



TOWN TO FACE DAGENHAM & REDBRIDGE OR FC HALIFAX TOWN IN FA CUP SHOULD THEY GET PAST EASTLEIGH

Swindon Town or Eastleigh have been drawn against Dagenham & Redbridge or FC Halifax Town in the Second Round of the Emirates FA Cup.

The draw took place on Monday and Luke Williams' side will know they will have a home tie to look forward to should they get past Eastleigh in their First Round Replay on Tuesday 15th November 2016.

Town's potential Second Round opponents will also have to contest a replay after Dagenham & Redbridge played out a 0-0 draw with FC Halifax Town last Saturday.

Second Round ties are due to be played between the 2nd and 5th of December 2016.



Speaking about the draw, Town Head Coach Luke Williams said: "I think it is a good draw because it is a home tie. I think it would be a lot trickier against either of those opponents."

"We should be confident enough of ourselves to feel like we can beat either of those opponents."

"The big thing is we have to win the replay first before we consider anything else."



Good Afternoon everyone and welcome back to The County Ground for today's Sky Bet League One encounter against Charlton Athletic live on Sky Sports.

It is nice to be back at SN1 after a tough couple of weeks on the road following our last home game against Walsall. On that note, it was really disappointing to lose to the Saddlers after the highs of beating Rochdale just a few days before, but we were outdone on the day by two pieces of individual brilliance. Sometimes you've just got to hold your hands up and there was nothing we could do about Erhun Oztumer's two brilliant strikes.

However, we were bitterly disappointed with our first-half display away at Scunthorpe United at the end of October and we as a team know our performance was far from good enough. We actually started the game well and gave the League One leaders a run for their money, but our reaction to going a goal behind wasn't acceptable. We then went on to concede three awful goals and I can promise you that there were a few cross words said in the dressing-room at half-time.

We changed things up a bit in the second-half by bringing on Michael Doughty and Lloyd Jones and it worked to an extent. We managed to prevent Scunthorpe from wreaking further damage and it was nice to get on the scoresheet from a personal point of view, although the manner of that crushing defeat overshadowed my goal and rightly so.

We've had a break from league action in recent weeks but we've really been put to the test in two gruelling cup encounters. We opened our Emirates FA Cup campaign with a 1-1 draw away at Eastleigh in what were very tough conditions. The pitch was far from perfect but you've got to expect that when you go to a non-league ground. I thought we handled ourselves well after a shaky opening and we showed great character to haul ourselves level just minutes after falling behind.

Michael Doughty showed just what a big miss he has been for us and it was great to see him back on the scoresheet – I'm sure he'll now only go from strength to strength.

We've got a number of key players returning and that will only help us in our replay on Tuesday. We know that should we beat Eastleigh then we've got a realistic chance of reaching the Third Round of the FA Cup and a long cup run is overdue for this club.

On a personal note, it was extremely disappointing to have suffered a hamstring injury against Eastleigh. I feel like I have started the season well and, more importantly, injury free so to pick up a knock of this extent is really frustrating. The road to recovery starts now and I hope to be back in action as quickly as possible. I would like to thank everyone for their messages of support, it really does mean a lot!

We're also through to the knockout stages of the Checkatrade Trophy after beating Exeter City on penalties on Tuesday. It was great to see Luke Norris open his account for the club and Will Henry once again showed his quality with a string of superb saves. Hopefully by the time you are reading this we would have been given a good draw as we look to go all the way in this competition.

Finally, despite their struggles so far this season, we know Charlton are going to be extremely difficult to play against today and they have an abundance of quality amongst their ranks. Today's game will give both teams an ideal chance to get back on track, especially being on TV, and although I'm frustrated not to be out there today, I know all the boys will be doing everything within their powers to get the three points.

It will also be nice to see Nicky Ajose back at SN1 this afternoon and I hope he gets the reception he deserves. His goals were absolutely vital for us last season and I just hope he doesn't find the back of the net today!



The Addicks have endured a frustrating start to life back in the Sky Bet League One and will be looking to kick-start their season with victory at SN1 this afternoon.

Following their relegation from the Championship at the end of the 2015/16 campaign, Athletic have found it hard to recover and are currently lying in 14th place in the table. However, with a squad packed to the brim full of quality and experience, Charlton will be hoping for a repeat of the 2011/12 season which saw them lift the League One title.

It was a summer of change at The Valley with experienced Football League manager Russell Slade being brought in to help restore the good times and steady an unstable ship. And the former Yeovil Town and Cardiff City chief was certainly busy having recruited no less than ten fresh faces.

