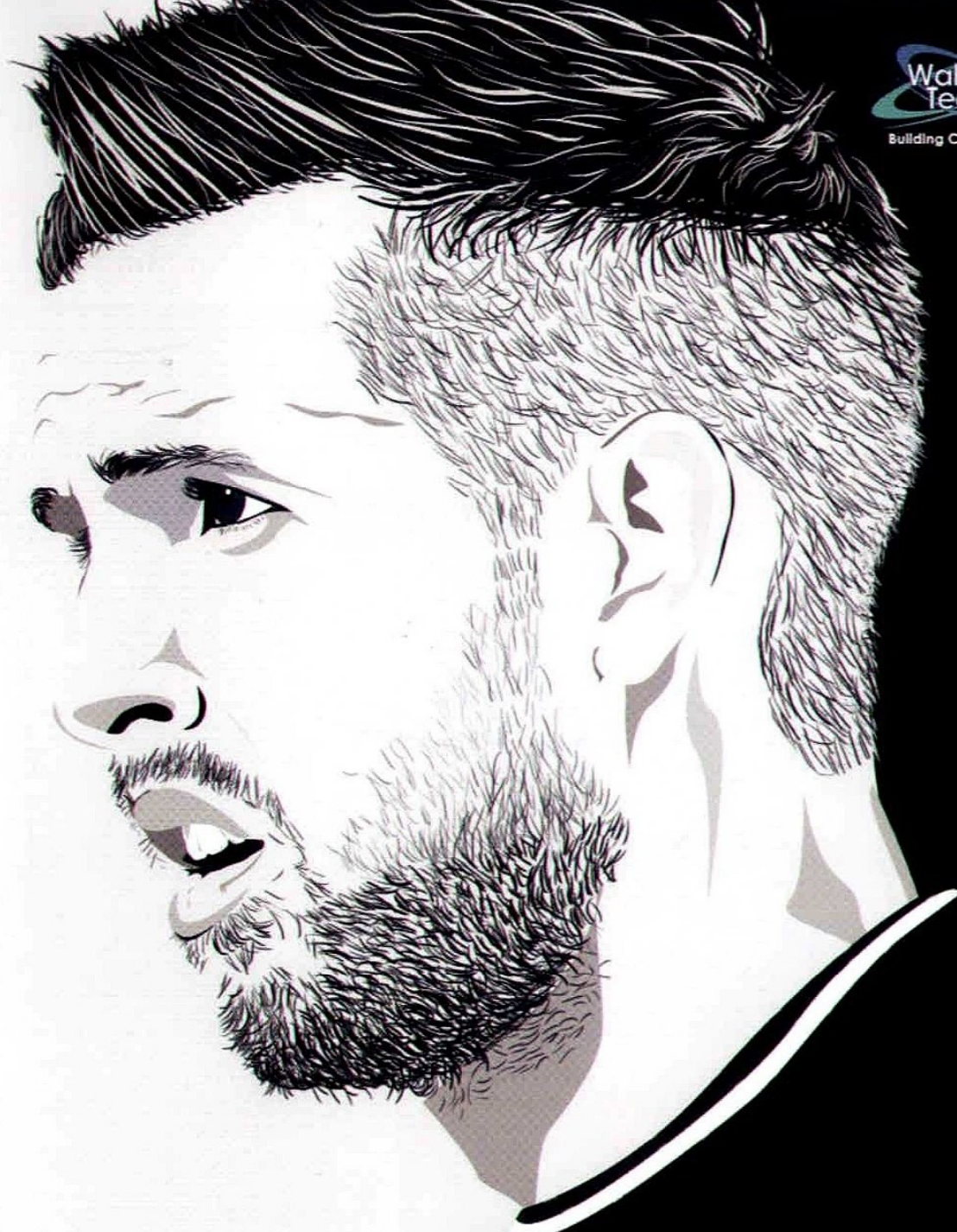

NEIL HARRIS MANAGER



We went into the international break with a real positive mindset after putting in a solid, workmanlike display against Northampton Town in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

We kept a very good clean sheet, scored a couple of goals and arguably could have had four or five. It wasn't packed with quality all the time but despite that we managed to pick up a good win and book our place in the next round against Plymouth Argyle.

That performance and result came on the back of our frustration at what happened against Peterborough United. We played really well there and bossed the game for large periods, but managed to let five goals in.

The focus in training leading up to today has been defending as a team and looking at adjusting very slightly to make sure we are a bit more aggressive and more dominant in and around our penalty area. That is the responsibility of the team as a whole because it is never just one or two players who concede goals.

It is important that we all understand how nowadays,

increasingly, most teams try and keep hold of the football, which is easier to do when you get more people around it.

We want to press the ball and get it back, home and away, but that is not always possible with the speed of the game and the way teams play currently. When I was a player it was easier because everybody played 4-4-2 against 4-4-2 and you just had to mark your man.

What I think is clear is that we have a gameplan where sometimes we press and on other occasions we sit in, are patient, and let other teams have the ball.

Against Rochdale we got that mix right and were excellent out of possession, just as we had been away from home leading up to the Peterborough match. We got it slightly wrong in the first few home games, particularly against Coventry.

I talk regularly about patience, mainly to remind myself because we can't press the ball every time like I used to as a player. You have to be patient when out of possession and if that is the best

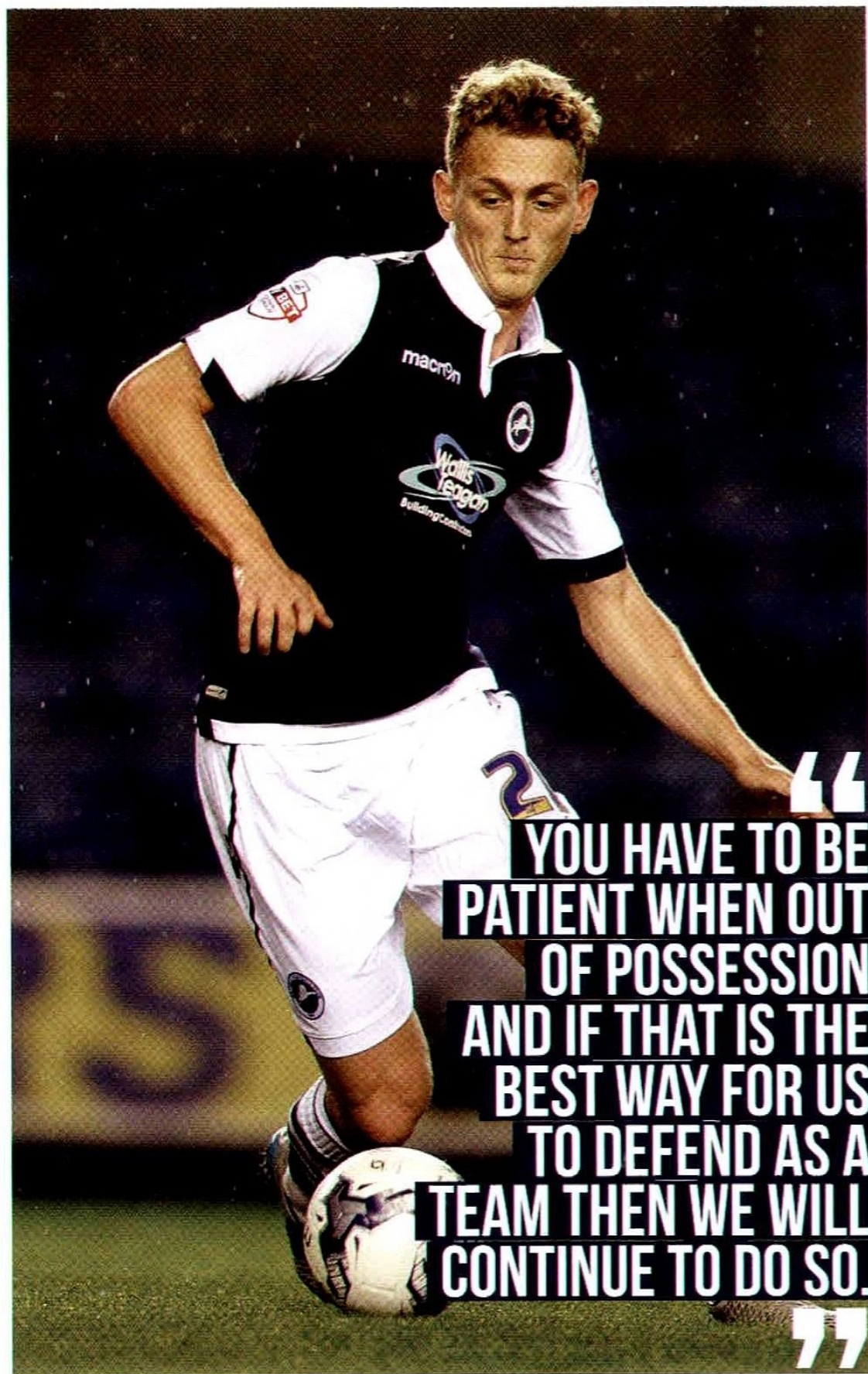
way for us to defend as a team then we will continue to do so.

