
Walsall were in the lower reaches of League One and we hadn't tasted League success since mid-October, whilst our visitors had suffered only one defeat in their previous 15 and were second in the table.

There were very few chances for either side in a somewhat tense first half but O'Donnell had to be alert to tip over an effort from Mat Sadler.

After the interval, Alex Nicholls curled in a shot from the edge of the area which struck the bar but Wednesday took the lead on the hour-mark when Ryan Lowe headed home Chris Lines cross.

Chris O'Grady then had a great chance to double our visitors lead but somehow missed from 12 yards.

Just when it seemed Walsall were going to endure another home disappointment, a Christmas cracker was delivered by substitute. Claude Gnakpa, in the first minute of time added on thanks to a deflected shot from 25 yards. Then three minutes later when a draw seemed on the cards, Manny Smith became the unlikely match winner finding the corner of the net from 12 yards to give our fans the perfect Christmas present.

EVENTS

CHRISTMAS time 1988 was not a merry one for Walsall manager, Tommy Coakley, who was sacked the day after the Boxing Day 5-1 home defeat to Oxford United.

This was the 11th consecutive defeat for his team - ten in the League and one in the Simod Cup - and it was deemed that enough was enough as under his management that season we had only won twice in the second division in 22 outings and were anchored at the bottom of the table with just 14 points.

It was a far cry from just a few short months previously when Coakley became the club's first manager to take us to the dizzy heights of second-tier football for 25 years following our play-off Final replay victory over Bristol City.

After his dismissal, the Scot cited the inevitable departure of star striker, David Kelly to West Ham as the main reason for his team failing to come to terms with life in the higher division.


Coakley's two and-a-half years in the Fellows Park hot-seat had been eventful, just as the events behind-the-scenes had been over this period. He and coach, Gerry Sweeney, had been unveiled on Terry Ramsden's takeover day in August 1986, but League form at the start of the adventure had been poor.

Results did improve thereafter that season to the extent that six wins on the bounce by the end of April almost fired the team in the play-offs, whilst in the FA Cup we reached the fifth round before going out in a second replay to then top-flight Watford.

1987-88 saw that remarkable season which culminated in the already-mentioned promotion, but after a steady enough start to the following campaign, it soon emerged that it was to be a season

As the defeats piled up, so did the pressure on the manager and at the end of his penultimate game in charge-a 2-1 defeat at Bournemouth - the emotional scenes of manager and players embracing each other suggested he was soon to be on his way.

He received the dreaded vote of confidence following a board meeting, only for his time to be finally up after that Boxing Day debacle.

THERE'S always a very special atmosphere at Boxing Day fixtures here at Banks's Stadium and this afternoon is likely to be no different as we welcome a Swindon Town outfit who can be pleased with the progress that they have made during first half of the season.

GOOD afternoon and welcome back to Banks's Stadium for our Boxing Day home game against high-flying Swindon Town. We welcome our visitors and wish them a safe journey home afterwards.

As 2014 comes to an end I'd like to focus on a few of the highlights of the calendar

January 1st is as good a place to start as any and on that day we faced Sheffield United in an entertaining New Year's Day clash, which was won by a rare lames Chambers strike as the team came from behind to get the year off to a flying start.

Unbeaten in lanuary, the month was rounded off with an emphatic 5-1 away win at Notts County on a day when the heavens opened and, in all honesty, on the pitch it could have been 12 as a rampant forward line created chance after chance, epitomised by a Febian Brandy first half hattrick.

However, it wasn't all plain sailing as we only showed brief glimpses of brilliance thereafter in the run in to the end of the 2013-14 season - a 2-0 away win at Bradford City and a 1-0 home win against our longtime rivals, Shrewsbury Town probably being the results that stand out.

Impressive performances against Doncaster Rovers, Notts County (again), Fleetwood Town and, most recently, Barnsley have propelled the team into the top half of the table and within four points of the coveted play-off places with all still to play for in the second half of the season.

The emergence of youngsters Amadou Bakayoko, Liam Kinsella, Rico Henry and Reece Flanagan onto the first-team stage has once again reinforced the pivotal and vital role that the club's Academy plays in our overall success.

The goals of Tom Bradshaw so far this

season have been crucial as has the key contributions from the likes of lames and Adam Chambers, Richard O'Donnell, Sam Mantom, Andy Taylor, Paul Downing and Romaine Sawyers amongst others over the calendar year.

