of the football club and the supporters.

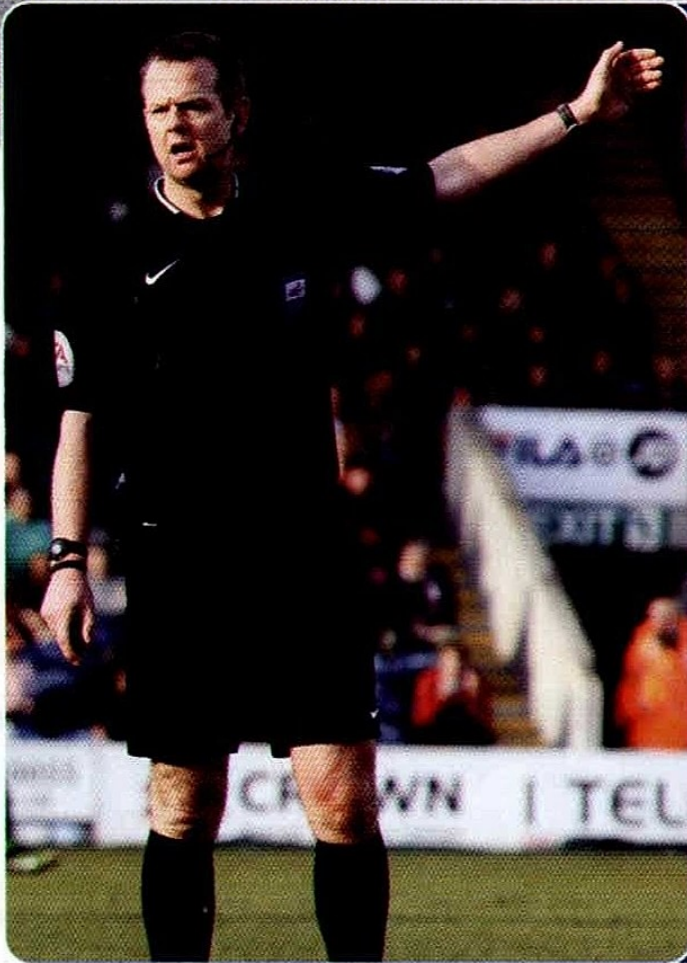
And as the players show a great desire to represent you, the fans, it's important that you give the players your support in return – positive support from the stands really does make a difference.

THE **AWAY** DRESSING ROOM

A break from their desperate league form might be just what Swindon Town need to bring some semblance of positivity to their season.

Last Saturday's last gasp 1-0 defeat at Wigan left The Robins next-to-bottom of League One and without a win since 5th September, some 11 matches ago.

In that time our visitors have gained only two draws and exited the Johnstone's Paint Trophy to Oxford, but it was their 2-0 defeat at Millwall that eventually spelled change at the top.

Mark Cooper, who had been in charge since August 2013, lost his position as manager and was replaced earlier this week by former Robins' midfielder, Martin Ling.

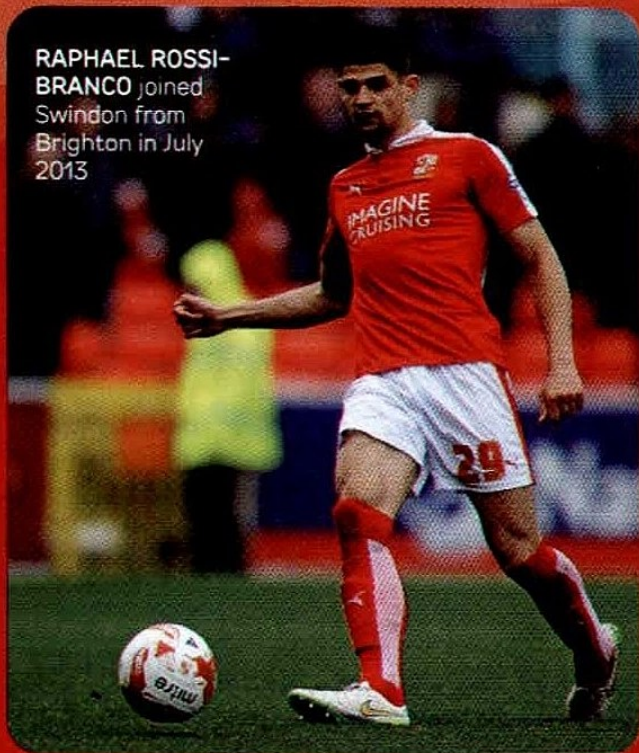
Cooper had guided Swindon to the League One play-off final last season, having kept his team in the top four since early November.