We've suffered a big blow with the injuries to Jimmy Abdou and Ed Upson, both of whom have played a big part in us doing well on the pitch. To lose them both at the same time is difficult but it has given me the opportunity to bring in George Saville, who was particularly impressive on his debut against Northampton. He knows the club, he knows the fan base and he understands what is expected of him. George is desperate to play well, impress and enjoy himself.

As you will have seen we have allowed John Marquis to go on loan to Leyton Orient, where I hope he can do well and score some goals. He has been frustrated at times that he hasn't had more opportunities to play and John is one of those who needs rhythm by playing regularly.

He is a good lad and wants to play week-in, week-out, so we all wish him the best of luck for the next three months.

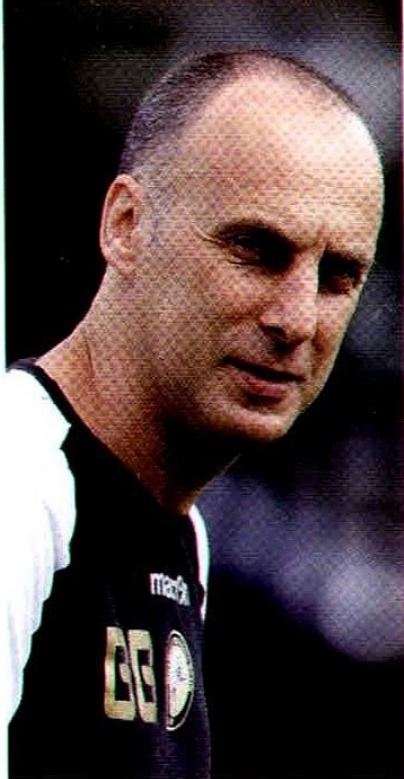

THE PHYSIO

Last month we had to confiscate a pair of football boots from a player as they were simply too flimsy and, as a result, we felt they were not fit for purpose.

It's the first time we have ever had to take that action, however boots and shin pads are two areas which concern us at times and are where we can make an intervention.

We are currently trialling a new shin pad which offers more coverage than some currently available and is pulled on like a sock for a more comfortable, secure fit. Shin pads are becoming increasingly smaller which obviously means less coverage on that part of the leg. I first saw the trend almost 10 years ago at Preston

North End when Kevin Nicholls, the midfielder, would cut his pads down to the size of postage stamps. This was bad enough but, just to give the medical staff even more nervous moments, he would take great delight at flying in for the most thunderous tackles which in theory he had no right to win, but usually did. He was a player that Kenny Jackett admired and thought would be a good Millwall type.

I had no luck in getting Kevin to change his pads back then but we have managed to get young Kris Twardek to wear different boots. Kris is now wearing a sturdier leather boot to protect his toe that suffered the fracture dislocation earlier in the season, though the original injury would have happened regardless of the boot Kris was wearing as it was a collision at full speed.

It should also be noted that Tony Craig, in the Play-Off Final, and Sid Nelson, last season, both suffered metatarsal fractures while wearing a traditional leather boot. However, we feel that Kris' latest boot will protect his feet better than his original choice. I hasten to add it was not his boots which were the ones confiscated as mentioned previously.

On a final note, we have been aided by head groundsman Dave Bradbury-Shaw and the rest of his staff who are keeping the rehab grids and training pitches' grass extra short and well watered, as the latest research shows long dry grass coupled with a long cleat-like stud increases the risk of joint injury when the stud gets caught in the turf.

THE SUPPORTER

I'm enjoying Leigh Edwards' "Fifty years since Gray... and forty since Jago" feature in this season's programme, recalling two periods in our history, one where we produced back-to-back promotions (in 1966 under Billy Gray) and the other when we bounced straight back following relegation under the expert guidance of Gordon Jago in 1976 – something we're obviously hoping to emulate this season.

Both were before my first match at The Den in 1979 but formed a large part of the legendary tales my dad used to tell me about supporting The Lions. In fact, since the formation of the League in its current four division format in the late 50s, we've only managed either of those feats on one other occasion – when we won promotion straight back to Division Three following relegation in 1964. So, for a club that has hardly forged a reputation as a yo-yo team, or one who can turn the momentum of one promotion into another, it might be wise to keep our hopes under control this year – and enjoy the steady progress of Neil Harris' new young side. Not that I'm giving up of course, but football fans can't afford to simply measure success by promotions, especially when there is so little to go around each season.

Thanks to our Johnstone's Paint Trophy victory here against Northampton before the international break, we are now closer to another trip to Wembley. I don't want to jinx it for Neil and the lads but it's a step towards our fifth appearance at the famous stadium since we ended that long wait to visit it in 1999 – which would make this season a success in my book.

Back in 1999, two other Millwall favourites were assembling a team that was destined for promotion glory, though sadly not under their watch. Keith Stevens and Alan McLeary built a Millwall side very much in the mould of the one that Neil is assembling – and of which Harris

himself was a part of. You could sense things were moving in the right direction, which made ultimate disappointment a little easier to swallow.

That frustration came in the shape of a defeat at Wembley in the Auto Windscreens Final (now the JPT) in 1999 and then in the Play-Offs a year later – both at the hands of Wigan. But it made winning the title in 2001 all the sweeter and even though that was achieved under Mark McGhee; the brand of a team that Millwall supporters can relate to had been left by Rhino and Macca. For all the highs and lows we have experienced already this season, from Coventry at home to Port Vale away, you can still feel a sense of progress around the place.

Very few clubs have the luxury of obtaining instant success. Spending tens of millions of pounds in the transfer market is often no more a guarantee of success than sticking a pin in the list of runners to pick a Grand National winner. This is the way we've always done it at Millwall – we've had a go at throwing money at it on a few occasions – with disastrous consequences.

Hopefully the international break will have the same effect on our fortunes in October that it did last month, although I'll warn any Lions fans travelling to Blackpool on Tuesday that I've got a terrible recent record following Millwall at Bloomfield Road. I think the last three times I watched us there we dominated the game and came away with nothing, but then these jinxes are there to be broken, aren't they?

Come on you Lions!

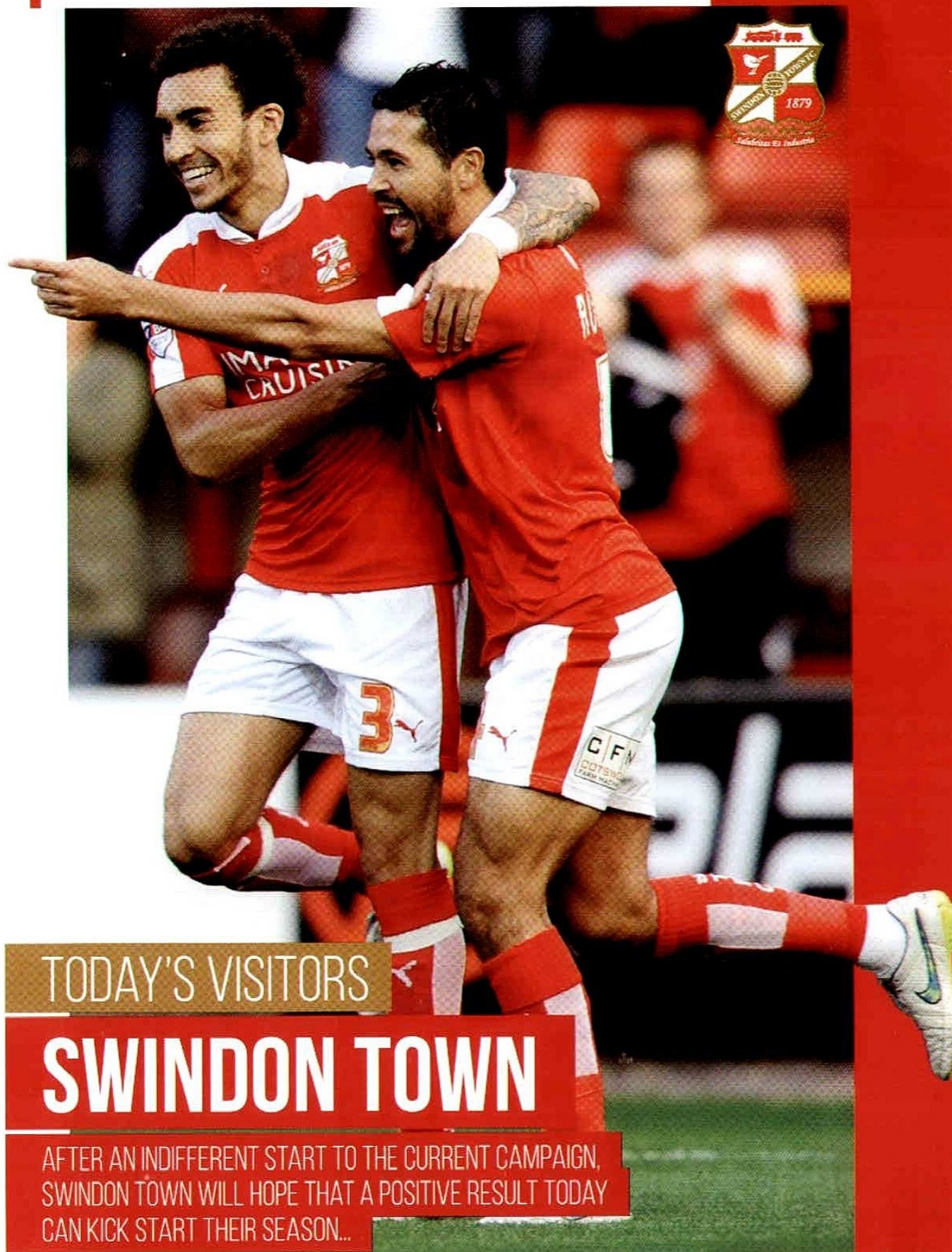

SWINDON TOWN

AFTER AN INDIFFERENT START TO THE CURRENT CAMPAIGN, SWINDON TOWN WILL HOPE THAT A POSITIVE RESULT TODAY CAN KICK START THEIR SEASON...

