







It's something that everybody at Swindon Town should aspire to: to have that mentality and that drive and that commitment. In the spirit of 'Amo', we can't lose.





Having recently lost his battle to cancer, he showed us how to fight when the odds are stacked against you. Thank you for all your help 'Armo', you're truly an inspiration and everyone's thoughts are with your family during this sad time.

It's been a season of highs and lows and I think, if we're honest, one we're thankful to see the back of. With a huge turnover of players last summer, followed by numerous injuries and then changes in management, it's been a season of upheaval and one where it has been difficult to find our rhythm. Having shared a car journey home with Louis – and without getting into comments about the referee – I know he wanted the opportunity to play one last time at the County Ground to thank the fans, players and staff properly, so we're gutted he's not able to do that. I think it's clear to see this club holds a special place in mine and Louis' hearts; Louis has played here since his very first team at Under-8s and it's always mixed emotions seeing him return to Norwich. SHREWS

The Shrews will be playing League 1 football again next season, after clinching promotion to the third tier last term.

Micky Mellon's side secured an automatic return to League 1 almost a year after departing it when they were promoted from League 2 at the end of the 2014/15 campaign. This term, the Shrews have found life in the third tier a little more difficult and secured their status in the division last weekend despite being on the wrong end of a 4-3 thriller at Greenhous Meadow. Despite fighting back from 3-0 down against Peterborough, the Shropshire side were stung by an injury-time strike from former midfielder, Jon Taylor. Blackpool's home loss at the hands of Wigan and Doncaster's defeat at already-relegated Crewe Alexandra pushed them further towards the drop but





ensured Shrewsbury would be playing League 1 football next term. In the cup competitions, the Shrews beat Championship side, Blackburn in the Capital One Cup before bowing out of the competition at Crystal Palace. In the FA Cup, they reached the fourth round where they hosted Championship Play-Off contestants, Sheffield Wednesday, losing 3-2 despite twice coming from behind.

Form appears to have deserted Micky Mellon's men of late with just one win from their last ten. That came courtesy of a 3-2 win at promotion-chasing Gillingham. That came off the back of a run of just five defeats from their previous 14, stretching back to the start of 2016. The Shrews will be hoping to avenge their 1-0 defeat to Town just before Christmas when they come to SN1 this afternoon.



JACK GRIMMER



MARK HALSTEAD

A native of Blackpool, Halstead started his career with the Tangerines but would only make a handful of appearances at Bloomfield Road, including a substitute appearance against Chelsea in the Premier League. The stopper spent time on loan with Burscough, Hyde, Kettering, Barrow and Stockport County. Made the switch to Shrewsbury in June 2014 but only made two appearances for the Shrews last term. He has made 19 appearances for the Shropshire side this season.



MAT SADLER

An experienced campaigner, Sadler came through the ranks at Birmingham City, going on to make over 50 appearances for the Blues in a six-year stint at St. Andrews. After leaving the Midlands, he went on to ply his trade for the likes of Watford, Crawley, Stockport and Walsall, even managing a season-long stay with the Shrews in 2010/11. Was most recently at Rotherham before signing a permanent deal at Greenhouse Meadow in May 2015.



ZAK WHITBREAD

The Houston, USA-born defender started his career at Liverpool but would only make eight appearances for the Anfield side before joining Millwall on loan. He completed a permanent move to the Den in 2006 and would go on to spend four years in the capital. After two-year stints with Norwich and Leicester respectively, he was most recently with Derby County before joining Shrewsbury in October 2015. Has featured regularly since, reeking up over 20 appearances.




JACK GRIMMER

The defender is currently on loan at Greenhouse Meadow from Fulham. After starting his career with Aberdeen in his native Scotland, he made the switch to Craven Cottage in the summer of 2012 and has made nearly 20 appearances for the London side. Towards the end of the 2013/14 season, he spent time on loan with Port Vale before spending a month with Shrewsbury last term. Joined the Shropshire side for a second time in January.



NATHANIEL KNIGHT-PERCIVAL

A graduate of the youth ranks at non-league side, Histon, Knight-Percival would go on to help the Cambridgeshire club achieve two promotions before moving on to Wrexham, where he became a full-time professional. His form with the Welsh side prompted Darren Ferguson to bring him to Peterborough United. He was part of the Posh side that was beaten in the 2014 Play-Offs before moving to Shrewsbury in June of that year.



