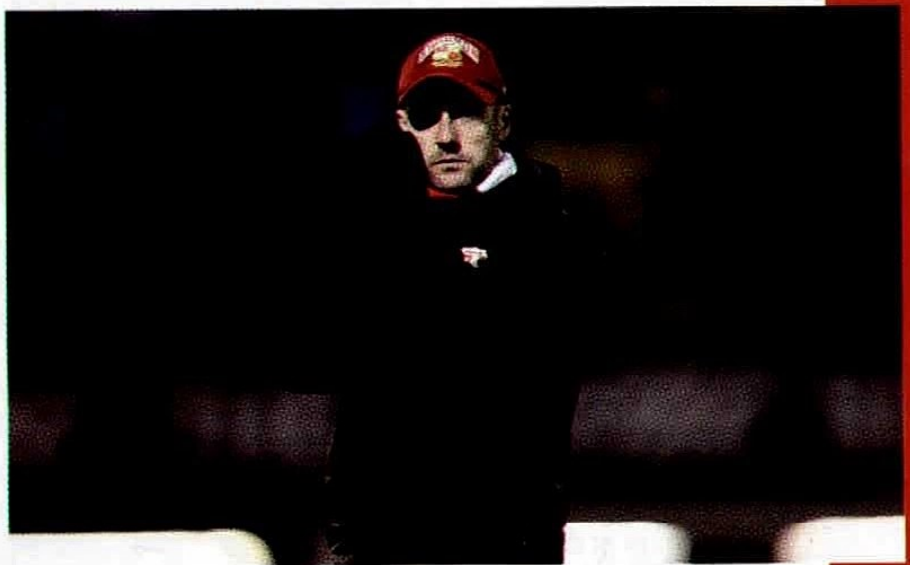

Good Afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for today's Sky Bet League One game against Bradford City. I would like to extend a warm welcome to the players, management, directors and supporters of the Bantams and I hope you enjoy your stay with us.

Since my last set of notes things haven't gone quite as we hoped and expected. We knew that the game against Eastleigh in the Emirates FA Cup First Round replay was going to be tough having been held to a 1-1 draw at the Silverlake Stadium earlier in the month. The Spitfires wanted it more on the night which was disappointing given that the path to the Third Round was in sight. The club have now fallen at the first hurdle of the competition ever since the 2011/12 campaign and this is something we will all be looking to put right next season.

Moving on to Rochdale and again it was a disappointing result given that less than a month ago we had outclassed the same opposition at SN1. 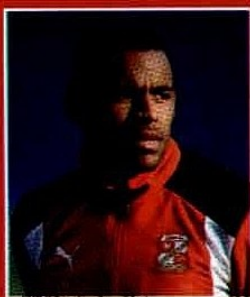

• BRADFORD CITY •

The Bantams are currently riding high in the Sky Bet League One and will be looking to give their promotion credentials a big boost with victory at SN1 this afternoon.

Following the return of club legend Stuart McCall to Valley Parade in the summer, City have gone from strength to strength and have spent the majority of this season in the upper echelons of the League One table.

After long-serving boss Phil Parkinson left for pastures new with Bolton Wanderers in the off-season, McCall began his second spell as manager of Bradford and has assembled a squad more than capable of challenging for promotion. The likes of Matthew Kilgallon, Romain Vincelot, Nicky Law and Vincent Rabiega were all recruited to add to an already impressive and strong core.

The Bantams boast a stubborn and resolute back-line and are hard to breach, while they are able to pack a punch at the other end of the pitch with the likes of Billy Clarke, Mark Marshall, James Hanson, Jordy Hiwula, Harris Vuckic and Marc McNulty all proven performers at this level.

It has been a season to remember so far for McCall's men too, who have only suffered a mere two defeats in League One so far. Opening the 2016/17 campaign with a draw at home to Port Vale, the Bantams went on to defeat Peterborough United, MK Dons and Coventry City before ending a fruitful August with a 1-1 draw at home to Oldham Athletic.

Four straight draws in September halted Bradford's progress somewhat but they picked up again in October to cement their place inside League One's top six. Bradford haven't played in the second tier of English football since 2004 but will be hoping to finally return to the Championship this season and, given their form so far this term, few would argue against the Bantams doing just that.



DANGERMAN

BILLY CLARKE

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF BRADFORD CITY'S DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

The experienced goal-getter is currently in his third season with the Bantams and has enjoyed a steady 2016/17 campaign so far. Clarke first signed for Bradford in June 2014 on a two-year deal from Crawley Town for an undisclosed fee.

Clarke was crowned Crawley's Player of the Year following an impressive 2012/13 season, where he notched 14 goals in League One. The 28-year-old was also part of the Town side that secured promotion from League Two in 2012.

Began his career with Ipswich Town and made his professional football debut in 2005, coming on as a substitute against Cardiff City in December of that year. Was later named the Irish Examiner's Junior Sports Star of the Year for Soccer in 2005 and was nominated

for the Irish U19 Player of the Year Award in 2006.

However, after failing to make the grade at Portman Road, Clarke had loan stints with Colchester United and Falkirk, before returning to Ipswich and opening his account for the club in a 2-1 victory over Southampton. The forward then bagged the winner against Coventry City just three days later, but was soon put on the transfer list and headed out on loan to Darlington.

That proved to be a successful move for Clarke who netted an incredible four goals in just one game against Macclesfield Town in August 2008, before joining Northampton Town and becoming the first Cobblers player since 2002 to net a hat-trick. Clarke also scored six goals in just eight games to help fire Brentford to the League Two Title during the 2008/09 season.

Clarke, who has also plied his trade for Blackpool and Sheffield United, leads the Bantams in scoring this term.

MEET THE REST

ROUVEN SATTELMAIER

The German-born goalkeeper spent the early days of his playing career with TSV Affalterback and VfB Stuttgart, before signing for Bayern Munich's second team in 2010. Was Munich's third-choice stopper before signing for Bradford in July 2016.

JAMES KING

Rose through the youth ranks at Valley Parade and put pen to paper on a new one-year deal with the Bantams in the summer. Burst onto the scene last season before a serious ankle injury hampered his progress.

