



"Everyone knows about Swindon so it is obviously a very big club and to be involved with the first-team here is very exciting.





OXFORD UNITED

The Yellows have been solid during their first season back in the Sky Bet League One and currently lie in mid-table.

Having achieved promotion from League Two last season, Oxford have adapted to their new surroundings well and will be looking to kick on with the second-half of the 2016/17 campaign now well underway.

Despite losing star player Kemar Roofe to Leeds United in the summer, United have built a very competitive squad at this level and recruited well in the off-season, bringing in the likes of Curtis Nelson, Wes Thomas, Kane Hemmings, Marvin Johnson, Aaron Martin and Joe Rothwell.

Hemmings in particular has really risen to the fore and leads the club in scoring with 13 goals, one more than strike partner Chris Maguire with the two having struck up a deadly partnership together.

Although they have dropped off on the domestic front somewhat, Oxford are going we'll in the cups and they knocked Championship high-flyers Newcastle United out of the FA Cup last weekend to book their place in the Fifth Round.

In addition to those exploits, the Yellows also reached the latter stages of the Checkatrade Trophy in midweek after beating Bradford City and they will already be dreaming of a potential trip to Wembley.

Oxford, like Town, bolstered their ranks last month and brought in extra attacking reinforcements in the ilk of Antonio Martinez from West Ham United and Conor McAleny from Everton.

These two sides have met on two occasions already this season with Oxford winning the first encounter at the Kassam Stadium back in September 2016, before Town prevailed on penalties to take the extra point in the Checkatrade Trophy in October of last year.



DANGERMAN

CHRIS MAGUIRE

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF OXFORD UNITED'S DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

The forward began his career with Aberdeen in his native Scotland where he scored 16 goals in 131 appearances. Having fallen down the pecking order at Pittodrie Stadium, Maguire headed out on loan to Kilmarnock in 2010, scoring on his debut against boyhood heroes Celtic to hand his new club their first win in eight games.

Maguire went on win the Scottish Premier League Young Player of the Month Award for February on his way to helping Kilmarnock beat the drop. The attacker then moved across the border to join forces with Derby County in June 2011, but failed to make the grade at Pride Park and went on to have spells with Portsmouth, Sheffield Wednesday, Coventry City and Rotherham United.

After impressing on loan initially, Maguire penned a short-term deal with Oxford on 1st February 2016, going on to score four goals in six games to help United clinch promotion to League One last term.

The former Scotland international has been in good form this season too and is currently second in Oxford's goalscoring charts with twelve goals to his name, while he has also contributed six assists to the cause.

MEET THE REST

BENJAMIN BUCHEL

Moved to these shores in 2012 after signing for AFC Bournemouth following a spell out in Liechtenstein, becoming only the second player from that country to play football in England. Had a number of loan spells in non-league football before joining Oxford in 2015. Has won nine caps for his country.

CHARLIE RAGLAN

The defender grew up in Tenerife and spent his youth days with the likes of UD Guargacho and CD Marino, before joining forces with Port Vale after returning to England. Dropped into non-league before sealing a move to Chesterfield in 2014. Currently on loan at Oxford.

SAM LONG

Long was captain of United's successful U18's side and was offered a professional contract at the end of the 2012/13 season, before putting pen to paper on a new deal in May 2014. The defender scored his first senior goal for the club against Southend in January 2015 and can play in any position across the back-four.

CHRISTIAN RIBEIRO

Joined Oxford in June 2016 on a twoyear deal but has yet to make his debut for the club having fractured his ankle during pre-season. Has represented Wales at senior level, in addition to winning caps for the U17, U19 and U21 sides. Was previously with Exeter City where he was crowned their Players' Player of the Year in his first season.

CANICE CARROLL

Put pen to paper on a professional contract with United in January 2016 at the tender age of 17-years-old. Able to play in both midfield and at the heart of the defence, Carroll is highly-rated by the Yellows and has been capped by the Republic of Ireland at U19 level.

JAMES ROBERTS

Has been with Oxford since he was 16 after joining from Wycombe Wanderers. Is known for his exploits infront of goal and earned a professional contract in May 2014 after finishing as the youth team's leading scorer for two seasons on the bounce. His superb effort against Plymouth was crowned the club's Goal of the Season during the 2014/15 campaign.

ANTONIO MARTINEZ

Currently on loan at Oxford from West Ham United and scored on his Yellows' debut during the FA Cup Fourth Round success against Newcastle United last weekend. Joined the Hammers in the summer of 2016 from Valencia and scored seven goals in seven games for West Ham's U23's side earlier this season. Has been capped by Spain at U17 level.