Unfortunately they met a supremely confident Preston team on the day, when a Jermaine Beckford hat-trick helped North End to a 4-0 win and a place in the Championship.

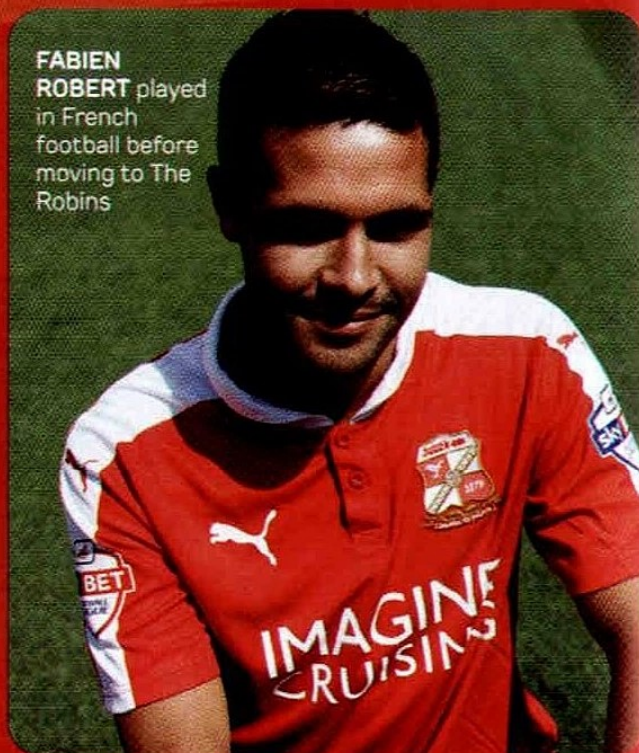
Our visitors showed no signs of a hangover when they defeated Bradford 4-1 on the opening day of this campaign, but they have won only twice since – at Southend and Crewe – and this afternoon will be desperate to impress the new man in charge.