TONY MCMAHON

Experienced defender who began his career with Middlesbrough, for whom he spent eight seasons with. Captained Boro's youth team to the 2003/04 FA Youth Cup title and made his Premier League debut against Manchester United when

he was just 18. Has represented England at U16, U17 and U19 level.

MATTHEW KILGALLON

A new signing at Valley Parade having signed for the Bantams in the summer following his departure from Championship outfit Blackburn Rovers. Regarded as a hugely talented defender, Kilgallon began his career with Leeds United where he made over 60 appearances, before going on to represent the likes of Sheffield United, Sunderland and Middlesbrough.

DANIEL DEVINE

Another produce of City's Academy, the young midfielder put pen to paper on his first professional contract with the club in June 2016. Devine helped the Bantams to retain the Youth Alliance North East Division title in 2015, before going on to win the Final Third Development Reserve League back in April.

FILIFE MORAIS

The skilful winger has been with Bradford since 2014 and has played a

pivotal role in the club's famous cup exploits. Scored against former club Chelsea in the Bantams' stunning 4-2 victory at Stamford Bridge in the FA Cup. Has represented Portugal at U21 level on two occasions.

VINCENT RABIEGA

Signed for the Bantams in the summer after leaving Bundesliga table toppers RB Leipzig. Began his career with hometown club Hertha BSC before moving to Leipzig in 2013, where he scored six goals for the club's second team. Scored three goals in ten games for Poland's U17s in 2012.

MARC MCNULTY

The Scottish striker is on a season-long loan deal from Sheffield United having spent part of last season with Portsmouth in the Sky Bet League Two, where he scored ten goals including a hat-trick against York City in November 2015. Was Livingston's top scorer in 2011/12 which eventually led to a move to Sheffield United in May 2014 for an undisclosed fee.

COLIN DOYLE

Made headlines in the summer when he signed for Bradford from Blackpool for just £1 after the Bantams met a release clause in his

contract. The experienced stopper, who could not prevent Blackpool from suffering relegation last season, spent twelve years with Birmingham City where he featured in the Premier League on a handful of occasions.

STEPHEN DARBY

Bradford's Mr. Reliable, the dependable right-back has plied his trade for the Bantams since 2012. Began his career with boyhood

club Liverpool in 2006, making his debut for the Reds against Tottenham Hotspur in November 2008 before featuring against PSV Eindhoven in the Champions League the following month.

JAMES MEREDITH

The Australian defender began his career with Derby County in 2004, putting pen to paper on a professional contract in 2006. Had spells with Cambridge United,

Chesterfield, Sligo Rovers, Shrewsbury Town and AFC Telford United, before helping York City win both promotion to League Two and the FA Trophy in 2012. Signed for Bradford that same year and has racked up over a century of games for the Bantams.

NATHAN CLARKE

The 33-year-old centre-back made his debut for Huddersfield Town at just 17 years of age, going on to make over 250 appearances for the Terriers. However,

after falling down the pecking order under Lee Clarke, the defender spent short spells with Colchester United, Oldham Athletic and Bury, before moving to Leyton Orient in 2012. Sealed a move to Bradford in 2015 in order to be closer to family.

ROMAIN VINCELOT

One of the big signings of the summer in League One, the hard as nails midfielder joined Bradford from Coventry City but has impressed

at the heart of defence this season. Despite being a new arrival, Vincelot has skipped the Bantams on occasion this term and is already a firm fans' favourite due to his all-action approach.

NATHANIEL KNIGHT-PERCIVAL

Joined Bradford from Shrewsbury Town in the summer and has played a big part in the Bantams' rise up the League One table. Progressed through the youth

ranks at Histon before becoming a first-team regular and winning two promotions with the club. Moved to Wrexham in 2010 and was named in the Conference Team of the Year, which persuaded Peterborough United to make him a Football League player in 2012.

NICKY LAW

Made his name with Rotherham United in 2009 before earning a move north of the border with Motherwell in 2011, where he quickly established

himself as a key player for the SPL outfit. The midfielder was included in the 2012/13 PFA Scotland Team of the Year, exploits which led to a move to Rangers in 2013. Finished as the Gers' top scorer in 2014/15 with 14 goals to his name.

TIMOTHEE DIENG

Born in Grenoble in France, the midfielder, who can also operate in the back-four, began his career with Brest, making his Ligue 1

debut during a 3-1 defeat to Paris Saint-Germain in May 2013. A move to Oldham Athletic came about in July 2014, where he made just shy of 50 appearances for the Latics.

MARK MARSHALL

Began his career in non-league with the likes of Carshalton Athletic, Grays Athletic and Eastleigh, before being offered the chance to try his luck in professional

football by Swindon Town. However, the winger struggled to nail down a regular first-team place at The County Ground and went on to have spells with Hereford United, Barnet, Coventry City and Port Vale before joining the Bantams.

HARIS VUCKIC

The attacking midfielder started his career with Domzale in his native Slovenia, but soon caught the attentions of Newcastle

United. Penned a three-year deal with United in 2009 and was touted as a hot prospect but has yet to make a real impact for the club. Has represented Slovenia at every age level and has one senior cap to his name.

JAMES HANSON

After spending the majority of his career in non-league football, the powerful striker joined Bradford in 2009 and has gone on to

become a cult figure for the club. Played a huge role in the club's stunning run to the 2013 Capital One Cup Final, before scoring against Northampton in the League Two Play-Off Final that same year.

JORDY HIWULA

Once regarded as a potential star in the making, the striker once scored 21 goals in just 30 games for Manchester City's U21s side

during the 2013/14 campaign, fine form that saw Hiwula rewarded with a new two-year deal. Currently on a season-long loan at Bradford from Huddersfield and has helped himself to five goals so far this term.

