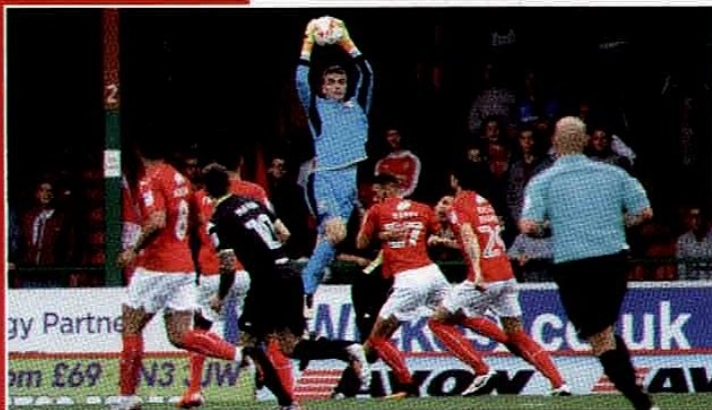
We know that Luke and the boys will have to be at the top of their game in order to get the three points this evening.

Enjoy the game.

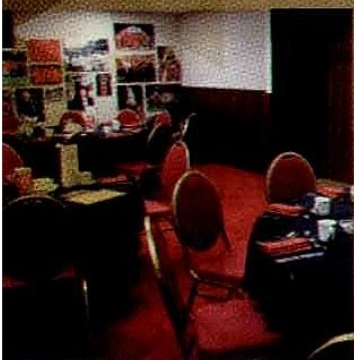

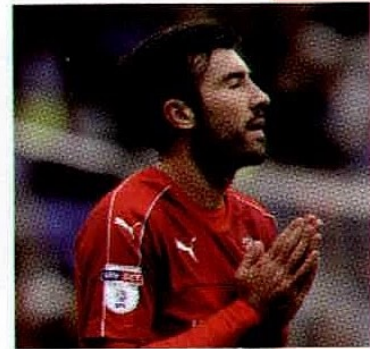
DOUGHTY ON THE MEND FOLLOWING SURGERY

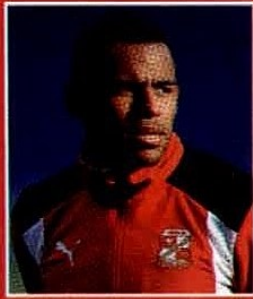

The Gas have made a slow start to life back in the Sky Bet League One and find themselves in the relegation zone ahead of tonight's 'Derby Day' clash at SN1.

Having started the season full of confidence following back-to-back promotions, Rovers have struggled so far this term and are without a win since August 14th. Since beating Oxford United 2-1 at the Memorial Stadium, the Gas have gone seven games without a victory in all competitions, including three defeats.

Darrell Clarke's men have drawn their last three outings, including a 1-1 stalemate away at Bradford City last time out where a late goal from on-loan Chelsea defender, Charlie Colkett rescued a point for the visitors.

Rovers have struggled both at the back and in front of goal so far this term, having conceded eleven goals and scored just nine goals in the league. That is a far cry from their form over the last two campaigns, which saw them emerge victorious in the 2014/15 Conference Play-

Off Final, before stringing together a remarkable run of one defeat in fourteen games to clinch automatic promotion from League Two the following season.

Despite it still being very early days in the 2016/17 campaign, the Gas will be hoping their fortunes begin to turn sooner rather than later in a bid to avoid having a mountain to climb later in the year. They have bolstered their ranks since their visit to SN1 a few weeks ago, adding Hiram Boateng and Chelsea duo Charlie Colkett and Jake Clarke-Salter to their squad.

There has been one positive for Rovers this term, however, in the form of Matty Taylor who has banged in six goals already this season. The former non-league striker has taken to life in League One like a duck to water and his form in front of goal will be key to any hopes Rovers have of prolonging their stay at this level.

DANGERMAN

MATTY TAYLOR

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF ROVERS' DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

Once on the books at Oxford United, Taylor went on to score 80 times in two seasons for North Leigh in the non-leagues. In 2011, he put pen to paper on a deal with Forest Green Rovers, scoring ten goals in his first season for the Gloucestershire side. He also had a prolific loan stint with Chester during the 2013/14 season, scoring six goals in seven games. Before signing for Rovers in the summer of 2014, he also netted on the international stage for England C against Hungary and Sparta Prague B.

In his first season at the Memorial Stadium, he finished

the campaign as the club's top scorer with 21 goals in all competitions as the Gas clinched promotion back to the Football League via the Play-Offs. Taylor picked up where he had left off the following season, bagging 28 goals for the Gas as they secured back-to-back promotions to claim a place in League One – a tally that included two hat-tricks against Wycombe Wanderers and Hartlepool United.

Taylor has not been fazed by stepping up another level and has continued his fine form in front of goal this season, helping himself to six goals in all competitions already, including the equaliser against Walsall a week ago. Will no doubt be attracting admiring glances from a number of clubs higher up the footballing pyramid.



MEET THE REST...

KELLE ROOS

The on-loan Derby County goalkeeper made his debut for the Gas against Town in August, before heavy rain put paid to that fixture. Has made 15 outings for Derby in the Championship and helped AFC Wimbledon win promotion last term.

CRISTIAN MONTANO

A former loanee at SN1, the former West Ham player spent time with clubs in England and his native Columbia ahead of signing for Rovers in 2015.

CHARLIE COLKETT

Another Deadline Day signing, Colkett arrived at the Memorial

Stadium from Chelsea and bagged a late equaliser away at Bradford City to earn his new side a point last time out.

LUKE JAMES

Came through the ranks at Hartlepool where his impressive performances earned him a move to Peterborough. Currently on loan at the Memorial Stadium from the Posh.

JAKE CLARKE-SALTER

Also on loan from Chelsea, the defender has represented England at U18 and U19 level and was a member of the Chelsea U18s side that tasted glory in the FA Youth Cup and the UEFA Youth League.

HIRAM BOATENG

Signed on Deadline Day on loan from Crystal Palace, the powerful midfielder has also plied his trade for Crawley Town and Plymouth Argyle. Made his Palace debut against Stoke City in an FA Cup Third Round replay in 2013.

BYRON MOORE

The forward made over 250 appearances for Crewe Alexandra after graduating from their renowned academy. Most recently with Port Vale before joining Rovers in June.

BILLY BODIN

Son of Town legend, Paul, Billy started his career at SN1 and was part of the 2011/12 title-winning squad. Has represented the likes of Crewe and Northampton before joining the Gas in 2015.

