TUESDAY'S defeat was disappointing. Yes, we had to make changes to the team. 





SWINDON Town Football Club paid tribute to former player and physio, Kevin Morris before Tuesday night's fixture against Rochdale at The CG.


Kevin served the club for over 30 years before he sadly took his own life in 1994 and, to mark 20 years

CAPTAIN'S NOTES

GOOD afternoon and welcome to The County Ground, at the end of a week where the weather isn't the only thing that's turned a little bitter...

IT'S been a frustrating week but we hope that the work the team has put in will pay dividends against Colchester.

In Tuesday night's Captain's Notes, I discussed how I'm protective of the team and will disperse pressure or expectations placed on us. For me, the lack of those two factors were the catalyst of our success before the international break. With such a young squad (many of whom elsewhere are young enough to still be in an Under-21s team) we have a duty of nurture if we are to get the best results from our players.

However, since the break we have yet to fully return to our rhythm of football. At Yeovil, it came too late and against Rochdale we lacked composure to see out the game. We should have taken six points from those two games, so to lose out on five simply isn't good enough.

Our style of football is different. Not just to the other teams in League 1 but to teams throughout the Championship and Premiership too, Its beginnings can be found on the continent where it's much more accepted for teams to build their attack from their goalkeeper. It's how 'the beautiful game' should be played. And it's not often practised in the UK.

Much like learning a new language, it's a style that needs continual practise – so perhaps it's a little ironic that during the international break, we lost some of our fluency. There is no substitute



to game time and it's not a coincidence that we've lost our fluency after both international breaks. However, identifying it's not a coincidence means that there are learnings to take to ensure this doesn't happen again - and we're committed to doing that.

Turning to address the elephant in the room - last week was the second time I saw red this season. Unlike the first time, this time it's contentious.

I've watched the footage repeatedly and personally, I feel the second yellow card was unjust. With the team in the ascendancy and a winning goal brewing, I was devastated to reduce the team to ten men. While I've received support from fans, I've also had a lot of criticism about the team's and my discipline.

The role that I'm required to play means that I'm arguably the most frequent one-on-one defender at this club. Therefore, at times it's a necessity for me to make a tactical, professional foul. This

was the case for the first yellow card. For the second yellow card, I maintain that I was fouled and deserved to have a free kick, not to be penalised myself.

Therefore, to read comments that I should have my captaincy taken off me is shocking and disconcerting. I can assure you that I maintain my professionalism at all times and when I wear my Swindon Town FC shirt, I give nothing less than 100% for this club. I take my role as Captain very seriously and would not purposefully jeopardise the success of this team through a lack of discipline.

Moving on to today's opponents and Tony Humes brings a team full of confidence after their 2-1 victory against Chesterfield. With positive results from their last three games, it's important we start brightly and impose our style on them.

There's no better place to start returning to winning ways than The County Ground. The team have had my full support during training this week and from the stands today, I hope it's an entertaining game but, more importantly, I hope the team can secure the fans, Manager and Chairman three points.

INTRODUCING THE US



AFTER avoiding relegation on the penultimate day of last season, the U's will be looking to secure third tier football for an eighth consecutive campaign...

DESPITE losing just one game in August, the first half of 2013/14 began in strained fashion for the Essex side. 1-0 wins over Gillingham and Port Vale preceded a run of four wins in twenty league and cup fixtures in a miserable, injury-hit period leading into December, with the club only able to call upon twelve senior players at one

A run of four wins in seven during Christmas and New Year over fellow strugglers (including Stevenage and Cartisle) gave the U's a springboard to launch themselves up the table, away from trouble, which led to gaffer, Joe Dunne's Manager of the Month nomination for January.

However, a total of nine points out of a possible forty-two, involving a goalless draw here at Town on Valentine's Day,

dragged the club into the heart of the relegation dogfight. They decisively ensured their League 1 safety with a 4-1 thrashing of already-promoted Brentford at the Weston Homes Community Stadium in game 45.

After remaining winless this time out. Dunne parted company with Colchester on 1st September, believing he had taken the club as far as he could. The club continued the theme of promoting from within, appointing Academy Head, Tony Humes to take charge of first team affairs. After leading the Academy side to a league and cup double last term, Humes has made a bright start to 2014/15, losing only two of his first ten games at the helm. In collecting 16 points from fourteen games in League 1 thus far, the U's have bettered their start to last term.