TOWN NEWS

After the dramatic end to Swindon's 2014/15 campaign there was always going to be a feeling of anticlimax coming into the new campaign.

Mark Cooper's men finished a creditable fourth in the League One table and were paired with Sheffield United in the Play-Off Semi-Finals.

A 2-1 win at Bramall Lane gave The Robins a great chance of reaching the Final, and when they took a 3-0 lead in the second leg, it seemed a foregone conclusion.

However, the Blades rallied and battled to a 5-5 draw in one of the most eventful games ever seen at The County Ground.

In the Final, however, Swindon were beaten 4-0 by Preston and left to face another season in League One.

After starting in fine style with a 4-1 spanking of Bradford City on the opening day and remaining unbeaten in the first four League outings, the wheels have come off somewhat latterly.

Following five League games without a win prior to last weekend's clash with Peterborough, Cooper called for calm and a sense of perspective as the manager sought to arrest the slide and kick-start another assault on the Play-Off places.

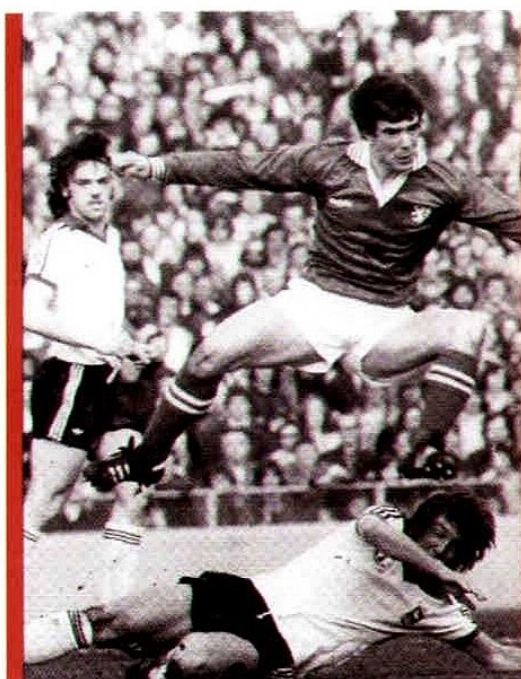

LIONS LINK BRYAN HAMILTON

Irish international midfielder Hamilton, who won 50 caps for his country first came to prominence in England with Bobby Robson's outstanding Ipswich Town side of the early 1970s before moving on to Everton for a year.

It was from Goodison that he joined Millwall for a £12,000 fee in July 1977, making his debut against Crystal Palace. He made 60 senior appearances for The Lions, scoring seven goals, including a spectacular effort against Spurs at White Hart Lane, before a £20,000 transfer took him to the County Ground where he made some 24 League appearances for Swindon.

Finishing his career at Tranmere where he took his first managerial steps, Bryan went on to manage Wigan twice, Leicester, Norwich and Northern Ireland.

THE MANAGER



MARK COOPER

The son of former Leeds United and England full-back Terry Cooper, Mark enjoyed an illustrious playing career of his own spanning some 22 years and comprising 457 League appearances (115 goals) for no fewer than 17 clubs.

Starting his managerial career at Tamworth, whom he led to the Third Round of the FA Cup in consecutive seasons he then guided Kettering to the Conference North title and the Fourth Round of the FA Cup.

Mark's exploits earned him a move to Peterborough United but his tenure with Posh lasted just 13 games. Moving on to Darlington he won the FA Trophy followed by very brief spells at Kettering again and Telford before he was appointed as assistant to Kevin MacDonald at Swindon, taking over the manager's role in August 2013 after MacDonald resigned.

THE KEY MAN

JONATHAN OBIKA

Enfield-born Jon signed for Tottenham Hotspur as a youngster, progressing through their youth system and making his senior debut in a UEFA Cup tie against NEC Nijmegen in 2008.

However, he struggled to establish himself in the senior squad at White Hart Lane, leading to no fewer than 10 loan spells during his time at Tottenham. One of those was at The Den where he scored twice in 12 League outings. He was also on the bench during the 2010 Play-Off Final.

Another loan spell took him to the County Ground and he signed for Swindon on a permanent basis in the summer of 2014 on a two-year deal.

At 25 he still has time on his side and has found the net three times so far this term.





THE LAST XI



24. JERMAINE HYLTON

The pacy striker penned a two and a half year contract with Swindon in the January 2015 transfer window, joining from non-league Redditch United. Formerly with Birmingham City and Kidderminster Harriers before breaking into the Redditch side, Hylton made his Town debut as a substitute in the televised win at Coventry.



10. NICKY AJOSE

The former Swindon loanee agreed a three-year deal at the County Ground in September 2015 after leaving former club, Leeds United. Having started his career with Manchester United, Ajose spent time on loan in Wiltshire from Peterborough United at the start of the 2013/14 season, netting 10 goals in his first spell.



26. ANTON RODGERS

The midfielder joined Swindon in the summer of 2014 after leaving Oldham Athletic. Having started his career at Chelsea, Rodgers broke into the professional game with Brighton and Hove Albion. Anton is the son of Liverpool manager, Brendan. He signed a contract extension earlier this summer.



18. LOUIS THOMPSON

Currently on loan at Swindon from Norwich City, the youngster came up through the ranks at the Swindon Academy and made his debut at Leicester City in the FA Cup in January 2012. That year his appearance alongside brother Nathan in an FA Cup tie against Macclesfield was the first time two brothers had played in the same Swindon side since 1947.



17. BEN GLADWIN

The 23 year old midfielder re-joined Swindon on loan from QPR this month having enjoyed a lengthy spell previously at the County Ground, making over 50 senior appearances for Town in the process. He made his 'second debut' against Peterborough last Saturday.



15. JAMES BROPHY

The defender signed a one-year deal at the County Ground following a successful trial period. The 21-year-old had been training with the squad over the course of pre-season before putting pen to paper on a permanent deal joining Town from non-league football.



7. DRISSA TRAORE

Traore started his career in his native France with Le Havre and has most recently plied his trade for Notts County. He has also represented France at junior level and has played for the Ivory Coast in an Olympic qualifier. Signed a permanent deal with Town earlier this summer.



3. BRANDON ORMONDE-OTTEWILL

The 19-year-old wing-back joined the Town from Arsenal having spent his scholarship with the Gunners. He featured regularly during pre-season and will be hoping to make an impact this season, having made eight appearances to date.



34. ADAM EL-ABD

Vastly experienced central defender who made his debut for Town against Peterborough United last weekend after signing on loan. Born in Brighton, but qualified to play for Egypt, he progressed through the ranks at his home town club, making over 300 appearances over 11 years on the south coast before moving on to Bristol City.



29. RAPHAEL ROSSI-BRANCO

Formerly with the Academy at Brighton, the Brazilian centre half penned a deal with the Town in the summer after a successful trial period. He made his debut against Plymouth Argyle in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and stepped off the bench to make his League debut in a 1-1 draw at Bradford City.



1. LAWRENCE VIGOUROUX

The Liverpool goalkeeper is currently on loan until the end of the 2015/16 season. Vigouroux was snapped up by Tottenham in 2012 before moving to Anfield in the summer of 2014 after leaving White Hart Lane. Last term the former Chilean youth international was a regular for the Under 21 side at Anfield.

MARK BEEVERS

DEFENDER MARK BEEVERS DEMONSTRATES SOME FORWARD THINKING AFTER RECENT SCORING FORM.

Remarkably for a player who, at the age of 25, should still have his best years ahead of him, Mark Beevers made his League debut for Sheffield Wednesday against Southampton as far back as January 2007.

The Yorkshireman, born just up the road from Hillsborough in Barnsley, made 160 appearances for The Owls, before joining Millwall, initially on loan in October 2012, following another brief loan spell with MK Dons.

Having already passed a century of senior games for The Lions, 'Beeves' has once again nailed down a regular starting slot at centre-back, after being in and out of the picture at The Den during certain spells in recent seasons, and is determined to help Millwall regain the Championship status they surrendered last May at the earliest opportunity.

"We made a mixed start to the season," he observes. "Clearly losing our first four League games at home was a problem we have had to overcome and has held us back in terms of our current League position. But against that,



our away form has been pretty good, and now we have got that first League win here in addition to a couple in the JPT, we are playing with more confidence at The Den and are looking forward to getting a run going on our own patch."

Goalscoring has not proved to be a problem for Neil Harris' side so far this term, but as Beeves acknowledges, there is still work to be done in shoring things up at the other end.

