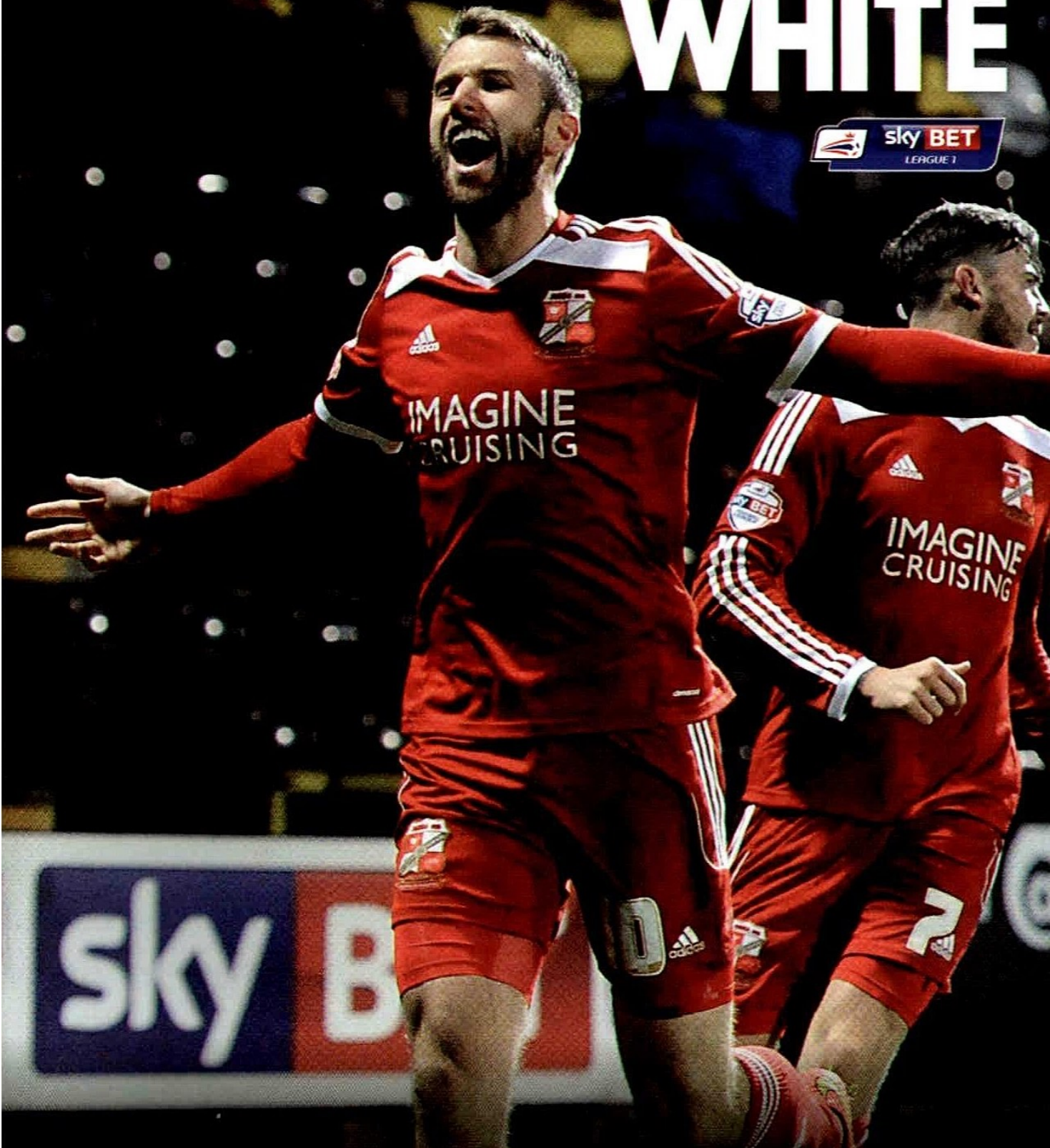

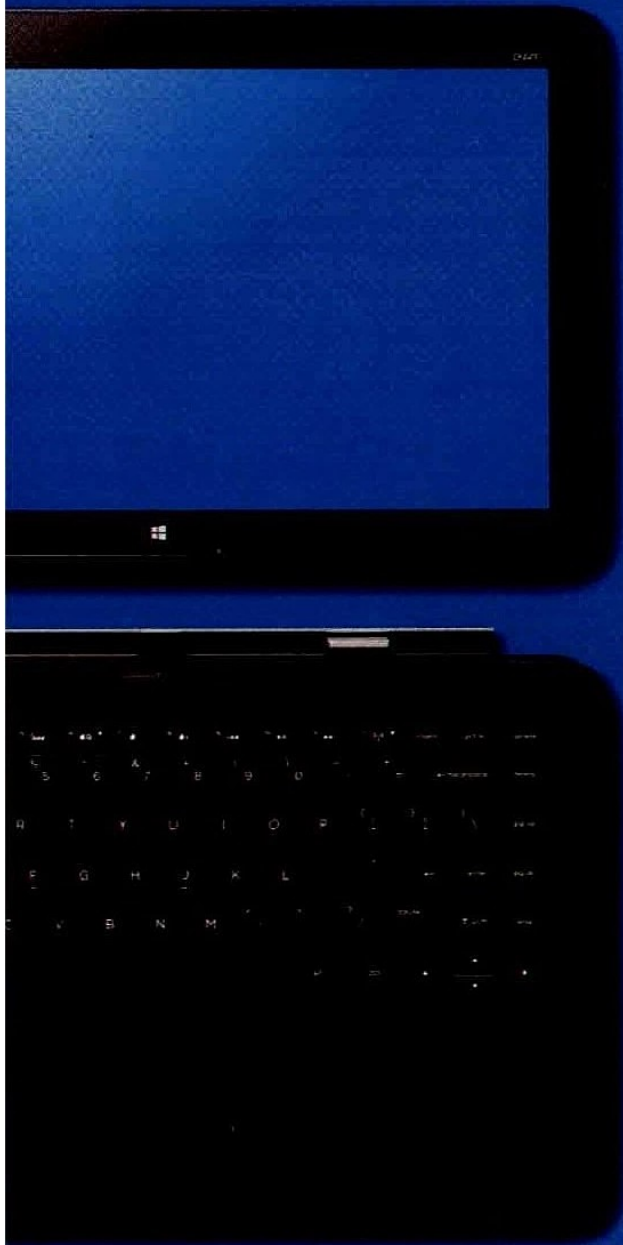

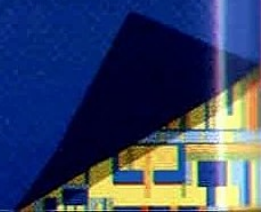

fa cheque presentation

THIS afternoon, Swindon Town Football Club will present a cheque to Jan Åge Fjørtoft on behalf of PCUK. These funds were raised from the FA Community Shield Fund 2014.

The process for distributing funds raised by the 2014 FA Community Shield for community based initiatives features the following components:

The funds available for distribution include the general admission ticket income net of match expenses and all profits from the sale of the match programme.

The 2014 FA Community Shield contribution to the fund amounted to 44% of the total matchday income.

Each competing club will be allocated an equal section of the fund to donate to community initiatives of its choice.

A section of the fund will be allocated to the 124 eligible clubs (those clubs that participated from the First Round Proper of the FA Cup last season) to nominate up to three local charities or community based initiatives to receive its share of the fund.

The remainder of the fund will be donated to the FA Charity Partners as well as the World War I Centenary commemorations. Breast Cancer Care was chosen by the FA Community Shield Distribution Committee and FA Group staff following a robust selection process and it will be The FA's Official Charity Partner until July 2016. Additional FA charity partners who have received donations from the fund have been The Bobby Moore Fund, The Bobby Robson Foundation and Homeless Football Association.

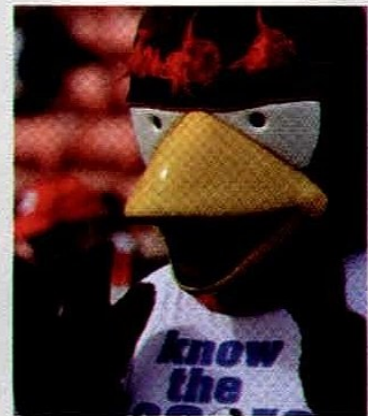

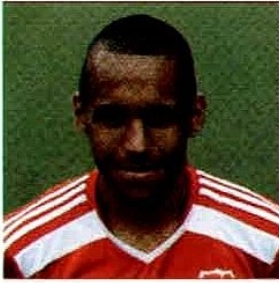

GOOD afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for today's game. I'm writing these notes on the coach journey back to Swindon after picking up our first away win of the month and there's optimism and hunger – figuratively and actually – in abundance around me.

