GOOD afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for the second time this week. With the recent amount of home fixtures it feels like I haven't stopped penning Captain's notes and, at this rate, we'll be at the end of the season before we know it...

AT the time of writing these notes (before the Gillingham game) I would like to start by recognising the support we received on our recent travels to Crewe. It was incredible. You were vocal and encouraging throughout and although you weren't rewarded with three points, every member of the team commented how positively you affected their performance – so thank you.

We are getting to the stage in the season where it's down to the team who can take the proverbial bull by its horns to decide who will stake a claim on automatic promotion. If we can work together as fans and players, I'm sure we can return to form and be the ones to pull away from the pack.

Reflecting on the Crewe game and it was encouraging to get back to keeping a clean sheet. At times, our defence has been seen as 'vulnerable' which, considering only three teams have conceded fewer goals than us, I rightly (or maybe because I'm biased) see this as unfair. We only allowed Crewe one or two shots on goal and as a team we were well organised. We've learned that teams become most susceptible to conceding a goal when they're attacking and with our style of play, we start our attacks from

crosses that come into our box. With my role, if I'm able to control a cross and start a counter attack, it's often the window of opportunity for us to attack when all 11 opposition players are not camped behind the ball.

In addition to the clean sheet,

we were able to dominate possession and create those numerous chances. Although we weren't able to execute our chances, it was pleasing to return to former ways and this breeds confidence. I have no doubt if we continue in this way, we will soon string a run of results together and we'll be the ones grabbing that proverbial bull's horns.

The point I'd like to leave you on is one of perspective. Last season, with a more experienced squad, we finished the season on 66 points. We currently sit on 61 points with 13 games remaining. While I understand we have become victims of our own success, it's also important to understand how much this young team has progressed – and this season is by no means over. With one point separating second, third and fourth, there's everything to play for and we will do just that – that I can promise you.

LAST TIME OUT...

INTRODUCING THE MAGPIES



COUNTY arrive at SN1 today seeking points to pull away from the League 1 drop zone, having narrowly avoided relegation last time out...

CHRIS Kiwomya's men started the 2013/14 campaign in poor form, picking up a solitary point from their opening seven league games. Progress was made in the Capital One Cup, however, with a 3-2 success over Fleetwood - largely thanks to the performance of Celtic loanee, Callum McGregor - earning the Magpies a money-spinning tie at Anfield, where they fell to an agonising 4-2 loss (AET), having drawn level from being two down at half-time. Things seemed to be going well in the domestic cups, as narrow victories over Burton Albion and Wolves, the latter via a shoot-out lottery, saw them reach round three of the JPT. After a first league victory against Tranmere was followed up by one win in six, leaving the team adrift at the bottom of the table, the club parted ways with Kiwomya at the end of October.

Managerial life didn't get off to the best of starts for County old boy, Shaun Derry, as he suffered an FA Cup First Round exit to League 2, Hartlepool. The club's league form was also still suffering; taking

six games to earn Derry's first win, while his seventh - a 4-0 trouncing of Colchester - netted the club their first away success since April. The New Year heralded a run of four wins in seven, with comprehensive victories over Bradford and Coventry propelling the team out of the relegation zone for the first time since October.

After picking up 19 points from their last ten fixtures (including a 2-0 win over Town at Meadow Lane) the Nottingham side emulated their 'Great Escape' from the 2001/02 season, finishing 20th.

This term, County have experienced a season of two halves as they have won just three times since the turn of 2015 after being previously unbeaten in eleven during September and October. First round exits in both the League and FA Cup were more than bettered by an Area Semi-Final appearance in the JPT. After Tuesday's key 'six-pointer' with Colchester, the Magpies occupy 18th place in the League 1 standings.

SCOUTING REPORT



NOTTS County's main problem has been scoring goals this term, as they have notched twice in a game on just two occasions since October. Only eight of their current squad have hit the back of the net all season, with just four of those having registered on the scoresheet more than once. Midfielder, Garry Thompson is the club's leading scorer with 10, while he also leads the way in assists for the side and will prove to be a threat going forward this afternoon, playing from his position on the wing or even in an unorthodox centre-forward role.

Shaun Derry has primarily

invested in planting experience into the backbone of the team, with ex-Bradford duo Jones and Thompson linking up with former top-flight mainstays, Carroll and Mullins. These four alone have racked up nearly 1500 professional appearances between them, leaving the side well equipped to contest their crucial survival run-in.