COLCHESTER'S formation of choice this season has been a 4-3-3. Tony Humes has maintained the U's shape and formation since taking over from former incumbent, Joe Dunne and has continued to preach the philosophy of passing, attacking football, something which helped Colchester to record back-toback home wins on Tuesday night for the first time in two vears. United's three-pronged attack has been led by topscorer Freddie Sears so far this season, who is usually flanked by Gavin Massey and Sanchez Watt (right) both of whom possess great pace as well as a goalscoring and attacking threat having scored five goals between them. Similarly to Rochdale, the U's will come to The County Ground with a gameplan and will look to play and pass the ball. The trio of midfielders can call upon the experience of David Fox to

help anchor the movement and creative talent of youngsters George Moncur and Alex Gilbev.

THE GAFFER



Tony Humes

HUMES started his playing career with Ipswich Town. making his debut in 1986. He would go on to spend seven years at Portman Road before moving on to Wrexham in March 1992 and went on to skipper the Welsh side making over 200 appearances in the process. Took his first steps in coaching with the academies at both Wrexham and Ipswich before being installed as Head of Youth at Colchester in June 2009. Worked with former boss Joe Dunne to bring youth players into the first team before taking the reins last month.

YOU KNOW?

AS the Youth Team Manager last term, Humes auided the U's to a South East Youth Alliance League and national Youth Alliance Cup double.

Tom Eastman DF

THE defender came up through the youth ranks at loswich Town and went on to make 10 league appearances in a two-year stay at Portman Road. In the summer of 2011, he made the move to Colchester and enjoyed a successful first season with the U's. picking up the Young Player of the Year Award. Last term saw the voung defender establish himself as a key member of Colchester's back-line and further accolades followed in the form of the Player of the Year title.



George Moncur MF

A name that is very familiar in these parts, George is the son of former Town midfielder, John and was born on the day Swindon played their first home game in the Premier League in 1993. A graduate of the youth ranks at West Ham, Moncur only has two Hammers appearances to his name but has spent time on loan at AFC Wimbledon and Partick Thistle. Joined the U's on loan in the summer and has found the net three times so far this term.



Freddie Sears FW

SEARS burst onto the scene with West Ham as a youngster, scoring against Blackburn in March 2008. He went on to make over 50 appearances for the Irons between 2007 and 2012. During his time at Upton Park, he had loan spells at Crystal Palace, Coventry and Scunthorpe before joining the U's on loan in January 2012. Earned a permanent move to Colchester that summer and has featured regularly ever since. Leads the way for the U's in the top scorer chart with eight goals this term.

01 Sam Walker GK



A former Chelsea trainee. Walker had loan spells at Barnet, Northampton, Yeovil and Bristol Rovers before joining Colchester on a temporary basis in

January 2013. He re-joined the U's on loan last term and was an ever-present, signing permanently in January 2014.

39 Elliott Hewitt DF



CURRENTLY on loan from Ipswich, the Welsh international Under-21 defender has featured regularly since joining the U's at the start of the month. Hewitt spent

time on loan at Gillingham last term and has played for the Tractor Boys this season before joining Colchester.

08 Alex Gilbey MF



THE young midfielder is a graduate of the youth system at Colchester and made his debut in October 2012. Helped Newport County into the Football

League during a loan spell then went on to make nearly forty appearances in his first year as a professional.

28 Sammie Szmodics MF



A teenager who has been with the U's all the way through the youth system, the forward broke into the squad ahead of the 2013/14 season. Was

a regular goalscorer for the Under-18s and has 10 appearances to his name

21 Gavin Massey FW



THE striker is a graduate of the youth system at Watford, where he made a handful of appearances. Has also spent time

on loan at Yeovil and Colchester before joining the U's in August 2012 on a permanent deal.

20 Sean Clohessy DF



THE experienced defender started his career at Gillinaham before moving to Salisbury City. After one season in Wittshire, he was snapped up by

Southend where he would go on to make over 150 appearances. Was with Kilmarnock last term.

04 Magnus Okuonghae DF



BEFORE joining the U's in July 2009, the defender represented Aldershot, St. Albans, Crawley, Dagenham & Redbridge and Weymouth. He has

now gone on to make over 200 appearances for the U's and has already seen red twice this season.