RAPHAEL ROSSI-BRANCO joined Swindon from Brighton in July 2013

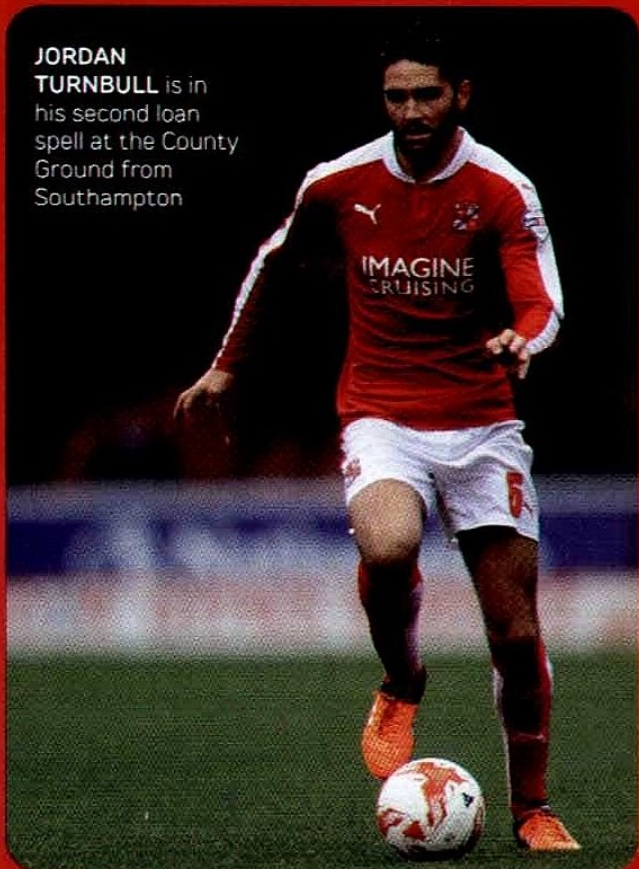

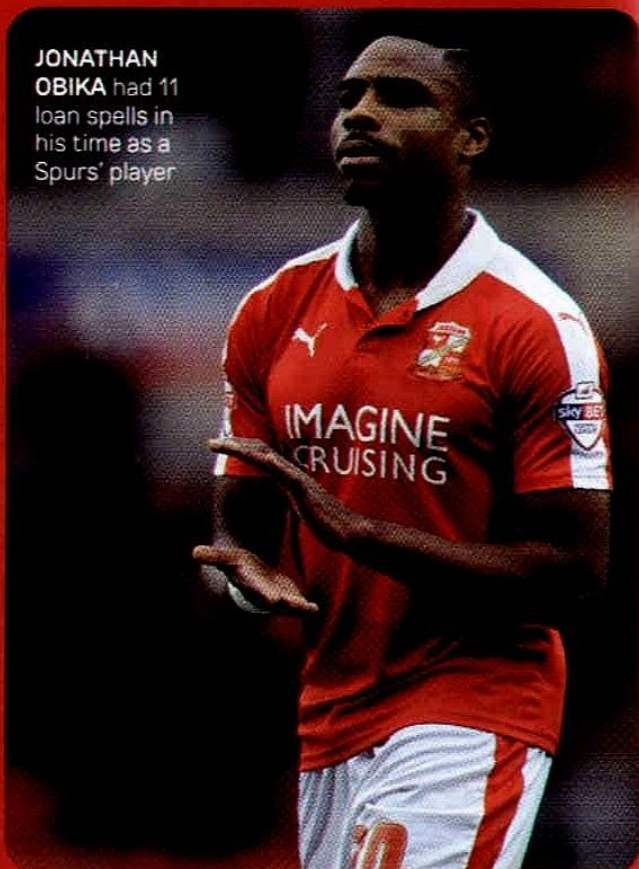

1 LAWRENCE VIGOUROUX

Lawrence is on loan at Swindon from Liverpool until the end of the season. The 21-year-old was snapped-up by Tottenham in 2012, before moving to Anfield in the summer of 2014 after leaving White Hart Lane. Last term the former Chilean youth international was a regular for The Reds' U21 side.

Providing back-up for Vigouroux is another 'keeper with Liverpool connections in **TYRELL BELFORD**, who moved to Swindon in the summer of 2013 following his release from the Anfield Academy. The 21-year-old made his Town bow in a Johnstone's Paint Trophy win over Plymouth in October 2013 and later helped secure Swindon's place in the area final by saving two penalties in a shoot-out win over Stevenage.

2 NATHAN THOMPSON

A product of our visitors' Academy, Nathan made his breakthrough into the first team during the 2012/13 campaign.

Aged 25 on Monday, the full-back has now made over 130 appearances for The Robins and is the current skipper at the County Ground.

Former Arsenal scholar **BRANDON ORMONDE-OTTEWILL** moved to the County Ground in July, while **JORDAN WILLIAMS** (Liverpool) and **JORDAN TURNBULL** (Southampton) are both with today's visitors on season-long loans.

Brazilian centre-half **RAPHAEL ROSSI-BRANCO** and **BRADLEY BARRY** (the nephew of Everton's Gareth Barry) both signed for Town having previously been with Brighton.

JAMES BROPHY penned a one-year deal with Swindon in the summer after playing in non-league football, whereas **KEVIN STEWART** is another loan signing from Liverpool, who played on loan at Cheltenham and Burton last season.

Meanwhile, Egyptian international **ADAM EL-ABD**, who started his career with over 340 games for Brighton, is on loan from Bristol City, having helped Bury to promotion last season in a temporary spell at Gigg Lane.

8 **YASER KASIM**

A former player with Brighton's Academy side, Yaser joined today's opponents ahead of the 2013/14 campaign.

In his time at the Amex Stadium, the 24-year-old played on loan at Luton and Macclesfield, while he has also represented Iraq at international level and played for his country at the 2015 Asian Cup in Australia.

Three players with experience in French football are all new to the County Ground this season.

FABIEN ROBERT signed a one-year contract in July after leaving Ligue 1 side FC Lorient, **MOMAR BANGOURA**, who started out with Marseille, arrived at the start of October and **JEREMY BALMY**, who made two substitute appearances for Notts County last season, was a youth player with Le Havre.

Norwich loanee **LOUIS THOMPSON**, whom Swindon sold to The Canaries in September 2014, has returned to the County Ground from Carrow Road for the second time after spending the whole of last term back with his first club.