The hardworking midfield engine room will be key to County's performance in containing Town and feeding the ball through to the young legs of their frontline with ex-Carlisle man, Liam Noble adding to the 'non-stop' willingness of Messrs Jones and Thompson. The Nottinghamshire

side are at ease in moving the ball along the ground but, with their strengths lying in midfield dynamism, can equally look to anticipate the balls in from the wing and catch opposition defenders napping. At the opposite end of the pitch, the defence can become a little 'stand-offish' when coming up against pace so, if Town can come out of the traps as they did against Bradford recently, there are gaps for them to exploit.

The Magpies have won just twice in their last ten visits to Wiltshire, stretching back to the last century, while Town are looking to claim their first league double over Notts for 11 years.

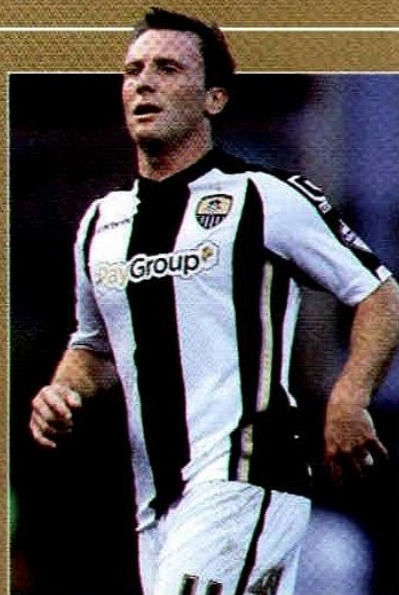
06 Haydn Hollis DF

During four years at Glanford Park, he made over a century of appearances before making the move to Bradford. Has enjoyed promotions with all three of his former clubs.

THE giant Hungarian striker caused a social media storm when he arrived at Meadow Lane on loan from Ipswich, as the Notts County Facebook page became inundated with messages from Hungarian supporters. The 24-year old started his career at Borussia Dortmund making just one appearance. In the summer of 2014, he put pen to paper on a deal with Ipswich and has gone on to make a handful of appearances for the Tractor Boys. Joined Notts on loan in January.

Let's start with the Asian Cup. You've said before how proud you were to have represented your country on such a big stage...

It was a very proud moment. I really enjoyed the month going out on the pitch wearing the Iraqi shirt. It's unbelievable and a great experience so I was very proud and my family were very proud, which is amazing.

It must have been a complete culture change going from League 1 to the heat and humidity of an international tournament?

It was quite a bit different - different opposition and different tactics, different styles of play. I'm very accustomed to the way we play at Swindon and the way we pass the ball so it was different but with the pressure and atmosphere you have to show what you can do, so it was very important that I personally brought my game out and that made me very happy. It was a very good

feeling scoring considering it was the first game. It was like a final for us because of the way the group was shaped up with Japan and Palestine so scoring against Jordan was a great feeling for sure and very important.

Then you were back and straight in against Barnsley. Were you pleased to be back?

Yeah, I was pleased to be back and playing the way we play here. It was a bit surreal with that atmosphere (at the Asian Cup) then you're back here - it's quite a bit different. Obviously with the weather too but it was important to get that win against Barnsley. I was happy that we got the win.

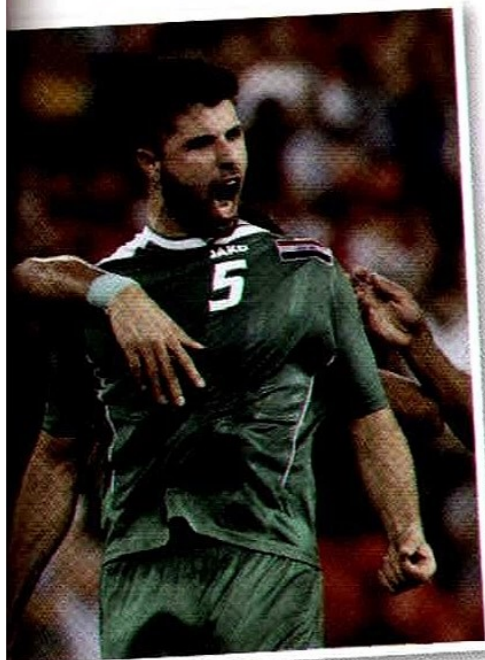
Let's go back even further before that - Swindon have had a remarkable season so far haven't they?