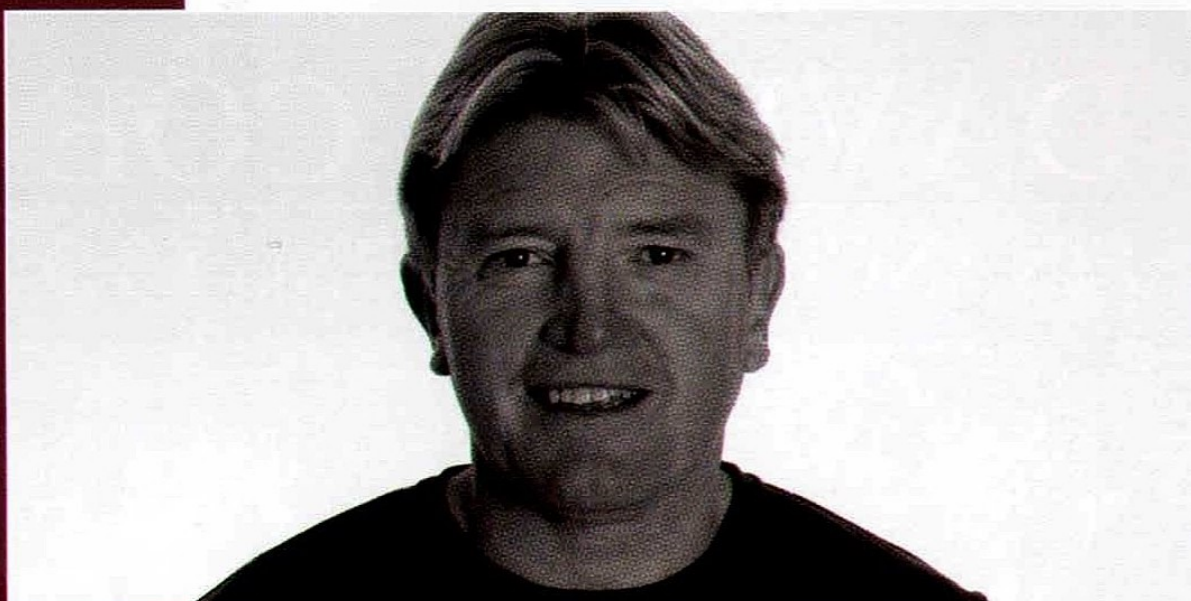

MANAGER

STUART MCCALL

The 52-year-old returned to the Bantams for a second spell as manager in June 2016 following Phil Parkinson's departure to Bolton Wanderers.

McCall first took charge of City in May 2007 after the club slipped into League Two, but left his post in February 2010 before agreeing to take the reins at Valley Parade once more in the summer.

Bradford is a club that's close to McCall's heart having begun his playing career there, making his senior debut in 1982. The former midfielder was a hugely popular figure with Bantams' fans and helped the club capture the Division Three Title during the 1984/85 season.

However, after the club missed out on promotion in 1997/98, McCall sealed a £850,000 move to Everton in June 1988. He scored twice against bitter rivals Liverpool in the 1989 FA Cup Final, but still ended up on the losing side.

McCall then moved to Scottish Giants Rangers for a fee of

£1.2million in the summer of 1991 and quickly became a club legend, helping The Gers rack up six league titles, three Scottish Cups and two Scottish League Cups. McCall then later became the 71st inductee into the Rangers Hall of Fame.

After enjoying plenty of success north of the border, McCall returned to Bradford City in 1998 and became the club captain, helping to take the Bantams into the top flight of English football for the first time in 77 years. After Bradford hit financial difficulties, he moved to Sheffield United in July 2002 before bringing his playing days to an end.

McCall also enjoyed plenty of success on the international stage with Scotland, winning 40 caps and scoring at the 1990 FIFA World Cup in Italy, in addition to playing at two European Championships.

After his playing days were over, McCall moved into coaching and was assistant manager to Neil Warnock at Sheffield United until May 2007, when he was put in charge of Bradford. After leaving the Bantams in 2010, he returned to Scotland to manage Motherwell and spent four years at Fir Park, guiding the club to two second place finishes in the SPL. Was then appointed as the new boss of Rangers in March 2015 but left after only a short time in charge following defeat in the Premiership Play-Off Final at the hands of former club, Motherwell.

Left a coaching roll within the Scotland set-up to return to Bradford once more in the summer and has led the Bantams to the upper echelons of the Sky Bet League One this term.

