Firstly a very warm welcome to all our visitors from Wiltshire for what I am sure will be a really exciting and noisy FA Cup tie. It is some years since we have played our nearest Football League rivals and it is a match that I am sure everyone is looking forward too. We are expecting a large away following as Swindon are very well supported and enjoying an excellent season to date.

The FA Cup is so important to all clubs, well apart perhaps from those in the Premier League. It represents a very real opportunity for clubs to make some much needed and unbudgeted revenue, revenue which can be the difference between a profit and a loss in the year end accounts, and that is certainly how it has been for us. Last year was a disaster - it really was - but the previous two years were a huge success, so who knows what this year will bring!

There has been much debate about the pricing for today's match which I don't propose debating here, suffice to say it was not an easy decision. I think as a club we have done exceedingly well to hold our match day prices for some years now while at the same time introducing free

admission for Under-11s.

But we have listened to fans and as a consequence have decided to slash our standing prices for the match against Wycombe Wanderers later this month, adults will pay £10 instead of £16 and concessions will pay £5 instead of £12.

Reducing prices like this is a huge gamble and unlike some clubs we cannot afford to take gambles very often. We reckon the price cut will cost us at least £2,000 (and it would have been considerably more if we had included seat prices as well), unless of course more people come to the game, and that is the test. Let's see if the football public in and around Cheltenham respond and, as fans, please do your best to promote this offer as widely as possible.

As I write these notes I am looking forward to the Fans' Forum on Thursday, no doubt there will be some tough and searching questions for Mark and I which is fine, lets hope we were able to give you full and frank responses.

It has been an excellent week off the field. We held a very positive meeting with Zurich who of course own our

training facility at Seasons, hopefully we will be making an announcement shortly about the outcome of those discussions.

We also had an excellent meeting with Cheltenham Borough Council about a potential land swap which would see the club gaining the current Cakebridge Place land, and a new access off the Prestbury Road and in return the Council gaining a similar sized piece of land at the Whaddon Road end of the car-park to build 16 new homes.

There are still 't's to be crossed and i's to be dotted but it really is an exciting opportunity for the club and a very good arrangement for the Council too. One thing we are insisting on is a continued pedestrian access from Whaddon Road.

So all in all it has been a busy and positive week, and the icing on the cake will be a win today and as we all know anything can happen in the FA Cup!

RAFFA RELISHING REUNION

Raffaele De Vita cannot wait to face former club Swindon Town this afternoon.

The skilful Italian spent two seasons at the County Ground, helping Paolo (i) Canio's men win the League Two title and knock Premier League opposition out of the FA Cup.

"I am very happy with the draw because I had two very good seasons at Swindon," De Vita said.

They are a really good League One side and it's a local derby, so it's a great one for us to look forward to.

There aren't many players left from my time, but I am sure I'll see a lot of familiar laces on the day."

De Vita joined Swindon from Scottish club Livingston in the summer of 2011 and his first season with the Wiltshire Robins turned out to be a truly memorable one.

"I came down from Scotland where I hadn't played in many exciting matches and the FA Cup was massive for us during our promotion season," he said.

"We ended Huddersfield's long unbeaten run with a 4-1 win in the first round and I managed to score our second goal that day.

"I was playing up front and we had a few injuries so the bench was full of kids. We battered them and it could have been more."

After knocking out Colchester United in the second round, Swindon's reward was a home tie against Wigan Athletic

"It was a sell out and the game was shown on Sky TV back in Italy, so it was the first time my family had a chance to see me play live on television," De Vita said.


"It was another magical game and even though we went 1-0 down, everyone knew we had

control of the game and to come back and win it 2-1 was unbelievable.

"Wigan had their full team out and we were in League Two, so that result gave us real confidence and we went on to win the title.

We had Leicester away in the fourth round, taking 6,000 tans there and playing really well, but lost 2-1.

"It was just a great season and nice to play in such big matches. The year after we got knocked out by Macclesfield, which wasn't so good!"

Eusebio Bancessi has returned to parent club Wolves after one month on loan at Cheltenham Town.



Cheltenham Town Ladies chairman Andy Liddle looks at the growth of women's football and the progress being made on and off the pitch by the Robins

England Ladies play at Wembley for the first time this month, against old rivals Germany and with more than two weeks to go, they are already guaranteed to have a larger crowd than England's men had for their last home game. Approaching 40,000 tickets have been snapped up.