Pre-season was different. We went away and I've never been to an army camp so that was interesting. When we played

the first game and in the week leading up to that first game I think we embedded some very important issues. We did some really good training and it showed from the first game how we were going to play against teams. Scunthorpe had no idea and we outplayed them. Now, we're getting different situations where teams come up against us and just want to counter so we've got to problem solve. With the training and the way we play I think we can do very well in this league. The boys have the confidence just to go out there and enjoy it and get the wins.

What's been your stand-out moment so far?

There have been a lot of stand-out moments but I've got to say Sheffield United at home. The way we got pressed then outplayed them. If it wasn't for a shaky ten minutes where they got back to 3-2 I think that showed how our style of play is so important to this club because we outplayed them



- Wes was fantastic, the back three were great - that match was an outstanding moment. Jon Obika's goal was very good because we had so many passes leading up to it. That game just calmed the nerves of supporters and sent out a big message. It took the heart out of Sheffield United that day.

You've scored a couple of free-kicks using different techniques - talk us through the way you hit them...

It depends how the wall is shaped up and where the goalkeeper is but I try to develop different techniques in training - both right and left-footed. Maybe one day I'll score with my left; that will be nice! Obviously, practise makes perfect and hopefully I can get a few more.

Players obviously have a more dominant foot so it's quite unusual that you're working on technique with both feet...

Personally I have a make-up where I can do everything on the same side. From a young age you play with one foot but I've always decided to try my best with both feet and get my left foot - which is technically my weaker foot - as competent as the right so free kicks is just one of a number of things I work

on with both feet. Free kicks help your passing, the strength in your legs and it's enjoyable - taking them with my left foot is enjoyable and it will help me progress technically in my career, for sure.

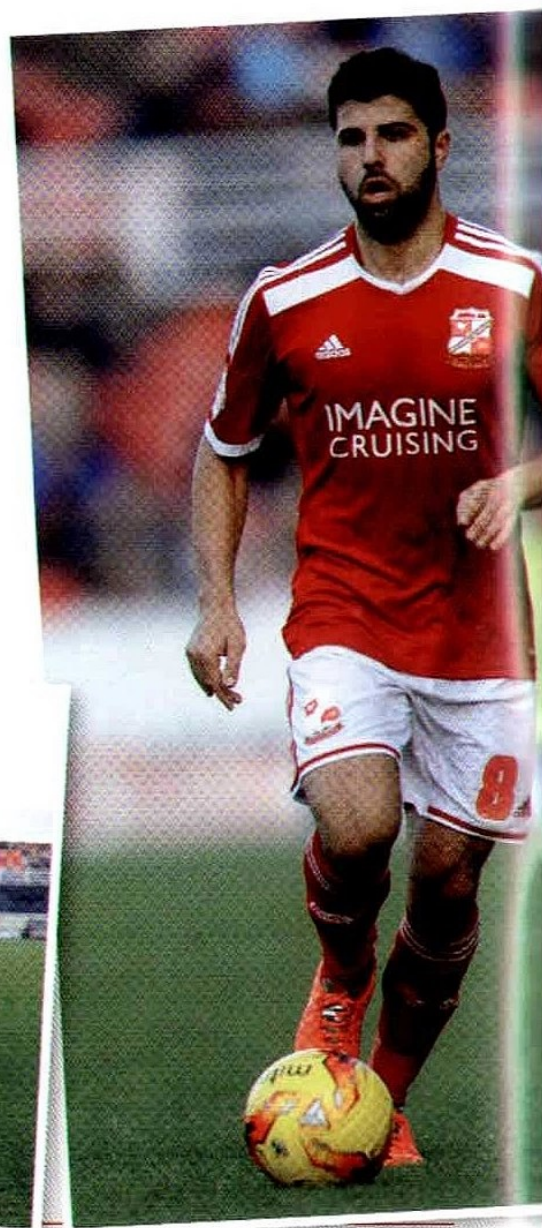
How much have you enjoyed playing in this particular Swindon side and style this season?

We started off well and obviously we had a run of games where the results weren't there to show for it, which is fair enough because I didn't think we got to that level previously but it's enjoyable when things click. It's very enjoyable because we work hard on the training ground to do the right things so when it comes onto the pitch it's basically problem solving and that's the enjoyable aspect. It really comes down to problem solving - you come up against a set of players and you have to break them down, that's what we're facing.

You must be looking forward to the rest of the season now, though?