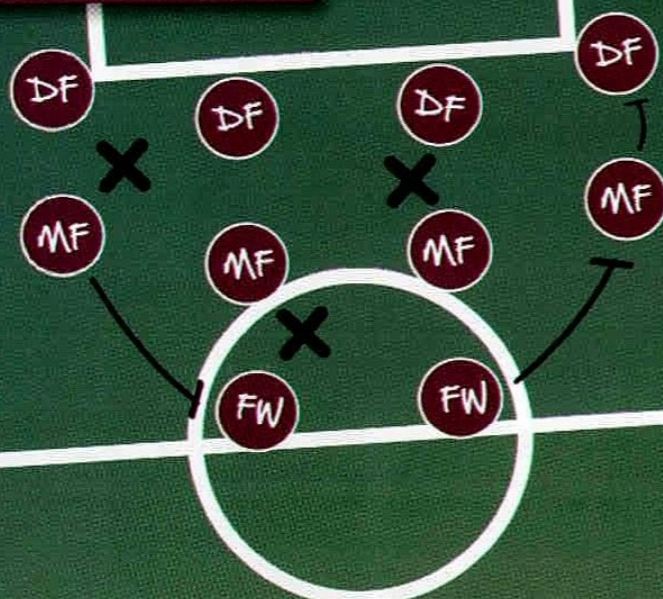

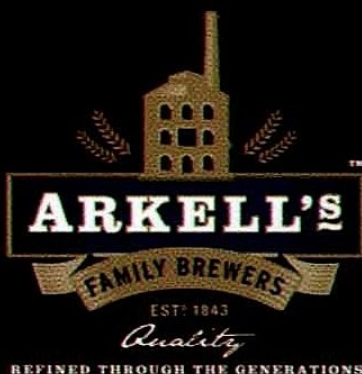

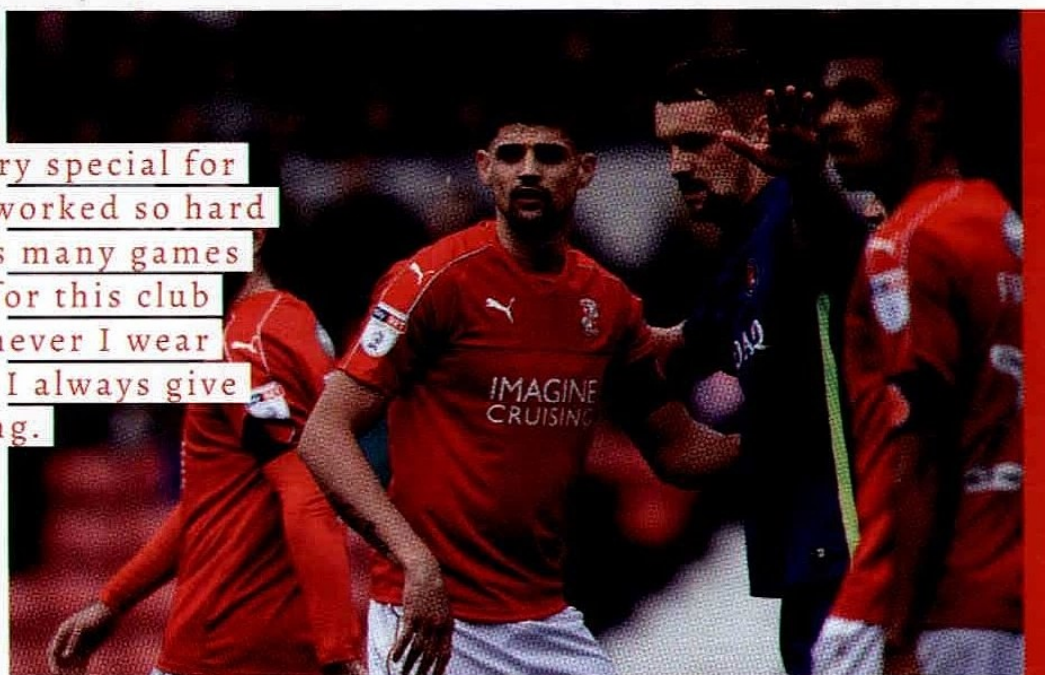

The team showed plenty of character in the 1-1 draw away at Southend United on Tuesday so it is about building on that now isn't it?

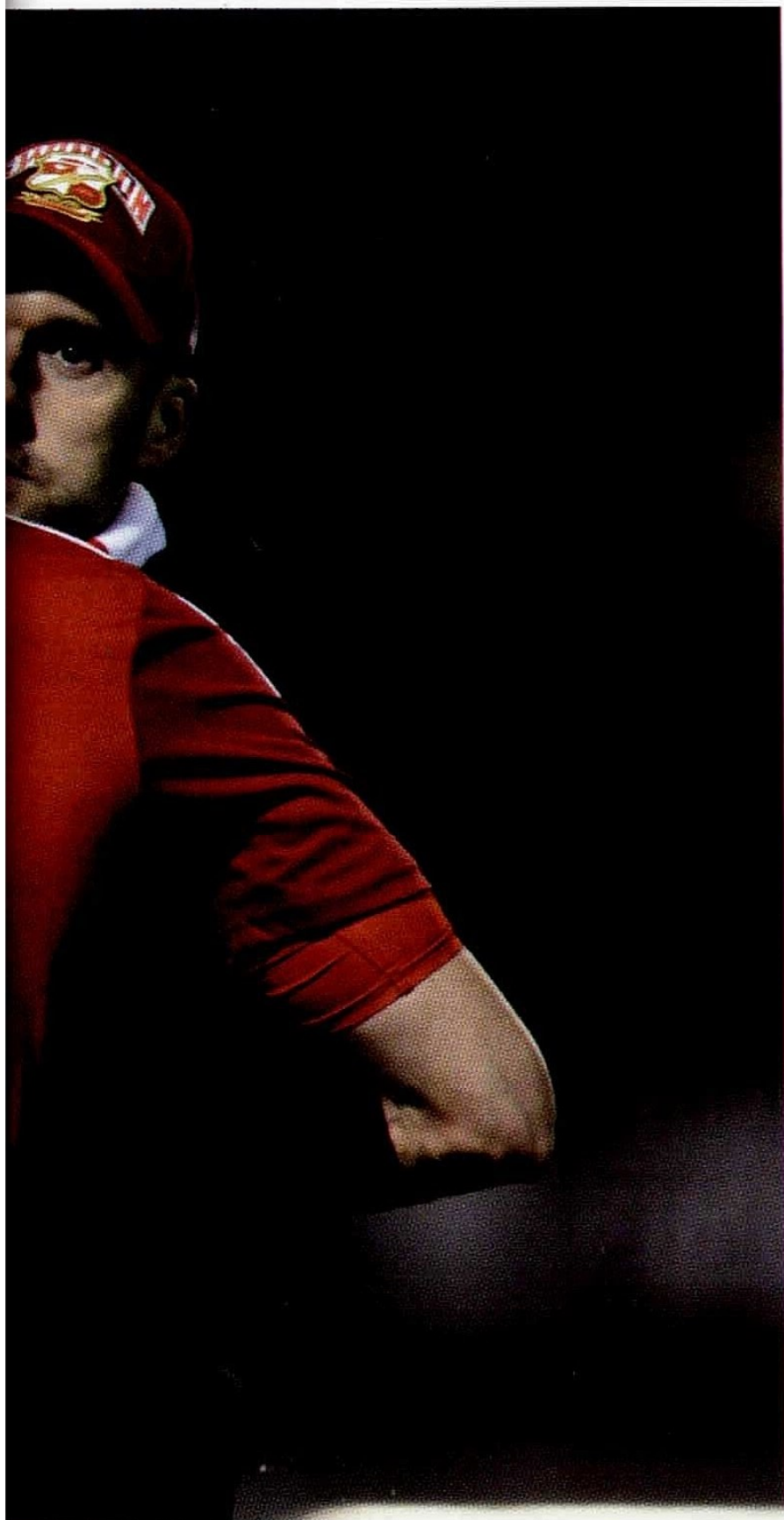

KEVIN MORRIS WILL ALWAYS BE REMEMBERED AS THE WHITE-HAIRED SPONGE-MAN AT THE COUNTY GROUND - WHERE HE WOULD BECOME A FAMILIAR FIGURE OVER THE COURSE OF 20 ODD YEARS AFTER TAKING OVER FROM HARRY COUSINS.