38 David Fox MF



FOX learned his footballing trade at Old Trafford before signing for Blackpool in January 2006. After three years with the Tangerines, he joined Colchester for

the first time in 2009. Went on to play for Norwich and Barnsley before re-joining the U's at the start of this month.

17 Drey Wright MF



ANOTHER graduate of the club's youth ranks, the pacy winger found the net regularly for the youth side and was shortly offered a professional

deal. He spent most of last season out with an injury but has made six appearances so far this season.

19 Rhys Healey FW



THE striker is currently on loan from Cardiff until the end of the year, having found the net on a regular basis for the Bluebirds' youth

sides. Healey has scored three goals in just five games for the U's so far.

26 Frankie Kent DF



KENT was the captain of the U's successful vouth team and featured regularly as they enjoyed league and cup success last season. Made

his first team debut at the end of the 2013/14 campaign and has made 10 appearances so far this term.

Since returning to the Town side after an ankle injury, the midfielder has notched his first senior goal and is now relishing the challenges that lie ahead this term...



We've done a bit of research at R&W and discovered that. a year ago this week.

> Marlow were beaten 2-1 at Slough Town. Do you remember that?

Yes. I do - verv well! It was a horrible night much like Tuesday night against Rochdale. There was a lot of wind and a lot of rain. I probably didn't have the best game either and it was a bit of a miserable one.

Fast-forward six months and you're playing in professional pre-season games against the likes of Southampton and Leeds United...

It's been brilliant. There have been a few highs and lows along the way. I've been adjusting and getting used to a few things but I've loved every single second of it. I'm living out my dream.

You've got the squad number seven this season. Did you choose that or was it given to you?

You started the first game of the season against Scunthorpe. Describe that feeling of stepping out as part of the starting XI...

My pre-season was a bit disrupted with injury and stuff but I came back against Leeds then got a few minutes against Aston Villa the week before so I went into that game in fairly good form. I hit the ground running and I thought I started the season quite well. It was a great experience beginning the season in the starting XI and getting the win, of course then it went on from there. It was brilliant the best time I've had here so far, starting games and in the

I had no idea about it! I was getting my little cousin a kit over the summer so I asked a few of the boys whether they knew if the sauad numbers were changing. I thought they were winding me up saying that I had been given the number seven shirt so I went and asked a few members of the staff and they confirmed it. I was buzzing that I'd been given that and hopefully I can live up to it. It's what I used to wear as a kid and I always used to watch some big players wearing that.

team. It was unfortunate to get the injury but now I'm back which is, obviously, a huge positive.

You mentioned the injury. What was going through your mind when you were lying on the ground having been chopped down by a Brighton player...

I won't lie to you - if you watched the video back you'd probably say that I had broken my ankle and, to be honest, I thought I had too judging by the reaction. It was pretty painful but full credit to the physic and everyone I worked with to get me back as soon as they did.

It must have been frustrating to be on the sidelines bearing in mind the start you had made to the season?

It wasn't nice. Especially coming in and watching how the boys are playing. You just want to be out there and be a part of it but, like I say, credit to everyone I worked with who got me back as fast as they did. I feel good now I'm back and involved.



Do you all - as a midfield unit - learn off each ofher as well as what you're coached in trainina?

Definitely. As a group, we're really close. We're atways discussing football - it's usually the only thing we're talking about. We're also different. If you look at us as individual midfielders, none of us are the same. We're all so different and bring something completely different to the team but, at the same time, we're always learning off each other. Huge credit to Luke and the Gaffer because they have been brilliant.

Do you feel that togetherness is one of the reasons behind Swindon's start to the season?

I think so. We're obviously a very young group and we're as close off the pitch as we look on it. We're all good friends, we spend a lot of time together off the pitch and I think that helps out a lot.

Well, after a few weeks out, you're back in the team at Plymouth. Talk us through your first senior career goal...

It was probably down to the Gaffer having a little dig at me saying I had the safety catch on too often and just to let more shots go and express myself in the final third. He had another chat with me the other day just saving that he likes watching me when I'm in the final third and to express myself a bit more and be a bit braver so hopefully that's something I can do during the games but it was great to get that first goal.

You've actually been nominated for the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Finish of the Round too ...

To be fair, I would have taken one off my backside as my first goal! I would have taken whatever but that's nice to know!

Last week at Yeovil, you stepped off the bench. Was that a point gained or two dropped for Swindon?