"The Peterborough game was a bit bizarre because although we did make a mistake or two, it just seemed that they put away every chance they had. At the other end three defenders, myself included, all got on the scoresheet from set-pieces and with a bit of luck we could have had more and got something out of the game.

"Having said that, you can't be happy when you concede five, and that was a bit uncharacteristic for

us in recent weeks. We know that we're capable of keeping clean sheets more often, and if we can do that obviously it sets us up to win a lot more games.

"Last season we struggled to find the net from set pieces at all, and during pre-season the gaffer spoke a lot about how important creating and scoring from free-kicks and corners would be for us.

"It is something we work on quite a bit, and fortunately so far that is paying off."

Mark's header at Peterborough took his tally for the season to three already, and he is now setting himself an ambitious target.

"Alan Irvine at Sheffield Wednesday used to reckon that four was a realistic target for a centre back, but now I've got three maybe I should be aiming for 10! The priority for us as a back four is to keep improving defensively, but if we can continue to chip in with goals at the other end here and there it takes the pressure off the forward players."

So what does he believe is a realistic aim for the team this season?

"If you look at the League table you can see how tight things are, and we know that if we can string a few wins together we can be right up there fighting for a position in the top six," he adds. "Up until the last match we had begun to show a lot more consistency and now after the international break we're aiming to get on another run.

"With no game last weekend we had more time to analyse things and work on the training ground, which we also did during the previous break and showed a real improvement as a result.

"The season still has a long, long way to go, and we genuinely believe that we will continue to improve as we go along. We have a lot of important matches coming up now over the next month or so, and it will be interesting to see where we are in five or six games' time."

LOU PUT FORWARD

Millwall Community Trust are putting Louise Newstead (previously Louise Waller) forward for the 'We Can Play Outstanding Contribution' gong at this year's FA Women's Football Awards.

Newstead, who is the Community Trust's Education and Employability Manager, has literally put her heart and soul into woman's football. In 1980, as an 11-year-old, she joined the Millwall Lionesses. Newstead (pictured here in those days) played for the club until 2000, making over 550 appearances. In a long association with Millwall Lionesses, she served the club as a player, coach, development officer, secretary and chairperson. Through turbulent times Newstead rallied committee members, players and volunteers to keep the club moving forward and remaining representative of its local community.

Furthermore, her talent on the field could never be questioned. She won the 1991 FA Cup, the 1996/97 FA Women's Premier League Cup and FA Women's Cup with the Lionesses, which saw her head the winning goal at Upton Park in the Final. Newstead gained 39 England caps and had the honour of representing her country at the 1995 Women's World Cup.

Community is everything to her and this is best displayed by Newstead's

work for Millwall Community Trust, where she has been an officer since 1991. She started off as a volunteer and in 1991 earned her first contract as part of the national Community Programme in Professional Football. Newstead helped found the Millwall Girls' Centre of Excellence in 1994 - the first in this country and the embryo for elite girls' youth development in England. Her roles within the Trust have varied and display her wide variety of skills, all of which she has used to develop the female game. These roles include

coaching (grassroots through to excellence), coach educator, education officer, mentor, strategic planner, administrator, fundraiser and counsellor. Being a local from the area, Newstead has an empathy and understanding for the culture, people and life in South East London.

This year's FA Women's Football Awards takes place at Wembley on Friday 4th December.

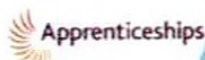

MINUTES OF CLUB MEETING

Members of the MSC committee meet with the club on average once a month to discuss issues affecting the club, team and supporters. The full minutes are available from the MSC website but here are some of the items discussed at August's meeting.

BT Sport and Sky Sports

It was agreed that the subscription to BT Sport is now too expensive, given the massive price increase for Champions League coverage. The subscription to Sky Sports will be maintained.

MSC funds

The new screen, which is HD, is now ordered, and will hopefully be delivered in November. The warranty is for one year and so there is no maintenance charge for the first year. The cost of the screen is into six figures. There will be new commercial opportunities brought by the installation, and potential new sponsors are under discussion. Turning the screen to face the railway and advertise outside of match time is not an option at the moment, due to the prohibitive cost of steelwork.

Lions Player move to HD

There is a problem for lapsed

subscribers trying to renew their subscription, as the old provider has not been able to transfer the stored records of lapsed subscribers to the new provider. It was noted that Lions PlayerHD subscriptions are not managed by Millwall FC. The MSC said that it was concerned that people will log on to listen to the Shrewsbury commentary and it was agreed that a warning should be issued across MSC and club channels ahead of that match.

New kit - Adult and Junior

The shop isn't aware of any issues regarding delivery of new adult kits. There has been a problem with some of the infant and toddler away shirts, which were made of inferior fabric and returned. Affected fans have been compensated. Sales of the new kit are very good.

The new Overground Station

The station has to be built as part of phase one of the regeneration; the likely date is unknown and the station's name is now presumed to be 'New Bermondsey'. We will pursue getting 'The Den' or 'Millwall FC' on to the station signs.

Display of Club Memorabilia

There is a large quantity of memorabilia owned by Chris Bethell, Dave Sullivan and others. It was suggested that the cabinets in the Press Room be extended to accommodate some of this. The club is very keen on this, as the existing memorabilia in the Press Room generates a lot of interest during the Stadium Tours. Andy Ambler agreed to ascertain what is possible and to get costings. The MSC agreed to contribute to the cost and this would need to be acknowledged.

The internet radio programme dedicated to all things Millwall continues to bring new areas of interest to the show, with Jordan Archer's agent, Eddie Duah, a local lad made good, recently joining the panel for a conversation.

DARREN WARD

DARREN WARD RECALLS GREAT MILLWALL MOMENTS
- AND KEEPS THOSE BOOTS AT THE READY



FOREVER YOUNG

At an age (37) when most players (except Carlos Edwards!) have either hung up their boots or are giving serious consideration to the prospect, Darren Ward is desperate to play on.

When he spoke to *The Lion* recently, Wardy was training with Dagenham & Redbridge in readiness for the right opportunity to come his way, having finished at Swindon at the end of last season via a loan spell with Crawley Town.

Approaching 600 senior appearances in a career that has included (technically) three spells with Millwall, the centre-back believes he still has a contribution to make.

"I love playing football and have worked very hard to keep myself extremely fit. I know a lot of people look at my age and assume I should be finishing now, but I back myself to do a job for a club this season.

"Looking forward I would love to stay in the game on the coaching side, but I'm not ready to make that transition just yet because there is no substitute for playing and I intend to continue as long as I possibly can."

There is no doubt in Wardy's mind that the best and most enjoyable times of his career were at The Den, as he helped The Lions reach the FA Cup Final in 2004 and then clinch promotion to the Championship via a Wembley Play-Off Final – against Swindon – in 2010. He also won the Player of the Year award twice in the process.

"When I first arrived at Millwall there was a real buzz about the place. The team under Mark McGhee had won promotion the previous season, and the spirit and camaraderie within the squad was fantastic.

"I found it very easy to settle in, but it was clear right from the start that I was going to have to work hard

to earn and keep my place in the side with Stuart Nethercott and Sean Dyche vying with me for a centre back spot.

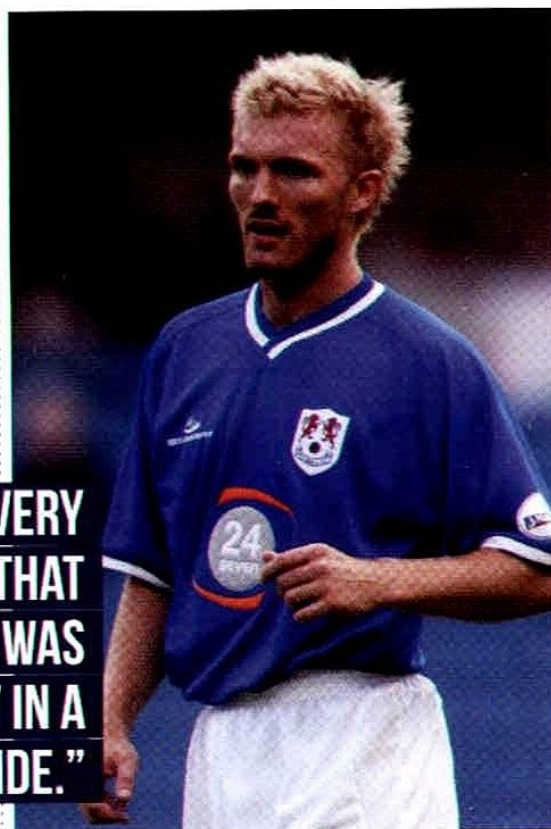
"I have fond memories of that time, and it was a pleasure to play in a very good side. I really feel that we should have won promotion that season (2001/2), but it just wasn't our night in the Play-Off second leg against Birmingham City.

"I think we might have even gone on to win automatic promotion had we not lost Richard Sadlier with a serious injury halfway through the campaign, but even so we were confident of winning the Play-Offs, but it was not to be.

"The turning point in a very tight game against Birmingham at The Den was probably when Dion (Dublin) narrowly missed a great chance for us in the second half, and then, of course they went on and nicked it right at the death.

