The Shakers have made a decent start to the 2016/17 campaign as they look to reach the Championship for the first time in nearly two decades...

After gaining automatic promotion from the Football League's basement division two seasons ago, Bury were solid if unspectacular as they finished 16th during their first campaign back in League One last term. However, there were a few highlights on the way including an impressive 3-1 victory away at Sheffield United in September 2015.

In-fact, the Shakers were sitting pretty in the higher reaches of League One by the start of October after carving out an incredible fivegame winning run. But, as winter arrived the wheels fell off as Bury won only twice in eleven games between November and February.

However, despite an indifferent finish to the season, the club did enjoy a run to the Fourth Round of the FA Cup, eventually falling to a 3-1 defeat to Hull City.

But things could look different this season with Bury having made a solid start following an impressive summer in the transfer window. A

exciting young talent was brought into the club with players in the ilk of James Vaughan, Zeli Ismail, Chris Brown, Niall Maher and former Norwich City defender Leon Barnett all putting pen to paper on deals at Gigg Lane.

And the new-look squad seems to have gelled nicely with the Shakers currently riding high in seventh place in League One, following two victories and a draw in their last three league outings. James Vaughan, who can count the likes of Everton and Derby County among his former clubs, has hit three goals for his new team already while Leon Barnett and Anthony Kay form a formidable partnership at the back.

And Bury have reason to be confident ahead of the game this afternoon having not suffered defeat at The County Ground since November 2006.



DANGERMAN

JAMES VAUGHAND

R&WTAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF BURY'S DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

Having signed for Everton at the age of nine, the powerhouse forward signed his first professional contract in the summer of 2005 and he went on to make history later that year, notching against Crystal Palace to overtake James Milner as the Premier League's youngest scorer at 16 years and 271 days, in addition to taking the crown of the Toffee's youngest top flight goalscorer away from Wayne Rooney. However, Vaughan could not settle at Everton and went on to have loan spells with Derby County, Leicester City and Crystal Palace.

before sealing a permanent move to Norwich City. A stint with Huddersfield Town would follow before the 28-year-old achieved a lifelong ambition by signing for his boyhood Birmingham club However, Vaughan - who has represented England at U17, U19 and U21 level and has racked up over £3.5 million in transfer fees - dropped down the pecking order at St Andrews and joined Bury in late August 2016 after being released, where he has scored three goals so far.

With his brute strength and ability to find the back of the net, Vaughan will no doubt be one to watch at SN1 this afternoon.

MEET THE REST...

PAUL RACHUBKA

The veteran keeper can count the likes of Manchester United, Charlton Athletic, Leeds United and Huddersfield Town among his former clubs – has been with Bury since the summer.

KEAN BRYAN

A box-to-box midfielder, Bryan has been with Manchester City since the age of eleven and joined Bury on Deadline Day on a season-long loan deal.

SCOTT BURGESS

A product of the Shakers Youth Academy, Burgess is a dynamic attacking midfielder with an eye for goal. Spent the latter part of last season on loan at Norwegian side Bergsoy.

ANTHONY DUDLEY

Having risen through the Academy ranks at Gigg Lane, the striker finished with over 20 goals as Bury's youth team won the Youth Alliance North West Championship last season.

NIALL MAHER

A summer signing at Gigg Lane having been released by Bolton Wanderers at the end of the 2015/16 campaign. The full-back put pen to paper on a one-year deal with the Shakers.

GEORGE MILLER

An exciting prospect with an eye for goal, George is the nephew of former Premiership referee Mark Halsey. Miller is another product of Bury's thriving youth system.

TOM WALKER

Another player who joined the Shakers on Transfer Deadline Day. The midfielder is on loan from Bolton and made his first-team debut for Wanderers against Leeds United in January 2015.

JOHN RUDDY

The tall Scot - also known as "Jock" - is highly-rated at Bury and has already attracted plenty of interest from clubs at the lop of the footballing pyramid.

BEN WILLIAMS



The 33-yearold goalkeeper joined Bury over the summer after rejecting a new deal at Bradford City and brings a wealth

of experience to Gigg Lane. Williams featured in the Scottish FA Cup Final and the UEFA Europa League during his time with Hibernian and he's made over 480 appearances so far in his career.