WITH the form and cluster of the teams around us, after the international break it was clear the importance of our final games was going to intensify. As a team, we were gut-wrenchingly disappointed and frustrated with our return performances. Losing against two of our closest rivals could have severely impacted on our confidence, so to be returning from Lancashire victorious has given us a tremendous boost when we need it the most.

The performance at Rochdale was extremely encouraging as we got back to dominating the football again. Over recent weeks, we've lacked a clinical edge so, as the games grew on, teams have been able to impose their style of play on us. Although Yeovil have already been relegated, players will be looking to impress the new

management and will be playing with freedom – and this combination can be dangerous. It's important we start the game the same way we did on Tuesday and continue this winning run.

LAST TIME OUT...

A rare goal from centre-half Stephen Arthurworrey, midway through the second period, handed the Glovers a win under the Huish Park floodlights against promotion-chasing Sheffield United.



INTRODUCING THE GLOVERS



FOLLOWING a maiden campaign dining amongst England's second tier, the Somerset outfit make the trip to SN1 today with rebuilding for next season already firmly in mind...

THE Yeovil Town fairy-tale began last term with back-to-back away wins over Millwall and Southend: Ed Upson's volley two minutes from time at The Den gave the Glovers a Championship debut to remember, whilst a first-half strike from Kevin Dawson was enough to book a place in round two of the Capital One Cup. That was as good as it got for Gary Johnson's men in August, as a home defeat to Birmingham set in motion a winless run of twelve games, including League Cup heartbreak, on penalties, to the same opponents after a 3-3 scoreline.

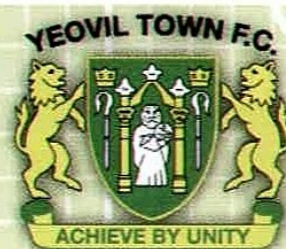
The sequence was finally halted at the end of October as a brace from Upson, in a 3-1 success over Nottingham Forest, handed them a first home win of the campaign. An impressive three points at Vicarage Road preceded a narrow victory over Blackpool at Huish Park; which remained the only occasion during the campaign that the Glovers managed consecutive league victories.