What was not so well known was that Kevin had also spent four years at the club as a player, having been signed by Bert Head as an amateur at 17. Kevin played as a wing-half - mainly in Town's third team - and was quite a specialist from the penalty spot! He had been noticed playing for his home-town team, Oldham, when Bert was assistant-manager at Bury.

Kevin turned professional in 1958 but, in truth, his small stature and blindness in one eye hampered his progress. He was released in 1961 without having reached the first team and joined Trowbridge.

But Kevin certainly made his mark after returning to the club in 1970, when he joined the coaching staff that included another Town icon in Maurice Owen.

Initially under the direction of Dr John Nicholas, Kevin would become one of the most highly respected physios in the game.

It was a great shock to us all when his death was announced in October 1994 - just a week after his 55th birthday. Images of him tending to a wounded Shaun Taylor will stay long in the memory.

ON THIS DAY:

26 NOVEMBER

1904

Swindon, two places off the bottom of the table following six successive Southern League defeats, suffered another set-back when they faced Plymouth and District League amateurs Green Waves in the Fifth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup. Jim Chalmers missed an early penalty for Town and the team of fishermen quickly went two goals up. Billy Kirby hit the only reply from the visitors.

1917

Swindon forward Freddy Wheatcroft was killed during the Battle of Cambrai in the Great War, aged 35. An England amateur international, Freddy hit almost a hundred goals in just 245 games for the club. Throughout his career he combined playing with working as a school teacher.

1932

Town faced Isthmian League club Dulwich Hamlet at the County Ground in the FA Cup. A Cyril Quinn brace helped the hosts to a 4-0 interval lead, before the London side pulled a goal back.

1968

Northampton scored first at their old County Ground enclosure, but Swindon hit back in style to win 6-2

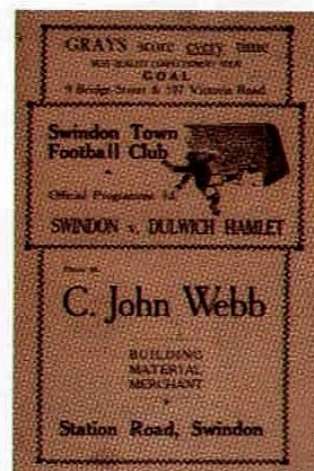

Having drawn in east London a week earlier, Lou Macari's side failed to build on an Alan Mayes goal 20 minutes in and were pegged back to 1-1 on the hour. Les Whitton won the tie for the struggling Alliance Premier League side just before the end of extra-time.

2011

Five years ago today, Town recorded a 2-0 home win over Aldershot Town with two second-half goals. A Paul Caddis cross was flicked on by sub Ronan Murray - making his debut and on for less than two minutes - for Jake Jervis to side-foot in. Twenty minutes later, Shots' Darren Jones, under pressure from Jervis, sent a Liam Ridehalgh cross from the other side past his own keeper.

Lou Macari's former assistant Harry Gregg - sacked along with the Scot at Easter 1985 - was in the visiting dugout for this Third Division encounter of thirty years ago. The Cumbrians' goalkeeper was also making a return to the County Ground, Scott Endersby. Swindon sat just outside the play-offs on goal difference, while Carlisle were 17th.

Town made two changes from the side that suffered a mid-week defeat at Walsall, Jimmy Gilligan starting in place of Peter Coyne and Chris Kamara returning after suspension to the exclusion of Alan McLoughlin.

But a quick re-shuffle was needed following an early set-back when right-back Chris Ramsey had to go off with an ankle injury only fifteen minutes

in. Jamie Reynolds, 19 a month earlier, came on for only his second taste of League football to play left midfield. Leigh Barnard moved to left back, with Dave Hockaday taking Ramsey's place on the right.

Endersby kept Town at bay for an hour with a string of good saves, but was then beaten by Watford loanee Paul Franklin - making his home debut in central defence. Reynolds gathered a free-kick from Barnard to hit a perfect deep cross to the far post for Franklin to head home.

The points were not wrapped up until three minutes from time when Kamara scored an exquisite second. A right-wing cross looked to be going out for a corner when the midfielder seized on it, turned and, from the edge of the area, sent a right foot shot curling inside the far post with Endersby well beaten.

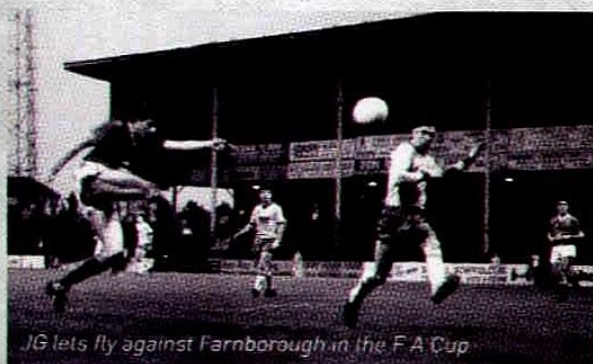

With a strike rate of a goal for every three starts, it was perhaps surprising that Jimmy did not have a longer stay at the County Ground than nine months. He had achieved a similar feat for Watford in three top flight seasons at Vicarage Road, where he had also scored the Hornets' first ever goal in Europe in 1983.

Jimmy opened his Town account in the first home win, against Rotherham, before netting the winner in a 4-3 victory at Port Vale. Five of his six goals came in just seven matches between mid-October and mid-November, when he partnered Steve White up front.

But the return to Wiltshire of Jimmy Quinn in the December saw Gilligan ousted and then despatched to South Wales for a month before re-joining the Red Imps at Sincil Bank.

"People may question our character but you could see on Tuesday that the boys are together and I feel like we are going to get more wins and more points on the board."