SHAUN WHALLEY

Having started his career at Chester, Whalley then spent two years at Accrington Stanley, making over 50 appearances. He moved on to Wrexham and Southport, racking up over a century of outings for the latter. In the summer of 2013, he signed for Luton Town, helping the Hatters clinch promotion back to the Football League. He made the switch to Shrewsbury in June 2015 and has gone on to make 30 appearances for the Shrews this term.



LARNELL COLE

Currently on loan from Fulham, Cole was once a trainee at Manchester United, making a substitute appearance for the Red Devils. In January 2014, he put pen to paper on a deal with Fulham but has spent the majority of his spell with the London side out on loan. After a stint with MK Dons in 2014, he spent the first part of this season on loan at Greenhouse Meadow before re-joining the Shrews later in January.



JAMES WESOLOWSKI

The Sydney-born midfielder started his career in his native Australia before signing for Leicester City. During his six-year stay with the Foxes, he made nearly 50 appearances but also spent time on loan at Cheltenham, Dundee United, and Hamilton Academical. He then spent the 2010/11 campaign with Peterborough United then joined Oldham Athletic in August 2011. He made over a century of appearances for the Latics ahead of a move to Shrewsbury in June 2014.



JACK HENDRY

Once on the books at Partick Thistle, the 20-year-old Scotsman made a handful of appearances for the Glasgow side before being snapped up by Wigan Athletic in September 2015. Hendry only made three appearances for the Latics before joining the Shrews on loan in March.

DOMINIC SMITH

The young defender is a graduate of the academy at Shrewsbury and made his Shrews bow in October 2015 against Colchester. So far this season, he has made 23 appearances for the Shropshire side in all competitions.

RITCHIE WELLENS

The veteran midfielder is currently on loan from Doncaster Rovers. Once a trainee at Manchester United, he has plied his trade for the likes of Blackpool and Leicester before signing for Doncaster for a second time in August 2013.

**ABU OGOGO**

Ogogo was once on the books at Arsenal but didn't make an appearance for the Gunners, spending time out on loan at Barnet during the 2008/09 campaign. Later that summer, he completed a permanent move to Dagenham & Redbridge and would go on to rack up an impressive 252 appearances for the Daggers during his six-year stay. In June 2015, he joined Shrewsbury and has been a regular for Micky Mellon's side this term.

**ANDY MANGAN**

An experienced striker with over 300 appearances to his name, Mangan re-joined the Shrews in January 2016 after spending the first part of the season with Tranmere Rovers. He started his career with Blackpool before plying his trade for the likes of Accrington Stanley, Forest Green Rovers, Wrexham and Fleetwood. Helped the Shrews clinch promotion last season, weighing in with ten goals before adding a further six to his tally since January.

He then spent two years at Tranmere Rovers where he netted ten goals from 61 outings. Towards the end of his time at Prenton Park, he spent five months on loan at Bury then signed for Shrewsbury in July 2014. Since moving to Greenhouse Meadow, he has bagged 16 goals in all competitions for the Shrews and has seven goals to his name this term.

The midfielder started his career at Barnsley before spending time on loan with Chesterfield, Scunthorpe and Hyde. Joined Shrewsbury in July 2014 and is closing in on 60 appearances for the Shrews.

JAMES WALLACE

Having started his career at Everton, Wallace spent time on loan with the likes of Stockport and Tranmere before joining the Wirral side in June 2012. After two years at Prenton Park, he signed for Sheffield United and joined the Shrews on loan in January.

KYLE VASELL

Currently on loan from Peterborough United, the striker started out in the non-leagues with Bishop's Cleeve. Since joining the Shrews he has spent time on loan with Oxford United as well as a short stint with Dagenham & Redbridge earlier this season.








Scouting Report







What a perfect way to mark your 150th appearance with a goal at Rochdale last weekend?

Definitely - it's been a long time coming. It's about two or three years since I was last on the scoresheet and that was a 2-2 draw as well so it seems to be a bit of an omen. It was nice - it was a good ball in from 'Doughts' and I managed to get a head on it and flick it on at the near post. I'll take that all day.

Are you already looking forward to next season?