STEVE MILDENHALL



The Swindon-born stopper who came through the youth ranks at the County Ground made his full league debut in a memorable match at

Portsmouth in 1997. Made 38 appearances for the Town before moving on to Notts County in 2001. With a university degree under his belt, Mildenhall has been with Rovers since 2013.

DANIEL LEADBITTER



A graduate of the youth system at Newcastle United, the defender signed his first pro forms with the Magpies in 2007 and would

stay at St. James's Park for four seasons. Following his release, he was with Torquay and Hereford before joining Rovers. A right-back by trade, Leadbitter can play in any position across the back four.

LEE BROWN



Brown signed his first professional contract at QPR, having graduated from the youth ranks. A former England C international, the full-back

has been a mainstay in the Gas side since joining in 2011. An ever-present in the team last term, his goal against Dagenham & Redbridge clinched promotion for Rovers at the end of last season.

TOM LOCKYER



Released by home-town club, Cardiff City as a schoolboy, Lockyer was a scholar at the Memorial Stadium before graduating into the first team,

signing his first professional deal in 2013. A former winner of the club's Young Player of the Year award, the defender has won international honours with Wales' Under-21 side and he has worn the captain's armband for Rovers this term.

MARK MCHRYSTAL



McChrystal is a former Northern Ireland Under-21 captain and started his career with Wolverhampton Wanderers. After

spells with Partick Thistle north of the border and in his homeland with the likes of Derry City, he signed for Tranmere Rovers. Has made over 100 appearances for Rovers since joining the Gas in 2013.

PETER HARTLEY



Once on the books at Sunderland as a trainee, the defender spent most of the early part of his career in his native north east after signing for Hartlepool

United in the summer of 2009. He made over 180 appearances for his hometown club before signing for Stevenage in 2013. Hartley spent the past two seasons on the south coast with Plymouth Argyle and joined Rovers in the summer.

JAMES CLARKE



A graduate of the youth system at Oxford United, Clarke then played over 150 times for Oxford City before signing for Salisbury City. His

next destination was Woking where he impressed Rovers boss, Darrell Clarke enough for the manager to bring him to the Memorial Stadium in June 2015. A regular fixture in matchday squads for the Gas ever since.

OLLIE CLARKE



The midfielder is currently Rovers' longest-serving player having come through the ranks at the Memorial Stadium to make his first team

debut in May 2011. Despite a number of issues with injuries over the years, Clarke has gone on to rack up over a century of appearances for the Gas and has been a regular so far this term.

CHRIS LINES



Awarded his first professional contract at Rovers after initialing joining the club as a non-contract player, Lines went on to make

nearly 200 appearances in his first spell at the Memorial Stadium. He was snapped up Sheffield Wednesday in August 2011 and has most recently been at Port Vale before re-joining Rovers in the summer of 2015.

STUART SINCLAIR



The box-to-box midfielder started his career at Luton Town before dropping into non-league football with the likes of Cambridge City

and Bedford Town. He also had a spell with Salisbury City, working under current Rovers boss, Darrell Clarke. He made the move to Rovers in June 2014 and has gone on to rack up over 60 appearances for the Gas.

ELLIS HARRISON



A product of the academy at the Memorial Stadium, Harrison made his first team bow against Southampton in 2011 when

he was still a scholar. Has gone on to find the net 27 times for Rovers in all competitions and is already off the mark this term. Harrison has also won international honours for the Wales Under-21 side.

JERMAINE EASTER



A Welsh international, the experienced striker joined Rovers in January 2015 after leaving Millwall. Easter has plied his trade for a number

of clubs including Swansea City and Crystal Palace and has reached the League Cup semi-finals with the Eagles as well as Wycombe Wanderers. Has already found the net this term, opening the scoring against Oxford United.

MANAGER

DARRELL CLARKE

Handed the reins at the Mem in 2014, Clarke became the first manager in Rovers' history to clinch back-to-back promotions when the Gas were promoted at the end of last term.

As a player, Clarke came through the youth system at Mansfield Town, putting pen to paper on his first professional deal in 1995. He would play 160 times for the Stags before moving on to Hartlepool United in 2001. During a six-year stay at Victoria Park, he would rack up over 120 appearances before finishing his playing days at Salisbury City as a player/manager.

He guided the Whites to promotion from the Southern League Premier Division during his first campaign

in charge before steering the Wiltshire side to the FA Cup third round for the time in their history a season later. At the end of the 2012/13 season, a successful Play-Off campaign ended in promotion to the Conference.

That summer, Bristol Rovers came calling and Clarke was appointed assistant manager to John Ward. However, with the Gas languishing towards the bottom of League Two, he was handed the reins with Ward moving upstairs to a Director of Football role but was

unable to prevent Rovers slipping out of the Football League after a 94-year stay in the top four divisions.

In his first full season at the helm, he steered Rovers to promotion from the Conference National via the Play-Offs, defeating Grimsby Town on penalties at Wembley. Last term, he secured successive promotions to League One with a final day victory over Dagenham & Redbridge at the Memorial Stadium.