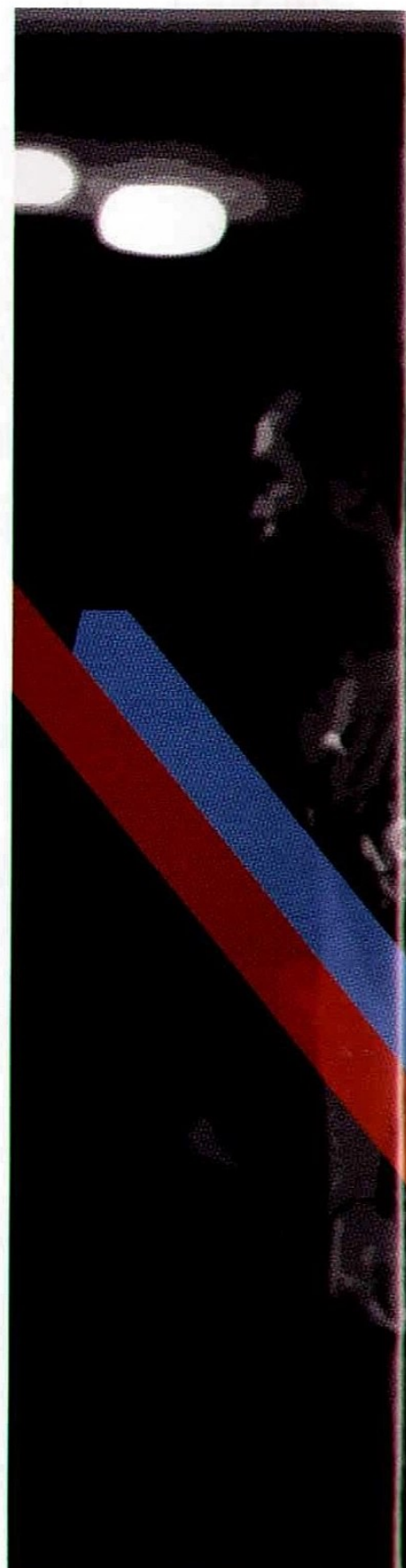
Obika now wants to build on the draw in midweek but knows high-flying Bradford City will pose a tough test.

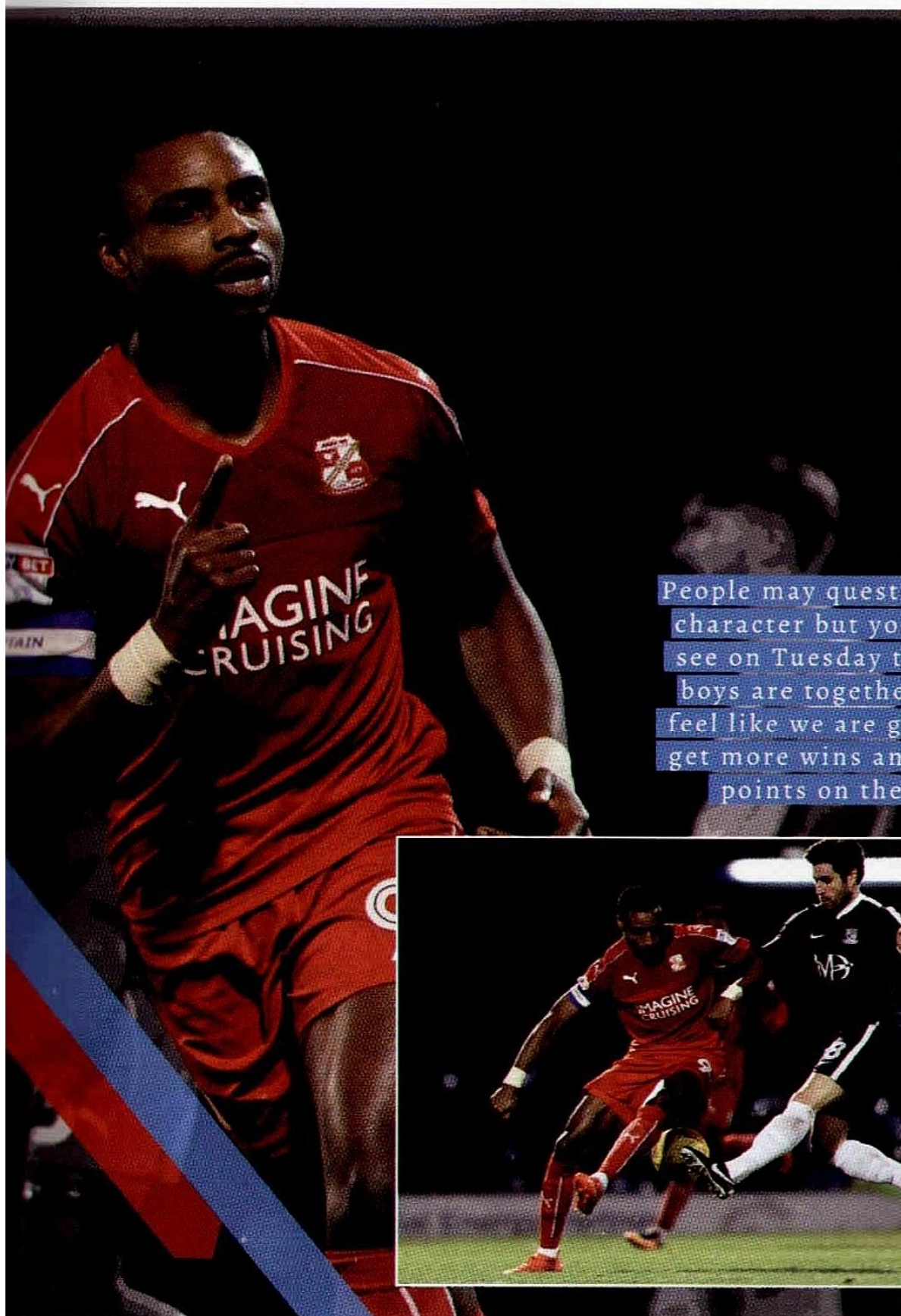
"The key is to keep this momentum going now and we want to go for the three points today," he continued.