ANTHONY KAY

Kay penned a two-year deal at Gigg Lane in the summer after bringing his lengthy association with MK Dons to an end. The

ball-playing defender started his career with boyhood club Barnsley and went on to achieve promotion with Huddersfield Town during the 2011-12 campaign. Has amassed over 573 games during his career.

TOM SOARES



Beginning his career with Crystal Palace in 2003, the reliable midfielder scored ten goals in 163 appearances at Selhurst Park before sealing a £1.25m move to Stoke City.

However, he managed just 12 games for the Potters and was shipped out on loan to Charlton Athletic, Sheffield Wednesday and Hibernian before finding a permanent home at Bury in 2012, where he has been a regular fixture in the Starting XI ever since.

HALLAM HOPE



Enjoyed a successful stint at Gigg Lane at the tail end of 2013/14 after arriving on loan from Everton, becoming the first Bury player to score a league

hat-trick since August 1999 with three goals in the final game of the season against Portsmouth, Following a brief loan spell at Sheffield Wednesday, Hope returned to the Shakers on a permanent deal in January 2015.

LEON BARNETT



Perhaps the most impressive signing made by Bury in the close season, the vastly experienced centre-back will add plenty of steel to the

Shakers' back-line. Signing for West Bromwich Albion for an initial fee of E2.5 million in July 2007, Barnett has gone on to win promotion to the Premier League three times in his career.

GREG LEIGH



The former England U19 international joined the Manchester City Academy in 2004 before enjoying a hugely

successful loan spell with Crewe during the 2014/15 season. Leigh sealed a move to Bradford City after being released by Man City, before signing a two-year deal with Bury in the summer.

NEIL DANNS



A seasoned pro who has been a constant fixture in the Football League since first turning professional, Danns signed a two-year deal with the Shakers

in July after impressing whilst on trial. The midfielder was a pivotal figure in Colchester United's promotion to the Championship in 2006, exploits that led to a £500,000 move to Birmingham City. Danns has also secured big moves to Crystal Palace and Leicester City.

ZELI ISMAIL



Regarded as an exciting talent, the young winger signed for Bury in June after being let go by Wolverhampton

Wanderers. Born in Albania, Zeli has represented England at U16 and U17 level and rose through the ranks at Wolves' Academy System. Ismail has scored one goal for Bury so far this

NATHAN CAMERON



A strong, powerful defender, Birminghamborn Cameron started his career with Coventry City

and made 52 appearances for the Sky Blues. Despite a difficult start to life with Bury, Cameron was named club captain in 2014 and he was crowned the club's 2014-15 Player of the Season.

JACOB MELLIS



After signing a two-year deal with the Shakers following his release by Blackpool at the end of the 2014/15 campaign, the

midfielder endured a frustrating first season at Gigg Lane which was ravaged by injury. Was a member of the Chelsea team that reached the final of the FA Youth Cup under former Real Madrid Assistant Boss Paul Clement in 2008.

KELVIN ETUHU



Another product of the Manchester City Academy, the energetic midfielder made his first-team debut for the Sky Blues against Bolton Wanderers

in 2008 and scored his first Premier League goal against Bolton Wanderers in a 4-2 win. Etuhu was snapped up by Bury prior to the start of the 2014/15 campaign, where he played a key role in their promotion from League Two.

TOM POPE



A player who knows where the goal is at this level, the striker joined Bury on a three-year contract after leaving Port Vale at the end of the 2014/15 season. Scoring goals

wherever he has gone, Pope plundered 31 goals for Port Vale to help the Valiants gain promotion from League Two during the 2012/13 campaign, stunning form that landed the forward several accolades. Leads Bury in scoring this scoson with four goals to his name so far.



DAVID FLITCROFT

Asked to fill the hot-seat at Gigg Lane in December 2013, Flitcroft has proved to be a positive influence on the Shakers.

Flitcroft began his footballing days with Preston North End, where he spent four years before sealing a move to Chester City.

That move proved to be a successful one for the midfielder who racked up over 200 first-team appearances for City, before securing a transfer to Rochdale in 1999 where he helped the Dale reach the Division Three Play-Offs in 2002.

Further spells at Macclesfield Town and Bury followed before Flitcroft hung up his boots, amassing over 500 outings in the Football League. He was then named as Keith Hill's assistant manager at Rochdale midway through the 2006/07 season, helping to guide the club, out of League Two via the Play-Offs.