I'm looking forward to the end of the season because if we go on a little bit of a run where we calm our nerves and enjoy our game, there's no stopping us. Just talking about it gives me a good feeling that we can achieve something special - this is a chance to go up but we also have to enjoy the remaining games and play the way we've always been playing, with the style of play and the problem solving and everything will click, so I'm really looking forward to the next 13 games or so.

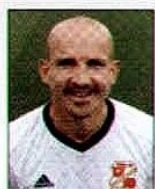

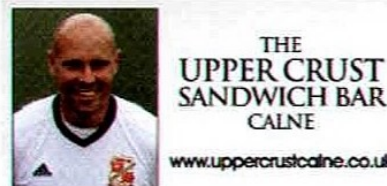

AS you all know from previous notes, I'm heavily into my stats and they seem to be popular with BBC Wiltshire's Shaun Hodgetts who likes to quote them on the radio (so a little bird tells me) so here's a few more for you Shaun...

OUR style of play means Wes is heavily involved, with the ball often going back to him. He starts the play or switches the play. At the start of the season all pitches are in excellent condition making this slightly easier. We are quite fortunate at The County Ground as Marcus Cassidy delivers an excellent surface for us to perform on. Unfortunately, the same can't be said at every ground we go to and this can have an impact on how we play and how careful at times we have to be.

At the time of writing these notes, Wes has dealt with 835 back passes in 36 games at an average of 23 per game. The highest amount of back passes Wes has dealt with in a game was Leyton Orient away where he clocked up 44 and from one of these started the attack which led to one of our goals. Up to Christmas he was averaging 25 back passes per game but since Christmas that has gone down to 18 and I feel the state of some of the pitches has a part to play in this. Last Saturday, Wes dealt with the lowest amount of backpasses in a game all season - just 7. The pitch at Crewe was basically compacted mud with very little grass and the mud soon kicked up as soon as the game got underway. This made it extremely difficult to play our style of football on so the players had to adapt their game slightly and be more careful about what areas of the pitch they tried to play and pass in.

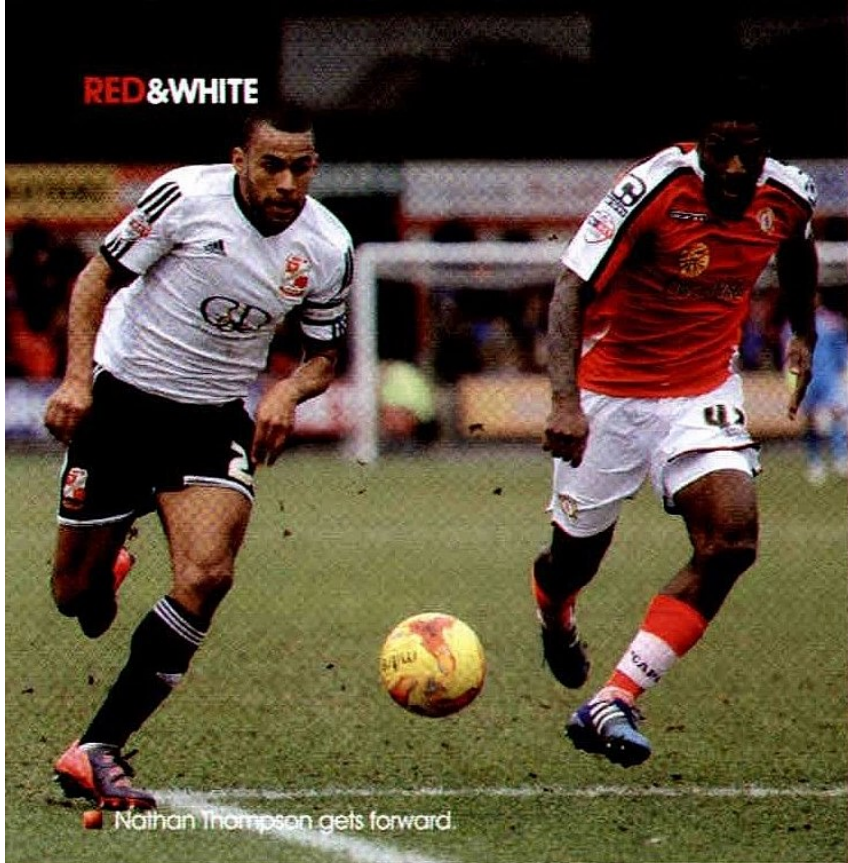


At this time of year I have to start looking at who will be our scholar goalkeepers in the youth team for next season. Connor Johns our current first year will be into his second year and, despite a recent injury setting him back, he has done well this season spending time out on loan in senior football and doing well along with some good performances in training with the first team. I then have to assess our current Under-16 goalkeeper and also look at options outside of the club to see if there is a better option externally before deciding. We get many CVs and recommendations and we have recently looked at two boys from Australia, one from Italy and are currently looking at one who is being released from West Ham. I look at them in the goalkeeping sessions we do, within the youth team training and I also use them in the small-sided games and