Bristol Academy, our local Women's Super League club, host Barcelona in the last 16 of the Champions League.

But its not just the higher echelons of ladies football that is doing well, the game has been the fastest growing ladies' sport in the UK for some years now, growth that sees the game in good shape.

Everything starts to plateau at some point and as the legacy shadow of the 2012 Olympic games starts to lengthen, so we see that plateau effect start to kick in. What is important at a grassroots level, is that we seize upon that momentum.

The Robins Ladies are punching above their weight in this regard and have already become the home of choice for ladies football in the county.

Current holders of the Gloucestershire FA chartered standard club of the year award after tripling player number over the last three years - last season's double promotion success is testimony to that.

The Robins are right on the heels of Forest Green Rovers, who have held the bragging rights as the highest placed ladies team in the County in recent times and the gap is closing.

After last week's final qualifying

round 2-1 win in the FA Cup, we have drawn Exeter City at home in the first round proper, a stage of the competition we haven't achieved for the last five years.

Just like the Swindon game today, this is an eagerly awaited fixture against a side that has played in a higher league than us for a few seasons now and it's a challenge we are relishing.

It is an opportunity to see just how far we have come, that only the FA Cup with all its glorious history and upsets can provide. Exeter certainly won't fancy the trip up the M5.



Talented winger Jon Purdie's finest moment in a Robins shirt was a match-changing FA Cup first round cameo from the bench at St Albans in 1992.

Lindsay Parsons' team were trailing before Purdie won a penalty that was converted by Kevin Willetts.

Purdie then netted the winner to seal Cheltenham's passage into round two for the first time in almost 50 years.

It was all achieved while carrying an injury and the 47-year-old still looks back on that afternoon at Clarence Park with fond memories. "I remember having a decent run in the FA Cup during my second spell at Cheltenham," Purdie said.

"I was struggling with an ankle injury and had to start on the bench, but I went on with us 1-0 down and probably about half an hour to go.

"My ankle was heavily strapped up and I wasn't sure I could do myself justice, but I managed to win a penalty and then score myself, so I was an effective sub that day!


"It was a wet day and Jimmy Smith reached the byline, pulled it back and I slid and knocked it in from inside the six yard box."


Purdie's exploits set up a second round tie against AFC Bournemouth at Whaddon Road, which finished 1-1, with the Cherries winning the replay 3-0 at Dean Court.

"I played in the first Bournemouth game, but I missed the second as I was still struggling with the injury," Purdie said.

"Football is full of ups and downs like that and I didn't let it affect me too much because there was nothing I could do but wish the other lads all the best."

Purdie started his first spell with the Robins towards the end of the 1989-90 season. His arrival coincided with the departure of Andy Gray and Purdie was given a wide role in a re-shaped forward line for the closing months of the season.

Manager Jim Barron wanted to keep him for the following season but Purdie chose to join Worcester City, where he stayed for a year then followed manager Ally Robertson to Cheltenham in the summer of 1991.

He asked to be released in February 1993, switching to Kidderminster Harriers. He had made a total of 45 starts and 12 substitute appearances over his his two spells at Whaddon Road, scoring 14 times.

"I wasn't at Cheltenham for very long so only the hardcore fans will remember me, but I tried to do my bit," Purdie said.

There were a lot of good lads there and it's hard to pick one out, but Archie Howells probably stands out from my second spell, with the likes of Mark Buckland, Kevin Willetts, Steve Brooks and Mark Boyland the pick of the earlier one."

Purdie was a key member of the Kidderminster side that won the Conference championship in 1993-94 and he scored the goal that defeated Birmingham City in the FA Cup third round. He played alongside current Cheltenham boss Mark Yates at Aggborough.

Purdie left Kidderminster to take up the role of player-assistant manager at Telford and later appeared for Bromsgrove Rovers, Kidderminster, Worcester and Bilston Town.

After football he ran a successful telecommunications business. He is now a property developer and coaches Stourbridge's Under-18s, having previously managed AFC Wulfrunians, who he guided to the West Midlands Regional League Premier Division title.














CLUB HISTORIAN ARCHIVES TO BRING ROBINS SCRAPBOOK

EW HORDER

Sad news reached us this week concerning the death of former player and captain Leonard 'Lew' Horder, who passed away in Cheltenham at the age of 88.

