Swindon Town have been drawn at home to Luton Town in the Second Round of the Checkatrade Trophy.

The Reds were handed a tie at The County Ground after finishing top of the Southern Group C following a 4-2 penalty shootout success over Exeter City last week.

Town will now host League Two outfit Luton at SN1 the week commencing December 5th in a straight knockout game with both sides hoping to move a step closer to Wembley.

Luke Williams' side defeated Chelsea's U21s 2-1 in September before beating both Oxford United and Exeter City on spot-kicks to finish top of the pile in Southern Group C.

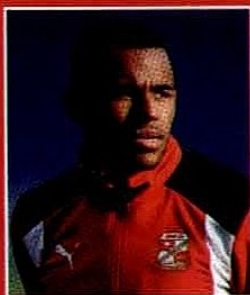

Good Evening everyone and welcome to The County Ground for tonight's FA Cup First Round Replay against Eastleigh FC.

I am, as I'm sure you all are, still on a massive high following our superb 3-0 win against Charlton Athletic at The County Ground on Saturday. The boys were outstanding in all areas of the pitch from start to finish and it was arguably our most complete performance of the season so far.

We limited them to very few chances and that is an impressive feat given the firepower they had at their disposal on the day in Lee Novak and Nicky Ajose, who we all know can score goals and plenty of them at this level. Lawrence Vigouroux had very little to do and we looked very solid defensively.

But it was going forward where we really impressed and Charlton just could not handle us on the day. Tim's arrival will only help us and the coaching staff moving forward and I look forward to working with him in training upon my return.

On that note, I'm really happy with my recovery at the moment and I'm now off crutches, which is the main thing. I'm still a few weeks away but I'm feeling stronger every day and I can't wait to get back out there.

Looking ahead to tonight and all the boys know what is at stake. Given the Second Round draw which has given us a home tie against non-league opposition, we feel we have a really good chance of reaching the Third Round of the FA Cup and potentially drawing one of the big boys. However, we can't look that far ahead yet because we know, as seen in the original fixture, that Eastleigh will be a really tough nut to crack tonight and they will be going all out to get the job done too. Saying that, we're playing at home and it is up to us to take the game to our opposition and make sure we stay in this great competition.

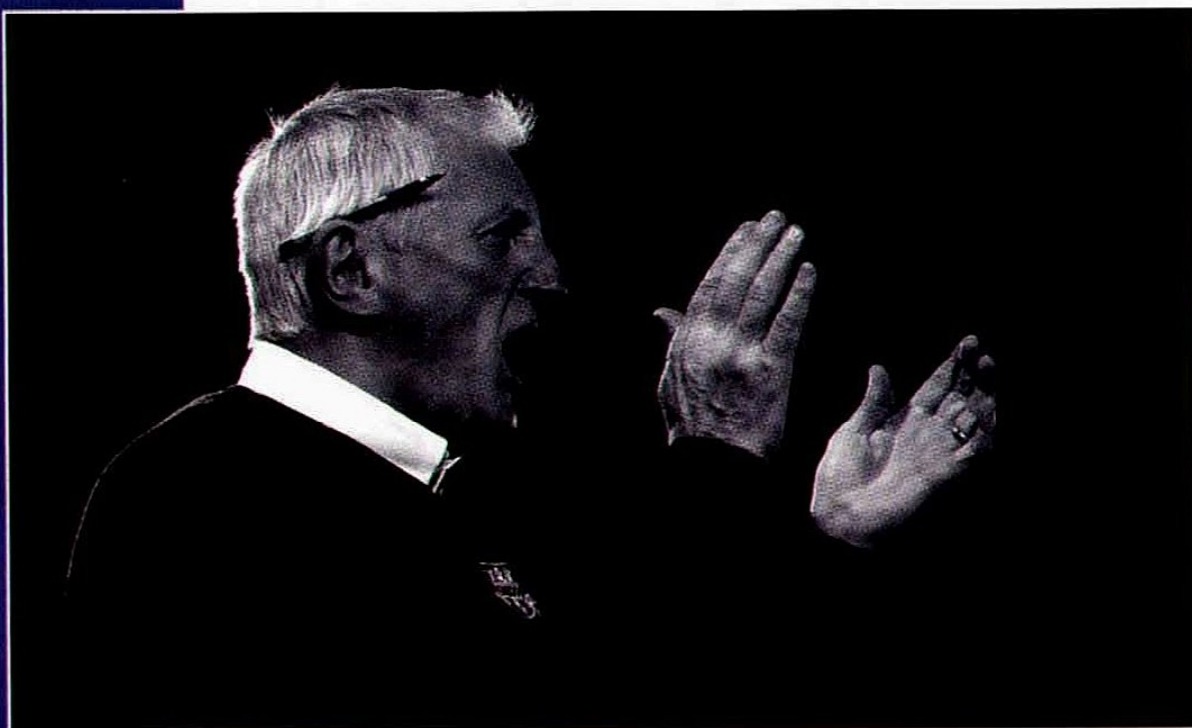

DID YOU KNOW:

Eastleigh are nicknamed 'The Spitfires' after the club ran a competition to choose a nickname in 2005. The Supermarine Type F37/34 Spitfire was assembled at Eastleigh (now Southampton International) Airport, which made its maiden flight on 5th March 1936.



MANAGER

RONNIE MOORE

Moore was announced as the new man in charge of the Spitfires in August 2016 after the non-league club parted company with Chris Todd.

Moore was handed a two-year contract and will be tasked with taking Eastleigh into the Football League sooner rather than later.

The former striker began his playing career, which spanned nearly two decades, with local side Tranmere Rovers initially as a centre-half, before making a hugely successful switch to centre-forward. Moore spent a fruitful spell with Chicago Sting in the summer of 1977, scoring five goals in just one match to equal the division's all-time record. He also scored the winner against the New York Cosmos, who had none other than the legendary Pele in their ranks that day.

Moore then spent a season at Cardiff City before sealing a move to Rotherham United, where he became one of the club's most prolific ever strikers. After three seasons with the Millers he went on to have spells with Charlton Athletic and Rochdale before finishing his career with Tranmere in 1989.

The 63-year-old's first managerial job was at Southport but that lasted just a year before Rotherham United came calling in 1997. This proved to be a match made in heaven as Moore led the struggling Millers to back-to-back promotions from Division Three to Division One. Moore then joined Oldham Athletic before taking charge of Tranmere Rovers in June 2006.

Moore led Rovers to the play-offs and ended up having two spells with the club as manager, in-between a second spell at Rotherham. Hartlepool United came calling in December 2014 and looked certain to drop out of the Football League but, under the guidance of Moore, pulled off the great escape to preserve their League Two status.

Having left United by mutual consent earlier this year, Moore then took up the challenge of breathing new life into Eastleigh's season and, with plenty of backing behind him, will be expected to turn his new side into promotion challengers as the Spitfires look to become a Football League club.

DANGERMAN

MIKAEL MANDRON

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK
AT ONE OF EASTLEIGH'S
DANGERMEN THIS EVENING...

The striker joined Eastleigh in June 2016 despite being linked with a move to Partick Thistle north of the border. Joined Premier League outfit Sunderland as a 16-year-old in 2011 after spending his junior career in his native France.

After advancing through the youth ranks at the Stadium of Light, Mandron was called up by the first-team in March 2013 following an injury to Steven Fletcher and was an unused substitute against Manchester United. But, just a month later, the attacker made his professional debut during a 6-1 defeat to Aston Villa, replacing

Danny Graham in the 85th minute.

Mandron was awarded a new one-year contract shortly after but found his chances at Sunderland limited and joined Fleetwood Town on loan midway through the 2013/14 campaign, notching his first professional goal in February 2014 during a 2-1 defeat to York City.

The 22-year-old went on to have loan stints with Shrewsbury Town and Hartlepool United before joining forces with Eastleigh on a permanent basis after being released by Sunderland. Scored against Town in the First Round and will be hoping to do the same tonight in order to send the Spitfires through to the Second Round of the FA Cup.



KEY MEN

RYAN CLARKE

A September 2016 signing from AFC Wimbledon. Ryan has also played for Northampton Town, Bristol Rovers, Southend United, Kidderminster Harriers, Forest Green Rovers, Salisbury City, Northwich Victoria and Oxford United. Is a vastly experienced keeper and has been in impressive form for the Spitfires this season.

RYAN CRESSWELL

The central defender is an experienced campaigner and has plied his trade for a number of Football League teams, including the likes of Northampton Town, Sheffield United, Rotherham United and Southend United. Was suspended for the original fixture against Town but should be available tonight.

REDA JOHNSON

A few eyebrows were raised when the bulking defender signed for Eastleigh in

the summer given that he had attracted Football League interest following his departure from Coventry City. Blessed with plenty of physical and aerial ability, Johnson is a commanding presence at the back for the Spitfires and will be key to their hopes tonight.