CONOR MCALENY

Joined Oxford on loan until the end of the season on Transfer Deadline Day. A striker with a growing reputation within the English game, the striker has featured on two occasions for parent club Everton and scored four goals in thirteen games for Wigan Athletic last term.

SIMON EASTWOOD



Currently in his second spell with Oxford having joined from Blackburn Rovers in 2016. The stopper originally signed for the U's from

Huddersfield Town in 2010 but soon dropped into non-league with Halifax Town. Impressed for Portsmouth before earning a move to Rovers in 2013.

JOE SKARZ



Racked up over 80 appearances for Huddersfield Town before going on to have spells with Rotherham United and Bury, Was a key

member in the Millers side that won promotion to both League One and the Championship. Was also named in the Football League Two PFA Team of the Year in 2010/11 and signed a new three-year contract with Oxford in May 2015.

CURTIS NELSON



Nelson was sought after by a number of clubs before opting to join Oxford in July 2016. Spent seven years with Plymouth Argyle and

was Club Captain, making over 230 appearances for the Pilgrims. Signed for Argyle from Stoke City in 2009 and won the Young Player of the Year Award in his first season.

AARON MARTIN



Another summer signing for the Yellows, Martin began his career with Eastleigh but was soon snapped up by Southampton in 2009. Was

highly-rated by the Saints and was part of the side that gained back-to-back promotions from League One to the Premier League. Has also had spells with the likes of Crystal Palace, Coventry City, Birmingham City and Yeovil Town.

PHIL EDWARDS



Currently on a season-long loan from Championship outfit Burton Albion, having signed for Oxford in the summer of 2016.

The vastly experienced right-back has won back-to-back promotions with the Brewers and also helped Accrington Stanley reach the Football League.

CHEYENNE DUNKLEY



Began his career with the fabled Crewe Alexandra Academy but dropped into non-league with Hednesford Town following his release.

Dunkley then secured a £5,000 move to Kidderminster Harriers and won three caps for the England C team, wearing the captain's armband for two of those games. Has established himself as a key figure for Oxford since signing in 2014.

LIAM SERCOMBE



The experienced Football League campaigner joined Oxford from Exeter in the summer of 2015. Turned professional with the Grecians in

June 2007 and was a key figure for the club, featuring in over 220 games and was part of the side that claimed promotion to League One in 2009.

JOHN LUNDSTRAM



Born in Liverpool, the tenacious midfielder progressed through the ranks at Everton's Academy and represented

England at U17, U18, U19 and U20 level. Had numerous loan spells and won the League One title with Doncaster in 2013 before joining Oxford in 2015, where he is now Club Captain and the heartbeat of the learn.

JOSHUA RUFFELS



Made his professional debut for Coventry City against Crystal Palace in August 2011, before signing for Oxford in July

2013. The midfielder signed a new contract with the Yellows in April 2014 and was crowned the club's Young Player of the Year later that month after bursting onto the scene with a string of impressive displays.

JOE ROTHWELL



Joined his hometown club, Manchester United at the age of six and went on to sign professional terms in 2013. However,

Rothwell was unable to make the grade at Old Trafford and had loan spells with Blackpool and Barnsley before agreeing to terms on a two-year deal with Oxford in July 2016. Has represented at England U17, U18, U19 and U20 level.

WES THOMAS



The experienced striker knows where the goal is at both League One and Championship level and spent a short spell with Town last season,

scoring twice before injury struck. Has represented a host of clubs including the likes of Bournemouth, Portsmouth, Blackpool, Birmingham City and Rotherham United, before joining Oxford in June 2016.

KANE HEMMINGS



Hemmings was the second leading goalscorer in the Scottish Premier League during the 2015/16 campaign, form which led him to signing a three-year deal

with Oxford in July 2016 for an undisclosed fee from Dundee. And the striker hasn't disappointed this term, notching 13 goals so far to lead the Yellows in sconng. Was crowned the PFA Scottish Championship Player of the Year in 2013/14.

MICHAEL APPLETON

The former Manchester United trainee hung up his boots in 2003 at the age of 27 after suffering a serious knee injury.

Then with West Bromwich Albion, Appleton remained with the Baggies in a coaching capacity and went on to take temporary charge of first-team affairs following the sacking of Roberto Di Matteo in 2011.