Lew was one of the leading players at the club in the first half of the 1950s and spent most of his life in Cheltenham having joined the club at the age of 23 in 1949.

Born in Yate, Lew played junior football in a successful team at Iron Acton before leaving school at 15 and taking up an apprenticeship in the building trade. During the final years of World War Two and while still a teenager, he was sent to London to repair bomb damaged sites and returned to play for Iron Acton after the end of hostilities. Offered trials by Bristol Rovers, he spent time playing for their reserve side before taking up an invitation from manager Cynt Dean to join Cheltenham Town.

Lew joined Cheltenham Town as a teft-half and made his first team debut in that position against Colchester United in a Southern League match in September 1949. Alter a short while he was forced by injuries and player departures to play at left-back and made a great success of the move.

He remained as first choice in the position following the appointment of George Surrimerbee as manager and featured in a notable 4-2 win at Yeavil Town in the FA Cup fourth qualifying round before a crowd of over 8,000 that resulted in a trip to third division south Reading in round one.

Strong, consistent and tenacious in the tackle with a good steady temperament, Lew became captain in 1952 and continued to live in Bristol until moving to Cheltenham in 1954 when he got married. By then he was one of the more experienced players in the side and began to assist new manager Arch Anderson and trainer Dennis Barrett with training. Anderson described him as: "a really popular player who showed great determination and always gave his best."

Between 1950 and 1956 he missed only eight matches and also represented the Southern League in a representative game against the South West League in 1952-53. The following season he was granted a joint benefit match with Jock Sherlock, Horder's English XI taking on Sherlock's Scottish XI at Whaddon Road.

He finally departed the club at the end of the 1955-56 season after helping the team to reach its highest ever league position of runners-up in the Southern League. Despite offers to continue playing, Lew retired from football at the age of 29.

He continued to work in the construction industry in and around Cheltenham and even after retirement, he assisted local sporting institutions such as the East Glos Tennis Club and Whaddon Bowling Club with bits of building work. He retained a keen interest in sport and was present at both the 1966 World Cup and one of the legendary boxing matches between Henry Cooper and Cassius Clay.

Our thoughts go out to Lew's family and many friends at this sad time.



RANDOM FACTS



Today's match will be our 10th competitive meeting with Swindon Town (there have been eight league meetings and one in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy). To date we have won five games and lost two with two matches ending as draws.

Due to the close proximity of the two clubs there have been a number of friendly matches (we make it 16) dating back to the 1932-33 season.

Today's match is also Cheltenham Town's first home FA Cup tie since the televised third round match against Everton in January 2013.

It is our 36th appearance in the first round proper stage of the competition and our 282nd FA Cup tie overall since our first match, which was also against Wiltshire opposition in the shape of Chippenham Town on 4 October 1919.

THE FIRST TIME

The first competitive meeting between Cheltenham Town and Swindon Town took place on 17 September 2002 in League One. It was our first campaign at that level and a tough early season fixture list meant that the Robins had failed to win any of their opening eight games and had taken only three of the 24 points on offer.

They were overdue for a win and it finally arrived with

a Tuesday evening game against Swindon in front of a 5,761 crowd.


Spurred on by a noisy home crowd, Cheltenham played their best football of the season to date in the first half and took the lead through a deflected Hugh McAuley free-kick on the half hour mark.

Swindon's cause was not helped at the start of the second half when on-loan striker Sam Parkin was sent off for a late challenge on goalkeeper Steve Book and Cheltenham made the points safe on 65 minutes when Russell Milton sent a shot from the edge of the area beyond Dutch goalkeeper Bart Griemink.

The result doubled Cheltenham's points tally for the season but was not enough to move them off the bottom of the early season table as results elsewhere were unfavourable.


Further chances came and went after that as Cheltenham finished comfortable winners and will now travel to play Colchester United in the second round.


This middle section, which will house deceased players, will lie underneath a full sized replica of the football stadium, making a mockery of the lack of space available to Spurs for


Despite the £80k per year pay for those at the highest level, the men in neon need to kick back and relax, which is why it's understandable that Mark





HOW HAS THIS CAMPAIGN GONE SO FAR FOR SWINDON TOWN?