Jason Pearce and Kevin Foley were both brought in from the league above to add some much-needed steel to the Addicks' defence. Matt Carter and Andrew Crofts bolstered the club's options in the engine room whilst Ricky Holmes, Josh Magennis and former Birmingham City hitman Lee Novak were tasked with providing the firepower. And Charlton also raided The County Ground, paying an undisclosed fee to prise Nicky Ajose to South London.

All in all, Charlton had assembled a squad to be feared at this level and entered the term boasting quality in all areas of the pitch. However, the Addicks endured a slow start to the 2016/17 campaign after losing to Bury on the opening day, before bowing out of the EFL Cup at the hands of League Two outfit Cheltenham Town. But wins against Shrewsbury Town and Walsall followed before Athletic saw out the month of August with back-to-back draws against Bolton Wanderers in the league and against Southampton's U21s in the Checkatrade Trophy.

It has only got harder for Charlton since and they have recorded just two victories on the domestic front since 20th August, which both came in October against Coventry City and Chesterfield respectively. However, Athletic have only lost three times in the league all season but eight draws have halted their progress.

Russell Slade will be hoping his all-star squad begin to fire sooner rather than later and they will be expected to be firing on all cylinders in-front of the Sky cameras today with both teams on the hunt for a vital three points.





DANGERMAN RICKY HOLMES

**R&W TAKES A CLOSER
LOOK AT ONE OF CHARLTON
ATHLETIC'S DANGERMAN
THIS AFTERNOON...**

The lively winger joined the Addicks for an undisclosed fee from Northampton Town in the summer after playing a key role in the Cobblers' promotion to League One. The 29-year-old scored 16 goals in 53 games for Northampton after making the switch from Portsmouth in January 2015.

Began his career with Chelmsford City where he helped them to promotion and a memorable run in the FA Cup. Earned a call-up up to the England C National Team and finished as City's top goalscorer at the end of the 2009/10

campaign with 21 goals, fine form which led to a move to Barnet in June 2015.

Holmes then joined Portsmouth following Barnet's relegation to the Conference and was a massive hit at Fratton Park, finishing the 2013/14 campaign with an incredible 50 assists and the club's fans' Player of the Season Award. A move to Northampton Town followed in January 2015 and the attacker notched nine goals last term to help fire the Cobblers to promotion, earning a place in League Two's PFA Team of the Year.

Holmes has carried that stunning form into this season and has helped himself to three goals and 4 assists in 16 games for Charlton.

MEET THE REST...

DIMITAR MITOV

The Bulgarian goalkeeper joined the Addicks in May 2013 following an impressive trial at the Valley. Has represented his country at U17 level and has been on the fringes of the Charlton first-team squad.

DILLON PHILLIPS

Made his first-team debut for Charlton this season against Southampton U23s in the Checkatrade Trophy, keeping a clean sheet and saving a penalty in the subsequent penalty shoot-out. Spent time out on loan at Cheltenham Town in 2015/16 and helped the Robins secure an immediate return to the EFL.

EZRI KONSA

Has risen through the ranks of Charlton's Academy and spent pre-season with the first-team. Konsa is versatile and is comfortable at the heart of the defence,

in central midfield and can also operate as a right-back.

JASON PEARCE

The no-nonsense centre-back penned a three-year deal at the Valley in the summer after parting ways with Wigan Athletic, for whom he helped get promoted last season. Pearce knows the Football League inside out having had spells with Portsmouth, AFC Bournemouth and Leeds United, where he wore the captain's armband at all three clubs.

JORGE TEIXEIRA

Has been with Charlton since January 2015 after penning a four-and-a-half-year deal with the club, joining for an undisclosed fee from Standard Liege. The defender is able to boast both Champions League and Europa League experience and has played in the top domestic leagues in Switzerland, Italy and Israel.

AHMED KASHI

The midfielder became Charlton's fourth summer signing of the 2015/16 season after arriving from FC Metz on a three-year deal. Spent his entire career in France prior to his move to London and has also represented Algeria in the 2015 African Cup of Nations.

ADEMOLA LOOKMAN

The teenage striker burst onto the first-team scene for Charlton in November 2015, making his debut away at Milton Keynes Dons. He then netted his first goal for the senior side away at Brighton & Hove Albion in a 2-2 draw the following month and bagged a brace against Bolton Wanderers in December 2015. Leads the Addicks in scoring this season with five goals to his name.