A 4-0 demolition of League 1 high-flyers, Leyton Orient in the FA Cup Third Round failed to make the New Year more resolute for the Glovers, as solitary league wins in each of the first four months of the year were not enough to stem the tide of inevitability, with their fate practically sealed in game 44, when an Adam Clayton goal deep into stoppage time consigned them to life back in the third tier.

Having dispensed with club legend Gary Johnson's services in February after being in the League 1 drop zone since November, former Town manager Paul Sturrock had a first game to forget last weekend, with a point against fellow strugglers Notts County unable to hold off successive relegations. With the simple matter of pride left to play for, the side will also hope to avoid propping up the table, once again, as they ready for fourth division football in the latter half of 2015.

SCOUTING REPORT



YEOVIL have been lining up in a 4-4-2 formation this season, attempting to strike a balance between solidity without the ball- where they can double up on Town's wing-backs today- and seeing their forwards naturally drift, both into strong crossing positions and running off the second ball in the final third. Their strength from getting balls into the box lies in the late runs the front two like to make whilst, in Ajay Leitch-Smith, the Glovers possess a talented and tricky player who plays off the left but can cut inside onto his favoured right foot and support the play further forward, allowing the flexibility

to change to an attacking trio when an opportunity arises. Equally, James Hayter's long, successful career as a frontman has enabled him to hone the finer mental and decision-making aspects of forward play, which is key in complementing a young and eager 'supporting cast' alongside him. As Yeovil's top goalscorer with just five goals to his name this campaign, he has been unable to lead from the front as in previous seasons.

At the other end of the pitch, the defence has conceded 68 league goals all season and shutting out the opposition has been problematic for the team, as evidenced by

the fact their last clean sheet came in January. Sturrock's men have struggled with their set piece defending, as failure to clear their lines has often led to messy goalmouth scrambles and sloppy goals given away. They can also be prone to a quickening of the tempo once the opposition get into attacking situations and can be sucked in towards the ball, leaving space for simple movement.

In 14 meetings between the sides, there has only been one goalless draw, with just one meeting taking place outside of League 1 - an FA Cup encounter in 1962, when Swindon ran out 2-0 winners.

Paul Sturrock

STURROCK spent his entire playing career with Dundee United netting over 100 goals for the Tangerines. Cut his managerial teeth with St Johnstone before moving back to Tannadice. Would steer Plymouth Argyle from the basement tier to the brink of the Championship then spent time at Southampton and Sheffield Wednesday before taking the reins at The CG. Took Town back into League 1 in 2007 and has since managed Argyle for a second time as well as Southend United. Appointed Glovers manager earlier this month.

A former Scotland international, Sturrock represented his country at the 1982 and 1986 World Cups.

KEY MEN...

27 Byron Webster DF

THE experienced centre-back started his career with York City before moving on to Doncaster Rovers. During his time in south Yorkshire, Webster spent time on loan with both Hereford and Northampton before joining the latter on a permanent deal in the summer of 2011. After just one season with the Cobblers, he moved west to sign for Yeovil in July 2012, helping the Glovers reach the Championship in 2013. After moving to Millwall in the summer, he re-joined Yeovil on loan in February.



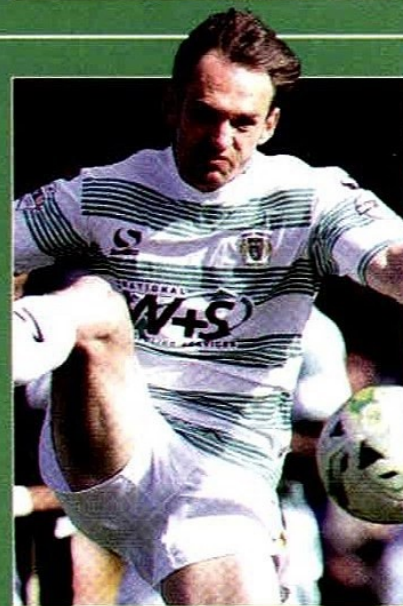
08 James Berrett MF

A graduate of the youth academy at Huddersfield Town, he went on to make 35 appearances for the Terriers, netting twice. In 2010, he moved north to join Carlisle United and would spend four years at Brunton Park as a mainstay in the Cumbrians' midfield. In 2011, he helped Carlisle lift the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and left the north-west having made close to 200 appearances. Signed for Yeovil in the summer of 2014. He has also represented the Republic of Ireland at junior and Under-21 level.



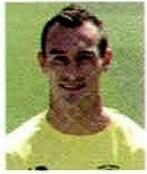
09 James Hayter FW

On a personal level could you ever have imagined that this season would be such a fruitful one in front of goal?

I'm an optimist and I'd always like to think that was going to be the case but I think, realistically, if someone had given me 21 goals at this stage last season when I was on a low doing rehab with the Physio and Mikey, I would have bitten your hand off and I'm delighted with the way things have gone so far.

Talk us through what you've worked on to tailor your game to suit this side's style of play...