So far, this season has exceeded pretty much all expectations. In the summer, most fans, pundits and members of the media – myself included – were expecting a mediocre, middle-of-the-table, unexciting campaign or perhaps worse. However, Cooper's young charges have gelled ridiculously quickly, they've played some scintillating football and, having adopted the mantra of risk for reward, it's been edge-of-your-seat stuff, A play-off push seems possible and the dream of promotion is still alive.

HOW MUCH TRANSFER BUSINESS DID MARK COOPER UNDERTAKE DURING THE SUMMER?

Chairman Lee Power does pretty much all transfer business, putting together a squad which he then leaves to Cooper and assistant coach Luke Williams to mould. Power recruited astutely, though not particularly heavily. Jordan Turnbull and Jack Stephens arrived on loan from Southampton, Jon Obika for £200,000 from Tottenham, while Anton Rodgers joined the midfield having been a free agent. Compared to the previous summer, where the revolving door at the County Ground was spinning out of control, this was a

more considered window.

WHAT WERE THE PRE-SEASON EXPECTATIONS LIKE AMONG SUPPORTERS AT THE COUNTY GROUND?

Very modest. A young team was never expected to come together and play as expansive and attractive football as it does as quickly as it has. Supporters by and large would have been happy with safety by mid-March, even if it meant a season of relative boredom. In reality, it's been very different.

WHO HAVE BEEN THE TOP PERFORMERS THIS TERM AND WHO SHOULD CHELTENHAM LOOK OUT FOR AS SWINDON'S DANGERMEN?

Nathan Byrne has been the stand-out performer for Swindon from right wing-back. After being played a little out of position on the left last season, he's been consistently excellent in his preferred position this time around. Nimble feet, a turn of pace, a directness towards goal and a ridiculously good understanding with Massimo Luongo all add up to produce a very dangerous player indeed. Luongo himself is playing below his rightful level – he's a dynamic, intelligent, ball-playing midfielder who is now a regular Australian international. You'll also be hard-pressed

to find a player at League One level with as much quality on the ball as Yaser Kasim, while Wes Foderingham is one of the top-rated young English goalkeepers and Michael Smith is turning into a very prolific and rounded striker. Even then, it's doing a disservice to Nathan Thompson, Louis Thompson, Jon Obika and Andy Williams not to give them some kind of mention.

WHAT IS YOUR ALL-TIME FAVOURITE SWINDON TOWN FA CUP MEMORY?


When I was nine, in 1996, Southampton pitched up at the County Ground for a fifthround tie. The Saints were in the Premier League and Town top of League One (then Division Two).

Standing in the home end with my dad when Kevin Horlock put Swindon in front was brilliant. Gordon Watson's equaliser late on wasn't quite as fun.

A close second would be the victory over then-Premier League Wigan in 2012, when Town were a League Two side. Paul Benson scored the winner, Paolo Di Canio went nuts – when didn't he? Still, not quite as good as that Southampton occasion.

Mark Cooper was named Swindon Town manager in August 2013 after a spell in temporary charge.

He had previously served as assistant manager to former incumbent Kevin MacDonald and left his post as manager of AFC Telford United to link up with Town.

Cooper made over 400 appearances as a player in the 1990s and played for a host of league clubs including Birmingham City and Fulham.

In 2004, he made the jump into management with Tarnworth. He enjoyed some memorable runs in the FA Cup while in charge of the Lambs before he joined Kettering. He repeated his success in the FA Cup with the Poppies and guided them to the Conference North title. In 2009, he was appointed manager of Peterborough United.

Following his departure from London Road, he took the reins at Darlington and guided them to FA Trophy success at Wembley in 2011.

During his playing days, Cooper was in the Rushden and Diamonds team beaten 2-1 by Cheltenham in a dramatic top-ofthe-table Conference clash in April 1999.

GOALKEEPERS

WES FODERINGHAM

Came through the ranks at Fulham before moving to Crystal Palace. Initially joined Swindon on loan in 2012 and enjoyed a superb start to his Town career where he did not concede a goal in his first five games. A string of fine performances saw him earn a permanent contract in January 2012 and went on to help Town claim the League Two championship.

TYRELL BELFORD


Belford signed a deal with Town in the summer of 2013 following his release from Liverpool's Academy and provides cover for Wes Foderingham.