shooting practices with the first team to see how they cope with that. Then we try and play them in a couple of games to see how they do in match situations. I have my views but also get the opinions of both Wes and Tyrell who train with them and some of the outfield players along with other members of coaching staff. Within the game, height appears to be a big factor in choices with some clubs and coaches. A lot seem to want 6ft 4 goalkeepers. It's not the be-all and end-all for me as both Wes and Tyrell are not giants; both are around 6ft 1 but both are good goalkeepers. The way we play at Swindon means they have to be comfortable with the ball at their feet and sometimes the 'giants' struggle to manipulate the ball well.

THERE aren't too many clubs who have an ex-professional footballer heading up the boardroom but here at The County Ground our own Lee Power is one of those exceptions....

LEE enjoyed a decade's worth of football playing career, signing as a professional at Norwich City in July 1990 and taking himself to Scotland, to Plymouth and most points in between.

London-born Lee also played a record 13 times for the Republic of Ireland U21 side and, like Andy Townsend, another graduate of the Norwich City ranks who went on to represent the Republic of Ireland, it was perhaps not an obvious international link to make bearing in mind the duo's accents.

Lee was still a trainee when he made his debut for Norwich at Aston Villa in April 1990, and he became the youngest player to score twice in a Division One match for City, registering a couple against QPR six months later.

Chances were limited at Carrow Road due to the plethora of striking talent coming through the ranks and loan spells at Charlton, Sunderland and Portsmouth soon indicated Lee's readiness to tour the country in pursuit of football.

A fee of £200,000 took him to Bradford City in 1994 but this time illness reduced his first team chances, and it was in July 1995 that a move to Peterborough brought about the only two occasions that Lee faced Town.

Neither would have left our

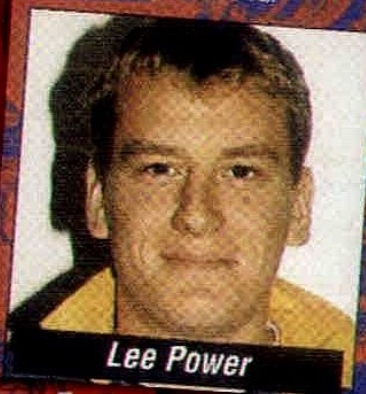
chairman with particularly good memories.

On 5th March 1996 he lined up against Swindon at London Road in a Division Two fixture.

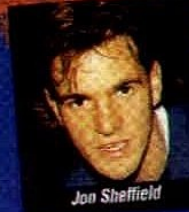
Under the Spotlight

Goalkeeper Jon Sheffield needs no introduction to the County Ground.

Jon arrived at London Road last summer following a transfer from Cambridge United and made his first debut on the opening day of the season, a 3-1 home win over Brighton. Since then he has been the only ever present in the Peterborough United lineup.

The popular goalkeeper had played at London Road in Division Two colours in a friendly match a couple of seasons ago when playing for Cambridge United on loan.

Born and bred in Haverhill, Jon was an avid Coventry City fan as a kid and went to moved at the 'goalkeeping' skills of Jim Blyth. He played in goal for his school and the county and was sought

after by Coventry, Ipswich Town and Norwich City. He chose to sign professional terms with Norwich because they had the best goalkeeper - Clive Woodward. Woodward was a great influence on the young hopeful but when he left, Jon was still too young to put on

the jersey and Bryan Gunn was signed. Jon did get one outing in the old First Division however, when Gunn was suspended. Jon was 19 and played well in a 2-2 draw against Aston Villa.

To gain experience he was loaned to Abingdon and was very successful in two three month spells in Hants, clocking up 28 Fourth Division appearances before eventually transferring to Cambridge United on a free transfer in the summer of 1991.