More success followed as Dale rose to ninth in League One during the 2009/10 campaign – their highest-ever position in forty years. Flitcroft's work at Dale did not go unnoticed and he was handed his first managerial gig by Barnsley in 2013 following a short spell as caretaker manager.

The Tykes secured their Championship status for the 2013/14 season under Flitcroft, but things soon turned sour at

Oakwell and he was relieved of his duties in November 2013.

But Flitcroft soon rediscovered the winning feeling after taking charge of Bury, leading the club to League One in his first-full season in charge after beating Tranmere Rovers 1-0 to secure automatic promotion.

Flitcroft then led the Shakers to a 16th placed finish in their first season back in League One last term, while they have made a good start to the new campaign and currently sit in 7th place following two wins and a draw in their last three league outings.

for us to get the win on Tuesday night and I'm happy with that.

You have been here for just under a month now, how are you settling in both on and off the pitch?


After a tough defeat to our local rivals Oxford United on Saturday, how important was it to bounce back and return to winning ways on Tuesday?




How vital is it that you get back on track in the league today, given that you are playing at home?

Today's visitors are a team you know well of course, having spent








a short stint on loan with Bury last season...

TAUL GODFREY

Town Physiotherapist Paul Godfrey sat down with R&W to give an update on injuries, in addition to explaining how the squad recovers in-between games during a gruelling run of fixtures.

On Jordan Stewart:

Jordan Stewart sustained a cartilage tear just before he went on international duty, but that wasn't diagnosed until he was out there and he subsequently didn't play. He came back for rehabilitation and the cartilage issue was confirmed with a scan.

He's had an orthopaedic opinion, the surgeon wants to see if the cartilage issue will settle without an operation and, at the moment, his symptoms seem to be clearing so the hope is that the cartilage tear may settle and may not need intervention.

We will just have to see but I expect he will be another couple of weeks before we can fully assess whether he's going to be able to come straight back into training or whether he will indeed need the surgery.

But at the moment we are just trying to keep him fit and strong in the eventuality that the knee does settle and he can come back and join the squad as quickly as possible.

On Jordan Young:

Jordan Young initially had a very low

grade hamstring strain and he's had some associated sciatic nerve issues with that.

The hamstring is now fine and is fully healed, we're now just trying to get on top of the inflamed sciatic issue.

He's done very well in the gym with me over the last week, he's been running and sprinting with no problems and the intention was to faze him back into training towards the end of last week.

I would expect him to be back in full training from next week onwards.

On Dealing With Fixture Congestion:

The lads have a recovery strategy that they follow on a Sunday post game, where we are trying to monitor their hydration levels to make sure that they have been fully rehydrated from the Saturday.

They attend a local gym and they will have a pool session and an active bike session just to really flush the legs out and it is about trying to give them the best opportunity to recover for the Tuesday game.

They will then have a light Monday session in preparation for the game and then we continue that recovery on the Wednesday. And ultimately, between games and in this period where it is so Saturday-Tuesday, it is all about recovery and making sure we are monitoring the players' level of recovery.

If there are any individuals that need additional days of recovery, then that is looked at just as a way of prevention rather than a cure.

That is something Mike Cooper (Sports Scientist) takes care of more than I do, but it is something we're as hot on as we can be with the staff we have and the facilities we have.

ON THIS DAY:

17 SEPTEMBER

1898

Town's first ever League game on 17th September was back in the days when they wore green and white shirts! Local rivals Reading found themselves five goals down at half-time at the County Ground - eventually succumbing 6-1...

1949

...and that score was replicated 51 years later. Still in the days of five men in the forward line, all five struck for Town in a home win over Northampton. It would be sweet revenge for a 0-6 drubbing by the Cobblers on this date in 1932.

1965

Ernie Hunt signed for Wolves after making 237 senior appearances for Swindon. He had made his League debut at 16 before netting 88 goals for the club. Just before his departure, while the first team were up at Workington, Ernie scored twice for the reserves in a 6-2 win over Chelsea.

1985


Goalkeeper Ken Allen, then 37, made his debut at Crewe after Jake Findlay had had his contract terminated. Ken went on to make maximum appearances in the Fourth Division title winning campaign – except in the League Cup for which he was cup-tied. Almost 16 years earlier, he had been on trial at the County Ground but was not retained after making four appearances for the reserves.