The continuation of our football philosophy has also been important and even when we have been through 'sticky' patches the belief and commitment to this has never waned.

The Johnstone's Paint Trophy run has, of course, captured the imagination of Saddlers young and old as we 'dare to dream' of a first-ever Wembley appearance in March. However, there is the not insignificant obstacle in our way in the form of the aforementioned PNE who provide our Area Final opposition over two legs, the first leg live in front of the Sky Sports TV cameras away at Deepdale on Wednesday 7th lanuary and the second leg at home on Wednesday, 4th February.

There is much to look forward to but for now, on behalf of all of the Directors, players and staff at the club, I would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New

Remembering the first concert on Bescot pitch.

2015 is going to be a big year for Banks's Stadium. It seems rather appropriate that the 25th Anniversary of the stadium opening will be marked by a summer concert from the legend that is Elton John as he performs here on June 13th.

But whilst there have been a long line of talented footballers grace the turf over the past quarter-of-a-century, there has only ever been one previous outdoor concert take place here and that came back in 1991 when The Wonder Stuff took centre stage.

The band, whose roots were here in the West Midlands, were riding the crest of a wave at the time; they had their third album out and the first single from that, 'The Size of a Cow', had reached number five in the charts.

This was the first time that they had headlined a stadium show and 18,000 people came along to see them.

"We had been allowed access to the stadium the day before the gig to set up and I must admit that I had been a little nervous about filling such a huge empty space with an atmosphere of a rock gig," said lead singer, Miles Hunt. "I needn't have worried as our audience poured in and brought with them the best party atmosphere that I had ever encountered.

"I guess the average age of the crowd was around 18 to 22; it was an unusual event to have in the area and I got the sense that they felt the day belonged to them.

"My over-riding memory of the day was the weather! It wasn't just a bit of rain we were in for, but very high winds too. This was a particular annoyance as we had invested in quite a spectacular stage set including a three-storey high inflatable Elvis and a track that ran the whole way around our lighting truss from which there should have been suspended various components of our 'Never Loved Elvis' album cover; a massive cake, an American-



style police car, a jet, dancing girls... But we couldn't use any of it as the winds would have brought it all crashing down!

"Just a couple of weeks prior to the gig I had met Vic Reeves and Bob Mortimer who I invited to come to Bescot to host the day's events; it had been a loose arrangement and come the morning of the gig, I had no idea whether they were even going to show up. Thankfully just before we opened the gates to the stadium they showed up on two Triumph motorbikes, somewhat hung-over from a night out in Manchester with the members of New Order!

"The stadium was excellent as a venue and all the staff were incredibly helpful and friendly. At a guess I would imagine that most of them had no idea who The Wonder Stuff were, but simply because it was such a different event to host there meant that everyone was keen to help out in any way that they could and this contributed to making it such a great day.

"After the gig had finished, we were allowed to have an aftershow party in the Boardroom – it was a party that went on for some time as I recall!

*Even though we had to battle with the weather, we all agreed that it had been a successful day.

"It was the first time that we had done such a gig here in the UK. We had the great pleasure of opening shows for the likes of Faith No More and INXS over in Austria and Germany; we were pretty low on the bill at those shows, so the excitement was in no way compatible to what we experienced at Bescot. Also those European stadiums were bigger than Bescot, so even when the headliners performed the atmosphere didn't match what we had experienced in Walsall.

"Bescot was the perfect size to capture the excitement; there was no need for huge screens for the audience to enjoy the show as it was happening right there in easy reach."

Hunt admits that he was never 'caught by the football bug'. "I've always had my head firmly fixated in music," he added. "The same could be said about the rest of the band, apart, maybe, from guitarist, Malc Treece, who was a Manchester United fan.

"As a result I've never been back to the stadium since, but every time I pass on the M6 motorway, my heart is filled with pride that we once managed to put a gig on your turf. I do have a great sense of pride that we did that, particularly as I lived in Chuckery in 1989.

"Walsall holds a special place in my heart, I had great times there. There were two independent record shops and a couple of pubs that had a great music crowd keeping their bars busy.