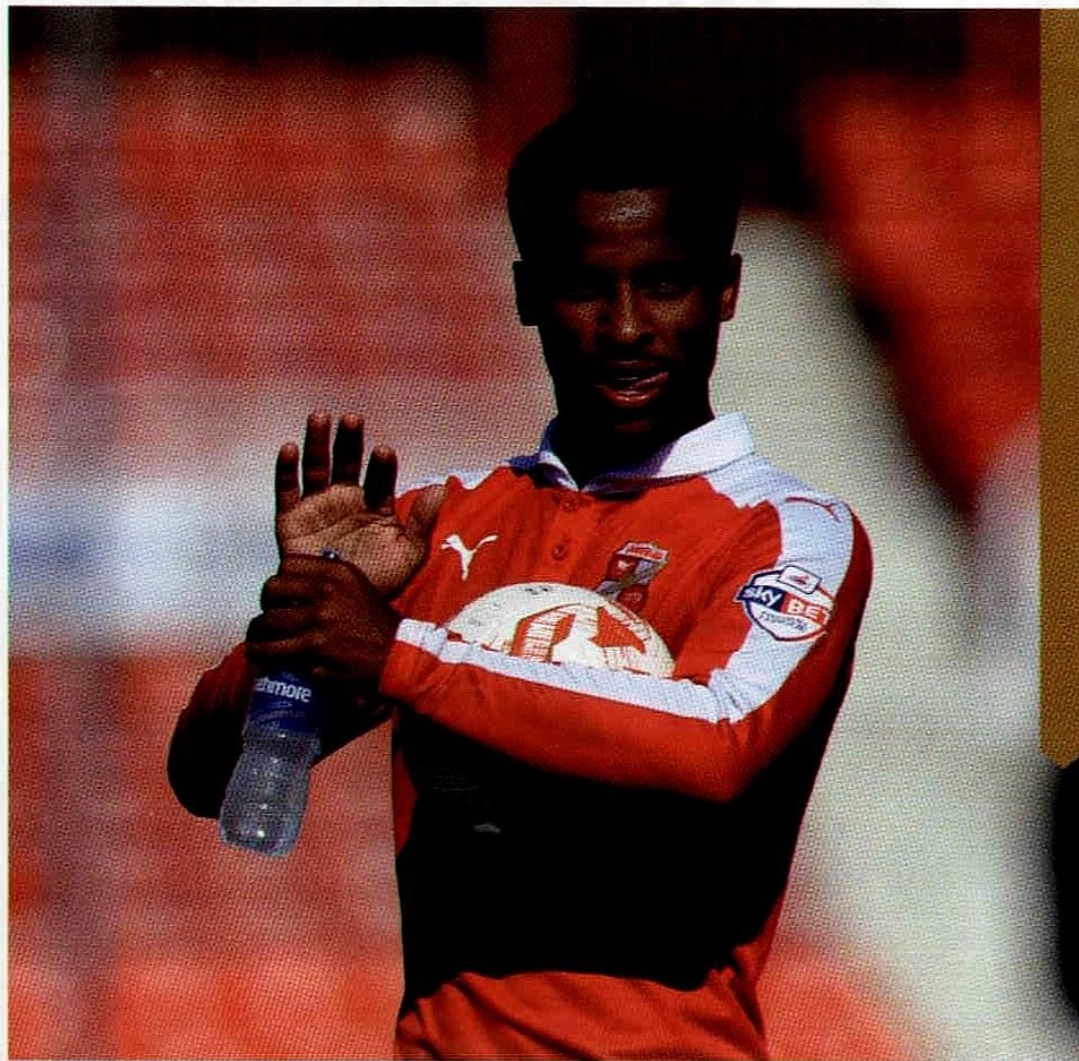

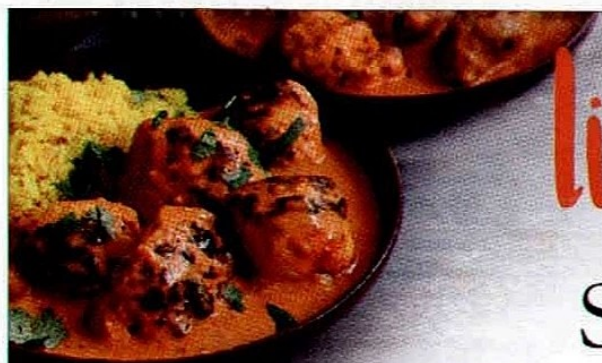
We got lucky on Saturday. Not many of our players stood up and we had to dig deep. AFC Sudbury were a good side and I thought they passed the ball better than us, they controlled

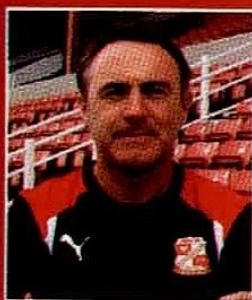

SUPER SAMMY SAYS

I'm writing these notes the morning after the draw at Southend. It isn't a ground I had particularly fond memories of before Tuesday night so I was more than happy to head off down the A127 with a point in the bag.

A colleague at BBC Wiltshire did remind me of a League Cup double I scored at Roots Hall but the endless run of defeats that followed has tarnished that evening's success somewhat. The night I stepped on a coat hanger in the dressing room after being thumped 3-0 probably stands out as the lowest point!

Lawrence Vigouroux was again magnificent in goal, he can also claim half an assist for the pass that started the move for Jon Obika's equaliser.

I've been racking my brains to think of the best goalkeeper I played with during my career. There must be 30 or so but no one really sticks out above all others. We're very fortunate at Swindon to have had Wes Foderingham and now Lawrence in the last few years. I remember they used to say Peter Schmeichel was worth 10 points a season. Lawrence was certainly worth one in Essex on Tuesday night.

My biggest memory of games against today's opponents Bradford during my time as a Swindon player was a home game in the 2003/04 season.

We won 1-0 courtesy of an amazing Sammy Igoe free kick - that's what I've been told anyway as I'd been sent off about ten minutes prior to the winning goal!