"We weren't able to maintain that standard the following year which was a hard one for us, and personally I had to grow up and mature a bit myself. There were a number of changes with the likes of

Lucas Neill and later on Steven Reid leaving, and, of course, Dennis Wise came in and then replaced Mark McGhee as manager.

"The FA Cup run was fantastic, and you cannot over-estimate what an achievement it was for Millwall to reach the Final in 2004, with the injuries, suspensions and so on we suffered along the way.

"The Semi-Final against Sunderland at Old Trafford was one of the toughest matches I have ever played in. We came under quite a lot of pressure at times and the clock seemed to be stuck for ages on 65 minutes! But we saw it through thanks to a tremendous professional team effort to set up a great day for the club in the Final against Manchester United."

Wisey and Theo Paphitis gave it one more season to try to win promotion to the Premier League, but thereafter the squad began to break up and Wardy was on his way to neighbours Palace.

"I had signed a three-year contract in the summer after the Cup Final and I had no desire to leave. But by that stage finances were tight and it was made clear to me that I pretty much had to move on.

"I know some of the fans weren't that happy that I joined Palace, but they were the club prepared to pay the biggest fee for me and Millwall needed the money."

A year later and Millwall were relegated to League One, whilst Wardy had spells at Wolves, Watford and Charlton, but as the rebuilding programme at The Den got underway under Kenny Jackett, the call came to return to SE16 and lend a hand. "It was a gamble for me at the time because there were offers from Championship clubs and it involved a big cut in wages,

but it just felt right to come back to Millwall and it was a decision I had no cause to regret.

"Again, I thought we were good enough to win promotion automatically, but this time we made no mistake in the Play-Offs, and while there were some nervy moments against Swindon in the Final, we kept a clean sheet and put in another professional display."

Wardy stayed on for another couple of years as The Lions established themselves back in the Championship, and when he left, after an initial loan spell, the destination, ironically, was Swindon.

"Again there were more lucrative offers, including abroad with the likes of LA Galaxy and New York Red Bulls amongst others showing an interest.

"But I wasn't ready to leave England to play at that time, Paolo Di Canio was manager at Swindon and the club looked to be going places, so after careful consideration that was the choice I made.

"By Christmas in my first full season we were top of the table and nailed on certainties for promotion. But then Matt Ritchie left under a cloud, Paolo followed, and the whole situation changed. I took over the managerial role with Tommy Miller and we were offered the job until the end of the season, but I wanted to keep on playing and didn't feel the time was right to take the step into management.

"We just missed out on promotion after a penalty shoot-out in the Play-Offs against Brentford, and after that there was a big upheaval at the club, with large numbers of players leaving and a change in philosophy."

Meanwhile, back at The Den, after a similar difficult period on the field, former team-mates of Wardy, Neil Harris and Dave Livermore were given the managerial responsibility, with Tony Craig soon to return as captain.

"I'm thrilled for them and I really wish them every success," says Darren.

"I can't speak too highly of them or of the club and hopefully they are on the road to success together once again. My spells at Millwall were thoroughly enjoyable, and I think the club was a good fit for me.

"Chopper, Livers and TC fully understand what you need to be a successful player at Millwall, and if they can get plenty of the right sort of characters into their team they will be well on the way.

"Will I ever come back to Millwall in some capacity one day? Who knows, football is a funny game, so you never say never."

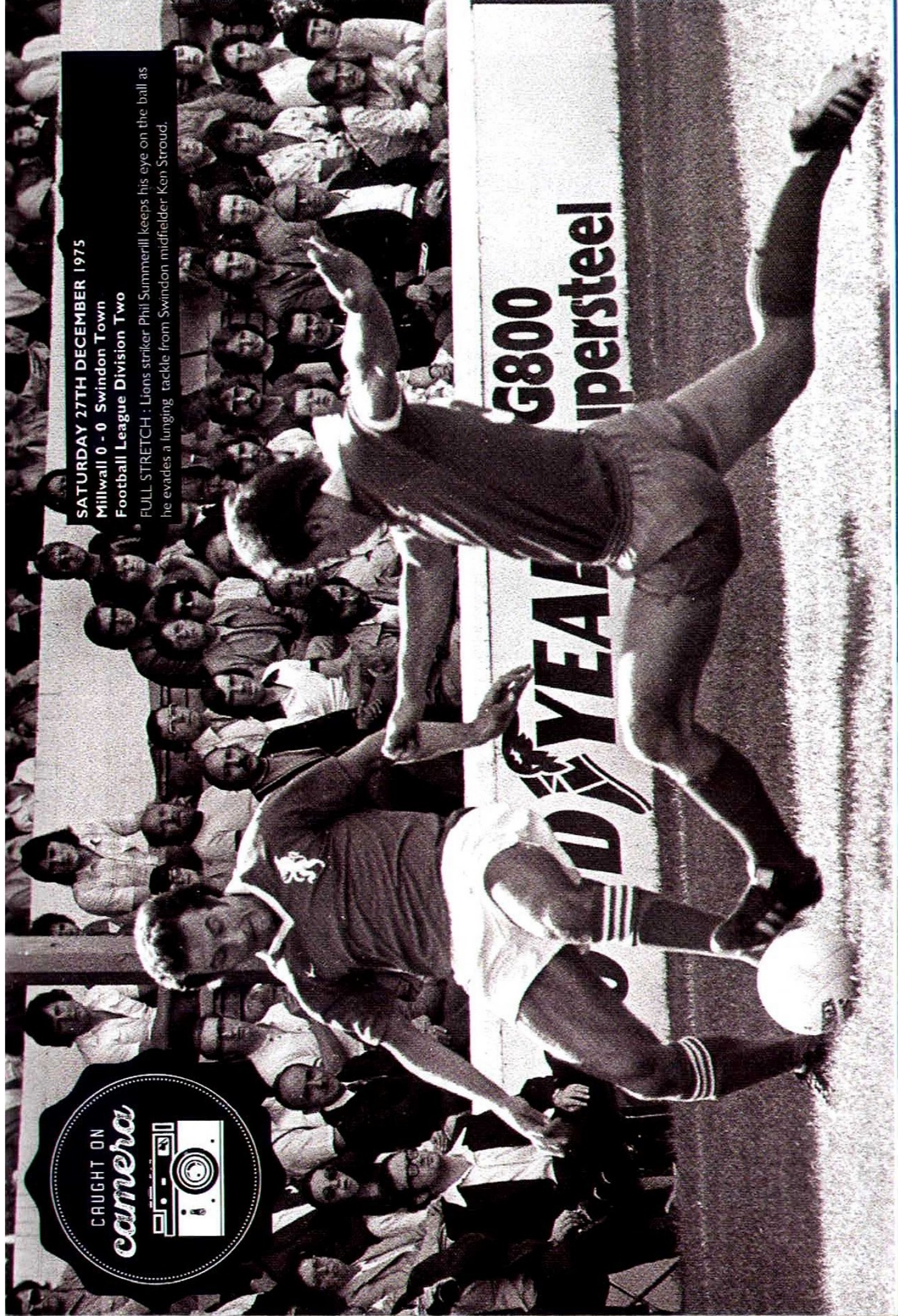

Historian Dave Sullivan focuses on three Millwall matches from years gone by...



1914

A victory over West Ham United is always sweet and this welcome success was achieved by the odd goal in three at The Den. This was Millwall's first win for three weeks, and their fifth of the season. It was left to Welsh international Jack 'Ginger' Williams to get the ball rolling with The Lions' first goal. Sammy Lamb, who had been forced to sit out the previous three matches, marked his return to the team in perfect fashion by bagging the decisive strike to secure a 2-1 win. Millwall went on to secure one piece of silverware during the season in the shape of the London Challenge Cup when they repeated the West Ham score-line and defeated Arsenal 2-1 at Cold Blow Lane.

1987

Despite Millwall's summer spending that had seen George Lawrence, Tony Cascarino and Kevin O'Callaghan sign for The Lions, gates remained fairly disappointing with only 5,202 turning-up to witness the visit of Shrewsbury Town. A topsy-turvy start to the campaign might have had something to do with it, but the 4-1 thumping of the Shrews sent the majority of the fans home happy. Teddy Sheringham, with his fifth goal of the season, and Tony Cascarino's third, coupled with an own goal and an O'Callaghan penalty did the damage. The strike duo of Teddy and Cas went on to score 42 goals between them in a campaign that saw The Lions eventually clinch the Second Division title.

2009

Neil Harris' one hat-trick of the 2009/10 season resulted in Millwall thumping Stockport County 4-0 at Edgeley Park in a game that saw skipper Paul Robinson mark his return to the team following a lengthy spell out injured with a goal. The game was virtually over by the interval with The Lions three goals to the good. Robinson opened the scoring after 19 minutes with a powerful header before Chopper took centre stage with three goals after 23, 37 and 68 minutes. The forward could have finished with four goals, but missed from the penalty spot. This excellent performance indicated to manager Kenny Jackett the many attacking options he had at his disposal. It also set-up The Lions perfectly for the two upcoming home fixtures against teams higher up the table, namely Leeds and Colchester. Both were defeated in what would become a memorable campaign.

IRUSTY ISTAPLES

Millwall historian **Chris Bethell** takes a look back at five previous encounters between **The Lions** and **The Robins**, whilst running the rule over the matchday programme of the day.