1991


It is 25 years since Swindon last staged a home League game on this date - and the single goal victory against Bristol Rovers was the only win in the last eight played on 17th September!

1993

Former Arsenal apprentice Ty Gooden was signed from Wycombe - then in the Conference - following a one-month trial. The wide midfielder was to make over 160 appearances during a near seven-year stay at the County Ground. Hard-up Town had to sell him and Iffy Onuora to Gillingham in January 2000 in a bid to avoid going into administration.







After conceding a goal in just 48 seconds, any hopes of Town getting something out of the game were blown away when the Seasiders hit three more in the space of eight minutes to go in 4-0 up at the interval.

A second-half brace from Leigh Barnard (his only one during his seven-year stay at the County Ground) brought a modicum of respectability to the scoreline.

But Swindon old boy Alan Mayes and Paul Stewart added another two in the final 15 minutes, culminating in a 95-minute 'post-mortem' behind the home dressing room door.



Some fans had still to take their seats when Mark Taylor put his side ahead, Chris Ramsey playing him on side from a long hopeful ball out of defence which he chipped over the oncoming Ken Allen.

A deflected Taylor shot led to Blackpool's second, Alex Dyer tucking it home and, just two minutes later Dyer struck again when both David Cole and Colin Calderwood failed to clear. Cole then slipped in attempting to make another clearance, allowing Mayes to tee up Taylor for the fourth.

Jimmy Gilligan replaced Martin Ling eight minutes into the second period and on the hour Barnard pulled a goal back with a glancing header from a Chris Kamara cross.

But the visitors restored their four-goal advantage on 74 minutes when a shot from substitute Brian Butler was diverted into Mayes' path.

Barnard quickly added his second with another header - this time from a Kamara free-kick - but Swindon's defensive frailties were highlighted once again when, just a minute later, Stewart headed home from a Mike Davies centre.

It was 22 years since Town had conceded six at home - and it would be another thirteen before it happened again.



"We need three points after the performance against Oxford United last weekend, but Bury have got a good side with some good players, so it is not going to be easy.


"We know that but we will be ready for the occasion and we know what we have to do. The players that play will give everything and hopefully we can give the three points to the fans."



ACADEMY

WITH JEREMY NEWTON

The Academy have had a busy last couple of weeks, especially with the U15's age group.

This has seen the U15's recently play against Arsenal, Liverpool, Southampton and Swansea. The U15's squad was split into two with lots of trialists coming into the age group. This has given the squad the opportunity to have two games per weekend with one having an Elite Games Programme, whilst the other squad continued to play in the Category 3 Programme.

The reasons for this are we want to try and test ourselves and challenge ourselves against Category 1 clubs, but more importantly it is a physiological challenge for the players to try

and compete, implement and to evaluate their understanding of their knowledge against these clubs.

The squads in these games tend to change from week-to-week with performances from players securing their place in the squad, which will enable them to compete against these clubs.

This will continue throughout the season not only with the U15's, but with all other age groups within the Academy.

Recently, the 10's and 11's played Tottenham Hotspur and the 14's are due to play Southampton with our U8's playing against QPR today. All age groups have been back in for a while now and it won't be long before they are all in for their first six-weekly reviews to set their individual objectives for the following six weeks.

It is important that these sixweekly objectives are achievable so new ones can be set within the six-week structure, so that effective learning is taking place to enhance their knowledge of their personal development.

Within the Academy the 13's-18's will play a different formation every six weeks and will cover seven different systems over the 42-week cycle that their Academy season runs.

It is important that the players and coaches are challenged by these different systems, which will create different challenges and scenarios in and out of possession. The idea is that effective learning of all systems are learnt by all players so they have a more general understanding of the game and what might be entailed for them going forward.





It wasn't the result everyone wanted last Saturday but hopefully by the time you're reading this, the players have put on a better midweek showing against Chelsea's development side in the EFL Trophy.

I've watched all the highlights from The Kassam again on TV. I don't think there's any doubt that the referee got a couple of decisions badly wrong.

Even at real time I thought Nathan Thompson's trip on Liam Sercombe was outside the box, time stood still for a few moments and I was actually anticipating the referee penalising the Oxford midfielder for a dive.

It's time that someone took over from my mate Steve Robinson as the hero. Fortunately we'll face them at least twice more in competitive action this season so all is not lost on that front.






