








Tonight for me is more of the same; the same level of performance as





Saturday, the same level of commitment as Saturday, and the same level of work rate as Saturday. Hopefully then the result will take care of itself.



Swindon Town visit Roots Hall tonight with a former Premier League winner in the stands.

Tim Sherwood, who won English football's top division with Blackburn Rovers in 1994/95, was appointed Director of Football only two weeks ago.

He was most recently manager at Tottenham Hotspur and Aston Villa, but since departing Villa Park has turned to an altogether different role at the forefront of the Robins' affairs.

He will be working to take try and take Swindon back to the top end of the League One standings, where they were not so long ago.


In 2015 Swindon reached the

League One Play-Off Final, losing out to Preston North End at Wembley 4-0.

Rolling the years back even further it should be mentioned the dizzy heights the Robins reached abok in 1992/93 when they were part of the then newly formed Premier League.

There are two obvious connections between the two sides in Simon Cox, who of course spent a very successful two-year period at the County Ground, and Michael Timlin, who spent a lengthy time there inbetween loan spells at Roots Hall.

Cox scored 46 goals for the Robins before getting a big money move to West Brom.

ROBINS' boss Luke Williams is one of the youngest managers in the Football League.

At 35-years-old, Williams is in the infancy of his career. His time at the County ground began at the start of the year after being promoted into the hot-seat following Martin Ling's sudden resignation.


His first game in charge was as caretaker manager which was, ironically, against Blues and the 4-2 comeback win went someway to staking his case for the job.

Another win against Crewe, 4-3 this time, sealed the deal, confirming his progression from assistant to the main man until the end of the season.

In March his contract was extended for another five years after winning six of his first ten games.


In the main, Williams was involved in youth football prior to first team management and a three-year stint as Brighton & Hove Albion Reserve Team and U21 manager preceded his time at Swindon.

Williams was also an FA Skills Coach and worked for Leyton Orient and West Ham.



Club legend

John TROLLOPE

JOHN TROLLOPE is revered among Swindon fans for all he achieved in his various roles he occupied during the 36 years he was there.

He made his debut in 1960 as a 17-year-old and went on to set the all-time record for league appearances at one club; a staggering 770 games over 20 years.

Trollope holds a club record number of appearances for the Robins with 889, of which only three came as a substitute.

He played left-back in the 1968/69 Third Division promotion winning side which then overcame a two-division gap to beat Arsenal in the 1969 League Cup Final.

He finally retired after the 1980/81 season before replacing Bobby Smith early the following season as manager of Swindon.


Working on a shoe-string budget, the management side of things failed to live up to his legendary status.

He led the club to their first ever relegation to Division Four and soon left at the end of the 1982/83 season.

It wasn't to be the end of his time in Wiltshire though, as he was appointed assistant manager to Lou Macari in 1985 and then youth team coach under Ossie Ardiles, Glen Hoddle, John Gorman and Steve McMahon before leaving in 1996.

In that time, he was involved in taking Swindon from the Fourth Division to the Premier League.


A proportion of my day entails me raising invoices, mainly hospitality related; Executive Boxes, Blues Legends Lounge, One10 Club etc. but can also be player related.

Youth Round-Up

outhend United U18s stretched their unbeaten run in the EFL Youth Alliance South East Conference to three matches ahead of last Saturday's visit to league leaders Leyton Orient.

Following a 2-1 victory over Gillingham at Boots & Laces at the end of October, Blues won their opening two league games in November by defeating AFC Wimbledon in south London before triumphing 2-0 over Dagenham & Redbridge at Old Parkonians FC in Fairlop.

"I wrote down five games on a board, and I said to the boys that we need to win all five of these five games," explained youth team coach Dave Huzzey of the team's recent upturn in form. "I was aware that The FA Youth Cup was in the middle of that, but I didn't put that down."

"It was the two friendly games against Reading, then Gillingham, AFC Wimbledon and Dagenham & Redbridge. To be fair to the boys, we won them all 2-1 apart from Dagenham, which we won 2-0. They've all been good performances and, because of the way I like to play with the technical side, the last one was a very good performance."