Saturday 10th April 1926

Millwall 3-0 Swindon Town

Football League Division Three

Millwall went into action on the back of a record-breaking run of 11 consecutive matches without conceding a goal, during which they had won nine - including the last six - and losing only once in their previous 17 games. The Lions were lying second, two points behind Reading, but with a game in hand. Sixth-placed Swindon needed the points too, to stay in the promotion race. After a goal-less first-half, Alf Moule, Bill Bryant and Dick Parker put an end to Town's hopes. With four games to go, Millwall then lost 3-1 to second-from-bottom Exeter, recording two draws and another defeat as they ended the season in third place.

The programme was a rare four pager, with a Lion and player drawing on the front cover. Priced at one penny, the blue paged edition had the team line-ups inside with the league tables situated above them, whilst the fixtures were on the back page. An article called 'Official Notes' could be found on page two, praising the reserves for winning the Southern League (Eastern Section) by a clear six points and scoring 106 goals.



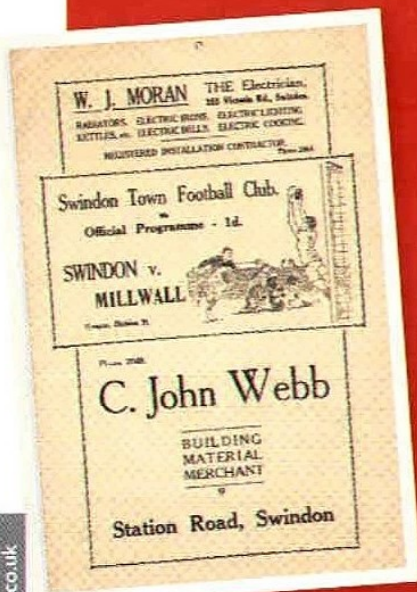
Easter Monday 18th April 1938

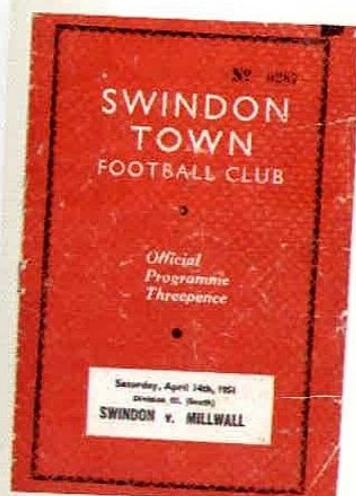
Swindon Town 1-2 Millwall

Football League Division Three

Millwall supporters packed the trains to Swindon from Paddington so densely that the railway had to put on several extra coaches. The playing conditions were atrocious with an uneven, bumpy pitch described by some as 'hard as granite'. The Lions adapted better, however, and although they dominated the first 45 minutes, could not find the killer touch in front of goal. After the break, Syd Rawlings atoned for an earlier miss when, with 10 minutes remaining, he set up Foster Hedley for the first of his two goals. Hedley, stepping in for the injured JR Smith, added a brilliant second, swerving past three defenders before crashing an unstoppable shot into the roof of the net.

The matchday programme was black print on beige paper with an action drawing on the front cover. Priced at one penny, this eight-page edition had a heavy emphasis on adverts at the top and bottom of the pages and surrounding the team line-ups in the centre. The 'Club Notes' section took care of two pages and described past games against The Lions. Surprisingly, however, there were no fixture lists or league tables.





Saturday 14th April 1951

Swindon Town 0-1 Millwall

Football League Division Three (South)

Goalkeeper Sam Burton prevented Millwall from taking an early lead at the County Ground when he dived headlong at the feet of Alan Monkhouse after Harry May had miskicked in front of goal. A long high ball from Jolinnie Johnson then bounced off the Swindon bar and Burton flung himself across goal as a left-foot drive from Millwall's Stan Morgan flashed past the post. The Lions' domination finally paid off after 72 minutes when Morgan bagged the winner to secure the two points.

This 12-page official programme had a bold red cover and was priced at three pence. The line-ups were located in the centre spread, surrounded by adverts. There were three pages of features in total, which included 'Club Notes', 'Manager's Notes' and 'Items of interest'. The latter stated that the County Ground would be hosting an Amateur international between England and Finland, plus a friendly against Borussia Dortmund.

Saturday 17th October 1953

Millwall 6-1 Swindon Town

Football League Division (South)

Millwall roared to a comprehensive victory as they brushed aside Swindon with ease. George Stobbart set the victory wheels in motion after 19 minutes, converting a Frank Neary pass, and Neary himself got the second two minutes later from a John Hartburn centre. Stobbart added a third before Bull scored Swindon's only goal. Hartburn netted a fourth on 48 minutes and a terrific 35-yard drive from Stobbart made it 5-1 on the hour mark. George Hazlett completed the rout with a sixth two minutes later from Hartburn's pass.

A seasonal cover of this 12-page programme featured a blue drawing of players in action. Priced at three pence, this was very good value for money with plenty of editorial copy to read, including four pages featuring reports from previous matches and a list of the teams - Manchester United, Spurs and Charlton - to play under the new floodlights. The players, it stated, were to be rewarded with a two pound floodlight bonus! The back four pages of this excellent edition included details of both the fixtures and leagues.



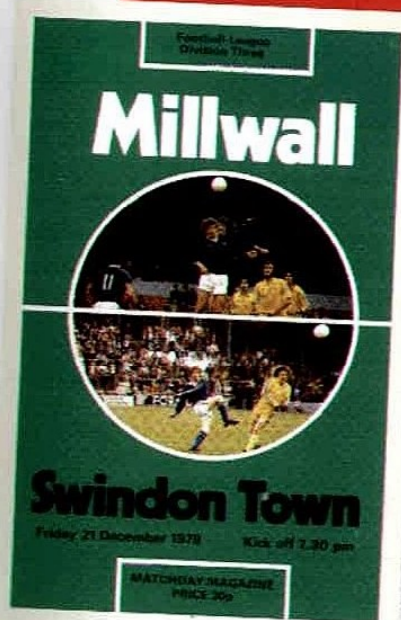
Tuesday 4th March 1980

Millwall 6-2 Swindon Town

Football League Division Three

It was goals, goals, goals as The Lions and Robins shared eight in a cracking game at The Den. Tony Tagg gave Millwall a 10th-minute lead and from then on it was a non-stop goal procession. Bobby Shinton hit two on 31 and 38 minutes, including a clever lob, with a Tony Towner solo effort (37 mins) seeing The Lions hammer home three goals in just seven minutes. Swindon's Ray McHale missed a penalty after Mel Blyth handled, but Andy Rowland pulled one back for the visitors in the 32nd minute. Defender John Sitton put through his own net for Swindon's second goal 15 minutes from time after John Lyons had already hammered a spectacular free-kick. Lyons added his second - and Millwall's sixth - three minutes from time.

The original game on 21st December had been postponed but this Christmas edition was still the match programme when the game was replayed in March, with a four page insert. The cover was a slightly garish green in the shape of a football pitch, with two coloured action photos in the centre circle. Costing 30 pence, the programme had a 16-page insert called 'Programme Plus', which featured several colour action pictures plus a two-page interview with Rod Stewart. There was also a full page advertising sheepskin coats on sale in the Jubilee Club and several interesting articles including 'Life with The Lions', 'Lions scene' and 'From end to end'.

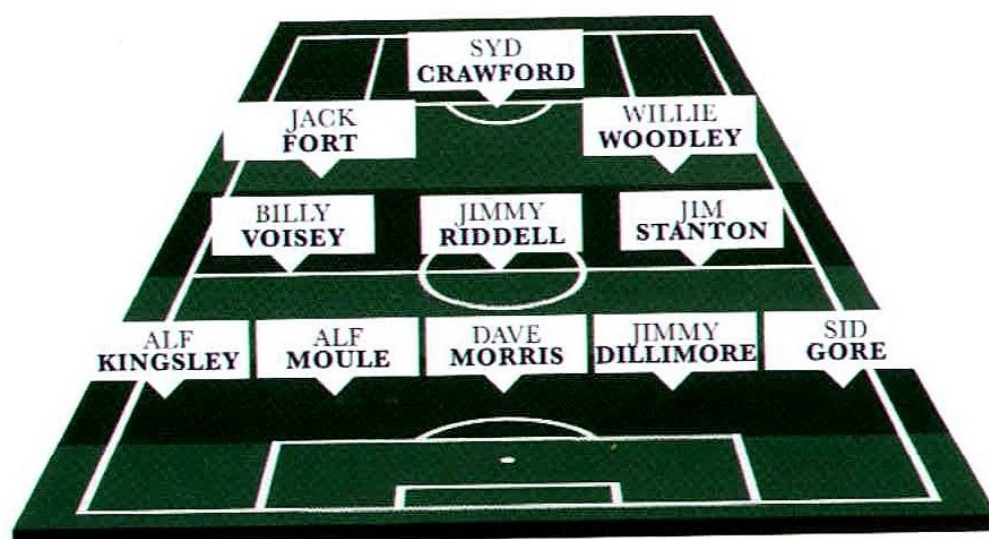

PAST MASTERS

In each Millwall home League One matchday programme this season our hugely knowledgeable club historians are selecting a number of 'Best XI' line-ups before deciding on the ultimate team from the club's 130-year history.