Two dropped really. In the second half we were a lot better and played our normal game. Credit to Yeovil, they made it tough in the first half. We then upped it a little bit and we probably should have gone on to win the game. Nathan's sending-off was really unfortunate and had we had eleven men on the field - even with ten - we could have gone on to win it.

You came on and took up a position on the left side of midfield. It was suggested afterwards to the manager that it's a sign of your versatility. Is that a word you would use to describe vourself?

No, probably not but a lot of people seem to! Wherever I can get minutes on the pitch and help the team then I'm happy

to do so and coming on there on Saturday was part of that. I thoroughly enjoyed it and I hope I did a good job.


The next month - on paper looks to be a really stern test for Swindon...

It's going to be a tough month and we always knew that from the start but I think, with the run we're on and the way we're playing football, we shouldn't worry too much about other teams. If we continue doing what we're doing and getting right what we do then results will look after themselves. Obviously, we're aware of the big teams and who we need to be wary of but we're a really good group and we're working so hard together at the moment. With some of the football we've been playing, I don't think we need to be scared of teams. We need to concentrate on ourselves - you can't look too far ahead and get too excited.

STFC'S Sports Scientist, Michael Cooper, is back in the Treatment Room and explains the importance of post-match recovery techniques...



WITH the upcoming block of Saturday-Tuesday fixtures, the focus of my job shifts to that of ensuring our players have recovered as best as they can before the next game. Years of continual research has been able to identify the best protocols for athletes and especially footballers to follow, in order to prepare themselves physically when there is such a short turnaround between games.

Of all the methods, nutrition post-exercise and training is viewed as paramount. Players need to not only refuel the energy that they have used (carbohydrates) but ensure they are eating foods that will repair their fatigued muscle tissue (proteins) and allow the body to carry out these processes at the highest level it can (fats, vitamins

and minerals).

After a game, our players are given a recovery shake which is to be taken within 20 minutes of their performance. This shake is balanced with all of the macro and micro nutrients mentioned above and the time window is set due to research studies finding that this period is the best in order to obtain optimal recovery.

Following this, players are offered a balanced carbohydrate/protein meal to further aid in their replenishment and recovery.


Alongside foods, it's important

to not forget fluids. You can never go wrong with drinking water. Players have various indicators to let them know when they have regained their hydration post-game. Sports drinks offer another source of recovery with their sugar-salt content. These are designed to replace the salts lost in sweat and sugars used for energy during exercise.

The players will be following these guidelines to prepare as best as they can for the upcoming fixtures.

ON 24th October 1964, fifty years ago yesterday, a Scottish goalkeeper made his Town debut in a Division Two fixture at Preston having joined the club from Celtic...

victory at Deepdale, he might still have been relatively happy, perhaps even relieved at the 2-1 defeat at the final whistle.

That's because Frank Haffey had gone down in history as the man who had conceded nine goals for his country when he kept goal for Scotland at Wembley in April 1961.

Joining Town on 9th October he had already made over 200 appearances for Celtic over a seven year period. His time at Parkhead was one in which the Bhoys were very much playing second fiddle to Rangers and Haffey was soon renowned as a 'keeper who could produce the odd howler.

From conceding a 40-yard lob in his trial match to kicking the ball into his net or letting it run through his legs, Frank was never far from a head-in-hands moment.

A broken ankle in November 1963 effectively brought the curtain down on his Celtic career when he was threatened with a reduction in wages through his inability to play. That seems pretty harsh and when Bert Head made an approach for the big 'keeper, he was south-bound. The fee was recorded as £7,650.

But after just four games and five months in Wiltshire, Frank had a disagreement with manager Head which led to him leaving Swindon. Three losses and not one clean sheet had presumably not impressed the boss and, never someone to do things by halves, Haffey decided the Gold Coast of Australia was far enough away.

Continuing his playing career with a couple of Aussie teams, he retired from playing at the age of 35 before his life took another unusual twist.

Frank took to the stage as a stand-up comedian and singer and appeared in a very successful TV series while still running a goalkeeping coaching school.

But back to his international record: Frank only made two appearances for his country and they both came against England in what was known then as the Home Championships, an annual tournament involving all the home nations.


The first was a creditable 1-1 draw at Hampden in April 1960 while the second came a year and a week later at Wembley.

Guess which one is best remembered? But to blame him entirely for the 9-3 loss was a tad unfair.