"It was tough conditions, and it was mentally tough to get

motivated. The boys that came off the bench must've been freezing, but they showed the grit and desire and determination to make sure, when they came on, they affected the game. I'm really, really pleased with the performances in those five games that I put on the board."

The fourth of those five matches was against the Dons, with Blues reeling from a 6-0 defeat against Leyton Orient in The FA Youth Cup just three days previously. Huzzey made just two changes to the starting line-up that had been beaten at Roots Hall, and goals by Imani Matthews and Joe Mackenzie ensured that the Shrimpers secured an important three points.

"I was satisfied with the boys' performance; I thought it was very good. I thought we showed a really good reaction after the Orient match, and that's all we could ask of them. In the context of what had happened, it was a really good win," admitted Huzzey.

"I could've made eleven changes if I'm honest, and boys know that, but I decided it was more of a statement to name more or less the same side and say, 'Let's get ourselves out of this,' because The FA Youth Cup was nowhere near acceptable, and it's not forgotten at all. The one thing it has done is got a reaction and got us some really



important points in the league."

"I think this win pushes us up to fifth, and it makes a massive statement. The last couple of games have been so important for us in the league against Gillingham and then today, so I'm really, really pleased that we've got a reaction from the boys. It was brilliant to have a game so quickly after Orient. and I'm glad it ended in the way it did."

First-year scholar Dru Yearwood had twice drawn good saves from the Wimbledon goalkeeper in a goalless first period, but Matthews gave the visitors the lead just before the hour mark when he fired home after a typically tricky Alex Clark run. Blues tired in the closing stages, and Jayden Antwi equalised via the underside of the crossbar, but Joe Mackenzie nodded in a Tom Clifford corner to hand Southend the win.

Huzzey shuffled the squad again for the short trip to Dagenham ten days ago, making three changes. Blues were on top from the outset, and Harry Cuthbert and Sewa Marah had both shot narrowly offtarget before Eren Kinali drew a fine save from the Daggers goalkeeper. In the 33rd minute, Blues led thanks to Cuthbert's first youth team goal, a superb strike from 25 yards after fine work from Lewis Gard and Marah.

Cuthbert twice could have added to his tally before half-time, and Marah nodded a corner straight





into the goalkeeper's gloves, but Southend kept up the pressure in the second period and substitute Alex Clark was unlucky when his cheeky chip from a Cuthbert pass was tipped onto the crossbar. The winger almost converted the rebound, but the goalkeeper made a superb double save.

Blues made sure of the points thirteen minutes from time when Gard marked his 50th youth team appearance with a goal, converting a penalty that he had won after being tripped having latched onto Matthews' return pass. "I thought Lowis Gard was the best player on the pitch. He was absolutely brilliant," remarked Huzzey.

These games are hard for him, when it's a heavy pitch and he's playing against a physical side because of the size and shape he is. I spoke to him before the game and told him he had to find another way of doing it rather than the technical side of it. He did that superbly well, and he looked like the strongest player on the pitch today because of the way he used his body."

"It was a real tough one because of the way Dagenham play and they are a good side, but also because of the pitch and the weather, and that was a real leveller. I thought the boys won because they were the most determined side, they showed real grit to make sure they didn't concede and they had loads of chances to score. I thought they showed a brilliant mind-set today

and a brilliant desire to go and win the game."

"I thought defensively we looked really solid. I can't remember too many chances where Dagenham got in behind us or affected us, and they are a good side this year. I reminded the boys at half-time that against AFC Wimbledon we went 1-0 up and they came back into the game when they shouldn't have because we were much the better side, and it was the same today."

"It would've been tough on us, I think, if they'd've got back into the game but, playing a good side like we were, you sometimes have that at the back of your mind. It makes you more determined as a manager to drive the boys on to stop it happening again, and it didn't today. I thought defensively we were really solid, and that was the foundation for us to go and build from in our attacking play," he concluded.



outhend United U21s emerged victorious from an eight-goal thriller at Boots Laces last Tuesday when AFC Wimbledon visited for a Central League South East Division encounter.