Pre-season was frustrating at times because I'd been working hard at getting back fit and working on what I was

good at before. I came into the team and felt like in pre-season I wasn't really getting too many chances. So I sat down and had a chat with Luke and worked out ways where I needed to improve and tailor my game to suit the team. It was a case of continuing to work as hard as I do off the ball but on the ball I had to use my runs wisely and work out when to run and when not to run. To be honest, it's made life a lot easier for me. The workload I do compared to normal has been halved as a result. If you look at a lot of my goals this season they've been one-touch finishes which is a joy for a striker.

It must help having a group of strikers that all offer something different too?

Possibly but one thing that definitely helps is having a group of strikers that get along so well

together. No matter who is playing, we get on well and, after training when we do extra work, it's always fun to do and never a chore and everyone is always encouraging each other. If there's a day where we can see another one feeling a bit low, we all get behind each other and they are all a pleasure to work with. It is nice to have different assets; all of them help me as a player because they all have attributes that I don't have and hopefully I have things that help them too.

What have been your goal highlights this term?

The one away at Yeovil was quite nice. It was great work from 'Stevo' - he just set it back for me and it was another one-touch finish into the top corner. I scored a good goal at home against Oldham. My first goal on Boxing Day as well. Throughout my career I've always prepared right for Boxing Day games and never had the reward I'd have

liked. A lot of my family came to that game so it was nice to get a couple of goals especially the first one where 'Smithy' has put it on a plate for me to lift over the 'keeper. Thankfully, this season there are a few to choose from and it's nice to have that headache.

With the arrival of Sam Ricketts, you can now pass on the baton of elder statesman in the squad. Not that it ever bothered you...

I think Sam has come and seen me as the next oldest but quickly realised that I'm one of the least mature at times in the dressing room *smiles* so I'm quite happy to mix it with everyone. I've got a wife and kid at home now so I've got to be a bit more mature but I like to come into the ground and mess around with the younger lads when I can.

Off the pitch it's been a season of personal milestones - named in 442 magazine's

'Top 50 Players Outside The Premier League' and two awards at the Supporters Club Dinner last weekend...

I was wondering if we were going to get onto that! It was nice to be recognised by the supporters and it's a massive award to have because, especially for me not being on social media, I don't have that interaction with them. Obviously I applaud them before and after every game and seem to get a good reception – it's quite a good thing to hear your fans singing your name especially when you're about to take a penalty. Unfortunately they don't always go in but it's a really good feeling and it was nice to be recognised. I was a little bit overwhelmed to be fair because, at the time, I was on a low one after missing the penalty and not performing at my best in the game so it was nice to go to that evening and be lifted by the fans and pick up a couple of awards. It's the same with 442 - it was a great achievement to be 37th. Massimo was in there too and, to be honest, a few more of our lads should have been on that list as well but it's still a nice achievement and, like I've already mentioned, I would have bitten your hand off for any of these things last year.

And you've had the arrival of a little one too...

It was a big life-changing moment. You can never be fully ready for the sleep deprivation you feel for the first few weeks but it's a great feeling especially after the odd bad game we've had recently to go home and see him - it just lifts you up and you feel a lot better about the world. It's a massive change in my life.

How has the mood changed in the camp after the win over Peterborough?

It's lifted again. The thing with a young group is that it can quite easily change. Any low points don't stick around for long and we're such a young, bubbly group that, give it a few days and everyone seems to lift each other up quite quickly and the mood in the camp at the moment is good. There's a lot of singing and messing around in the dressing room so hopefully that will be carried on.

It's been sad to see the way they've gone this season. I've got a lot of time and respect for Terry Skiverton who got given temporary charge for a bit but, unfortunately, things didn't quite go according to plan there. They're already relegated so they'll be coming here with nothing to play for and possibly under no pressure which is often a danger at this stage of the season but hopefully, it will be a good game for us and three much-needed points.