"I've always been surprised that no other bands have played at the stadium as our day was such a success, but I suppose secretly I have been proud that we have been the only ones. "To know that Elton John is now set to play the stadium during the summer, I'm not at all disappointed to know that we will no longer be the only musicians to hold such a high accolade. Elton is one of the biggest stars in the word, I'm thrilled that your stadium has been chosen to host his show and it's a nice feeling to know that only The Wonder Stuff and Elton John have been lucky enough to perform at Bescot - so far..."

Part of the crowd that day was current Saddlers' boss, Dean Smith. He was a key member of the Walsall back-line in those days and also a fan of The Wonder Stuff.

"I was well into my indie music at the time, and still am," he said.

"Me and a group of mates at school use to go to various places locally and when we heard that The Wonder Stuff were coming to Bescot Stadium, we snapped up some tickets straight away!

"It was a bit surreal watching them from the pitch that I played on, but it was great fun.

"My over-riding memory was of the rain that lashed down, even though it was supposed to be the summer time... typical British weather!

"It failed to dampen the atmosphere, though, and it was a great gig. I can recall Vic Reeves and Bob Mortimer being on stage to introduce the band and that also added to the occasion.

"Now all these years later, I'll be attending the next gig here with my wife in the summer when Elton John takes to the pitch.

"I have to admit that it's not my type of music, but he is such a fantastic entertainer and it will be great to have such a world-renowned artist here at Walsall FC."

"Playing alongside Kevin Wilson helped improve my game beyond recognition," said the Bermudan International without hesitation. "We built up such a good understanding and complemented each others' game so well. "We ended up scoring almost half-a-century of goals between us in that promotion season alone, which was a real highlight for me and something that I still look back on with great fondness.

"I had some very happy days at the club and still enjoy coming along and seeing some old faces when I am in the UK these days."



THE BRITPOPS TORY

THE MAJORITY of the Britpop bands that we all know and love were inspired heavily by the mod and garage rock groups of the 1960s.

Most famously, Oasis were cited with ripping off The Beatles, while Blur credited The Kinks with some of their inspiration.

Additionally, the influence of the post-punk groups could be heard in many of the Britoop groups ranging from Suede to Marion.

The Verve and Lush were originally shoe-gaze bands but as the '90s progressed, they adopted a more pop-friendly sound giving us such Britpop classics as 'Bittersweet Symphony' and 'Single Girl'.

The video for The Verve's Bittersweet Symphony is a timeless classic. It was directed by Walter A. Stern and sees Ashcroft lipsynching the song as he struts down a busy North London street, refusing to change his stride or direction, oblivious to what is going on around him.

There is once instance when he is forced to stop for a moving car, but he repeatedly bumps into passers-by and even jumps onto the bonnet of another car that has to stop for him.

At the end of the video, the rest of the group join him and they are seen walking off into the distance. This then leads into the beginning of the video for The Drugs Don't Work.

The video was nominated for a number of awards before a parody was later released for England's 1998 World Cup song, Vindaloo.








"Wigan included a lot of experience in their side and they stepped up a gear as we became somewhat disjointed.


"That said, it was a good lesson for us today and we'll hopefully take things on board from it.




"We got a little bit sloppy at the back end of the second-half but that is to do with tiredness, I can deal with people being tired when they put that sort of work





DRAKE'S WORLD OF SPORT

IT'S CHRISTMASI as my mate, Noddy Holder, once said. So, for today's match, I thought I'd deliver a bit of a festive offering for you that is almost completely plagiarised from my fellow stadium-announcers around the country.



I've trawled through BBC Sport Online's archive of 'Stadium Announcements of the Week' to find my favourites in this now-defunct Fun and Games column.

A bane of announcers everywhere is car park announcements; lights left on, windows left open, fire exits blocked, or – such as during our game against Barnsley earlier this month – an engine left running!

The Wycombe Wanderers announcer had an unusual car park-related announcement to deal with: "Would the owner of the Vauxhall, registration number xxx, please report to the nearest steward as you have left the hand brake off and it has rolled into the car behind you."

This was swiftly followed by: "Would the owner of the Ford Fiesta, registration number xxx, please also report to the nearest steward as yours is the one that has been hit."

Car park-related announcements are often ignored – especially if the announcement is about a vehicle parked where it shouldn't be. This Gillingham announcement had an unusual twist on this theme: "This is for the owner of the Land Rover that moved his car from Chicago Avenue earlier because it was blocking a drive; it is now causing an obstruction in Sunnymead Avenue, so MOVE IT. Now. For the second time today. Thanks."