JOE PARTINGTON

Signed on loan in January 2015 from Championship side AFC Bournemouth before making the move permanent in July 2015. Joe has also had spells with Portsmouth, Aldershot Town and Eastbourne Borough. Capped at Under 17, 19 and 21 level by Wales.

LUKE COULSON

Noted as Eastleigh's record signing when joining from Oxford City in January 2016. Previously with Manchester City and Cardiff City. Can also play in a defensive role and was called up to the England C setup earlier this season.

ANDY DRURY

July 2015 signing from Luton Town. Andy started his career at Sittingbourne before

having spells with Lewes, Stevenage Borough and Luton Town before sealing a £150,000 move to Ipswich Town, where he scored two goals in sixty-two appearances. A spell at Crawley Town then followed before returning to Luton Town and then on to Eastleigh.

DAVID PIPE

Signed in May 2016 from Forest Green Rovers. David has previously played for Coventry City, Notts County, Bristol Rovers, Cheltenham Town and Newport County. Has represented Wales at Under 21 and senior level.

JAMES CONSTABLE

May 2014 signing from Oxford United where James was just one goal short of breaking the overall goalscoring record for the club. The striker has also played for Cirencester Town, Chippenham Town, Walsall, Kidderminster Harriers and Shrewsbury Town. Will be relied upon to provide the goals for Eastleigh tonight.

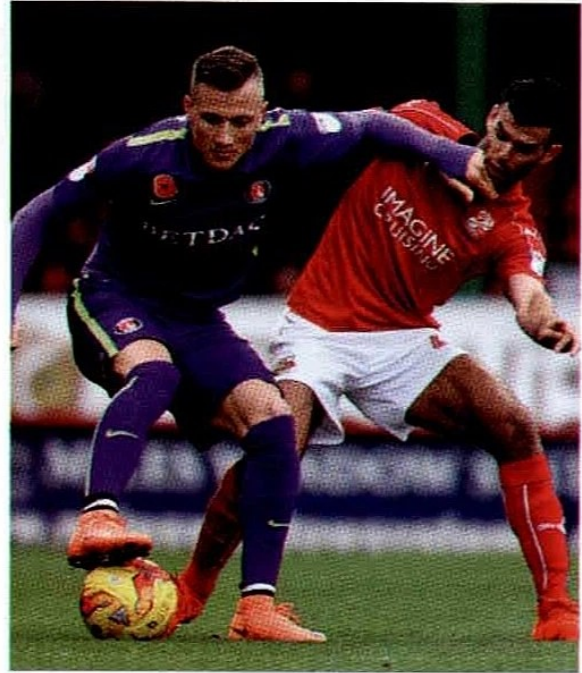

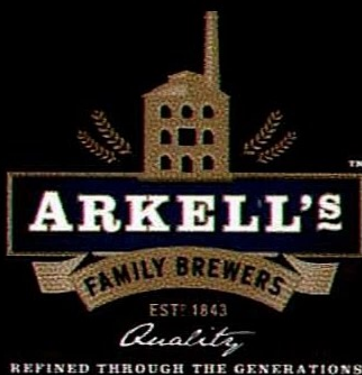

Able to boast a glittering CV having managed both Tottenham Hotspur and Aston Villa, the former Premier League winner has been brought in to head up the football department at The County Ground.

Speaking to R&W shortly after he was introduced to the national media at SN1, Sherwood made it clear that he sees his link-up with Town as a "great opportunity."

"It is a great opportunity for me. People will be a little bit surprised that I've chosen Swindon over a few opportunities that I had, but it doesn't surprise me," he said.

"I'm looking for an opportunity where we can try and build something and I've had a relationship with this club for over four years now.

"WE'RE STILL IN SHOCK THAT WE'VE MANAGED TO GET TIM TO TAKE IT ON."

"I like this club and I've got a soft spot for it.

"My friend is the Chairman here and, not only that, I sent a lot of loan players here from Tottenham when I was doing the development there and a lot of those boys have gone on to do very, very well.

"It benefitted them and it benefitted Swindon Town at the time.

"The time has come where we can continue to develop the young players as individuals, but we need to start developing the club and Lee (Power) recognises that.

"I'm just coming in here to help Luke Williams. My job role is a bit of everything. I think the playing style will be tweaked somewhat, not totally, there's not a lot wrong but at times they need to go a little



bit more direct or turn the page over.