So far our historians - Chris Bethell, Dave Sullivan, Jim Creasey and Richard Lindsay - have covered 1885-1920. Today, the quartet look at those Lions players who have graced the field of play representing our great club from 1920-25.



SYD CRAWFORD

Syd was brought in as cover for the excellent Joe Lansdale in 1922 having built a formidable reputation at Reading where in the course of nine seasons he amazingly managed to save over 50 penalties. Syd was regarded as a fearless and consistent goalkeeper who was originally spotted by Woolwich Arsenal prior to the First World War.



JACK FORT

When Millwall signed Jack back in 1914, little could anyone have envisaged that he would spend the next 54 years at The Den! Jack gave The Lions some splendid service as a right-back in over 330 games, and when his playing days were over he served the club in various roles including scout, coach, trainer, and finally, Jack received a well earned benefit match in 1952 when an All-Star team visited Gold Blow Lane.



WILLIE (BILL) WOODLEY

Like Jack, Bill assisted Millwall in both the Southern and Football Leagues with The Lions his only senior club. Such was the youngster's promise, trainer Bob Hunter stated that he displayed "the confidence and coolness of a veteran". Bill's solitary Millwall goal came at in the 3-1 victory at Southend in February 1914.!

BILLY VOISEY

Millwall born and bred, Billy was a renowned tackler and ball winner, who possessed a fearsome shot that earned him the nickname 'Banger'. With the outbreak of the First World War in 1914, the qualities Bill displayed on the football field held him in good stead on the battlefield in the Royal Artillery. He returned home as a highly decorated combatant, accompanied with bravery awards, the DSM, the MM and the Belgian Croix de Guerre. Bill also made one appearance for England against Wales in 1919.

JIMMY RIDDELL

Despite shouldering the onus of his name Jim was, nonetheless, a real spoiler and a tower of strength in the half-back line. Jim's heading ability and his fine array of passes were key to setting-up a swift counter after foiling the opposition's raid on the Millwall goal. Jim, another Scottish import, was formerly with Glasgow Rangers who had acquired him from the flourishing junior football scene north of the border. After leaving the game he became a pharmaceutical chemist.

JIM STANTON

Although born in the East End of London Jim played the majority of his football in the north and with Rotherham Town won the Midland League on three occasions. A typical half-back of the time, he possessed a prodigious tackle and was also a good provider to his forwards.

ALF KINGSLEY

Alf or "Scotty" as he was nicknamed was a speedy winger whose superb ball control and accurate crossing led to many a chance for his fellow forwards to convert. Having failed to gain a regular place at Fulham who had paid £1,550 for his services, The Lions signed Alf in September 1923, and he was to make his debut the following day against Charlton, the club who sold him to Fulham.

ALF MOULE

Alf was another splendid capture from the amateur game, joining Millwall from Leytonstone FC in March 1919. An elegant inside-right who possessed neat and concise control, Alf was the perfect foil for centre-forward Dave Morris with whom he shared a profitable return of goals and finished top scorer in 1924/5 and 1925/6. Alf appeared for the FA against Cambridge University in the autumn of 1923. He also excelled at cricket and played first-class games for Essex CCC.

DAVE MORRIS

Dave was at the time one of a small number of Jewish footballers in the Football League and proved a phenomenal goalscorer as his 283 goals in 413 matches would indicate. An explosive shooter with both feet, he notched 47 goals in 41 games for Swindon Town during the 1925/6 season, great value for his £300 transfer fee. Dave, or Abe as he was also known, later entered the diplomatic service when his footballing days were over.

JIMMY DILLIMORE

Quite simply Jimmy was a genius, whose compelling footwork had a mesmerising effect on his opponents. His flair and confidence in possession never diminished despite suffering two broken legs during his career. Jim's threat in front of goal made him a player to fear and he was selected by the FA for a tour to Australia in 1925. When his playing days were over, Jim unfortunately fell on hard times.

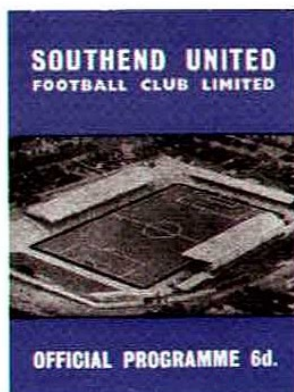
SID GORE

Exciting winger Sid's crossing ability supplied the ammunition for the likes of Morris and Moule on a regular basis. He was a product of Kent football and after signing from Sittingbourne in May 1923, he became a virtual fixture in the first team over the course of the next three years. Sid went on to represent the Rhine Army against their French counterparts following the end of World War One.

SOUTHEND UNITED 0-2 MILLWALL 8th October 1965

Millwall stretched their lead at the top of the Third Division to four points with this Friday evening win at Roots Hall. Billy Gray's side took the lead after 19 minutes of fast and furious action. Harry Cripps lofted a hopeful long ball into the Southend goalmouth and teenage keeper Ray White, making his home debut, ran out but Len Julians was on the spot first to head home. Tommy Wilson doubled Millwall's advantage with a 30-yard free-kick just 60 seconds later. Southend pushed forward in the second half and Alex Stepney saved superbly from Bobby Gilfillan, Mal Slater and Bobby King.

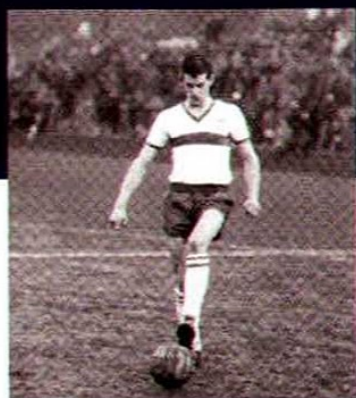
MILLWALL 1-0 SWINDON TOWN 16th October 1965

Third Division leaders Millwall produced a masterclass in defending to thwart the danger of Keith East and winger Don Rogers, who were a constant danger. Mickey Brown, replacing the injured Hugh Curran, broke the deadlock after 50 minutes with a firm header from a Ken Jones centre. Jones, George Jacks, Billy Neil and Harry Cripps were all denied by keeper Peter Downsborough, while Swindon never looked likely to equalise.

Central defender Tommy was an influential figure in Millwall's 1964-65 promotion success after moving to 'The Den' from Falkirk as Ray Brady's understudy during the 1961-62 Fourth Division title campaign. Tommy helped 'The Lions' to win promotion as runners-up for the second consecutive season in 1965-66. He was a key member of the team that recorded an unbeaten run of 59 home matches, netting 15 goals in 201 League games prior to joining Hull City for £18,000 in November 1967. Tommy later appeared for Goole and North Ferriby. He eventually settled in South Cave.

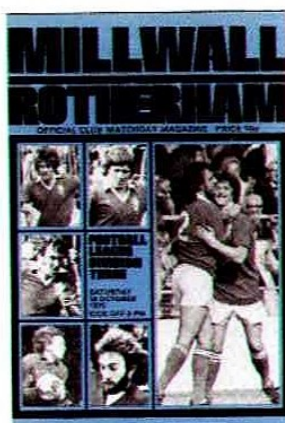
PLAYER PROFILE TOMMY WILSON



SWINDON TOWN IN 1965-66

Swindon Town finished seventh in the Third Division in 1965-66. Danny Williams' side lost just one of their opening eight games, then slammed six goals past York City and Mansfield. They failed to win any of their last seven matches. Keith East was leading marksman, whilst Don Rogers and John Trollope were ever-present.

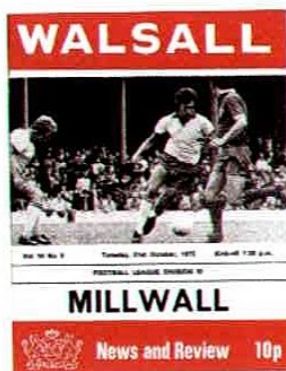

MILLWALL 3-1 ROTHERHAM UNITED 18th October 1975

Millwall maintained their 100 per cent home record with this victory over Rotherham United. Gordon Jago's side took the lead after 32 minutes with a great diving header by Barry Kitchener from Gordon Hill's corner. Rotherham equalised a minute later when Trevor Phillips sent Dick Habbin racing through to score. Terry Brisley hit the post and Hill had an effort ruled offside before Millwall regained the lead on 68 minutes courtesy of Trevor Lee's first goal for the club – a header from another Hill corner. Hill sealed victory two minutes from time with a 20-yard drive.

WALSALL 1-1 MILLWALL 21st October 1975

Millwall snatched a dramatic late equaliser against Walsall at Fellows Park. The Lions had an early escape when top scorer Alan Buckley wasted a great chance and Gordon Jago's side were under heavy pressure for much of the first half. Millwall gradually improved and Gordon Hill headed against the bar on 55 minutes. Walsall had a penalty appeal ignored after Colin Harrison was felled in the area by Alan Dorney. The Saddlers broke the deadlock on 86 minutes when Bernie Wright scored with a fierce shot on the run but Millwall levelled in the dying seconds. Tony Hazell whipped over a great ball for Phil Summerill, who beat Mick Kearns with a downward header at the far post.