Smoking has been banned in public buildings since 2007; but some people still don't get the message so it is necessary to spell out the obvious. The Bristol Rovers announcer had some fun with this one: "Smoking is banned in the stadium but if you are desperate ask a steward for a nicotine patch."

If you're looking for real humour in nonsmoking announcements, you have to go to the old home of Colchester United where the announcer was becoming increasingly dangerous with his threats to wrongdoers: "There is a no-smoking policy at Layer Road. Anyone caught smoking will be taken to a darkened room, where they will be imprisoned for 27 hours and forced to listen to Will Young records for all of that time. Thank you."

In similar announcements around that time, he threatened smokers with being hung from the floodlights, being electrocuted, and being buried up to their necks in the centre circle during half-time where they'd remain for the second half.

Floodlights, of course, are of no help when it comes to fog; and the Radcliffe Borough announcer certainly needed help during one foggy spell: "In the event of the second half being played, if you hear cheers down the other side of the pitch or near the dugouts, could the manager please ring my mobile. The fog is stopping me from doing my job."

The Galway announcer couldn't use the weather as an excuse when he fogged up this announcement: "Please could all the players get into position five minutes before the end of the game... er, sorry, I meant the stewards."

Talking of players' positions, the Crawley announcer was pushing his luck with this cheeky jibe: "It finishes Crawley Town 2, Woking 2. Be sure to tune in to the Blue Square Premier Review on Setanta next week to see how far offside Woking's first goal was!"

We're all used to David Bathurst's infamous 'now, now' whenever we cheer a particularly bad result for our orange and black neighbours; but some announcers take great delight in pointing out their rivals' scores.

Take this moment of glee from the Chelsea announcer: "And a big round of applause for Hull City. Tottenham nil, Hull City one. Tottenham nil, Hull City one. Tottenham nil, Hull City one. Thank you very much."

Sometimes the announcements don't even excite the announcers. The Yeovil Town announcer wasn't impressed with this set of half-time results: "Man United 1, Blackburn 0; Sunderland 0, Arsenal 0; West Brom 0, Fulham 0; Wigan 0, Middlesbrough 0. That'll make for interesting watching on Match of the Day tonight."

I finish with some from here at the Banks's. A number of my quips made it onto the BBC's Stadium Announcements of the Week list. Amongst them, in a match against Leyton Orient: "I'm a big fan of the Orient; but I prefer Pye Green Cantonese because they do a bostin' Singapore Fried Rice".

I couldn't resist announcing that "Elvis has left the building" as Cheltenham Town replaced Elvis Hammond; or that it was "All change at Crewe" as the Alex made all three subs in one go.

But my favourite is one delivered, I think, two seasons in a row by my colleague, David Bathurst, who, at this time of year, announced that "The next match here at the Banks's Stadium is on New Year's Day, which this year falls on January 1st."

Except, of course, it doesn't! Our "New Year's Day match' this year is on 3rd January as we welcome Coventry City here to the Banks's!



ALAN BUCKLEY & BERNIE WRIGHT

The Buckley-Wright Partnership (duration: 1973-1977 - 156 games, 119 goals)

ALAN Buckley and Bernie Wright were paired together for the first time in the opening game of the 1973-74 season, which ended with defeat at Wrexham, but four days later the Alan Buckley legend was born with the 6-1 demolition of Shrewsbury in the league Cup and Bernie Wright was certainly instrumental in 'Buck' scoring his hat trick.

The two players were the classic combination with the little poacher feeding off the tall, robust centre forward and in their first season together they scored 19 goals between them in 34 games and did even better during 1974-75 by scoring 35 times in 48 matches.

The latter was one of our most successful seasons since the war and Doug Fraser's side reached the fifth round of the FA Cup with Buckley and Wright outstanding in those thrilling victories over Manchester United and Newcastle.

There were no Cup runs during the 1975-76 campaign to excite the fans, but with a forward line that contained not only Buckley and Wright but also George Andrews and Miah Denehy, Walsall missed out on promotion by just six points.

Alan Buckley and Bernie Wright were at times unplayable, netting 46 goals between them in 47 appearances and they continued in the same goalscoring vein during the first half of the 1976-77 season until Wright moved to Bradford City less than a month after we had come close to beating Manchester United in an FA Cup third round tie at Old Trafford.