The defender is in his second loan spell at the County Ground having enjoyed a spell in Wiltshire at the end of the 2013/14 campaign, where he made 10 appearances. Stephens rejoined on transfer deadline day from Southampton.

JORDAN TURNBULL

Turnbull returned to Swindon on a season-long loan in the summer of 2014 from Southampton. The left-sided defender was on the books of the Swindon Academy before being snapped up by Saints.

DARREN WARD

After joining initially on loan from Millwall in the summer of 2012, the centre-back made his Town debut against local rivals Oxford United before penning a permanent deal in January 2012. He started his career as a youngster at Watford making 67 appearances, including a number of Premier League games before then Millwall boss Mark McGhee brought him to The Den in 2001. Ward moved to Crystal Palace in a £1.1m deal in the summer of 2005, before switching to Wolves.

RAPHAEL BRANCO

Formerly with the Academy at Brighton and Hove Albion, the Brazilian centre-half penned a deal with Town in the summer after a



successful trial period.

MATHEW JONES

The left full-back is a graduate of the youth Academy at Swindon, penning his first professional deal in the summer of 2014. Mathew is the son of former Swindon player, Tom.

CURTIS DA COSTA

Another graduate from the Academy who put pen to paper on his first professional forms with the club in the summer.

HARRY TOFFOLO

A former FA Youth Cup winner with Norwich City, the young defender is currently on loan at The County Ground from the Canaries for an initial month.

AMARI'I BELL

The left-sided defender is on loan from Birmingham City and made his Town debut in the 3-0 win at Barnsley.

MIDFIELDERS MASSIMO LUONGO

Joined Swindon from Tottenham on a season-long loan last summer before completing a permanent move just before transfer deadline day. Part of the Socceroos squad at the 2014 World Cup in Brazil, the third player in Swindon history to represent his country on the biggest stage.

RYAN HARLEY

Experienced midfielder who joined Town in July 2013 after his release from



Brighton. Made his name with Exeter City before securing a move to Swansea City. From there he moved east to Brighton and had a spell on loan at MK Dons in the latter part of the 2012/13 campaign.

The versatile youngster, who can play in defence or in midfield, penned a one-year deal with Swindon at the start of the 2013/14 campaign. Barthram had previously played with Tottenham's youth team before his release in the summer.

After a brief spell on loan at the County Ground in 2011, Obika is now back in





WHO ARE YA?

This afternoon we welcome local rivals Swindon Town to Whaddon Road for the tenth meeting between the two sides, and the first ever in the FA Cup.

Our first Football League meeting against the Wiltshire Robins was on September 17th 2002, at Whaddon Road in the old Division Two. In front of a crowd of 5,761, goals either side of half-time from Hugh McAuley and Russell Milton saw Cheltenham run out comfortable winners as Swindon's Sam Parkin saw red.

The return fixture saw the Robins go one better, as Martin Devaney and John Brough struck in the first-half, before a stoppage time Damian Spencer wonder goal saw Graham Allner's men return to Gloucestershire victorious.

Four years later, Swindon fravelled to Whaddon Road for the next league meeting between the two sides, as Ashley Vincent's late goal cancelled out Blair Sturrock's first-half strike in August 2007.

Less than two months later, we travelled to the County Ground for a Johnstone's Paint Trophy 2nd round tie, in which Sturrock again netted. This time, however, Jennison Myrie-Williams and Craig Reid were on target for Cheltenham, as a Ben Tozer own-goal capped off an impressive 3-1 win.

Sadly, the League fixture in the Cotswolds later that season was less profitable, as 6,483 supporters saw Simon Cox, Billy Paynter, and Christian Roberts secure a convincing 3-0 Swindon success.

We recorded an impressive four out of six points against today's visitors the following season, as goals from Ben Gill and again Myrie-Williams ensured three points at Whaddon Road.

The return fixture was an equally pulsating affair, as an Elvis Hammond brace gave the then bottomof-the-table Robins a huge lift, cancelling out goals from Hal Robson-Kanu and former Cheltenham loanee Kevin Amankwaah.

We last faced Swindon here at Whaddon Road on August 13th 2011, in a game that saw us secure the first win of our famous 'Wembley season', thanks to Steve Elliott's second-half header. Current Cheitenham winger Raffaele De Vita started for the visitors that day.