DRISSA TRAORE, who was with Notts County last season, once represented Ivory Coast in an Olympic qualifier, **ANTON RODGERS** is the son of ex-Liverpool manager Brendan Rodgers and **WILL RANDALL** and **ELLIS IANDOLO** are 18-year-olds with just a handful of first team appearances.

IN ATTACK

10 **NICKY AJOSE**

Having played on loan at Swindon two seasons ago, Nicky returned to the County Ground in September after leaving Leeds.

The 24-year-old started his career with Manchester United and played on loan at Bury, before joining Peterborough in July 2011. He was loaned out by Posh to several other clubs, including Scunthorpe, Chesterfield and for a second spell with The Shakers.

BEN GLADWIN, who netted a hat-trick in Swindon's 4-2 win at Spotland in April, has just completed a month's loan from QPR, although our visitors were hoping to extend the deal this week. The 23-year-old joined Rangers at the start of the summer.

Much-travelled **JONATHAN OBIKA**, who had 11 loan spells during his time as a Tottenham player, equalled a club record by scoring in his first four games for Swindon, while another player with plenty of moves around the country, **WES THOMAS**, arrived on loan from Birmingham at the start of September.

JERMAINE HYLTON was recruited from non-league Redditch United in January and **JORDAN STEWART** is a Northern Ireland U19 international who moved to Wiltshire from Glentoran in August.

That leaves **HENRIK OJAMAA**, who penned a permanent deal with our visitors in September after most recently playing for Legia Warsaw, Motherwell and Norwegian side, Sarpsborg 08.

A look back at some of the strips worn by our opponents down the years, from the good to the bad to the sometimes ridiculous!

IT'S A BIT DIFFERENT...

Sometimes clubs who use famous kit companies for strips will end up with a template that, well... looks a bit strange.

There could have been a love of mountains behind the 2013/14 home kit and although it wasn't great, at least it was trying something new.

In an unwanted connection to the previous season's work of art, Swindon were unceremoniously dumped out of the FA Cup by Macclesfield again.

Could this over-ambitious shirt have worked better? Yes, imagine a third colour added to the bottom of the mountainous area, a line of piping in the colour of grass...



IT'S A CLASSIC

Sometimes clubs who use famous kit companies for their strips will end up with a template that, while it might look quite good, will be a bit nondescript with other clubs using something similar.

When Swindon released their Adidas away strip for the 2012/13 season, such concerns were forgotten, with a magnificent Boca Juniors-inspired blue and yellow outfit flying off the club shop shelves.

Not seen during the FA Cup that season after a disappointing home defeat to Macclesfield, the change kit would really have stood out on their travels; a real necessity when such choices are made.

While not a fan of the collar design, the reverse seam trim on the sleeves is good, as is the dedication to ensuring only two colours are used throughout.

In hindsight, it might have been an idea to see if the badge could have been in blue and yellow too, though I doubt such specifics would have been achievable.

IT'S MEMORABLE

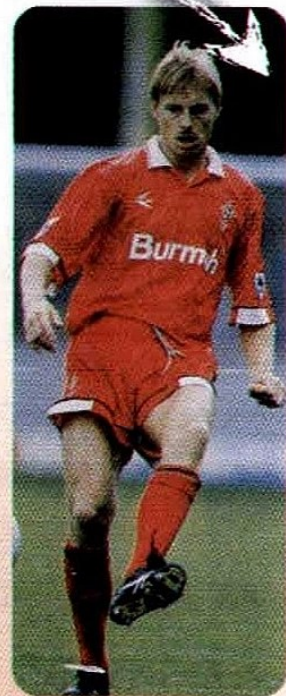
Swindon's season in the Premier League was a difficult one.

No wins until November, they were bottom for the majority of the campaign with little respite coming in the cup competitions.

A draw at home to fellow top-flight strugglers Ipswich was followed by a defeat in the replay wearing the strip pictured. The shadow patterned material was the same on both shirt and shorts (another feature of the experimental 1990s), whilst a keen eye will notice the subtle trim.

Green had been added to Town's palette and as an addition to red and white it was recognisable to The Robins for a number of years.

It was a shame when that little bit of green was dropped, apart from a brief return in 2006/07, and it's maybe something to think about in the future. But not while using the Himalayas for inspiration!