Alan Buckley (born 1951) Apps: 483. Goals: 202

Alan Buckley was born in Mansfield in 1951 and from the moment he announced his arrival with a hat-trick against Shrewsbury Town in a League Cup tie in 1973, he won a host of admirers.

As a striker he had few equals and it is not surprising that he is one of a handful of players to have won the Player of the Season Award twice, doing so in 1973-74 and 1975-76.

He was pivotal in the FA Cup runs of 1975 and 1978, which saw Doug Fraser's team beat sides of the quality of Manchester United, Newcastle United and Leicester City, and his contribution to The Saddlers during the 1970s was

202 goals in almost 500 firstteam appearances, 20-plus League goals in five successive seasons, hat-tricks in all three major competitions and four goals in a 5-1 victory over Rotherham are statistics which require no embellishment.

That this diminutive goalscorer should become such a capable football manager took most people by surprise, however, but in a managerial career which spanned 30 years and over 1,000 matches, he experienced far more highs than

He enjoyed no fewer than four separate spells as manager of Walsall FC between 1978 and 1986 and achieved instant promotion back to Division Three in 1980.

Buckley then worked in tandem with Neil Martin for a time before regaining full control in May 1982 and attracting many plaudits for his commitment to attacking football.

In the course of the next four years The Saddlers won many friends but we were unable to achieve promotion to the secondtier and despite the kudos of an incredible League Cup run to the semi-final in 1983-84, Buckley found himself unceremoniously sacked by Terry Ramsden in June

He drifted into non-League football but he revived his reputation at Kettering and returned to The Football league with Grimsby Town, leading The Mariners as they rose from Division Four to Division Two with successive promotions between 1988 and 1990.

His love affair with the Grimsby public even exceeded his cult status at Walsall and he managed Grimsby on two further occasions.

Buckley also achieved moderate success with Lincoln City and Rochdale and whilst he was less successful in a three-year spell at The Hawthorns, which ended in 1997, he has the distinction of being one of only 14 managers to reach 1,000 matches in charge of a Football League club.

Unfortunately he is the only one never to be given the opportunity to manage a team in the top-flight.

Bernie Wright (born 1952) Apps: 196. Goals: 48

Bernie Wright was born in Birmingham in 1952 and played his early football with Paget Rangers before signing for Walsall FC in

He impressed the home crowd by scoring on his debut against Port Vale in the October, but no-one could have predicted that less than six months later he would be playing for one of the biggest football clubs in England.

Everton took a gamble and paid £50,000 for the burly striker who had made just 15 starts in the League for The Saddlers, purely on the basis of his spirited performance against them in an FA Cup fourth round tie at Goodison Park.

The young man appeared to have the world at his feet and it seemed only a matter of time before he would follow Allan Clarke along the path to stardom, but after being with The Toffees for only 11 months, and having made just 11 appearances, he had his contract terminated for 'serious misconduct'.

The rags to riches story was over but Bernie 'The Bolt' Wright returned to Fellows Park and went on to have four great seasons in his second spell, scoring a further 38 goals in 152 games.

Wright was an uncomplicated striker of the old school, but despite his brash demeanour, and somewhat dishevelled appearance (he usually sported a full beard and wild mane of hair), he was a much

better footballer than many people gave him

He certainly justified his move to Bradford City in 1976 by helping The Bantams win promotion from Division Four and his final move to Vale Park two years later was equally successful.

Port Vale paid £9,000 for his services in 1978 and he went on to terrorise opposition defences. After scoring on his debut, he rapidly became a firm terrace favourite, endearing himself to the home crowd with a hat-trick against local rivals, Crewe Alexandra.

He finished the season as the club's Player of the Year and top scorer and started the next season where he had left off before falling out with new manager, John McGrath.

Wright left the club in May 1980 after scoring 23 goals in 76 appearances and subsequently drifted into non-League football, playing for Kidderminster Harriers, Trowbridge Town, Cheltenham Town, Worcester City and Gloucester City.

After retiring from playing he worked as a forklift operator earning his licence at the same company his dad worked for. The one-time legendary hard man in football maintained his interest in the game by qualifying as a referee and once again surprised his critics by officiating successfully in the Central Warwickshire Sunday Leagues.
















































WE WELCOME everyone connected to Swindon Town to Banks's Stadium afternoon.