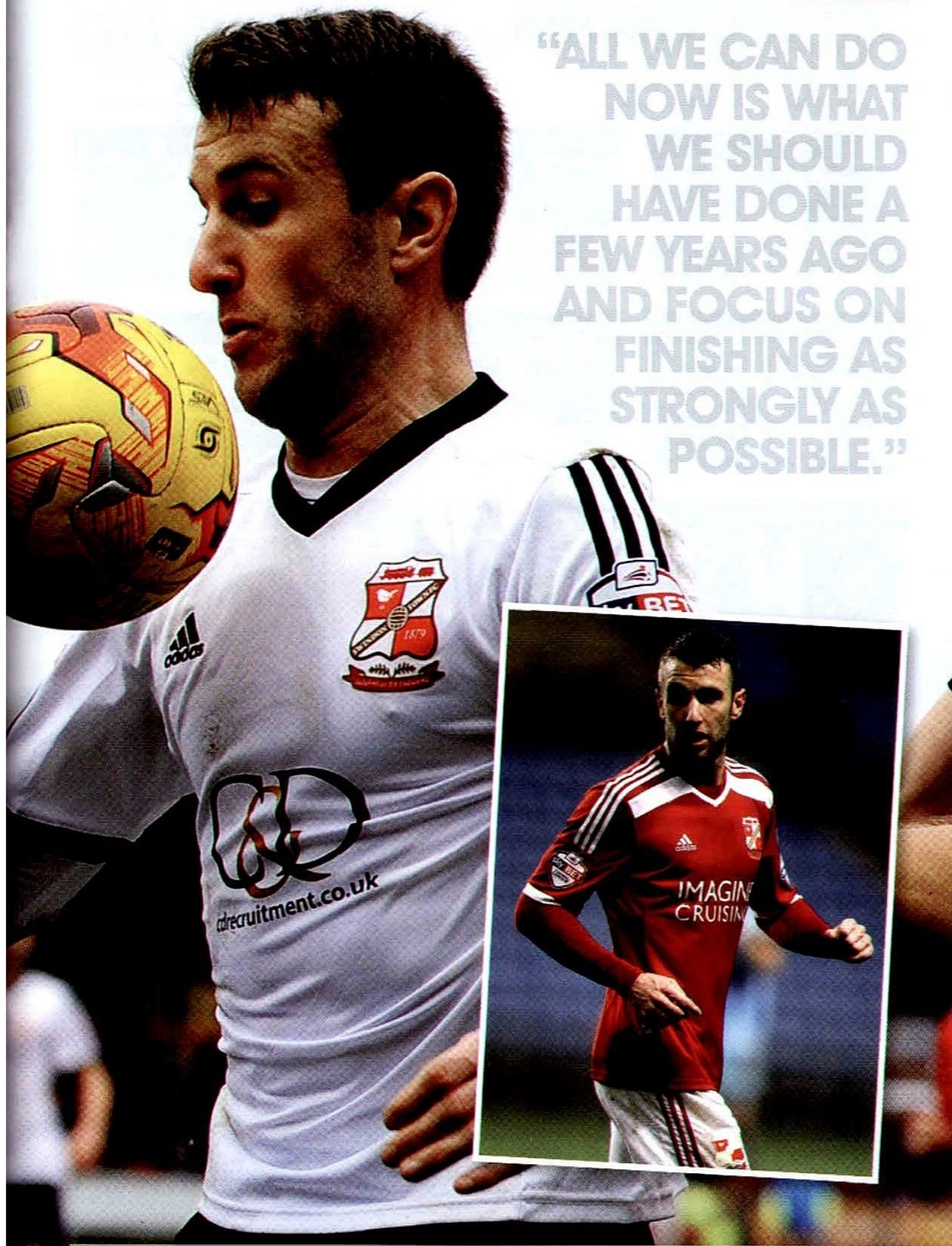
What about the remainder of this season. Excited about what potentially lies ahead?

All we can do now is what we should have done a few years ago and focus on finishing as strongly as possible. We need to win as many games as possible. It would be great if we win our game in hand and come up to the Preston game within touching distance which could mean it would be all to play for on the last game of the season. For me, that's got to be our minimum requirement at the moment: winning as many games as we can or at least matching Preston's results and it

would be nice if we had something to fight for on the last day of the season. If it doesn't work out then – I always say it – even though it's a lottery and nothing is guaranteed, if you can go up through the Play-Offs at Wembley, it is the best way to get promoted.

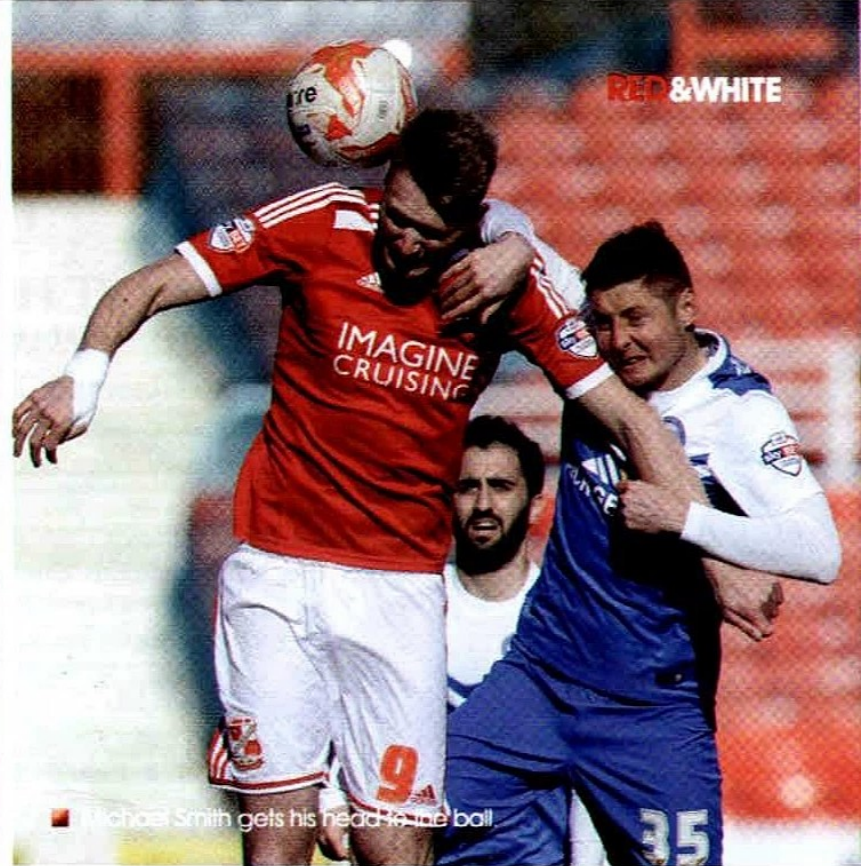

IN the early eighties much change was taking place in Swindon...

AT The County Ground, Town were in the midst of great turmoil having been relegated to Division Four for the first time in 1982.