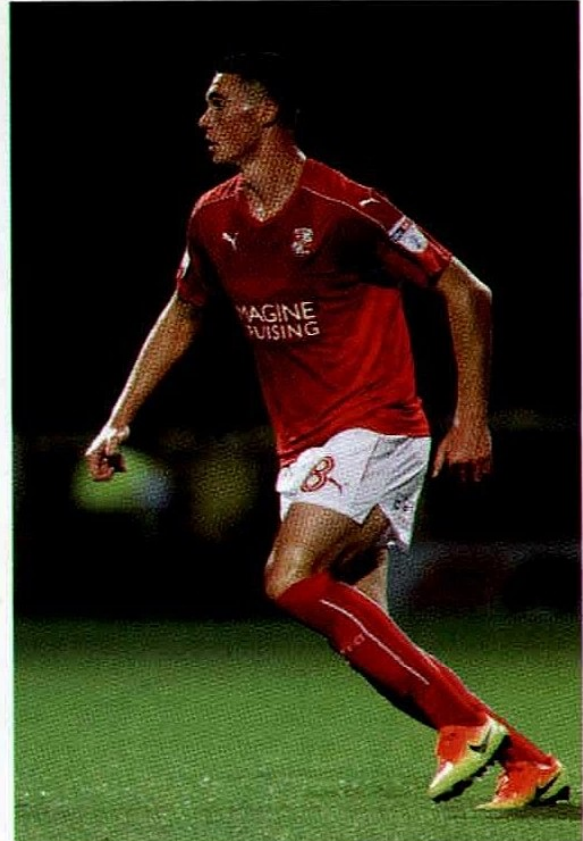

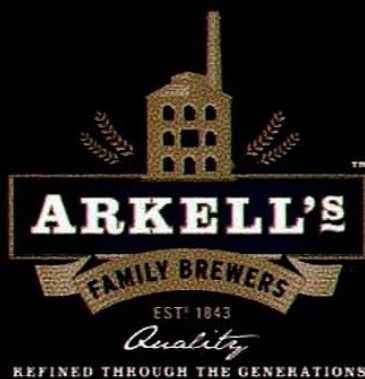

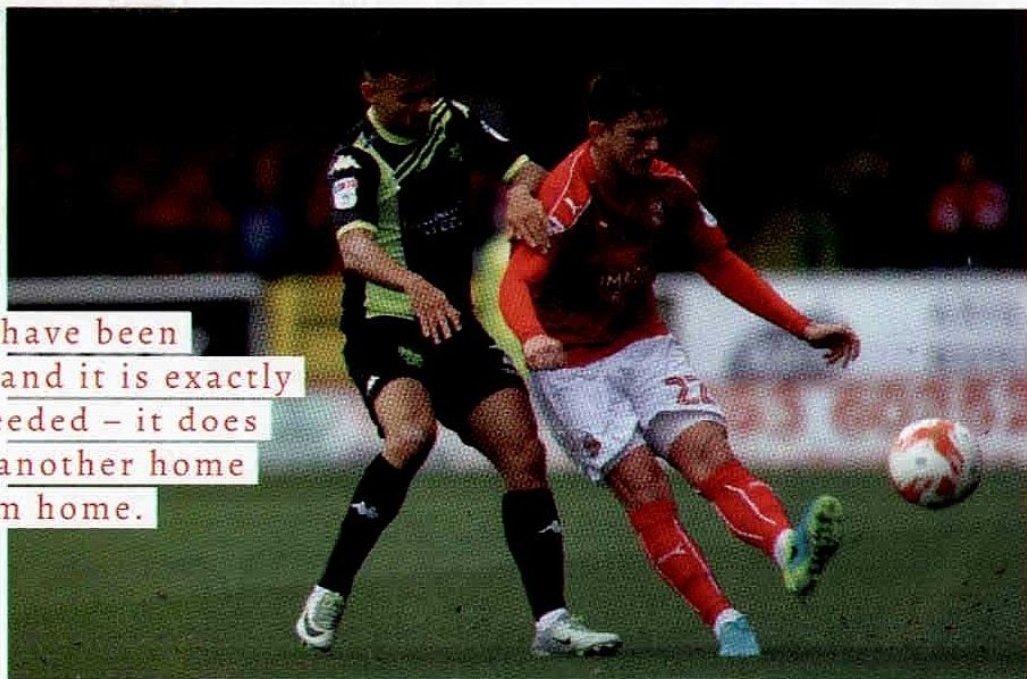

Sean, firstly, how have you settled in at the club since signing a few weeks ago?

The club have been brilliant and it is exactly what I needed after being at Watford for so long. Everyone has been really welcoming here and it has made my life ten times easier because it is probably the first time that I have properly been away from home. It does feel like another home away from home which is really nice.

The boys have been really good and they have let me know where the nice places in Swindon are, so hopefully by next week I'll be living here permanently and not in a hotel, which will be nice.

There is a lot for a player to think about when moving to a new club both on and off the pitch, so how have you dealt with that over the last few weeks?

It is having good people around you. I don't have to do everything

by myself because I've got people around me who help me with everything and they have made my life easier. They travel to the games and they travel up on the weekends so it saves me doing a lot of journeys back home, which will help my football in the long run because it takes a bit of energy out of you when you are driving up and down.

You played under Gianfranco Zola during your time at Watford, in addition to rubbing shoulders with a lot of quality players. How much did that help your personal development?

Watford put so much energy and so much of their money into the Academy when times weren't as good as they are now. Coming through we had a school and we trained twice a day every single day at the school, so that helped more with your technical ability.

When I broke into the first-team we had a good manager in Sean Dyche who gave me lots of opportunities to play. He realised I was a young player so he didn't tell me what to do in games, he just let me be free and go out there which helped a lot.

After that we went through a lot of managers but you learn a little bit from each one, and I learned a lot from Zola. He coached every player one-on-one, he took them after training to do free-kicks, shooting drills, passing drills and I probably learned the most under him.

There are plenty of similarities that are shared between the Watford you grew up with and the Swindon team you are at now, isn't there?

It is very similar, maybe not so much now, but when Watford were bringing young players through, they had to do that because they couldn't go out and buy players.

Being at a club like this, which is pretty much the same, you saw Smudge (Tom Smith) play against Chelsea's U23s and he was brilliant, he didn't look out of place at all. It is good knowing that Swindon are dedicated to bringing through young players.

Since you have been here, you made your debut away at Peterborough United, was in the matchday squad for 'Derby Day' away at Oxford United and now have two starts under your belt against Chelsea's U23s and Bury respectively. What have you made of your start at SN1?

I knew it was going to be a slow start because I was out injured for a while and I knew I wasn't going to get thrown straight into the mix, so I just had to keep training hard every day and take my chance when it came.

I thought I did okay against Chelsea but the most important thing about that game was to get the fitness in, so I know in myself that I can complete games.

I'm still not 100% there and there is still a lot more to come. Once

I'm fit then I know I can have more impact on games.

You have racked up three assists in your last two games for Town...