Went on loan to Colchester United before John Gorman brought him to Swindon on loan in 1994. Jon played in two Championship games for us, a 1-0 defeat at Aston Villa (13-9-94) and the 3-3 home draw with Norwich City. Incidentally Jon's big hobby is driving - rather appropriate for a goalkeeper!

that year drew to a close, then when manager Jim Duffy moved on to Hibernian, Power briefly followed the boss before moving once more, this time to Ayr United in

March 1998.

So, after his next move took him 500 miles south to Plymouth, Lee then tried a sort of 'halfway house' by joining Halifax Town at the start of 1999.

After suffering two broken legs during his career, Lee's retirement from the pitch at the young age of 28 while with Boston United was sadly premature.

But before joining the Board here at Swindon he used his copious football knowledge at boardroom level at Cambridge United and Rushden and Diamonds.

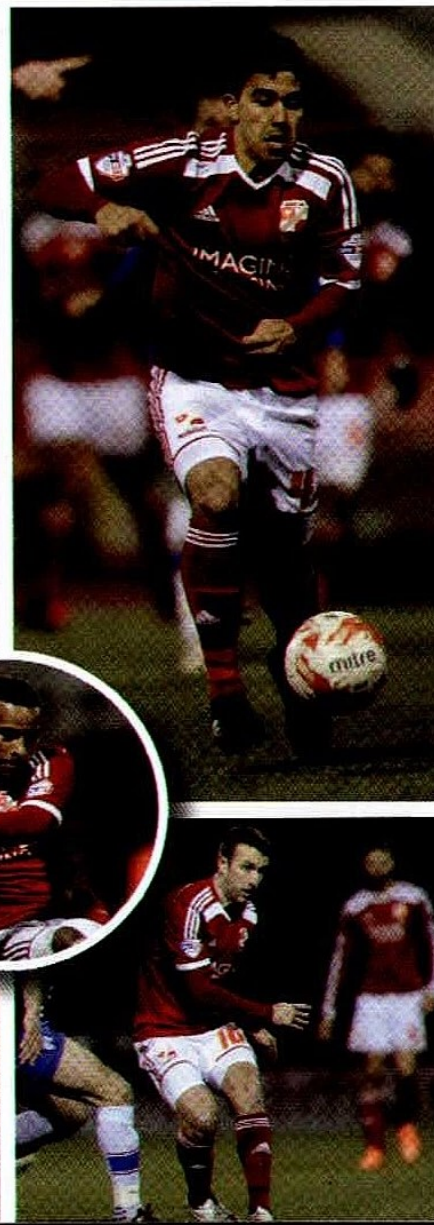

50s In focus

R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

TOWN had been without a home game for a month when they faced Palace in a Division Three South fixture in the first week of March 1950. But they had managed maximum points from three away trips during February, registering wins at Orient, Newport and Watford.

In that month the south London club had not conceded a goal, but two in as many minutes from Town half an hour into the game hit Palace hard after they had been handed an early lead.

Swindon struck again before the interval and were good value for a 4-2 victory.

A moment of misfortune led to Fred Kurz opening the scoring for the visitors. With big centre-half 'Garth' Hudson off the field recovering from a heavy tackle, Harry Kaye dropped back to cover. He took his eye off the ball and it went under his foot allowing Kurz to run through and fire past Sam Burton.

The Palace number nine went close to increasing his

side's advantage when he again beat the keeper but his effort crashed against the crossbar. But Town quickly responded when Andy Cowie's free-kick was flicked on by Maurice Owen for Roy Onslow to hit a first time shot past Dick Graham and in off a post.

And they edged in front from another free-kick barely a minute later. Jimmy Bain swung the ball in from the left and Tommy Dawson beat the keeper to head the ball home.