KARLAN AHEARNE-GRAHAM

Became one of the youngest players to represent the Addicks in late 2014 and scored his first professional goal last season. Has been with Charlton since the age of 12 and has been tipped for a bright future at the Valley.

DECLAN RUDD



Is on a season-long loan at Charlton having arrived from Norwich City in August 2016. The 25-year-old has racked up over 100

professional appearances and featured on eleven occasions in the Premier League last season. Has also been capped at U16, U17, U19, U20 and U21 level.

KEVIN FOLEY



The vastly experienced defender became the Addicks' seventh signing of summer 2016 after putting pen to paper on an initial five-month contract with the club. The Irishman, who is capable of playing at both right-back and in central midfield, began his career with Luton Town before racking up over 200 games for Wolverhampton Wanderers.

ADAM CHICKSEN



Signed for Charlton on a free transfer prior to the start of the season and made his debut for the club against Southampton's U23s in the

Checkatrade Trophy. Started his career with hometown club MK Dons at the age of 14 and made his bow for the first-team just two years later. Has also played for Leyton Orient, Brighton & Hove Albion, Gillingham and Fleetwood Town.

PATRICK BAUER



Was one of the bright sparks for Charlton during an otherwise disastrous season at SE7, which resulted in the club's relegation from the Championship. The

big German defender impressed at the back before suffering a season-ending injury at Burnley in December 2015. The 23-year-old began his career with Stuttgart in his native Germany and has represented his country at U17, U18 and U21 level.

ROGER JOHNSON



The experienced defender has over 500 league games under his belt and made his professional debut for Wycombe Wanderers at the ripe old age of 17, before securing a move to Cardiff City in 2006. Johnson made 136 appearances for the Bluebirds, helping the club reach the FA Cup Final and being named Player of the Year twice. Has also won the League Cup with Birmingham City in 2011.

JOHNNIE JACKSON



The Charlton skipper is currently into his sixth year with the club and the midfielder surpassed the 200-appearance milestone

last season. Jackson is a firm fans' favourite at the Valley and skippered the side to the League One title and the former England youth international has enjoyed a bright start to this season, bagging four goals.

ANDREW CROFTS



Joined the Addicks on a one-year deal in July 2016 following a successful trial with the club throughout pre-season.

An assured presence at the base of midfield, Crofts has won 28 caps for Wales and has proven to be a star performer for the likes of Gillingham, Brighton & Hove Albion and Norwich City.

JORDAN BOTAKA



Is on a season-long loan deal at the Valley from Championship outfit Leeds United. Nicknamed the Wizard, Botaka began his professional career with Belgian outfit Club Brugge, signing his first pro contract in 2012. Signed for Leeds prior to the start of the 2015/16 season for a seven-figure sum and is also a full international with DR Congo.

FREDRIK ULVESTAD



Signed on loan from Premier League outfit Burnley on Transfer Deadline Day of summer 2016. Made over 132 appearances

for his hometown club Aalesunds FK, scoring 20 goals during a four-year period. Ulvestad is a full Norway international and has also represented his country at U20, U21 and U23 level.

JOSH MAGENNIS



Northern Irish striker Josh Magennis became the club's eighth capture of summer 2016 after joining from an undisclosed fee from Kilmarnock.

Began his career in Northern Ireland as a striker before opting to go between the sticks, but opted to revert back to a striker after joining Cardiff City. Bagged the goal that booked Northern Ireland's place at the 2016 European Championships.

NICKY AJOSE



A face that Swindon fans will know well having bagged 25 goals for Town last season, exploits which saw him named in the 2015/16 Football Manager Football League Team of the Year. Began his career with Manchester United and has had spells with the likes of Peterborough United, Crewe and Leeds United. Has four goals for Charlton so far this season.

LEE NOVAK



Another new signing at Charlton and should score goals at this level. Netted an impressive 15 goals in 38 games whilst

on loan at Chesterfield last season, but made his name with Huddersfield Town where he notched 42-times in 172 games. Enjoyed a spell with Birmingham City and began his career at the famous Wallsend Boys Club.



RUSSELL SLADE

Following their relegation from the Championship at the end of last season, Charlton Athletic looked to the experienced Football League campaigner as the man to take them straight back up.

Slade was handed a three-year deal by the Addicks in June 2016 and was immediately tasked with taking the club back to the second tier of English football.