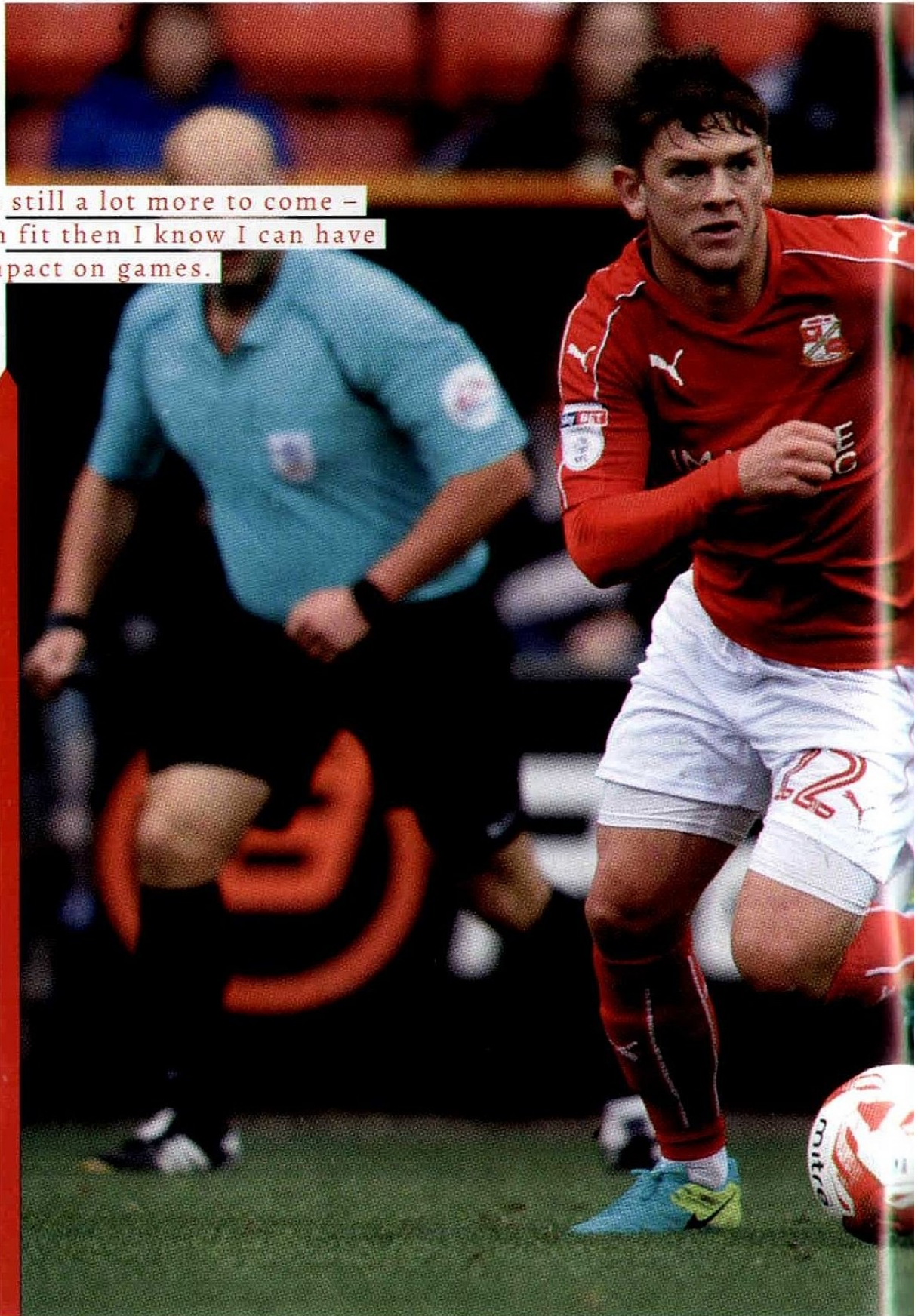
Getting two assists on my home debut was good because it's something I can build on and you get a bit of confidence from it.

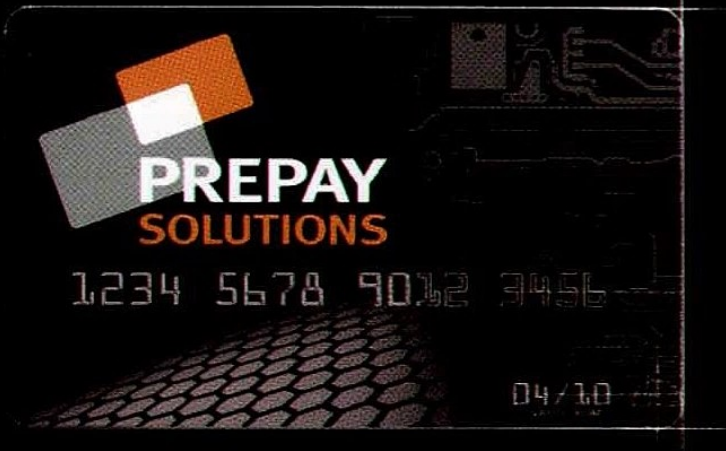
Hopefully we can get the win.

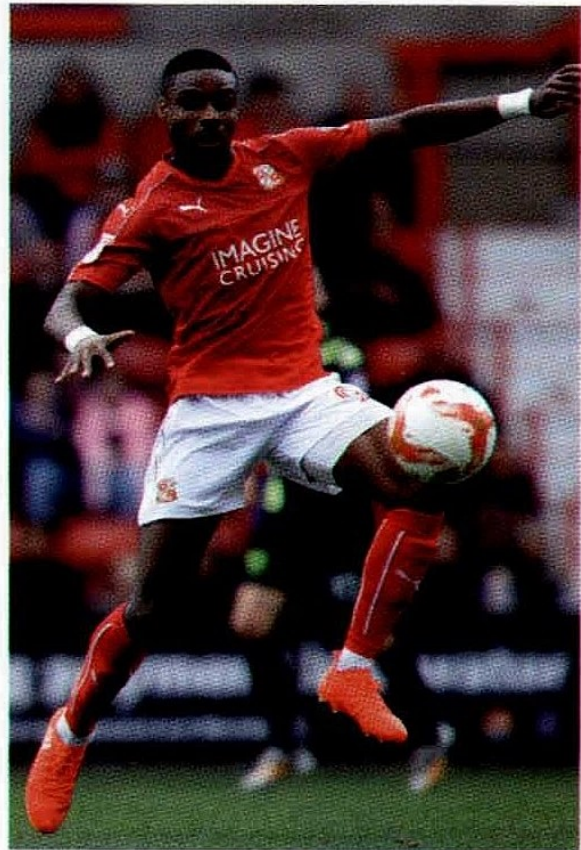

Town Kit Man Ryan Sharland gives R&W an inside look at what a typical matchday in the Boot Room looks like...

I get in between 6am and 7am on a Saturday morning to pick up anything that is left over from the day before. The training kit is left to dry overnight on a Friday and then it is a case of coming in and laying it out fresh for the lads in the morning.

We get all the stuff ready for a matchday the night before and I'll put it out on the morning of the match so that it is as fresh as it can be and it won't be creased up. I'll generally press it before with the printing presser so that it's all neat and tidy.

It is then a case of laying it all out in a neat routine order, so towel first, t-shirt second, jumper on top, shorts over the top of that and then socks and slippers. Any individual preferences that the players have, like thermals, any different socks that they use and the captain's armband for whoever is the captain on the day will have to be laid out as well.

Different players have little things that they like me to do – Jamie Sendles-White wants me to wash the holders for his shin pad guards.

Different players have little things that they like you to do, for example Lawrence Vigouroux likes me to keep hold of his gloves and Jamie Sendles-White wants me to wash the holders for his shin pad guards – that's just the routine they have got into.

Overall, there are a few different superstitions that go around the dressing room, but obviously the lads might not want me to say what they are!

It keeps you on your toes because you have to make sure that you get everything right and you need to make sure that you remember everything. Take away games for example, you have to take the speaker and no one will remember that other than the Kit Man, so you don't necessarily think about those little details because they just become routine.