He was then handed his first managerial role with Portsmouth later that year, but with the club in serious financial difficulty, relegation to the Championship followed at the end of the 2011-12 season. Blackpool then came calling in November 2012 but Appleton resigned after just eleven games, becoming the shortestserving boss in the club's history.

Following a short stint with Blackburn Rovers, Appleton took over the reins at Oxford United in July 2014 and guided them to automatic promotion from League Two last term and a place in the JPT Final.

More success has followed this season with the Yellows having knocked Championship high-flyers Newcastle United out of the FA Cup last weekend.




Dion Conroy became the Reds' fifth signing of the January Transfer Window last Friday after arriving from Chelsea, putting pen to paper on a two-and-a-half-year deal at The County Ground.

R&W sat down with the defender in the build-up to this afternoon's game to get his thoughts on making his debut last weekend, settling in, his aims while at SN1 and the possibility of making his home debut against the club's fierce rivals today...

Firstly, Dion, just how excited are you to be a Swindon Town player?

"I'm very excited to be here. Swindon is a very big club and I'm just looking forward to getting started and playing. I found out last Wednesday that coming here was a possibility and it just all happened really quickly. I'm just happy to properly join and get everything signed – I'm looking forward to playing! involved with the first-team here is very exciting. Hopefully I can bring something to the team and help the club win points."

You have been at the club for just over a week now – how have you found life at SN1 so far?

"It has been really good and I've settled in quite well. I've got to know the boys and I'm settling in really well. I want to work hard, get my head down, get used to everything and get in the team and help them out. I'm just looking forward to playing for Swindon. I haven't had much of a chance to look around Swindon yet because everything was such a rush last week and I went home after Saturday to see my family, but I have been out a couple of times and it seems lovely. The Magic Roundabout looks interesting though!"

When this move first came about, what were the main attractions of joining Town for you?

"There were a few things really. I like to play football and Swindon

"Even if I didn't know anyone I would still settle in fine but just knowing a few of the boys is nice because they show you about and they show you what to do and what is happening. It has been really good settling-in here."

You have signed a two-and-ahalf-year deal here so what are you hoping to achieve during that period of time?

"I just want to kick-on, play games, impress people and help Swindon out as much as I can and get them back winning. I want to help the club get back to the top of the league and fighting for promotion – that is the goal. Hopefully I can start getting a few games before the end of the season and show everyone what I can do and then really kick-on next season."


Going back to your days at Chelsea, just how big of a learning curve was it training alongside the likes of John Terry, Frank Lampard and Eden Hazard on a daily basis?


"Training with John Terry was a dream come true because I always looked up to him since I was a young kid so being able to train next to him and talk to him about things and staying behind



that then you start dominating the game and you should win it. I love a physical challenge so I'll be looking forward to that."

You made your Town debut away at Bristol Rovers last weekend, albeit you were only on the pitch for a few minutes, but how special a moment was that for you?

"It was amazing. The game obviously wasn't the best but to be able to put a Swindon shirt on and come on in an atmosphere like that was really good. I came on and all the home fans were going nuts and screaming things but you've got to deal with things like that as a footballer, so it was another learning curve. As a team, we struggled a bit in the first-half but the second-half was a lot better and we managed to get the ball down and play."

Today's game is the big one of course and it is a match that means so much to the club and to the fans, so how excited are you about the prospect of featuring against Oxford United and the chance to run out at The County Ground for the first time?

"I'm very excited. Hopefully I can play some part in the game but even if I don't then fingers crossed the team can get the three points and start pushing up the table. It would be an amazing win and it should be a great atmosphere. Hopefully we can get the win for the fans. It would be amazing to come on in-front of the fans but the main aim is to get the three points."

ON THIS DAY:

5 FEBRUARY

1910

Southern League Swindon were in FA Cup action against Second Division Burnley. Goals from Archie Bown and Harold Fleming - who had both scored in the previous round against Crystal Palace - saw them safely through to face Tottenham in the Third Round.

1938

Goals from Jim Cookson and Alan Fowler and an own goal from former County Ground defender Bill Armstrong saw Town ease to a 3-0 home win over Gillingham in Division Three South.

1955

The Gills were again on duty at Swindon. With only one win since October, the hosts went a goal down but fought back to triumph 2-1. Ray Sampson netted two in two minutes - the second coming from a penalty - and was then quickly denied a hat-trick when his header came back off the bar.

1977

Forty years ago today, Town returned with a point from Wrexham following a 2-2 draw at the Racecourse. Ray McHale and Steve Aizlewood put the visitors into a two-goal lead with only a quarter of the game gone, but the Welsh side fought back to snatch a point through a Billy Ashcroft double.

