





his afternoon, Swindon Town visit the ABAX as the EFL season begins to get into full swing with both sides looking for promotion in Posh's first televised fixture of the campaign.

Swindon, managed by Luke Williams, endured a difficult season in 2015/16 and will be hoping to make great strides towards promotion having signed keeper Lawrence Vigouroux on a permanent deal from Liverpool, Conor Thomas on a free transfer from Coventry, Lloyd Jones on Ioan from Liverpool, Michael Doughty and Darnell Furlong on Ioan from QPR

and John Goddard from

Meanwhile, a number of players have left the County Ground with Nicky Ajose leaving for fellow League One outfit Charlton, Miles Storey moving to Aberdeen and Michael Smith signing for Portsmouth with a number of players also being released.

Posh have pit their wits against Swindon Town on many occasions in recent years. In the first leg of the semi-final of the Johnstones Paint Trophy in 2014, the two clubs played out a thrilling 2-2 draw at the ABAX with an own goal from Raphael Branco swiftly followed by Kyle Vassell scoring giving Posh an early two goal lead in

the tie before Nile Ranger pulled a goal back and an unfortunate own goal from Shaun Brisley evened the scores.

Swindon's last match game on August 20th, a 1-0 success over Port Vale at the County Ground. Swindon were set to face rivals Bristol Rovers last Saturday, but the Sky Bet League One fixture was abandoned after 60 minutes by match referee Oliver Langord due to the adverse other conditions.

The game was goalless although Robins defender James Sendells-White headed againt the woodwork before Yaser Kasim and Luke Norris both went close for the home side.


LAWRENCE VIGOUROUX

An athletic keeper who was with Swindon on loan during the last campaign. Vigouroux is a strong shot stopper and a good distributer of the ball. On loan from Liverpool, he has previously been with Tottenham as a youth player and spent time with Hyde on loan.



BRANDON ORMONDE-OTTEWILL

A former Arsenal youth player, Ormande-Ottewill signed for Swindon in July 2015 and has made 32 appearances since. A quick and direct full back, he is a bright prospect for the Wiltshire club with his defence capabilities and his keenness to get balls into the box at the other end of the field.




JAMIF SENDLES-WHITE


DARNELL FURLONG


LLDYD JONES


ANTON RODGERS


YASER KASIM


JOHN GODDARD


JORDAN YOUNG


JORDAN STEWART


JERMAINE HYLTON





Syrett passed away peacefully at home and we would like to offer our condolences to his family at what is sure to still be a difficult time.



EFL SKY BET LEAGUE ONE

LEAGUE ONE REVIEW

eteran Marcus Tudgay struck to earn Coventry a draw with former hosts Northampton at Sixfields. The Cobblers - who allowed Coventry to groundshare for a season two years ago - looked as if they were destined to take their first League One win of the season when Harry Beautyman put them in front on the half hour. Beautyman started the move in midfield and was in the area to turn home Matty Taylor's shot.

Bury produced an amazing comeback from three goals down at half-time to earn a point in a thriller at Walsall. Walsall led on six minutes as Erhun Oztumer and Andreas Makris combined to tee up Kieron Momis to drill home from 10 yards. The Saddlers doubled their lead after 14 minutes as Oztumer pounced on an error from Shakers defender Leon Barnett to fizz a 25-yarder into the bottom comer. It was 3-0 on 32 minutes as Simeon Jackson stole in at the near post to poke Makris' cross past Ben Williams from close range.

Walsall could have been out of sight by the break but Williams twice foiled Jackson one-on-one - and Bury were back in it with two goals in the first five minutes of the second half. Barnett drilled home a 47th-minute comer from 10 yards and then nodded down a high ball for new signing James Vaughan to make it 3-2 from similar range two minutes later. Danny Mayor lashed home Bury's leveller from 15 yards on 66 minutes - and the Shakers could have won it two minutes later but Vaughan's half-volley flashed inches over.

Bolton's 100 per cent start to the season came to an end as a 90th-minute stunner from Ademola Lookman earned Charlton a point. The 18-year-old forward came off the bench to strike the ball past Trotters keeper

Mark Howard from 20 yards. And another Charlton sub Brandon Hanlan could have won it right at the death, but his header hit the side-netting. Bolton had taken the lead through Gary Madine in the 53rd minute after good work from Liam Trotter on the wing.

A first-half double from Steve Morison inspired Millwall to victory at Chesterfield, who were beaten at home for the first time this season. Morison pounced after Shane Ferguson opened the scoring and although Sam Hird pulled one back in the second half, it was too late to rescue the Spireites. Both teams could have scored in the first 90 seconds with Shaun Williams striking the bar from the edge of the area before Jordan Archer saved from Gboly Ariyibi. Millwall found the net in the 13th minute when an excellent move started by Williams was finished by Ferguson, who fired low past Ryan Fulton from 15 yards.

Morison put the visitors in control with two goals in the space of four minutes, the first a sharp finish in the 38th minute from just inside the area and the second a precise lob over Fulton from 30 yards. Chesterfield reduced the arrears in the 65th minute when Hird headed in a free-kick but Millwall held on for a well deserved three points. Port Vale continued their good start to the campaign with a 3-1 win over Scunthorpe, Fleetwood beat Phil Brown's Southend United 2-0 while Gillingham won a five goal thriller at Shrewsbury. Rochdale and AFC Wimbledon and Bradford and Oldham both drew 1-1 while Sheffield United beat Oxford United 2-1.

Swindon's fixture with Bristol Rovers was abandoned in the second half at 0-0 due to the adverse weather conditions.

Fry denounced it as "complete rubbish, in fact we were disgraceful!"



eterborough United manager Grant
McCann was a busy man on transfer
deadline day this week, making a number of
exciting signings and allowing several of his fringe
players to depart the ABAX Stadium.

With goalkeeper Ben Alnwick seeing his contract with the club cancelled after requesting to leave the club over last weekend, Posh had to move quickly to secure the signing of another shot-stopper and Tottenham Hotspur custodian Luke McGee agreed a loan move until 2nd January 2017.

McGee is third choice behind Michel Vorm and Hugo Lloris at White Hart Lane and has trained alongside those two keepers for the last few years. McGee wasn't the only arrival from Spurs with exciting winger Nathan Oduwa agreeing a similar loan move.

Oduwa lit up the Scottish League last season during a loan spell with Glasgow Rangers, helping Mark Warburton's men to promotion into the Premier League. McCann described Oduwa as someone who will 'get fans off their seats' and will complement the attacking threat already in the squad.

Young goalkeeper Dion-Curtis Henry joined Boston United on a loan deal until January 1st while Striker Joe Gormley made a loan switch to Scotland.

The former Cliftonville striker joined Scottish Premier League side St. Johnstone untill early January, with the front man set to go straight into their squad for their next league fixture against Partick Thistle.

Defender Kgosi Ntlhe has joined Sky Bet League Two side Stevenage where he will link up with former team-mates Andrew Fox, Tom Conlon and Charlie Lee. The terms of that deal are unspecified.