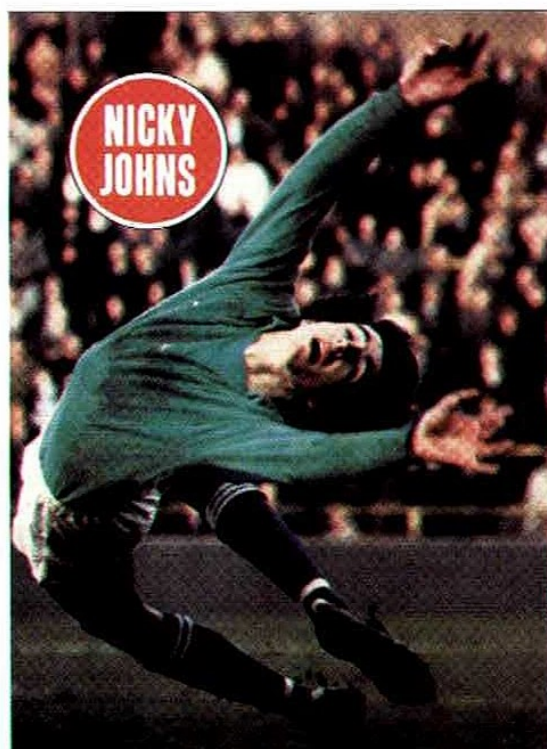
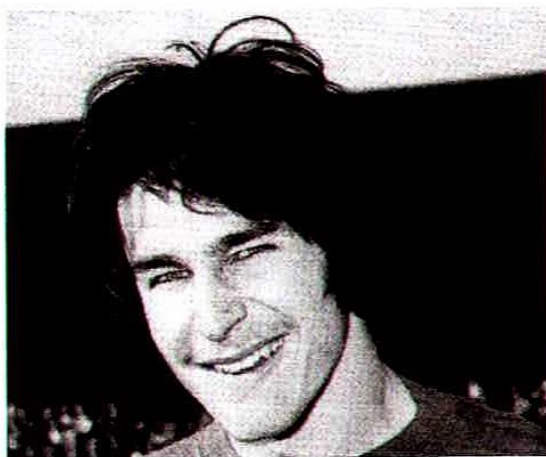
PLAYER PROFILE TONY HAZELL



Central defender Tony missed just one match in Millwall's 1975-76 promotion campaign. An England Youth international, he turned professional with QPR in October 1964 and starred in their 1966-67 Third Division title and League Cup 'double' triumph, 1967-68 promotion success, 1969-70 FA Cup run and 1972-73 promotion campaign. He followed manager Gordon Jago to Millwall for £10,000 in December 1974, netting six goals in 153 League games. Tony later reunited with Terry Venables at Crystal Palace in November 1978, winning promotion again in 1978-79, then with Charlton Athletic in 1980-81. He became a telecom engineer in Flackwell Heath.

SWINDON TOWN IN 1975-76

Swindon Town finished 19th in the Third Division in 1975/76. Danny Williams' side won only four of their first 17 games and suffered a 5-0 defeat at Bury and FA Cup exit at the hands of non-league Footing & Mitcham. However, they improved to hammer Aldershot 6-3 and Walsall 5-1. Leading scorer Trevor Anderson and John Trollope were ever-present.





LIONHEARTS NICKY JOHNS

Goalkeeper Nicky was just 18 and an engineering apprentice when Millwall manager Gordon Jago plucked him from non-league side Minchhead FC for just £6,000 February 1976 as understudy to Ray Goddard. However, he did not have to wait long for his first start and when Ray sustained an early season injury in August 1976, Nicky made his debut in an eight-goal League Cup thriller at Layer Road against Colchester United.

Nicky soon established himself in the first team with his performances showing the keeper's fine judgement when coming off his line, backed by excellent handling and the necessary bravery that comes with the territory. His performances as Millwall's number one ultimately led to his predecessor, the late Ray Goddard, seeking a transfer and moving to Wimbledon in February 1978. Nicky followed him out of The Den the following summer when boss Jago, now at Tampa Bay Rowdies, persuaded him to cross the Atlantic and embark on a career in the States. In September that year, however, Nicky was back in England and appeared in one League game for Sheffield United. By the end of 1978 he had joined Charlton Athletic and went on to play the majority of his professional career in a nine-year stint at The Valley. Nicky made 288 appearances for The Addicks and such was his popularity in SE7 he was voted Player of the Year in three out of four years in the early 1980s. YOU WEAR IT WELL

Having won their final three matches of the 1955/6 campaign there was at least a modicum of optimism in The Lions' camp in spite of finishing 22nd in Division Three South.

John Shepherd, who had announced his arrival in dramatic style with four goals on his debut at Leyton Orient back in 1952, was starting to find the net again on a regular basis and would weigh in with 24 in League and Cup during the 1956/7 season.

But it was a far more unlikely goalscorer who was to capture the headlines that year, as Millwall embarked on a dramatic run in the FA Cup which belied their lowly League standing.

Having negotiated a safe passage past Brighton, Margate and neighbours Crystal Palace in the first three rounds of the competition, The Lions were given no chance when paired with the mighty Newcastle United, Cup winners in three of the past six seasons, in Round Four.

In a bid to bolster a somewhat lightweight attack, manager Ron Gray had experimented with playing full back Stan Anslow (pictured right) at centre forward in some recent games, and the ploy had paid off to an extent, with Stan netting a hat-trick against Torquay and scoring again in the following League game against Palace.

Facing the formidable Magpies defence was likely to prove a much taller order, but on the day Anslow was the hero of the hour, scoring both goals in an heroic 2-1 win at The Den in front of a 45,000 crowd.

Sadly a 4-1 defeat at the hands of Birmingham City ended The Lions' progress in Round Five and that was to signal the end of the excitement in New Cross for a few years to come.

Jimmy Seed had taken over from Gray at the helm by the time Millwall finished 23rd in Division Three South in 1957/58 to become founder members of the new League Division Four and it would take four more seasons before another pair of

sharpshooters would propel the club upwards following Gray's return to the managerial hotseat.

The second half of the 1950s saw Millwall's kit change little, being predominantly a short sleeved royal blue shirt with a white V neck, white shorts and either blue and white striped socks or blue socks with a white top.

However, the swinging sixties were on the horizon and as fashions in general became more adventurous, this was reflected in new football kit designs.

The Lions were no exceptions in embracing this trend and suddenly fans at The Den were treated to the sight of their favourites trotting out in white shirts with a blue hoop round the chest and blue V neck, blue shorts and blue socks with a white top (see team group above).

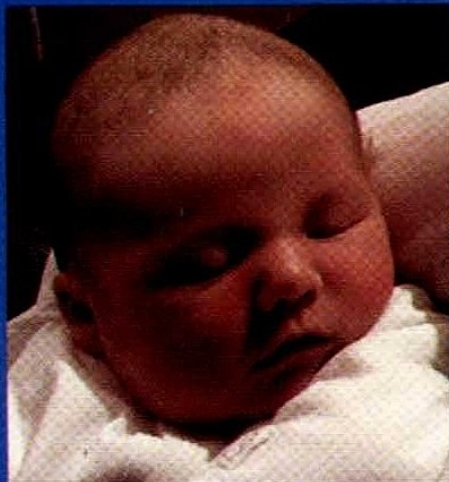

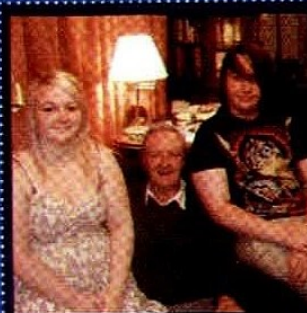

Millwall U18s shared the derby honours with QPR U18s in a keenly contested clash at Calmont Road last Saturday.

The Lions came flying out of the traps and the only surprise was that it took 12 minutes of intense pressure to break through and score the opening goal.

The irrepressible Ebere Eze had already seen a fine strike saved by the Hoops keeper before he got his name on the scoresheet with a stunning effort that saw him tricking his way past a defender and rifling an unstoppable shot from 16 yards.

Minutes later striker Mikael Ndjoli embarked on a positive run towards goal and then let fly with a stinging shot that keeper Marcin Brzozowski parried straight back into his path.

Ndjoli was to be denied again, however, and his follow-up effort was superbly pushed away.

The Lions kept the pressure on and could have doubled their tally midway through the first-half in a move involving both full-backs.

A raid on the left flank saw Noah Chesmain pick out overlapping James Brown on the right, and it took a splendid save by the Hoops keeper to prevent Brown's fierce drive from arrowing into the roof of the net.

The visitors' only real serious threat on goal in the opening 45 minutes came midway through the half when Dominic Power's fierce shot was expertly pushed away for a corner by Millwall keeper Ryan Sandford.

Millwall were a whisker away from regaining the lead just a couple of minutes later, but defender Rian Bray's bullet header from Chesmain's inviting free-kick flashed narrowly wide of the target.

However, the visitors could twice have secured what would have been a fortuitous win right at the death when Brandon Barzey's fierce shot crashed against the bar and then keeper Sandford did well to deny Josh Bowler's follow-up effort.

In the end a draw was just about the right result in a game high on commitment and entertainment from the two young teams.