A hat-trick from Jimmy Greaves and braces from Bobby Smith and Johnny Haynes indicate how strong England were up front and, less than a month later another eight goals, this time without reply, were registered against Mexico at Wembley.

Scotland's goalscorers may seem a little familiar to Town supporters for managerial reasons. D MacKay got one (yes, that one), while the other two were scored by D Wilson (no, not that one).

The legacy of Frank's disastrous second international is well known. The music hall acts did a round of jokes at his expense, the most celebrated being: "What's the time? Almost ten past Haffey".

IN a fortnight's time, the Under-18 side will be travelling to Hampshire in another quest for success in the F.A. Youth Cup - 2014 being the 50th anniversary of Town reaching the final against Manchester United.

Their first venture into the competition came 62 years ago today, when they faced Dorset side Longfleet St Mary's in a Saturday morning kick-off at the County Ground.

The club was represented by the 'A' team which, in

1952/53, was competing in the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League for the first time.

Portsmouth-born Peter Guy - now 80 and living in Highworth - had the honour of scoring Town's first goal in the competition when he shot his side in front soon after half-time.

Apart from an early melee in front of the visitors goal, it was he who had come closest to netting for the home side when his effort in the closing minutes of the first period rolled along the bar before dropping behind instead of back into play

The Poole side had had a firsthalf effort ruled out for offside against Lockyer, but they drew level on the hour.

A shot from Prosser hit the hand of left-back Alan Goddard

- covering on the goal line
- and Stevens hit home the resultant penalty.

The previously unlucky Lockyer settled the issue with just eight minutes remaining, heading home a Rigley cross at the far post to make it 2-1.

But there was success for the reserve side. Running out after the Youth Cup game had finished, they came back from a goal down at the break to record a 2-1 victory over Leyton Orient. Derek Tilley and George Gray were the scorers.

FOOTNOTE:

Longfleet had provided the opposition for Swindon once previously, in an F.A. Cup 4th Qualifying Round tie back in November 1904. But on that occasion they were not as successful, going down 0-8!








COLCHESTER United made their 'debut' in the Football League - when the Third Division South was extended from 22 to 24 clubs. The Essex club provided Town with their first opponents of the season, while the away fixture was played at Layer Road eight days later, on Thursday 31 August. The first at The County Ground ended all square at 1-1, in front of 15,717. But Town went down heavily in the return, 1-4, conceding all four goals before the interval.




TRUST STFC BOARD MEMBER JOHN WARD...

ON Thursday 9th October, a service took place at St. Saviours Church in Old Town to mark the restoration and re-dedication of the grave of one of Swindon Town's longest and most faithful servants.



SAM Allen came to Swindon from West Bromwich to take up a job in the railways. He first became involved with Swindon Town Football Club when it was still an amateur organisation and went from being a committee member to a Director and then Club Secretary. He then took on the role of Manager or "getting the team up", as he termed it and guided the Town through one of the most successful periods in their history. As well as two FA Cup semi-final appearances, he also steered Swindon to two Southern League championships and took his team on tour to Argentina in



1912 and to Paris where they won the Dubonnet Cup. As a member of the Southern League Management committee, he was instrumental in the creation of Division Three South and would later serve on the Football League's Management Committee. After relinquishing his duties as team manager, he continued in his role of secretary until his death on New Year's Day in 1946. St. Saviours was packed for his funeral before he was laid to rest at Radnor Street cemetery. His grave has the words "Well

His grave has the words 'Well done thou good and faithful servant' inscribed on it, taken from the Biblical Parable of the lalents,

which was read out at the service of re-dedication. Club Historian, Dick Mattick, closed his address with the following words: "Let us hope that if, on some celestial playing field, the wonderful side he put together Skiller, Kay, Walker, Tout, Silto, Handley, Jefferson, Fleming, Wheatcroff, Bown and Bolland - and all the other Robins of that and other generations play together again, a seat of honour will be reserved in the eternal grandstand for Sam Allen; the good and faithful servant."























THE Academy have just completed the six and twelveweekly reviews with all of our players from Under-7s through to Under-18s and new contracts have been offered.





THESE reviews are very detailed with individual objectives set for each player. They discuss the following: 'in possession', 'out of possession', transition, social, psychological and physical. In the report, an education section is filled out by their schools along with their training minutes and their match minutes. In their review section, individual objectives regarding training are also discussed and noted. This is now enhancing the individual development with the players and staff highlighting the specific individual needs and objectives of every Academy player within the system.