Having spent the vast majority of his playing career at reserve team level, the 56-year-old moved into coaching in 1993 with Notts County, where he eventually took charge of the team on a Caretaker basis. From there, Slade had short spells with Armitage and Leicester United before being offered the chance to join Sheffield United's coaching staff in 1997.

Slade had two spells as Caretaker Manager of the Blades before landing his first permanent managerial post at Scarborough. The club were adrift at the bottom of the Conference upon his arrival in November 2001, but a remarkable run of 39 points from the final 19

games of the season ensured that they finished 13th.

It only got better the following season when Slade led Scarborough to 4th by Christmas, before resigning and then re-joining the club following a petition by the fans after the club went into administration. Scarborough also enjoyed a superb run in the FA Cup under Slade, defeating Hinckley United, Doncaster Rovers, Port Vale and Southend United, before suffering a narrow 1-0 defeat to Premier League giants Chelsea following a gutsy and courageous display.

Slade then took over at Grimsby Town, who he led to famous victories over Derby County and Tottenham Hotspur in the League Cup, before being lured to Yeovil Town. They reached the League One Play-Off Final under Slade, an achievement which led to a move to Brighton and Hove Albion.

Slade succeeded in his mission of saving Albion from the drop and it wasn't long before he was on the move again, filling the hot seat at Leyton Orient in April 2010. He kept Orient in League One by a single point before leading them to a fifth-place finish and a replay against Arsenal in the FA Cup the following season.

Cardiff City then came calling in October 2014 with Slade tasked with cutting the wage bill following the club's relegation from the Premier League. He led the club to 11th in his first season and 8th in his second, before being moved upstairs in a 'Head of Football' role. But Slade resigned from that role on 3rd June 2016 before taking over at Charlton just days later, and he'll be hoping to lead his new club to promotion this term.

The season hasn't gone as we would have hoped so far, but today's game represents a massive opportunity to start making steps in the right direction doesn't it?







SUNDAY

SWINDON TOWN AND THE EFL WILL UNITE TO PAY TRIBUTE TO FALLEN SERVICEMEN, WOMEN AND FORMER PLAYERS AS PART OF REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY COMMEMORATIONS AND THE FIRST WORLD WAR CENTENARY.

Sky Bet League One and League Two clubs will honour those that lost their lives at war over the weekend of the 12-13 November, whilst the 24 Sky Bet Championship teams will pay their respects the following weekend on Saturday 19 November to mark the Centenary of the Battle of the Somme which ended 100 years earlier on 18 November 1916.

Across all of the 72 member clubs between 12-19 November, there will be a minute's silence and an EFL wreath laid on the pitch prior to kick-off to remember and honour all of those that have fallen in battle.

The shirts and balls from this year's Remembrance fixtures will be auctioned to help support the fantastic work the British Legion does by supporting members of the Royal Navy, British Army, Royal Air Force, veterans and their families all year round.

In addition, Sky Bet and individual clubs will supply the British Legion with an allocation of tickets for all EFL fixtures across the three divisions between the 12-19 November, to be donated to current and retired service personnel.

EFL Communications Director, Mark Rowan said: "Every single one of our clubs lost players, staff and supporters, it is only right and appropriate that we

pay a tribute. Football is all about community and the EFL's clubs, fans and staff will all stand in silence together to pay our respects this November."

Sky Bet spokesman Sandro Di Michele added: "We're delighted to be continuing our relationship with the Royal British Legion into a third season after raising a terrific amount of money last year. The generosity shown by fans of Championship clubs was truly remarkable and we hope this year's campaign will be no different."

Fought over 141 days between 1 July and 18 November 1916, the Battle of the Somme was one of the defining battles of the First World War. With over 400,000 British casualties and over 1 million men of all nationalities killed, the Somme remains one of the most brutal individual battles ever fought.

One hundred years on, the Battle of the Somme is being remembered across the country as part of the official First World War Centenary commemorations of which the EFL is proud to play its part by marking the centenary of the Battle of the Somme's end on 19 November.

Having launched the #FootballRemembers campaign in March 2014 at the start of the First World War Centenary to mark the contribution made

by the game, football continues to pay its respects to those who made the ultimate sacrifice 100 years ago.

Sadly, many players, staff and fans of EFL clubs were killed at the Somme, 1,000 whom fought for the Footballers Battalions which included many of the great stars of the day and some of those who would go on to achieve great footballing feats in the post-war era.

In recent weeks, EFL clubs and the communities in which they are embedded have been paying tribute to those who lost their lives. A full Sky Bet Championship fixture list will take place 24 hours after the 100-year anniversary of the final day of the

Battle of Somme, giving clubs the opportunity to pay their respects to their fallen players and supporters.