The most recent meeting between the two sides came later that season, in a pivotal top-of-the-table clash. In front of more than 10,000 fans at the County Ground, Darryt Duffy missed a first-half penalty for Cheltenham, before Paul Benson struck to maintain his side's place at the top of League One.

Supporters will remember Paolo Di Cario's somewhat over-exuberant celebration in front of the away end, as Swindon went on to win the League, and we were unsuccessful in the Play-Offs. Hopefully we can get our revenge this afternoon!

MEMORABLE MEETING

Cheltenham Town 1-0 Swindon Town August 13th 2011

In an exciting afternoon of football, Mark Yates' Cheltenham secured an impressive three points in their opening home game of the 2011/12 campaign against Swindon Town.

The match had been initially postponed because of safety concerns before a U-turn from the police allowed it to go ahead, as Mark Yates' men were widely written-off ahead of the fixture.

The visitors made the better start, as Alan McCormack hit the post; however Cheltenham, cheered on by nearly 4,000 home supporters soon look control of the game.

Central-half Steve Elliott headed home early in the second-half to send Whaddon Road into delirium, as a commendable defensive effort saw the Robins survive an inevitable Swindon onstaught.

Striker Jimmy Spencer saw red for a late elbow, however Yates' men held on, as Cheltenham ran out winners and Di Canio suffered his first defeat as Swindon boss.

PLAYED FOR BOTH

Michael Pook - Midfielder Pook made 109 appearances in a Swindon Town shirt between 2003 and 2009, scoring thrice. He then switched to Whaddon Road, making 64 appearances, and wearing the captain's armband in the 2011/12 season. Currently playing for Chippenham Town.

Paul Benson - Journeyman Benson joined Swindon from Charlton Athletic in 2012, scoring 12 important goals in 31 appearances, firing the Robins into League One. He joined Chellenham on loan in the 2012-2013 season, scoring four in 16. Currently playing for Luton.

Steve Book - Cheltenham Town legend and goalkeeping coach Book made 207 appearances between 1997 and 2004, helping the Robins achieve and cement their Football League status. He made four appearances for today's visitors. Now coach at Cheltenham Town.



WHY THE FA CUP WILL NEVER GO OUT OF FASHION

While reading about the FA Cup on the internet recently, an article struck a chord with me. It was about the rise and fall of a player who was brought into the limelight via the FA Cup several years ago. Playing for a non-league side, he scored several goals taking his team to the third round where his side Yeading, were eventually knocked out by Newcastle United. This got him noticed and he was rewarded with a move to League One club Brentford.

Years later, he featured in the Championship and the Premier League, but can be found these days playing for free at non-League Maidenhead United (at time of writing). DJ Campbell is a striker desperately trying to resurrect his love for the game, and once again the FA Cup could have been the platform to leapfrog him back into the football league.

His story of being arrested for alleged match fixing, then later being cleared, has tarnished his career. So he now finds himself playing in the Conference South under his former Yeading manager; Johnson Hippolyte, who openly said 'I want the FA Cup to get him a move back to the football league'. Campbell found the net on his Maidenhead debut, ironically in the FA Cup, scoring in a 4-0 defeat of Faversham Town.

But it was the visit to Gosport Borough which ended any hopes of a recurring dream for Campbell as the home side comfortably saw off United by three goals to nil. Borough now have another home tie against League One Colchester United. If only...

Unlike other players' stones, Campbell's is one of rarity. Here is a player who owes almost his entire career to the exposure, the enchantment of the FA Cup. And a decade later, there was hope, perhaps expectation, that this competition could again be the catalyst that would reignite Campbell's vocation.

It didn't happen. But there was the hope, the endless possibilities that most non-league/lower league players feel when they are gearing up for an FA Cup match. I don't doubt that the majority go out there wanting to win for their current team, to help the club, to please the fans. But the metaphonical carrol dangles twice as tempting. The prize of facing a Premier League side, appearing on television and perhaps most enticing; provoking a move to a bigger club.

Many footballers are picked up off the back of turning in fantastic Cup performances. Look no further than former Cheltenham youth trainee Matt Smith whose goalscoring exploits for Oldham earned him a move to Leeds United. It's even easier to be spotted in this day and age as there is more media coverage than ever before, more at stake, more sides looking to spot an undiscovered gern. Back when (L) Campbell was tree scoring for Yeading, teams weren't as keen on taking a punt on an unknown.