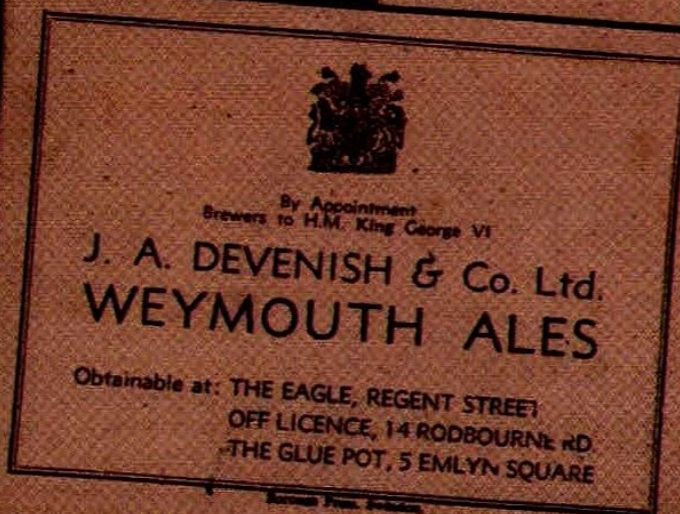

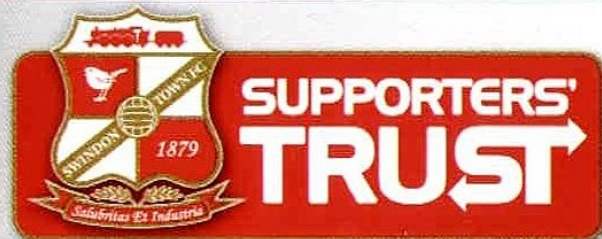

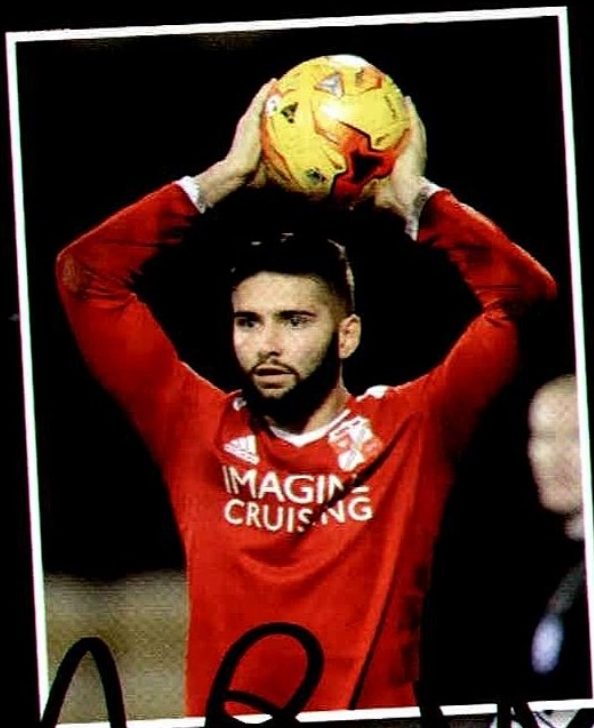

Town ran out 3-0 winners when they played at Notts County earlier this season but Turnbull believes that the Magpies will make life difficult for Swindon this afternoon.

"That was a great game," he said. "Everyone performed really well that day but we know it's going to be tough. They're going to come here and make it hard for us but - as I've said - the performances have been up there and, hopefully, we can perform well again and get the three points."

THERE is a lot of player movement at the moment in the Academy as we're looking at players throughout the age groups...

IT'S this time of year that we start to move a lot of our players up and that has a knock-on effect from the Under-18s all the way down. The 18s are coming to the stage where we have to make decisions about their futures so myself, Scott, the Boss and Luke will sit down and go through who we're looking to offer contracts to. The 16s have, near enough, been done now which then has a knock-on effect on the 15s squad and so forth. We now start moving the better players up and we start challenging them within their own personal development, so it's a busy procedure making sure that the better players are playing up a level. Elsewhere, the Day Release Programme is going really well and we have some exciting games coming up: on 17th March, the Under-13s go to Manchester United and the week after that, both the 12s and 13s will go up to Liverpool so that's exciting for us. That actually starts off our two-week annual tour to the Netherlands so that's another thing we're looking forward to. When we come back, it's decision time for the Academy players. We sit down with the coaches, go through their contracts and see whether we're going to retain the players or unfortunately release them. It's the most horrible part of the job but you've got to be true to the player and the club in making sure that you try and make the right decisions. Football's about opinions so our decision will be



based on this moment in time and our opinion on whether we think the player is going to be good enough the following year, regardless of age and hopefully fulfil their potential. This process is ongoing in their review system that goes on throughout the season. It is great news for our Academy that Tommy Ouldrige – one of our Under-16s – was on the bench for the first team on Tuesday night. Tommy's been with us a while now and he hasn't actually played many Under-16 games recently because we put him in with the Under-18s. Scott Lindsey has done some fantastic work with Tommy and he's come on leaps and bounds. Every week, Scott talks about how well he's doing - I have a look at the clips and agree that he's coming along really nicely. I went and watched him play at Watford recently and he was fantastic. The ultimate reward is

being part of the first team squad now and there's no qualms that the manager will listen to us and actively take an interest in what we've got coming through. If the squad and the circumstances allow it, then the boss will always include the young players which is great for us and them, being part of a successful side. It was great to see the manager at our game on Sunday against Plymouth. It's great for the young lads to see the manager taking an interest. The Academy is a great place to be and the first team are obviously doing that as well. We need to keep that transition between the academy and the first team closer so the transition of players from Under-18s or even Under-16s to first team are closer and that makes it easier for everyone.