Yeah, definitely. It's a fresh start. Everyone comes in with renewed hope and expectation for us. We've got a little bit more of a southerly league next year which is something to look forward to! And potentially some big games: the likes of Bristol Rovers and Oxford could come up then you've got Bolton and Charlton that are coming down so it's a season to look forward to and hopefully one that can be prosperous for us.

The last time Shrewsbury came to the County Ground for the final home fixture turned out to be a defining moment in Town's history.

Some 20,273 filed through the gates that Tuesday evening to witness the club's first ever promotion - from the old third division to the second. In his seventh season in charge, Bert Head had seen his young squad (average age 23) triumph with a game to spare.

'I have always been confident - right from

the early stages - that our youth policy would see us into Division Two', he said afterwards.

The decisive goal did not come until just two minutes from time. John Stevens raced on to a through ball, beating the onrushing keeper Paul Miller to the touch. But as a defender came towards him, he tapped the ball out wide on the left to Roger Smart.

The inside-left looked up before cleverly placing the ball beyond the retreating Miller, who got a hand to it but was powerless to prevent it from going over the line.


Miller was the star of the show on the night. Swindon were far from their best, but on several occasions he alone

prevented his side from going behind much earlier.

But Town were lucky not to concede early in each half.

After the break home keeper Mike Turner diverted a low John Gregson shot, but only into the path of Frank Clarke - who lobbed the ball into an open goal. Owen Dawson seemed to appear from nowhere to head the ball out from under the bar.

The first clear cut chance of the game, however, went to Shrews' winger Graham French - just 18 - who put his effort wide. But the England youth winger did enough for Bert Head to invest a then sizeable £10,500 in bringing him to Swindon just three months later.

"We now have a 12-strong board, plus Rob as an external director, as well as 10 Trust officers, each with their own specific responsibilities."





While everyone else's season has finished, the academy's season is still going on for a little bit longer.

Our 2001/02 group fly out to the Cayman Islands on Monday where they will take part in a pretty prestigious tournament with 12 teams spread over the three different islands. The trip is being funded by the players, the staff and the Cayman government, in particular the Minster for Sport and the Minster for Tourism as well as Grasspiece Promotions. It's a huge tournament that's been going on for the last couple of years but this year is the biggest tournament they've hosted which tells you something when the likes of Manchester City, LA Galaxy, Houston Dynamo, Orlando City and DC United have been invited. That puts a huge challenge upon our players but one that the players and coaches are looking forward too.

Alan McLoughlin is going to take the side because I've got to conclude my UEFA PRO licence next week which will be a big personal milestone.

The boys will spend a week out there and they have a really full-on schedule. The boys will not get to the Caymans until 10.30 (4.30am our time). Then their first game is at 3:30 in the afternoon the following day. With humidity at 89% and temperatures in the high 90s there is lots to take into consideration. That's why it's so important that the boys are able to manage their time

effectively to make sure they're going to give their maximum in the tournament. There is also a quick turnaround with games and we've got to make sure fluids are replenished. They will be weighed before and after the game so that Tom, our physio can replenish the fluids that are lost.

It's also that time of the year where all the players will come in for their final reviews. We've changed the process a little bit this year with handover documents. All players will receive one as well as the coaches because the boys will move on to different coaches next season. The documents give them key information about every individual - even though the coaches tend to know the players all over the academy, it picks out the fine details that the specific player might need next season as part of his individual learning plan.

We're also gearing up for the introduction of the PMA system which is a huge online system that will aid the management of the academy. Not only is this important for the staff but more importantly, it gives the players some ownership with the ability to input data for themselves.

The Day Release Programme is also winding down. As well as being a huge benefit to the players, it's a huge benefit to the school. Day Release is an essential part of their

development and we've seen an enhancement in their educational requirements. Their grades have increased and that's a testament to the players.

We are also going to sit down as a group of staff and go through what we might need to change within the syllabus for next year and try and tweak it to incorporate a bit more but overall it's been a fantastic season. We've had yet more first team debuts for the youth team players which is fantastic news. It's important that we create a genuine pathway to the first team, not just for the youth team but to aid recruitment at the club. It's important that we can show that there is a pathway, we can show that there is success and more importantly, if you are good enough regardless of age, the boss and the first team management will trust our judgement and give these boys an opportunity, such as Will Henry last weekend, which was fantastic to see. We know there are more but we have just got to keep working away. We've got to make the transition a little bit easier to help these boys make the grade and increase our productivity.