Once the game finishes the lads will go back into the dressing room and Luke Williams will give his team-talk and go through everything he wants to address. The lads will then get changed and have their ice baths, sometimes that takes ten, twenty minutes and sometimes it takes an hour depending on if Doping Control come in and things like that.

I will then wash the kits and, if we're at home which we are tonight, then the white shorts are a bit of a nightmare to get clean again so we'll soak them overnight in stain remover and then we'll come in the next morning to wash, rinse and scrub them.

I generally wash the shirts after the game to make sure they come out nice and clean and the wash will take around thirty minutes, so if you are doing a few washes then you are normally at the ground for two or three hours and not leaving until the early part of the morning.

ON THIS DAY:

20 SEPTEMBER

1913

Town returned from The Dell with both points following a 2-1 win over the Saints in the Southern League. Archie Bown and Freddy Wheatcroft were the men on target.

1930

Leyton Orient (then known as Clapton Orient) had moved into a new stadium at Lea Bridge Road for the 1930/31 season - and Swindon became the first side to win there in the League. Inside-forwards Joe Eddleston with a brace and Frank Richardson were on target for the visitors in a 3-2 victory.

1957

John Skull re-joined Town after first signing for the club as an amateur eight years earlier. The former Ferndale and Swindon 'Corries' winger was taken on as a part-time pro while working as a physiotherapist, hitting eight goals in 28 appearances during 1957/58.

1958

Newport County visited the County Ground, where full-back John Neal and then Jimmy Kelly scored first-half goals to give Swindon a 2-0 advantage. Jimmy Singer netted for the visitors after the break, in front of a 12,522 crowd.

1986

Town's home fixture with Walsall was called off well in advance, due to several of the visiting squad being struck down by gastro-enteritis. By a strange coincidence, the return fixture in February was also postponed when seven Town players were suffering from 'flu!

2014

Swindon raced into a three-goal lead against Sheffield United, before the Blades hit back to net twice in six second-half minutes. But Mark Cooper's side added a further two of their own to run out 5-2 winners.

Anxious to regroup following the Blackpool debacle, manager Lou Macari was unable to mobilise his troops four days later, with the visit of Walsall being postponed (see 'On This Day'). That game would also have seen striker Dave Bamber complete his two-match suspension for a dismissal against Notts County.

So Lou Macari would now have to take his side to The Dell for a Littlewoods Cup tie without him. Town had earned a passage into the Second Round by virtue of a 6-2 aggregate win over Torquay, Bamber hitting four of the goals.

With barely two minutes on the clock, the little Scot was dealt another major blow, when he saw his keeper Ken Allen land awkwardly on his left ankle as he stretched to keep out an effort from Colin Clarke.

Whether a fully fit Allen would have prevented any of the three goals is a matter of conjecture. The first came after only eight minutes when his defence allowed Jimmy Case far too much leeway before sending in a low cross for George Lawrence to pounce.

Midway through the first-half, play was held up to allow strapping to be applied to the stopper's injury and he was able to keep the hosts at bay with three saves as the interval approached. But then two goals in as many minutes left Swindon with the proverbial mountain to climb after the break.

Lawrence struck again with a free header from a corner on 43 minutes and then provided the assist for Joe Jordan to grab the third.

Jimmy Gilligan, making his first start for Town, came close to reducing the deficit in the 69th minute when he looked to have beaten Peter Shilton with a shot that was heading for the top corner.

But the England keeper - who had celebrated his 37th birthday a week earlier - twisted in mid-air to somehow touch the ball wide of the angle.

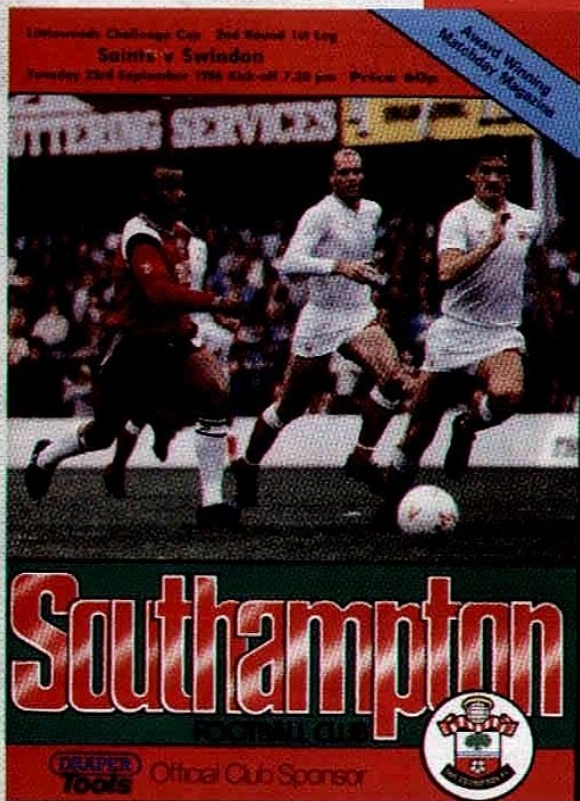
Gilligan's strike partner Bryan Wade also kept the home defenders busy, but in the end Swindon had nothing to show for their efforts.

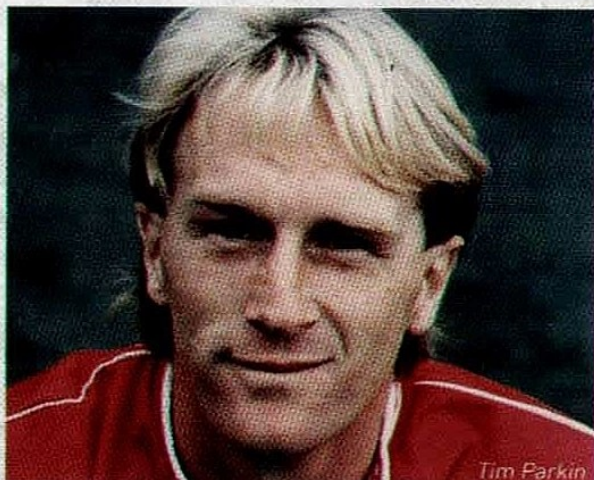

Tim arrived at the County Ground within a few days of his Rovers' teammate Steve White. A £25,000 signing, Tim replaced David Cole in Town's back line alongside Colin Calderwood, missing only one game after Christmas as the side surged towards the Third Division play-offs and ultimately promotion.

In the spring of 1988, he partnered Jon Gittens when skipper Calderwood was out through injury. Tim was to eventually lose his place to the former Saint - early in 1989/90 - which resulted in a move to the Potteries.