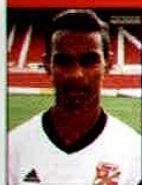
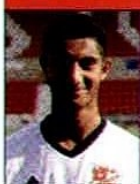

aggressive, athletic and I think he's going to have a bright future. As an Under-16 he's probably been one of my best players for the Under-18s which is why he's been given the opportunity to be on the bench for the first team. He's a great lad, he's got a great attitude and I'm really looking forward to working with him next year. Hopefully it's another one off the production line, that's what we're trying to do here. We're trying to get as many through the system as we can and, hopefully, in return we'll see more and more play in the first team here - that's what it's all about, that's the main aim.

WE extend a warm welcome to Notts County who arrive at The County Ground this afternoon looking for the points that will keep them above the relegation zone.

MANAGER Shaun Derry, who took charge at Meadow Lane just over a year ago, oversaw the team's survival last season where he was able to turn their fortunes around in a run that saw them take 19 points from the last nine games and avoid relegation thanks to a 1-1 draw on the final day.

While enjoying an encouraging start to this campaign which took them into a play-off position before Christmas, the team has recently suffered a string of poor results losing four from the last five matches leaving them hovering just above the drop zone.

Last Saturday's encounter away at Crewe Alexandra cost us the services of both Louis Thompson and Jack Stephens so we hope that the result of Louis's midweek scan will show no dislocation requiring surgery. A referee's job is never easy, having to adjudicate between



22 players on the pitch plus the two managers in the technical areas, not forgetting two sets of one-eyed supporters with pundits and commentators also offering their opinions with the benefit of hindsight and TV replays of course! Surely a referee has a duty to attempt to provide an entertaining spectacle for the supporters by yellow carding a player unnecessarily early in a game, he makes life hard for himself by setting a precedent that has to be followed when a stern word in the ear of the offending player re-confirming that foul play will not be tolerated sends the right message to both teams and maintains the players' respect and confidence in the ability of the referee to officiate the match.

Continuing on the theme of injustices that referees decisions can have, both on an individual

player and his team, who could not have felt for Nemanja Matic missing out on Chelsea's League Cup triumph at Wembley. Burnley's Ashley Barnes committed two shocking fouls both somehow missed by the referee. Barnes should surely have been booked for his karate kick on Branislav Ivanovic and his cowardly, potentially leg-breaking assault on Matic was a clear red card. Unbelievably, Barnes got away without even a booking for either incident and Matic is sent off for retaliation - with no retrospective action against Barnes that cannot be right.

Our midweek match against Gillingham did not go to plan with the team suffering its heaviest defeat this season. Too many of our players gave substandard performances well below what we have come to expect and on the night Gillingham gave the most complete performance seen at The CG this season - their midfield quartet strangled our midfield supply lines with high energy closing down for 90 minutes with Cody McDonald and Bradley Dack producing outstanding displays. The season does not end here - others around us have faltered too but we are still just two points from automatic promotion with 12 games to play. R&W looks ahead to a trip to Port Vale on Saturday 14th March.



TOWN have happy memories of recent visits to Vale Park, especially after last season's superb comeback to clinch all three points in the Potteries. Two goals down at the break, Nile Ranger reduced the arrears before Alex Pritchard's stunning free-kick levelled matters. Nathan Byrne struck the winner for Mark Cooper's men shortly afterwards to cap a remarkable turnaround. Swindon are unbeaten in six of their last eight visits to Port Vale including another comeback to earn a point in March 2004. 3-0 down after an hour, a twenty minute spell saw the Town snatch a point thanks to Rory Fallon's late equaliser. A Swindon team has not tasted defeat at Vale Park since October 2007 when, despite Lee Peacock's equaliser, the visitors were beaten 2-1. 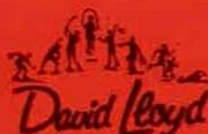