"That's what I'm trying to do and we're not for one minute suggesting we're going to start lumping the ball forward and going from back to front.

"I'm going to use Luke Williams' knowledge to assess what we have here and come January if we feel we need to strengthen, which I'm sure we will, we will see what is available to bring in.

"I've always been very big on trying to get the best out of what you

have. We'll work with what we've got and there is a lot of games between now and January, so we have to get the best out of what we have here and it is up to the boys to prove that they're worthy of a place at this club.

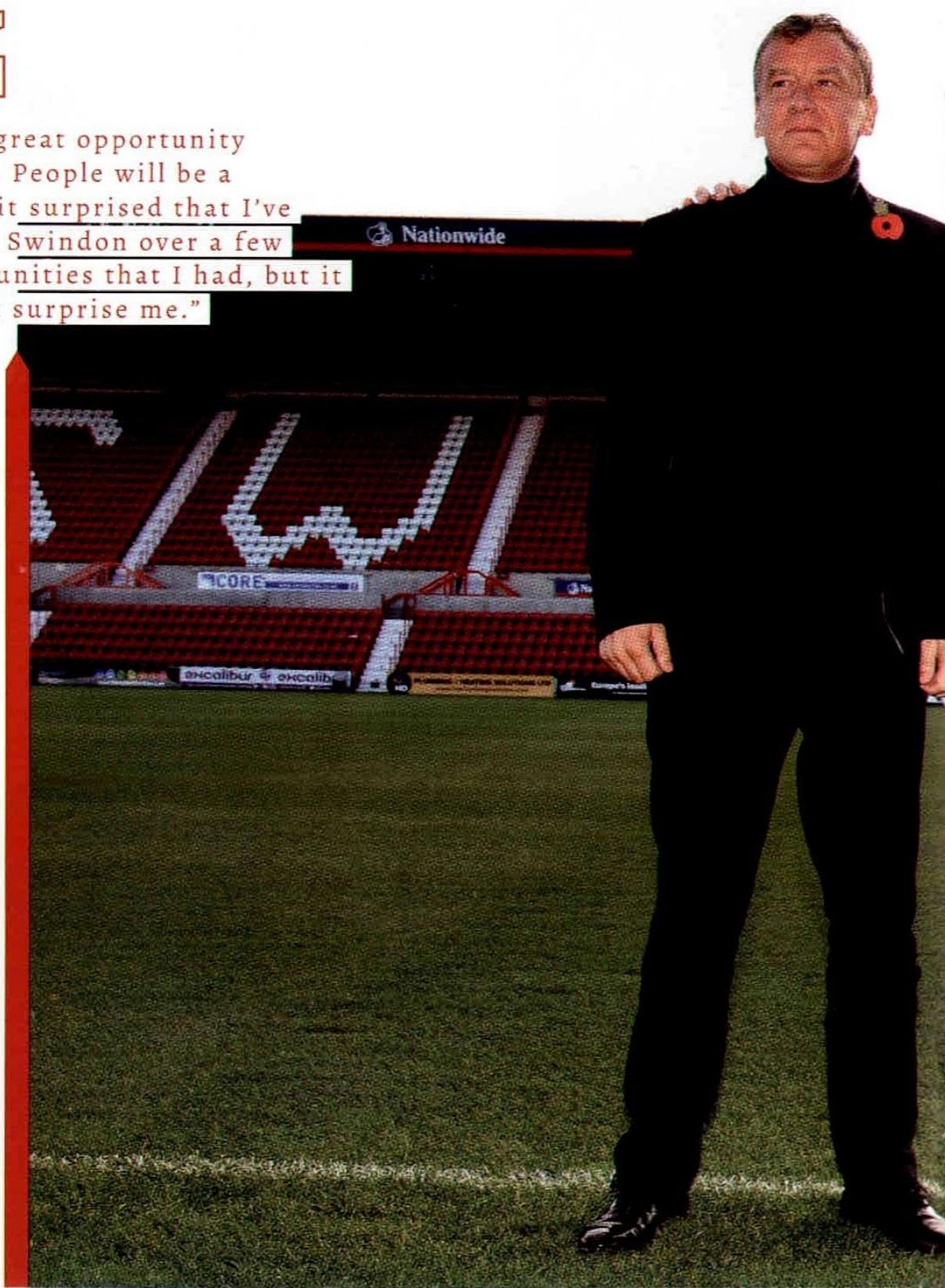

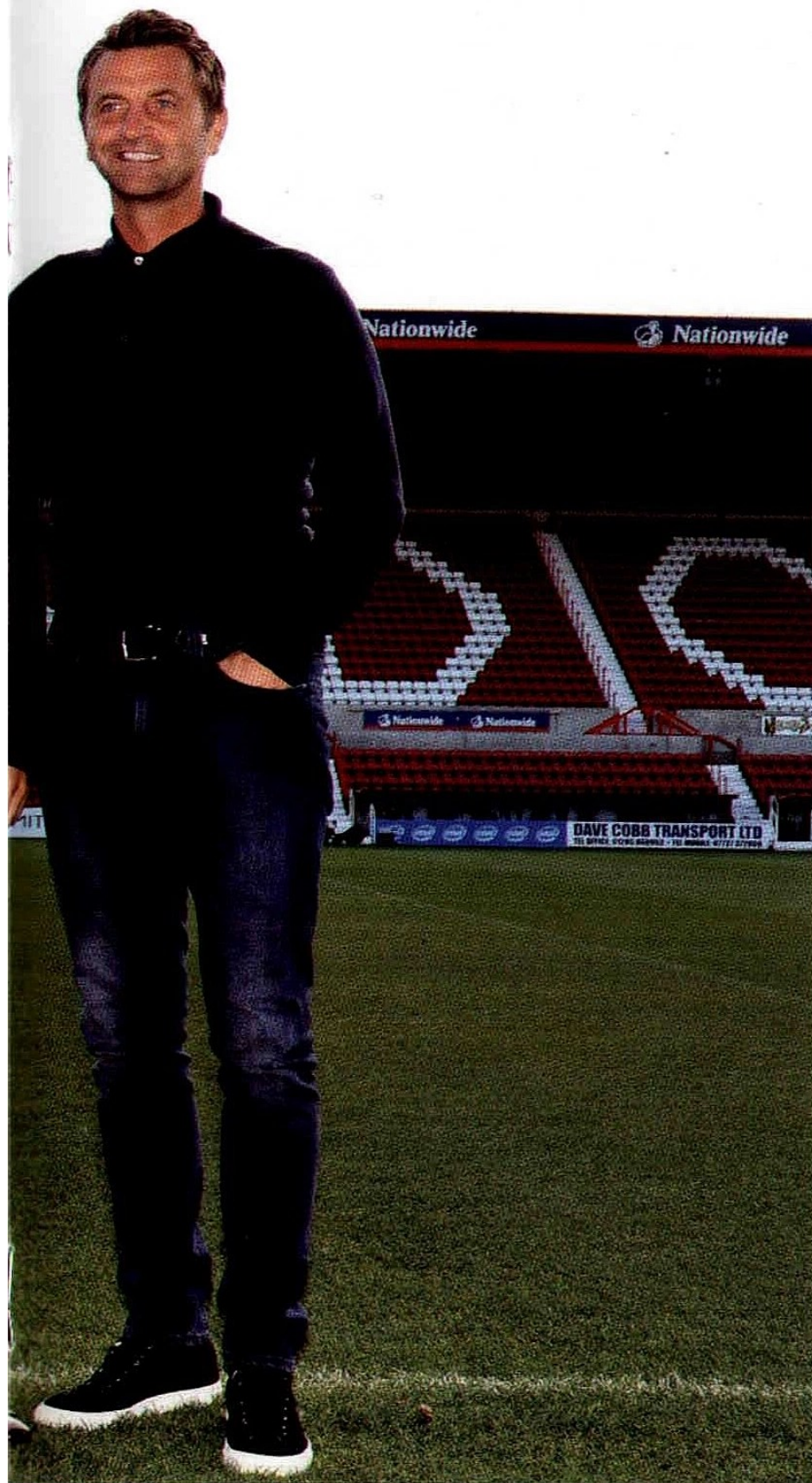
Town Chairman Lee Power was thrilled to have got Tim Sherwood on board at The County Ground and outlined the former player's role at the club.

1902

Town entertained Poole in the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup. It was the only home fixture between the first Saturday in October and Christmas - seven successive away Southern League games interspersed with four in the Cup! Jimmy Pugh hit a hat-trick as Swindon swept Poole aside 7-1.

1947

A record County Ground crowd of 26,401 saw Swindon entertain Bristol City in a 2-2 draw. The previous record was for the same fixture 13 months earlier when 25,031 also witnessed a stalemate. The new record (for which gate receipts were just under £2,000!) would stand for just ten weeks.