CLICHES

Every season we hear the same phrases associated with different teams. The banana-skin, the giant killers, the minnows. But when the rewards can be so great, the phrasing never gets old. Very

few teams in the draw at this stage actually believe they can win the Cup, there hasn't been a winner outside the top division since 1980. But teams with less resources have shown they can at least have a successful run and take a few 'scalps' on the way.

It is always said how football has no room for sentiment, yet there is so much of it which surrounds this effervescent competition. The history, the classic finals, the upsets from yesteryear will always contribute to make each season's FA Cup a nostalgic affair. It's the one time in football where we are all allowed to be sentimental.

The financial reward of these games can act as a saviour or indeed as Cheltenham found last year, a real restriction. The defeat to Tamworth had a real impact on our season for various reasons. So as much as the FA Cup can lift your domestic season, it can seriously derail or indeed reiterate the reality of how the current season looks to be panning out.

Reading Campbell's story highlights how to use another clichel one can go from rags to riches, back to rags with the never diminishing hope of returning riches. Professionally rather than financially.

But failing to catch the eye of another club doesn't subtract from the sparkle of the Cup for most players I'm sure. And managers, especially outside of the Premier League never lose that hunger for a Cup run. So it's no surprise that the magic of the FA Cup could still be the spark for DJ Campbell, even at the age of 32. After all, there's always next year.

HOW PLEASANTLY SURPRISED HAVE YOU BEEN WITH WYCOMBE WANDERERS' SUPERB START TO THE SEASON?

It's been great to watch after last season, when Wycombe would often struggle to manage an on-target shot, never mind score a goal. I thought they would improve on last season but it would probably take time for the team to consolidate and rebuild, but everything's fallen into place really quickly and Wycombe have been playing some good attacking football.

WHAT HAS BEEN THE KEY TO THE TURNAROUND AFTER LAST YEAR'S BATTLE AGAINST THE DROP?

It was all change in the summer - 10 players were released and a similar number were signed. After a season of struggle last year manager Gareth Ainsworth felt the only way to improve was to implement a complete squad overhaul in the summer, and that's a strategy that's paid off. He took time to identify who to bring in, and news of each signing was met with a positive reaction from fans.

In simple terms, the defence has tightened up considerably - they have one of the best goals against records in the whole of the Football League - and they're finding goals a lot easier to come by.

WHAT WERE PRE-SEASON EXPECTATIONS LIKE AT ADAMS PARK?

After last season most fans were hoping for a nice quiet season of mid table obscurity, and Ainsworth has continually said this year his aim is simply to avoid relegation. With such a big turnaround in personnel people naturally expected the team to take time to gel and for results to be fairly inconsistent, but the transition has been seamless and they look like they've been playing together for years.

WHO HAVE BEEN THE STAND-OUT PERFORMERS SO FAR THIS TERM AND WHO SHOULD ROBINS FANS LOOK OUT FOR?

Peter Murphy is definitely the one to keep an eye on. Scoring goals from midfield was a major problem for Wycombe last season and, at the time of writing, the former Accrington man already has seven to his name. That makes him joint top scorer alongside Paul Hayes, who is another one to watch out for. Their goals have been a big factor behind Wycombe's good start - last year's top scorer only managed nine in the whole of the campaign.

HOW HAS SIDO JOMBATI FARED SINCE HIS MOVE FROM CHELTENHAM TOWN?

He's been in outstanding form since day one and most Wycombe fans think Cheltenham have made a big mistake in letting him go.

He's gelled seamlessly with the rest of the back four and formed a formidable unit alongside Aaron Pierre, Alfie Mawson and Joe Jacobson. I can't think of an opposing winger who's got the better of him, and his forward runs have been a key part of Wycombe's attack.

DO YOU THINK WYCOMBE CAN MAINTAIN THEIR POSITION AT THE TOP OF THE TABLE, BASED ON THE OPENING THREE MONTHS OF THE SEASON?

That depends on whether they can avoid suspensions and injuries. The squad is very small, with Ainsworth deciding to go with quality over quantity, and while that policy has worked so far they could be in trouble if they're struck down by a lengthy injury list. But it's no fluke they are where they are - nobody's outplayed them so far this season. I don't see why they can't stay at the top end of the table for the rest of the season.