Founded in 1879, the club became professional in 1894 and joined the newly-formed Southern League. The 1910-11 season saw Swindon Town win the Southern League Championship, earning them a Charity Shield match with Football League Champions, Manchester United. That game was played at Stamford Bridge with United winning 8-4.

Swindon entered The Football League in 1920 as a founding member of Division Three and defeated Luton Town 9-1 in their first game of the season, a result that still stands as a club record in League matches.

The club was almost disbanded after World War II and made little impression in the League before gaining promotion into the second division, as runners-up to Northampton Town in 1963.

The club was relegated back into Division Three in 1965 but better times were just around the corner.

The 1968-69 season saw Swindon defeat Arsenal at Wembley Stadium to win the League Cup before securing promotion to the second division.

League Cup success earned the club its first invitations to European competitions, but they were not eligible to participate because they played in the then third division, so, as compensation, they were entered into the 1969 Anglo-Italian League Cup and the 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup, winning both.

Swindon were relegated to the fourth division in 1982 before recovering to gain promotion as Champions in 1986, achieving a Football League record of 102 points in a season. A year later they won the third division play-offs to achieve a second

successive promotion.

The Robins were second division play-off winners in the 1989-90 season, but later admitted 36 charges of breaching League rules and were denied promotion.

They beat Leicester City 4-3 in the 1992-93 Division One Play-Off Final to achieve promotion to the Premier League. They were relegated the following season, after recording only five wins and conceding 100 goals, in their only season in the top-flight to

A year later Swindon were relegated for the second consecutive time and slipped into Division Two. They got back into Division One at their first attempt, winning the Division Two Championship in 1995-96.

They were again relegated into Division Two after finishing bottom of Division One in the 1999-2000 season as their yo-yo existence continued.

The club has been beset by financial difficulties throughout its recent history, having been placed into administration twice and twice fighting off winding-up orders over unpaid tax. Swindon became the first-ever former Premier League team to be relegated to the lowest Football League division after being relegated from League One in 2006.

Paul Sturrock guided Swindon back to League One in his first season with the club. earning the third automatic promotion place in a 1-1 draw with The Saddlers in the last game of the 2006-07 season as we celebrated taking the League Two title at the

The 2010-11 season ended with Swindon being relegated to League Two but they bounced back as Champions the following season and have played in League One for the last few years.

This term they have secured some impressive results as they find themselves in amongst the leading pack.

RECENT FORM

Three wins from four League games in September lifted Swindon to third place in the table going into October.

League Two Cheltenham Town thrashed a ten-man Swindon in the FA Cup first round last month but they quickly put that upset behind them with victory over table-toppers Bristol City a week later.

They followed that up with a victory at Peterborough to move within one point of League leaders, Bristol City.

The Robins ended November with a late winner against Fleetwood Town to record their fourth straight League win and a fifth consecutive League One victory was to

follow a couple of weeks ago with a 3-0 win over ten-man Notts County.

Andy Williams gave the visitors an early lead with a low driven shot following good work by Massimo Luongo. Williams doubled Swindon's advantage after half-time from close range, converting a magnificent cross from Ben Gladwin for his 11th League goal of the season. Notts County midfielder, Liam Noble, was then sent off for an elbow on Nathan Thompson before Luongo completed their sixth away league victory of the season with a neat finish from six yards out.

AT THE HELM

Mark Cooper followed his father Terry into football, starting his career with Bristol City in

During a 22-year playing career he was at 17 clubs, including three on loan and two spells at Exeter City. He played 457 League games, during which time he scored 115 goals, with his five-year spell at non-League, Tamworth, being his longest at any club.

Cooper joined Tamworth as a player in May 2002 and at the start of the 2003-04 season he was appointed player/assistant manager, moving up to manager for the 2004-05 season.

During his time as Tamworth manager, Cooper managed to get them into the third round of the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons. Tamworth's League form did not, however, match their cup exploits. Cooper left Tamworth by mutual consent in January 2007 with the club bottom of the Conference table.

The following season he guided Kettering Town to the Conference North title with a margin of 17 points, the in the 2008-09 season Kettering reached the FA Cup fourth round and finished eighth in the Conference.

In November 2009 Cooper become Darren Ferguson's successor as manager of then Championship side, Peterborough United, but was sacked in February 2010 after only one win in 13 games.

Cooper was named Darlington manager in June 2010, finishing the season seventh in the League and beating Mansfield Town 1-0 at Wembley to win the 2011 FA Trophy Final. He was sacked in October 2011 and was appointed manager at AFC Telford United in January 2013.