The ensuing financial constraints meant inevitable cost-cutting and, without the astuteness of a Lee Power or the managerial nous of a Mark Cooper, we were getting further and further adrift of regaining our Division Three status.

Meanwhile in Rodbourne, my unbroken ten years' worth of home attendance was shattered when I met someone who drew me to Somerset at weekends.

That was until I instigated a rule that the future Mrs Wallis came to Swindon and went shopping alone in the Brunel on home match days, instead of us wandering the Quedam in Yeovil.

So when Town faced Darlington on Tuesday 17th April 1984 enthusiasm around the town and about the Town seemed at an all time low, and that was certainly reflected in the attendance that evening.

The game itself was remarkably forgettable.

This being a midweek fixture I had the dubious pleasure of being one of just 1,681 people who clicked through the turnstiles to witness midfielder Leigh Barnard score the only goal of the match on the stroke of halftime.

The attendance that day remains our lowest ever in the

Football League and at kick-off, manager Ken Beamish presided over a team who sat 17th in the table.

That rose to 15th by the end of the evening, which was where we remained at the end of the season six matches later, Town's worst ever Football League finish.

'Things can only get better', they sing... and this time they were right.

By the end of the year the installation of Lou Macari as a manager and the moving of my wife-to-be to Swindon meant normal service could be resumed in all respects.

Town were on the up, and my season ticket was again renewed.

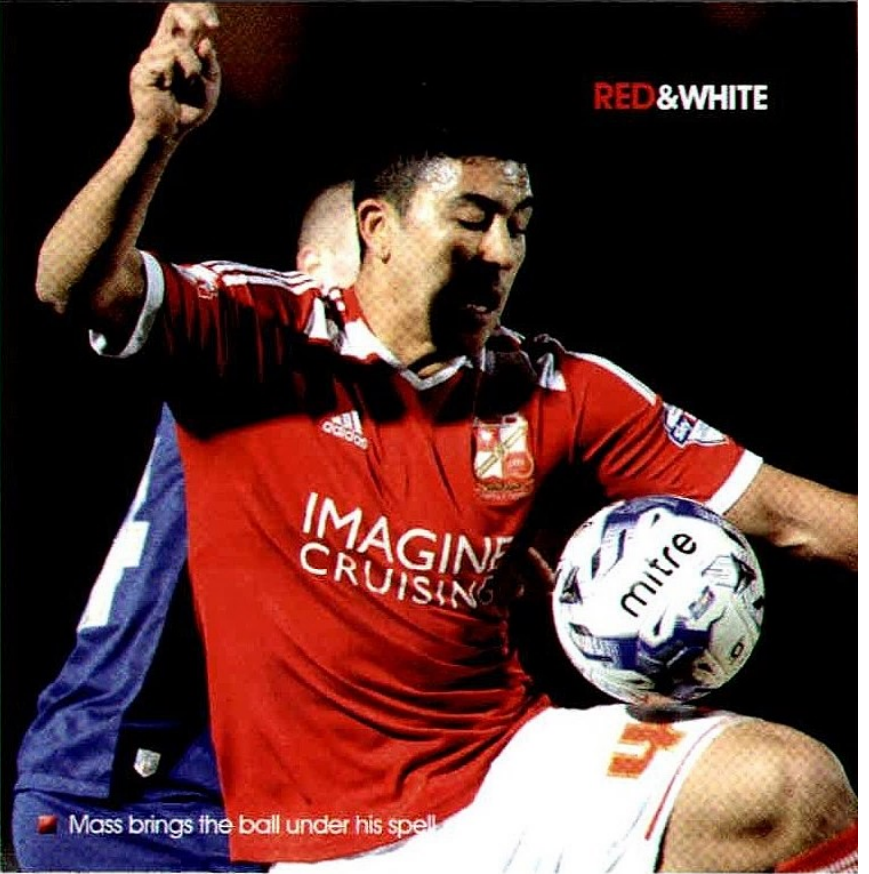

50s In focus

R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

IN mid-April 1958, Town were getting ready to say farewell to Division Three South, of which they had held continuous membership since it evolved from the old Southern League in 1920. But the Football League had now decided that a restructure was necessary - one that would give clubs a slightly better chance of promotion to the Second. It would also, however, open up for the first time the possibility of relegation to a Fourth Division.

And, given Swindon's recent track record - finishing in the bottom four in each of the last three seasons - that

prospect was not too appealing.

But, as the 1957/58 season drew to its conclusion, the club had swept aside those years of despondency and looked in a far healthier state.

On securing a third successive 1-0 victory on 19 April, the sixth in eight games, Town took their points tally to a best ever 54 (only two for a win in those days).

Fourth in the table, they were only two points behind leaders Plymouth. But with only two games left - both away - and one club promoted, the chances of going up were very slim indeed.

Little Arnold Darcy was the match winner in two of those three 1-0 wins, at home to Southampton and Shrewsbury, scoring direct from a corner in the latter.

Andy Micklewright grabbed the honours in the other, at Coventry. And he was on target again four days later, on the 23rd, when his 36th minute goal brought a fourth 1-0 verdict at Exeter.

On the final day Swindon had to travel to Bournemouth, where they had not won for 20 years.