Tim's career ended through injury in 1994 when, after a short spell as Community Officer at Middlesbrough, he joined the Cumbria Police Force. He has now retired.

Okay then... Take two. Has everyone brought their wellies?

Bristol Rovers come to town for a second time in three weeks this evening and we've got our fingers crossed that Mother Nature doesn't intervene this time around.

The whole episode of the initial abandoned fixture got Trust STFC thinking... what is the most bizarre reason for a football match to have been called off mid-game?

While torrential rain, fog and floodlight failure are perhaps the most common threats, there have been some truly peculiar abandonments down the years.

Take the story of Stephen Anglesey, for instance.

Anglesey, a Tranmere Rovers fan, was in the crowd for a League Two clash with Mansfield in 2003 but evidently the football on offer wasn't all that entertaining because - midway through the first half - he decided to take a wander round the ground.

This wasn't just a trip to the kiosk in the concourse, though. Oh no. Anglesey scaled a

floodlight pylon and leapt onto the roof of one of the Prenton Park stands.

He was unable to be coaxed down by stewards and police and the match was called off at half-time by referee Mike Ryan, with his team - who were chasing a play-off place - 2-0 to the good.

Anglesey eventually had to pay a fine and received a football banning order, Tranmere didn't make the top seven and the re-run was pretty much a dead rubber - but a crowd of 10,000-plus turned up after fans were offered free entry.

Another fine example comes from our friends in Holland.

When the football is faecal, a Dutch crowd really lets the players know about it.

A 2008 Eredivisie clash between Ajax and Groningen was abandoned after hundreds upon hundreds of toilet rolls were chucked onto the pitch by disgruntled fans. Andrex stocks went through the roof.

And while fickle fans, thunderstorms and high winds usually do the damage,

occasionally the responsibility for call-offs lands squarely at the players' feet.

Take the wonderfully named former Chester goalkeeper Grenville Millington, for example. In 1981, Millington was between the sticks in a League Cup clash with Plymouth when - in making a save - he collided with a post, snapping it in two.

Unsurprisingly, given how important goals are in a game of football, the match was abandoned and Plymouth had to repeat the long trip to Cheshire days later - by which time Millington's sore head was just about wearing off.

So, on reflection, a little bit of rain wasn't quite as exceptional as we might have first thought.

To three points. And bragging rights.

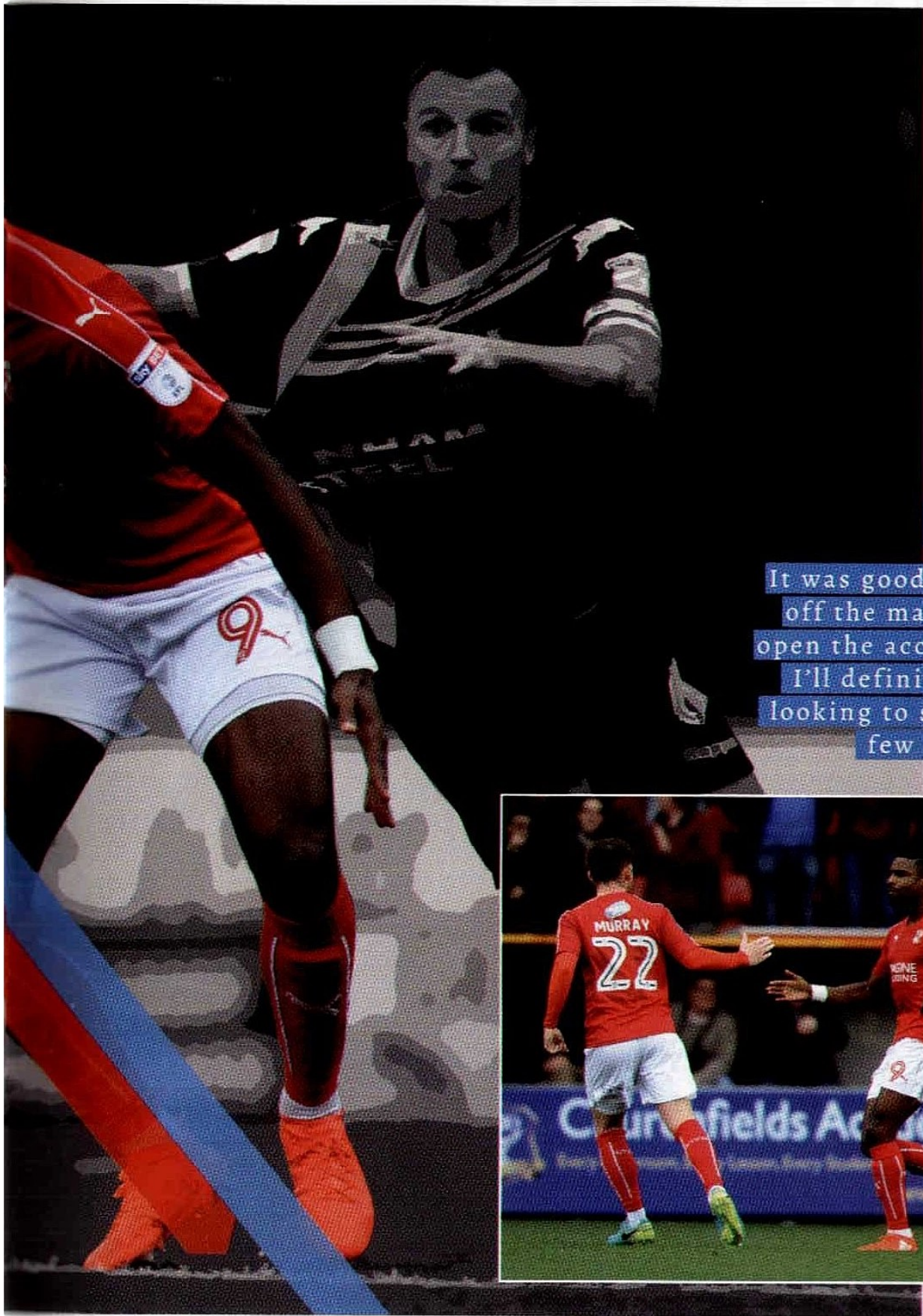
"I was watching the game with Rapha (Raphael Rossi-Branco) and we were both wishing we were playing," he recalled.

"It is a big game tonight and we need to make sure we perform."





