerged with the title and the biggest smiles in women's football as the WSL concluded its first season as a resounding success.

What is a shame however is the fact that almost no-one, unless looking directly for it, will know what a close-fought, exciting title race it's been. Here in Sweden, women's football has a much higher profile; domestically the Damallsvenskan is close to receiving the same level of exposure as the men's Allsvenskan. Live games are shown on television, results are read out on the news, and players such as Kosovare Asllani, who plies her trade at PSG as the 'female Zlatan', are sufficiently high-profile that the layperson on the street knows who they are.

It would be nice to see that same profile given to the domestic game in England; having watched YTFC Ladies the quality is certainly there in the women's game, if not quite the same physicality. That has no bearing on the entertainment on offer though; Chelsea and particularly Arsenal Ladies play expansive, exciting football that is extremely pleasing on the eye. There is good fare on offer and people are missing out.

How could the WSL further grow? It's tough to come up with a solution in a hundred words, but here are a couple of suggestions: integrate tournaments; the World Cup? Hold the men's and women's simultaneously. Doesn't need to be on the same pitches, or even in the same country, but more will stick around for a little women's football if it's staged to fit in with the high-profile men's game. How about a decent highlights programme? The FA also need to promote the sport as played and watched by both sexes, and market it as such.

In reality, the sport may never be as popular as the men's version, due to the physiology of men being faster, stronger and fitter. Have a good look at the women's game though, and there is a lot to admire, a lot to like, and some very competitive entertainment on offer.