FA CUP TRIVIA

FIRST ROUND TIES



FIRST ROUND FIRST TIME

Dale didn't reach the first round of the FA Cup until the 1912/13 season when their opponents, as today, were Swindon Town.

Although they were only in the Southern League at the time, The Robins had reached the semi-final of the cup in 1910 and 1912 and proved too strong for Dale, winning 2-0 at Spotland.

A crowd of 8,801 saw the game, paying what were, at the time, record receipts of £306 12s 6d.

STANLEY, I PRESUME?

Despite joining the Football League in 1921, Dale still had to play in the qualifiers until the 1925/26 campaign, when they automatically entered the first round.

Their opponents were north-easterners West Stanley, who seemed set for a replay when they were holding Dale to a 1-1 draw at Spotland.

Unfortunately for the visitors, the game was abandoned and when it was replayed, Dale romped to a 4-0 win.

Excluding replays, Dale's full record in their FA Cup first round games is:

BEST-EVER

Dale's biggest win in the first round of the FA Cup came in November 1927 when Crook Town were thrashed 8-2 at Spotland.

Bert Whitehurst scored four goals, with Joe Clennell also completing a hat-trick, but with one goal less.

Our best away victories are 3-0 defeats of Rhyl in November 1949 and Nuneaton Borough in November 1986.

WORST-EVER

The worst of Dale's 38 defeats in the first round of the FA Cup came in November 1938 when we were beaten 7-3 in a high-scoring game at Halifax.

Our heaviest Spotland losses were in November 1966 and November 1971 when Barrow and Barnsley respectively won 3-1 here.

MOST FREQUENT

Dale have faced 63 different opponents in the first round of the FA Cup.

We have been drawn against Scunthorpe most often, being paired with them four times in 1931/32, 1956/57, 1979/80 and 1990/91.

Next in line are Wrexham, Halifax, Crewe, York and Workington, who have all been drawn against Dale on three occasions in round one.

ATTENDANCES

The highest crowd to watch Dale in the first round of the FA Cup is 26,596 at Arsenal in January 1920.

The best figure for a first round meeting at Spotland occurred in November 1970 when 13,879 saw a 2-0 win over Oldham.

The lowest first round gate involving Dale is 1,190 at Workington in November 1975.

The smallest crowd to turn up at Spotland is 1,554 for the visit of South Shields in November 1973.

Overall, the average attendance at Dale's first round matches is 5,625. Spotland has seen an average of 5,100, with the away ties averaging 5,678.

HOME & AWAY

Today's tie marks the first time Dale have been drawn at home in round one of the FA Cup in five years.

After being paired with FC United at this stage in 2010, we have since travelled to Bradford, Morecambe, Torquay and Northampton.

Indeed, Dale have never had more than four consecutive first round away draws, although that sequence has now happened five times.

In contrast, Dale were handed five consecutive first round home ties from 1970 to 1974.

Saturday 7th November 2009

Dale were almost on the end of an FA Cup shock when they travelled to play Luton on this day six years ago.

A poor defensive display, coupled with an injured goalkeeper in Kenny Arthur, saw Dale 3-0 down with less than half-an-hour played.

However, Keith Hill's half-time team-talk had the desired effect and Craig Dawson quickly pulled a goal back.

We were still 3-1 down with three minutes remaining, only for Joe Thompson to score two dramatic goals to force a replay.

Pictured we see Dale putting on the pressure that created the first of Thompson's efforts.

1970

Dale put only goal difference between themselves and a place outside the Third Division relegation zone after their best win of the season.

Top ten side WREXHAM were beaten 4-1 at Spotland on an afternoon when things eventually clicked into place for Dick Conner's men.

Graham Smith and Peter Gowans found the net for Dale in the first half, with Hughen Riley and Alf Arrowsmith completing the scoring late on.

Sadly, the win didn't inspire better form as Dale lost their next five league matches.

1987

Dale remained bottom of the Football League after another desperate home performance.

Eddie Gray's men had lost 4-1 to Colchester at Spotland in midweek, but the 3-2 loss to fellow strugglers SWANSEA CITY was in some respects even worse.

For 87 minutes Dale were second best and trailed 3-0, but two late goals gave the scoreline some undeserved respectability.

Lyndon Simmonds and Mark Gavin were the players on target, although their goals hardly raised a cheer from what remained of the 1,243 crowd.