Midfielder Joe Bedford scored with two outstanding first-half finishes before George Oakley halved the deficit for the Dons. Two minutes before half-time, Paul Kalambayi put the ball in his own net to restore Southend's two-goal advantage and, after Egil Kaja had again scored for the away team. Adam King scored from closerange. Oakley's second made it tight again, but Norman Wabo umbbed a late fifth for Blues.

"It was entertaining," said U21s boss Kevin Maher, "I think we played very well at times. There were a lot of good performances, and a lot of good goals in the game as well. There were a couple of poor ones from our point of view, and it was disappointing to concede three goals, but when you have scored five, you'll take that."

Bedford opened the scoring after ten minutes when King won a corner and Nico Cotton's delivery was only cleared as far as the edge of the penalty area, where the 19-year-old arrowed an effort into the bottom lefthand corner. A quarter-of-an-hour later Bedford was celebrating a consational finish, his sweet strike from 35 yards out flying into the top left-hand corner after he had controlled King's pass.

Four minutes before half-time, Onkley got on the scoresheet by nutmegging Blues goalkeeper Josh Bexon, but Southend stretched their lead again a couple of moments later when Jack Bridge intelligently switched play to the



right flank and Elvis Bwomono's centre was poked past his own goalkeeper by Kalambayi.

Within two minutes of the restart. Wimbledon had made it 3-2 through Kaja, who slotted a long ball forwards inside the lefthand post, but Blues responded quickly, and a trialist's tricky leftwing run culminated in a square pass that King converted from eight yards out.

Again the Dons hit back. and with around 20 minutes remaining, Oakley's clinical finish via the base of the left-hand upright reduced the arrears to a single goal once again. However, Blues had just enough to see off their opponents with Wabo latching onto a trialist's right-wing pass before slamming his shot into the roof of the net to complete the scoring at 5-3 in the final minute.





dam Thompson is thriving at the heart of the Blues defence and relishing every moment of it.

And Thompson is delighted with the way the team has bounced back from them and how the backline is doing its job.


"The whole defensive unit is doing well, really", he said.

like he's helped me a lot."





QUID-A-GOAL

Pledges for the 2016/17 season Quid-A-Goal scheme have already started to come in and it is hoped that we will beat the total of £1796.25 raised last season.

The aim of the scheme - like most of the Shrimpers Trust's - activities is to raise money for Southend United Football Club and make sure that there is a club for us to be supporting in the foreseeable future. This is how it works: Those who support the scheme with a pledge have their name displayed in the Blues' matchday programme each week and are also detailed on our website, www. shrimperstrust.co.uk. We ask you to pledge £0.25, £0.50, £1.00 or more under various headings such as clean sheets, various players scoring goals, or leam goals.

This does not have to cost you a fortune as you can easily judge in advance how much your pledge will cost you come the end of the season.

For example, the Blues rarely manage more than 70 goals in a season from first team matches. A 25p per goal pledge would therefore most likely not cost you more than £20 come the end of the season. If funds are tight, how about £1 for every goal scored by our full-backs? The 14/15 season would have cost you £1.50. If you chose to do £0.50 per point

and we finished up with 80 points, at the end of the season we would write to you thanking you for your support of this initiative asking you to send us a cheque for the amount of £40.

Last year this scheme raised almost £2,000 from the 75 people that helped us. This includes support by some of the Southend United's directors; why not join them this time around?

Goals from Alex Revell and Francis Laurent overcame Maurice Malpass' Swindon side.

Coering Southend United can often conjure up all kinds of weird and wonderful moments.



bagged two for the hosts on a day that would see Barcelona striker Luis Suarez miss a penalty for the away side. Eduardo Vargas kept up his impressive goal scoring record for Chile with his 32nd goal for the national side.

Brazil took advantage of

Uruguay's slip up by extending their lead in the group with a 2-0 win against Peru on almost a week ago now, with the goals coming from Manchester City bound striker Gabriel Jesus and Beijing Guoan midfielder Renato Augusto which sealed the three points with just over ten minutes to go.

CHARLTON ATHLETIC have sacked their manager Russell Slade (right) after less than six months in charge at the Valley.


The final straw was their 3-0 thrashing away at tonight's opponents Swindon Town at the County Ground.