Micklewright was on his way to opening the scoring on the hour when he was

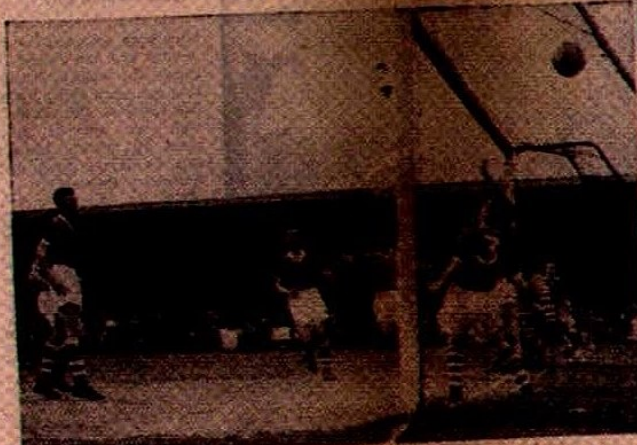

JAN ÅGE FJØRTOFT HALL OF FAME...

JAN Åge Fjørtoft signed for Swindon from Rapid Vienna for a club record fee of £500,000. His Town career was only to last from July 1993 until March 1995 during which time the Norwegian international made 87 appearances and scored 38 goals. His period with Swindon may have been short but he was to become one of Swindon's greatest crowd-pleasers of all time. However, it was not until 22nd January 1994 that he scored his first league goal for the Robins helping them to a 2-1 home win over Tottenham. He went on to score 11 more making him Town's top scorer during their Premier League season in 1993-94. The following

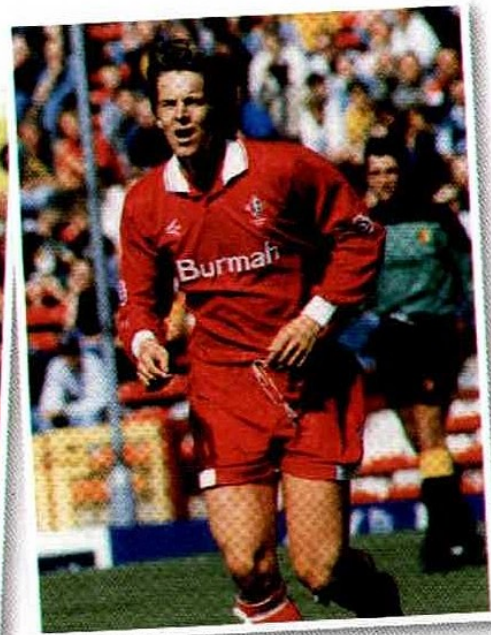


season saw him score 15 goals in 36 League matches but he saved his major heroics for the League Cup run with nine goals in eight games. When Town travelled to Charlton in the first round they were already 3-1 down but a first half hat-trick by Jan Åge turned the tie around with Town running out 5-4 winners on aggregate after extra time. It was in the victory over Millwall that he

scored his most unbelievable goal swivelling to fire in from an impossible angle to put Town two up and help take Swindon to their third League Cup semi-final. An individualist, his style of play was never as greatly appreciated by manager Steve McMahon as the fans and

miming gunning the manager down after one goal was perhaps not the greatest career move. As soon as Swindon were out of the League Cup he was sold to Middlesbrough in a move which helped condemn Swindon to relegation for a second consecutive season.

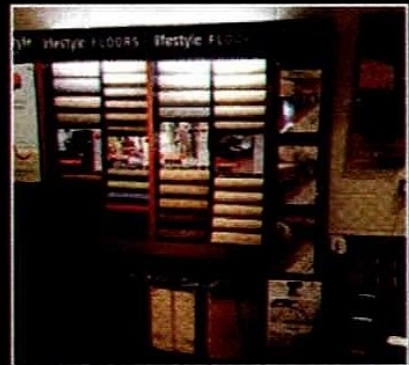

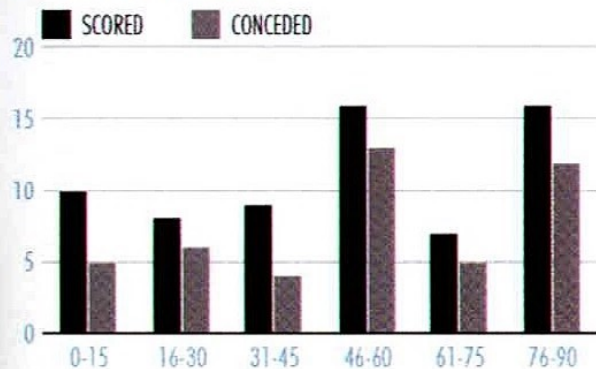

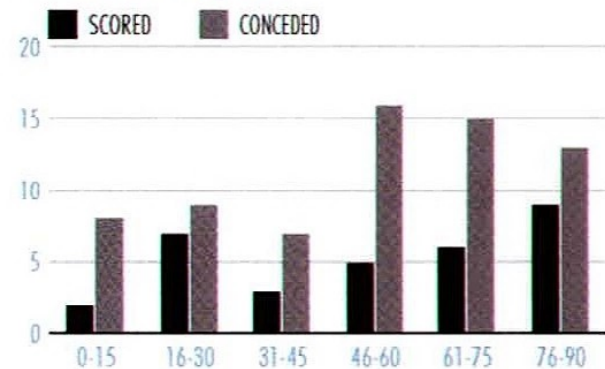

YOU may have read in the last programme about our trip to the Netherlands, a trip that was very beneficial for the Academy here at Swindon Town.