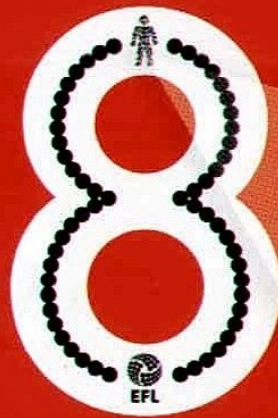

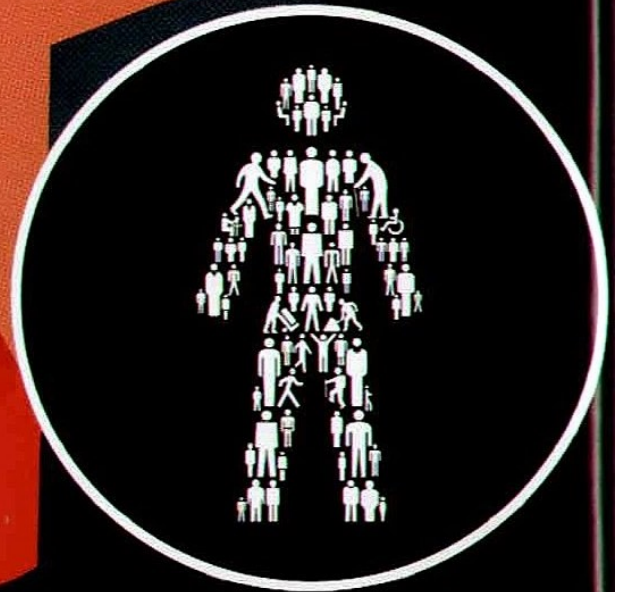

be taken but it becomes more important for their final season.

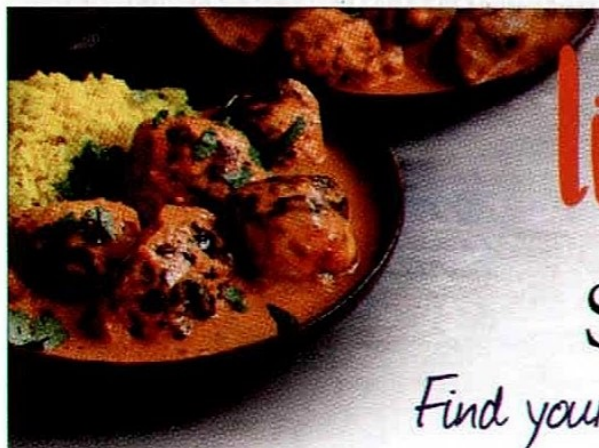

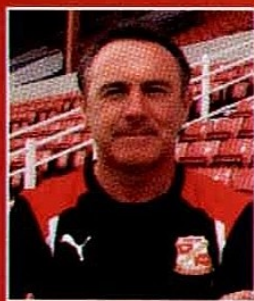

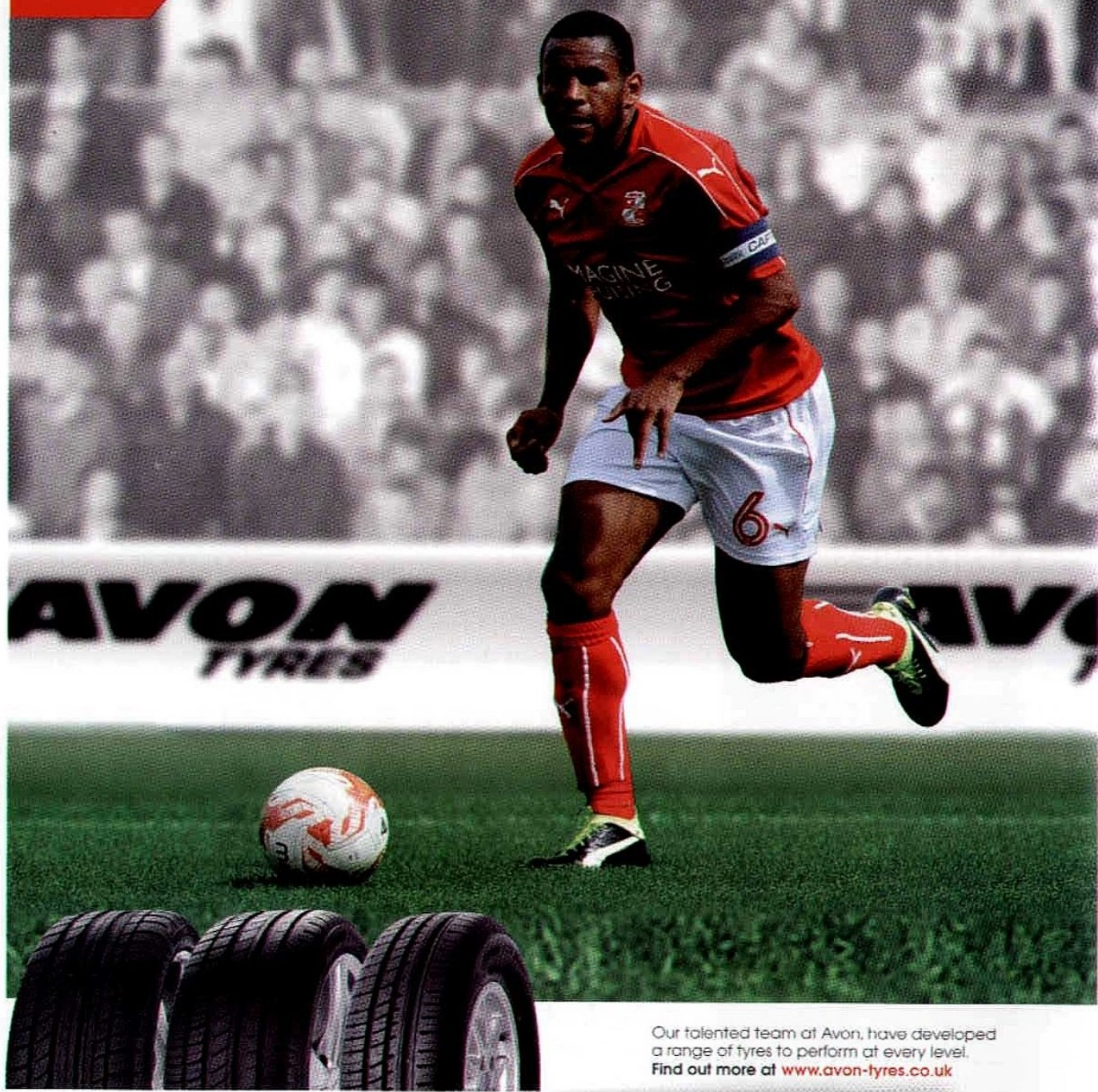

Having played in his fair share of derbies for Town, former defender Jerel Ifil is well placed to offer his thoughts on this particular fixture...

So it's derby day again and it's another opportunity for the fans to show how passionate they are about bragging rights for the teams in the South West. These games do not make or break a season but boy do they pack a punch for an atmosphere and the right result can ignite a season.