Our congratulations as players go to Dan Youngs, Rochdale's official photographer, who last week raised over £600 for the Cystic Fibrosis Trust.



It was the sixth Saturday of the season and the fourth that Dale had spent on the road, so it was time for the Travellers Tales car to hit the highways and byways once again for the trip to the Midlands.



DEPARTURE

Once upon a time there were five regular Travellers Tales passengers – R17, Dingle, The Captain, TTYear and Young Jack.

Through various reasons that list has been whittled down in recent years and for the second consecutive weekend I (The Captain) was contemplating travelling by myself.

R17 was still playing Bergerac, Dingle was playing at being a dad, I thought TTYear was probably playing golf and Young Jack has probably got himself a Young Jackette!

Fortunately, the week before the game I got a text from Chuckleberry who was looking for a lift to Burton. I told her I had several spaces, one of which was taken by her and the other by Chuckleberry's mum!

That's right, a Traveller's mum makes Travellers Tales, so throughout this article I'm simply going to refer to her as 'Mother'.

Mother needed picking-up in Sudden, before we made our way to Milnrow to collect Chuckleberry.

Next time, I might save my time, money and potential damage to my mobile phone by lumping my life savings on a 1-0 Burton victory!

I'm not a regular listener of radio phone-in programmes, as they tend to be dominated by boring Premier League fans and Robbie Savage.

However, we had 'Radio Five Live' on the wireless on the way home and after their numerous news bulletins reporting on the Labour leadership result had ended, it was time for 606.

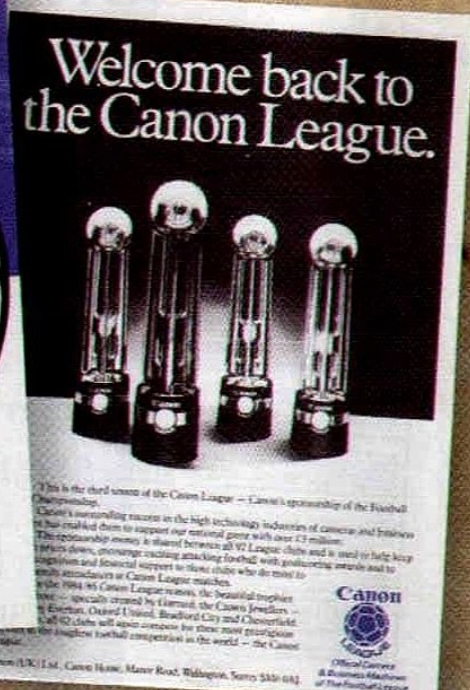

FACTS ON OUR VISITORS

Today Dale will be looking for revenge against a team which comprehensively beat Rochdale 4-0 at the County Ground, Swindon, back in October.

Since then Swindon have climbed to the heady heights of the fourth division while Dale have dropped down through dropped points and postponed matches.

Formed in 1887 Swindon were elected to the third division in 1920.

During their early third division (sixth) years, they had one of the leagues most prolific goalkeepers. In his first season at Swindon, (1962-27) Harry Morris scored 53 league and cup goals. During his eight years at Swindon, Harry scored 232 goals, twice scoring five goals in matches.

Swindon Town have spent their years drifting between the second and third divisions, their best position being fifth in the second division in the 1959-70 season.

'The Robins' won the Football League Cup as a third division club in 1969-70. In 1960 Swindon paid a record £750,000 to Southampton for David Peace.

They were relegated to the fourth division for the first time in 1982, and in 1983 Aston Villa paid a record £250,000 for Paul Rideout.

Swindon have had a most successful season. As well as riding high in the fourth division, Swindon have had a most successful Milk Cup season. After dispatching Torquay, 'The Robins' did the division proud by bundling Laverie McMillen's multi-million pound Sunderland better was to follow as 12,110 ecstatic Swindon supporters saw Peter Coyne's 10th minute goal put the mighty Sheffield Wednesday out of the Milk Cup and earn a fourth round tie at Ipswich. The bubble burst at Portman Road, but such a spirited and successful cup run must show to the high and mighty of the 'fashionable' first division clubs that they should leave the league intact.