WE were able to do a lot of workshops and we were fortunate enough to take our analyst, our sports scientist, the medical department and a number of coaches. We broke the tour down into sections throughout the day: the sports scientist would take the players for recovery, while the other two age groups were reporting in for injury or looking back through their games with the analyst. Then myself and Alan McLoughlin and the older age groups led workshops with the aims and objectives for the week from an individual perspective and collectively from a team performance point of view as well. It's a great environment to have them in, in that length of time - there's no hiding place, we have them from the moment they wake up to the moment they go to bed so it's ideal for us.

We did ok - we came second in the Under-10s, Under-11s and Under-12s tournaments. We won it last year so it's always a little bit disappointing but we'll take second place and start looking forward to the tournament in August with all the Champions League teams involved. That's another big plus for us - in August we go across with the likes of Chelsea, Feyenoord, Borussia Dortmund, Schalke 04 and Chicago Fire from America. It's going to be a big tournament and one we're looking forward to with the 2002 age group.



For me, this is probably the busiest time of the year. The pre-season schedule is all complete - that's from the moment we're back in July all the way up to September when the schools go back. All our training times with all the age groups are already in, looking to maximise the time given to us in the school holidays. We're already planning for the Milk Cup, looking at squads for that and we're organising the Under-16s and Under-18s to go to the Netherlands in pre-season. With the end of season it's that time of year where, unfortunately, we have to tell players that they're being released and it's

one of the hardest things that you have to do. We have to go through every age group starting at the Under-8s going through a two-week period with all the coaches then sitting down and just making sure we're happy with what players we're going to be retaining and the ones that we're going to be releasing but, more importantly, making sure that we retain the right ones for the reasons that they've hopefully got a little bit more development inside them to hopefully obtain their youth contract.

OVER the Easter holidays, it was a chance for the Under-16s to come in and sample a bit of full-time training for two weeks, which was brilliant for me and brilliant for them.

It gave me an opportunity to work with them and see them at close quarters. It also gave them an insight into how we do things on a full-time basis with the Under-18s so it was a really worthwhile exercise. They've more or less played the last five games in the Under-18s and results have not been great but, like I've said before, a lot of the Under-16s we've got are young for that age group so a lot of them are actually still 15. So we're playing against the likes of Peterborough, Barnet and teams like that, who are still playing a lot of second years that are 18. There's a three-year difference between some of them and, when you're that sort of age, it's a big difference in terms of a player's strength, power, pace and the physical side of the game. With that in mind we've done really well and what's pleasing is that every team we've played against, we've played some great football and still dominated the ball and that's the most important thing for me. I don't really buy into the results, especially if it's the Under-16s playing up a level. It's great because I think we're the only club at the moment from the sides we've played against who have actually done that and promoted the youngsters early. I haven't come across any other team yet that have

played any of their Under-16s which is a credit to what we're doing here - we're trying to bring them up sooner whereas, for the other teams, perhaps the results matter too much.

I'm pretty much playing the team that will play next season now, albeit a year too soon but it's not too soon for me because

it gives them a head start and me a head start. I didn't have this luxury last year so it's good to be able to make such early progress.

The busy period for me is now over because we've made decisions on who we want to take and who we've released. We've now only got one game left in the league programme, so after Saturday it's going to be winding down a little bit for the summer. Obviously we'll still be coming in and training - especially with the first team fixtures not finished yet we'll have to come in and be extra bodies for them.

PLEASE welcome Yeovil Town to The County Ground this afternoon whose recently appointed manager Paul Sturrock is, of course, well known to us all here at Swindon Town.

PAUL'S year-long stay back in 2007 was capped with promotion from League 2 where that period was indeed his most successful spell in football management. His appointment at Yeovil came as somewhat of a surprise when he left his role as advisor to Conference Premier side Torquay United just four days after taking the job but he will be encouraged by last Tuesday night's impressive win over our promotion rivals Sheffield United for his already-relegated team. What a difference a week makes - with our disappointing defeats to MK Dons and Bristol City now erased from the memory we followed up quickly with two successive victories over Peterborough and Rochdale respectively where the six points gained has repositioned the team right back on the tails of MK Dons with a game in hand and with Preston still within our sights after they dropped points with their 2-2 midweek home draw against Gillingham. Congratulations must go to both Jermaine Hylton and Ben Gladwin whose goals have helped the team to get back on the victory trail with significant landmarks in their young careers. Jermaine's first professional goal with the late winner against Peterborough was just the tonic the team needed and then Gladwin's first half hat trick at Rochdale will fill him with supreme confidence for the remainder of the season - he knows now that he belongs at this level. I was somewhat baffled and

Jordan Turnbull again misses this afternoon's match after being unjustly cautioned against Peterborough after cleanly taking the ball with a perfectly well-timed challenge. We're also without Rapha Rossi-Branco after the deserved retrospective suspension following his off-the-ball elbowing of Aden Flint, explained on the FA's website as an incident not seen by the match officials but 'caught on video'. Without any doubt, the FA will also ban Steve Cotterill for his interference of Jordan Turnbull in the same match at Ashton Gate for which the FA tell us they have video evidence and we know it wasn't witnessed by the officials!

Please do enjoy the game as we try to continue our form with another victory this afternoon.

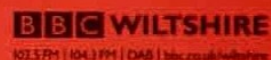