After just five games in charge he was appointed assistant to new Swindon Town manager and former Saddlers' midfielder, Kevin Macdonald, taking over as manager when Macdonald resigned in the summer of

THE IMPOSING **'KEEPER**

Wes Foderingham Goalkeeper



Commanding stopper Foderingham came through the youth academy with Fulham before securing a move to Crystal Palace.

He initially joined the Robins on loan in 2012 and made an emphatic start to his temporary spell where he didn't concede a goal in five games.

In lanuary of 2012 and after a series of sparkling performance the club signed him permanently. He went on to help the club secure the League Two title and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in his first season at the County Ground producing several top class performances along the way.

He was then ever-present at the Robins secured a place in the League One play-offs during the 2012/13 season and he was subsequently rewarded with a new contract with the club.

THE BURLY **CENTRE HALF**

Nathan Thompson Defender



Right-back Thompson is now a first-team regular having come through the youth academy at the County Ground.

He made his debut during the 2012/13 season, and the toughtackling defender was a regular in the starting XI as the club made the League One play-offs.

Since that point he has been a permanent fixture in the Robins back four and he has won the Player of the Year award on no fewer than two occasions.

The 23 year-old ended last season with the captain's armband and will skipper the club again during the 2014/15 season.

He is the older brother of Louis who is now back at the club on a loan spell having been transferred to Norwich on transfer deadline day.

THE FLAMBOYANT **AUSSIE**

Massimo Luongo Midfielder



Australian midfielder Luongo initially joined the Robins on a season-long loan last summer before making the move permanent.

He spent time on loan at the club during the 2012/13 season and his performances earned him rave reviews and established him as a firm fan favourite.

One of the stylish midfielder many fans is Australian International coach, Ange Postecoglou who decided to include Luongo in his 2014 World Cup Squad in Brazil.

In doing so he became the third Swindon Town player in history to represent his country on the biggest stage.

The 21 year-old, who is predicted to have a bright future in the game, also had a loan spell with Ipswich Town earlier on in his career where he played nine times for the Portman Road outfit.

THE TARGET MAN

Michael Smith Striker



Smith signed for the Robins from Charlton Athletic in January 2014 and made an instant impact by scoring twice on his debut against Shrewsbury Town.

The powerful front man started his career at the renowned Wallsend Boys Club before signing professional terms at nearby Darlington.

At the Quakers he scored six goals in 37 appearances before moving to the Valley in 2011, failing to make a first team appearance.

He was subject to several loan spells whilst on the Addicks' books, most notably at AFC Wimbledon where he netted nine times in 23 appearances.

Smith has been in scintillating form this campaign and has netted 11 goals as the club lie second in the league.

THE EXPERIENCED **GOAL-GETTER**

Andy Williams Striker



The former Bristol Rovers and Hereford United striker is currently productively rebuilding his career with the Robins after a series of injuries.

He signed on at the County Ground in 2012 after an impressive season in front of goal for Yeovil Town during the 2011/12 season.

In his first season with the Robins he netted 11 times before the first injury struck and he is now in the process of rebuilding a glowing reputation at League One level.

He went on loan to Yeovil at the back end of last season to regain some match fitness and made nine appearances for the







The Christmas Day truce marked a widespread ceasefire across the Western front between German and British troops.

Young men who had been fighting for months on end dared to venture into no man's land to exchange food and souvenirs. There were joint burial ceremonies and prisoner swaps, while several meetings ended in carol-singing.

But the most iconic image of the truce is one of which is still

being debated today.

The football game. Two warring factions swapped their bayonets for balls to engage in a common fondness for the beautiful game.

Dozens of men openly congregating in daylight to have a kick about is regarded today as the most symbolic moment of peace and humanity amidst one of the most violent events of human history.

As you might imagine, the sporadic fixtures were a far cry from what we will witness today. In one instance members of the Lancashire Fusiliers had a game where the ball was a tin of bully beef! And I'm not sure playing surface would have been perfect

It's an incredible story, some say too incredible to be true but a century on and football still unites people across the world.

It provides a common ground for strangers. An ice-breaker for conversation.

People of all ethnicities, ages, backgrounds and classes come together to do battle in the right way, through a good old game of football.

And through all this, football remains their release valve. A temporary escape from the harsh realities of daily life.