The Bradford fans in the away end today will remember their centre-half Darren Holloway. I certainly haven't forgotten him after the two games against them that season. He was one of the most aggressive defenders I've ever faced. In the second-half of that game he caught me flush in the face with his elbow as he shepherded a ball out of play for a goal kick. It was one of those incidents where the defender is not interested in the ball but fully focused on not allowing the forward player to get to it and keep it in play.

Strangely, referees rarely blow up for a foul. I was furious and

seeing stars when the goalkeeper conveniently decided to play a short pass out to the guilty man, it was one of the few times on a football pitch when I'd lost control and I took him out with a pretty reckless challenge. I'd been kicked from pillar to post for an hour and I'd taken the bait. It was the same scenario in the away game at Valley Parade later that season. Fortunately, two Grant Smith goals meant we took six points from the Bantams that season.

Last time out here against Charlton was up there with the best performances of the season. The second-half was as dominant as I've seen the team and its imperative the home wins are consistent if the team is to climb up the table. You're always going to drop points away from home at this level. We've seen some wonderful goals here in the last month or so. None more so than Erhun Oztumer's double for Walsall in their 2-0 win. Johnny Goddard's strike against the Addicks however was also a magnificent goal. It effectively ended the game as a contest and you could hear that collective roar of elation and relief when it whistled into the net.

Let's hope for more of the same today.

Enjoy today's game.

Come on you Reds.

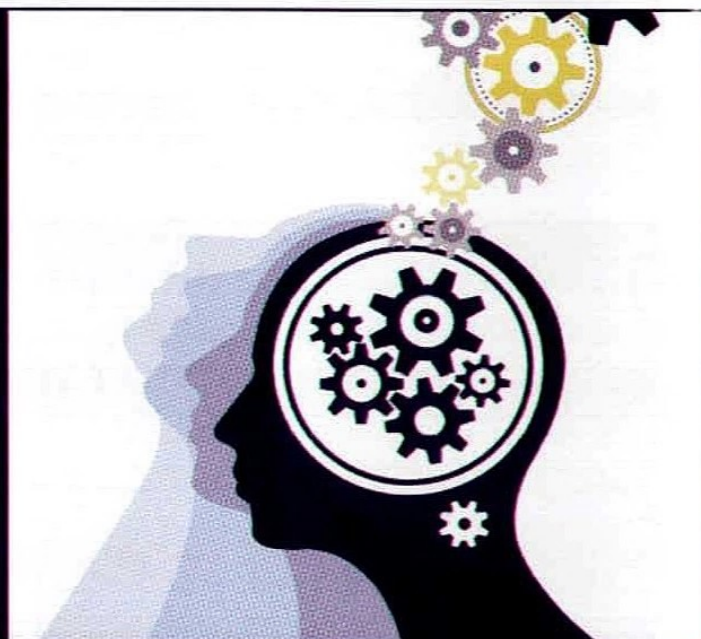

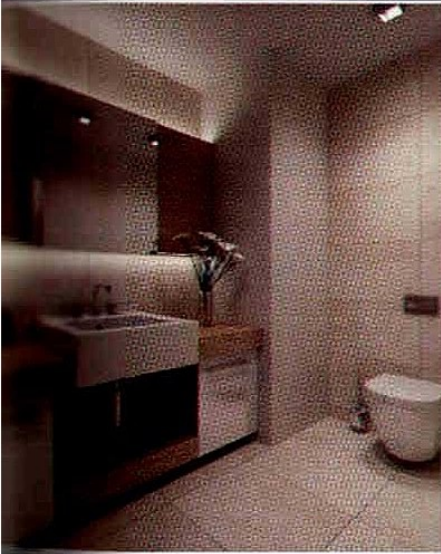

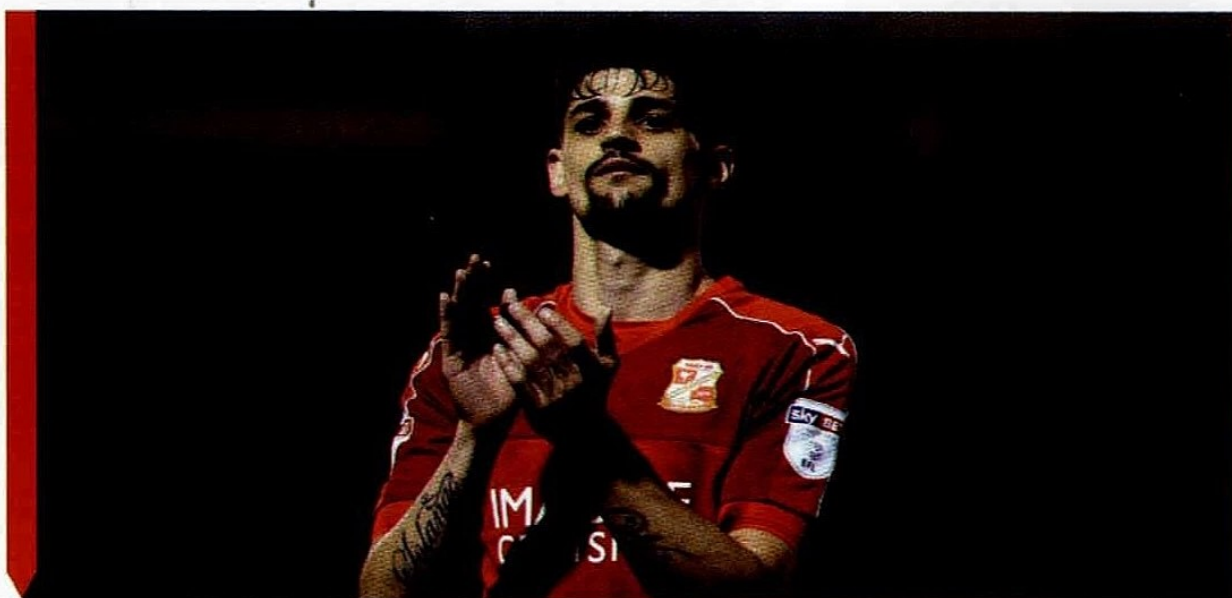