Our day release programme has been going for a month which sees our Under-12s and Under-13s based at our Lydiard Academy training site where the



This will take place over three days and at the end of the week there will be additional games against Brighton so they will have a real good half-term programme. The Under-15s will be on training days and the Under-16s will be with the Under-18s.

Jayden Mitchell-Lawson, who is an Under-15, has extended his contract with Swindon Town to 2018. Jayden, who is from Basingstoke, has been at the club for a long time and has progressed and developed very well and we hope to see him progressing further in the years to come. Three more players that have extended their contracts are Jordan Young, Tommy Ouldridge and Jack Stanley who have signed deals until the end of 2017. Finally Lee Marshall has just signed a two year pro contract which will keep him at the club until 2016. It's great to see these players developing and we look forward to working with them in the future.







Awarm welcome to Tony Humes who brings his Colchester side to Swindon this afternoon fresh from their 2-1 victory against our high-riding rivals, Chesterfield, in midweek.

WHILST our own midweek defeat against Rochdale was disappointing, it is important at this relatively early stage in the season with just a quarter of the league programme completed, to keep everything in context. Yes, whilst the performance against Rochdale was certainly not our most impressive at The County Ground this season, our open attacking play conjured up enough goalscoring opportunities to have won the game. That we did not was down to the fact that defensively in and around our six-vard box we conceded three headed goals where our young players did not stay with their man, or switched off momentarily from the set-piece restarts which resulted in two of the goals. Word spreads quickly with rival managers sharing information from their previous encounters with us - just how do you combat our free-flowing, attacking play? Some opponents like Yeovil last weekend will try the strong-arm tactics thinking that they can bully our youngsters out of their stride, pressing our back-line high up the pitch. Others like Rochdale will be happy to drop off closing the space behind their defence and look to play counter-attack

fouled by an opponent who then escapes punishment as happened with James Hayter's foul on Yaser Kasim at Yeovil last Saturday. When your direct opponent is justly punished with a yellow card for foul play, then you gain the upper hand on him - he is treading a tightrope for the rest of the match. We will become more street-wise. Continuing on this theme it is (of course) important for our captain Nathan Thompson to stay out of the referee's notebook. He is too important a player to be missing through suspension again especially considering his inspirational form in the sweeper role this season.

The Rochdale game was our first defeat in ten we cannot expect to go throughout a whole season on silver wings and it is important that we react with another positive performance to this minor setback. Bristol City, Peterborough and Chesterfield also dropped points in midweek and when we look at the league table I note that alongside Bristol City and MK Dons, we are joint top-scorers at home with 15 goals scored and our goal difference of 10 is one of the best in the division. We have a potent strike-force with Andy Williams, Michael Smith and Jon Obika already amassing more than 20 goals between them with Nathan Byrne and Massimo Luongo creating an exceptional amount of chances for our front players.

Mark Cooper must take great credit for sticking with the attacking principles by never shackling any of our talented young individuals - it is surely the only way to succeed. Please get behind the players once again as we look to get back to winning ways this afternoon.

R&W looks ahead to Swindon's trip to the Proact Stadium.

SWINDON make their first ever visit to the Proact Stadium when they take on Chesterfield in their next away outing - a fixture that was rearranged due to international call-ups. The Spireites were promoted as champions from League 2 last season and have made a flying start to the new campaign in a higher division. The last meeting between the two sides was at Wembley Stadium in the final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy; the Derbyshire side coming out on top by two goals to nil on that occasion to lift the trophy. Nearly nine years have passed since Swindon have visited Chesterfield in a league game. In December 2005, it was Hameur Bouzza who earned Swindon a point in a 1-1 draw at Sattergate. Swindon will be hoping to halt a winless streak at Chesterfield that stretches back to 2002. On that day, a double from Danny Invincible, coupled with goals from Eric Sabin and Sam Parkin saw Swindon come away with a 4-2 victory. Town fans will recognise a familiar face in the Spireites' ranks in the form of Gary Roberts who spent the 2012/13 campaign with Swindon at The County Ground. During his time in Witshire, the winger made over 40 appearances in the famous red and white and bagged four goals including two stunning efforts at Tranmere that took Town top of League 1.




AFTER so long away from The County Ground, I had almost forgotten what it was like to meet two programme deadlines in the space of a week...