This activity will support the British Legion's national campaign, Sport Remembers the Somme, to commemorate the role played by sporting men and women for the centennial year.

Town will be paying their respects at today's game with a minute's silence to be held, before Frances Cowley from the Swindon Brass Band comes out on to the pitch to play the Last Post. The captains from Swindon and Charlton Athletic will also be laying out a wreath on to the pitch prior to kick-off.

ON THIS DAY:

12 NOVEMBER

1904

It was a busy day at The County Ground with a 'double header' - both a League and an FA Cup fixture on the same afternoon! The first-team fell to a 3-1 defeat to Brentford in the Southern League, but the reserves - kicking off earlier at 1 p.m. - had a much easier task against minnows Longfleet St Marys in the Cup. Freddy Wheatcroft netted a hat-trick on his debut as Town romped to an 8-0 win. Six of the eleven in the Dorset village side were named Brown!

1949

Town faced a tough trip to Third South leaders Notts County, who had lost just once previously. And their task was made even tougher when, in front of over 37,000, keeper Frank Boulton was carried off early in the second-half with a dislocated ankle. It would prove to be his last game for the club. With no substitutes then, full-back Albert Young went in goal. England forward Tommy Lawton hit all the goals in a 3-0 win.

1955

Swindon slumped to their 13th successive away defeat - 0-4 at Gillingham - and their 25th without a win. The run would come to an end a fortnight later at Reading.



1983

After five 'blanks' on this date in history, Town recorded their first goal and first win for 51 years. Recovering from an early Simon Gibson own goal, Gary Emmanuel put his side level against visitors Hartlepools. Andy Rowland and Leigh Barnard both found the target in the final five minutes to bag three Fourth Division points for the hosts. The attendance was just 3,074.

2002

"You could probably say the same for us so both teams now are looking to kick-start their seasons again," he added.


"We'll well aware of the calibre of players they've got. They've got Nicky who we all know has got goalscoring ability and I guess he'll be keen to put one over on his old team.

"Part and parcel of being a professional footballer is being able to produce performances on a national level and those are the games we all love playing in because it provides a platform both personally and as a team.







WITH JEREMY NEWTON

Town's Academy Manager reflects on a busy few weeks and dishes out praise to a certain scholar who has come in for some special recognition of late...

Half-term has played a big part in us being busy where we've maximised the contact time with all the players from the 7's all the way through. We've tried to build a challenging games programme within that and this has seen the U13s play Liverpool, which was a fantastic game. The final result was 3-3 and that was a big plus for us and a good challenge for us to go up there and try and compete with the bigger clubs.

Off the back of that we've played Cardiff and again it was a fantastic challenge and some very close games all the way through the age groups. Recently, the U9s, U10s and U12s went up to Leicester and all three age groups got results up there, so it is a fantastic and busy programme.

It is something we want to try and keep doing and our U15s went up to West Brom last weekend and won 6-3, so we're doing okay throughout the age groups but we've just got to keep getting these games.

That is becoming easier following the results and, I know we don't talk about results often, but in order to get the calibre of clubs we're playing you have to do the right things and sometimes you've got to show how to play football, which is our

philosophy, but you've still got to be able to compete against these clubs in order to be invited back and in order to get further games.

That has been a big plus for us and we try and achieve over 50 games a season and we think that is massive for us. We've got lots of tournaments and festivals coming up, our U9s and U12s are involved in a tournament at Southend this weekend with West Ham and Arsenal in attendance, so again that is going to be a tough festival for the boys.

Our U13s are at Watford so it is a busy programme and then we've got the FA Youth Cup as well, so it is something we're all looking forward to and it is going in the right direction.

To finish off, it was brilliant to see our Academy graduate Will Henry named as one of the EFL's Top Ten Talented Teens last month. Will is very mature even though he is so young and a lot of that is based on his education. I don't have to ask him where he is with his education, he is proactive with that and goes to the teachers at the college and gets further work so this enables him to fulfil his requirements to train with the first-team.

That's the deal we've got and it is fantastic recognition that he's achieved that. He received a £50 bonus as well which might fill his car up for a couple of weeks, but it is important that he continues to improve not just on his football but on his college programme as well, because education is an important part of their apprenticeship.

It was up and down and I was gutted as it looked like we were going out but then it just seemed to be one of those nights where everything seemed to go for us - it was meant to be in the end.