Personally, I loved them and it gave me something to look forward to during a tough and long season. Having played in 5 of these derby games, conceding only three goals with two clean sheets and losing only one in front of crowds of around 10,000, my record shows you why I enjoyed it so much.

So let me take you to one of the games I remember most - at home on the 27th of November 2011. Before the game we were

all aware of the importance of this game for us and the fans, so we were all extra focused. Once we stepped out onto the field it was game on, the crowd were pumped up, loud, boisterous and we all fed off the atmosphere, drinking it up to increase motivation.

As usual this made for a very competitive, physical and aggressive game but I always felt we were on top. Christian Roberts put us in the lead with a penalty and it looked like we were on our way to getting another, but it's a Derby and there is always a twist.

I got sent-off for practically nothing after trying to get in front of Richard Barker to put him in an offside position. He blocked me and I fell over him, he dragged me down pulling my arm. As I got

back up I pulled my arm away, which the linesman thought was a punch and rose his flag.

Whilst Barker and I smiled at each other thinking nothing of it, the referee came over and sent me off. I was furious with the ref and refused to leave the pitch until he could tell me his reason for the red, but Peaks (Lee Peacock) calmed me down and I left the field.

The ref then proceeded to send Barker off and after that it was absolute mayhem with another two players given their marching orders and another five players receiving yellow cards, but we held on for the win - Brilliant!!!

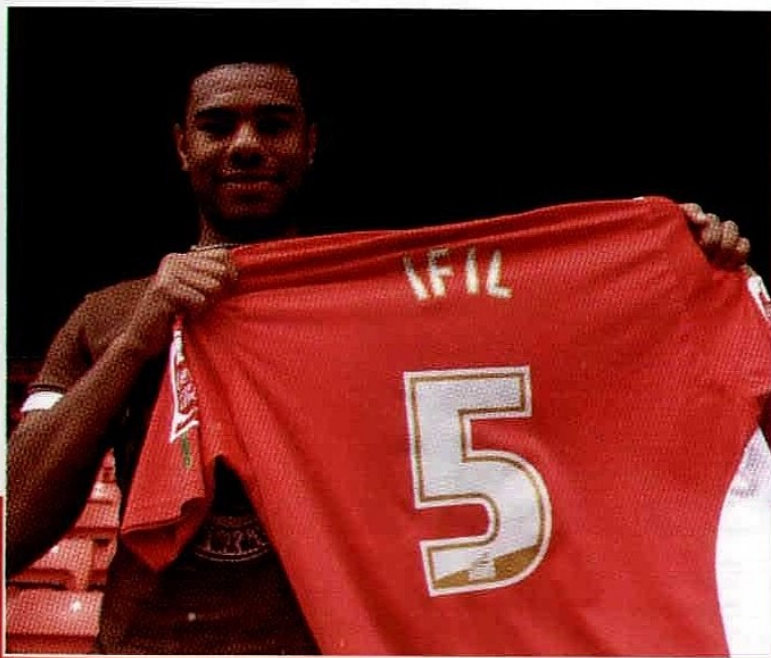
I tried to appeal the red card but the camera angle wasn't close enough to show what really happened so they extended my ban to four games and fined me even more! Of all the reds I've had in my life I got punished the most for the one which was a mistake on the officials' part - but such is life!

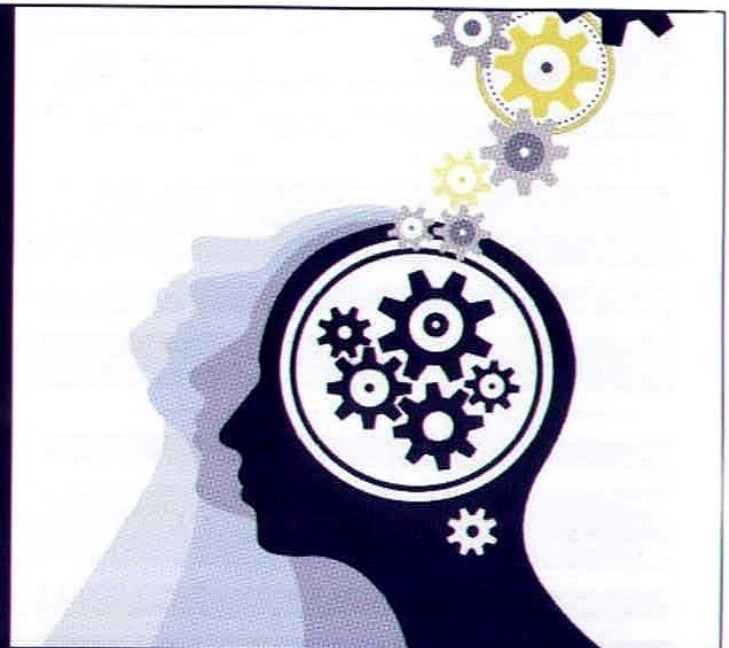

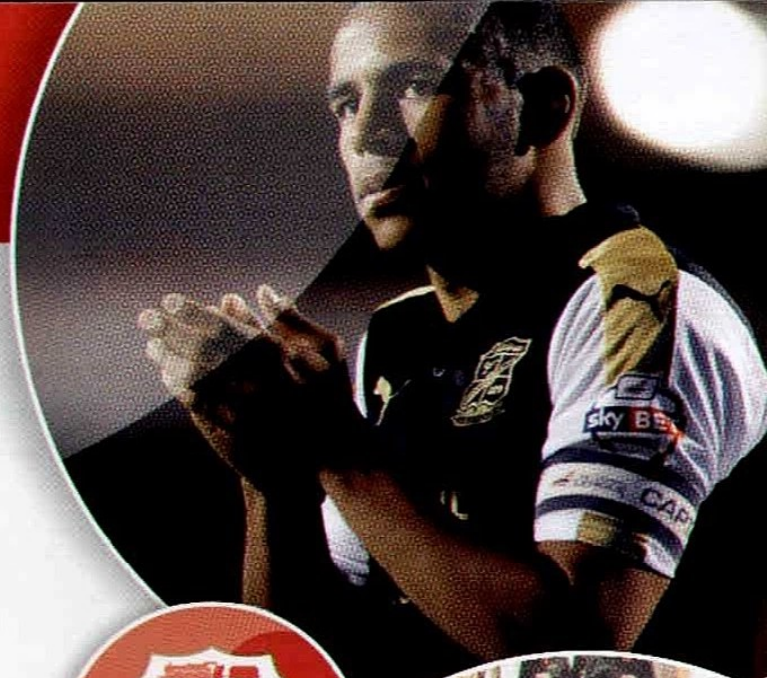