1958

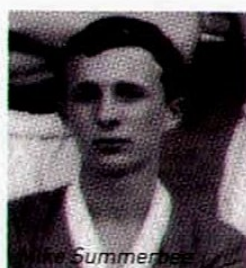
Town wasted little time in getting off the mark against FA Cup visitors Aldershot, with two goals in the first three minutes! Bob Edwards opened the scoring and Arnold Darcy then netted the first of a hat-trick as the Shots went down 5-0.

1960

Swindon's FA Youth Cup Second Round away tie with Weymouth was switched to the County Ground, where Mike Summerbee helped himself to seven goals in a 14-0 victory. Ernie Hunt hit four and Roger Smart three in front of a 1,945 gate. Seven of the eleven who played that night were to progress to the League side.

1994

First winners of the competition 24 years earlier, Town played their last ever game in the Anglo-Italian Cup in Ascoli. Less than 1,000 saw the hosts win 3-1, substitute Chris Hamon replying from the penalty spot.

2014

Bristol City were again visitors to the County Ground, but less than half of the 1947 attendance watched Swindon clinch victory with a single goal from Michael Smith in the 78th minute. By that time the visitors had been playing a man short for all but three minutes following the dismissal of Wade Elliott.

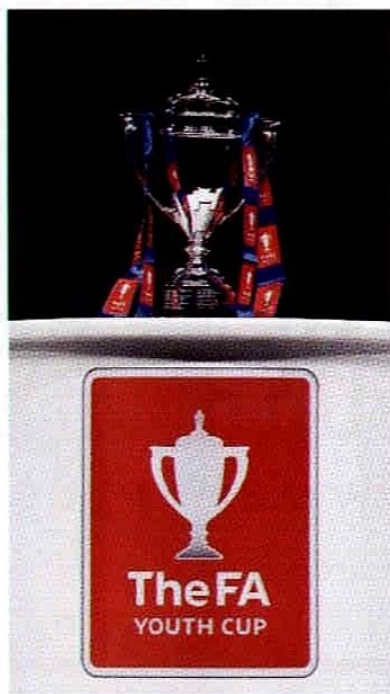

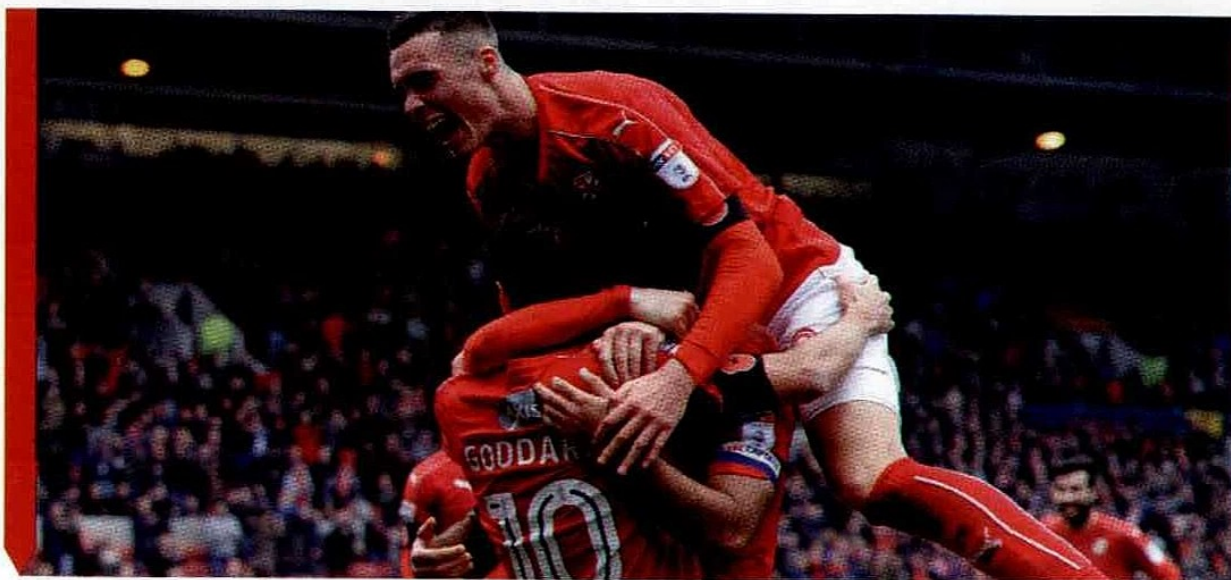