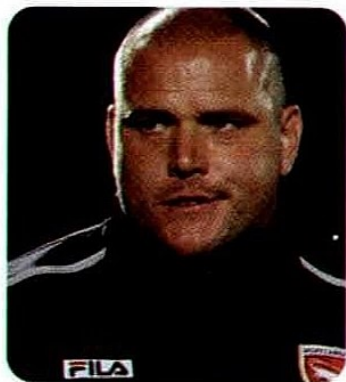
Morecambe will be looking for a return to winning ways in their cup double-header over the next four days.

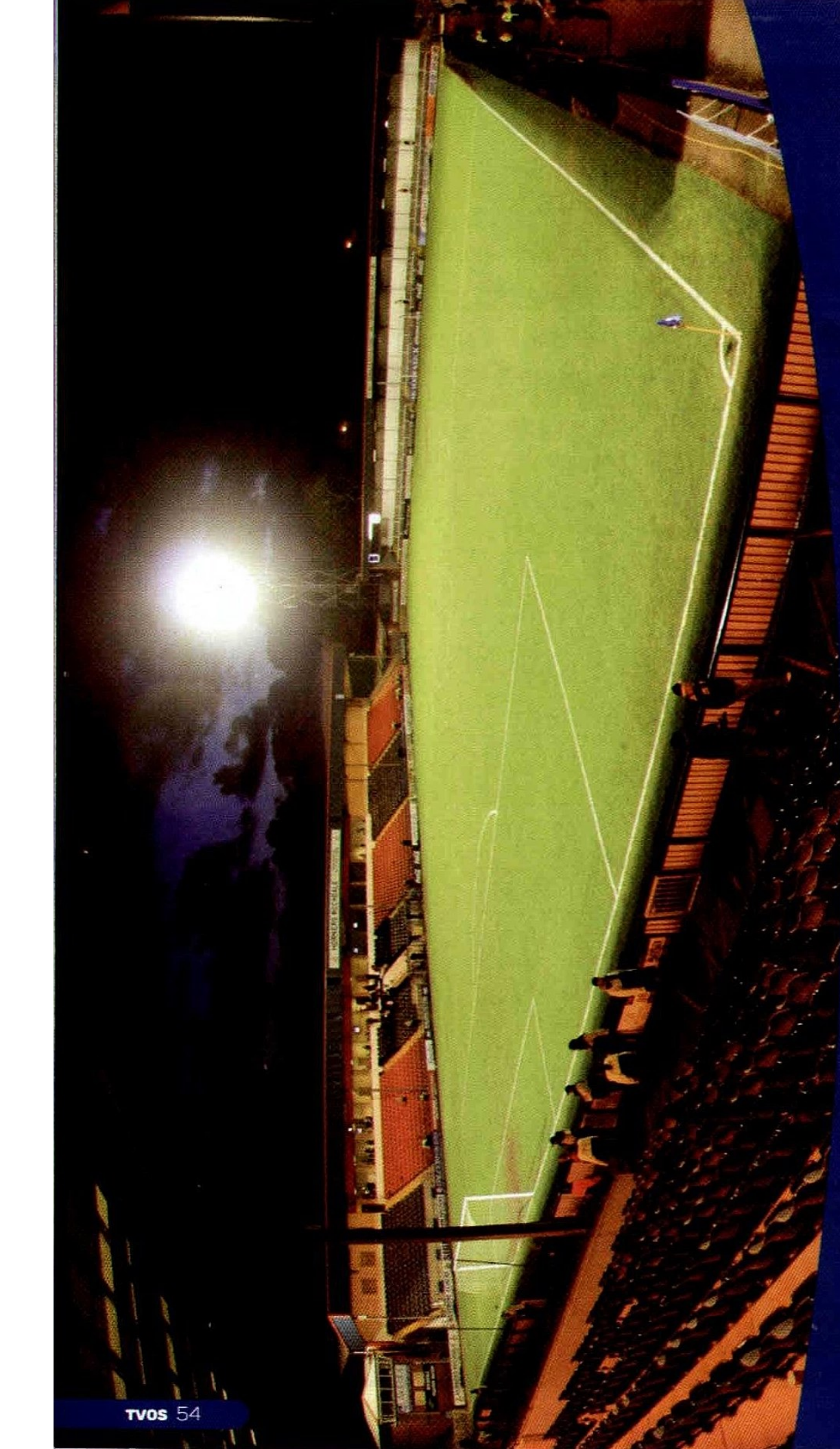