1989

Our visitors today were also here at the County Ground on this day 28 years ago. Alan McLoughlin netted just before the interval and then Ross MacLaren fired in a penalty on the hour. Swindon made sure of the points with a late goal from skipper Colin Calderwood.


2014

The last fixture played on this date was the first leg of the League Trophy Southern Area Final against Peterborough at London Road. Two goals down with less than 15 minutes gone, Town hauled themselves back level despite being a man short for almost an hour following the dismissal of Jay McEveley.

Fourth-placed Town faced a tricky trip to the sixthplaced Seasiders, who had recorded an emphatic 6-2 win at The County Ground back in September.

There were two changes from the side which lost narrowly to Leeds in the FA Cup four days earlier. Peter Coyne came in for the injured Bryan Wade - who was 12th man for the reserves - and Chris Ramsey was rested, his number two shirt being handed to Steve White. New loan signing from Torquay, full-back Phil King, was on the bench.

Both Dave Bamber and Dave Hockaday were returning to their former club at Bloomfield Road and both played a part in the goals which came in the first fifteen minutes.





John Deary raced into the area and was held back by Hockaday, Paul Stewart converting the resultant penalty. But within two minutes Bamber had restored parity when he sent a towering header home from a Mark Jones corner.

The same pair had fashioned Swindon's first real sight of goal, Jones getting free down the right before sending over a cross which the diving Bamber got his head to, but saw his effort narrowly miss the target.

The visitors were a little fortunate to go in level at the break as Blackpool had much the better of a scrappy first half in which there were 18 stoppages for offside! They went closest to another goal when Alex Dyer hit the woodwork.

But Town defenders Colin Calderwood and Tim Parkin tightened their grip as the game wore on and in the end it could have been them celebrating a winner when home keeper Barry Siddall had to tip

over a shot following a solo run by White.

Not the biggest of strikers, Bryan's rise from parttime football while working as a stonemason to scoring twice to knock second-tier club Sunderland out of the League Cup was swift - just five months.

That brace against the Roker Park men came only three days after his first start in a Swindon shirt - when he netted in a 4-0 win over Rochdale. Bryan went on to contribute ten goals to the Fourth Division title effort.

He hit a further dozen in just 23 starts in 1986/87, including four in five games as Town surged to the play-offs. Sadly, Bryan suffered numerous injuries during his time at The County Ground and he made just four appearances from the bench in his final season here. A persistent knee problem eventually called time on his days as a full-time professional.





We also played on Sunday against Bristol Rovers and we try to have two games every weekend. This weekend our U10's, U11's and U12's are in a tournament with Swansea





U18's Manager Alan McLoughlin hailed the efforts of his players after their 3-2 victory at home to Portsmouth last weekend...

The first-half was probably as well as we have played all season and we were 3-0 up at half-time. Tommy Ouldridge scored a great goal, Sol Pryce deserved his goal for his performances recently and Jordan Simpson scored a great goal as well.

I was delighted at half-time and we spoke about how we have a tendency to take our foot off the gas and not start the second-half well and allow teams back into the game. That's exactly what happened and we didn't play with the same intensity, we didn't play with the same drive, we didn't move the ball around quick enough and we allowed Portsmouth back into the game.

It was only the second time we had conceded from a corner all season and it was poor marking at the far post where we are generally very strong. 



Forgivable?! His prolific campaign here was alongside BBC Wiltshire's own Sam Parkin. Amongst our pundits: Steve White, who scored six times against these nearneighbours, more than anyone else in history! Of course, his most famous double-act at SN1 paired him with Duncan Shearer.

Are we about to see the renewal of the Jon Obika/Nicky Ajose partnership? The latter has returned on-loan until the end of the season, let's hope he's back on the goal trail this afternoon,



following his deadline-day arrival. Brighton's Rohan Ince & Jesse Starkey also put pen to paper - the "midfield enforcer" & "one for the future"!

All the wheelings & dealings of the January transfer window were a topic of conversation in our latest fans' phone-in to chairman Lee Power on Friday night - you can listen again throughout February thanks to the iPlayer via bbc. co.uk/bbcwiltshire.

Obviously Swindon won the last game against Oxford, thanks to Will Henry's heroics in the EFL Trophy penalty shoot-out here. That success followed six defeats in a row, the first of which was the most disappointing for me after a marathon radio build-up to the away televised FA Cup second-round tie in 2002. Dave Bampton will recall the occasion as his Town debut, for the rest of us an instantly forgettable day!


